"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

by Bill Gersh

STANDARDIZED PARTS

About two years ago The Cash Box reported that there were a great many coinmen who believed that for post-war manufacturers of similar types of machines should arrange for the standardization of many of the parts used in those machines.

The arguments presented for parts standardization are extremely logical. They would tend to create a much better industry. Such standardization would be of tremendous benefit to every repairman.

It is understood, to begin with, that not all machines can have everyone of their parts standardized. Use of certain parts of specialized fabrication and design causes them to become "individual" machines in their own right. Parts must comply with the overall design, and such parts naturally, cannot be standardized.

The sort of parts, such as on the cabinet of a phonograph, must remain individually designed units. But the inside mechanisms, in general, are more or less similar in most regards. The tubes, amplification units, trays, etc., etc., can be standardized. And by such action eliminate a great many present mechanical headaches for the trade.

The pin game manufacturers should arrange for standardization of a great many of the components they use. The public does not play what is underneath the playing field of a pin game.

But the operator does care what goes on beneath the playing field. If he could transfer parts from one machine to another he would not only save time, effort and money, but because of this very great economy of time and money he could arrange to run larger routes of machines.

In the end, then, the manufacturer would gain. The repair and servicing problem, which is the average operator's nightmare these days, would be so much simplified by standardizing the majority of parts, that every operator would look around to increase his operations.

By standardizing certain component parts the manufacturers enjoy great savings. They could very easily arrange with certain producers of their present parts for extremely large orders. And in view of the fact that the unit would be used by all makers of the same type machines, ordering in so much larger quantity and producing but one type of unit, the price would become so much more reasonable for the manufacturer.

Once again it must be remembered that not all parts can be standardized. There are certain mechanical and design features which make certain machines individually distinctive. The design of a cabinet itself might require the construction of a unit completely different than in any other similar type machine. Even tho the unit would do the same job that another of different design would be doing in other equipment of like nature.

The trade realizes that not every single little part that goes into the making of a machine can be standardized with parts of other similar type machines. But what can be done is to greatly simplify the repair problem of the average coinman by standardizing the parts most used, and most in need of repair, in the average machine.

From an economy standpoint, which is one thing engineers continually strive for, the standardizing of parts would save a great many thousands of dollars in costs to the manufacturers, and as many times to the operators, jobbers and distributors. Yet, parts would continue to be sold and the profit margin remain the same, even tho the price might be lower.

The suggestion on the part of those coinmen who have been urging the need for standardizing parts in similar type machines, meets with great approval everywhere in the nation.

The trade agrees that this is something which should have been done years ago. For example, the anger of a pin game operator when a leg is broken off his game and he learns that he must have that certain type and style leg and that no other leg will do. Surely the public doesn't care one bit about that leg. Nor is the public putting coin into that pin game to play the leg of the machine.

The average coin machine manufacturer is reported to have advanced probably 50 years or

more in manufacturing skill because of his war work. He can easily arrange for the standardizing of certain parts which would make construction simpler and speedier for him, and would also cut corners on costs here and there and thereby allow him to get his machines to the market faster and cheaper.

It is the hope of the average operator, and the larger the operator the more anxious he is to see this come about, that the manufacturers will get together and arrange to standardize certain parts of their machines which will bring greater economy and convenience to the trade.

It is surely not the purpose of the average factory to see how many stock piles of parts it can accumulate. Nor does the average manufacturer want to force customers to come to him with each and every little repair requirement. Builders like to sell machines that stay sold. Not see stock piles of old parts gather up in warehouses to later be sold at great loss as scrap.

One noted coinman wrote *The Cash Box* sometime ago reporting that prior to the war it was necessary for him to rent a complete and additional store simply to storage parts for all the games he was operating.

It is nothing new for the average man in this industry to buy almost as many parts as he buys machines, so that an emergency repair job won't force him to take his machine off the location until the part arrives from the factory. And usually those small parts which are the source of most repair troubles are the very parts that could be standardized and would therefore be interchangeable from one machine to another.

The average mechanic in this industry could prepare a long list of parts which he would recommend for standardization. He is in there battling with most of those units almost every day. He has seen machines lie about in his shop idle while he waited for just one part to arrive from some factory. And usually a part that could have been taken from some old machine—if parts were standard.

The industry needs standardization of parts.

CANADA LOOKS TO POST-WAR

The Canadian coin machine market has become so much a part of the United States, that few, if any coinmen, consider the shipping of merchandise to the Dominion of Canada any different from shipping to some neighboring state.

But Canada still remains little different as far as shipments and sales are concerned than England, France or any other foreign center where coin machines are being used.

For post-war the Canadians do not believe that they will have a large increase in the ranks of their operators, jobbers and distributors. They claim that there is very little room for newcomers for the territory at present is extremely well covered by the trade.

They look forward to the ending of the war with Japan as the time when the Dominion will remove some of the heavy taxes now imposed on the importation of coin operated machines.

The duty at this time amounts to approximately 90%, plus the exchange into American funds, which all shippers require, and which increases this by an additional 10%. In short, Canadian coinmen are paying about 100% over and above the price of the machine they purchase by the time delivery is made to their doors.

All Canadian coinmen hope to see these high rates of duty reduced. But they do not believe that this will happen until sometime well after V-J day. At present the rates of duty on new and used coin operated equipment are as follows:

25% Duty
10% War Tax
8% Sales Tax
25% Excise Tax

These rates are paid one on top of the other. As is known, tho, prior to Canada entering the war, there was no 10% War Tax and no 25% Excise Tax. It is hoped by the Canadian coinman that both of these taxes will be eliminated soon after V-J day.

Just as in this country, Canadian coinmen eagerly look forward to the new machines which the American manufacturers will produce. There is tremendously good interest in the new phonographs which will be made. Canadians hope that the manufacturers of phonographs will arrange to assemble these in Canada.

Canadian assembly saves about \$150.00 to \$200.00 on each phono—as against bringing it in as a complete unit from this country. The phono manufacturer who will not assemble in Canada will be at a disadvantage for the prices of the two leading phonos, who now have Canadian assembly organizations, will be sufficiently lower to make sales a problem.

Since August 1944, when Canada lifted the ban on the importation of coin machines, Canada's operators, jobbers and distributors have been buying huge quantities of machines from this country. They haven't been able to buy many of the latest types of phonos because of the unusually high prices being asked for these. When these prices are doubled (by the 100% duty rate) it gives the American coinman some idea of what one of the later model used phonos would cost a Canadian.

Therefore, after the war, when prices are expected to start downward as the new machines come to market, Canadians believe that there will be a market for the later model used phonos for so few of them can be found in the Dominion at this time.

But regardless of this fact, they are still most interested in the new equipment which will be produced, so that the some Canadian coinmen believe the used market will remain good, others feel that it will continue along on a normal basis with new equipment capturing the lion's share of interest.

Like his American counterpart the Canadian operator has enjoyed a long rest from purchasing equipment. From 1940 to 1944 he couldn't even import a used machine into Canada. Therefore this long surcease from buying equipment of any kind gave him a chance to strengthen himself financially.

But, also like the American operator, the Canadian, too, was faced with tremendously increased overhead and therefore, even tho the collections were the best in all their history, this was balanced by the as greatly increased overhead to keep actual profit down to a more or less normal level. Yet, because no new equipment, in fact no equipment of any kind was purchased, he was able to accumulate a good cash reserve.

The leading Canadian coinmen are of the belief that the average Canadian operator is in a good financial position and will be able to purchase the new equipment when it is ready for delivery—for cash.

On the whole, Canada has pretty much escaped the tax bug, the bane of the American operator's existence. Here and there in some territories machines are licensed. But license fees are not exorbitant.

And, just as in the United States, there are territories where nothing but music equipment is being operated. Here the operators are reported to have so well organized their businesses that they have provd phono operating to be very profitable in Canada.

The Canadian coinman realizes that once the new equipment comes to market that the situation thruout the Dominion is in for a change. He feels that the purchase of new machines will once again put him back into the category where he will have to figure on lowered profits while amortizing the cost of the equipment he will buy.

Business generally is very good thruout Canada and the average Canadian business man expects that it will become even better once new consumer goods is being manufactured and sold to the general public. Employment is at peak and will probably remain so. Collections are therefore expected to continue good.

In consensus: the Canadian operator, jobber and distributor can be likened to the American coinman in almost every regard. He is eagerly looking forward to the new machines. He hopes that the majority of the manufacturers will arrange to assemble their products in Canada so that his cost will be reduced. He foresees an increase in the number of coinmen, after the war is well over, but he doesn't believe that the increase will be so great as to revolutionize present operations.

Some Canadian coinmen fear direct selling to their locations. They were faced with this prior to the war in certain territories and hope that there will be no return. But with five very good years under their belts, and with a very sound financial condition to back them up, they face the future with greater confidence than ever—and will, as always, be the best and largest importers of American coin operated equipment.

"TALKING OUT LOUD"

TRADE WANTS CONVENTION TO SHOW NEW PRODUCTS

Leaders Suggest Sometime Between October and January.

Want Mfrs. to All Show New Machines at Same Time.

Believe This Would be Biggest Buying Meet.

NEW YORK—The entire trade reacted to the great good news of the surrender offer of the Japs with a demand that since most controls would be lifted almost immediately after V-J day, including that of ODT on the holding of conventions, that the manufacturers should immediately arrange to hold the first post-war meet of the industry sometime between October and January '46.

By that time, leaders believe, most new machines will be well under way and the trade will be able to view all the new products assembled in one spot.

Not only will this meet bring together many coinmen who haven't seen each other since the war started, but will, in all probabilities, prove to be the biggest buying convention of all time.

The need for such a meet is very great. It would not only help to bring better understanding of the future plans and products of the manufacturers, but it would also allow the average coinman to be able to prepare himself, as well as his locations, for the new machines.

There are many who believe that the convention should be held in November. These men are of the belief that the manufacturers will be ready to present their new machines by that time.

This request does not leave too much time for the manufacturers to prepare themselves. But with restrictions and curbs lifted by all government agencies before then, this may be possible.

USED MARKET PRICES STILL HOLDING

NEW YORK—Regardless of the tumult which has been caused by the Jap offer to surrender, there hasn't as yet been any real effect of this on the used machines market.

Market prices are still holding up, and from all indications will continue to hold up for some time to come.

The belief is that only a flood of new machines can bring these prices down, and this is not expected for some months to come.

Dealings in used machines continue at good pace and prices will probably go on at present quotations unless some drastic changes affect market conditions.

WPB READY TO RELEASE ALL CURBS

WASHINGTON—Leading reports from this center are to the effect that the War Production Board is completely prepared to release all curbs and restrictions as soon as the word of official V-J day comes thru.

It is understood that some restrictions will continue for about six months after the war is over.

With cutbacks rolling up to many billions of dollars it will prove necessary to release all curbs so that domestic production can get under way immediately to take up the employment slack.

GREATER ROUTE BUYING SEEN AS MANY FORMER COINMEN RUSH TO RETURN TO FIELD

NEW YORK — Reports already reaching here to the effect that many former coinmen are already inquiring about returning to the field.

There is a big demand for routes of all kinds so that these men can get into instant action.

Many of these former coinmen have been engaged in war plants and other essential industry. They now seek to return to the field as soon as they possibly can.

ODT TO ALLOW CONVENTIONS

WASHINGTON—Word from the Office of Defense Transportation is to the effect that restrictions on civilian travel will be lifted as soon as possible after V-J day and that conventions of business men will again be allowed.

ODT is reported to realize that business firms want to get together to help retailing, distributing and general reconversion programs.

FIRST NEW MACHINES READY TO RUSH TO MARKET BUT ONLY SMALL QUANTITIES TO BE SEEN

CHICAGO — Leading coin machine manufacturers here are reported to be ready to rush their first new machines to market.

This is expected within a very, very short period of time as WPB lifts all restrictions.

It is also reliably reported that the first machines will come to market in small quantities and will therefore not be able to cover the tremendous backlog demand which has accumulated during the war years.

Many here are of the belief that the manufacturers will get going as soon as they can start a schedule of materials coming their way.

Some manufacturers, it is believed, may hold back until they have sufficient raw materials on hand to turn out a good quantity.

WLB TO VANISH

WASHINGTON — Latest reports here are to the effect that the War Labor Board is expected to vanish almost immediately after V-J day is officially announced.

Others claim that this may not prove practical. Some may ask that the agency continue on for a short time after V-J day.

But from all present indications WLB is scheduled to go out as soon as possible after V-J.

BALLY ENTERS MUSIC FIELD

LICENSED TO MANUFACTURE GABEL PHONO

CHICAGO - Ray Moloney, president of Lion Mfg. Corp., this city, producers of Bally games and venders, startled the industry this past week by announcing that his organization will start delivery of a coin operated phono as soon as materials are available. Early delivery of the Bally Phonograph, Moloney explained, is assured by the fact that The John Gabel Mfg. Co. has granted an exclusive license to Lion Mfg. Corp. to manufacture the Gabel phono mechanism.

"I wish to emphasize," Moloney stated, "that The John Gabel Manufacturing Co. will continue to manufacture the Gabel phonograph for distribution thru Gabel distributors. The fact that the Gabel mechanism will be incorporated in the Bally phonograph simply means that greater numbers of operators will be able to take advantage of the recognized simplicity, sturdiness and superior tonal quality of the Gabel mechanism.

"The Gabel mechanism, which will be built into the Bally Phonograph, is a new, improved model which Gabel engineers completed just prior to the outbreak of the war. This model, which includes many new features desired by operators and designed to increase play is, of course, based on the experience of the Gabel organization in the 42 years during which it has produced successful phonographs.

"Bally engineers have added their contributions to the Bally Phonograph, utilizing their vast pre-war experience in the coin operated field, as well as the war time experience in precision production which has won a three-star Army-Navy "E" flag for the Bally plant. Nationally famous stylists have produced a line of cabinets for the Bally Phonograph which is destined to usher in a new era in brilliance and eye-appeal."

Discussing the licensing of the Gabel mechanism, Bob Gabel, salesmanager of The John Gabel Mfg. Co., reiterated Moloney's statements that the licensing arrangement with Lion Mfg. Corp. will not interfere with the plans of Gabel distributors or those distributors awaiting commitments to their applications for distributorships.

"In fact", Gabel stated, "with both Gabel and the Bally plant in production, distributors are assured quick delivery in almost any volume. Just as the superiority of the Gabel mechanism convinced Ray Moloney that the Gabel unit is the right one for the Bally Phonograph, we in the Gabel organization are highly gratified to see the vast production facilities of the Bally plant at the disposal of the hundreds of operators who have long recognized the superiority of the Gabel mechanism."

MFRS MEET THIS WEEK ON CONVENTION

CHICAGO - Dave Gottlieb, president of the C.M.I., met with other manufacturers in the Hotel Sherman this past week and discussions were started as to a general meeting of all manufacturers this week to decide upon a date for the first post-war convention.

There has been a demand (as noted in this issue) from all the trade for an immediate convention. As yet ODT is holding down on very large meets. But it is believed that by November, or surely by January '46, ODT will allow large meetings to be held once again.

The manufacturers, it is reported, are going to try and arrange this first post-war meet for the first week in January. They also believe that they will again be able to hold the convention at the Hotel Sherman, as in former years. The trade is eagerly looking forward to an official statement after this week's meeting from the manufacturers as to just what dates were decided upon.

OPA PRICE EXEMPTION NOW OFFICIAL

WASHINGTON-The TheCash Box made the report this last week regarding the fact that the industry would be exempted from further price control by OPA, this news became official the latter part of this past week.

All those who read the official report were tremendously elated. It included every type of coin operated machine. At the same time this greatly eased the minds of those wholesalers and operators who are preparing to get into immediate action on buying and selling of equipment now that the war is over and men are returning to the industry in large numbers.

AL STERN SEES NEW MACHINE DELAY

CHICAGO - Al Stern of World Wide Distributors, this city, reports that it is his belief that those operators who think that they are going to purchase new equipment in any quantity whatsoever within a few weeks, or even by the end of this year, had best change their minds and, instead, take advantage of every open location in their territories with whatever used machines they can buy now.

Al claims that this erroneous belief on the part of many coinmen is halting some from covering important spots in their territories. He believes that the coinman who know what it is all about will realize that regardless of the fact that all restrictions seem to have been lifted, lumber and certain other vital coin machine components continue to remain tight, and will remain tight for sometime to come. He therefore states that no quantity of new equipment can be constructed under these conditions.

Stern urges that the members of the trade take this into serious consideration. He believes that now is the time to cover every single open location in the country in preparation for the time when new equipment will come to market. He stated this past week, "I'm still buying pinballs and slots, and will continue to buy, because I feel confident that when the new equipment does at last arrive the price set-up will be high enough so that a great many will realize the value and importance of used machines. This is the time to buy reconditioned equipment."

JUKE BOXES FOR USE IN VENEZUELA

CARACAS, VENEZUELA - A prominent official of this city believes that he can be instrumental, in an anonymous fashion, to introduce juke boxes here. He would, at this time, prefer to receive complete information regarding second hand stocks of machines so that he will know how many are available, their prices, and how soon they can be shipped to Venezuela.

AKRON OPS ASSN MAKE JOE ELFANT PRES

AKRON, O. - Operators here have formed themselves into an association to foster good will among members. The organization is reported to be working out very well with almost 98% of the total coinmen in greater Akron as members.
