Miles Gordon Technology rejects Amstrad claim

ALAN MILES of Miles Gordon Technology reacted angrily to a report in Computer Trade Weekly which stated Amstrad had warned the company against producing a Spectrum clone.

"We are not borrowing, stealing or deriving technology from any other product," said Miles, "and are very angry at the implication of the article.

"Amstrad has merely stated that it will fight anyone who infringes its copyright and it is

right - so would we," Miles continued. "So far as I am aware there is absolutely no reason for us or Amstrad to be worried about the activities of either company."

Miles pointed out that his machine 'SAM' was further away from being a copy of a Spectrum than the Amstrad 1640 was an IBM PC. Although the machine has a Spectrum mode, Miles was adamant that SAM in no way imitates the Spectrum. "We feel it has superior capabilities to any existing 8-bit computers," he said. "It has superior graphics, sound and a wider range of options.'

A spokesperson for Amstrad was non-commital on the subject, stating: "Anything which endangers our intellectual property rights we would look at extremely

Adventure trilogy marks the Level 9 Mandarin debut

LAUNCHED with a budget of \$1 million, Mandarin is a new entertainments software house which will combine the marketing abilities of the Europress group with the various top programming teams.

The first link with Level 9 has produced an adventure trilogy, Time and Magik, which contains three formerly acclaimed titles, Lords of Time, Red Moon and Price of Magik.

Having been made available on a wider range of micros, the games have also been enhanced considerably so that the vocabulary has increased five times since the originals, there are 700 locations and better quality pictures on disc versions.

Mike Cowley, a spokesman for the new venture, explained how the new deal had evolved. "Level 9 is a good programming team but it was not marketed properly, which

is a role we can play".

Chris Payne, also of the Europress group, supported him, saying, "Mandarin could not be more sound financially - we have \$1 million in the kitty - so we are in a superb position to pick and choose not only our partners but also just what products we decide to release and when."

Claiming that the new label will be the Rolls Royce of software games, Time and Magik is to be released on March 31 in 13 versions.



funny thing happened recently. Not to me but to one Eric Nussbaum, who recounted his tale in a letter to the Metropolitan Diary column of the New York Times.

It seems he returned one night to an apres-row atmosphere at home, where it transpired that Mrs Nussbaum and their $3\frac{1}{2}$ -year-old son had been locked in battle over the untidy state of his playroom. The room was now tidy, certainly, but Nussbaum Junior was looking strangely quiet and shaken.

To cut a short story even shorter, the reason for the child's distress was not withdrawal of bedtime stories or even bubblebath, as you might expect. No – the tiny Nussbaum was in tears because his mother had threatened to tear up all his computer software. The child was $3\frac{1}{2}$ years old, remember.

Several thoughts spring to mind, the first being "What a spoilt brat" but it makes one think about the appeal the home computer industry is making, or ought to make, to the whole age range. This journal's letters page has lately been the site of several complaints from readers who object to our increased games coverage. A point is often missed by those same readers is that *Popular Computing Weekly*, just like the home micro industry as a whole, needs to appeal to all sections of the market simultaneously.

We are often told that the computer market is growing up and the position of *Popular Computing Weekly* on that development needs no repetition. If the story of the American family Nussbaum is at all representative, the industry should be growing down, if anything.

Efforts to inform and entertain the young and preschool child through microcomputers are piecemeal, not to say lamentable. Look at Acorn, look at Miles Gordon Technology, look at the toy computers available in the big toy stores. The computer industry's attempt to cater for this age group is not good enough and, as in other areas, needs to show long-overdue signs of thought and originality.

Budgie Code Masters to break into 16-bit market

CODE Masters has turned its intentions from 8-bit to 16-bit software. David Darling, managing director of Code Masters, says: "We have wanted to break into the 16bit market for a long time; the improved graphics and quality of games of these machines is extremely appealing."

The first title to appear on the ST and Amiga will be a conversion of BMX Simulator. Other releases will follow.

The price for the 16-bit releases has been set at £14.99. "We think it is very high quality and much better than the current £9.95 budget software on the market. We

THE Dysan Investigator, from Action Computer Supplies, is a new drive test program which determines whether a drive is in good working order. Designed for the IBM PC/XT and compatibles with 48tpi and double-sided drives, the Investigator is contained on a single 5.25in. diskette.

When inserted into the drive the program conducts seven crucial tests automatically and a readout shows on the monitor, indicating pass or fail.

Tests include read/write, spindle speed, static head alignment, disc centring, index to data, azimuth head rotation and hysteresis. If more specific information is required operating the controls can produce numerical results and a full printout of the data if required.

The result of a partnership between Infocom and Tom Snyder Productions, Infocomics are not computer games but a web of storylines enriched with cinematic effects such as zooms, pans and dissolves. Tom Snyder, who originated the idea, gave his reasons for the new product.

"Many people are intimidated by complex recreational software whose instruction manuals would boggle the mind of a Nobel Laureate. I wanted to create a product even my mother would love – something simple to use, escapist like a movie and, unlike other forms of computer software, rooted in pop culture."

Infocomics enable the user to create the destiny of the char-

acters and events. Each Infocomic embodies intertwining storylines and wherever different paths intersect, the player can choose to enter a different character. These paths also reveal different thoughts, flashbacks, dreams and perspectives.

The graphics in Infocomics are

minimalist, used to support the storyline rather than deflect from it. "We have developed a technology which allows artists to create expressive drawings using minimal storage," Tom Snyder said.

Beginning what they hope to be a successful series, Infocom and TSP are releasing three titles. Lane Mastadon vs the Blubbermen is a spoof of 1930s science fiction; Gamma Force in Pit of a Thousand Screams is a superhero tale featuring a trio of brave aliens; and Zorkquest: Assault on Egreth Castle is a fantasy adventure involving travellers and an evil magician.


Instant letters

Sega promotion announced

MASTERTRONIC has announced a Sega promotion, giving the customer the choice of two special offers. Lasting until June 30, the first promotion offers a complete Sega system and a free two-Mega game for \$99.95. Each game is worth \$24.95 and customers can choose from *Outrun*, *Space Harrier* or *Rocky*.

Alternatively, people can pay \$124.95 for the Sega Master System and Light Phaser, again saving about \$25.

Rachel Davies, marketing manager of Mastertronics denied the promotion was to support flagging sales of the Sega but simply a marketing ploy to assist the post-Christmas decline, common to all hardware manufacturers.

"We sold in excess of 30,000 units before Christmas and as there was a drop afterwards, we just want to keep the momentum going.

"There are several ways of looking at how you market hardware" she continued; "rather than spending thousands of pounds on advertising, we are giving value to the customers and support for the multiples."

She did not exclude the possibility of advertising in the future but added that Mastertronic will take its time "to make sure we get it right".

Organiser for PCs

THE Organiser package, bundled with the Amstrad PPC, has just become available as a separate item for all other PCs. A fully-integrated package, it is memory-resident and offers a variety of features, including word processor, spreadsheet, calculator and name diaries

Panic in year Zero

have had *Popular Computing Weekly* delivered every week since it was 35 pence or so. If it had been 70 pence then, my view is that it would have been far better value than it is today.

Of course advertisements are as essential to a publisher as countless games reviews are to some readers, judging by the letters of praise. No doubt these are from either youngish new readers, or perhaps those involved with software sales.

Reviews are an essential part of any micro magazine; it stimulates sales and helps keep computing alive but why must this be to the exclusion of most of the things that made *Popular Computing Weekly* popular?

Sections covering hints and tips; Peek and Poke; Bytes and Pieces; the Adventure column; Arcade addicts section; Communications updates and info; reasonable size Letters section where all manner of computing views have been exchanged and not just Amigas or STs which most of the readership have no intention of owning; and even a once-affordable private small advertisements section. Computers old and new were worthy of mention and occasional support.

Almost from week one of the new management the Letters area was halved. Is it not significant that a high percentage of letters recently printed offered criticism and that an increasing amount of lineage is being used by the editorial staff answering such criticism with more than a hint of sarcasm?

Popular Computing Weekly was a well-balanced, comprehensively informative and friendly magazine second to none. All that has changed. For some while now I've considered cancelling my Popular Computing Weekly order: the 15 per cent plus price increase was the last straw! Kenn Garroch's excellent section cannot singularly sustain my interest in Popular Computing Weekly. I am sure my views are shared by many. Not all readers use their machines solely for business or games playing.

There are only two things to be said in reply. Most of the features you describe as having made *Popular Computing Weekly* popular are still here. Second, I am sure many readers are as bored by letters like this as you are by letters about Amiga.

Amigamedes – the case continues

First of all I will make this letter as short as I can to avoid the chances of it being shortened again. I have written the main facts and a few comments of David Vint's letter (*Popular Computing Weekly* Feb 11-17), who was writing about my previous letter.

Here I will write the true facts:

Archimedes advantages:

- 1. Speed;
- 2. Protected RAM;

Amigas advantages:

- As Vint said, true multi-tasking;
 Some parallel processing, with
- the help of the blitter; 3. 4096 colours on screen simultaneously;
- 4. The memory chips can operate at twice the processor speed;
- 5. The sound-chip is of better quality;
- 6. The ability to do many things with scarcely any loss of speed. The 25 DMA channels allow the custom chips to access memory without disturbing the processor. The blitter can generate graphics

and animate them faster than the processor. The blitter, as stated in the Amiga handbook, runs at around ten times the processor speed could it be over 70MHz?. Graphics on the Archimedes are fast but not as fast so it is capable of

8. Amiga is easier to program because of its library of routines; 9. Amiga is better value it makes a change to hear that;

Two things about the Archimedes advantages that I have written:

a) I did not write 'the O/S in Rom' as I do not see that as an advantage;

b) I did not write 'the pixel resolution' because I was informed by an Acorn expert, with the confirmation of three different Acorn magazines, that Archimedes does not have a higher resolution than 640×512 pixels, which is the same as the Amiga. No doubt this could be improved via software, as I have heard of Amiga software which uses a pixel resolution of around 2400 pixels. I presume that Vint has a 300 series, as they are the only ones with monochrome models.

Saying that what Amiga can do via hardware, Archimedes can do more flexibly via software depends on the programmer. The Amigas hardware runs from the ROM, and the ROM is still a program which could be improved on. Every computer operating system is a program. What the Amiga already does via hardware could be improved greatly via software – it does not stop there.

In my original letter – and Popular Computing Weekly will confirm this – I said that the ARM was a very powerful processor. The accusation aimed at me saying that I had a disregard is understandable, given the fact that my letter was shortened.

Finally, everyone I know who is interested in computers prefers the Amiga to the Archimedes. With all due respect Vint's friends must be mad if they call that "upgrading".

That word is used only when a computer with a higher number of bits is concerned. Yes, Archimedes is 32-bit but the only reason that the Amiga can not be called 32-bit is because of the 16-bit databus.


Amiga would have been a true 32-bit computer like Archimedes if equipped with a 32-bit databus. The 68000 always uses 32-bit values during operations.

I do not think that any word is appropriate for the change from

an Amiga to Archimedes. If anything, it would be "downgrading".

Whenever magazines talk about the Archimedes, no matter how long the article, they are only trying to put forward one advantage - the speed. That is the only advantage Archimedes has over computers like the Amiga.



Mercy mission

After winning independence for Xul-3, Dexter the Android and his podocephalus Scooter have once again been assigned a 3-D isometric adventure.

Down on the planet Kef, things have been going just a little bit wrong. Natural disasters and the like have provided the catalyst for the emergence of a new religious sect, inhabited mainly by the Stiffiens, the race holding power on Kef. Bad news for the Swappis, who naturally like to swap things, as this sect is heavily into xenophobia and hating new technology.

The centre of these nefarious practices is a stronghold located inside a mountain, called Antines. Dexter's mission, should he choose to accept it, is to shed some light on the Antines mystery.

No easy task, as contact with the Stiffiens, along with the fauna of Kef, drains the old batteries, and is ultimately fatal. It is necessary to employ the assistance of the Swappis in order to get into the secret stronghold, but unfortunately, Dexter being an offworlder, they don't trust him very much.

So, the primary objective is to build up the trust, there is a trust rating on screen, to 100% by performing good deeds for the Swappis. Inside each of the three Swappi houses are signs which inform you what they want, and outside are signs giving clues to each test.

The tests can be completed in any order, and indeed a general

Expect to see versions of the game on the Amiga in about two months, and then cross your fingers for the conversions. \Box







A tale of two modems



With modem prices seemingly going through the floor, Steve Gold looks at two of the latest and cheapest high-speed modems on the market.

odem prices have been falling for the last year or so, with the effect that many previously expensive highspeed modems capable of 1,200/1,200 and 2,400/2,400 baud full-duplex have fallen below the psychological \$200 barrier. Before we look at two recently released modems, many readers are probably asking why there is a constant move towards faster and faster communications. The answer, as with most things of this nature, is pricing. On-line databases and electronic mail networks charge for their services on the basis of time; the longer you remain connected to the service the more you pay. Add the fact that the British Telecom meter is clocking units all the time and it is not difficult to see why lower-speed modem users are migrating to the higher speeds as fast as modem prices are falling.

The two modems I have chosen to review are the recently launched Micro-Link multi-speed modem and the Supra 2,400 modem. The former is designed and manufactured in the U.K. while the latter originates from the U.S. This fact, as we shall see, greatly influences the facilities available on each unit.

The MicroLink modem is badge-engineered for MicroLink by Pace Micro Technology of Bradford, whose modem pedigree stretches several years to the original Pace Nightingale. The most recent Pace claim to fame is the Linnet, a \$139.95 Hayes-compatible unit capable of 300/300 and 1,200/75 baud. A version of the Linnet, the Linnet V22, capable of 1,200/1,200 baud full-duplex is in the works, with a provisional price of more than the psychological \$200 mark.

Financial muscle

As readers will probably have guessed the MicroLink multi-speed modem is a badged version of the forthcoming Linnet V22 unit. The difference is in the bundling and its price, \$169 including VAT, substantially less than the forthcoming Linnet V22 model. Not that corners have been cut nor the modem cheaply-assembled. It is merely because MicroLink has exercised its financial muscle and is using the multi-speed modem to market its own electronic mail service.

As communications users can scarcely have failed to notice, MicroLink offers all

the facilities of the Telecom Gold network but with a much lower price structure. The MicroLink's pay-as-you-go service costs between 20 and 30 per cent less than the comparable e-mail facilities on Telecom Gold.

MicroLink is looking to the multi-speed modem to boost its already high subscription base. Included in the £169 price tag is a free subscription to MicroLink, worth £5 and the first month's usage free of on-line charges. This deal, provided the user wants a subscription to MicroLink, is worth at least £8 plus VAT.

Good value

Also included within the MicroLink multispeed modem's price are all the cables required to link the modem to a computer, as well as software for a variety of micros, including the Amstrad PC and BBC Model B, B+ and Master. More software packages for other micros are planned. Even if your micro is not catered for in the software stakes, the modem bundle still offers good value.

Because of the price of the MicroLink modem, it's likely that a typical purchaser will already be running a low-cost modem, possibly restricted to 1,200/75 baud, such as the one being given by Micronet in return for a year's subscription commitment.

Despite this, the software bundling deal adds considerably to the nett worth of the modem to its owner. In use, the MicroLink modem behaves as you might expect of any 300/300, 1,200/75 and 1,200/1,200 baud Hayes-compatible modem. Several internally software-driven extra facilities have been included as standard, including automatic speed-buffering – even when operating in reverse Prestel, i.e., 75/1,200 baud and an optional dialling suffix command to lock the modem speed-seeking functions to a particular baud rate.

Most Hayes-compatible modem users in the U.K. find that the speed-seeking feature of a new modem is more of a headache than an advantage. Listening to two speed-seeking modems trying to lock on to each other's carrier is about as interesting and productive as watching a \$5 note burn in an ashtray.

In practice, it is a simple matter to issue

a dialling suffix – e.g., ATD 618 + 75 – to lock the modem speed-seeking functions on to 1,200/75 baud carrier only. A similar suffix of +12 indicates that reverse Prestel modem speeds – 1,200 baud TX, 75 baud RX – are required.

I have two criticisms of the MicroLink modem, both of which have been communicated to MicroLink. The first involves the inability to accept a pulse dial string followed by a tone dial string. This could prove problematic if you are using the unit on an old pulse-dialling PABX and dialling through a tone-only System X telephone exchange. This feature or lack of it also proved a headache when using the Mercury telephone network to reduce on-line costs. I gather that MicroLink is considering changing the software to accommodate such usage.


To be fair to MicroLink, the modem can accommodate a tone PABX string in prefix to a pulse-dialling string, as is normal for PABX out-dialling. The lack of the reverse option of pulse and then tone dialling is odd and almost certainly a software oversight.

The mains plug

The second complaint concerns the mains plug. In common with many other modems, the MicroLink mains plug doubles as an AC/DC transformer, feeding DC power to the modem. That makes for a bulky plug and one which may not fit a typical wall socket unless some form of adaptor is used to move the socket away from the wall. Again, to be fair to MicroLink, the problem afflicts other modems, including the Supra 2400 model, to a lesser or greater extent.

Cheap imported U.S. modems are not new. Previously, however, such modems have been limited to 1,200/1,200 baud or greater, because U.S. modems work to different standards when using 300/300 baud. In addition, they rarely offer 1,200/75 buad rates since Prestel is unavailable in North America.

While the Supra modem does not offer 1,200/75 baud it includes a software switch to enable full CCITT working at 300/300 baud. As an added bonus a software switch tweaks the dialling timing and modem frequencies to that of the U.K. and CCITT specifications. That is not to say that a U.S. modem will not work in the U.K. – merely that some U.S. modems can cause problems with slightly off-tune telephone lines. Normally, U.K.-originated modems



can accommodate such lines. U.S. modems are little less tolerant of such line conditions.

Miniaturisation

The Supra modem is much smaller than the MicroLink unit – less than half the footprint and a third of the weight. Internally, the modem is well-constructed, with miniaturisation of many components. Externally, the case is of a solid metal design. Like the MicroLink modem, the Supra unit features several status lamps on the front. There are eight on the Supra unit, compared to six on the MicroLink modem. That is due to the number of extra facilities seen on the Supra unit, including the 2,400/2,400 baud facility, albeit at the expense of the 1,200/75 baud facility.

Unusually for a budget modem, the Supra 2400 includes a simple on/off switch on its front fascia. It acts in a similar fashion to the software re-set button on most other modems, the MicroLink unit included. The rear of the Supra modem has the same array of inputs/outputs as the MicroLink and other budget modems – telephone in and out, power input, and a 25-way serial cable socket. A moulded 25-way serial cable and all relevant U.K. telephone cables are bundled with the Supra, making it a good all-round package.

Again, like the MicroLink, the Supra includes a free subscription to an on-line service in its £199.95 including VAT price. This time it is a \$25 starter kit to the giant Compuserve system in the U.S. which now has direct dial ports in London. The bundling deal also includes a one-hour free subscription to the Official Airline Guide, although users should watch for the rather high usage costs for this useful airline database.

Auto-answer

Technically, I liked the Supra 2400. It conforms closely to the true Hayes standard and, as such, can be operated with an auto-answer bulletin board system with a minimum of software tweaking. Such tweaking is normally required to accommodate the ubiquitous 1,200/75 baud rate used by Prestel and several U.K. on-line services.

No on-board number store is provided as

on the MicroLink unit, although the Supra software can remember the last telephone number dialled, even after the unit is powered down.

Aside from the aforementioned problems with combined plug/power supply units, which affect the Supra slightly less than the MicroLink unit, my only criticism is the lack of a 1,200/75 baud rate. Prestel is upgrading its dial-in port network to include 300/300, 1,200/1,200 and 2,400/2,400 baud rates.

The Vasscom system, as the Prestel multi-speed network is called, is available in London, Scotland and several major cities. It is not yet available in Sheffield. It will, says Prestel, be available "soon".

Both modems offer amazing value. The documentation for both is excellent and the inclusion of free offers and serial cables make them both compare very well to the competition. The MicroLink multispeed modem is ideal for communications novices, as well as established users of modems generally. The inclusion of free software for a variety of micros will appeal to many potential buyers.

Compatibility

The Supra 2400 modem costs slightly more but offers true Hayes-compatibility, albeit at the sacrifice of 1,200/75 baud rates. No software is supplied but the free offers compensate for this to a certain extent.

I would recommend the MicroLink modem for beginners and middle-ranking comms enthusiasts. For middle-ranking and advanced enthusiasts, the advantage lies with the Supra 2400. Even if you buy both modems for the best of both worlds, you will still have change from the price of a comparable combined modem such as the Pace Series Four.






When the plot to Mastertron-ic's latest Arcadia game converted for home use starts on about giant space fleets locked in a fight to the death, an alien Star Killer ship the size of a planet, and the need for a suicidal volunteer mission to penetrate to the very heart of the ship in a small, one-man fighter, you can tell that it's time to disengage the brain and set up the adrenalin drip.

After entering through the waste water vent (who cares about logic), the first exercise in wholesale destruction takes place in the water distribution level. At the end of this a pair of gates must be carefully navigated to avoid an early demise.

There are five further levels to make mayhem in, and include the hydroponics, residential, flight deck, command level, and finally the control level which needs to be completely blown away to destroy the Star Killer.

The graphics take up the entire screen, whatever the level, which is great to see, especially as the scrolling is wonderfully smooth, there's plenty of alien sprites to nobble, and the surface is literally chock-a-block with destroyable objects.

With nose-splitting explosions,



and rattling good sonics, this is arcade quality action. When things like command posts, oil drums, and ground troops are firing and being destroyed in turn the effect is sweaty palms and maximum excitement.

As well as scrolling downwards, the screen also has limited lateral movement, a la Flying Shark.

Just when the going gets too tough though, the tough get hold of the lettered boxes which infrequently appear and impart such useful ship additions as rapid fire, power shots, invulnerability, and hover which stops the scrolling so that you can get at otherwise inaccessible targets. Xenon was the first page in the book of new shoot-'em-ups, now be prepared to turn to a new chapter altogether and witness a blindingly brilliant pure arcade experience.






Water in the works

An aquarium has been set up which holds exactly 10 litres of water. Evaporation results in the loss of one per cent of the total volume per day, so, to counter this, a jug, full to the brim with fresh water, is added at the end of every week.

After one year has elapsed it is found that to restore the volume to the original 10 litres, two jugs full of water need to be added. Clearly, the jug was slightly too small and so the cumulative effect resulted in an overall drop in the volume of the tank.

If this has happened for 52 weeks, can you determine the volume of water held by the jug?



PUZZLE SOLUTION

Solution to puzzle for 25 February-2 March

Answer: The smallest number of segments is nine in the number 121 – 11 times 11 – and the largest is 27 in the number 6888 – 82 times 84.

Solution: Each digit in the display is made up from a certain number of segments. The values are held originally in the DATA line, from where they can be read into the array $D(\)$. As a dimensioned array begins at subscript zero, D(0) can hold the number of segments in the display of a zero, D(1) holds the number in a '1', and so on up to D(9).

The program then uses two FOR/NEXT loops to test all possible products of numbers from 10 to 99. To prevent repeating a test for any given pair, for example, testing both 16 times 17 and 17 times 16,

the second loop starts counting from the present value of the first loop and not from 10

Two variables are used – H and L – to keep a record of the current highest and lowest segment totals, the L variable being set initially to an artificially high value. Whenever either of the values in these variables is improved on, the variable is updated and the calculation which produced that result is printed-out.

For each pair of multipliers, the resulting product is first converted to a string variable. This variable is then scanned, digit by digit, and the corresponding value in the array is added to the running total to achieve a segment total each time. This is then compared to the current highest and lowest scores.

The required answers will be the last lowest and highest results respectively which are printed-out. $\hfill\Box$

Pounds per column inch

Peter Jackson reviews two word processing packages at different ends of the price scale and outlines their advantages.

f all personal computer applications, word processing is the most personal. Ask 12 users which word processor is best and there may well be a dozen answers, since the choice of a word processor depends not only on the usual criteria of price, performance, features and suitability for the job on hand but also on individual preferences and prejudices.

Naturally the software industry has attempted to satisfy those individual needs with word processors tailored for home users, small business users, big business users, lawyers, scientists and budding publishers, with prices set to match the prospective markets. Large corporations think nothing of spending \$500 on a single software package but home users would expect to get 10 for that price on a good day.

When the fundamentals of any word processing program are the same, involving text entry, editing and re-organisation followed by printing, how can the cost differences be justified? Is a high-priced package like *WordPerfect* really 10 times

more valuable than a low-priced one like *WordStar Express*? The answer is it depends on the user's application, the budget available, and on those intangible qualities of ease of use and transparency, the art of keeping out of the way while thoughts are transcribed onto screen and paper.


Taking WordPerfect 4.2 and WordStar Express in their Amstrad-labelled incarnation as the opposite ends of the price spectrum, it is instructive to look at the marketing as well as their features. Word-Perfect is the undisputed big seller among business users and sells to corporations because it includes every feature you might need and works exactly the same on a wide range of machines, from the Atari ST and the Amiga up to DEC VAX and Data General minicomputers.

First

WordStar Express, on the other hand, is sold as everybody's first word processor. There is no confusing plethora of features – just a collection of the most-used word processing functions made as easy to use as possible.

That marketing difference is clear from installation onwards. WordPerfect assumes the user is familiar with computers in general and MS-DOS in particular, while WordStar Express assumes nothing and starts by explaining, with a useful diagram, the differences between a monitor, a keyboard and a disc drive. WordPerfect lets users install the program as they wish, copying individual files into a speciallynamed hard disc directory, while WordStar Express tells them to run the install program provided and follow the instructions on the screen.

Most obvious of all, WordStar Express requires users to remember only three function keys F1 to get help, F2 to call up a menu of available options, and Escape to cancel the previous operation – while WordPerfect has 40 commands attached to the 10 PC function keys alone. Each function key has a different meaning depending on whether it is typed on its own or with any one of the Alt, Shift and Control keys held down and that ignores other WordPerfect key combinations such

as Home-Home-DownArrow to move to the bottom of a file and Control-End to delete the remainder of the current text line.

That means gaining access to WordPerfect features requires users to make a considerable investment in learning time, while WordStar Express is a get-going-fast package with a much shorter feature list.

Missing

Looking at WordStar Express features it is difficult at first to see what is missing. It has a spelling checker which uses an 85,000-word British dictionary, direct support for hundreds of printers including models costing 10 times the price of the Amstrad PC, a linked mailing list package which can act as a simple database and a set of pop-up utilities including address book, calculator, notepad, appointment reminder book and print-screen functions. That is sufficient to produce any type of document, including form letters, manuals, novels, invoices and the rest and it will even run on a single-drive PC.

WordPerfect, on the other hand, has all that plus an on-line thesaurus, on-screen display of multi-column documents, built-in mathematical functions to calculate totals in tables – say an outliner to produce structured documents – line-drawing functions to produce boxes and borders, automatic generation of tables, contents lists and indices, comprehensive footnote handling, and macro handling which lets users perform repetitive editing tasks with a single keystroke.

Impressive list

That is an impressive list but it is fair to say that the majority of WordPerfect users will never find the occasion to use most of those advanced features and will do the same kind of editing and mail-merge jobs WordStar Express is designed to do. Feature lists are satisfactory but confuse the issue when the features on the list are obscure and rarely if ever used in anger.

What is really at the heart of the comparison between WordStar Express and WordPerfect is nothing to do with the features. It involves the flexibility of the latter and number of user options in performing any task, from simplest letter to the most complex scientific document.

The Find command in WordStar Express looks for text strings and setting-up the Find to look for whole words only or for the correct combination of upper- and lower-case letters in a string has to be set using a global settings menu. In WordPerfect the search can be for text strings or text formatting commands such as bold, underline or tab stops, and it searches for exactly what is typed-in, including upper- and lower-case combinations. Leaving a

space before and after the text string to be found limits the search automatically to whole words only and the search can run forwards or backwards through the text.

Similarly, even something as simple as cursor movement shows the greater richness of WordPerfect options. In WordStar Express the cursor can be moved up and

down a line at a time, left or right a character at a time, to the left or right end of the current line, to the top or bottom of the current screen, or to the top or bottom of the current file. WordPerfect has all those and adds other commands to move the cursor to the boundaries of the page rather than the text area or move it by a specified number of characters in a line, lines in a page, or pages in a document. There is even a special GoTo command which allows immediate cursor movement to a specified character, page, or text column or to the beginning of a marked text block.

Gets you there

These two examples have been chosen deliberately, since text searching and cursor movement are two things every word processor user does frequently and two things which can be very frustrating if they do not do what you want them to as quickly as possible – if not faster. Word-Star Express will get you there, but the flexible WordPerfect commands will get you there faster once you have figured the key combinations.

The same story could be told about almost all of the comparable functions in the two packages. Here is one more example: WordStar Express has file management utilities which let users copy, move, re-name or delete disc files without going to DOS. WordPerfect has file management utilities which can retrieve a selected file to the screen at the current cursor position, delete it, re-name it, print it, change its format from DOS to WordPer-

fect and retrieve it, or display its contents without loading it. All files in a directory can be searched for particular text strings and the names of matching files displayed. If that is not enough, WordPerfect allows a temporary exit to DOS for any further file operations; typing EXIT at the DOS prompt returns control to the word processor

exactly where it left off.

None of this is intended to decry WordStar Express, which is a great improvement on its predecessor Word-Star 1512 and which has mailing list management functions which basically are easier to handle but inevitably less flexible than those in Word-Perfect. The intention is to show that the two packages have differences

more fundamental than their prices, even if the really advanced features of the more expensive program are ignored.

Good job

WordStar Express will do a good job on the straightforward tasks which form the bulk of word processing for most beginners. WordPerfect will do that, too, with some extra little features which may or may not be useful from time to time. Beginners will

not be beginners for ever and simple word processing tasks have a tendency to turn into more and more ambitious tasks as experience grows.

It is then that the depth of an expensive package will gradually be revealed, while the limitations of a cheap one will start to appear.

Put more simply, WordPerfect will do every conceivable job for the foreseeable future while WordStar Express will do only for now.



Over-loader

John Burns, of Churchdown, Gloucester, writes:

I have a Spectrum+ 48K issue 2. Recently it stopped accepting programs greater than 16K. It does load into higher RAM but then hangs up or crashes. Programs below 32768 work perfectly.

An examination of the memory above 32767 reveals that what is poked in differs from what is peeked out.

I have written a program to test memory and have noticed that above 32767 bit 5 is not operating correctly.

Visual inspection of the circuit shows no shorts or open lines, particularly in the area of i/cs 23 to 26 and 15 to 22. The fact that the computer works perfectly below 32768 eliminates quite a lot of possible faults. The voltage/amplitude timing transistor TR3 seems to be missing on this board. The first item I suspected was i/c 25, a 2 to 1 quad data selector and luckily I was able to easily change this since it was socketed.

I still have the problem, however, and if you have a corner of your brain that is not already punch drunk with years of teaser solving, it would be very much appreciated if you could direct a few tips this way.

A It sounds like either the RAM chips (although it would have to be the whole block) or trouble with the connection from the μprocessor to the RAM on the bit 5 line. I do not have a Spectrum of this type I can look at to see what it might be and I am not really an expert on Spectrum hardware. Perhaps one of our readers is able to help? If so,

please drop me a line with any suggestions.

Looking for a pig

Andrew McIntosh, of Halstead, Essex, writes:

There are two problems I am having with my MSX computer that I hope you will be able to help with. The first is about a book you recommended in Popular Vol. 6 No. 30. I know books are available from stockists by mail order, but I feel reluctant to buy a "Pig In A Poke". Therefore when you recommended "The Complete MSX Programmer's Guide" I decided to get a copy (easier said than done). Unfortunately, it seems to have gone out of print about a year ago. I have tried everywhere I can think of, but I have been unable to obtain a copy. Do you, or your readers, know where I can get one? Also, could you recommend other MSX books?

My second problem is on getting Basic programs to auto-run. I have listed a program (shown below) which works sometimes. I do not know why, but it seems to have something to do with what is on the screen before the program is run. Am I right? What can I do to correct it, or can you suggest something better?

The book you mention is, or was, published by Melbourne House and since, as far as I know, the book publishing side of this concern no longer exists, I do not know where to suggest you will get one – perhaps our readers will know. Unfortunately, the other book I would recommend for the MSX, 'MSX Exposed' by Joe Pritchard, was also published by Melbourne House – again any help from the readers?

The auto run program appears

to work by poking the letters RUN followed by carriage return to the screen – at least I think it is the screen, it could be the keyboard buffer (the manual calls location F3FA (62458) GETPNT but I do not know what this means).

At a guess, you will need to clear the screen first and it is just possible that the first POKE i.e. POKE S, 13 should be POKE S,12 i.e. clear screen code – my MSX is not operational at the moment so I cannot try it.

Another, more obvious, solution is to save the Basic program in ASCII format with SAVE"filename" or SAVE"CAS.filename" and use LOAD"CAS.filename",R which will run the program once it has been loaded. The only drawback with this is that it will take longer and use more tape since ASCII files are longer.

By the way, all I can say about the photo is you can't see my feet.

Give us a clue

J T Cicero, of Wirral, Cheshire, writes:

I am in the middle of a crossword program. As you know a Spectrum+ only prints 32 columns on its screen.

How do I made the Spectrum print letters on 64 positions on the screen?

I want to put the clue on the screen beside the crossword but I am stuck for space.

The problem with the Spectrum is that it only has 256 pixels horizontally. This gives 32 columns since each character is made up from an 8×8 matrix. To get 64 characters across you would need to define a character set where each character is made up from only four pixels horizontally. In practice this means that each character can only be three pixels wide since there must be a space between each to make them readable.

For most of the alphabet this is all right but M, W, X, and Q cause problems - you would be better with six pixels across giving 42 characters horizontally.

The most obvious way to get 64 characters is to access the screen memory directly and poke the correct patterns onto the screen.




Fig. 1. - external cassette controller

For example, take the letters A and C as 4×8 matrices (see fig. 1), to put the letters AC at the top left of the screen, use the following program:



As you can see from this, it is not especially readable and you will have to resort to 6×8 characters. Putting these on screen is a little more complex since 6 into 8 gives a remainder of 2 – the solution is to put 4 6×8 characters into the space of 3 8×8 using the same method as the 4×8s.

The best way of doing this is with a machine code program since bitwise AND and OR can be used—these do not work correctly in the Spectrum's appalling Basic (my own opinion).

What you need to do is mask out the bits you want to replace with characters using AND e.g. the top six bits can be set to zero by ANDing the byte with 252. Then OR the pattern into place and put it back on the screen.

Unfortunately this is rather hard to demonstrate from Basic, so all I can advise is to take up machine code programming and then follow the guidelines I have outlined

John Witchard, of Chippenham, Wilts, writes:

I am intending to write a program for my children to help with their spelling and would like to know whether it is possible to use the C64's data cassette as an audio tape player to get sounds through the TV's speaker.

Also, what POKES are used to start and stop the data cassette within the program.

I'm afraid I do not know of a method of getting the C64's data cassette to play ordinary sound through the TV's speaker. The problem is that although it is possible to play external sound through the 64's SID chip, connecting the cassette player to this input and to the normal data input is rather complex since the signals do not, as far as I know, match.

A simpler solution would be to use the 64's user port to control an ordinary cassette player and just use the data cassette for program input. Fig. 1 shows the connections you would need to make to the

cassette player and the user port.

Controlling the 64's data cassette is done with the following POKES:

If a key is pressed i.e. play: POKE 192,1:POKE 1,PEEK(1) OR 32 turns the motor off

POKE 1,PEEK(1) AND 31 turns it on again

To see whether one of the cassette keys is down:

IF (PEEK(1) AND 16)=0 THEN PRINT"The key is down"

If (PEEK(1) AND 16)=0 THEN PRINT"The key is up"

supervisor mode causes the 68000 to use a separate stack and so, when it reaches the RTS instruction, the value on the top of the stack is no longer the return address.

This value is more likely to point to a restricted or nonexistent area of memory producing the two bombs.

As a rule, if a subroutine enters supervisor mode, do not exit it until in user mode again – unless you feel confident enough to read the value off the old stack, pointed to by DO.

Can you recommend a good book about the ST's interrupt structure, interfaces and timers, etc?

I am afaid that you are wrong about the supervisor stack on exit from a call to the GEM-DOS \$20 super call.

When using a subroutine to put the machine into supervisor mode, as you say at the BSR, the return address is placed on the user stack and the subroutine is executed.

If this then performs a GEMDOS \$20 call, the supervisor stack pointer is set to the current value of the user stack so that the return address is exactly where it was before and RTS operates correctly.

It is true that supervisor mode uses a separate stack but in the case of the GEMDOS super call, this is placed on top of the user stack, if (and only if) zero.1 is placed on the stack as the argument to the command i.e.

CLR.L -(SP) * This zero.1 means super mode on top of MOVE #\$20,-(SP) * the user stack. TRAP #1 ADDQ.L #6,SP

If a value other than zero is used, this is taken to be the location of the new supervisor stack base.

To get out of supervisor mode the old value of the super stack is used as the argument to GEMDOS \$20 which returns the super stack to its old position and, as long as all the BSR/JSR/TRAP/interrupt commands have the appropriate RTS/RTEs, then the resulting stack is the old position of the user stack.

The GEMDOS \$20 routine keeps track of the number of times it has been called and on the last call returns to user mode and replaces the super stack pointer with the original, as long as the correct value, i.e. the old super stack

pointer, has been used as an argument.

The upshot of all this is that the super call can be used in a subroutine and for the reasons mentioned above, obtains the correct return address.

The super call can also be used to move the supervisor stack pointer after the machine has been put into supervisor mode but care should be taken in using it from this since it is possible to get the stack pointer mixed up.

The best rule to follow is to put the program into super mode at the beginning and take it out at the end. If you want to move the stack pointer around in betweeen, simply move values to and from A7 remembering to keep all stack accesses even e.g. each BSR needs an RTS.

I am afraid I do not know of a 'good' book about interrupts, interfaces, timers etc.

I learned all I know from the Anatomy of the Atari ST from first publishing, but to say this is a good book on these subjects is rather hyperbolic – you will need to play around with the machine quite a bit to find out what is going on.

hen writing machine code programs on the ST, it is sometimes necessary to be able to check on various values that are being used in the program. This routine takes the 8-bit value in d4 and prints it out as a binary number. To get 16 or 32-bit numbers simply change the value placed in d5, at the start of the routine to #16 or #32 and alter the 1s1.b to 1sl.w or 1s1.1. for 16 and 32 bits respectively.

his short program will provide a directory listing of the disc without destroying the current Basic program. This is

quite useful in many ways, for example, you may have just written a program and want to store it on any empty disc. Using this program you can check the directories of a number of discs without upsetting the program.

The major advantage of the routine is that it is totally relocative, i.e., it can

reside virtually anywhere in memory. The start address is specified in the variable 5A – remember, however, that care should be taken when altering this variable in that the program will not work if it is accidentally written under a ROM.

To get the directory simply type SYS and then whatever value of SA was chosen. □

Cheap and cheerful

o, the time had come, in the words of Ford Prefect, to swallow my pride and join the human race. I'd grown over the last six months increasingly tired of the prehistoric monster I'd built back in '86, which at the time had been a big improvement on my first machine (anyone out there remember Tangerine?) but was rapidly showing its age.

I decided I wanted something more, more memory, more speed, more power, and possibly above all, something which wasn't lost in computing's backwaters.

Well, I looked at what I could possibly afford, and having established an upper spending limit, I looked for what was available. This left me with three possible choices, either an Atari ST, a Commodore Amiga A500, or some cheap PC clone.

I looked around, eventually writing in to this august publication, to try to find a DIY PC clone, in the hope that I could then get one made cheaper than anything 'off the shelf', but this didn't really work out (despite having my nom de plume mentioned three times in this magazine), and the recent article only confirmed those suspicions.

Basically, I couldn't afford a PC clone I liked, and I didn't much like any of the ones I could afford, and, all things considered, decided that a 68000 processor would make for a logical step up from a 6809 processor, despite PC clones being far more like the sort of things I was used to, with their system bus for plug in add-ons, and good old-fashioned DOS command lines. I despised the Amstrad PC's for their monitor fixation, which would have practically prevented me from getting a simple

display to begin with and upgrading it as money provided, and was really thinking that with the coming(??) of OS/2, within a few years any 8088 based machine might joint the dinosaurs, the only PC clone really worth the buying would be at least a 286, the cheapest of which is still a long way above my spending limit.

So that left me with a choice of two, an Atari ST, or an Amiga A500. Which was it to be? I rapidly jettisoned the idea of the 520STFM, for its meagre 360K disc capacity, which really is a bit of a joke.

And what of the Amiga? Well, I considered it, on the grounds of its seemingly superior technical merit, large disc capacity, and general state of the artness, then considered it overpriced for what it was. I also considered the necessity of buying an expensive colour monitor, which the way graphic resolution is going would be obsolete in a few years time, and reflected that with an ST I would quite happily settle for the hi-res mono monitor, for word-processing, DTP purposes, and use a plain colour portable for 'playing about'.

And so, after also considering when I actually wanted to get this new machine, I finally plumped for a compromise. I purchased an Atari 520STM, with separate double-sided disc drive. It may be messy, wires everywhere and two big black boxes on the floor, but it was cheap and fulfilled my need for a decent disc capacity.

This is where the culture shock comes in. Although quickly adapting to the idea of all this mousing about, I still have to admit that these trendy 'user interfaces' can't compete with a good old-fashioned command line, and in blacker moments

consider that whoever thought up the whole stupid idea ought to be shot . . !

I also find myself very annoyed at the fact that the ST manual gives no information whatsoever regarding the operating system, thus necessitating for serious programmers the purchase of several books on the ins and outs of GEM. I believe any computer manual ought to provide the purchaser with every last piece of information, every last address in the jump table, every last system variable, everything. Anything less is only ripping off the customer who then, having already splashed out large sums of money on a machine, has to spend more to find out the information which he/she should have been provided with in the first place.

I now intend to annoy all Atari ST owners by stating irrefutable fact. The Atari ST is not the best small computer going, it leaves much to be desired, both in its use, packaging, and documentation. Just to keep things balanced, the Amiga also leaves much to be desired, and is still, at the cheapest prices seen, overpriced.

So here we come to the crux of this article, and advice to anyone considering plunging in for a new machine. Let me tell you why I chose what I chose. First, it was cheap, secondly, it fulfilled my requirements, and thirdly, it was capable of what I wanted to be able to do. That is what really counts. Don't let yourself be seduced by technical jargon and advertisers' blurbs. Trust the manufacturers about as far as you can spit out a rat, and whenever possible try to get what suits you, not what suits them . . .
