





WHAT PRICE MUSIC?

Once again the question of price comes to the fore in the music field. The average coinman wonders whether he can considerpresent prices out of line, in line or below the line, as compared to what post-war machines will cost. This price problem is one that has arisen in all divisions of this industry almost from the first days machines were produced in volume.

Music men seem to be taking the price situation more to heart than anyone else in this business. Their argument is based on the fact that slots, consoles, pin games, arcade equipment, and all other amusement devices can be rapidly amortized. "But", they claim, "when it comes to music - that's different".

These men are therefore questioning the present price situation with an eye to the future. This is not just the contention of the music machine operator himself, but it goes up the ladder in this field to the music jobber, distributor, manufacturer, loan firm and even the banker. In short, every step of the way there is today in this coin operated music machines industry the question of, "What price music?"

Well, what about prices? Are they too high? Are they low? Generally, the trade agrees that present prices of used equipment are out of line. But what the trade overlooks is that prices of its equipment, like prices of all other commodities, are based on the economic law of supply and demand. Yet, supply and demand, of its own accord, does not completely control price in this field. What does actually control price is whether the men in the trade find that they can amortize the equipment they purchase and, at the same time, profit after a reasonable period of time. In the music field the average amortization period is considered to be 18 months.

Therefore, since the men in this division of the trade are willing to pay the prices now being asked for used machines, it is to be considered that they have learned, in most cases, that they can amortize this equipment and actually profit from it over a reasonable period of time. There is where the price problem rests - on the fact that machines can be amortized over a reasonable period of time and can, at the same time show a profit to the purchaser.

Most music men believe that they must gauge the price they can pay for a phono by the average take they enjoy. They base this take on an 18 months period. In this fashion, they claim, they will realize a profit and not be caught short with the machine when they want to trade it in.

By this they mean, and they figure that the national average today on phonos is \$7. per week, they cannot pay more than \$550 for the best phono on the market. In short, it will take them 18 months to take in this \$550 on this \$7 average to pay for this machine. They can either sell the machine and take the sales price as their profit or continue to run it for another 6 to 12 months and consider this income as their profit.

But all this is based on the fact that what might hold true in one man's territory might not be true in another's. In short, if a music man in one territory is earning far and above this mythical national average of \$7, then to that man perhaps the cost of \$700 per unit is not too much. He not only feels that he can amortize this cost within a reasonable period, but that it will also bring him profit for a long time afterwards.

The bankers in this industry, who usually set the loan valuation on equipment, may have a formula of their own for gauging how much they can loan on machines. It is generally understood that they loan on the market price of the machine against the income of that machine on the route deducting taxation costs.

They have been more or less forced to adopt such a formula, otherwise they might be caught very short in a great many areas. Tho the market price of a machine might be \$600 - the income from that machine, in a certain territory, averaged over a period of time, might be but \$4. Therefore where they might be able to loan one man more on a route where this same \$600 machine is earning a \$15 average they can't loan as much to the man where this unit earns an average of but \$4.

The price problem has always been a most difficult one for this trade to solve. It is based, in this industry, on what the machine can earn. For example, the most beautiful machine in the world featuring a platinum cabinet, genuine rubies for all lighting, and diamond encrusted turntable, wouldn't be worth a thin dime to the men

in this business if that machine couldn't bring in profits. Similarly, a machine manufactured from an old cardboard box, using staples and pins to hold it together, but earning big profits, can almost command its own price.

This was one big lesson learned during this wartime period. Machines of older vintage than some of those last introduced to the field, before the war started, are calling for greater prices than the latest equipment. Why? Simply because they proved to be better money-getters on location. And that's where the test comes in the price situation as regards this filed: What does the machine earn on location?

Some operators now liberally admit that certain manufacturers could have asked a lot more for their equipment than they did, simply because the equipment earned such handsome profits on locations.

But the manufacturer has no advance way of basing the price of his product on what it will do on location. He still must base his price on his experimental, his fluctuating labor cost, his materials and promotional costs, etc., etc., and to this he must add a decent profit, so that he will be able to continue in business and build more and even better equipment for the trade.

Therefore, the many a manufacturer might have afterwards been able to get two and even three times what he charged for certain machines, he still must continue to charge a nominal price. And this price is only considered nominal when the operator learns what the machine will earn for him on location.

Where one man yells about the price being too high, another believes the price to be exceptionally reasonable. Where one man says the manufacturer should have obtained more for his machine, another claims that the manufacturer is an out and out robber. Therefore, there is only one method on which price can be based in this field, whether on new or used equipment, aside from the economic law of supply and demand, and that is on what the machine will earn on location.

No machine, new or used, is overpriced that can amortize itself within a given period of time. The average phono operator usually sets his amortization period as 18 months. He obtains loans on this basis. He depreciates most of his machines on that basis. He continues his business, not on what he earns immediately, but on whether his earnings will be such that they will clear off the cost of the equipment within or on the date he sets.


Therefore the juke box operator who does clear off what he paid for a machine in 18 months (and remember that during this time he is usually drawing a very handsome living from his business) has not overpaid for that machine. But if he doesn't amortize the cost - then he has overpaid, as far as he is concerned only.

The price problem can only become a serious factor when everyone in the trade, from coast to coast, reports to any certain manufacturer that the product he has presented is not bringing in enough to amortize itself in a given time period, and that because of this is not worth the price placed on it. Then this manufacturer is the worrier. Not the operator, nor the jobber, nor the distributor.

These latter can usually clear themselves off fast. They can take their licking on the first samples they purchased, and get out from under. But the manufacturer has to consider all the work that went into that product before it even reached the production stage and what that cost him, aside from the actual manufacturing cost. This is really loss. In some cases, in pre-war days, this loss was so great that many a manufacturer was forced to fold up right afterwards.

It is therefore a more or less ironclad rule that there is no method of ascertaining the price of any product in this field until that product has been tried and tested on location. The results on location will be the answer to whether the price is right or wrong. The phono men in this business who yell about high prices, must simply consider themselves in a position where their territories cannot handle higher priced equipment. They must purchase only that sort of equipment which is priced within the earning capacity of their locations.

But because these men cannot handle higher priced machines, this does not prevent others thruout the nation who can handle them, from issuing price quotations for these same machines far and above anything these former want to pay. This is how market prices come into being. Many in this trade must place themselves in the category of operating equipment that is priced on an income earning standpoint. And to therefore set a formula for pricing machines in advance of location tests would be nothing short of phenomenal.



"TALKING OUT LOUD" DIRECT SELLING MFRS. EXPECTED Many Coinmen of Belief Mfrs. Selling Direct Will Become Fact Post-War. Location Contracts Urged

NEW YORK—A large number of the nation's coinmen are of the firm belief that manufacturers will arise who will sell direct to locations sometime after the post-war period gets under way.

This belief gained momentum some months ago when the first false signs of possible peacetime production were indicated.

Since then many coinmen who have been thinking of this problem, advise that they have heard rumors relative to the fact that certain large manufacturers outside this industry have been planning to work thru their present dealers to sell directly to locations on a time payment and super-service basis somewhat along the lines of the automobile dealer set-ups.

As one noted coinman writes, "There is no reason why such manufacturers can't do a direct sales job. If they already have the dealer outlets, they can designate the very same territories to these firms and arrange for sales of such coin operated equipment as music machines direct to the locations in the dealer's territory.

"Furthermore, by giving complete service direct from the dealer right in the territory, and allowing the location owner to pay for the machine from receipts, there is a certainty that many locations will go for such a plan.

"Why should it be any more difficult for a dealer to create a service force than it is for any operator?

operator? "The dealer can service the phonos with records and needles just as the operator does, take out the receipts and give the storekeeper whatever share the contract will designate, remove expenses, and the balance will be applied toward payment of the machine. Surely the storekeeper is going to like this a lot better than the present arrangement he now has with his operator, where he never gets to own the machine.

"I am fully convinced that such direct selling manufacturers, working thru dealer set-ups, are sure to become a fact during the post-war era. This is one reason I am urging all my friends to get back of the plans which The Cash Box has presented so that we shall be able to put up the kind of battle which will prove necessary to protect our livelihood.

"Tho many thruout the trade claim that direct selling failed time and time again in the past, they do not consider, when making such statements, that there never before existed complete organizations such as now exist thruout the nation which are daily contacting and serving retailers. And these organizations would jump for joy to be able to get something like an automatic phonograph for example to install in the locations in their territories."

It is the hope of The Cash Box that every location which operators now have is under contract so that coinmen will be legally protected from such actions.

SEE BOTTLERS AND DAIRIES TAKING OVER BEVERAGE VENDING FIELDS

NEW YORK—While expectations run rampant as to the possibility of the automatic beverage dispensing business becoming the most outstanding of the merchandising machine field, there is also creeping into discussions among coinmen the possibility that the bottlers of soft drinks and milk will probably be the ones who will really profit with beverage vending machines.

Coinmen explain that the beverage vender is a natural for the average bottler. He already knows the business and he knows the locations in his territory. He knows that his men are servicing spots where one case or even less is being used per day and per week. Yet his drivers will stop and make such sales for they have become accustomed to this small profit business.

Naturally, they explain, when a driver is also given the opportunity to service a beverage vender which will sell 500 and more drinks a day, he is literally in heaven. He has never before enjoyed such profits. Furthermore, they explain the average price per case of bottled soft drinks is around 80c. On a vending machine drink basis this goes well over the 95c mark. At the same time no commissions are being paid to any location that doesn't reach the 1,000 drink mark in a set period of time. And the average commission is about 10% on spots where over 50,000 drinks per month are sold.

The days of 1c and 1½c commission per drink are all over. The large bottlers who are already in the beverage vending machine business instantly eliminate such commissions. The smaller beverage machine operators have followed suit. The claim is that the bottler is enjoying big profit from beverage dispensers. He doesn't fear the cost of amortizing the unit. In the long run it is much cheaper for him to work thru beverage dispensers.

The same, they claim, is true of the milk vending machines. Whereas the average operator, because of the health laws, is forced to service the machines each 24 hour period, the regular milk man enjoys such servicing methods anyway, and because he can see tremendous profit, especially in spots where he can't sell his product, he will be the one to most greatly benefit from automatic milk dispensing.

But with all this, there is still a tremendous demand from the field for the beverage dispensing units. Many operators are planning to enter into this business as soon as these machines become available.

BRITAIN STILL REFUSES EXPORT LICENSES TO AMERICAN MFRS.

LONDON, ENG. — American manufacturers who have been fighting here since V-E day to be allowed to once again ship their merchandise to Britain, are being turned down by the Board of Trade on every argument which they present.

The American manufacturers have explained that it took them almost a generation to develop the British market, and that since they haven't been able to export any merchandise here for the past five years, and unless they can do so very soon, all this missionary work and the expense they have undergone to cultivate the British market will be wasted, and they will have to start all over again from scratch.

At the present time all arguments presented by the American manufacturers have been to no avail. The British insist that the great scarcity of American dollars for exchange would definitely harm them and, therefore, they are withholding any export licenses. In the meantime, this gives the British manufacturers an open hand in

DECCA CLEARS UP SPARKS' COMPLAINT

SOPERTON, GA.—R. N. Sparks, Sparks Specialty Co., Seeburg distribs, this city, writes, "I notice in the current issue of The Cash Box you have published the copy of my letter to Decca and, in turn, I have received a very nice letter from them this morning which I think you should also publish, if you see fit, as this letter is very cooperative. Let's all hope that they are going to wake up and give us a little better service."

The following letter from R. N. McCormick, Southern Division Manager of Decca Distributing Corp., New Orleans, is the one to which Mr. Sparks refers: "Thank you very much for your letter of May 30 directed to our Atlanta branch, copy of same having been referred to the writer by our home office.

"We appreciate very much the constructive criticism you have rendered in your letter, as we are most anxious to serve all our customers in the most efficient, satisfactory manner possible. If you have no use for our Permo Point needles, certainly return them to our Atlanta Branch for credit.

"The Atlanta Branch has been instructed to ship your quota of records regularly, of the types you want and can use. They will ship you no supplies of any kind unless you order them. this market. With no competition, they are rushing in products.

Among the proposals made by the Americans to get around the dollar problem is a suggestion that they be allowed to sell goods here for sterling and let the sterling remain on deposit here until such time as British feels that she can permit the funds to be converted to dollars. This suggestion has been met with the statement that such an arrangement would merely be building up additional dollar obligations that Britain would have to meet at a later date.

Naturally, the coin machine industry is much interested in the fight which the larger American manufacturers are putting up here to obtain export licenses to ship merchandise to Britain. The industry is of the belief that the British market will prove one of the largest and most lucrative for all types of coin operated equipment. The distributors who are gathering together used equipment for export shipment are much concerned about this delay.

OPA CONVERSION PRICES EXPECTED JULY 1

WASHINGTON — Coin machine manufacturers are eagerly looking forward to the new conversion pricing policies which will be made public on July 1 by the Office of Price Administration. Studies now being made in the consumer durable goods division will be completed and analyzed at that time. (Coin machines are classified as "consumers durable goods" by OPA.)


Pending completion of these studies no clue is being given whether or not price increases over the 1942 level will be granted. It was indicated that the standards which have been set up for determining the need for price increases will be used in conjunction with data which the surveys disclose.

Many industry executives claim increases in costs of component parts will prevent retaining the 1942 base. In analyzing costs of their first products for conversion, certain manufacturers stated that the cost of compenents range from 25% to 100% over the last pre-war year. This, naturally, makes it impossible to retain the 1942 level.

WISCONSIN ANTI-GAMBLING BILL AMENDMENTS

MADISON, WIS. - The Governor now has the new anti-gambling bill awaiting his signature, and there is no doubt that he will sign it. But certain amendments have been added and many coinmen here do not believe that this bill now has the meat in it to hurt as much as when originally introduced.

Amendments permit Circuit Court to dismiss actions upon request from District Attorneys and not requiring the approval of the Attorney General. State beverage tax agents shall report violations to the district attorney who must take action within 10 days. This saves much of the trouble wherein originally D.A. could not dismiss any charges and was forced to go to Attorney General.

Coinmen believe that these amendments make things a lot easier. Reports were held up by this publication until these amendments went theu therefore changing entire aspect of this new anti-gambling bill.



LLOWS PLANURGED ON MERS. BY COIN AS REPORTED IN JUNE 12 ISSUE OF "THE CASH BOX"

NEW YORK - Prominent coin machine leaders urged all manufacturers to help create jobs for veterans and to so arrange this help that the vets would be fully protected. This was reported in the June 12 issue of The Cash Box. This report was a follow-up on the fact that such plans had already gained wide publicity for other industries.

The NAMA (National Automatic Merchandising Ass'n.) at a meeting of their publicity committee in the Biltmore Hotel, this city, Thursday, June 21, reported to The New York Times (which paper made their story the feature of its business page)(that, "they were arranging for plans to protect returning veterans, anxious to start a business, from exploitation by unscrupulous vending machine promoters". The plans were outlined by Nathaniel Leverone, president of NAMA (who is also chairman of the board of the Automatic Canteen Company of America).

NAMA also outlined a new public relations program which sets up a nationwide code of ethics and explains the industry's merchandising methods and sales objectives in relation to other means of merchandising candies, nuts, cigarettes, soft drinks, chewing gum, etc.

Mr. Leverone reported to The Times that his organization represents members who own appoximately 2,000,000 vending machines. He also stated that most of the machines were now in war plants and service force training camps.

He stated to the Times, "While the outlook for new production, due to the scarcity of tin and sheet steel is not encouraging, we feel that we can, in the meantime, do a good public relations job. We have adopted a code of ethics which pledges our members to sell nothing but merchandise of the best quality, full weight and full size at a fair price. Those of us who handle service machines, such as scales, locks, lockers, have pledged precision accuracy. In all cases our machines must be geared to return the purchaser's coin when empty. Occasional failures, by the way, are responsible for some heavy breakage.

"We have already run into some cases where veterans have been taken advantage of by unscrupulous promoters of coin operated machines who give the impression that owners have nothing much to do but sit back and watch the money roll in. It will be our purpose to point out that there is hard work attached to the busihess which requires definite qualifications in addition to ample capital. To do the job right a man must have some mechanical knowledge, some knowledge of the products to be sold, and definite business training which emphasizes the part which overhead, maintenance, obsolescence, deterioration and plain wreckage play in automatic merchandising. We are going to get after the 'double-your-investment-in-a-month' boys."

Mr. Leverone also stated that NAMA had a job to make clear to unreceptive communities that vending machines performed useful non-competitive functions obtainable in no other way, and were not a threat to the small merchant.

This unusually fine story, appearing in so noted a newspaper as The New York Times, is going to prove of tremendous value to all the automatic merchandising industry thruout the nation. This is the sort of effort which has been urged on all the other divisions of this industry by The Cash Box ever since its inception.

The Cash Box takes pride in the fact that it made a recommendation that such an announcement be made by all the manufacturers as a group under the status of a "Nation al Board of Trade", thru a "Public Relations Committee", which The Cash Box has long urged be created, and made this announcement directly concerning the returning veterans to protect them, to bring them to this industry in such fashion that they would grow with the trade and help it to reach new heights, many months prior to this announ. cement just made by the NAMA.

The Cash Box now eagerly looks forward to the manufacturers of music and the amusement machines also gaining for themselves greater acclaim and respect by just suc: an announcement of their own.And such an announcement should most definitely come from one central coin machine organization, a National Coin Machines Board of Trade, which would be the common meeting ground for all organizations and all men of this profession.

FOREWORD

Prices continue to be very widely divergent these days. Someone on the West Coast may feel a certain machine worth \$150.00 whereas someone on the East Coast may think it worth but \$75.00. Of course, condition, serial, appearance, demand, territory, quantity, etc., must all be taken into consideration. The C.M.I. Blue Book reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depend on the subscriber to make average price adjustment to fit the peculiarities of his own territory.

METHOD

The C.M.I. Blue Book is to be read as follows: First price listed is lowest price for the week: Second price listed is highest price for the past week. Where only one price appears this should be considered lowest price.
