COUPÉ 'STILL GOING STRONG'

Six months after these men clambered out of the debris which was Miles Gordon Technology, the little computer which destroyed their company is still around.

Alan Miles and Bruce Gordon remain as optimistic as ever about the Sam Coupé which has won so many fans, but has failed to win much of a market share. Last week Miles and Gordon celebrated the first six months of SamCo which was set up after the collapse of MGT to continue the promotion of their unpretentious 8-bit.

Although the Spectrum compatible machine has suffered all sorts of problems, it has managed to avoid home computing's legendary



'cupboard under the stairs'.

According to Miles "at under £200 the disk based system is comparable on a point by point basis with more expensive 16-bit machines, while still running many thousands of Spectrum titles". He pointed out that the Coupé has attracted user groups, fanzines, Public Domain clubs, and says that it is now available

in 11 countries.

Miles insists that the Sam Coupé still has far to go: "It has taken a lot of hard work and help from friends. We now have something solid on which we can build. The Coupé is a toy for children of all ages and a tool for developers of all capabilities."

Users will be offered nine common fonts and all the usual typestyles. Seikoshareckons the sheet feeder could make its new baby a winner. UK boss Shoji Aihara said: "Interest has already come from the insurance and transport industries, whose main applications is multi-part printing." ■

Sugar is still the major player in the UK computer market. His 7.6 per cent sale to institutional investors raised a tasty £33.8 million, and he still holds 36 per cent of the company he set up in the 60s. ■

Government security sham

Appalling computer security within Government departments is costing tax payers thousands of pounds a year, according to Parliament's own financial watchdog

The recently published report warns that crooked civil servants are exploiting flaws in government computers. Some £130,000 has gone missing in a series of computer frauds over the past year.

The report blasts heads of departments for not taking the threat of computer crime seriously enough. It says that Whitehall needs to update its computer security procedures or face mounting losses.

Thirteen cases of computer fraud were uncovered at the Department of Employment alone, where Giros were being sent to curious addresses by unscrupulous computer operators.

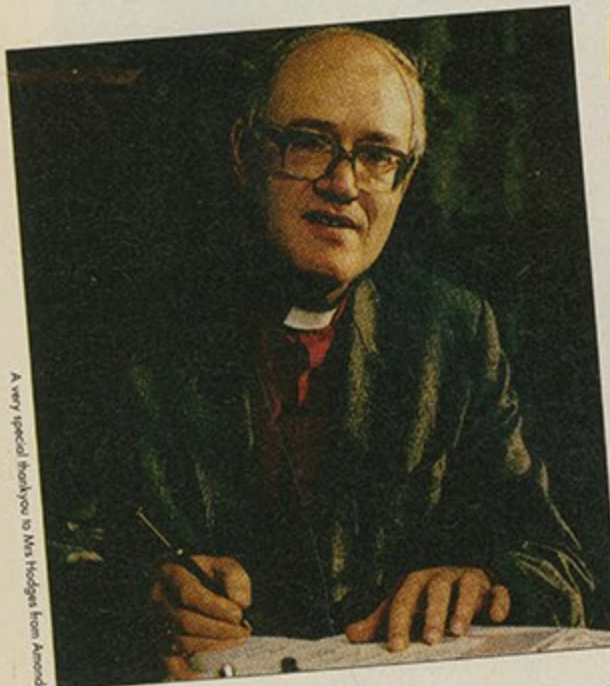
And at the Ministry of Defence, one operator used computers to sell off £17,000 worth of equipment. ■

George Carey, the new Archbishop of Canterbury, has decreed that the Church of England shall join the computer age. For starters, he has installed £12,000 worth of hi-tech kit in his official limousine. The gadgetry includes portable PC, fax machine and telephone.

Other high ranking churchmen will be plugged into the holy network when Dr Carey takes office in a few weeks' time. A spokesman for the Church Commissioners, which handles the financing of such projects, said: "There are times when Dr Carey will need to communicate with a lot of bishops at once. Now he has the machinery to do so." ■

The £149 suite combines word processing, DTP, file management, communications, drawing, calendar, address book and notepad facilities.

Watford claims best bargain crown with Aries notebook

386 LAPTOP FOR UNDER £1,500

A 386 notebook computer has been launched at the "price-busting" tag of just £1,495.

The Aries NB386SX from Watford Electronics is claimed to be the first of its kind to break the £1,500 price barrier. In contrast, Amstrad's very reasonable ALT 386SX retails at £1,999.

Weighing in at just over 3Kgs, including battery, the Aries comes with a 40Mb fast access 28ms hard disk as standard. There's also 2Mb of RAM on board. The screen is the usual VGA backlit supertwist LCD.

Watford reckons it has designed the machine for the busy user. For example, you can quit out of any application by simply closing the notebook's lid.

On the lid being lifted again, the display will automatically re-open where the user left off.

The rechargeable battery lasts for about three hours, and the provided mains adaptor acts as a recharger. Optional extras include a spare battery pack and car lighter adaptor. Buyers will also be offered £150 worth of free software including MS DOS 4.1, GW Basic, word processor, spelling checker and organiser.

A spokesman for Watford said: "As far as we know this is the cheapest 386 laptop on the market. We think it provides power, portability and functionality with exceptional value for money."

Euro research undermined

A computer research and development council, founded by European hardware manufacturers hoping to compete with American and Japanese firms, has opened its doors to American and Japanese companies.

The European Computer Industry Research Centre in Munich decided that it would gain more by inviting companies from outside Europe. Members include Siemens, Bull and ICL, which was almost expelled six months ago after being bought out by Japanese firm Fujitsu.

Curiously, the Centre will be choosing companies which don't directly compete with its own members, thus IBM is not being invited because its mainframes are too similar to those of Bull. ■

'All outbreaks are a crime' - Detective Inspector John Austen

SCOTLAND YARD IN VIRUS CRACKDOWN

As virus researchers around the world warn of a sharply increasing rate of computer infection, Scotland Yard has pledged that all reported outbreaks of viruses will be treated as crimes.

At the National Virus Strategy Group's inaugural meeting last week detective inspector John Austen of Scotland Yard's computer crime squad said: "Every time a virus infects a file, a Section 3 of the Computer Misuse Act offence is being committed. The law provides for a five-year prison term upon successful conviction."

He pointed out that reports of virus outbreaks would be on the increase as corporations realise that in order to claim compensation against viral damage on insurance, they must report virus outbreaks to the authorities.

"Insurance policies will not pay out unless the matter is reported to the police," he said.

Earlier this year Austen secured the extradition of Joseph Popp from Ohio, USA, who is alleged to have sent out the so-called 'AIDS' virus package to thousands of computer users. He is currently on bail in the UK awaiting trial.

The NVSG's members include Interpol, IBM, *Virus Bulletin*, PC

Security and Digital Research. Last week the organisation agreed that virus researchers would assist the police in all investigations and in information gathering. It was also agreed to rationalise the naming of viruses and to build a library of samples which could be used by the anti-virus community.

A study, published in the US on behalf of the Data Processor Managers Association recently, claimed that the virus problem is worsening at a rate of 160 per cent every four months, equating to a six to ten fold increase on an annual basis.

The survey, which covered 150 computerised companies across the US, found that over half the respondents had a continuing virus problem, with 26 per cent admitting to finding a new virus during the month of January 1991.

A spokesman claimed that, by the middle of this year, any organisation with 400 or more PCs will have a 50-50 chance of encountering a computer virus every month. He said that by the end of this year most organisations will have a "100 per cent probability of monthly computer virus episodes".

Dr Peter Lammer, of *Virus Bulletin* in the UK, told *Express*:

"We've got the absolute back-up of Scotland Yard, there can be little doubt that the police treat this as a serious problem. The fact that they secured the extradition of Popp is a good indication."

Meanwhile, at the fourth annual Computer Virus and Security Conference, held in New York a few weeks ago,

keynote speaker Klaus Brummstein, of the University of Hamburg, said that Russia has now replaced Bulgaria as the leading European source of computer viruses.

Many Russian programmers are sending their "work" straight to virus researchers, but some are planting the rogue programs into computer networks. ■

Britain's most common viruses

1. *New Zealand II*. It's a boot sector virus which proclaims: "Your computer is stoned, legalise Marijuana" when you boot up. Also known as *Stoned* or *Marijuana*, it has infected computers all over the world.
2. *Jerusalem*: On the wane now, but still prevalent. It slows your computer down and deletes programs every Friday 13th. Not surprisingly, it's also called *Friday the 13th*.
3. *Cascade*. This one isn't much trouble, and most people don't know they've got it. During October and December 1988 it caused text on computer monitors to flutter to the bottom of screens. That won't happen again until winter 2088 (or if you reset your clock). In the meantime, it slows your computer down almost imperceptibly.
4. *Joshi*. Another boot sector virus. It makes you type: "Happy Birthday Joshi" on certain dates.
5. There's a whole rash of troublesome programs which are gaining circulation. Don't be surprised if you come across *Yankee Doodle*, *Vaccine* and *Nomenclatura*.

Barbarian firm sold

Palace Software, the company which was responsible for classic games such as *Barbarian* and *Cauldren*, has been sold to French company Leisure Holding.

The firm had been an offshoot of the giant Palace film and video organisation. Paris based Leisure Holding is already involved in computer games through the games label Titus.

Palace, which also published the hugely successful *Shoot'em-up Construction Kit* will continue to operate in London. Leisure Holding says that "no immediate changes" are planned for the company.

Palace Group's managing



director Chris Craib admitted that his company could not give the computer games market the attention it needs in these "fast changing" times.

Over the past twelve months Palace has enjoyed success *Dragons' Breath* and *3D Tennis*. New games launches are expected in the near future. ■

Game music comes to CD

The Japanese have been raving about computer game theme tunes for ages. It's nothing new for them to go into a club and listen to the dubious techie tattle of video games, or to settle down by the Sony and relax to the harmonious echo of perishing aliens.

In Europe we've been far too sensible - until now. UK distributor Extendor has just begun selling a CD packed with the sounds of various Thalion games.

Programmed by Jochen Hippel, the CD features bellowings from such classics as *Wings of Death* and *Dragonflight*.

Extendor claims that the CD has already sold 2,000 copies in Germany, and is still going strong.

68000 emulator for power PCs

A Canadian programmer is working on a 68000 based software emulator for 386 and 486 PCs.

Derek Mohoko of Branch Always Software reckons his project will be completed by the summer. Essentially, developers will be able to use this technology to develop commercial Amiga, Macintosh and Atari ST emulators.

Mohoko was also responsible for the Atari 8-bit emulator for the ST which he launched in the early days of Atari's 16-bit machine. ■

THE WEEK IN VIEW

Petra Duffield of the Virus Bulletin attended the first meeting of the Computer Virus Strategy Group...

At the end of August 1990, a British law was introduced to thwart the growing problems of computer crime. Section 3 of the Computer Misuse Act 1990 now makes the distribution and deliberate insertion of computer viruses into computer systems a criminal offence. The police have a clear duty, therefore, to prosecute offences against this act and the Computer Crime Unit (CCU), a division of Scotland Yard, has been given the task of enforcing this law.

Recently, the CCU called the first meeting of the National Computer Virus Strategy Group, with the objective of devising a common policy for dealing with viruses. The meeting was chaired by detective inspector John Austen and detective constable Noel Bonczoszek, who called upon the help of virus experts to establish guidelines for everyone in this field to follow.

In order to successfully prosecute offenders, the CCU has to follow rules of investigation and evidence. To secure a conviction, the prosecution must prove beyond reasonable doubt that the person committed the crime. This may sound obvious, but it's easier said than done where the object of the offence is a computer and the tool is a piece of code.

At the meeting the CCU stressed the necessity for a universal computer virus nomenclature, which will allow the easy identification and collation of viruses. It was also proposed to establish a library of known virus specimens with a central record of virus outbreaks.

Although the CCU acknowledged that users are often reluctant to admit outbreaks, most large corporate users have a fidelity insurance which will not pay out in the case of a computer virus attack, unless the matter is reported to the police. Where the user does not wish to make a formal report of the crime, the incident will be recorded, but as a "non crime", and the user will not be identified in the subsequent report.

The CCU's proposals will be welcomed by all those involved in combating computer viruses. It is difficult to determine how serious the problem will become, but it is safe to say that the threat will continue to excite commercial interest. Scotland Yard's initiative comes as the first step towards uniting individual efforts to fight the virus war and we should look forward to the next meeting in three months time. ■

Micronet re-jigs pricing deal

Don't forget - from this week, subscribers to on-line service Micronet will be offered unlimited free off-peak access to Micronet and Prestel.

Anyone logging on will only have to pay for their local call time. However, Micronet has upped the general subscription rate by £10 for residential customers. You'll now have to pay £30 per quarter, although businesses will still be charged the standard £30.

During the peak hours of 8am to

6pm Mondays to Saturdays users will be charged eight pence per minute - which can mount up in a big way for anyone hoping to sample large chunks of Micronet. Access at all other times will be free, although the offer does not include those areas of the service which carry premium charges.

Micronet's marketing manager Kevin Smith explained: "I'm sure that our customers will be delighted with this change in pricing. The majority are residential customers

for whom free off-peak usage will mean a considerable decrease in costs." He added: "Our more canny users will notice how favourably the costs compare against rival services, once users go past one

hour per month."

This pricing deal follows Prestel's announcement that its charges for BT's Viewdata network are to rise dramatically (Express issue 123). ■

Criminal conviction for code cracker

PROGRAMMER BLACKLISTED

A computer programmer who indulged in illegal code breaking at work, has been blacklisted by computer employees after a conviction of criminal damage to a computer system.

Dipak Dhokia, 27, of Peterborough, worked for industrial tool company Kango. But during lunch hours he tampered with the firm's computer security password. After leaving the com-

pany the damage was found by workmates, who discovered that back-up tapes had been wiped, and they had to spend 100 hours repairing the damage.

Dhokia had moved to a different job before being charged with criminal damage. But when his new employer Peterborough Software found out about his past, they fired him immediately.

Managing director David Laking explained: "He was an

intelligent and a good worker. It's ironic that Kango had given him very good references.

"When we realised what he had done we saw we were holding a time bomb. It's totally unacceptable for anyone here to be involved in this type of thing."

Apart from losing his job and being blacklisted by all employers of programmers, Dhokia had to fork out nearly £2,000 in fines and costs. ■

VDU pregnancy fears unfounded

Fears that pregnant women who work with computer VDUs are more likely to suffer miscarriages are unfounded, according to a new report.

The study, published in the *New England Journal of Medicine*, is based on 2,430 women who have been monitored since 1984. Of the 882 who became pregnant, 14.8 per cent of those who worked with computers suffered miscarriages. But among those women not exposed to VDU's the miscarriage rate was 15.9 per cent.

The average figure among American women is about 15 per cent. Also, women who spent more time with computers were no more likely to suffer a miscarriage than those who spent only a couple of hours a day. ■

PC copies style of deceased top selling authoress

COMPUTER WRITES NOVEL

Literary purists will be apoplectic, computer buffs will be intrigued, and the public at large will probably be mystified. A computer has, for the first time, written a novel.

The 350-page romantic sizer, entitled *Just This Once*, was created by a freelance author and computer programmer who taught his PC to dissect the novels of a deceased authoress, and mimic her writing style.

Californian Scott French chose Jacqueline Susann as the model. She wrote *Valley of the Dolls* in 1968, a torrid tale of drug abuse among Hollywood's rich and famous. It remains the biggest selling novel of all time

with sales of 26 million.

French claims he wrote a program which could study her style, and then come up with a new book containing completely new plots and dialogue.

The computer came up with various ideas, and French chose one which details the lives of successful women in the entertainment industry, who go off the rails in an orgy of drug abuse...

French admits that he had to fill in sometimes, and was required to write about ten per cent of the book. He says that the computer was instructed to hot up the sexy scenes to move in line with today's liberal tastes. "*Just this Once*," proclaimed French "is the next novel she

(Jacqueline Susann) would have written had she still been living now". Susann, who always said her work provided escapism rather than literary excellence, died in 1974.

A spokesman for Bantam, her publisher, said: "I'm neither a lawyer, nor a computer expert, but something about this whole thing strikes me as wrong."

French is unrepentant: "I didn't copy her words, or even sentences, but her way of thinking. I don't think you can copyright the way a person thinks."

He says he got the idea while reading a particularly poor novel, and decided that a computer could do a better job. A publishing deal is being negotiated. ■

Olivetti goes mobile

Olivetti, one of Europe's biggest PC manufacturers, has launched a comprehensive range of portables dubbed, "the mobile computing" range.

The series consists of three A4 sized notebook PCs and two heavier laptops with removable keyboards. Models range from basic 286 to 386SX, and are priced between £1,000 and £3,299.

At the bottom end is the A12 notebook, a 12MHz 286 with a 20Mb hard disk and 1Mb memory expandable to 5Mb. The V16 is much the same, although that zips along at 16MHz and comes with 2Mb which can be stretched to 6Mb. The S20 is the bigger beast, it's a 20MHz 386SX with 2Mb, also expandable to 6Mb.

Of the two portables the most impressive is the D33, a 33MHz full 386 with 4Mb of memory expandable to 20Mb. All come with a touch-pad mouse situated on the keyboard.

Olivetti says it will be launching so-called 'docking station' portables which can be attached to office monitors and printers without faffing around with all the cables and ports which often frustrate portable users.

According to Olivetti's marketing manager Alan Rogers, this will "break the traditional barrier between laptop and desktop computers". He says that Olivetti is confident of grabbing a not insignificant five per cent of the portables market this year. ■

It's a porker

Huxley Pig, currently riding high in the 8-bit budget charts, is to be launched on to the ST and Amiga.

The kiddies TV porker who attracts more than three million tiny viewers every week has also proved to be a hit among younger games players.

What's so wonderful about the new portable? And who will want it?

ATARI'S NOTEBOOK: JUST A NEW STACY?

Atari's new portable machine has a lot to live up to. The Stacy was called a "confusing disaster" by Bob Gleadow, managing director of Atari. So just what is so wonderful about the new ST Notebook and who is it likely to appeal to?

The Stacy found favour, almost entirely, with the professional music community. Its "fold up and go" appeal meant that they didn't have to grapple with monitors or external hard drives. It didn't sell too widely to other sectors of the portable computer market, because of its price, its size and the quality of business software on other cheaper portables.

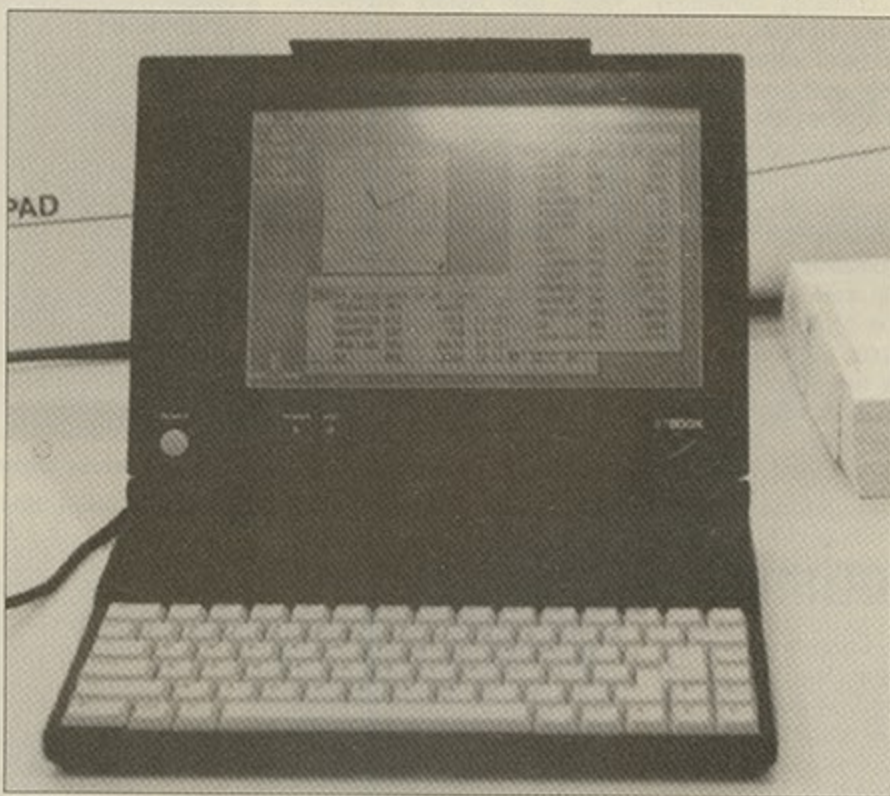
The very best music software is available on the ST. Programs such as C-Lab's *Notator* and Steinberg's *Cubase* are to be found running on an ST in the vast majority of recording studios. Stacy enabled these professionals to run exactly the same software on the road. Therefore it is mainly this group which will be interested in the ST Notebook.

The ST Notebook is an ST with an A4 footprint which will come in a variety of configurations. Two static RAM sizes will be released: 1 Mb and 4 Mb. The base unit will have a 20 Mb hard drive fitted, but it can accept drives of up to 65 Mb.

The ST has always featured a wide variety of ports and sockets; these all find their way onto the Notebook, although in suitably squashed dimensions. The vital MIDI IN and OUT ports are included, though the long called for THRU has been left off. An external floppy drive socket, a parallel and a serial port, a 128-pin port, a modem socket and a mouse port make up the rest of the Notebook's connectors to the outside world. In addition there are two RAM card sockets, which can be of up to 4 Mb.

The display is supplied by a grey LCD screen. This is very clear, though not backlit. One of the greatest problems with the Stacy was the size of the batteries. The Notebook has eight alkaline batteries supplying the main power, these are recharged when plugged into the mains supply. If these cells run down, then a couple of Ni-Cad batteries will hold the computer in a halted state for up to

five hours, giving plenty of time to find a power socket.

Perhaps the most glaring omission is an internal floppy drive. Quite how Atari expects users to transfer data between computers is debatable. For example, if you wanted to load in a sequencer you would have to port it over from another computer, or connect up an external floppy drive unit and save the whole program to the hard drive. The other option is for companies to sell programs on the RAM cards. This would have the advantage of freeing up all the static RAM for actual data space.

So besides the music professional, who might be interested in getting hold of a Notebook? The specification of the machine rivals any other laptop on the market. The big problem is the public perception of PC compatibility. The punters

need to know that they can run the standard PC software on a machine.

The problem will be in convincing the public that there is better software available for the ST. For its price, ST DTP software rivals any other computer. Some superb word processors are available for the ST and productivity software is appearing all the time. However, this big problem of transfer of data again rears its ugly head. The ST has PC readable disks built in, the Notebook will not. You could, of course, simply connect a cable between base computer and Notebook, but this introduces a very technical element, which most people would rather avoid completely.

The computer industry is suitably impressed by the specification of the machine. However they take all Atari release announcements with a pinch of salt. Andy Leaning is a marketing man for Silica, the biggest Atari distributor in the country. He believed that the Notebook would create "an awful lot of interest in this country." However, he foresaw the problems of making the computer appeal to people other than music professionals.

"It falls into the same problem category as the Mac laptop. It has little mass-market appeal for people who want PC portability. I mean you can buy a half meg PC laptop very cheaply these days."

So what kind of applications would the

computer be useful for?

"Well, it'd be excellent for music or desktop publishing, areas the ST is very strong in. I can see it filling a specialist niche that no-one else could fill."

But would the computer aid Atari in revamping its terrible public image?

Leaning thinks it is possible: "One of the best things that could happen, is that the technology could filter down through the ST range, into the home computer market."

Sound Technology is the British distributor of the C-Lab range of MIDI software. Simon Stock, one of its marketing managers was excited by the prospect of a decent ST laptop computer. So is it likely that the C-Lab software will find its way onto the Notebook?

"I presume we'll port it all over, if it'll run that is. A lot of people who'd like to use C-Lab live have been put off because of the problems of lugging a monitor around. I'm not sure that they would actually use a Notebook for sequencing, though. It's more likely that they would use it to keep track of sample files, etc."

So what might inhibit the Notebook from succeeding in the music industry?

"Well a lot of people restrict their use of C-Lab software to the home or studio. It also depends on the price point. It's well worth looking at, in terms of not having to update."

Is it feasible that C-Lab software could be put on a RAM card?

"I don't know whether that's feasible. It would certainly open up opportunities to make use of increased levels of sophistication without tying up RAM. It's an interesting possibility."

Dave Crombie of Evenlode Soundworks (distributor of the Cubase range) agreed with Leaning and Stock. He reckoned that the price point was crucial, but that it sounded like "a Mac killer". He said that the only real difference between Stacy and Notebook, apart from the size, was the addition of the RAM cards. Commenting that it was possible for companies to put samples on the cards, he thought it would be unlikely that Cubase would end up on one.

Atari has said that the Notebook definitely won't be available this year. However, it does seem likely that a spring launch would not be out of the question. The company will have to look long and hard at its marketing options before the machine hits the streets. If the price is right and data transfer is explained clearly, then the ST Notebook could be a massive success. ■

IS THIS PC THE CHEAPEST EVER?

Buying a non brand name computer can often be a trial, especially if it's your first, and even more so if you are working on a limited budget. People 'in the know' will tell you that you can't get a decent PC for under £900, some will even say that is cheap. You will be told that if it's not IBM, Tandon or Compaq then it's not worth looking at. However, the basic fact is that most people do not have the money to fork out for a high-priced machine. So what can a basic unit such as the TriGem 88e offer?

The first thing to get straight is that there are no frills with this machine at all. It is a basic, greyish unit with a single 5.25-inch drive, no hard drive and 512K RAM expandable to 640K. UK Home Computers have bundled the unit with the Philips Professional 7BM713 monochrome monitor. Again, nothing special here, the monitor comes with nothing flashier than a pedestal which allows for slight tilting and turning. It has a 14-inch screen, high resolution tube with what the manual called an 'anti-reflecting screen' although this could be queried when it comes to sunlight shining in from the side. Input is achieved via a 6-pin TTL DIN plug. The only major downside here is that it is a green screen rather than amber – a colour which has been proven to be better for the eyes.

Controls available are brightness, contrast, and the 'inverse knob' which allows you to switch the screen display from positive to negative whenever you get the urge. The other controls open merely to allow you to control aspects such as vertical and horizontal hold, picture slippage, image weight, and left or right positioning. The lack of volume control illustrates quite happily the fact that the monitor comes with no built-in speaker. Frankly, if you are buying a machine to take care of databasing, spreadsheeting or word processing then this monitor will do the job quite adequately.

WORKHORSE

Moving away from the monitor, the computer itself comes with a severe lack of manual. The only documentation you get applies to the bundled GWBASIC (version 3.22, not the latest version by the way) and MS-DOS 3.3 software. As far as finding out exactly what is inside the machine you will either have to open up the box, an action which is definitely not to be recommended, or telephone UK Home Computers and ask. When we did this we were told that the 88e came in two different video configurations depending on when the TriGem in Korea shipped. So, you either get straight mono or mono/Hercules versions.

Expansion ports are all standard and provide the

basic useful functions which a workaday computer should. That is to say you get serial (RS232) and parallel (Centronics) ports, two empty conventional 8-bit expansion slots. Also on the back of the machine is a reset switch. Now why it is on the back shall remain a mystery. One argument has it that you are not accidentally going to turn off your machine, while another says that with the On/Off button mounted at the front there is not a great deal of need for a reset switch in the first place.

The 88e is a true IBM compatible which means, in

just about possible to run Windows on an AT clone such as this, Microsoft does not support the machine, and the lack of speed would make it a tortuous process to say the least.

KEYS TO THE DOOR

The data input interphase – or keyboard – is in the enhanced/AT style. You get 12 function keys and, for once in the budget world, you also get a very acceptable action. This aspect of the machine is often overlooked by a first time buyer – make sure you do not make that mistake yourself. The last thing you need if you have to do a great deal of word processing and/or data entry into spreadsheets or databases is to have to work with a soggy keyboard or one which requires herculean strength.

One unusual point to note about the setup is that the 512K of RAM is not mounted on the motherboard of the system, but is to be found on an expansion card. The single 5.25-inch drive which comes with the machine is all well and good as this type of disk is still widely available. However, it is also possible to add an extra floppy drive and your best choice is going to be a 720K 3.5-inch model. This can be fitted below the existing drive and configured to act as the B drive. The 88e will also support a hard disk, as well as half and full length cards for modems and faxes – hence the fan at the rear of the machine which is just about quiet enough not to be disturbing.

All in all, the TriGem 88e is a decent piece of work. It will run faster than the Amstrad 1512, its obvious competition, but it will not run fast enough to give any thrills.

Basically, if what you're looking for is a standard, hard working IBM clone, and you cannot afford to pay out for big names, bells and whistles, then this machine will do everything a small office would possibly require from it. Its expansion possibilities will keep the machine alive for a good few years, as will its build quality which is

greater than you would expect from a sub-£300 pound price tag which includes VAT and carriage. No problems at all to report. ■

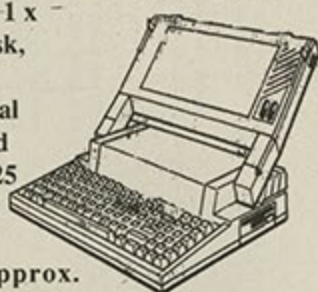

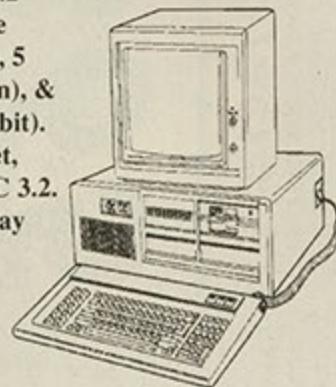

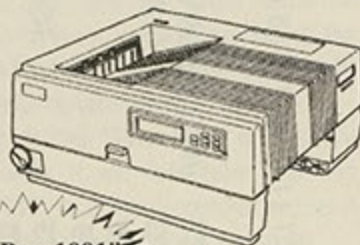

We often obtain copies of games some time before they are due for release - two examples of this are *Prince of Persia* and *Sim City*. In both cases we had the full game cracked one year before they were released in the shops - and the pirate *Sim City* was a bet-

ter product than the UK release.

The exception to the rule was *SWIV* which took two days to crack because of the difficulty of normalising the dynamic loader to make it easy to duplicate.

One of far too many if you ask me. Tell me, if you dare, exactly how you get hold of such early copies. And explain to me, if you can, how you had full versions of *Sim City* and *Prince of Persia* a full twelve months before they were released?

■ Price conscious

While reading the article about a new Amiga format by Gary Penn in *Express 122* I noticed that in discussing the merits of disks versus cartridges, he reckons that the cost of manufacture for a 3-disk game with box and manual is £2.

The question is, where does the other £22 go to, assuming the average Amiga game cost £24 or more? Allowing for royalties to the author, a reasonable profit to the manufacturer plus another pound or so for advertising and distribution, I can't see why games should cost more than £10 or £12. £24 up is sheer profiteering!

Probably everyone in the industry will dispute this vehemently, but being on the side of the buying public, it still mystifies me. Any comments?

Just to keep the sums simple, let's look at a game that sells for £20 at retail. Assuming VAT at 15 per cent (now 17.5 per cent of course, so expect price rises all round), a whopping £3 goes straight into the taxman's pocket.

The shop that sells you a game will take a gross profit of some £6.50, which might sound a lot, but don't forget that there are a whole lot of overheads to pay for when you run a shop - rent, business rate poll tax, light, wages, employer's national insurance and so on.

The distribution company, or the wholesaler who supplies the retailer, is likely to take a £2.50 slice of the price pie chart - and again, that company has to pay a stack of overheads, including transport costs incurred in delivering the game to the retailer.

At the end of the day, the software house gets around £8 in gross profit. For a start, you have to take out the £2 manufacturing charge (which is bit on the low side - in the case of a game like *Supremacy* with a 96-page manual, this cost can be a fair bit higher) - this leaves £6 out of which the software publisher has to fund development (and maybe pay for a licence), pay for advertising and promotion and absorb all the staff and premises costs associated with running a business.

It's only a guess on my part, but I reckon software houses count themselves lucky to make more than 50p net profit on a £20 game - and when you add up the risk that's involved in producing a game and all the money that you have to invest up front, that's hardly outrageous.

If you look at this breakdown, you can see why some mail order companies can offer such competitive prices - if they can get the software house to deal direct with them, then the distributor's margin and the retailer's margin can be

trimmed back significantly – especially if they charge customers for post and packing. But then mail order buying isn't everyone's cup of tea – you have to wait for your order to be processed and the game to be delivered, but if you pop into a shop on Saturday morning with your cash, you can walk out with the game in your hand.

Let's have some comment from readers – I think the editor can feel a feature coming on...

I purchased a copy of *Door to Door* by Geographic on 15th February after seeing a full-page advertisement in *Express*.

I returned the disk to them because my Amiga showed that it had read/write errors – neither the *Readme.Doc* nor the flightplan ran at all, while the buttons for *The Quest* and *Europedata* were ineffective. Nor did I have the free digitised maps of Greater London streets.

I was totally unable to find any inner city street directions, one-way systems or street names as stated in the advertisement, but that may have been due to the faulty disk. So I sent the disk back, and asked for a refund or a working copy that produced the information as claimed in the advertisement.

The company sent me a working disk, but the program still failed to provide a door-to-door routefinder/planner or many of the other facilities claimed in the ad.

As the medium carrying the advertisement, I believe that you have some legal responsibility in the matter – and I await your reply prior to taking action to try to recoup my losses.

And it would appear to have changed its address. (In trying to get a comment from someone at Geographic, I have just dialled the telephone number given in the advertisement, and got a 'number unobtainable' signal; checking with the operator, I find the line is discontinued.)

We are actively pursuing our enquiries – and Keith Pomfret has been given a copy of *Door to Door* by one of our readers, which he will be evaluating fully in *Express* 127.

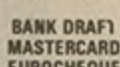
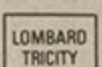

MACWORLD EXPO

As I write this, the MacWorld Expo in Birmingham is fading to a mere memory of hours standing around watching, oh, hundreds of people doing their best to look like a flood of excited visitors to the show.

The UK is about the only country in the world where the premier Macintosh show is not the MacWorld Expo. Everywhere else, the show is eagerly awaited, product launches are saved up and people throb with excitement (can I say that?) in anticipation. But Britain's situation is somewhat different. Long before MacWorld decided that a UK show might be a nice idea, MacUser was already well established, so MacWorld is something of a poor relation by comparison. Also, the fact that it's held at the NEC in Birmingham means that it's not as accessible as the London shows - ask anyone who's waited for hours for a train on Birmingham New Street station.

In the end, the organisers reckon that about 12,500-13,000 people turned up. Unofficial estimates put the total somewhat lower - it was certainly far less busy than November's MacUser show, which was much larger and had about 18,000 attendees. Many of the larger distributors - Frontline and Principal among them - decided not to attend, as did a number of other prominent Mac software houses like MacLine and SoftSel. Of the companies which were there, here are some edited highlights:

Adobe was demonstrating Photoshop on its stand, while on Tuesday the company announced a major new addition to its Type 1 font format which will allow you infinitely variable 'boldness', 'serifness' and any number of other things. Watch this space for further details next week. And

the company also announced that it will be selling typefaces from the Berthold type library; this is very sexy if you're a typographer, and not if you're not.

A M Varityper launched 3B2, a major new desktop publishing package. It's really rather smart, but it's over-£1,000 price tag is bound to put many people off.

Amtech International was showing a range of products, including Ray Dream Designer, a package which turns sketches into full-colour 3D pictures and was impressing the hell out of everyone who saw it. The company also had DiskDoublers, a file-compression package, and Empower, a password-protection program on show.

Bitstream was giving away huge posters showing the company's 1,000 plus PostScript typefaces, and launched its first collection of TrueType fonts.

Claris, the company who brought you MacPaint and MacWrite was showing MacDraw Pro. MacDraw has been rather superceded by products such as FreeHand and Illustrator in recent years, so the Pro application has quite a bit of catching up to do. Judging by the demo on the stand, it may just have done so. More details when review copies become available.

Computers Unlimited showed a number of neat gizmos, including the launch of the Radius Pivot Colour monitor. This is an A4 monitor which can be used in either portrait or landscape format. If you pivot it while it's on, it automatically twists the desktop so that it's still the right way up. This is the first time that the Pivot has been available in colour; it's yours for a mere £1,299 (plus driver card if you want 256 colours instead of 16). The company also announced a new mail order operation, called Software Club, which will sell most of the software and

Last night, I climbed the upstairs after doing the dishes, and started working on this column. I'd put my old 512e/Plus Macintosh in our bedroom, which is also the television viewing headquarters of the flat. Sometimes I like to multi-task, and watch a basketball game with one eye, while I compute with the other.

My daughter was utterly involved in an awful, mindless teenage situation comedy, so her olfactory glands was turned off. She was oblivious to a sharp burning smell. Is it outside? No. The Mac? Yes!

I quickly saved my work and shut everything down. The video hadn't blown yet, so everything looked fine. I was an instant from total wipeout. And I had been very lucky. I've seen real fires when the power supply and video circuitry arc. Flames.

There are two likely and one positive culprits here. The most common breakdowns on compact Macs are a faulty

resistor on the board, or the flyback transformer. If you see a little yellow residue at the top left vents of a Mac Plus, it hasn't been smoking cigarettes. That's a sign of overheating.

The biggest failure has been from Apple. It has known about these problems for years but has never admitted their existence, although any good repair shop has seen too many cases to call it coincidence. There was an attempt to start a class action suit in 1986, but it fizzled.

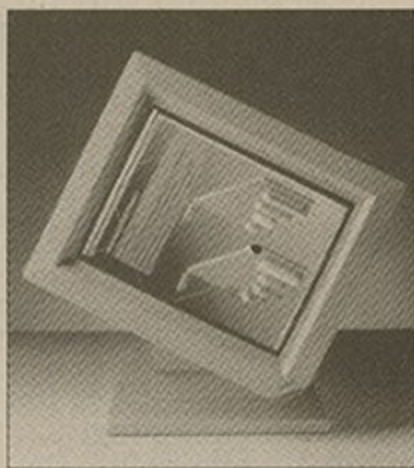

some hardware that CU distributes. The phone number to ask for a catalogue is 081 205 4548.

The boys from **Encyclopaedia Britannica** were there, as usual. Nope, I've no idea why they were at a Macintosh show either, and clearly neither had the rest of the attendees – the stand was notable as being the emptiest at the show.

Microwriter Systems had the **Agenda** pocket computer on show. This is the one with a weird six-button keypad for text entry; the company now has an interface which lets you plug it into your Mac.

Er... that's it. There were more people exhibiting than just these, but no one with anything really new and exciting – at least, not unless you have several thousand pounds to spare.

If you didn't manage to make it to the show, I wouldn't be too concerned; save up for the MacUser show in November instead.

RUMOURS...

Not much to report on this week. The show was virtually rumour-free, and little info has come through from the States. The word is that there will be not one but two 'tower Macs', based on the 68040 chip, which will appear sometime this year. Nice if you can afford them – the price is expected to be above £5,000.

Meanwhile, rumours abound that Apple will start shipping printers and Macs with built-in Ethernet before the end of the year. Ethernet is a network which runs a million times faster than LocalTalk (well, not quite, but it sure seems like it); at the moment you have to buy add-on cards to use Ethernet with the Macintosh.

The Mac II computers are most likely candidates for built-in Ethernet; look out for the Ilicix and IIsix in the fourth quarter (marketing-speak which translates as "by the end of the year if we're lucky").

CONSOLE CALUMNY!

Back when Amstrad first launched the console, the company made a great show of being determined that software publishers should not just get away with porting old code on to the new medium. And rightly so!

However, all that seems to have gone out of the window – at least as far as *Klax* and *Tintin on the Moon* are concerned. Yup, I've just got hold of copies of these two on cartridge...

Klax was an excellent game on tape/disk. In case you've never played the game, it is a *Tetris*-type arcade affair. Instead of using variously-shaped blocks to form solid lines, though, here you're collecting different-coloured tiles on a paddle, then dropping them into a pit below to form horizontal, vertical or diagonal lines of the same colour. Points are scored according to the type and difficulty of the line you make, and there are 100 different levels, each with a specific target – either a certain number of points, diagonal lines, tiles and so forth.

Klax is thoroughly addictive, superbly playable and definitely worth buying... on disk. It would even be worth buying on cartridge for £25 if the disk version hadn't appeared first. As it is, though, the console version is indistinguishable from the old one! Apart from a couple of different backgrounds and a fade here and there, the game looks – and plays – exactly the same. Naughty naughty.

Not as naughty as *Tintin on the Moon*, though. Without having the old disk version of the game to hand, I can't really say whether the console version

is identical. However, the graphics show no sign whatsoever of the enhanced console hardware. It wouldn't be so bad if the game wasn't a complete dodo in the first place! The graphics and animation were excellent (for a disk game) but the plot was... well, there wasn't really a plot, just some nice-ish animated sequences and some rather dull platform adventuring. There's also an arcade sequence where you guide the *Tintin* spaceship through an asteroid cloud collecting fuel. It's not hugely playable, though, but it is hugely dull.

It's a bit sad that there are console games out there that show little or no improvement over the original disk versions. All the more so since the success of the new Amstrads will depend on how people perceive the quality of the machines and the software available for them. It's especially galling when you look at brilliant console games like *Switchblade* and *Robocop 2*.

However, I'm reserving my ultimate kicking for when I can find a copy of *Barbarian 2* on the console. I've only played a demo version, but that too looked just like the disk original. And although *Barbarian 2* had many fans, I wasn't one of them. With graphics that looked like they were made of about three pixels each, and a storyline that wouldn't tax a senile gibbon, it doesn't rate as one of my all-time-favourites, to say the least. And the prospect of paying £25 for a console version... I think I'd better just hold my tongue.

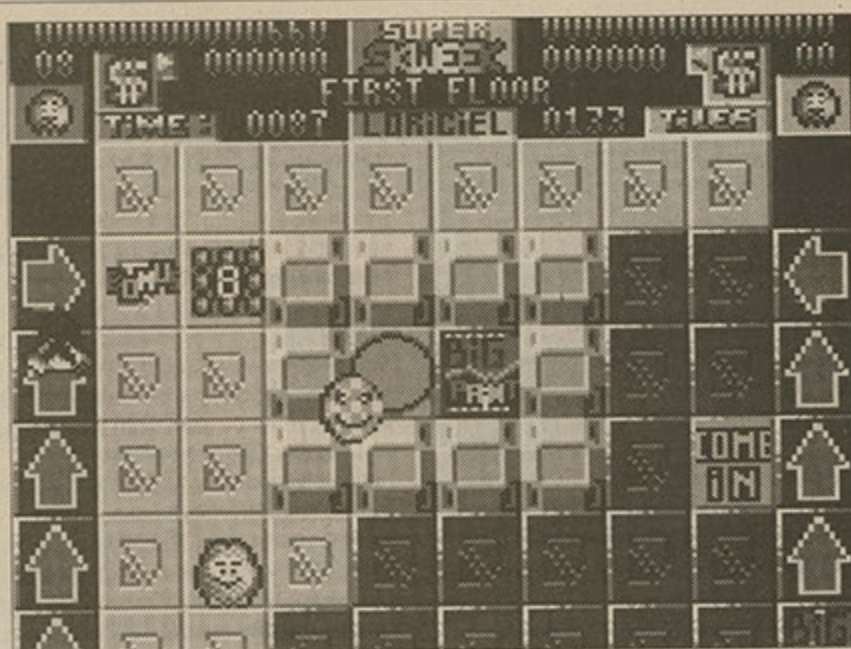

to rush around painting his world pink again after some nasty alien critters came and coloured it blue, is back.

Last time, Skweek had to face a pretty tough range of traps, puzzles and nasties, but in *Superskweek* matters are much, much worse. Thankfully, he's now got his friend Skrouch to help him (in two-player mode, anyway). Enhancements over the original game include wider levels with a correspondingly larger playing area, many more collectable weapons and bonuses and even a shop where you can buy the things! (When you zap one of the aliens, it leaves doosh behind.)

It all sounds very promising. After all, take a successful game and add to it, and you've got a sure-fire recipe for success, no? Well, er... no. The graphics are as bright and cute as ever, but because there is now so much more happening on-screen, they slow down to a crawl just as the action hots up. This is very irritating, as your joystick response is constantly changing. It makes it very hard to time things properly, for a start.

Secondly, although it's theoretically an improvement having all these extra power-ups and goodies, in practice there are just too many to get your head round. You'd have to have been playing the darned thing for ages before you could instinctively recognise the bonuses before you steam into them. And considering that some of the 'bonuses' do nasty things instead - like reversing your controls - that's not

altogether a good thing.

Superskweek is still a very good game, but in gaining loads of features it has lost its principal charm - that of being simple to grasp yet beautifully playable. What a shame.

STOP PRESS STOPPED!

I've had some rather sad news from Database Software. The company is no longer going to be selling its long-running *Stop Press* DTP program. Apparently it has only been selling in dribs and drabs over the past few months, and Database has decided to call it a day, selling remaining stocks to the trade.

I've actually been using *Stop Press* a bit over the past few days because of a desktop publishing article I'm working on, and I've come away convinced that it really is an excellent program.

It is sold in two versions - both with and without mouse - and you can also use a joystick, too (though I wouldn't recommend it). Although a mouse is nice, the program is perfectly usable just from the keyboard.

There's no space here to go into detail about everything the program does. Suffice to say that it's very professionally-produced and presented. The manual is light in tone, but thorough and informative, and the program itself is easy to use.

Anyone after a copy of the program should not contact Database. Instead, try scouring the mail order ads.

NEW MUSICAL AMIGA

Rumours have been floating around that Commodore has developed a vastly enhanced version of the Amiga's sound chip, Paula. According to sources both in the UK and in the States, Commodore is rumoured to have shown the new chip to a select number of developers.

If the rumours prove to be true, the new chip could be available to Amiga users as soon as this December. Even better, because the chip is a direct replacement for the current Paula, all Amiga users (including A500 owners) will be able to have it fitted to their machines, regardless of whether the

new Enhanced Chip Set (ECS) upgrade is fitted.

The most striking feature of the new chip is the number of sound channels - instead of the usual four, the new 'Super Paula' boasts now less than sixteen! (although one of my sources believes that this figure could actually only be twelve). What's more, Commodore is rumoured to have built-in support for PCM samples, therefore allowing the Amiga to produce crisper and clearer sounds.

According to a source in the UK, Commodore may have even built-in a selection of PCM samples, although this

seems doubtful when you consider the amount of onboard RAM that the chip would need to store these samples internally.

Although support for PCM samples may seem rather ludicrous at first, it could well be a possibility that Commodore's engineers are exploring. With the release of the CDTV, Commodore has been working closely with music hardware manufacturers Roland, which has already developed a music product for the CDTV in the shape of 3D-Sound.

Roland has been producing PCM-based music products for years now (the Roland U110 and U20, for example - even their LA Synths use PCM samples to build up synth 'patches'), so it would seem only logical that Commodore could license this hardware for use within their products.

At first glance, it would seem that extending the Amiga sound architecture to a full 16 channels wouldn't be as simple as just installing a new Paula. After all, the Amiga's sound capabilities rely heavily on the machine's DMA architecture, which is an integral part of the Amiga hardware.

On closer inspection, though, it seems that even the current Paula is capable of producing more than just the basic four channels of sound. If you've read Addison-Wesley's 'Hardware Reference Manual', then you may have noticed that it is actually possible to mix waveforms in realtime using the blitter. You could also use a sort of 'multiplexing' system which would allow the same results.

DIGITISING TIPS

How many of you have bought a digitiser such as NewTek's Digiview 4 or Rombo's VIDi, only to find that the results you are able to obtain are far from the quality of those you see in other people producing? Follow these basic tips and you won't go far wrong:

Camera - Unless you're using a realtime colour digitiser like Marcam's FrameGrabber 256, a decent mono video camera is a must. Cameras can be picked up for as little as £75, but it's worth spending a little extra to get a camera that offers a high enough resolution for digitising.

Lighting - If your digitiser is to pick out detail, then decent lighting is essential. Two desktop lamps fitted with 100 watt 'daylight' bulbs are the best bet as these will produce light that is 'natural'. Do not use normal bulbs as these can often add a reddish or yellowish tint to all your images.

These light sources must be fairly close to the object to be digitised, but don't put them so close that they produce glare. This is particularly common if you're digitising from a glossy picture. If glare persists, then you may have to tilt the lamp away from

the image which will reduce glare substantially. As always, experiment to find the best positions for your lighting.

If your images are coming out with a rather 'grainy' finish to them, this is usually because there is not enough light shining on the image. If you have both bulbs burning away, then check the contrast on your camera to make sure that it has not been turned down too far.

Digitising - If you have the memory, try to take all your grabs in interlace mode and then convert them down to low resolution using a tool such as Progressive Peripherals' PIXMate. I have found that this usually results in a much better defined image. In particular, a lot of the 'fringing' usually associated with HAM digitising can be eliminated by using this method of digitising.

EXCELLENCE ACHIEVED

I have always been a great fan of Arnor's Protext (especially with the release of version 5), but I feel that I have finally been tempted away by a product which is quite simply breathtaking.

That product is none other than Excellence 2.0, a high performance word processor from US-based company MicroSystems Software.

MicroSystems certainly knows a thing or two about word processors - more seasoned Amiga owners may remember the company's Scribble, the Amiga's very first word processor (Commdore's own Textcraft excluded, of course!). Scribble may look rather archaic by today's standards, but it set the path for Excellence!

Seemingly like all word processors these days, Excellence isn't just restricted to straight words. No siree. It's actually another in the breed of 'word publishing' programs that have been made popular by such programs as Pen Pal and ProWrite. You use standard Amiga bitmapped fonts and import any 32 colour IFF picture and pull it into your document. Excellence! treats a graphic like one huge character, so it's possible to cut, copy and paste the graphic in exactly the same way as you would for conventional text.

This has its disadvantages, however. For starters, you can't run text around a graphic, so you can often be left with large amounts of white space unless you split the page into columns (another DTP-like feature).

What really makes Excellence! so special are undoubtedly its spell checking and thesaurus facilities. The spell checker boasts a 150,000 word dictionary and the thesaurus beats this hands down with its 1.4 million word dictionary (quite impressive, I'm sure you'll agree!).

What's great about the thesaurus is that not only does it provide alternatives

Archimedes

DOWN THE RABBIT HOLE

After many months of frantic phone calls to Magnetic Scrolls and Virgin, I've finally persuaded them to send me a review copy of *Wonderland*. The wait was even almost worth it!

The game comes on four disks but can be installed on a hard disk - watch out though, as it uses up 2.3Mb. Included in the (very nice) box is an A3 poster, an installation guide, a quick reference card, a map and a 66 page manual - this is not a game that's just been knocked up in half an hour.

Wonderland represents the first major departure in the style of adventure games for a good number of years now. Magnetic Scrolls was one of the pioneers of the 'illustrated adventure' and with *Wonderland* it has really just taken this concept to its next logical step.

Everything appears in a window on a desktop and can be moved around to suit your own personal preference. If you so wish, you can just use the 'Session Window' and treat *Wonderland* as a traditional adventure with straight forward location descriptions and simply 'GO NORTH'-style commands. As with all previous Magnetic Scrolls adventures, you could actually get away with this. The descriptions are very full and colourful and the parser seems to be able to understand anything you care to throw at it.

Apart from the session window, you can display a map (this is updated as you move around the *Wonderland* world), a compass (for directing movement without typing) an inventory and a room contents. These last two depict (with icons) what you are carrying and what is available for manipulation within the current room. Picking up an object can be achieved simply by dragging its icon from the room to your inventory.

You can move about with the compass, or even more simply, by clicking on the location's icon in the map window. Rather annoyingly, you cannot move to a new (ie as yet unvisited) location by using the map window, even though the available exits are shown. Curiouser and curiouser, as Alice herself might say.

Other commands (such as examine, drink etc) are available from a couple of menus, and it is very rare indeed that you'll actually need to type anything. Additional menus are provided for loading and saving games, accessing the on-line help system and setting a number of display preferences.

I only have two criticisms. First, the windowing system is very nice but it doesn't use the Archimedes window manager; instead it uses one of Magnetic Scrolls' devising which is decidedly Mac-like. There are two upshots to this: the game doesn't multitask under RISCOS, and it takes a fair while to accommodate to the (vastly inferior) Mac user interface.

My second complaint is really in addition to this; all the output from the game seems to be geared for a multisync monitor, so on a normal monitor everything has a very stretched appearance. The window 'gadgets' (scroll bars, zoom icons etc) definitely seem rather on the large size.

I can see the reasoning behind developing a generic user interface that can be simply tweaked to run on any given machine, it's just rather disappointing to see a windowed application not exploiting the full power of the Archimedes.

The only feature that's missing from the Archie version is the music. Evidently the author was rather short of space. Who needs music in an adventure game anyway?

Please don't let this put you off, though. I've been playing the game almost non-stop for the last couple of days, and if that doesn't give the game some sort of seal of approval I don't know what does. Apart from the rather annoying features described above, *Wonderland* is the best adventure game available for any home computer. If you've got £35 spare in the first week of April, I don't think I could recommend *Wonderland* highly enough.

Special congrats to Virgin for even considering releasing an Archie version. I wish more big name companies had the courage to support our machine!

The final piece of good news is that Virgin is very interested in producing more games in the future. Keep watching this space!

Interestingly, neither software house has ever released a licensed game (apart from CRL's *Blade Runner*

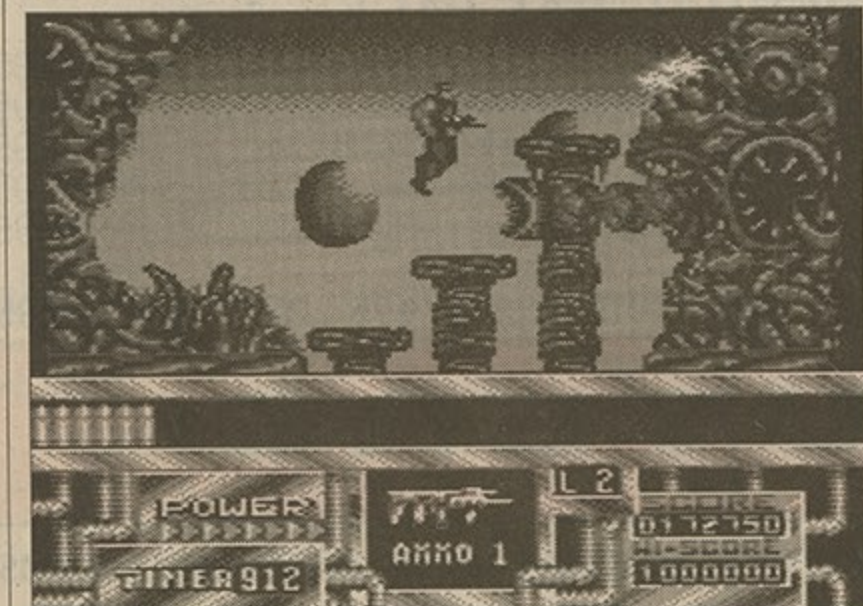

The game collected thousands of percentage points on it's original release a few years back and caused a national shortage of superlatives in the computer journalism world, such was it's unbridled fabness. Since then, of course, we've played a fair few other games in Incentive's *Freescape* series and, as I write, are drooling in anticipation of its 3D *Construction Kit* utility which I raved about last week. *Driller* remains, however, a truly great game, still a long way from reaching its sell by date even if the solid 3D world depicted on your Speccy does seem to move a tad sluggishly these days.

This game is, perhaps, the most adventure based of all the *Freescape* series with a vast playing area to explore as you try to prevent a deadly build up of gas on a moon (the name of which I can't remember) by drilling 13 holes in its surface. 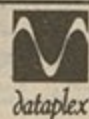

ATARI BACK WITH A VENGEANCE

It's happened. Atari has got serious. In something of a coup, the company has announced two brand new machines, the launch of the Mega STE, a brand new STE bundle and a price cut on the Turbo pack to £350.

Strategically, this means that the Turbo pack now represents the best possible entry into the world of 16-bit computing. The reduced price point should prove crucial in convincing first time buyers not to purchase other less flexible computers.

The Education pack is an intriguing and very clever development. By tagging the ST with the word "education" parents will feel a lot easier about buying what has always been sold as a "games" computer. However the really clever development is the fact that the software bundled with the ST may actually be of some help to kids.

All ages of the family have been targeted, from "preschool" infant to the "suddenly four hundred quid worse off" parent. Much of the software has been specially written for the pack, with words like "national curriculum" banded liberally about. A marketing move like this can only be of help in ridding the

educational establishment of its unhealthy obsession with Acorn and Research Machines hardware.

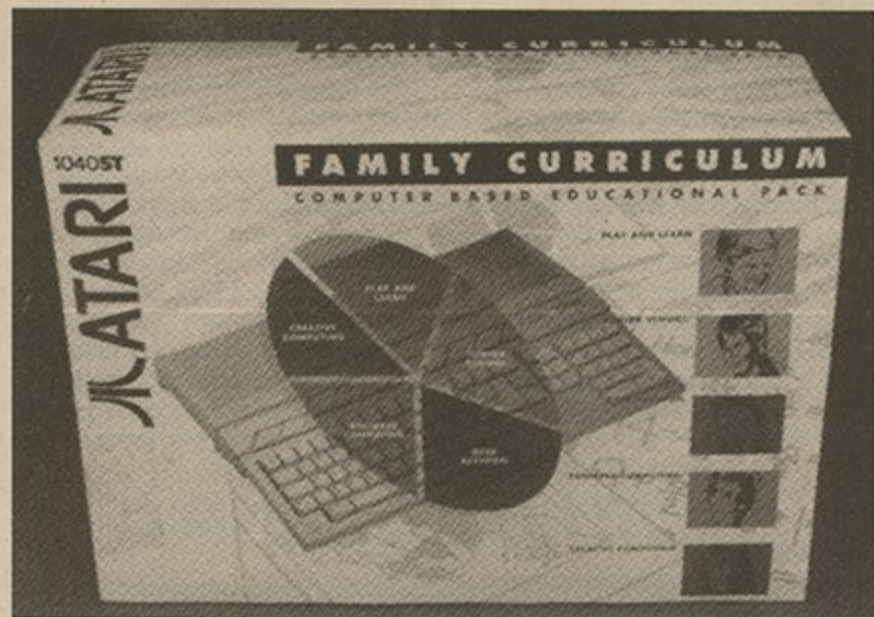
The two new machines will offer a new challenge to Atari. Bob Gleadow, Atari's managing director, called the Stacy a "confusing disaster", so he must be pretty sure that he can sell these computers to the right market.

The ST Book looks great on the specifications sheet. Its A4 footprint, built-in hard drive and proliferation of ports and sockets could breath new life into a staid laptop computer market.

Atari has not announced a price point for the Book yet so I wonder whether it is planning to try and undercut the other laptop manufacturers.

The ST Pad is a different matter entirely. Gleadow claims that the machine will be aimed at those who, "don't want to become computer literate".

This is certainly an untapped market. If the price point is right and if people with "techno-fear" can be convinced to part with some hard earned cash, then Atari is onto a sure-fire winner. The Pad will also appeal to ST/STE/TT owners who could interface the two together.



• The Education pack should help change people's perception of the ST as just a games machine.

At last the Mega STE has been launched in this country and the pricing is excellent. A Mega STE 1 comes with a high resolution monitor, but no hard drive, for a recommended retail price of £688.85. This makes the Mega STE the perfect home business or mid-range home computer available.

It's good to see that Atari has dealt with the problems of the STFM/STE. The new TOS is great, the keyboard has a chunky professional feel to it and the whole unit looks great. Let's hope that some software starts appearing which takes advantage of the processing power of the STE range.

INSPECT A GAJIT

Gajits Music Software is a company which specialises in low cost ST MIDI software. Its latest package is aimed at harried musicians stuck for inspiration.

The Hit Kit helps you to create drum tracks, bass lines, arpeggio patterns or (if you're really stuck), complete pieces of music. Gajits reckons that the program "speeds up" music composition, though there are some people who would argue that programs like this de-humanise the whole song writing process.

Hit Kit can operate in a wide range of styles. Blues, disco, house, reggae,

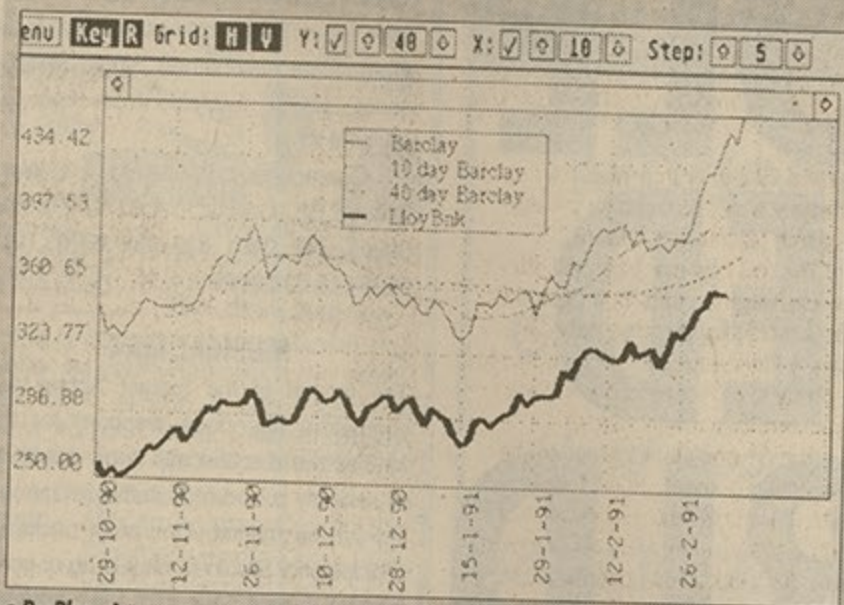

WHOLE WIRED WORLD

In our regular jaunt around the world of computing, Steve Gold discovers a free Atari magazine, two new baud standards, musical Macs and much, much more.

FREE ATARI MAGAZINE

Quill Publishing, the Californian publishers of *ST Journal Magazine*, has replaced the magazine with *Atari User*, which it claims is the first and only free Atari-specific computer magazine.

The company plans to distribute *Atari User* free of charge through Atari dealers, computer stores and computer software outlets on an international basis. To encourage more outlets to stock the magazine Quill will allow certain dealers to charge \$1 an issue, with all the profits from sales going straight to the stockists.

Mail order subscriptions to *Atari User* will cost \$12 a year, with 12 monthly issues mailed to subscribers ahead of the magazine's general release in the US. Quill says that *Atari User* will cover the entire Atari product range, including the ST, STE, TT, Mega ST and

STE series, Portfolio and Lynx computers. There will even be coverage of the Atari 8-bit computers despite the fact that these machines are obsolete.

Atari User's editor-in-chief is a well-known (in the US at least) computer journalist called John Nagy, who promises that the magazine will focus on facts that will make it easier to be an 'Atari User'.

"Every month we will try to cut to the meat of what is happening, what is available, what it can do for you and how to get it," he said. "And we'll do it fast, with less than two weeks between final edits and distribution. Our concept and goal is to be your standard monthly reference for all Atari interests - at a price *Atari Users* can truly say is power without the price - free."

The first issue (May, 1991) of *Atari User* is due for release in the US on April

15 and the first print run will be 30,000. Atari dealers and user groups should contact Quill direct if they want to stock *Atari User*. The publisher is looking for international distributors. Single sample issues will be available from April 20 onwards at \$1.

MUSICAL MAC

The launch of the budget Apple Mac computers has done wonders for the Mac software scene with large quantities of sensibly priced Mac software appearing on the market. One such package, Digidesign's *Studio D*, should be of great interest to musicians and audio enthusiasts. The \$995 package turns the Mac into a MIDI and digital audio mixing console which the company claims is as good as a dedicated system costing 10 times the price.

The system requires an Apple Mac II with a hard drive, Digidesign's Samplecell playback card for the Mac and a black boxdeck that does most of the switching and mixing. The Samplecell is a 16-bit playback card that comes with a 630Mb sound library disk. The black box is actually a four-track digital recording system that can be driven by the Mac.

Using the system Mac owners will be able to import a MIDI file created by any MIDI instrument and then mix it interactively with other audio sources. Extra modules can be added to boost the number of digital tracks beyond four.

TWO NEW BAUD STANDARDS

After months of soliciting proposals, the CCITT, the international communications regulatory body, has formally adopted two new standard recommendations called V.17 and V.32bis.

V.17 is a new modulation system

that supports 12,000 and 14,400 bits per second (bps) trellis-coded modulation for the V.29 fax modem standard. The V.29 system uses 9,600 bps half-duplex transmissions. Fax machines with the V.17 standard should be available shortly. V.32bis, meanwhile, is an extension of the original V.32 standard which dates back to 1984.

The new standards add 7,200, 12,000 and 14,400bps transmission speeds to the 9,600bps seen on V.32 modems. A key feature of V.32bis is a system called Rapid Rate Renegotiation (RRR) which allows V.32bis-compliant modems to renegotiate their data transmission speed (up or down) in just 0.1 of a second.

MAC BOSS MOVES ON



• John Sculley is set to concentrate on breakthrough projects.

John Sculley, credited with guiding Apple into developing and releasing the trio of budget Macs unveiled last October, has officially handed day-to-day control of the company's Research and Development division to Mike Spindler, the company's chief operating officer.

Sculley, Apple's chief executive officer, intends to concentrate on a few projects that he thinks could lead to potential breakthroughs for the company. According to US newswire reports, Sculley is particularly interested in stylus input notebook computers which can also link into mobile communication networks, as well as interactive CD-ROM visual applications. ■

US GAMES SOFTWARE COMPANIES TO MERGE

Two popular names in the US games software industry, Broderbund and Sierra On-line, have announced plans to merge their respective operations.

Under the terms of the proposed agreement, Sierra, which has 3.6 million shares outstanding, will issue 4.1 million new shares of common stock in exchange for all of Broderbund's outstanding shares. When the deal is completed Broderbund will

become a wholly-owned Sierra subsidiary and the consolidated company will be renamed Sierra-Broderbund. The transaction is subject to the approval by both companies' shareholders, qualification for treatment as a pooling of interest, negotiation of a merger agreement and other contingencies.

Ken Williams, Sierra's chief executive officer, will assume the title of chairman, president and chief executive officer of the new company, while Doug Carlston, Broderbund's chairman and chief executive officer, will serve as president of the subsidiary.

So what does this mean to users of the company's software? Initially not a lot, but since both companies have some interesting software ideas, it's a fair bet that by pooling their resources, the new company will produce some nifty software later this year!

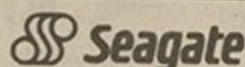

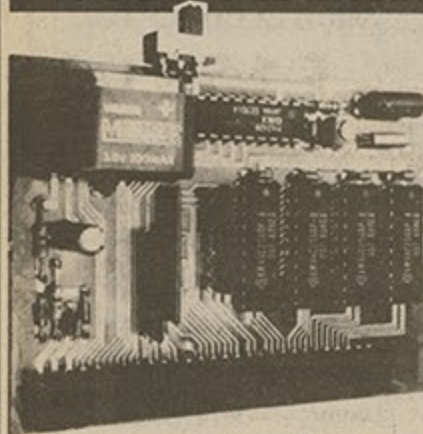

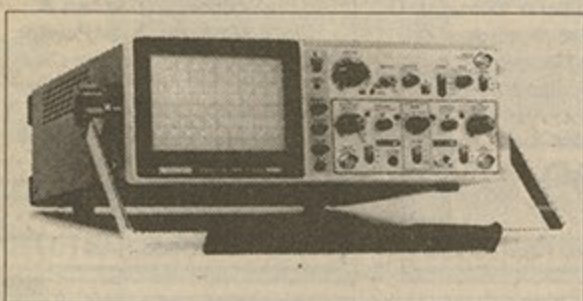

CIRCUIT CITY



An oscilloscope is top of the list as the most desirable piece of test equipment. Keith Pomfret looked beyond the electron beam to see what you get for your money.

Every science fiction film has a couple of oscilloscopes dotted around the mad scientist's laboratory and there's something compulsive about the green trace that makes the human heartbeat more urgent in the emergency ward.

DYNAMIC DISPLAY

Essentially, the oscilloscope is a dynamic tool that lets us know what is going on 'now' in a visual way. The display of an oscilloscope changes as the input varies and it makes the ideal tool to monitor the changing condition of a piece of equipment.

The display of an oscilloscope is generally by a cathode ray tube similar to that in a monitor or TV only generally smaller in size. Some current scopes have a liquid crystal display screen, but the affordable ones are generally CRT.

There's more to an oscilloscope than a simple display, though, and it's the way that the signal is processed that makes it such a clever and useful piece of kit. Two sets of electronic plates (X and Y) within the display tube control the trace on the screen. In order to display anything other than a dot there has to be some way of controlling the trace on the screen. This is done with timebase generators that control the X plates by means of an amplifier.

The timebase generator produces a sawtooth (or forward ramp) wave and the duration of the ramp determines the sweep across the screen of the trace at a constant speed. As the beam reaches the right side of the screen it is electronically shuttered for the period of flyback to the left side. This stops any potential confusion caused by the returning beam.

The input to the oscilloscope is fed to the Y amplifier and this causes the trace to move vertically as well as the horizontal movement caused by the timebase generator X.

Therefore on the screen, the X axis is time and the Y axis is signal strength.

By varying the sensitivity of the inputs an oscilloscope can be made compatible with many different kinds of and levels of signal. A simple task to use an oscilloscope for is viewing waveforms although it would be a waste of a good instrument if you only used it for that. An oscilloscope can serve many functions in the measuring of signals and their timespans.

In order to help with this, the front of an oscilloscope's display is fitted with the grandly named graticule. A graticule is the printed hatch pattern on the

face of the display that makes it possible to align the trace with known points and make approximate calculations about the nature of the input by the position and range of the trace on the graticule.

With a wave or signal that repeats it is easy to work out the frequency from the visual clues provided by the trace on the screen and the calibration on the graticule. Most are calibrated in 10mm increments.

There are two sorts of display in common use. These are medium and long persistence tubes. In a medium persistence tube, the trace remains on the screen for a short while after passing a point. On a long persistence tube, this duration is much longer and more suited to viewing slower moving signals.

Some scopes are equipped to display both sorts of display and show them as different colours to help the user determine which is the appropriate signal to look at. A synchronisation circuit makes it possible for the display window to synchronise with the same point on the wave trace of each screen display so that in a fast moving display, the waveshape on the screen matches previous traces. This makes reading the display simpler and stops the possible blurring effect caused by lack of synchronisation.

BUYERS BEWARE

If you're planning to buy an oscilloscope, it's worth working out a specification before you buy. The most noticeable and one of the most important factors when buying a scope is the size and clarity of the display. Here we come to one of the most contentious points about buying a scope, new or previously used.

There seems to be a plethora of ex military and ex laboratory equipment on the market at the moment. If you are buying second-hand or from an auction or the like, be sure to see the equipment up and working before you buy. Remember that oscilloscopes get used for repetitive tasks and it could be that the tube is burnt or damaged.

Portability can be a consideration too. If you need a scope to use on the bench, the weight and size shouldn't matter, but if you intend to use it in the field, some of the lumpy battle-equipped military models will probably be a little on the heavy side.

Most portable oscilloscopes seem to be of the 20MHz type. This means that 20MHz is the maximum frequency that the instrument can respond to. 20MHz is generally suitable for most tasks. Don't be fooled into buying a scope with a very low frequency response just because you think that you're only going to be working on low frequencies.

THE RIGHT WAVE

A simple example of why this could be problematic is sound. The human ear can hear up to about 20KHz and you might be forgiven for thinking that if your job was purely working on sound, a scope with a frequency response of say 25KHz would be right for the job. Not so. As well as the fundamental frequency, different waveforms have different harmonics. A pure sine wave sound resonates with its fundamental frequency but a sawtooth wave has noticeable resonance at up to the tenth harmonic. This is many times the frequency of the fundamental note. Thus, if you are looking at a sawtooth wave at 17KHz the total frequency trace will be well into the 100s of KHz.

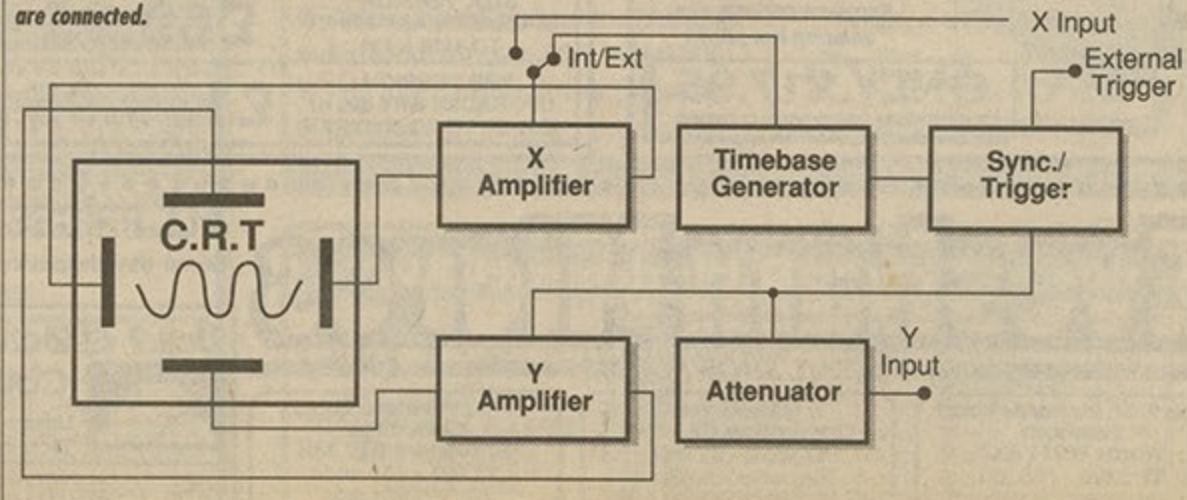
Another useful thing to look for is a twin input twin beam format that allows the comparison of two discreet signals on the same screen. This is ideal if a test signal is available and an implemented signal must be matched with it.

Other things to look for are extras provided with the scope. Most scopes come with a set of leads with probes and/or crocodile clips on the end. Facilities for testing components and logic circuits exist and some scopes even have DC power outputs.

Prices can range from about £75 for a reasonable previously used scope up to many thousands for high spec industrial scopes. A reasonable price to expect to pay for a new scope is £300-£400. For this you can expect to get a good twin beam scope with a bandwidth of 20/40MHz, a 6-inch display and sensitivity of 1mV/div.

Falling into the above category are a couple of scopes from Hitachi. We'll be taking a look at the Hitachi V222 on the Circuit City testbench. First impressions suggest a worthy piece of kit. Hitachi can be contacted on 081 202 4311. ■

TECH TIPS



Open University proving quite a challenge? Need to make your computer communicate? Know a useful program? Send your stories and queries to Keith Pomfret, Tech Tips, New Computer Express, 30 Monmouth Street, Bath BA1 2BW.

■ OUCH! Careful!

To reduce the danger of computer crashes from mains surges, an inexpensive option is simply to fit a Mains Transient suppressor inside each 13 amp plug. The two wires can be easily fitted into the live and neutral connections alongside the mains wiring. PVC sleeving should be put on the naked wires to prevent shorts. These devices are available from Maplin at 48p each (order code HW13P).

And that's very well if you're a wirehead who knows what he's doing, but messing with the 240 volt end of anything is the fastest way to order your own personal embalming fluid.

Unless you have a death wish, leave messing with mains to the experts. It's only a matter of days since a so-called project arrived at *Express* with a plug wired with the mains power to the earth. I mention this only because the project came from an expert who had made a simple soldering mistake when he was tired. If that can happen to an expert, imagine what fried people could be served up by an amateur attempt.

If you have to ask yourself how or

why, don't attempt it. There are much more efficient ways to protect your kit from mains surges which may cost more but do a better job without you having to mess with the mains.

■ UNIVERSITY! Challenge

I am now working on the Open University M205 Computing Course and, after all the earlier anxieties over the suitability of this humble Commodore PC-1, it has been a relief to find that the p-System is quite at home with the small program segments used for programming and debugging practice. It is thanks to the work done by the OU team that the software will work on a minimum specification machine like this and so does not exclude those who might only be able to afford an Amstrad PC1512 or similar IBM compatible.

The fact that all is well for the time being is a great help: it allows plenty of time to look for an Upgrade PC along the sensible line you recommend. And it must be VGA or nowt. I think this also applies to the plethora of portables that have appeared on the scene, many with peculiar super-twist screens or even just CGA. And here for once Amstrad seems to have

set the standard with its fine ALT machines. One of these offered with a "free" Canon BJ-10e Bubblejet is the latest ploy in many shops - almost irresistible to anyone with £1,500 to burn and the need to word process on the move or calculate in corners - or more likely to show off to their friends!

Meanwhile, learning how to do Top-Down Design involves using the computer attached to my neck (a single chip old model with Parallel Inputs called ears and eyes), an A4 pad and word processing biro with built-in 200,000 word spelling checker. The only present I've bought myself is a Citizen CT-600 calculator from Dixons. They were using it for working out customer accounts, so that was recommendation enough - the main reason is the big keys and the replay and check facilities. It is a great help for working out a few steps in a Trace to test that a program with maths calculations is working correctly. In programming there is no substitute for a brain. Even a Super 486 can't make up or the lack of that.

Do you think the Amiga CDTV will be a great new asset and worth waiting for? At under £400 it sounds interesting. Without Ken Garroch in the vanished

The TELE and DATA switches are non-locking and come out when not held in.

■ HELP! CAD on the cheap

I want to get into computer aided design but I've no money. At a recent show I was horrified to find out that it's easy to spend over a thousand pounds on the software alone. My budget is closer to £15 so I will have to settle for a book on the subject. What do you recommend?

It should be a veritable source of inspiration as well as a good template toward economical design work using your computer

■ HELP! Portastudio

Is there such a thing as a dual purpose Portastudio that takes normal multi-track recording and also MIDI. It seems like a great idea but I can't find one.

You haven't been looking very hard then, have you? A walk around the northern music show recently showed at least a couple of manufacturers offering conventional recording equipment with the facility to record MIDI codes on a track.

TASCAM produces the 688 MIDistudio which is a multi-track recording machine using standard cassette tapes. The 688 offers eight track recording with mix and bouncedown facilities and allows the 'striping' of a MIDI code on track eight.

The downside is a £2,000 price tag but you get what you pay for. A multi-track recorder that will take analogue licks and MIDI data while using standard cassettes has to be a bargain at a couple of grand. By the strangest of coincidences, the 688 landed in the *Express* office recently. It's been out and about getting checked out by a couple of professional muzos and their verdict will be coming to *Express* soon.

If you'd rather have a reel to reel machine and you'd like something that will interface with an ST and allow you to control it from within your sequencer package, there's a rather tasty package from Fostex. Now if that nice Mr Fostex will please send me one to play with ...

■ HELP! Word Processor

My PCW 8256 is annoying the hell out of me. I bought it because I am an author and wanted to replace my aged typewriter. The shop sales person said that the PCW was the only dedicated word processor but neglected to tell me that it was compatible only with other Amstrad offerings.

A publisher that I work for on a regular basis is now insisting that I get a PC or use a WP package that is easy to import onto a PC. I got involved in comms for a book that I was helping to write and have a Pace Linnet modem. I understand that the publisher also has a modem and wonder whether a telephone link could be the answer (and save me a £50 train trip each draft). If the phone link won't do, what will?

The telephone link should do the trick. Your Pace Linnet is a Hayes compatible modem and if your publisher has a similarly equipped modem, it should be as simple as a couple of commands (ATA and ATd). The modem manuals should explain the use of Hayes commands to get connected and the comms software that you are both using should have instructions for file transfer.

If your publisher has a manual or non-Hayes modem you should still be able to get on line together following the instructions supplied with both of your modems. If you don't want to go to the trouble of making a connection, you could find a friendly bulletin board or on-line service and leave the files in an electronic mailbox addressed to your publisher for retrieval at his convenience.

One thing you must remember is that the file you produce on your PCW word processor must be readable by your publisher's PC software. The most common sort of text file is ASCII and most word processors can read an ASCII file. The word processor that came with your PCW is *Locoscript* and it's a simple matter to produce ASCII files from *Locoscript* files. If you aren't using *Locoscript*, the chances are that you are using *Protext* which can also turn out ASCII files. You may like to tell your publisher that both *Locoscript* and *Protext* are available for the PC.

■ HUBBLE! Bubble

In response to a reader's enquiry, in *Express* 118, regarding arrays, I enclose the following:-

1) A pseudo-code algorithm for a Bubble Sort. This should enable your readers to implement the algorithm in their favourite language (this is one of the more well-known sorting algorithms and quite adequate for small applications).

2) An implementation of the above algorithm in GW-BASIC (since this is widely available and easily translated into other dialects of BASIC).

I hope the above proves useful.

I enjoy *New Computer Express* a great deal as I program more than one type of computer. Keep up the good work.

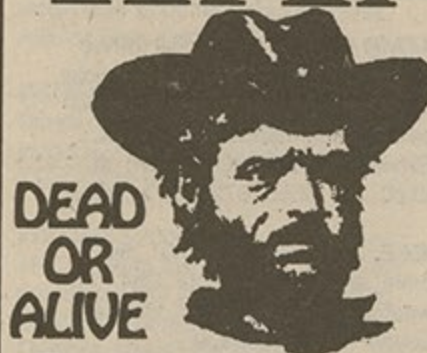

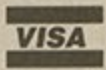

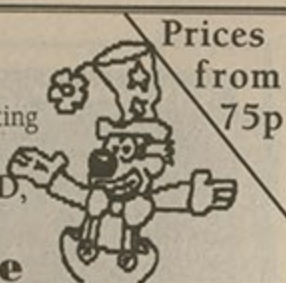

Alfred A Algol (1819-1989)

The Inventor of the first portable

Algol was a bear of a man. He loved to eat honey, savage hunters and appear in Walt Disney films. Born in Amsterdam he was an acknowledged child prodigy by the age of one. He attained a scholarship to Oxford University at the age of three, making him the second youngest ever Dutch Mathematician to attend the University. He majored in Applied Advanced Theoretical Mathematics, and minored in potty training, speaking and joined up writing.

His degree came in double-quick time, with his Phd following at the age of four and three quarters. His thesis was revolutionary and laid the basis for what became known as Predictive Arithmetical Practices (PAP). In it he claimed that whilst studying the works of Euclid and the racing form for a recent Newmarket meeting he was able to prove that a company called Amstrad would appear in the mid-to-late 20th Century, that a man named Hitler would rise to power in Germany, that there would be a melon famine in 1992, and that a British government would re-introduce a poll tax. The last piece of conjecture was poo-pooed as facile. He gave his final speech to the Oxford Union clutching a small black box with a keyboard and back-lit Super Twist LCD screen, a mouse port, serial and

parallel ports, and two feet high battery pack. He called this his Lightweight Computing Engine. This was in April of 1901.

Following this he became an adviser to IBM telling the company to get into personal computers in 1922. He was sacked for his wild ideas and easy living. He moved on to advising the British Government during the war years. Prolegies of his included Barnes Wallace and Alan Turing. To Turing he gave the following piece of advice in 1942: "Al baby, numbers are for mugs, get into computers or at least circular teabags - they're the future for us!". He was sacked from Bletchley in 1943 because of rumours that he was cracking codes and then re-encrypting information out of boredom.

He was last heard of in 1989 when he leapt from the top of the Empire State Building yelling: "It's all right. Statistically speaking someone has to be the first person to live after this and my calculations say that I'm the one." Bits of Algol can still be seen scattered around New York.

While Shopping Express is undoubtedly the perfect way to track down the best bargains in the computer world, many people are still, perhaps understandably, wary of buying products through mail order or through personal ads. This is mainly because you usually cannot see the item you are buying before you hand over your money.

We do everything in our power to make sure that all the advertisements we run are above board. But here are a few tips designed to take the risk out of buying through the post or over the phone.

- Be precise in describing what you want to buy. Leave no room for error. Feel free to go overboard in double checking details - make, model, specifications, colour, size, the page number and name of the magazine in which you saw the advertisement etc.

- Confirm the price you are supposed to be paying. If

you are phoning a company check whether there are any hidden extras, such as postage and packaging.

- Check how the item will be delivered to you and how long it should take. This is especially important with reader ads where delivery details are rarely mentioned.

- If you are writing off for the product keep copies of all letters. If you are phoning, note down details of when you phoned and who you spoke to.

- If possible enquire about guarantees and servicing. Check the supplier's policy on returns and refunds. With reader ads, it is probably best to make the effort to see the item personally before you hand over any money.

- It is best to pay by credit card, especially for items over £100, as this provides extra cover under the credit card companies' own insurance schemes. Otherwise use a crossed cheque or postal order. Avoid sending cash at all costs. ■

As usual, just a few points to bear in mind:

- The following chart is compiled from the reader advertisements we have received for Shopping Express over the last month, and the items listed are those which have been advertised in sufficient quantities to calculate the averages.

- The lower priced products usually need repair work of some sort.

- The higher priced items are invariably offered as part of a package with numerous add-ons and mountains of software. This is why the higher figures quoted under 'range' can often be higher than the machine will cost brand new.

- Remember, this is only a rough guide, so if you find a PC down your local market for £20, bully for you.

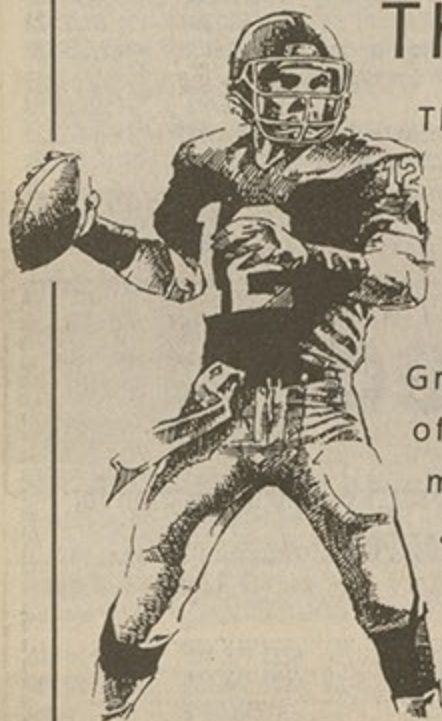

The concepts behind object-oriented programming are far simpler than the hype surrounding the methodology might suggest. The ideas they use can be found in ancient Greek philosophy, in the works of Aristotle who pioneered the organisation and schematisation of knowledge and information.

All programs are organised around the data that they process and the format used to represent that data, but the data is normally seen as input to the process performed by the program; the data is passive and the code must detect the form of the data and deal with it as necessary. In object-oriented programming, or OOP, the data becomes the focus of the program. Different types of data to be dealt with by the program are defined as classes and the properties or values that these items of data can hold are stated in the class as attributes. A particular instance of a class is an object.

An object is fairly similar to a record, which has slots for the different attributes of each data object, but records do not usually carry associated procedures. A class might represent the employees in a database or the windows that a user interface displayed on the screen. One named individual, or the screen displayed when you save a file, would both be objects, with particular values given to the attributes they had inherited from the classes that defines them. Instead of being passed to code that analyses the data and selects what processes to apply to it, the class defines all the processes that can be applied to objects of that class. These are known as methods for that class.

If a class is too general for a specific purpose, then a sub-class can be defined. This will inherit all the methods and attributes of the root class, but you can add more attributes and methods which will be inherited by all the objects of that sub-class. This allows you to build up a hierarchy of the types of data used in the program and to define general procedures that are given special cases only when these are needed.

Classifying data into different types is quite simple and these hierarchies appear to be a very natural and obvious way to organise information about the world. Because all the main methods for dealing with one type of data are encapsulated in the general, root class for that data, making changes to the code of these methods is much easier and cleaner. You only have to change the name of a procedure and the arguments

that it uses once, in the root class, unless you have made changes to the procedure in a sub-class. This reduces one source of bugs, incompatible procedures, immediately; finding and changing all the instances of a procedure in a large program is much harder and more tedious than it sounds.

The class of dates, for example, would contain methods for how to calculate the date, perhaps from the system clock, how to pass the date to other classes that used the date information and how to display the date on the screen when required. Date would have four attributes; the day of the week, the day of the month, the month and the year. An instance of date might be Today, with the values Monday, 1.4.91. This object carries the methods that it has inherited from the class Date, so that it can pass the date to an Alarm object, which may tell the Today object to display itself to the screen, to warn the user to watch out for April Fool jokes.

If you want to deal with particular types of date, you can specify sub-classes of Date, with extra attributes and methods as necessary. It will always be worth thinking carefully about which types of data should form a sub-class. You might want to define a sub-class of DatesToBeAnnounced, to include Christmas, birthdays and anniversaries, but it may be better to make two sub-classes, Holidays, to include Christmas, Easter and bank holidays, and Anniversaries, to include anniversaries and birthdays, because the different dates need different methods. For birth-

days and anniversaries, you need to store the name of those involved as an attribute and you need a method to calculate how many years the birthday or anniversary celebrates by comparing it with the current date, as given by the system clock. Neither of these are needed for Holidays, but you will want to store the reason for the holiday as an attribute.

As well as using the Date class in a calendar and appointments system, you could also re-use it in a banking calculation system, such as the one illustrated. The modular nature of object-oriented programs and the fact that classes capture natural divisions between data mean that classes can often be re-used in this way. Many useful definitions will be available in Class Libraries for the various object oriented languages.

The Anniversary and Holiday sub-classes inherited attributes and methods from a single root class; single inheritance. The banking system shows classes that inherit code from more than one root class; multiple inheritance. The basic root class is an Account; the main attribute is the history of the account, which will give the details of the account holder and the transactions that have gone through the account. One method updates the account history by recording credits and debits, while the balance method keeps a record of the current balance in the account. There are two sub-classes, a Savings Account and a Current Account. Both inherit all the attributes and methods of Account. The Savings Account also includes a Rate attribute, that records the interest rate applied to the account, and the interest method, which credits interest to the account.

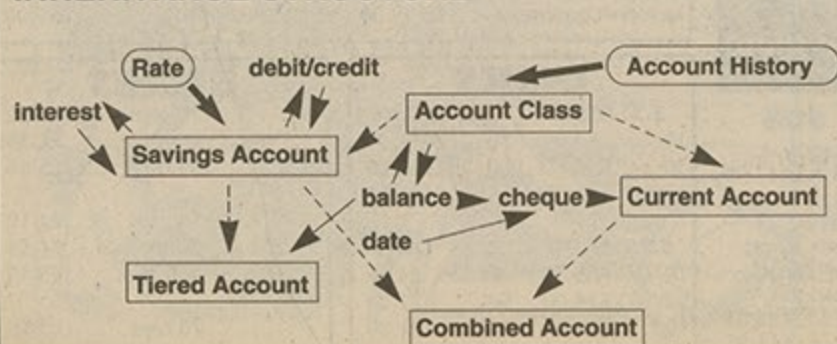
The Current Account uses a date method with the balance method that it has inherited from Account, to create a cheque account, that debits cheques from the account. The sub-class of Savings Account, Tiered Account, inherits the attributes and methods of the root class, Account and of the sub-class Savings Account. It also modifies the

balance method to change the rate of interest when there is a certain amount of money in the account. The last sub-class, Combined Account, is a current account that pays interest, or a savings account with a cheque book, depending on how you look at it. As such it is a sub-class of Savings Account and of Current Account and inherits attributes and methods from both of them, as well as the original attributes and methods in the root class. It does not inherit the modified balance method from the Tiered Account.

Any individual account held by any named customer will be an object which is an instance of one of these classes.

Many of the concepts of OOP were developed in the Smalltalk language. Other languages designed for OOP are Eiffel and Oberon, which is written by Niklaus Wirth, author of Pascal and Modula-2. Object-oriented techniques have been added to a number of existing languages, such as Prolog, Lisp and Turbo Pascal. Some research is being done on producing object-oriented versions of truly functional languages, but the best known and most popular object-oriented language is C++, due at least in part to the popularity of C, from which it has been developed. To make sense of C++, we will need to look at C first, which we will do next week. ■

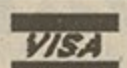

Fancy getting into machine code on your Amiga? The Amiga Coders' Club could be just the thing for you. The club releases a magazine on disk every second week of the month. I saw the March issue, number 10, which was released on the March 11. (Issue 11 to be released is April 12.)

The disks are full of all sorts of advice, hints and tips on assembly language using Devpac and Genam. They are not only for all the brain boxes out

there, though; there are also sections for people new to assembly.

For example, it shows you how to use include files, and generally takes the newcomer through the maze of problems that they are bound to come across when learning to program.

For the advanced user, there are loads of source files with which to tinker, and advanced advice is provided by well known people on the scene who really know their business.

With the exception of the first four (which cost £1.50), the disks are £3 each. However, the birthday issue is due out soon, and will contain two disks for the same price. Bargain!

The Wobbly-Wobbly Scrolly-Rolly Megademo • ST • ZZZsoft • Dem 1.4.90

This demo really lives up to its name! It's been coded by that famous Norwegian cracking outfit The Crud Bores, so you can be sure that it'll be very wobbly indeed, if not wobbly too.

On loading, the program is deunched in order to fit the inordinately large 'greetz' message on the disk. This takes a few minutes, so it's a good opportunity to make yourself a cuppa with which to relax and watch this amazing demo.

When the program has loaded a lot of brightly coloured things fuse your retinas to your eyelids. After a quick toasted tea-cake the demo proper starts. Ray-

traced spheres move around the screen to the accompaniment of a sound-track ripped off from Jean Michael Jarre's *Oxygene*. The message announces that Sparky is a lamer (lamer: someone who is not a complete spanner-head obsessed with microprocessor instruction timings and interrupt driven split screen palette changes), and couldn't code his way out of a paper bag. It then continues to say hello to everyone who happened to be at the Ormsk cracking party.

Anyway the text scrolls in a, well, wobbly-wobbly fashion is probably the best way to describe it. The letters turn inside out and spin round and round, probably using very complicated 3D

mathematic routines honed to perfection. And what better use is there to put these extraordinary talents to? It holds your interest for at least 12 nanoseconds.

A round of toast and a packet of chocolate Hob-nobs later and the demo repeats itself. Not that you'd have noticed that you were reading the same stuff all over again - you'd have switched off long before then.

Heavy duty, but not too heavy weight.
Dave Golder sees if the Victor 386PX
is too rugged and robust for your
average businessman.



LUGGABLE LAPTOP

The V386PX is one of the growing breed of heavy duty, but thankfully not heavyweight, laptops designed to really let the overworked businessman take his work home with him.

Based on a powerful 80386SX 16MHz (switchable to 8MHz) microprocessor with 1Mb of RAM and at least a 40Mb hard disk and an industry standard 3.5-inch 1.44Mb floppy drive the V386PX can rival many desktops in terms of performance, having enough power and capacity to handle many of the larger and more popular spreadsheets, databases and other applications.

It is fully IBM PC-AT compatible and runs under Microsoft DOS and OS/2. Indeed, Victor, apparently eager to promote it as a carry-home version of your familiar office machine, has supplied the laptop with Windows as standard.

PORTABILITY

As for portability, the V386PX certainly seems a couple of pounds heavier than the 13 which the company is claiming, perhaps because of its rather bulky design, and the handle is far from being of the most ergonomically satisfying ever designed. However, it remains relatively light for its capabilities. And at £2,639 it is really aimed at the business users and salesmen who will not be expecting to carry it much further than from the company car park to the office, and over this distance it will cause no great discomfort.

The V386PX is also a true laptop, in that it has a

rechargeable nickel cadmium internal battery so that it can be used practically anywhere. The battery recharges automatically when the computer is plugged into the mains – whether it is actually switched on or not – and a fully depleted battery will take around two hours to charge up completely. The battery has an operating time of around two hours, though intensive word processing, or any other programs that require a lot of memory accessing, can reduce this optimum noticeably.

CONSERVING POWER

However, a number of power conserving features have been included. The LCD backlight will automatically switch itself off after approximately four minutes of inactivity, while the hard disk will shut down after three minutes without a disk access. A series of LEDs indicate the level of battery charge, warning you when you have less than 15 minutes left.

Aesthetically, the V386PX will not win any prizes

for style. Rather angular and squat, it actually exudes an air of robust ruggedness as if it has been designed for use in an environment where it would be expected to take a few knocks and bangs, although this is not what the manufacturers were aiming at. However, this bulky design actually makes the V386PX quite comfortable and easy to use for real laptop work, such as when you are using it on a train; it must have the perfect centre of gravity.

The company curiously describes the screen hinge as "silky smooth"; it actually takes a mighty tug to move it, but the advantage of this is that at least it does not keep flopping over while you are using it, a common problem with many laptops. Even after some vigorous yanking back and forwards, simulating a good few months wear, it did not loosen up at all.

The V386 has a sharp 640 x 480 LCD screen which supports VGA, CGA, EGA and Hercules graphics and can display 16 levels of grey. It only suffers from a couple of problems inherent with the majority of LCD screens; it becomes difficult to read when viewed from an acute angle or in bright light. Fiddling with the brightness control or setting it to reverse video can help a bit.

DETACHABLE KEYBOARD

The key board is not full-sized, having only 82 keys. The numeric keypad is embedded into the main letters grid and is activated via the Num Lock key. However, a useful feature is that the keyboard can be removed from the main casing by loosening the carrying handle. This gives you the freedom to place the screen and keyboard in a comfortable typing position. The keyboard even has little fold-up legs to tilt it forwards if you feel happier with it that way.

If you want to install a full-sized keyboard the V386PX also comes with a keyboard adapter which converts the laptops PS/2 DIN plug to the standard DIN used by desktop manufacturers.

The V386SX has a variety of I/O ports. It has two RS-232C serial ports using standard DB-9 connectors into which an external modem, mouse, scanner or other input device can be connected. A parallel port using a DB-25 connector is provided for link up with printers while external monitors can be connected to the V386SX via a DB-15 port. There is also provision for external disk drives, though the company recommends that you only use its own V386PX 5.25-inch external floppy disk drive as others may cause damage to the laptop.

A rather irritating feature is the reset button, which is set at the very front of the computer. This is handy for desktop work, but very annoying if you are using it on your lap. Occasionally, you need to reposition the computer because it has slid a bit or just because your legs have gone to sleep, and it is too easy to press the reset button by mistake as you are pushing the thing around.

Overall, the V386SX may not be the Porsche or Lotus of the laptops, more of a Volvo really, with an impressive amount of power under its bonnet – functioning well without the frills. ■

SPECIFICATIONS

The V386PX has a 16MHz 80386SX microprocessor which can be switched to run at 8MHz. It comes with 1Mb of RAM upgradable to 4Mb using SIMM type modules on the

motherboard. Disk access time is around 27 milliseconds.

The V386SX also supports Lotus/Intel/Microsoft (LIM) Expanded Memory Specifications

(EMS) and features a 40Mb hard disk and a 3.5-inch 1.44Mb diskette drive.

Standard software supplied with the unit is MS-DOS 4.0 and Windows 3.0.

While many software houses are closeted up busily working away on the big releases for next Christmas, Mindscape has decided that now is the perfect time to launch its 4-D games onto a hungry 16-bit market. Two titles, *4D Sports Boxing* and *4D Sports Driving* are due out for ST and Amiga sometime in April at £29.99, the PC versions having just been released.

4D Sports Driving promises you the stars of road racing and dirt-rack with famous name cars like Porsches, Ferraris, Lamborghinis and Audis. The incredible test-track on which you put them through their paces features challenging stunt items like a full 360 degree loop-the-loop, jump ramps, tunnels and a pipe. *4D Driving* uses polygon vector routines, like those in flight sims and the awful *Hard Drivin'*, but with the added advantage of a fully-movable race camera which can be positioned to view all the action, anywhere. You can even design your own tortuous three-dimensional tracks and swap them with friends. If you're bored of the run-of-the-mill, blocky vector planes and cars, why not check this out?

4D Boxing is a different concept, but one that also uses a polygon vector system to bring the sweaty sporting action to life. The game has vector-drawn figures, which move and act like real human beings.



GAMES WEEK

Neil Jackson gives you the low-down on the latest new games, playing tips, cheats and news.

At the start of each session you create a team of up to 10 boxers determining just how tough, how tall and how heavy they are. Then you have to train them and get them into the peak physical condition for the moment when they are ready to enter the ring and get beaten to heck.

The game's creator, Distinctive Software Inc, has researched all the various boxing gambits and recreated them in this simulation. You can control the type, force and direction of the punches you throw, and your opponent reacts in the correct manner when hit. The challengers duck and dive and flex their arms, just like Tyson and Bruno, but without the lip and the pain! Maybe this could replace the real thing! ■

SCENE 1: As soon as Dirk's crabby old mum-in-law swings her rolling pin, push left on the joystick

BACK TO THE FUTURE 3

ImageWorks Amiga and ST £24.99

Third time lucky, the old adage goes, and it's one that has certainly applies to ImageWorks' *Back to the Future* series of games. Sadly, the first two installments of the trilogy were (at least, as computer games) quite simply, duff! This time ImageWorks appears to have got it sussed.

Back to the Future 3 centres on the star of the earlier movies, Marty McFly, a young lad who is befriended by a mad professor known as Dr Emmet Brown. Brown has invented an extraordinary time-travelling DeLorean car and the pair spend most of the three films nipping backwards and forwards in time like it was going out of fashion.

In this episode, Brown has popped back to the 1880s, but Marty finds out about Brown's imminent demise and returns to rescue him. Complex stuff, but it doesn't affect the game at all. Instead, the play revolves around four sub-games which are all set in the era of the Wild West.

Game one puts you in the role of the Doc, who's trying to rescue his true love, Clara Clayton. She's desperately clinging to the back of an out of control cart which is heading for a huge ravine. You follow on horseback, leaping over tumbleweed and rocks, picking up Clara's dropped luggage while trying to reach her. Mess it up and over she goes!

Game two involves a shooting gallery, hosted by none other than the legendary Samuel Colt. Marty is invited to try his



luck and must shoot down enough targets to prove himself a true gunslinger, and win a new Colt 45.

The event is organised to celebrate the unveiling of the new town clock, and everyone's out in force. This includes Buford Tannen, a mean, nasty sort of dude, who finds Marty a little annoying and decides to try to put him off by firing at the gallery from a nearby window.

Game three is ludicrous in the extreme, but great fun nevertheless. Marty retaliates against Buford and his bunch of homeboys by flinging pie plates at them. They're not quite so stupid and so they decide to use real ammo. Marty has to beat them all off before his metal shield is ruined.

The aim in game four is to travel through time back to the present day. The DeLorean must reach at least 88 miles an hour to break through time, but it's a bit knackered. It needs a helping shove from a nearby train, which is where you come in. As Marty, you have to clamber along the top of the train, avoiding various obstacles and collecting wood, in an attempt to reach the cabin of the locomotive and stoke up the fire to give the car the extra shove it needs.

In all, *Back to the Future 3* is a fun game, and one that will bring enjoyment to fans of the films and the uninitiated alike. It's well-scripted, with plenty of in-between game cameos and scene-setters which convey the atmosphere. Each game section is fun to play, and is neither frustrating nor too easy. Perhaps the only letdown is the fact that virtually none of the characters look like those in the film, but this has more to do with artistes retaining copyright over their fizzogs, rather than poor graphics. Otherwise, *Back to the Future 3* is the best of its bunch, and recommended.

28: Push right when Dirk swings over to the right, then push up.

29: Pull down to get away from the snake, and then push right when you reach the floor.

30: When the snake starts licking, press fire to clobber it.

31: Activate the time-machine by pressing fire.

32: Jump onto the rock by pushing up and then press fire to throw the sword through the wizard's arm.

33: Another non-interactive bit.

34: Not much to do except gloat over Mordroc's displeasure.

35: Push up, then left, then down and finally right in order to escape.

36: Jump on the rock using up, then push right and hit fire to get the Death Ring. Finally pull left to escape.

37: Push up before Mordroc lobs a fireball at you, quickly followed by fire to chuck the Death Ring.

38: Watch and wait...

39: Pull down to get the sword.

40: Pull down to get off the rock and press fire to destroy the gas bag.

41: Pull down before the rocks start to crumble, then pull left and immediately push up to reach Daphne.

42: As Dirk bends over, pull down to avoid the pterodactyl, then push fire. When the second pterodactyl arrives



press fire again.

43: Press fire to swipe the pterodactyl and fire again when it comes around for a second go.

44: Daphne's waking up! It's nearly all over...

45: Fire at the pterodactyl.

MIDI MAYHEM

Attendance at this year's Frankfurt fair indicates that the world's international music trade market is still growing. 1149 exhibitors from 40 countries paraded their wares with British developers being well represented with 102 stands - second only to the massive German presence.

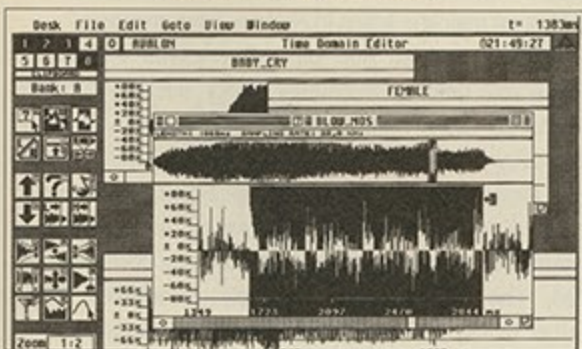
The bi-centenary of Mozart's death was a prominent theme at the show, and his greatest hits were featured everywhere. Nowhere less than at the "Computers and Music" special show where visitors were introduced to the interaction of computers and synthesizers. Eight booths, each with an Atari computer and software from C-Lab and Steinberg allowed you to go to town on Mozart's compositions, detuning his flugal horns and editing his bass lines. More than 90 stalls vied for prominence in the electronic music hall, and what follows is a breakdown of the most striking updates and innovations.

Steinberg continues to lead the field in midi organization with the new *Cubase* update (version 2.0 for Atari and 1.8 for Macintosh), implementing *M. Ros*, the first MIDI-multitasking running on computers from different manufacturers. It allows *Cubase* to keep playing while you use other software under *M. Ros*. Start, stop and wind in sync with real time applications, like the mix automation software *Mimex*, or *Cubase* while editing a sound in a synth-works editor. Steinberg midi-peripherals like *MIDEX*, *TIMELock* and *SMP24*, as well as some hardware manufactured by other companies can be accessed via *M. Ros*.

Cubase 1.8 for the Macintosh offers a freely definable MIDI Mixer. Elements like Faders, dials, etc. may be freely positioned on the screen and it allows you to design complete editors for all MIDI controlled devices.

With *CuBase Mac audio* a new concept for music production becomes available: integrated Hard-disk and MIDI recording within one program. Audio data such as vocals or guitar can be recorded and edited in *Cubase* in the same way as MIDI data. Audio data is "non-destructive", ie. the original recording is not changed and copies do not need additional space on hard-disk. Any number of Audio tracks can be recorded and assigned to the available outputs.

STEINBERG SAMPLES



Avalon 2.0, Steinberg's updated sample editor deserves a mention. Two new program modules have been added. The Sound Synthesis Page allows you to create software synth on screen with a multitude of sounds and effects available. The new Timestretch module lets you lengthen or shorten a sample without changing its pitch. This is impressive, meaning the loss of the Mickey-Mouse effect when speeding up a vocal for example. Unfortunately, Steinberg was using a

Madonna track to demonstrate this effect and it turns out she sounds like Micky-mouse whatever speed you play her at. Steinberg updates are available from autumn. *Cubase 1.8* approx £340, *Cubase Audio* approx £460, *Cubase 2.01* approx £330, *Avalon 2.0* approx £230.

C-Lab are focusing on what they call "International product support" This means more updates and it's very much the same story from the other main software designers Hybrid Arts and Passport. *Notator Update 3.1* offers improved Arrange mode with the addition of a new Graphic display for quick and easy Real time song viewing and editing. You also have the option to view 32 tracks at once on the main page as well as the original 16 3.1 offers a link to the work of desktop publishing. Instead of printing your score to paper you can now print to disc, saving your score as a standard ATARI.IMG graphics file allowing it to be used with many Postscript compatible DTP programs for what they C-Lab call "truly professional output". For notation of drum parts a single lined stave is also available. *Notator Upgrade 3.1* is out now at around £160.

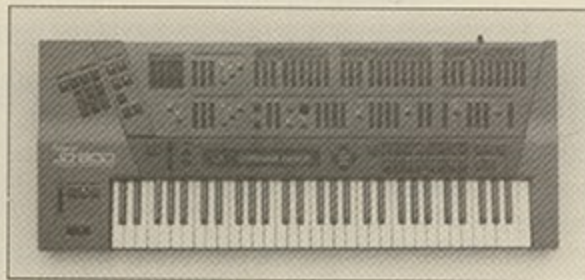
Notable amongst the Passport range of software updates is the *Master Tracks Pro 4.5* an upgrade of the celebrated Macintosh sequencer *Pro 4*. New features are the Overdub Record Mode which permits recording directly over a track without erasing existing data, Loop Record which allows you to build up tracks, layering music continuously, in the same manner as you would with a drum machine. Volume faders are added to the track sheet for live mixing of MIDI volume. This gives immediate graphic and numerical feedback of your mix. *Pro 4.5* costs £349 and is out now. Passport products are distributed in the UK by MCM on 081-963-0663.

RETROTECH DESIGNS

But all in all there was nothing truly momentous from the software manufacturers. Frankfurt featured updates everywhere - focusing on improved user-friendliness, time-stretching facilities, on-screen faders, wavestations for graphic manipulation of audio wave-forms and enhanced desk-top printing systems.

Roland, the Big Brother of hardware, went completely beserk at this year's fair with 200 exhibits, 30 new products and 1,200m of floor space. And since they spent so much money on T-shirts it's only fair to mention a couple of their new ideas. The S-750 Digital Sampler is an affordable version of the much vaunted S-770. It is a 24 voice stereo sampler with 32 multi-timbre parts, having the same tonal quality, the same memory storage capacity and the same software features as the S-770. Memory storage capacity is 2Mb, this capable of being rigged up to 18 Mb. The maximum sample time based on the highest scanning rate is 96 seconds in stereo. Its affordable price is £2,750, available in May.

Apparently last year was poor for high-tech/key-board sales in general and the effect on this year's releases was visible. Out go faceless screen dominated workstations, black boxes and yet more software



sequencers, and enter "consumer MIDI" and instruments for dedicated players. Nostalgia is very evident with Rolands leading synth launch, the JD 800 - its front panel awash with knobs and sliders just like the good old analogue days. It has 108 preset waveforms sampled from the best synths of the past decade and can be edited in real time using modern programming parameters. Its also multi-timbral, 24-voice polyphonic, and has many built-in effects including distortion, phaser, and reverbs. The sounds are "massive" and it costs £1,699 - available next month.

Roland also released the VK-1000 under the Rhodes banner. This synth has 13 draw-bars with which you mix sampled waveforms as opposed to harmonics. Its Hammond sounds are pretty convincing and it has plenty of strutting 60s-type ready organs too. Built in effects include wow, distortion, reverb, delay, and the all-important "Revo" for rotary speaker simulation. It costs £1850 next month and if you think that's expensive, read on.

UNFEASIBLY LARGE ORGAN



Hammond sounds have always been my own personal acid test for assessing credible synth simulation. Because it is so distinctive it is easy to recognise and easy to fault. Its attraction in synth form is enhanced by the fact that a real Hammond and Leslie outfit costs a second mortgage and needs a three ton van to ferry it around. Now Hammond (Hammond Suzuki) has sorted it all out with the release of the XB-2, its own portable with nine draw-bars, percussion switches, key click, overdrive and slow/fast Leslie control. The XB-2 is MIDI compatible and there are extensive zoning and multi-timbral facilities. Some 24 patches can be programmed in addition to the 24 presets. I've heard it sounds great, it's a technical break-through for all Jimmy Smith lovers even if it does cost £12,450 with digital reverb and £10,994 without. ■

CD-ROM DRIVE

HARDWARE/SOFTWARE



Now that CD-ROM has moved firmly from the realms of the "latest gimmick" to being a viable system for storing vast amounts of information, CD-ROM drives are becoming sleeker, more compact and, most importantly, within easier financial reach of the average small business.

The Philips CM50, from the people who originated the whole CD revolution, is one of the first of this new breed. It is only slightly larger than an average portable CD player and retails at a tantalisingly reasonable £399, for which you receive a system with a whopping memory capacity of up to 635 Mb. What should also make it enticing to first time CD-ROM users is the fact that it is easy to use and so straightforward and simple to install. Anyone with the slightest knowledge of a PC and of DOS should have it up and running in no time.

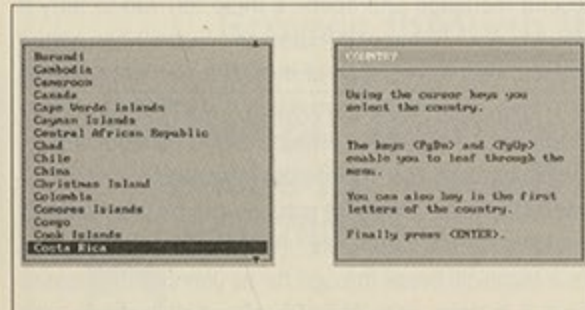
The CM50 is designed for use with the IBM PC/XT AT and compatible computers running MS DOS version 3.10 or higher. The bundle contains everything you need to get the drive working, aside from the PC itself, of course. This includes the actual CD-ROM player, installation software on both 5.25-inch and 3.5-inch floppy disks, Microsoft software extensions, a host adapter card and the necessary cables. The driver unit is powered through the PC via one of the I/O cables.

Once you have installed the card in your PC in the normal way, you are ready to run the set up program. This automatically installs the device driver and the Microsoft extensions and updates your existing AUTOEXEC.BAT and CONFIG.SYS files (the disk even contains sample versions of these two files in case, for some reason, you do not have them on your PC). As the program runs it will ask you a series of questions along the way so that you can reconfigure the system to your preferences. This is easy enough to follow and there is a help window available, should you need it. The whole process should take less than 15 minutes.

EASY TO USE

Now you are set to go. Using a Compact Disc to access information is no more difficult than using a floppy disk; instead of placing a floppy in a slot, you just drop a Compact Disc into the driver and click the lid shut. The disc immediately starts to spin around at high speed and you can begin to read off that vast amount of information it holds.

The CD-ROM driver will be assigned drive D by your PC, but you will still be working mainly from drive

C. This is because most of the software which comes in CD format contains front ends – the interfaces you use to access the information – which operate from in drive C leaving the CD purely as a vast data pool. You will only have to go into drive D to initially install the software, thereafter using drive C to call up information. Part of the reason for this is that the access time for CDs is relatively slow, at around 0.8 seconds.

Besides merely accessing data, the CM50 can also handle audio output; a headphone socket to the rear of the drive means that you can listen to music while you work, although there are, of course, more serious uses for this function. It is actually designed for use with multimedia applications where you can have synchronised sound and vision.

EUROPEAN BUSINESS GUIDE

For the moment, though, most businesses will be using CD-ROM drives as a fast way of finding out information that would traditionally have meant wading through large wads of paper. For example, British Telecom has placed the phone directory on CD, and the *Northern Echo* newspaper has transferred all its articles from the last couple of years on to the format. The system has the added advantage that you can look for information in a number of ways; you are not restricted to looking for names in an alphabetical list.

Take, for example, the *European Business Guide*, a directory of useful information for the travelling business executive which contains air and train timetables for all the major connections in Europe, as well as details of international telephone codes (world wide, not just restricted to Europe), embassies, hotels and entertainment. Also, in a remarkably perceptive example of knowing your audience, all major European golf courses are included as well.

Like the CD-ROM drive itself, this Dutch-produced program is remarkably easy use. The accompanying booklet contains virtually no instructions at all as you simply learn intuitively as you go along. Each stage has

a series of options which you choose by pressing the appropriate function keys and each of these options is clearly labelled and explained.

You begin by telling the program relevant details about yourself; nationality, language, country of residence and the stations and airports from which you are most likely to depart. You can also choose what language you would like the program to run in; English, Spanish, French, German, Dutch and Italian. The English version is fine, but has some really irritating spelling mistakes, a couple of which are almost unforgivable; London crops up more than once and litres are continually referred to as liters.

The list of regions which the program covers is very comprehensive, with all the obvious countries included – Germany, France, Denmark, etc – along with a few more surprising places such as the Faeroe Islands, Gibraltar and Malta.

PLANNING YOUR TRIP

Having filled in these preferences you can now plan your trip by flight or train. Unfortunately, train timetables only cover journeys within countries, so you won't be able to plan a pan-European trip on the Orient Express. For international travel you will have to rely on air travel.

You simply select your destination country and/or city and the day on which you want to depart, press return and you get all the relevant flights that day along with details of the arrival and departure times and the length of journey and the telephone number on which to book your tickets. For air travel the flight numbers and airlines are also listed, while train information includes classes available and catering facilities. Did you know that most mainline trains in Norway have minibars?

You can also find out other useful information about your destination country or city, such as currency exchange rates, hotels, restaurants, nightlife and duty free allowances.

Drawbacks of the program include lots of missing data – many embassy addresses are listed as unknown, and some of the hotel lists are decidedly limited. The graphics are decidedly uninspiring, being rather blocky and basic. But overall, the program fulfils its function adequately, and half yearly updates make sure that the timetables, despite the publisher's disclaimer that they are subject to constant change, don't become too outdated. ■

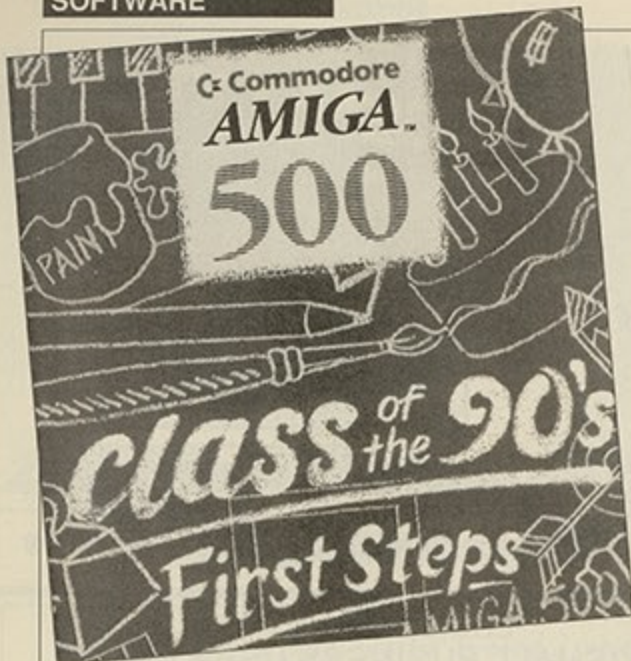

FIRST STEP FORWARD

Commodore continues to cut a swathe into the educational market with the First Steps bundle. Keith Pomfret put on his cap and gown and went back to school.

First Steps is the latest offering from Commodore with an eye toward using the Amiga as a learning tool. Last year the A500 *Class of the 90s* pack offered an integrated educational solution, but was pitched at a secondary school level. The First Steps pack is the second *Class of the 90s* offering and is suitable for primary, junior and above.

Commodore has chosen the software in the *First Steps* pack to be a simple introduction to computing, applications and using the Amiga as a tool for productivity and creativity. The pack also contains information for parents about the National Curriculum and how it includes computing.

THE EMULATOR

The Emulator is a piece of software designed to take the Amiga back to the days of the Ark and allow it to emulate the 8-bit BBC B micro. However, this seemingly retrograde step has method in its madness. The majority of schools and particularly primary schools still use the BBC to teach computing.

Like most emulators, The Emulator will only run well behaved software that conforms to legal BBC programming, but falls over if it comes across a program that bypasses the operating system and accesses the hardware directly. Thankfully, most BBC educational software is written legally and will run.

The Emulator consists of *Beebos*, *DFS*, *BASIC* and *6502*. *Beebos* is a bridge from the BBC operating system to the Amiga. *DFS* is a bridge from the BBC disk operating system to AmigaDOS. *BASIC* is an implementation of BBC BASIC that runs on the Amigas 68000 processor. *6502* is a software emulation of the BBC's 6502 chip which enables the Amiga to call BBC machine code routines.

PROWRITE

The National Curriculum has word processing as a requirement in education. *First Steps'* answer to that is New Horizons' *ProWrite*.

ProWrite is a word processor with the facility to include graphics as well as text on the printed page. *ProWrite* allows you to open and manipulate text and graphics between up to eight windows. The graphical ability of *ProWrite* is a plus point in a package intended for younger children. This, and the larger font sizes available, make it a useful tool in teaching as well as a full multi-tasking word processor.

LOGO

Logo is the original 'turtle graphics' program designed to teach young children about processing and computing. In its simplest manifestation, it can be used to draw patterns on the screen from simple mathematical instructions. The instruction: Repeat 4 [Forward 100 Right 90] would draw a square. It's simple to teach a

child the connection between the instruction and the screen drawing. *Logo* also allows any set of instructions to be defined as a procedure. The above instruction could be defined as Square. In future routines, the word Square would replace the instruction.

The Amiga version of *Logo* is the best specified so far using colour, graphics and even speech routines. To make life even simpler there's a Teach Yourself manual aimed at teachers and parents. This offers the adult a structured approach to teaching young children.

MUSIC MOUSE

Music Mouse is a fun way to introduce children to making music on the Amiga. Tunes can be played by pushing the mouse around and playing the music in real time while various control options can be accessed from the Amiga's keyboard.

Although *Music Mouse* is aimed at the beginner to music, it can be used equally well by musician and novice alike. None of the controls are difficult to master and even a complete beginner will soon be able to access rhythm, voicing and dynamics. There is also a feature that allows computer generated transposition and harmonics. *Music Mouse* can handle standard IFF sample files and connection to MIDI means that all that is needed is an interface and cables to start conversing with the outside world of MIDI.

INFOFILE

Taking data in well known structures such as telephone books and address books, and working that into the computer is the job of *InfoFile*.

To make things simpler, *InfoFile* comes with ready made templates for the most common databases. These are address book, phone file, basic accounts, club activities, personal finance, book lists, video and record collections and many other things to keep track of on a daily basis.

It is possible to load pictures into a file and *Infofile* becomes almost multimedia with a facility to hold a sound sample with a record. Thus an entry for say a fire engine could have all of the normal written data, a colour picture and a sound file of the bell or siren. There is also a guide for adults to show how to best teach the use of the database.

DELUXE PAINT II

Every youngster likes to crayon and paint and including *Deluxe Paint II* offers a canvas on screen that doesn't make mess and can be used again and again. Control is via the mouse and the results can be saved as IFF files to import into databases and documents.

Deluxe Paint II is capable of doing anything that a box of paints can do with one important exception. If you make a mistake with paint, you have to start again. If you make a mistake on screen, it can be undone.

The program is suitable for young children who generally like to cut a broad swathe of bright colours, but as their abilities grow, the program grows too, offering bold and pastel shades and dithering and stippling effects suitable for graphics work up to degree level.

DELUXE PRINT II

Menus, letter heads, business cards, posters, adverts, greetings cards, signs and any custom designed image can be produced with *Deluxe Print II*. It's a simple to use program that even the youngest child will be happy with and the results can be sent direct to a printer.

LETS SPELL AT HOME

Reading, writing and arithmetic have always been regarded as the backbone of learning. *Let's Spell* helps reading and writing. It can be used by any child aged four or older and as well as basic spelling tests, also includes a spelling game to get the youngster familiar with the program.

Help and hints are given and a correctly spelled word is rewarded with a smiling face and a pleasant tune. A word spelt incorrectly gets a frown and the correct spelling appears on screen. As the child becomes more proficient, there's a more difficult version.

This package isn't a jumbled mish-mash of software. Someone at Commodore has taken time and has researched what the younger child needs, resulting in a suite of software that is suitable for primary children, but in the main will last well on through the school years.

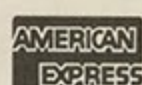
The cover value of the software is about £500 which means that you get a 1Mb Amiga for the remaining £99. Not bad value for a machine to aspire to. *First Steps* is a well thought out package that builds on the foundation set by the original *Class of the 90s* pack. ■
