FAST unveils anti-piracy phone line and audit kit

HOT LINE TARGETS CORPORATE PIRATES

Anyone fancy blowing the whistle on a few pirates? The anti-piracy organisation FAST (The Federation Against Software Theft) has announced that it is to set up a piracy hot line to enable members of the public to do just that.

The 0800 number, which costs nothing to the caller, takes its lead from a similar toll-free line which has been in use in the United States since last September, operated by the Software Publishers Association. The Washington-based SPA, which represents 600 members of the computer software industry, has contributed \$25,000 to establish the FAST line.

In London for the initiative's press announcement, SPA director Ken Wasch sang the praises of FAST, which represents the UK arms of a number of SPA members. Wasch stated that the SPA had " marvelled at FAST's success" and FAST had "done more to fight piracy than any organisation in the world".

According to Wasch, the US hotline takes between 10 and 20 calls per day. As well as tip-offs on piracy - mostly from former employees of companies using illegal software, or from disgruntled workers shopping their bosses - the line also takes many calls from honest software users who want to be sure that they are not violating copyright.

FAST will hope for much the same from its own telephone service, which will help to direct interested business callers to its simultaneously-launched Corporate Self-Audit Piracy Program, designed to help systems managers cross-check for discrepancies between the applications found on their staff's PCs and the quantity of software the company has actually paid for.

The self-audit kit, which can be obtained free by writing to FAST, comprises of a list of proposed audit procedures, a suggested memorandum to employees and a sample corporate employee agreement for staff to sign stating that they understand the com-

ment was to blame for most piracy, but that most managers were ignorant of the problem. "Your average member of senior management knows as much about computers as I do about brain surgery," he commented.

"The vast majority of British companies want to operate within the law, and that includes the law on copyright," said Hay. "Thanks to the self-audit program we will be able to help them to do so on a very practical level."

Of the hot line he stated: "We intend to use it exactly as the name implies and we will be prepared to act on any suitable information that we receive from this source."

Ken Wasch said the most pirated piece of software found in almost all of the major companies which the SPA had helped to audit in the US was Norton Utilities. Ironically, the most-pirated application found in the UK by FAST, according to Bob Hay, is Copy II PC - a program used for making copies of other software.

The SPA, which already distributes a self-audit pack in the States, is also in the process of completing a software product to help companies with the cataloguing side of the audit. The program is designed to search machines for the 1,000 most popular software products and list them if found. It should be available free through FAST some time in the early summer.

FAST chief executive Bob Hay said that neither dishonest nor 'bad' manage-

A new Amiga-based system has been launched which will help train the next generation of air traffic controllers.

The SAAST System Control Workstation is to be installed at all the major Civil Aviation Authority centres around the UK.

Software for the souped-up Amiga 2000 has been developed by air traffic control experts. The computer, which features a 68020 processor running AmigaDOS, uses a graphics card giving a resolution of 1,280 x 1,024 pixels on a touch-sensitive screen. ■

Dawn of the intelligent television set promises a new age of communication

A new add-in PC board brings the age of the intelligent television one step closer.

Digithurst's Picture Book PC system allows live or recorded digital video to be superimposed on a VGA screen display. But the transputer-based video processing board and software is more than just a genlock device.

Digithurst is pitching the device at broadcasters using the new ISDN phone-line standard, which allows simultaneous transmission of video, voice and text data. Thus, specific information relating to an object or person in the video frame could be accompanied by associated voice and text material like background notes and library references – an ideal

facility for news studios and picture researchers.

But the company believes its technology will go beyond even this. Billing the Picture Book as a major advance towards the introduction of the intelligent television, Digithurst expects such systems to find their way into the home. In such a scenario, a domestic viewer could interrupt any programme to receive data on its subject material via the phone line to their home computer.

Alternatively, the Picture Book could be used for the telephone transmission of full-colour magazines – who knows, *Express* could soon be faxed direct to your terminal for print-out! ■

'Wide implications for the home and work' claim

BREAKTHROUGH FOR 'LISTENING MICRO'

A revolutionary speech recognition system capable of running on IBM-compatible PCs was previewed in London last week.

The software-with-board combination promises to push computing into a new age by rendering the traditional keyboard redundant. Osprey, developed by the Centre for Speech Technology Research, has already proved capable of allowing use of a spreadsheet by vocal commands alone.

In the near future it should be possible, using such a system, to word process by simply talking to your computer, or even to control flight simulations through spoken instructions.

CSTR, based at Edinburgh University, has been working on the project for more than seven years. It has set out to avoid mistakes made by other developers in the search for a real-time voice recognition system.

Instead of treating words as basic units, Osprey has been designed to recognise speech sound 'building blocks', known as phonemes. There are only 44 of these in 'British' English, yet all words can be constructed from them.

This means that a new word can be added to Osprey's vocabulary simply by looking it up in a phoneme dictionary and feeding in the data given. In other systems a new word would have to be learned from scratch – a far more cumbersome process.

The other problem CSTR has overcome is that of systems being speaker-dependent – that they can only recognise the voice of the person they have been trained to work with. The research team has designed a data acquisition system which produces a database of the way in which a wide range of people speak, and this lets Osprey understand anyone who speaks without a strong accent.

The research has been based on the design of continuous speech recognition system operating in real-time using commercially available circuit boards which can plug into an IBM-compatible PC.

At the heart of the recogniser is the parallel processing power of the Inmos Transputer which can handle 10MIPS (millions of instructions per second).

At the London launch the system was put to work monitoring voice commands between commercial aircraft pilots and air traffic controllers, showing aircraft movements and warning if these did not match traffic control instructions.

Although not yet commercially available, it will soon be possible to plug the card and microphone into a PC – from a 286 upwards. CSTR is also working on a system which could work with portable or hand-held computers.

The chairman of CSTR, Professor

John Laver, commented: "Speech computer interface is a new and potentially revolutionary technology with wide implications for the home and workplace. The Edinburgh Osprey represents a major step towards the commercial exploitation of computers operated by speech rather than a keyboard, and I would hope to see a product marketed in the near future. We are now seeing the beginnings of a speech technology industry in Europe."

The research unit has been awarded a £500,000 funding grant from the European Community's Information Technology program to assist in the development of speech recognition in a total of seven European languages.

CSTR is also involved in speech synthesis research – applying its phoneme techniques to the development of improved text-to-speech systems – and plays a role in Edinburgh University's pure research program on neural networks.

The logical conclusion to this would be a real-life version of the sci-fi computer which not only understands you but talks back. ■

It will be open six days a week at the Pallion Residents' Enterprise Centre until the end of the month.

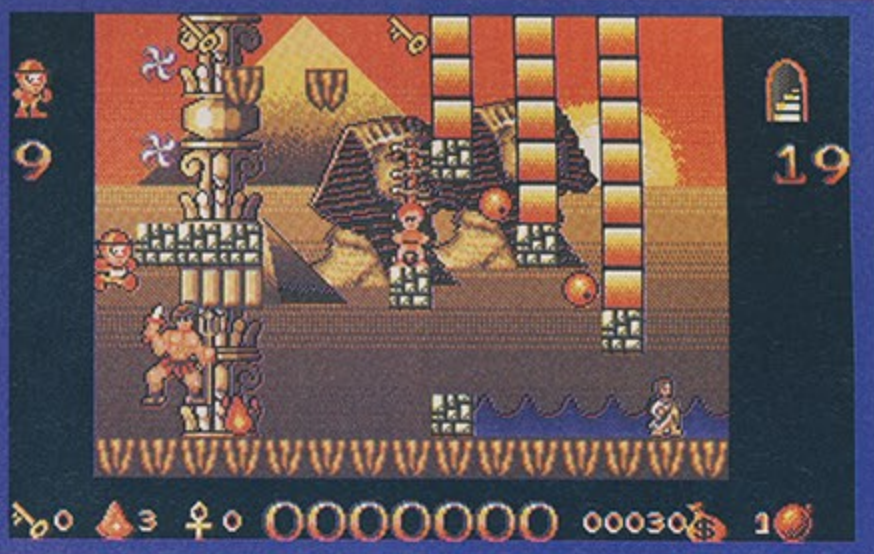

Drive firm hits Scotland

Hong Kong giant brings vast catalogue to Britain

LASER'S PC RANGE TAKES ON THE UK

Laser Personal Computers has launched a vast range of new PCs, totalling 81 different models.

Laser is an unfamiliar name in this country, but it is the 11th largest PC supplier in the US, and holds the number two slot in Canada and Holland. The Hong Kong-based company is hoping that its huge new series of PC-compatibles will help cement its future in the UK market.

Bottom of the range is the stylish-looking XT/SL. Unusually at this level, the machine is 3.5-inch disk drive based, and does not offer a 5.25-inch option. The XT/SL features a built-in joystick port and clock. Its 8086 processor runs at a fast 10MHz, and the basic machine comes with a high-resolution mono monitor. Prices start at £775 for a twin floppy model, with a 20Mb hard disk costing an extra £170.

If you need more expansion options the XT/3 offers six free expansion slots (as opposed to three on the XT/SL), and can accommodate three half-height disk drives, including 5.25-inch models. There is also a fast processor option which

pushes the speed to an outstanding 12MHz. You pay an extra £60 on top of the XT/SL price for these extras.

Three different 286-based AT clones are offered, running at 12, 16 and 20MHz respectively. All feature 640K of RAM, expandable on the motherboard to 3Mb, and five free expansion slots - one 8-bit and four 16-bit. Mass storage is a 20Mb hard disk and high-density floppy

drive. Prices for the AT models start at £1,250 for a monochrome 20Mb 12MHz system, running up to £2,275 for a 20MHz colour VGA model with a 122Mb hard disk.

At the top end, Laser offers a number of 386 PC options, and here real power begins to show. Even the basic 386SX (the SX is a cut-down version of the 386 chip) offers 'shadowed' ROM for top performance. Memory starts at 1Mb, with space for up to 10Mb. RAM can be interleaved for extra speed. Prices start at £1,675 with a 20Mb disk.

Topping the range are a number of 25MHz 386s with mouth-watering specs. Coming complete with a minimum of 2Mb of RAM, the machines feature a 64K memory cache, which massively speeds up data flow. The basic hard disk option is a 65Mb device with a fast 28ms access time and a data transfer rate of more than 550KB/s.

With power like that it's worth advertising the fact, and there is the option of a posey tower case for the speed king. Prices start at a corporate-level £3,090 and head skywards. ■

There's a new memory-resident personal organiser available for your PC.

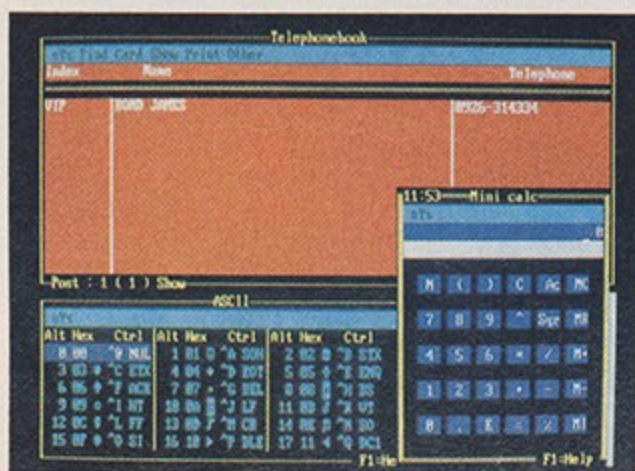

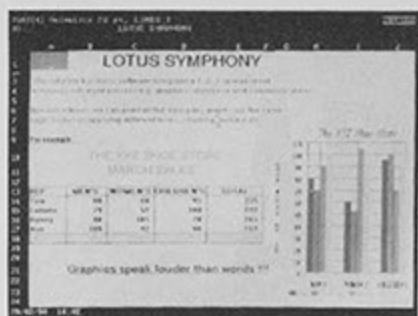

A new version of Lotus' integrated PC business package **Symphony** is to be launched within the next two weeks.

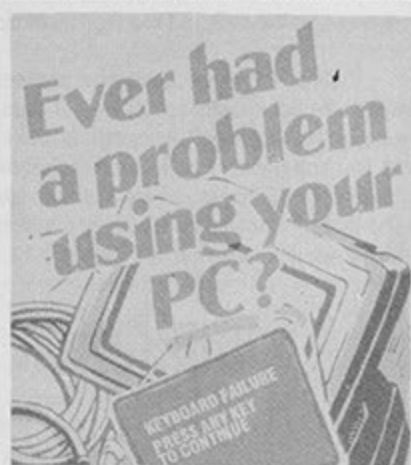
The PCW gets some games

IBM joins in race for Euro superchip

IBM has been allowed to join in the £3 billion Euro superchip project currently being run by some of the continent's major players in the electronics field.

The US giant has been attempting to join in the project for some months, since it will benefit from any breakthroughs. It's also involved in a similar project in the States. In return to letting IBM in, companies such as Siemens (West Germany), SGS Thomson (France) and Philips (Holland) will have access to some of the breakthroughs made by the Americans.

The JESSI project aims to produce a DRAM chip capable of storing 64 million bits of information. The Europeans and Americans fear that top-end multimedia projects are being hampered by the slow chips currently available.

With IBM involved in both projects the company will be able to act as a gateway for technical information. The Japanese superiority in commercial chip technology calls for co-operation between the two. ■

There are also 73 game launches for the PC, as well as many for the 8-bit computers. ■

Nintendo's games go on-line

Nintendo has announced that it will be setting up a unique 'on-line gaming' network for its consoles in Japan later this year.

The test exercise will connect people who own Nintendo consoles to other families via telephone lines. This will allow someone in, say, Osaka, to do battle on *Super Mario Brothers* with someone in, perhaps, Kyoto.

But only families already on-line and using the Nintendo home trading system will be able to participate. The console, linked to a phone via the home trading communications adapter, will access Nintendo's host computer.

By using only a relatively small number of people Nintendo hopes it can iron out any bugs. It all begins in July. ■ (Newsbytes).



COMPUTER FIRE STRIKES AT DEC BUILDING

Millions of pounds worth of computer equipment was saved last week thanks to prompt action by firemen.

On Tuesday last week the Hampshire Fire Brigade was called out to deal with a blaze at DEC's £28-million customer support building. Despite extensive damage to the building itself, the firemen managed to save most of the valuable computer equipment.

They had moved in to swathe six valuable Vax 6000 machines in fire-resistant blankets, and had then attempted to beat off flames from around the machines while putting the main fire out.

However, personal computer terminals worth up to £10 million were destroyed.

DEC says it fears some data will have been lost, but the firm always takes weekly back-ups which are stored at another site, as well as daily back-ups which are kept in a fire resistant safe.

No-one was injured in the fire. An inquiry into its cause is to be launched.

Honeypot success

The American and European hacking community was buzzing with rumour and speculation last week following talk of a large scale action against US hackers by the FBI.

As yet no official details have been released although it is understood that up to a dozen computer operators have been arrested. This follows a seemingly successful ploy by the FBI to set up a 'honeypot' bulletin board which attracted hackers from all over the US to leave details of their exploits.

The hackers had presumed the board was simply another medium to boast about their latest break-in.

An Wang in hospital

An Wang, one of the pioneers of the computer age and founder of Wang, has been admitted into Massachusetts General Hospital this week. It is not known whether his confinement is related to surgery for cancer which was undertaken last July.

The 70-year-old chief executive of the veteran computer firm is said to be continuing work from the hospital. He set up his company in 1951. Despite years as one of the world's major forces in computing, his business is now in trouble. The company reported losses of \$72 million for the six months ending December 31, 1989. (Newsbytes).

Gold rocked

Two senior staff from games publisher US Gold have been arrested and charged with deception.

David Baxter, software development manager, and his assistant Tony Samuels both left US Gold earlier this month. They were charged on Wednesday and Thursday respectively last week.

US Gold stresses that its release schedule has not been affected.

MIRRORSOFT PLANS HUGE GAMES RANGE

Mirrorsoft's second International Conference, held in Nice earlier this month, greeted assembled journalists with a range of new products.

The computer version of *Back To The Future II*, out soon on the Imageworks label, signals the start of a heavy investment in film licenses. This is traditionally a difficult area as development time is short and it is all too easy to ride a poor game on a good film. Mirrorsoft has a full-time scout in Hollywood on the look out for future releases and has already signed *Back To The Future III*.

A recent signing with Sega means that *Back To The Future II*, *Speedball* and *Xenon II* are currently being converted for the Sega Master games console.

The company's link with Cinemaware means a heavy investment in

CD-ROM entertainment too. We were shown a video of the making of *It Came From The Desert* featuring real actors, just one of six new CD products currently under development. On more conventional 16-bit formats are *Wingz* (a World War I flight simulator), and *TV Sports Baseball*. *TV Sports Boxing* is due soon.

Flight Of The Intruder, on the Spectrum Holobyte label, is the successor to *Falcon* and puts the player in control of four separate planes during the 1972 Linebacker campaign over Vietnam.

Dungeon Master is at last to appear on the PC, together with an adapter that plugs into the printer port and contains a joystick socket and a lead to connect the adapter's built in sound chip to your hi-fi. This will be bundled as a limited edition at £39.99, after which the adapter will

be available as a separate item.

Vektor Graffix writing *Killing Cloud* for the Imageworks label. This uses techniques developed for flight and driving simulations to produce a futuristic graphic adventure.

Dr Peter Turcan, author of *Waterloo*, *Borodino*, *Austerlitz* and *Armada*, is working on a new gaming system for his next series of battle simulations. Meanwhile *Battlemaster* on the PSS label introduces role-play elements to the traditional strategy game.

Duster is being written by the authors of *Carrier Command* and puts the player in the shoes of a 'bug hunter', hunting mutants.

All titles are being launched for the Commodore Amiga, Atari ST and PC compatibles.

Lynx and STE make Atari's future look bright

Atari has announced healthy figures for the quarter-year ending December 1989. The company made profits of \$45.7 million compared to a loss of \$97 million for the same period in 1988.

Total sales amounted to \$170.6 million compared to \$152.6 million. For the whole year Atari made \$4 million, compared to losses of \$84.8 million. That was on sales of \$423.6 million - down from 1988's \$452.2 million.

The company is putting that dip down to a slowing of sales of its traditional video game units. However, it says the emerging popularity of new PCs, the Portfolio and Atari Lynx point to a healthy 1990.

Atari president Sam Tramiel commented: "For Atari, 1989 was a transition year. It witnessed the introduction of a new generation of hand-held machines - the Lynx and Portfolio, and the disposition of an extraneous business segment." He was referring to the Federated chain of electronics stores, bought by Atari and then offloaded following poor financial performances.

"For 1990, Atari is fully committed to regaining its market share in the video game sector with products like the Lynx, increasing our market share in the personal computer sector with products like the Atari STE, and maximising our opportunity in the hand-held or palmtop computer business with the Portfolio."

Computer dinner

If you're one of those people who likes to throw dinner parties, then you will be interested to hear of a new computer which can take the headache out of these difficult occasions.

It's well known that one of the biggest problems is pleasing everyone - especially if some of your guests are vegetarians or have peculiar fancies. A new expert computer, called Julia and developed at the Georgia Institute of Technology, can solve this problem.

All you have to do is program in all the favourites and no-nos of your guests. Then the machine will come up with a meal to suit everyone.

And it will store details of everyone's tastes for future reference.

COMMENT

So now computers can hear you speak. Will that give the computer addicts of the future a true friend at last?

It would be easy to take the Edinburgh Speech Technology Research and hype that breakthrough up into a frenzied vision of the cybernetic world of tomorrow. So let's do just that.

We're really into Neuromancer and Max Headroom territory here, but what the hell. It's a way of life which must surely come. The steps taken by organisations such as CSTR bring that era closer than ever. Certainly it can no longer be confined to novels and movies.

Imagine your computer, without a keyboard, but with both the ability to understand what you say, and to reply utilising speech synthesis. Take that a step further and donate neural technology and pretty staggering memory capabilities to your machine. Here goes:

- **Word processing:** The typist is a thing of the past. All you have to do is talk to your machine. For instance: "Dear mum comma par tab how are you?" The computer would put capital letters and the question mark in.

Forget spelling checkers. Every word is taken in context by the processor, so there is no confusion as to whether you meant 'pale' or 'pail'.

Also, if, as is likely, you get ahead of yourself, you can use the speech synthesis and ask for the last paragraph to be read back to you.

Using palmtop computers you can take transcriptions of interviews or conversations as they happen. You can also dictate faxes by remote phone.

- **Business:** Apart from word processing you can also send orders from a site back to your computer by phone and into a spreadsheet or accounts package. All business is immediate and

portable. You no longer have to telephone an appropriate person who keys in the relevant data. Just call the computer and it will have employees hanging on every word.

- **DTP and CAD:** Tricky jobs are handled by voice. For example: "main pic left eight mil" dispenses with difficult mouse co-ordination.

- **Expert systems:** Your computer is linked to an expert system based on the medical knowledge of the day. Switch it on and there is a kindly video face and soothing voice.

"What seems to be the trouble?"

"My knee hurts."

And so on until the computer has a diagnosis.

You can actually converse with the machine. If the computer addicts of today consider their micro to be a best friend - imagine what tomorrow will bring.

- **Commercialism:** Movie stars are licensing out their phonemes to computer users. You can have the voices and faces of maybe Jerry Hall or Jack Nicholson - whoever takes your fancy.

The voices of the dead could be resurrected. It would not be difficult to re-create Elvis Presley or Marilyn Monroe as a computer simulation.

- **Gaming:** Adventurers can forget typing in those commands and reading responses. You say: "Enter the hut" and inside a goblin is talking to you.

Simulations would be more accurate. As the captain of a submarine you don't type in your orders. You say them in the same way as real sub skippers.

Just thinking of this world of computing can turn your mouth dry. It is full of fearsome and intriguing possibilities. Perhaps you have some ideas? ■

FROM THE ARCHIVE

ONE YEAR AGO

Nothing changes much from year to year. Twelve month's ago the headlines were being made by Atari, which had just announced its latest bundle. Entitled the Powerpack, it contained some 20 top-selling games including *Gauntlet II* and *Afterburner*.

Atari boss Bob Gleadow predicted that the pack would still be strong come Christmas, and he was right - the bundle has only now been discontinued after a highly successful year.

The Amiga was also being bundled up this time last year, but Commodore's offering was considerably less successful. The strategy centred around Air Miles, the promotional flight gift tokens, 500 of which were given away with each machine - enough for a return flight to Paris. Computer buyers proved a ground-loving lot however, and the bundle was soon phased out in favour of the Batpack.

One of the sickest games to date surfaced in Scotland where a bunch of warped hackers converted the popular *Sidewinder* game into the racist *Paki Basher*. The game graphics had been altered to depict attacks on Asians instead of jet fighters. The police were called in, but the culprits escaped capture.

US Gold made a brave but short-lived attempt to reduce the extortionate prices of 16-bit games by releasing a series of titles at £14.99.

Unfortunately for gamers, the trend, led by the likes of *Vigilante* and *Out Run Europa*, failed to catch on and prices soon went back up.

The cracks began to show in the specialist computer show arena when Database closed down the long-running BBC Micro Show. Other Database shows were to follow suit later in the year.

Atari's portable ST, the Stacy, saw the light of day for the first time at the Hanover show. Featuring a built-in trackerball, hard drive and MIDI ports the machine was instantly hailed as the touring musician's dream machine.

TWO YEARS AGO

RAM price hysteria gripped the trade as Atari, Amstrad and Acorn all claimed that prices might have to go up by up to a third. In the event the manufacturers took a deep breath and absorbed the price rises into their margins.

Atari announced a huge rise in turnover from just over £200 million to around £500 million, with profits up 36 per cent. The relatively low profits were put down to its American retail chain subsidiary Federated, which Atari is still embroiled in legal action with to this day.

Top games release of the week two years ago was the Amiga version of the classic *Star Wars*, which had finally been converted from the 8-bits. Other titles released that week have sunk without trace. Where are you now *Championship Sprint*, *Power at Sea* or *Slogon*? Topping the charts was *Ghostbusters*. Plus ça change...

FIVE YEARS AGO

Sir Clive Sinclair announced his aim of taking his company into the manufacturing of wafer-scale chips. He predicted that production of the devices would start in 1986, but four years after his prediction the industry still awaits the volume production of the silicon-based disk drives

THE BIG BUILD UP

OK, Nigel Nock of Software Paradise, I take it all back. Even though you didn't include a photocopy of the packaging of *The Builder* last week, I have to admit that it does exist. This, as no doubt you guessed, is because the real thing arrived a few days ago.

It does most of what it claims. It takes an existing batch file, converts it to its own format and then compiles it to machine code. The resulting COM file can be run independently of *The Builder* with no licence fee due to hyperkinetic inc [sic], the producers.

For some reason, the program changes the syntax of some of the elementary MS-DOS batch file commands. Quoted filenames must be enclosed in speech marks, for instance and all calls to `COMMAND.COM` for functions such as `COPY`, must be preceded by `RUN`. This is fine if you're running an existing batch file through *The Builder*, but annoying if you're writing in native mode to make use of the extra structures and commands.

And there are plenty of extra structures and commands. *The Builder* programs can include `CASE`, `REPEAT` and `WHILE` statements, can read the size of disks and files, can get and return keypresses and can provide a complete library of automatic menuing utilities. The program supports variables, simple box drawing and cursor positioning and reading.

The finished programs are compact - minimum size around 3K - and execute more quickly than an equivalent batch file. They do take some memory space while running, though.

All in all, *The Builder* is an excellent util-

ity. Just the thing for building installation systems or short menuing utilities. It's almost a language in itself.

FLIGHT SIMS TAKE OFF

But if you're me, they rarely land again in one piece. Nonetheless, while taking the trouble to send through *The Builder*, Software Paradise sent through its new recreational software catalogue. It's worth a mention, if only for the wide range of games stocked by the company. Further details on the SP number.

LASERJET II SUPERSEDED

Hewlett Packard has launched a replacement for the industry standard LaserJet II laser printer. The LaserJet III - how did I guess? - is a touch smaller than the present machine, comes with a megabyte of memory as standard, and will retail at the same RRP of £1,999.

It's main innovation is in the firmware it comes with. The new machine emulates the Epson FX and IBM Proprinter, includes eight scalable fonts from Compugraphic, and Resolution Enhancement Technology (RET). This is perhaps the most interesting advance in the machine.

All lasers to date have used tiny but uniformly-sized dots to create an image. This is fine for small characters and graphics, but as the size increases the dots begin to show and the well-known 'jaggies' appear. This is particularly noticeable with diagonal lines, such as

the sides of an 'A'.

RET gets around this problem by using a set of dots of varying sizes. This means it can fit even complex shapes a lot better, giving a smoother picture, at the same resolution.

Ironically enough, this harks back to traditional typesetting, where a screen is made up of many dots of differing sizes. A 100 line picture, as used in most newspaper photographs, has a lower resolution than a 300 dpi laser, but because of the variation in dot size, the newspaper photo looks a lot better. STONING APRICOT

I've noticed from reports (in *Express* news and elsewhere) that the all-UK PC company, Apricot, is set to sell off its hardware division, which includes state-of-the-art 386 and 486 PCs. You may recall that the company originally set out to raise money on the strength of its PC prowess in January, looking perhaps more for a part sale than a full sell-out.

Now it seems that a main contender for taking over Apricot has emerged in the form of Commodore, the company currently claiming to be the number two

computer company in the world. I think that this ranking is stretching the imagination somewhat, as the company's sales figures are boosted by the Commodore 64 and 128. Its PC sales look a lot less exciting.

A purchase like Apricot would make a lot of sense for Commodore, whose main PC models are rather run-of-the-mill. Indeed, the high-tech image of Apricot would slot in well, and give Commodore direct access to MCA and EISA technology - Apricot has stakes in both camps.

Neither company is prepared to make any comment at this stage - it would be surprising if they did - but Commodore would almost certainly be after a full buy-out, not a 'strategic partnership'.

HYPERPADDERS

No relation to Black Adder (alas), but a proposed user group for *HyperPad*, the easy to use hypertext-style tool on the PC. The idea is great, as the product is engineered to assist anyone in producing useful programs for their own purposes.

There are two different types of graphic adventures around at the moment. On the one hand games like *Leisure Suit Larry* or *Neuromancer* are essentially graphic versions of the classic adventure format. On the other hand RPGs (role-playing games), based on the Dungeons and Dragons formula, provide a party of adventurers the chance to explore a dungeon with the players' performance depending on a complex system of attributes attached to each character.

DRAGON WARS

Deja Vu II, reviewed a few weeks ago, is a fine example of the first, while *Dragon Wars* is an RPG, developed by the team responsible for the excellent *Bard's Tale* series. It takes you to the legendary islands of Dilmun, on the watery world of Oceana, which your party finds under the spell of a beast called Namtar and you are seized, stripped of all your possessions and left to die in the disease-ridden hovels of Purgatory.

Characters are suitably-complex, with six attributes determining performance and some 20 skills for each to master. There are 65 spells for those with magical skills, and a sophisticated combat system that you can test against creatures ranging

from *Shadow Spiders* to prison guards.

The world is large and normally viewed in perspective through the leader's eyes, although this can be confusing. It is possible to take a top-down view using 'Auto-map', but this takes you away from the main action and is not sufficiently detailed.

Dragon Wars has a good plot, augmented by nearly 150 'paragraphs' in the manual that can be read at strategic points.

However this new game, however good it may be (and it is good) cannot match Origin's *Ultima V* - let alone the forthcoming *Ultima VI* - for either size or graphics quality.

SHORTENING BATCH FILES

Whether you're using *The Builder* or not, the following tip from Meir Greenfield of Sheffield might tidy up your batch files, if they need tidying, that is.

The tip concerns the usual technique for making multiple choice branches within a batch file.

Using an external program to generate an Errorlevel (such as the one in evidence on the *SHOWCSF* utility on the PC Plus SuperDisk), you would normally use a section of code like this:

```
IF ERRORLEVEL 10 GOTO LABEL10
IF ERRORLEVEL 9 GOTO LABEL9
IF ERRORLEVEL 8 GOTO LABEL8
```

and so on to...

```
IF ERRORLEVEL 0 GOTO LABEL0
```

But this is an awfully long-winded way of doing things when you can use:

```
FOR %p IN (0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10)
DO IF ERRORLEVEL %p SET ERRVAL=%p
GOTO LABEL%ERRVAL%
```

The second technique makes use of the environment variable `%ERRVAL%` in a FOR loop. The FOR loop is one of the less well known structures within batch programming. The `%p` parameter is given each value within the brackets in turn.

The test at the end of the line then checks if the errorlevel equals the current value of `%p` and, if so, sets the variable `ERRVAL` to the same value.

The last line branches to the label with the name `LABEL0`, `LABEL1`, `LABEL2` or whatever.

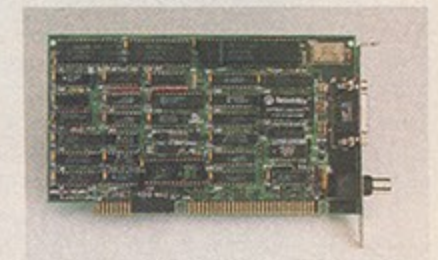

And, what is more, version 2.65 of the extraordinary Mac emulator Spectre GCR is soon to be released in the States.

Incidentally, HiSoft says all back orders for Spectre GCR have now been honoured, and further supplies are in stock. So if you've taken a fancy to owning a big Mac, but don't have the necessary folding, this could be your lucky day!

Meanwhile, still on the subject of STs with personality changes (er, emulators) Gasteiner has released two new additions to the PC Speed range, fitting the Mega and the STE and requiring no soldering - always a bonus, I feel. Give Gasteiner a bell on 01-365 1151.

SOCCER SHOCKER

Is there no end to the mounting pile of footie managing games? The two latest versions to thud onto the Express office floor are *Football Crazy*, from a small company called ESP Software (I seem to recall a game a couple of years ago called *Football '88* from the same source); and, at the other end of the scale, the *Player Manager* from Anco, written by Dino Dini, author of the astonishingly successful *Kick Off*.

Now I have to be totally honest (makes a change, doesn't it) and admit that this really isn't my thing at all. Give me a playable footie sim and I'm in heaven, but having to muck about buying and selling

players, training and wheeling and dealing and I instantly start wondering what's on telly.

But in fact both these £20 games, in their separate ways, are good examples of the type. Of the two I'd have to plump for *Player Manager*, since it involves what I enjoy best: playing. Your decisions actually do influence a 'real life' game, and thereby involving the 'player manager' to a greater extent.

On the other hand, *Football Crazy* may well appeal more to the purist, who is interested solely in strategy and finds the lack of joystick waggling much more to his or her liking.

Incidentally, the programmer of *Kick Off* and *Player Manager*, the aforementioned gentleman referred to by the name of Dino Dini, is currently hard at work on *Kick Off II*, which in and of itself is expected to be ready in good time to cash in on the footie fever that is bound to surround the World Cup, which Holland is going to win (you heard it here first, folks).

PLAYING TIPS

VOYAGER

Before we go, just enough room to squeeze in a quickie *Voyager* cheat: On the option screen, type 'when the sweet April showers fall'. The cheat option screen should now appear. When playing the game, use F1 to go back a level, F2 to go forward, F7 to pause and F8 to show your position.

Also, on the option screen, you can press enter to call up an object designer where the arrow keys and keypad numbers can produce some very interesting results. Hit space to return to the option screen.

But the prize for the earliest bid to cash in on this year's big sporting occasion goes to those monsters of budget, CodeMasters for *Italia 1990*, a £4.99 feast of footballing fun, or something. Ah well, we might as well get used to it sooner rather than later.

If by any chance you're not a footie fan I'd be inclined to move your ST into the cupboard under your stairs and move yourself in after it.

YOU CAN DO EVERYTHING

Reports of an ST multi-tasking package being developed in the US have been circulating for some time, though it appears it is, at least initially, to be aimed at musicians.

Apparently the program enables the user to have up to six separate programs running simultaneously. Don't hold your breath, though, for the program is unlikely to be seen on the European side of the Atlantic during this current year.

IMPROVE YOUR SIMS LIFE

A while ago I went to see Bob Sidgwick in Bristol to report for one of the Express sister magazines, *ST Format*, on the £200 *Aerochopper*, which might fairly be described as the ultimate flight simulator. It's a hand-held device used by fliers of radio controlled planes to practice on, and it enables the user to reproduce flying conditions on an ST.

The hardware feels and behaves exactly like the radio controller that is used to fly the plane itself. The beauty of it is that it lets the user put in simulated flying time without having to put his or

her plane at risk.

Does it work? You bet - if I can learn to fly using it, anyone can! After a couple of hours on Bob's ST with *Aerochopper* I went out and, under Bob's expert supervision, actually flew a plane. It's a marvellous experience, and requires far more skill and precision than I'd imagined.

Anyway, the point about all this is that Mirrorsoft has now got involved, releasing *Falcon* and *Mission Disk One* in *Aerochopper*-compatible form. So now you can enjoy the ultimate flight simulation on the ultimate flight simulator.

And though it can hardly be thought of as a casual purchase, Bob told me that many radio-controlled plane buffs had bought an ST just so they could run *Aerochopper*! And that's not all, for I hear that another famous flying name is soon to become available in *Aerochopper* form. More on this when the story firms up.

By the way if you're a flying freak and you don't happen to have 200 pounds in ready money, there is a cheaper way to improve your sims life. RC Simulations has begun importing the Advanced Gravis Switch Joystick.

It's a peculiar-looking object, as so many new joysticks these days are, with the special feature of adjustable handle tension with eight settings. The result is a choice completely slack right up to wrist-wrenchingly firm - with all points in between. It makes a big difference to flight sims such as *Falcon*. The Gravis costs £39.91.

ST GAME OF THE WEEK

RAINBOW ARTS • £19.99

Several years ago a tank sim called *Conqueror* appeared on the Acorn Archimedes, but no one took much notice at the time. Now the game, written by David Braben of *Elite* fame, has surfaced on the ST - and it was well worth the wait.

When you see the screenshots of *Conqueror* the first thing to hit you is their remarkable resemblance to *Virus*. That's because the unusual playing environment designed by Braben and first used in *Virus*, reappears in this, his latest game.

Conqueror is a tank game with a difference. It doesn't intend to be a straight tank simulator but instead fuses action and strategy modes to come up with a fully-playable and long-lasting challenge.

The game is arranged in three levels - arcade, attrition and strategy. Arcade mode is a standard



action level where you must move a tank around the battlefield, searching out other tanks and blasting them to smithereens. The keyboard is the best method of controlling the tank and a logical set of keys enables you to control the direction of the tank and dictate the position of the turret.

When you tire of the arcade level, you can move onto attrition mode which is a combination of action and strategy events. Here, you control one light tank, two medium and two heavy-duty. By conjuring up a map you can see the location of enemy tanks on the battlefield and send your tanks out to destroy them, putting some tanks into automatic mode and controlling one yourself.

Finally, there's the action mode. When you look at the map in this level, you can spot a large circle encompassing roads and a town. Using the same

number of tanks from the attrition mode, you must move into this zone and capture the area for a full minute. In essence, this means ensuring that no enemy tank can breach the circle but with so few tanks under your command, it isn't always easy to fend them off. The answer is to spend much of the game blasting other tanks and amassing a large score which can be used to purchase other tanks and establish a stronger army.

There are few games as addictive or challenging as *Conqueror*. With the three levels, you are eased gradually into the game so that by the time you come to play the strategy mode, you are already experienced at controlling tanks and reading the map. As a result, *Conqueror* has a very high long-term interest value. Indeed, even if you're not a tank fan, you'll go mad playing *Conqueror*.

C FOR YOURSELF

Learning to program the Amiga's Intuition windowing environment form a language such as C can be a long-winded, and often frustrating experience. After getting over the initial shock of learning the C language (which can be a barrel of laughs at times), the user is suddenly confronted with a multitude of complicated data structures and routines that must be pulled together to produce even the simplest of C applications.

For all you struggling C programmers, however, help is at hand in the shape of *The Amiga C Manual* from that prolific PD software programmer, Anders Bjerin. Anders has been responsible for several PD utilities and games including the popular *Car*, *Sys* and *Miniblast* games. During his time as a C programmer, Anders has collected together a wealth of information which he has now passed on in the shape of his latest project.

The first edition of the *Amiga C Manual* is finished and is being launched as a shareware product (registration fee £15). The manual consists of more than 200 pages of incredibly concise documentation plus 71 fully executable examples together with source code. All this comes on three disks.

The manual covers all aspects of Intuition including screens, windows, gadgets, requesters and the IDCMP (Intuition direct communications message port).

PRINTER PROBLEMS SOLVED

Printers are one of the greatest sources of frustration with the Amiga. To ease the pain, here are a couple of scorching hints to help you get a decent graphics printout from an Epson FX-compatible printer. Thanks go to reader A Edmonds of Latchford in Warrington.

1. Check the current density settings within Preferences - if you are using density 1 or 3 then watch out because the paper type setting effects the line feed distance (thereby leaving gaps between lines). If the paper type is set to single, then the line feed must equal the number of dots printed minus one third of a dot.

The wrong value here can result in horrible horizontal banding, which can make your print outs look pretty awful! The best way of working out the ideal setting for your printer is simple - experiment.

2. Try checking the printing gap setting inside your printer. Don't be put off by having to delve inside your printer - the results are worth the effort! On the Star LC-10, this adjustment is carried out using a small lever located at the left-hand side of the metal bar on which the print head travels. If in doubt about its location, refer to the manual that came with your printer.

Adjustment can make a surprising improvement in print quality. I have found that the different density settings in preferences tend to require different gap settings to obtain good results.

3. Remember to use a white background colour or select 'negative' in Preferences in order to save your printer ribbon (not to mention your ears).

mercenary soldier, in his mission for the Interplanetary Federation Governing Committee.

He must gain access to the research complex on Xelos and use cyanide cartridges to kill the eggs before they hatch. Throughout the complex

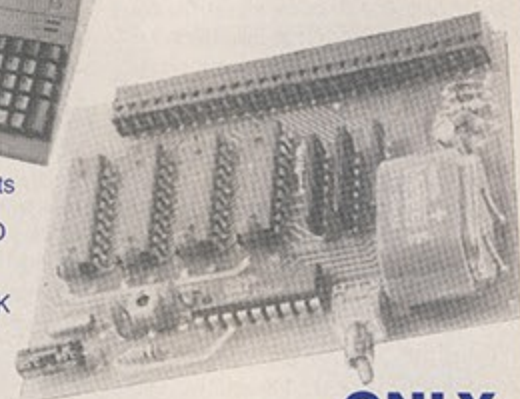

The supply of home brewed Spectrum software seems to be on the increase and now drops through my letter box with almost bill-like regularity. But the sparse, photocopied instructions and humble packaging of indie software makes a change from the fridge-sized boxes and thousand-page novels that come with professional products.

The latest piece of grown-at-home software I've received is from Vinsoft - a pretty enterprising outfit by all accounts - with three games already jolted into life and loads more planned for release this year.

The free sample of Vinsoft's wares that I received just two mornings ago is entitled *Spi Droid*, the latest maze/platform extravaganza. The idea in this one is to guide a rather basic-looking droid through lots of treacherously-designed screens in a game not dissimilar in structure to that elderly 10p-guzzling arcade brontosaurus - *Marble Madness*.

Unfortunately, it's pretty much unlike that old classic, both graphically and also in terms of addictiveness. While it's not badly programmed, the jerky scrolling and unresponsive controls provoke swear words and, even compared to your average, run-of-the-mill budget effort, it looks somewhat unprofessional.

However, the actual game design is sound enough and the whole thing proves surprisingly addictive although maybe not quite to the point of justifying the £2.99 price tag. Still, if you fancy checking out the underground world of independent Speccy software, this wouldn't be a bad place to start.

SPACE TRAVEL

If you find your disks fill up too quickly, here are two tips on getting the most out of your disk space:

1. Try keeping any letters to the same correspondent in the same file. Add new letters on to the end of the existing letters in the same document as follows.

Edit the file and go to the end with [SHIFT] [DOC]. Go to a new page with [ALT] [RETURN]. Now press [f1] (Loco 2) or [f7] (Loco 1) and 'insert file'. Give the *TEMPLATE.STD* as the file to insert.

Back in the main file carry on as usual. When printing, choose 'Print some pages' and just print the relevant section. This saves space and has the advantage of letting you easily look up what you wrote before.

2. Old files that you only need for archive or backup purposes can be stored as ASCII. This loses all bold, italics etc, non-alphabetic letters and layouts, but saves you loads of space. Use [f1] from the disk manager, ([f7] Loco 2) select 'Make ASCII file', give a name and choose 'simple text'.

Then erase the old version. To view the ASCII version, create a new document and 'insert text' ([f1] Loco 2, [f7] Loco 1) giving the ASCII file as the one to insert.

AND FINALLY...

Ever spilled coffee on your keyboard? If it doesn't work afterwards, the solution may be to put the keyboard in a bucket of water and then dry it out. No, this isn't a premature April fool; I have it on good authority from a number of correspondents who swear they cured their sticky keys like this. I haven't tried this myself and would recommend it only as a last resort - but there it is anyway!

MSX

LETTERS

It's about time that I answered a few letters, several of which deal with the apparent lack of MSX software stockist, particularly in the north and north east of fair old England.

A Mrs Ivey of Consett, Co Durham has searched high and low in the Tyneside/Durham area, and has been unable to find a stockist of MSX software. This is also the case in Blackburn, Lancs, according to Dr Tunde Gbolade.

I have had many more letters from MSXers in these areas who find the same sorry state of affairs. It's not as if there is a shortage of MSX software, because to my knowledge there are at least 100 titles still currently available.

If you live in any of these areas, and know of a stockist of MSX software, can I beg you to write in to the MSX column in *Express*, and I will add these stockists to my list. In the meantime, it appears that these MSX users in the North will have to use the excellent mail order facilities that companies such as Tavistock Hi-Fi, DL Chittendens and Capri Marketing have to offer.

The aforementioned Dr Gbolade also asked in his letter if I could recommend a colour printer for use on his Pioneer PX/7 computer. As I have never used a PX/7 I am sorry to say that I have no idea which type of printer is supported by the software you are using for titling, but most programs support MSX and Epson printer standards.

If this compatibility is the case with your software, I suggest you try out the excellent Star LC-10 colour printer, which offers exceptional value for money and Epson compatibility.

AND MORE QUESTIONS

You're going to have to wait another week for more pokes from the Shadow Weaver, because this week I am going to answer a question of his. He asks if I can explain how to input pokes without the software overwriting them.

Well, Weaver, most pokes, particularly short ones, can be inputted before the game is loaded. For example, on my MSX 2, to make some MSX 1 games work, I have to first type in the poke - 1170. I then load the tape in the usual way. This will not work with disks that auto-boot, as a reset is needed after the poke, and this clears the memory, and removes the poke.

If a longer poke is needed, and you find it a chore to type it in each time you wish to load a game, make up a short program which contains the poke statements, and make the last line of the listing a command to 'LOAD' the game you wish to play. Here is a short example ...

```
10 rem * MOLECULE MAN POKE *
20 SCREEN 0: KEYOFF
30 PRINT:PRINT" ** LOADING **"
40 POKE 38379,0:POKE 38384,0
50 RUN"CAS:"
```

Save this program to tape, using *SAVE"poke:"* and load it into the computer before you load in the game, using the *LOAD"poke:"* command. The above program will auto run, and line 50 will load in the game.

I would normally enter pokes this short in direct mode, but the example serves.

OK, so you've got your snazzy new Virgin/Mastertronic lightgun – now all you need is something to shoot! And Virgin has obliged, with three budget releases you can play either with your weapon or off the keyboard.

You see each of these games is recorded on both sides of the cassette. Side A contains the lightgun-compatible version, side B the conventional keyboard offering.

And at only £1.99 apiece, can you go wrong? Well, er, yes you can, actually...

Billy the Kid, for example, looks perfectly cut out for release on Lightgun format. After all, what better game for a gun-toting gamester?

First of all, though, you have to practice your shooting skills. I mean, you can't just pick up a gun and go robbing banks and holding up stagecoaches willy-nilly, you know. No, you've got to be able to shoot straight, first. Which is why you have to hit the required number of bottles on the first stage.

Amass enough points, and you get to try your hand at bona fide bank robbing. Unfortunately, things go wrong, and you have to shoot your way out...

Get through that stage, and you must face the sheriff in a final showdown. You stand back-to-back, take five paces, turn – and shoot. Which is why all that target practice at the start was such a good idea...

Billy the Kid is a pretty obvious Speccy port, but it doesn't look bad for all that. Graphics are unambitious, but they do the job. The only real criticism is the gameplay – or lack of it. Still, it'll keep you occupied for a couple of hours on a wet Wednesday afternoon.

Which is more than can be said for *F-16 Fighting Falcon*. It's a rear-view flying shoot-'em-up that looks more like *Afterburner* than *Afterburner*. So far so bad (depending on what you think of *Afterburner*, that is).

The worst of it, though, is that you control your aircraft by shooting it! Land a slug in the right place and you can make it perform a quick evasive move to get out of the way of an attacking plane/tank, etc.

But when you consider that you're

shooting at them as well, the whole thing becomes ever so slightly indiscriminate. It's tempting to just sit there waving the gun around and shooting everything on sight. If you hit the bad guys – good. If you hit your own plane...

After that little airborne outing, you could be forgiven for thinking that the third in Virgin's trio of budget Lightgun releases would have to be better. Well, wait no longer, because it ain't.

American Turbo King is an overhead-view stunt car race where you have to guide your motor across hazard-infested territory, negotiating ramps and belligerent attackers all the way.

So how do you control a car with a lightgun? Well, after playing *Turbo King* for half an hour I still couldn't tell you.

The idea is that you steer by shooting at two arrow icons on either side of the screen. You can select forward or reverse by shooting at your car. The packaging says to 'be merciless – it's the only way to survive'. If you ask me, it should be 'play the keyboard version –

it's the only way to control the ?!*&er!

Still, at only £1.99 apiece, and since you get a keyboard version too, well... yes, OK... they're really not too bad.

FORTH

One language I haven't mentioned in this column is Forth. Forth was invented by one Charles Moore as an efficient way to control a telescope – moving it around, switching filters in and out and so on.

Moore developed the languages in the good old days when most minis and micros had 16K of RAM, maximum. Forth is a very compact language, and Forth programs are extremely compact, owing to the use of 'threaded code' – the program is transformed into a set of sub-routine calls.

One writes programs in Forth by defining 'words'. Once a Forth word has been defined, it effectively becomes part of the language – Forth is 'extensible'.

Owing to the use of threaded code, Forth programs run quite quickly and, if programs need to be speeded up even further, in-line assembly language can be used, as with BASIC on the BBC.

For several reasons, Forth has never been particularly popular. Perhaps its biggest drawback, as far as most programmers are concerned, is its use of a stack in conjunction with Reverse Polish arithmetic notation.

Thus, to add two numbers you have to push them on to the stack, followed by the addition operator. The sum of the numbers is now on top of the stack and may be printed, or used in another calculation. To give you some idea of what Forth looks like, the following statement

creates a new Forth word called 'add1', which adds 1 to a number and prints it:

```
: add1 1 + . ; [Enter]
The new word is used as follows:
5 add1 [Enter]
printing '6'.
```

Forth is one of those languages that you either love or loathe. Forth aficionados claim that they can write an application in Forth in a fraction of the time it would take using one of the more conventional languages.

A good implementation of Forth is available for the QL from Digital Precision. SuperForth was written by Gerry Jackson (who also developed DP's Small C compiler) and costs £39.95.

68008 CONTROLLER

Leon Heller has designed a simple 68008 system which can be connected to the QL via a serial port. Using about 10 devices and, with its own EPROM programmer, it is ideal for learning about 68000 hardware. Software can be developed on the QL, and downloaded to the controller, for testing and debugging.

The prototype system was built using wire-wrap techniques on a single Eurocard (160mm x 100mm) and cost less than £40. Details will be published in the QUANTA newsletter.



GENIE DOES

Confusion, exhilaration and frustration. Everybody who has ever used a computer for their work goes through the same three stages. You start off cautiously, not sure what to do. Then you master the machine, and suddenly you can do everything. Finally, you seem to spend all your time waiting for the computer to finish some small task. A familiar story to most people, but what can be done about it?

The simplest way is to buy a faster computer. But another, cheaper, route is to get more out of your present hardware. One way is by switching from program to program with no waiting. On IBM or Macintosh computers many such programs, called respectively TSRs and DAs (terminate-and-stay-resident and desk accessories) exist.

Three components are necessary: an area of memory set aside for the new program and its data, a way of switching to that program, and a method of returning the computer to its original state when finished.

On the BBC two out of three are fairly easy, but finding enough memory can be a problem. Genie from PMS is a solution. Coming with its own 64K of battery-backed RAM, it's an address book cum diary cum notebook. Cousin to Genie is Genie Junior, but I would not recommend it unless you have the Challenger RAM disk to reduce access times.

Another practical application is screen dumping; notable products include Screenprint and Colour tool. You could try Anchor, available from Argus Specialist Publications.

A word of warning – although these programs are legally written, many BBC programs are not. Compatibility checking is therefore strongly recommended.

Following on from the above comments about compatibility of programs for the BBC, here are steps you can take to avoid some common problems:

Program expects 'page' to be of a particular value.

Solution, add a small routine to check 'page', then download the main program in memory.

Program uses keywords only supported by BASIC II.

Often occurs when opening files and gives a 'No Such Variable' error in BASIC I. You should re-write using BASIC I keywords – best to acquire BASIC I for testing purposes.

Program runs out of memory – a particular problem for owners of the Electron model.

Try switching to a lower mode, or load and run the program in parts. As a last resort, you may use some of the memory allocated for tape or print buffers.

VETERANS DELIGHT

The end of the Master 128 has been widely predicted (even by me). But nothing has yet been announced by Acorn. So could it be that the old warhorse will carry on for some time to come? Let's hope so.



COMMS CAPERS

I hope you've all logged onto The City by now and experienced the thrill of finally discovering a bulletin board written for, running on and supporting the Atari 8-bit. By the way, as well as the V21/V23 speeds (300/300 and 1200/75 respectively), The City also supports V22 1200/1200, which increases the efficiency of file transfers and scrolling on-screen text by leaps and bounds. Once you've used V22, you'll never go back to 300/300 baud communications.

If you haven't logged on, perhaps I ought to tell you about some of the goodies that await you. Product news, hardware and software reviews and programming sections make up the some of the most interesting 8-bit sections this side of page 6. There's a post box to enable you to send E-mail (electronic mail) to other users and a 'pub' where you can let off steam about the 8-bit and its lack of support and the generally poor state of the computer industry.

A support line offers a helping hand when needed, and there's a bulging public domain software section where you can download everything from word processors to programming and communications utilities. And of course, there's the Antic's Roadshow section, where you can make – almost – direct contact with me. A special mail-box in this section enables you to tell me what you'd like to see in column (or tick me off about things you *didn't* want to see).

Next time, I'll describe the equipment needed for accessing the comms world.

SECOND IMPRESSION

I've held back from commenting on *Impression*, the document processor from Computer Concepts, as the version the company supplied last autumn was very much pre-release.

But just last week CC sent in a more recently released version of the product, which on first look seems still to have some problems.

First you should know that the system I'm running it on is not ideal. Although CC makes much of the fact that the program is entirely ARM-coded, therefore small, and therefore quite suitable for a 1Mb Arc, it's really less than happy with that amount of memory.

My machine has a second floppy – 5.25-inch – and between the two there should be ample disk storage for small documents. The program needs a three disk start up, with the program and drivers on one disk, fonts, font manager and system folder on another, and the document on a third which replaces the program disk once it is loaded.

This all works pretty well, though you also have to increase the font cache allocation to around 128K or every re-draw forces the program to re-read its fonts from disk, which is painfully slow. There still seem to be a lot of errors coming through from the program, all neatly handled in RISCOS alert boxes. However neat and witty the messages, though, too many force a re-start.

The main problem is in getting any output from the LaserJet driver supplied with *Impression*. The program has the

very useful facility to reproduce more than one page on a sheet of paper, ideal for draft prints, but even on a one to one basis, things are not good.

The program seems to create a small part of the page image on the printer, but then starts sending straight ASCII characters – around 10 of them per sheet and an awful lot of sheets. Unless you want to complete the destruction of the Scandinavian pine forests, all you can do at this stage is abort the printing.

Computer Concepts technical support line runs from 1pm to 5pm only, and the deadlines on this column mean you'll have to wait a week for the next exciting instalment.

MAKE MINE MONO

The *Impression* manual, which is an excellent and helpful guide by the way, makes several good points about the choice of monitor for DTP. It starts by stating that multisync monitors are a good deal better than the medium-res Acorn-style units.

It then goes on to point out, though, that a mono multisync sports several and distinct advantages over some of its colour counterparts.

Not only can it display all the modes the colour unit can, but the picture will be sharper – only one electron gun instead of three – and it's likely to cost about a third of the price.

Personally, I'd go so far as to recommend a NEC Multisync GS, which is a full grey-scale unit and can be picked up for around £120.

ULTRA IMITATIVE MACHINE

UIM, from Fourth Dimension, promised to be one of the best games to date for the Arc. It is certainly a massive game, with many thousands of underwater ports to visit, and numerous enemies to sink. But methinks the scenario was changed at a late stage to try and make it a little bit less like *Elite*. And, unfortunately, it hasn't worked.

Indeed, the game is very like *Elite* – it involves trading, flying and shooting at things, it has similar controls and the playing screen with its forward view and 3D scanner beneath is a dead ringer for Braben's space game. That's not to say this new offering is bad – just that the rejigging is rather transparent.

And the effects don't have Braben's flair, either. The stars – or are they bubbles – are all square, the other ships, while solid, are rather sluggish and you're left feeling that there's little new here. If you liked *Elite*, I'm sure you'll be interested in *UIM*.

I cannot guarantee that you'll love it, though. At any rate, the good people at Fourth Dimension can be reached on 0742 700661.

And most of all make sure we can read your hand-writing, a little time on preparing your work could mean the difference between you having the job or not.

If you follow these simple rules then you will find your application a lot more successful with ourselves and probably other companies as well.

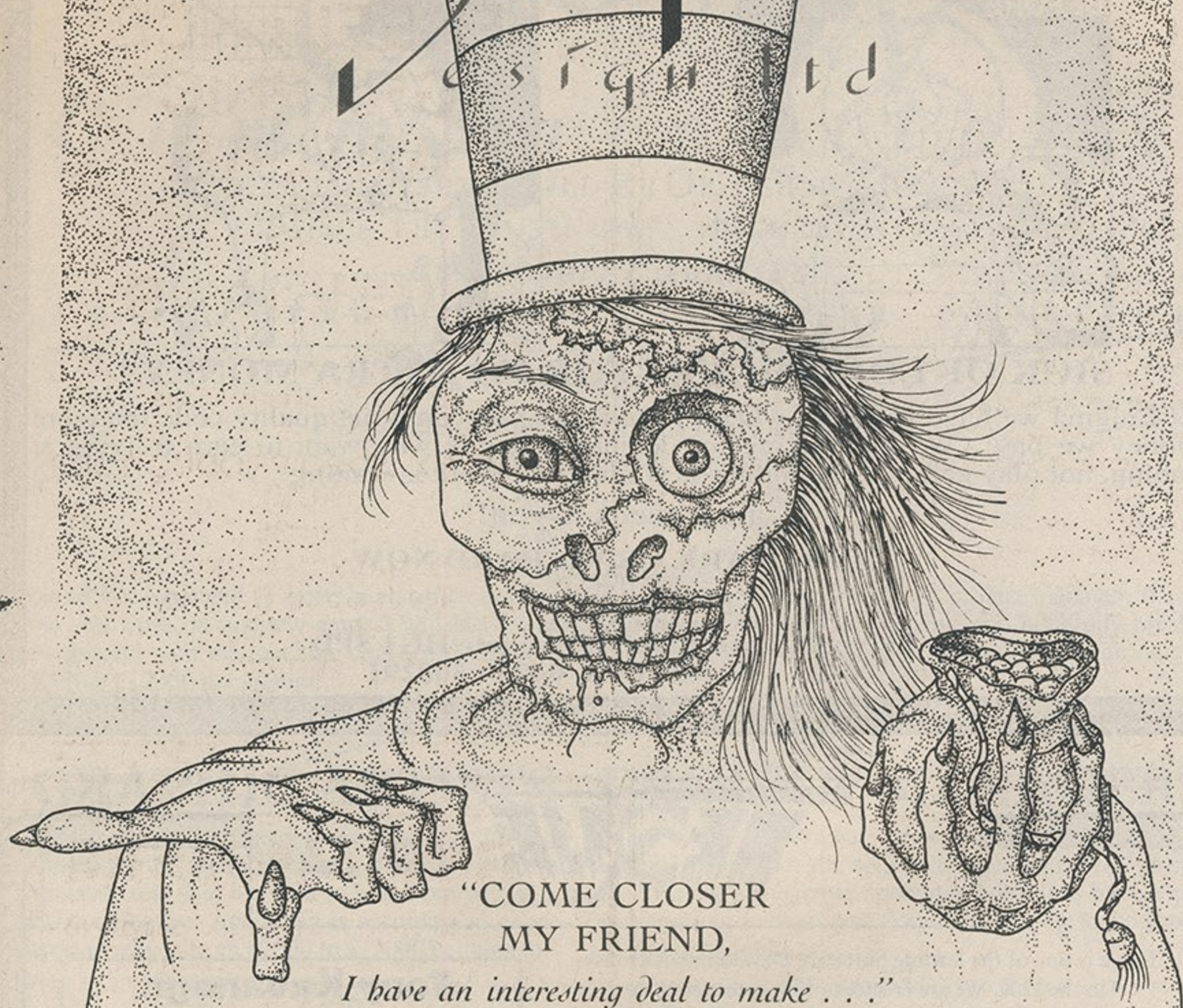

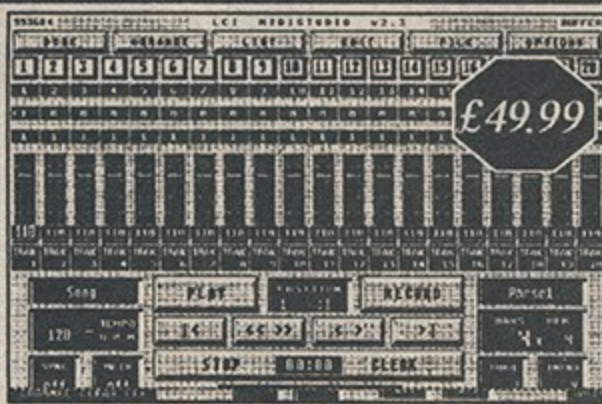

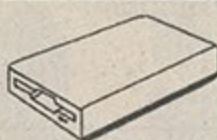

The Apple Macintosh range of computers are generally accepted as being the friendliest computers for everyday use. Their much copied – but never equalled – windows, icons, menus and pointer system, provides an easy means of navigating the machine's excellent range of applications, and what's more, all software conforms to the same 'front-end'.

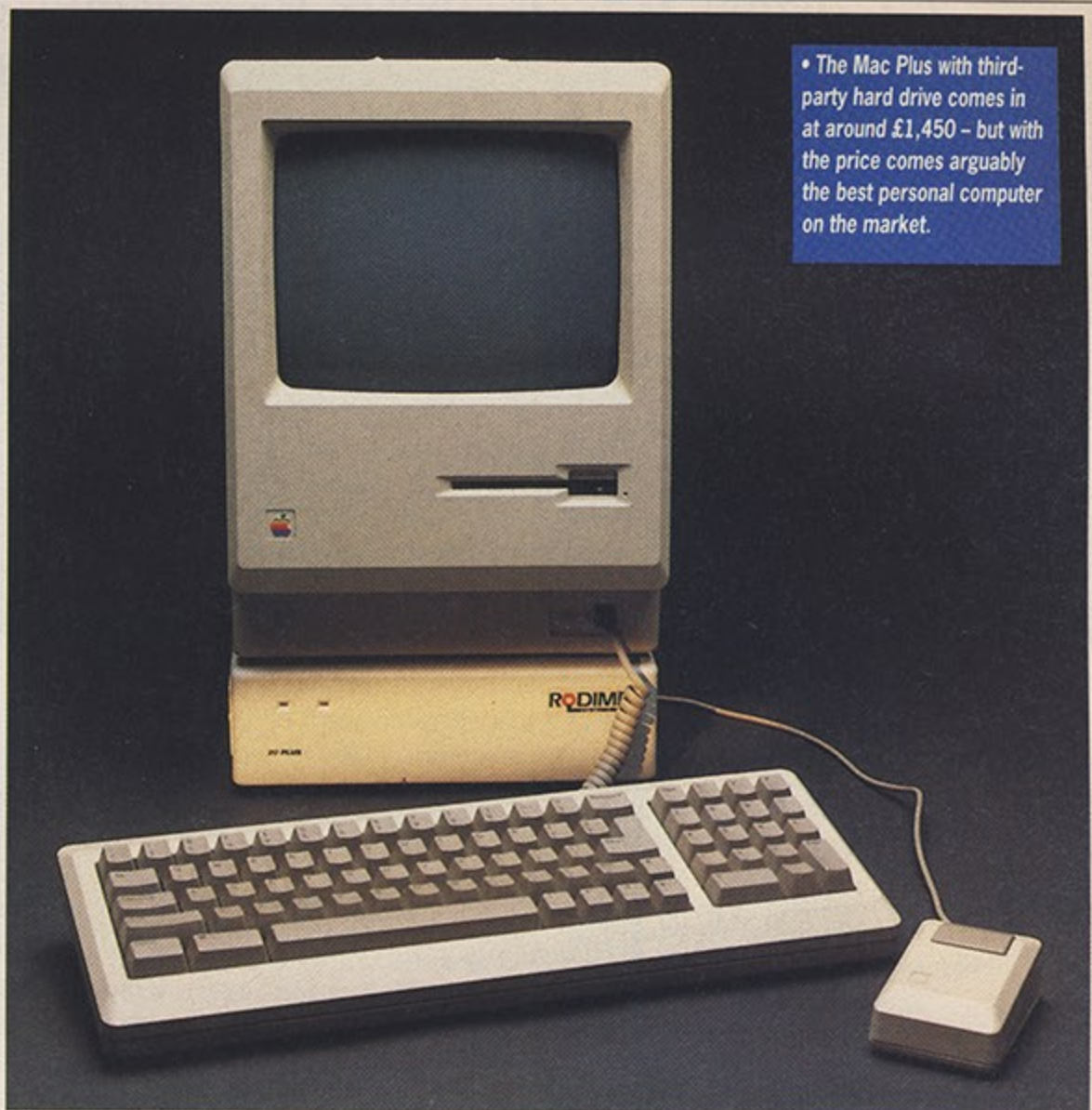
Even function and combination key presses are identical across a wide range of programs, allowing you to quickly familiarise yourself with new packages. All the machines are bundled with *HyperCard* and those featuring 1.44Mb disk drives come with *File Exchange* software enabling you to read and write to MS-DOS format.

With the built-in systems software there is also a good range of different fonts, utilities and desk accessories supplied as standard. So from an owners' point of view, the Mac is probably unequalled in terms of sheer usability. But becoming a Mac owner doesn't come cheap!

STATESIDE SHOPPING

Once upon a time it made sense to fly to the States to buy a Mac. There, you could pick up a machine for 40 per cent of the cost here.

To some extent it's still worth making the trans-Atlantic trip. For instance, the entry level Mac Plus is £1,100 here yet only £600 in the US, while a top-of-the-range IIfx, costing you £7,700 in the UK, can be picked up for only £3,600 in New York. But you will have to declare it to customs on return where duty of 4.5 per cent and VAT of 15 per cent will be added to the receipt you show. So you will be paying somewhere between £100 and £700 extra, and will also

have to include at least £300 for air and hotel costs.

You would also have to take Apple's policy on 'grey imports' into account. To put it in a nutshell, any warranty on Apple kit purchased outside of the UK would be invalid. Therefore the cost of any repairs would have to be borne in full by yourself, and you would probably have to import any spares from the States for yourself too, since authorised Apple dealers here are mostly reluctant to let them go to non-AppleCare subscribers.

But then as Apple kit is well-built and very reliable you might think it a risk worth taking.

VARIETY PACK

Altogether there are 14 different configurations of Mac machines, but these can be divided into two main varieties – the self-contained units represented by the Plus, SE and Portables and the modular systems comprising the II range.

The Plus is the entry-level model and comes with 1Mb of RAM, a keyboard and 800K internal floppy drive. As with the basic SE, which has a faster chip and two 1.44Mb floppies, the Plus only really comes into its own when used in conjunction with a hard disk. This is because part of the Mac operating system is loaded in from disk each time rather than residing in ROM chips. As such, and despite the sophisticated yet easy to use interface, even the most simple system calls – say to copy or delete files – require a lot of floppy disk swapping.

The Apple Macintosh. Everyone raves about how good it is. Everyone moans about how much it costs. Andy Storer finds out the facts behind the most user-friendly computer there is.

So it's essential to have either an additional floppy or a hard disk, otherwise operations can be painfully slow. Just loading an advanced piece of software such as the DTP classic, *Quark Xpress*, can take over a dozen disk swaps! But with a hard drive included, and the SE range come with 20 and 40 Mb versions, the system is a dream. Especially if you have the 2Mb or 4Mb of RAM fitted as standard in the other four models of the SE range, and particularly if you have the 68030 chip found in the top two.

SE STARTING PRICES

Prices for the SE range start out at £1,995 for the double disk drive version, while a 2Mb RAM SE with a 20Mb hard drive costs £2,525 – £2,829 for the 40Mb version.

Moving up to the 68030-based SE/30s, £3,536 will buy you a 2Mb RAM, 40 Mb hard disk model while the same machine with 4Mb of RAM goes for £4,075.

PRICEY STUFF

If you think the prices for the self-contained units (See box) are a little high you should take a look at those for the Mac II modular range. But to be fair, in both ➤

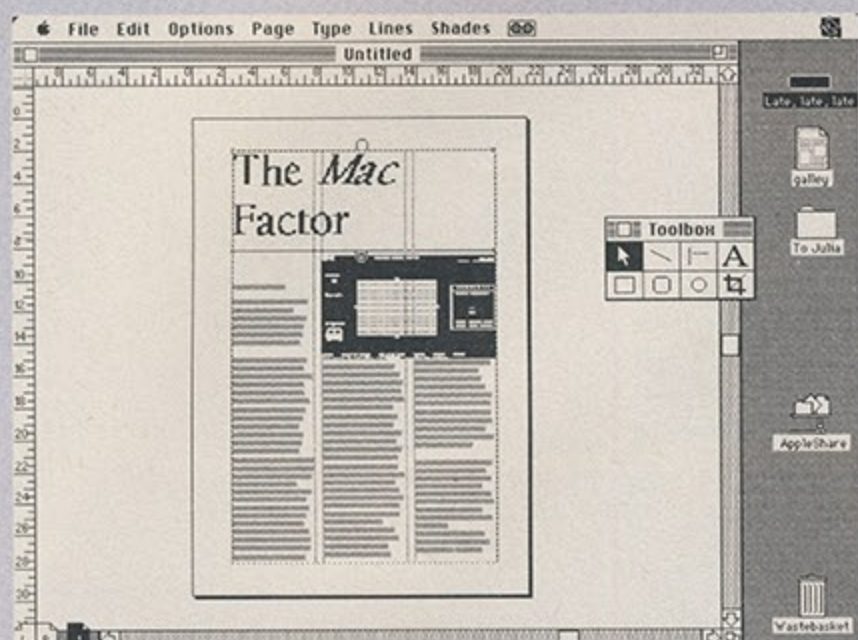

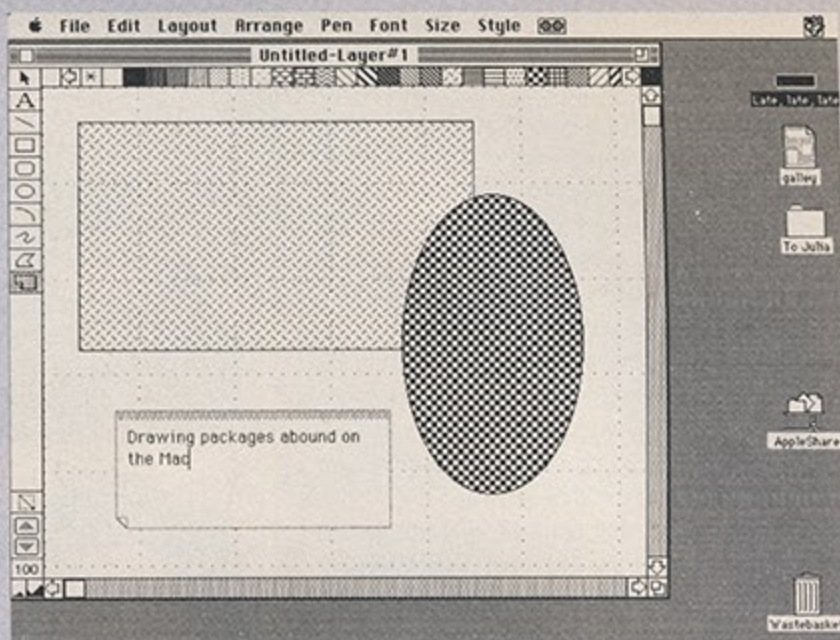

cases you are paying for the build-quality and reliability that everyday professional demands require. Nevertheless, Apple's pricing strategy remains a moot point. Last year's decision to cut the price of the Mac Plus by 25 per cent was warmly greeted, but only led enthusiastic commentators to suggest 50 per cent would have cleaned the floor of competitors. By the time you've added a £300 20Mb hard disk to the Mac Plus to make it properly functional, you're still talking nearly £1,500 for a 1Mb, 68000 machine with a single floppy.

But for those seriously interested in professional use, the cost of a Mac II system won't appear that excessive.

All the Mac II machines have a 68030 chip fitted as standard and come with either 2Mb or 4Mb of RAM, and either a 40Mb or 80Mb hard disk. For these configurations, prices start out at just under £5,000 and go up to £6,250. These sums will buy you just the central processing unit, mouse and systems software with HyperCard and MS-DOS drive readers thrown in for good measure. So you'll have to pay another £340 for a 12-inch mono monitor or £800 for a 13-inch colour monitor, along with the appropriate video cards to support them, costing between £160 and £575. Also you will need to include a keyboard in your costing here - at £110.

Since at some stage you'll want to print out your various works you might want to opt for the essential Mac add-on - the LaserWriter for between £2,300 and £5,285 or the Apple Imagewriter at between £500 and

£1,150. Other makes of laser can be used as long as they support the PostScript printer standard. Everyday Epson-compatible printers can be used as long as you have the necessary drivers available from PD sources for around £30.

THE ULTIMATE PORTABLE?

For sheer sophistication, portability and reliability they don't come much better than the Macintosh portable. Racing along at 16MHz and containing some high-spec sound and video ports, the machine is being touted as the mobile multimedia tool *par excellence*. Designed for the up-town businessman as well, the portable might cost you £5,170 with a 40Mb hard disk but it really is the bee's knees.

SO ARE THEY WORTH IT?

Yes. You will be hard pressed to find anyone who has ever used one to tell you otherwise. The Mac is easily the most addictive hardware ever devised. Not only does it look good and have a crisp operation, but most of the software is entirely compatible with everything else. Thus you can easily create a picture in one and paste it into another, no problem at all.

With HyperCard you have access to the hippest collection of PD software in the world, and, if you have the money, the sky's the limit on video, sequencing and sampling kit. DTP was born on the Mac, and the machine remains its main platform.

So if you like the look of the Macintosh range, fly

to America, use other people's money, or start saving. But there are another two possibilities. If you are a student you can get up to 25 per cent discount on the prices quoted for the entire range.

Of course if none of these appeal, or your finances make them completely impossible, then you can always transform your ST or Amiga with an emulator. Models for the ST and Amiga cost £380 and £240 respectively, and generally speaking work well and reliably, although you are denied some of the more sophisticated Mac features, such as the built-in networking capability.

In the final analysis, the Mac is well worth the financial effort it takes to get hold of one. ■

MAC-SIM-ISE YOUR ST OR AMIGA

If you fancy a cheaper alternative to all this expensive Mac kit, but like the sound of the world of software, you might like to take a look at emulation on the machine you already own.

GST's Spectre GCR Mac emulator for the ST sells for £378, supports hard drives, and effectively converts your ST into a Mac running some 20 per cent faster than a Mac Plus, with a larger screen display,

and a high degree of compatibility. The manufacturer claims it will run all Mac software except those applications specifically designed for the 68020-based Mac II. More from GST on 0954 81991.

Meanwhile Amiga owners should take a look at A-Max from Entertainment International on 0268 541126. Available for the A500, 1000 and 2000 for £240, A-Max allows Mac format disks to be used

directly during Mac emulation and, ironically, Spectre disks too! However, unlike when using Spectre you won't be able to run a hard disk while in Mac emulation mode. This is a shame since on the ST, Spectre's hard disk access times are faster than those of Apple's own and make disk-intensive programs fly along. Plans to incorporate this into the A-Max specs are said to be in the pipeline.

At Christmas, CodeMasters was poised to take the 8-bit gaming world by storm with its revolutionary CD Games Pack. Advertisements were placed, massive press coverage was received. Months later it is still not here. So what has happened to 8-bit CD?

CodeMasters – previously simple budget game specialists – was touting a system that contained 30 games, could load them in seconds from any domestic CD player, and would cost a mere £20. The CD Games Pack was set to make loading errors a thing of the past, and bring the 8-bits back into the fray as serious games machines. At least, that was the plan.

It's three months since those early boasts, and the CD Games Pack has already conspicuously missed its chart-storming target. Indeed, of the three systems – Spectrum, C64 and CPC – planned, only the first two have so far made it onto the shop shelves.

Speculation about the purpose, profitability and even common sense of the project is understandably growing. Is there room in the market for yet another gadget to be plugged into the back of your friendly neighbourhood micro? Is it possible for a company to successfully assume the mantle of hardware manufacturer and software house simultaneously?

A STARTER FOR 10

CodeMasters spokesman Mike Clarke explained the initial reasoning behind the project: "The CD Games Pack is in fact a spin-off. It's something we thought we could do, call it a starter for 10. Nice and easy technically, although there with a bit of sourcing and manufacturing involved. Practice, I suppose.

"Our hardware team needed something to cut their teeth on, and they thought they could do it, no problem. Remember, we're only talking about a lead here! It's not like Miles Gordon, who had to get a whole computer assembled. We also had the benefit of Richard Darling's trip to Taiwan, where he'd met a lot of manufacturers and made a lot of connections."

The reason for this searching out of technical expertise, however, is still shrouded in secrecy. It appears that the CD Games Pack may have been a 'dry run' for another product, one that may debut this year – more than likely at one of the big consumer electronics shows such as the CES in Chicago or the ECT in London.

Concentrating on the present 'revolutionary' system, though, pushes other questions to the fore. How did a software house, especially one with such a cheap and cheerful image as CodeMasters, become convinced people would want to buy the Games Pack?

"Initially, our techniques were fairly simplistic. Included with our higher price games was a registration card, and a large number of people sent them back. So we sat down with a massive stack of these cards and rang around asking a list of questions. 'Do you have CD player in the house? Would you be able to use it with your computer?' Which was practically all we needed to know."

This research revealed the following: two metres was the optimum length for the cable; a surprising number of people had CDs and computers (40 per cent); and a lot of houses had more than one CD player! Commented Clarke: "It also showed that most people don't know the first thing about how their CD player works. They didn't want to begin messing around with the connections at the back, so we had to work out of the headphone jack."

ADVERTISING CAMPAIGN

CodeMasters was willing to back up this initial optimism with a massive advertising campaign to push their baby in the vital Christmas market. The company found to its cost, however, that hardware projects can

be hit by as many delays as can software – and missed the boat.

"We were anticipating getting it out in the first week of December, whereas it was only finished a week before Christmas. It probably didn't even reach the shops before the New Year – which could be described as a monumental cock-up – but there's no way we could avoid it. It's made a little headway in the Commodore charts, which is quite surprising because there haven't been many of them around!

"Regard its position now in the same light as the Atari Lynx, which was only obtainable in New York over Christmas, because they restricted the market. Something similar has happened here, it's still a very fresh and happening product that's got long way to go. There are a lot more people out there who actually want these things than have managed to get hold of one. The Press has seized on it as a wonderful idea."

The CD Games Pack did appear briefly in the shops, but mysteriously disappeared almost immediately. This only fuelled rumours that the system didn't meet the specs, or even didn't work at all! The reason for such a disappearance is put firmly at the door of the CD player manufacturers by CodeMasters, as certain systems forced a product re-vamp to guarantee 100 per cent compatibility.

"A few people were unable to coax it into working with a certain brand of CD player. But the new version works with it, and on the loading menu it now actually states brands. It's given us the chance to offer a few more options on the loader cassette. There's the normal option which will work with 99 per cent of CD play-

ers. Then you've got an option which loads more slowly but is even more reliable. Finally you've got an option in which you can't reset out and load another game, but is totally reliable. And on the CPC version you've also the option of transferring the loader cassette to disk, because that's one bit of software we don't mind getting spread all over the world!

COMING SOON

Mike Clarke is eager to make the best of the situation: "The response has been so good it has, if anything, encouraged us. It was definitely a step in the right direction and we want to do more 'firmware' – something between hardware and software – it's a nice place to pitch ourselves. We're often perceived in some areas of the press as a 'budget house', a company that just throws games at people. We've made some money on the £2.99 stuff and can now start sinking it into other ventures. We're very happening and set to get a whole lot more exciting.

"It's too early to say for certain that it's the medium of the future, but there are four other CD products in development at the moment. It's an idea we definitely want to push, we're not scared of the thing. As for the future with the 16-bits, we'll have to see.

"The £2.99 stuff is our bread and butter, a little measure to keep the wolf from the door. Whatever anybody says, it keeps selling and it keeps selling in quantity. People out there want to play our games and it's really good news, because it's money we can rely on. We don't want to lose any impetus in the budget market because of the CD."

WHAT DO YOU GET FOR YOUR MONEY?

Opening the box reveals a whole host of goodies. The lead is truly immense. The unusual length is vital, as not everybody's parents will be willing to disassemble the hi-fi whenever a game needs to be loaded. An adapter is included so that the lead can fit into both the standard 3.5mm headphone sockets or the miniature plugs found on portable equipment. The electronics are moulded into the computer end of the cable, which connects to the joystick port of the computer.

The inclusion of a cassette tape may seem odd at first, but before the computer can load anything from the CD player it must have the software to do it. The tape contains a loader which is only a few hundred bytes in

length. Once loaded then the tape need not be used again – each game has a quit option that will reactivate the loader. CodeMasters toyed with the idea of recording this loader at standard tape loading speed on the CD, but dropped the idea as it would involve too much lead-swapping and generally add techno-fear to an already confusing concept.

The CD itself is crammed full with the games. Each game is recorded twice just in case there are any problems with dirty discs. Although the advertising claims there are 30 games on each disc, CodeMasters have generously added one or two more, utilising all the available space.



WANTED TO CODEMASTERS' CD?

The Press generally is as interested in the technology CodeMasters has pioneered as the Games Pack itself. Surely other software houses must be queuing up to licence the technology, now that someone has got it working?

"No-one in Britain's come to us about licensing. I think they're all sitting back and waiting to see how we do, because we're breaking into a new market. We've got to establish awareness, gain consumers' confidence, get them to accept the product for what it is and not to be scared of games on CD. We're working on that now, so if it does go really high up in the charts, people will start talking about it as a product and not an oddity."

Licensing would make a lot of sense, though, if the 'oddy' fulfills its financial promise. CodeMasters has already spent an estimated £22,000 on designing, building and filling the market with the CD leads. Add this to a cost of only 90 pence per CD itself and the margins start to look pretty healthy.

"It's more profitable to sell games at £20 than £2.99. Now that sounds obvious, but there is a lot more behind it. When you take into account distributors' and retailers' margins, we're making the same profit on one of those at £20 as we are on five budget games at £2.99."

CodeMasters has begun a profitable revolution with its CD Games Pack, but has found the process can be pretty painful for all the parties involved. It remains to be seen whether it's the beginning of a CD-based coup – or whether it was the manufacturing experience CodeMasters sought, and not a user base for a new system. The future for the CD relies on licensing, as even their own vast back catalogue can't stand much raiding at 30 games a shot.

If nothing else has been gained from this adventure in hardware, CodeMasters has enhanced its reputation and stated its intention to become a major player in the future of the leisure industry. ■

CHANNEL TROUBLES

There were the inevitable teething problems with the CD. To get the system loading as fast as possible, CodeMasters designed the lead to read both left and right channels – doubling the speed of transfer. Unfortunately, some brands of compact disc player suffered from cost-cutting design.

Instead of having a digital-audio converter (DAC) for each channel, these models share a single converter, switching rapidly between the two channels to give the effect of continuous stereo. The resulting stereo signal is slightly out of phase.

The phasing effect is not too noticeable to the ordinary punter

(although the hi-fi purist would object), but to a computer the signal is rendered incomprehensible.

The system has now been modified to take into account these older machines – by using a slower but more reliable recording – and should now be compatible with 100 per cent of CD hardware.

CD GAMES PACK – CD-ROM?

CD-ROM is in. Everybody wants one, but nobody can afford one.

These hi-tech gadgets load data ultra-fast from conventional Compact Discs containing a vast amount of pre-recorded information. The devices are totally computer-controlled, making them highly interactive. As well as an enormous amount of raw data, CD-ROMs can also hold high-quality music and video.

The data is stored digitally on the Compact Disc and can be read directly by the computer.

There is price to pay for this leading-edge technology, though. Even if these up-to-the-minute gadgets were available for 8-bit micros, they would be well above the

price range of your average Speccy owner.

The CodeMasters device is not a CD-ROM. It does not interact with the computer, and it does not read the information digitally. Instead, the data is stored as a series of two-tone 'beeps'.

It can be described more accurately as a glorified tape loader that owners of these down-market micros have come to know and hate. Play the CD games pack through speakers and you will hear that horrendous howling noise that only tape-based 8-bit computers can bear to listen to.

However, a CD-based loading system offers many advantages over the more traditional tape. Because

the information is recorded digitally, there is no trace of the 'noise' associated with audio recordings – the cause of many a load error. This more accurate sound means that the signal can be replayed more quickly, certainly several times faster than tape, and still retain excellent reliability. CDs offer better 'data integrity' – they are not susceptible to distortion from magnetic sources and can withstand a relatively high quantity of dirt and scratches. Finally, although the system is not computer interactive, CDs can be split into tracks. By recording each program on a separate track, the search facilities that all domestic CD players feature can be used to manually select the required games.

HELP! Train me!

Please could you help me with a small problem I have with my Atari ST? At the moment I only really play games with the machine, but I would like to start programming. Is there any place where I could go to learn programming, or would I have to learn it on my own?

Also, please could you send me a signed photograph?

Doncaster is, I believe, a large town. Large towns almost invariably have a technical, FE or HE college (particularly in the North, where 'local-boys-made-good' decide to invest some of their pile in a public building or teaching establishment, in order that their name will live on). To determine the location of any college in Doncaster, pop along to your local library, they will have addresses and probably even a prospectus or two.

Depending upon your age and status, a basic course in programming will cost somewhere between nothing and £100. Sounds like a lot, but you will get expert tuition and help to support the concept of education for all.

If there isn't a college near you, you don't have the time to attend it or you can't afford to pay the course fees, get back to the library and run your fingers over their computer section. I guarantee almost all of the books will be out of date, mainly dealing with machines such as the Spectravideo, TRS80 and Ti994/a, but in among the antique computers there will be several texts detailing BASIC, Fortran, Pascal, COBOL and the like which, with a modicum of application on your part, will teach you everything you need to know about programming the Atari ST.

You will, of course, need to have implementations of the languages you wish to learn. BASIC is easy – the ST comes complete with a copy, but Fortran, COBOL and the like will have to

be purchased separately. If you can't afford compilers (programs which take the language commands you've written and convert them into a form the ST can understand), they're available from public domain libraries for a nominal fee. Buying a couple of these will enable you to try out several languages to determine which one is best for you.

HELP! Shared TV

I have recently bought a new television, and my ST now comes through on the same channel as the video, which louses up the respective signals. The TV manual states that a computer can be connected to the SCART socket.

Will this stop the interference? If so, where can I buy such a cable? How much will this SCART lead cost and where would it plug into the back of the ST? If not, please suggest some other connection method, as I cannot use the video while the computer is on.

Connecting your machine via a SCART socket will almost certainly help with the problem of interference.

You can buy a SCART lead for the ST from Evesham Micros for around £10. This cable will have a SCART connector at one end and a standard ST monitor plug at the other.

One end goes into your ST's monitor jack socket, the other into the TV.

HELP! Serial solution?

Last year I scraped together enough money and bought an Amiga together with an A501 512K memory upgrade. I was – and still am – very happy with my machine, but my problems started when I decided to get a printer to make listings of my programs and to produce some low-resolution graphic dumps.

A friend of mine had an old printer that he didn't use any more, that had been attached to an Atari ST. He offered it to me for free and I accepted because I could not afford the £150 for a new printer. The printer he gave me was a C-Itoh M8510 Plus serial device which did not have a manual. I acquired a serial printer lead, connected the printer to my Amiga, selected the serial printer mode from Preferences but nothing happened!

I've spoken to Commodore's technical department and I was advised that the problems could be with the pin-outs from the printer or the settings of the dip switches. C-Itoh have said that special driver is required for this printer. As I have no manual for the printer, I'm totally clueless! Could you tell me how the dip switches should be set, and where I can get a suitable printer driver that would enable the printer to work with my Amiga?

I am also looking to buy a word processor when finances permit. Would one of these have the correct driver I need?

OK. Back to basics. The printer worked perfectly well with your friend's ST, right? Why not borrow the serial lead they used.

In this way, you'll be able to discover whether the fault lies with the serial cable you've acquired. The Amiga and ST have exactly the same serial port, and leads are entirely interchangeable between the two.

How did your friend use the printer with his word processing and graphics programs? Did they have to get a special printer driver? There's no reason why your printer – given the correct lead – shouldn't print in the serial standard ASCII mode supplied with all word processors (although this won't enable you to print graphics).

As for the dip switches, unless one of the esteemed TechTippers has a manual or some information to spare, I'm

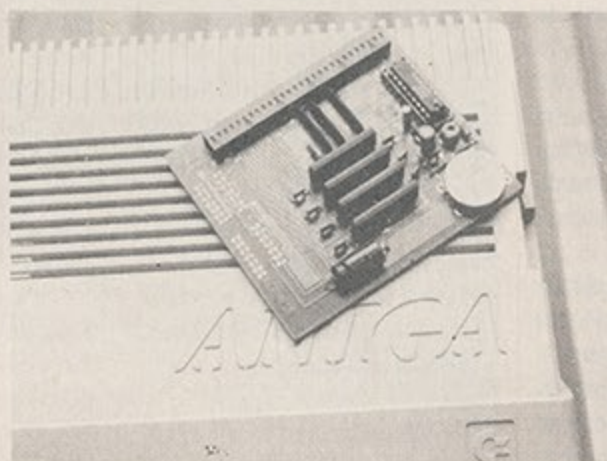

What can the A501 memory upgrade do? It can expand the amount of RAM memory your Amiga is equipped with. Expanding the amount of memory a computer has at its disposal will enable you to greatly increase the performance of the machine. You will be able to make better use of databases, spreadsheets and word processors by holding far more data in RAM, desktop publishing applications benefit by being able to manipulate far larger documents with more fonts, pictures and the like. Many games also benefit by being run on larger memory machines providing better graphics, more digitised sounds and speech, and faster animation (the computer can store more animation

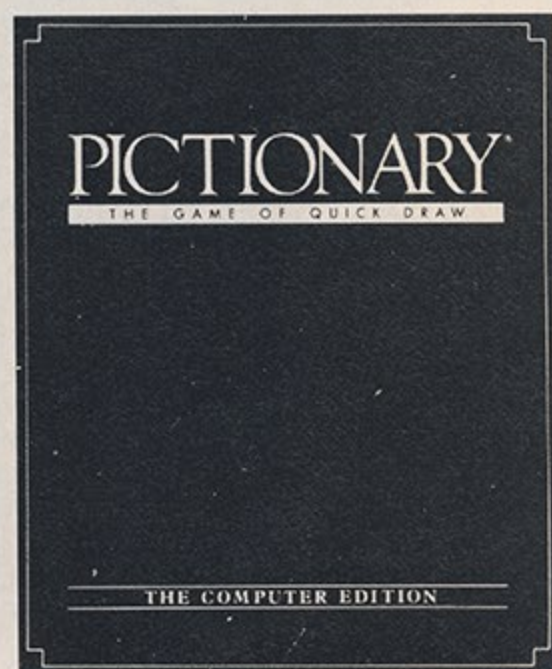

frames in memory and does not need to access the disk quite so often). If you can afford it, a RAM expansion is one of the best upgrades you can give to your machine.

If you try a different cable and get some print-out – however unintelligible – experiment with the dips. Don't worry, you can't damage anything and may discover the true setting. As with any obscure bit of kit, you're going to have to burn the midnight oil in an effort to discover the correct configurations. Frustrating, but it's all part of the fun of computing.

HELP! Time warp

Our family are newcomers to the world of Amiga computing, having recently upgraded from a Spectrum. We bought the machine in October last year and soon after, bought a second drive. A few days before Christmas we treated ourselves to an early present and bought ourselves a Commodore PN 312600 expansion kit.

A few days after Christmas we realised that the clock was gaining time at quite an alarming rate (the year had advanced to 2000!). We took the expansion kit back to the shop where we bought it and it was replaced with another.

Unfortunately, we now find that the new clock is behaving in exactly the same way. We have reset it several times but it still gains. The shop suggested that perhaps the computer was not being used enough to keep the battery charged. We did charge the battery for 24 hours when we first installed it, and the computer is used for several hours every day.

Is it possible that we are doing something wrong, or could it be a fault with the computer?

The other question concerns our printer. We bought a Star LC-10 colour

printer last week and are very pleased with it, but there are a couple of queries that we can't find the answers to.

We have installed the printer with the correct driver and it works fine through Workbench and with *DPaint* and a working demonstration copy of *Protext*. What we cannot understand is if you open the System drawer, there is an icon for initialising the printer. When we have clicked on the icon it is rather like double Dutch! We can find no reference to this anywhere. Can you help?

The last question concerns the use of the graphic dump in the Workbench. We have managed to print out a nice copy of the Workbench screen, but cannot work out how to do anything else with it. There must be another use. Is it possible to use it to print screens from games for example? If so, how do we do it?

What could be wrong with your clock? The problem may lie with the battery, but I doubt it – you seem to be giving the machine enough use. All I can suggest is that, being new to computing on the Amiga, you may have it connected incorrectly. Try taking the whole machine plus expansion along to the store that sold you the clock and ask them to have a look at it.

Don't worry about the printer initialisation icon in the System drawer. It's there so that you can create the necessary driver (a little list of commands to get your printer to perform with paint packages and other applications) for printers that don't have a driver. As you've said, the LC-10 works perfectly from the Workbench, *DPaint* and other applications, so leave well alone!

The graphic dump is for doing exactly what you've already been doing with it – reproducing computer screens on your printer.

Unfortunately, although in theory you should be able to print screens from your favourite games, in practice this is extremely difficult as most games have code to stop you tampering with them (this is primarily to stop users making pirate copies of the games).

However, many clever Amiga owners (yes, there are one or two) have written little utilities to enable you to stop games and copy their screens, and there are several of these programs available from the public domain. Contact Senlac Software on 0424 753070 for an example.

HELP! Upgrade query

I have recently sold my Atari 520STFM with a view to upgrading to an STE, but with all the problems being encountered by those who own the STE, I would like to change format to an IBM PC compatible which would also be more useful at college and work.

Fortunately, I'm in a position to be able to afford a 386 machine. However, as this is a 32-bit chip would there be any problems with the 16-bit software available for PC compatibles? Will there be problems with my Star LC-10 printer? Finally, are you aware of a good manual which gives an overview of the PC, and instructions on connecting devices to the expansion slots?

Fortunately, the 386 PCs are downwardly compatible with their smaller

brothers – the common or garden PC and compatibles. You can run any software on a 386 that you can run on a less powerful PC. Likewise, all peripherals such as printers, drives, monitors, modems and the like will work perfectly. You can continue to use the Star LC-10.

An excellent manual detailing the hardware specifications of the PC is the *PC Upgrade Handbook* (ISBN 1 85058 118 5) by Clive Smith and published by the Sigma Press. It's available from all good High Street book stores for £9.95

HELP! Wear the mask

Could you please advise on the possibilities of using a BBC emulator and a PC emulator on my newly-acquired Commodore Amiga 500? Should I be considering an IBM PC 5.25-inch disk? What other hardware do I require to access the software for the above mentioned makes of computer? How much will it all cost? Should I consider buying a cheap BBC B or Master (*There's no such thing – Unc*).

My main reason for buying the Amiga was to acquire the latest technology I could afford. The BBC computers are not made now, so I'm told, and the IBM PC appears to be entirely business-based. I think BBC educational software is a vast area from which my children could benefit greatly.

Hey Gerald, haven't you bought rather a white elephant?

You're anxious to use BBC educational software (the Beeb Master is still available and there are thousands of BBC Bs on the second-hand market) and you want to use IBM PC software. Why didn't you buy either of those computers, at least then you would only have to emulate the other rather than both. I suppose that selling the Amiga and buying one of the latter machines is out of the question?

OK. Beeb and PC emulators are available for the Amiga and work with varying degrees of success. The BBC emulator is not an emulator at all, but a language which enables you to run BASIC (and only BASIC) programs on your Amiga, but as there are lots of BASIC educational programs around, this should cover what you want to do. The emulator written by Ariadne is available from Commodore itself.

Until recently, the only PC emulator available for a Commodore machine was the Bridgeboard for the A2000. The launch of KCS's Power PC Board changes all that however, by bringing PC compatibility to the unexpanded A500. The board supports the Amiga's internal 3.5-inch drive, and as most new PC software is available in this format, you'll have access to almost everything.

Fairly simple to fit, is priced at £299 and can be bought from Bitcon Devices, 88 Beswick Road, Gateshead NE8 1RS. The price includes MS-DOS. ■

HELP! Some advice on setting up screen shots

I am writing to ask if you could give me any tips on how to produce quality photographic screen shots from the Amiga screen. I am producing a fanzine for my A-level communication studies project and have encountered a few problems when trying to photograph the screen. So if possible, could you tell me how to produce the quality shots that I see in your magazine. Also, have you any tips on the editing and designing aspects when creating a magazine. I hope to create a new and original format so I will send you the finished product and see what you think of it.

You will need a 35mm SLR

camera for best results. Buy some 100ASA colour transparency film – be prepared to use lots and lots of this – load your camera, secure it to a tripod and attach a cable release to the shutter trigger.

Place the tripod in front of the Amiga's monitor or TV so that the camera lens is at the same height and square relative to the screen. Darken the room or drape a large velvet cloth over the screen and camera. If you want to shoot a game, pause the action at the point you wish to photograph.

Open the lens aperture as wide as it will go (usually around f1.8). Set the shutter speed to a 1/2 second and release the shutter. Wind on, set the shutter speed to

a 1/4 second and release the shutter again. Repeat with shutter speeds of 1/8th and 1/16th. You now have four exposures of the screen you wished to photograph, one of which will have just the right balance of tones to be perfect for reproduction. It's wasteful of film, but that's how it's done (or rather, that's how we do it).

Design tips? Don't listen to anyone. And don't read any of those trashy pamphlets by 'popular' computer writers purporting to tell you how to design like the experts.

Good design is exceedingly difficult to quantify, but is generally that which doesn't get in the reader's way. Let loose with a desktop publishing

program and access to a hundred fonts, most novices pepper their publications with typefaces and end up with something that looks like a Victorian circus poster – absolutely appalling! In Tech Tips, we use Placard for headlines, Helvetica for the text, and that's it!

When you design a page, try roughing it out with a pencil and paper first. The temptation is often to fiddle endlessly with an on-screen version in the DTP package, but unfortunately most budget DTPs don't have the speed or flexibility to design 'on-line'. You are much better off working out what you want to do first.

The best tip is to cut along to a newsagent and examine every magazine you can lay hands on.

FROM THE TOP

In the last year Atari has never been far from the headlines with a series of major releases and controversial problems. Bob Gleadow, Atari UK's managing director, is the driving force behind the British end of the company, and Colin Campbell went to meet him...



Atari's ST, while far from the autumn of its years, has reached the safety of middle age. It is neither state of the art, nor outdated junk – but it has passed its prime as an admired piece of hardware. With characteristic savvy its maker and guardian has performed the necessary transition with common sense. That is, to position the machine not as a bright new thing for the computer literate, but as a no-nonsense entry level option for the masses who have yet to fully comprehend that there's more to computing than bytes, floppies and *Pacman*.

Atari would rather be selling computers than positioning them in some grand scheme. But position it must in order to introduce the five year-old ST to what continues to be the most important person in home computing – the first-time buyer.

TOP MAN

Bob Gleadow, for the past three years Atari UK's top man, is fronting the operation. He's not just the managing director of Britain's sales operation, but more significantly, a touchstone for the decision makers in Sunnyvale, California. With the UK so important to Atari Inc, his performance is vital.

His ruffled hair and amiable manner belie a wolf-like approach to business that incorporates aggression with a subtlety, which opposite numbers lack.

Like most businessmen he says 'we like to think we can afford to be nice', but he'd rather like to think he can thrash his competitors if he has to.

He is most certainly faster at making decisions than his adversaries, but this can have an unpleasant effect. Buyers of the STE – shipped-in at short notice last December to cope with yet another Christmas shortage – will testify to this.

It was Gleadow who picked up the telephone and dragged the computers into Britain when seasonal demand and a dock strike threatened to mangle up sales plans. And, despite predictable compatibility problems, he'd probably do the same again.

But his immediate concern does not centre around supplying demand – more with generating it. Bargain

hunters may be pleased to learn that this will be achieved through the ST Discovery Pack (*Express* 70).

Bundles are bundles are bundles, and they are usually cobbled together with a degree of sales cynicism. Atari is no less guilty of that than any other company, but this time there appears to be a genuine attempt to give people what they really want: a good computer, a guiding hand, and some freebies to boot.

"What we want to do this year is position the 520ST as a first-time buyer's machine with a £299 price-point. We're trying to separate out the first-time buyer and the second-time buyer – one with an attractive £299 package, and the other at £499 where we'll actually look to sell the 1040."

This may smack of marketing mumbo-jumbo, but therein sits the future of one of Europe's most popular home computers. Gleadow is no longer content to fight it out with the Amiga – he's now after those people who would normally be wondering whether a CPC would be better than a Spectrum.

"It's a better deal. When you buy an 8-bit computer you still have to look at a disk drive and other extras. With the 520 you're getting a superior machine with a 1Mb disk drive and access to a wide range of software packages."

POINT TAKEN

He has a point. Buy a tape-driven CPC and you're looking at £299. Buy one with a disk drive and that's £399. The Speccy isn't much better. A Plus 3 will cost £100 less than the ST – but it's largely based on a computer introduced almost 10 years ago.

It has to be noted that the ST has been selling for £299 for ages. But people don't simply want a piece of hardware, they want a fully-fledged computing option – hence the new emphasis. The 520 ST is no longer in a head-to-head battle with the Amiga. It's an alternative to the 8-bits. At least that's the theory. ■

GLEADOW ON THE STE

"We released the STE prematurely. We brought in 20,000 last December and they all sold through. The justification for our doing that was that there was a dock strike at Folkestone and we had to fly them in," says Gleadow.

This isn't exactly saying 'sorry we did wrong' but it is something of a departure from the arrogant attitude displayed when the STE compatibility fiasco was in full swing.

Then, when leading ST software packages were not running on the upgrade, Atari was adamant that it could not be held responsible for the follies of over-ambitious programmers who saw fit to break the rules on earlier models.

Nevertheless, these follies are well known to all in computing and really should have been added to the formula.

Gleadow explains: "We all know that programmers take

short cuts. The problem was that they were violating Atari guidelines. The problem with the Atari guidelines is that you could go round them with one version of a product with no problem. But of course when Atari comes to do the next version it takes those guidelines as the Bible and sticks to them. That's how we guarantee compatibility."

Except of course, in the event, real-world compatibility could not be guaranteed.

Whatever, the wails of 'I should have bought an Amiga after all' from disgruntled buyers have floated away. Software publishers are falling into line, and with the STE now priced at £100 more than the STFM, Atari is saying that those 20,000 buyers can count themselves pretty lucky.

The STE is a 'serious' computer. "You can upgrade it to almost anything you want. 4Mb packs are already available from

third-party dealers, proving that there is a market demand for the serious user."

The STE costs serious money. Atari is deliberately steering prospective purchasers toward the £499 option with extra goodies. One suspects the basic £399 model will not be one of Atari's big sellers this year.

But is the STE an 'Amiga beater'? "I never said it was," he replies. "It's an improvement on the existing machine."

GLEADOW ON BUSINESS

"Over the last two or three years Atari has become a multi-product manufacturer. By the end of this year you'll see Atari being successful in consoles, with the Lynx, in business machines and there will be the beginnings of a workstation presence. So as we have evolved over the last three years we have had to change our style."

With such a broad range of gadgets and computers within his remit, it's no wonder Gleadow is

looking to "be in the background". When he started at Atari, life was a good deal simpler. But now he's controlling everything from games software in the ARC division, through old consoles, the new ST console (still pencilled in for the autumn), Lynx hand-held, Portfolio pocket PC, to all the STs, as well as the forthcoming TT, a line up of PCs and the top end ATW Transputer Workstation.

With that kind of job spec it's no wonder he has to leave the

nitty gritty to employees. But how much of what we see is dreamt up by the boss? "A degree of that does happen but before we do anything we get a group of people together and have what I call a 'bullshit session'.

"We look at what we're putting together, what we're asking people to buy, and we throw ideas at each other.

"Ultimately though, I have the casting vote."

The best thing about being

the boss of a hardware operation is, he says, the salary, but pay cheques tend to demand a lot of graft. "I think so. When I come in every morning I think I'm going to be leaving at six o'clock, but the hours tend to drag on."

He considers his greatest success at Atari to be the firm's current standing. But what of his biggest regret? Surprisingly it's in that area where the ST has really proved its worth as a serious tool - desktop publishing. Gleadow

says he should have moved faster two years ago when DTP was still more of a buzzword than a reality. "We should have recognised the capabilities of the ST in DTP early on."

Gleadow views it as a real alternative to the Apple Mac rather than being the poor imitation some have suggested (including the market in general).

But he sees the TT as "my second chance to get into DTP and graphics".

GLEADOW ON THE COMPETITION

Much is made of the rivalry between Commodore and the firm it spawned - Atari. Behind the scenes you can just imagine Gleadow grinning every time Commodore (or indeed Amstrad) fumbles the ball.

And of course Mr Franklin (Commodore) and Mr Sugar (Amstrad) will also have a good

chuckle when Atari trips over its own ambitions. Such is the nature of intense competition - but you'll never get any of them to admit it.

"It never crosses my mind. Every step we take is to look at what we think is good for us in the market. We're not interested in what everyone else is doing because we don't have their

logic." A little dig there. Gleadow then goes on to claim that Commodore is obsessed with Atari.

And Amstrad? "The minute Atari starts looking at what Amstrad is doing and we follow that, we immediately relegate ourselves to being behind Amstrad, because we're looking at

what he does. Instead we are looking at what we can do that is good for us.

"If you're in a car race and you start to follow someone, or you look in the mirror and see what everyone else is doing, then it starts to distract you from driving as fast as you can. We're into driving as fast as we can."

But surely you can't ignore your competitors? "There's nothing they can do which specifically influences anything we do. It might cause us not to do something. For instance, if we were planning a headline and then Amstrad went out and did it before us, then we would scrap it, that kind of thing."

GLEADOW ON CD

Given that Atari introduced a CD-ROM device three years ago, it may come as a surprise that Gleadow does not share the enthusiasm expressed by much of the market.

When will we see Atari

introduce an all-in-one CD ST device akin to the much publicised Amiga machine? After all, isn't CD where it's all happening?

"Is Compact Disc happening? You're looking at a man who has

had Compact Disc players in his warehouse for 18 months now. Where is the software commitment? Show me a CD standard. Is it CD-I?

"Look at the MSX. That had a Laserdisc which gave you the best

graphics I've seen. It was true video with a computer image superimposed. Outside of Japan it didn't do very well..."

He turns on the notion of CD/computer combos. "They're going to cost £600 or £700. How

big is the market opportunity at that price range? We think computer buyers should become CD buyers. It's better to offer computer buyers the CD as an extra rather than offering a highly-priced integrated system."

GLEADOW ON THE PRESS

While Commodore and Amstrad generally like to wait for things to happen before announcing them, Atari is constantly toying with the press - hinting, leaking, suggesting and otherwise making

implications. It sometimes moves into the realms of absurdity, although for those with a vested interest in information (like magazine news editors) it's all rather jolly.

Uniquely, Atari isn't so much concerned with the public's perception of it as a company, rather with the perception of each individual project.

This has the effect of

providing magazine readers with lots of juicy titbits from 'highly-placed sources' as well as supplying Atari's formidable PR machine with cheap market research.

Doesn't this take, well, a certain degree of manipulation of the press? Gleadow is suitably shocked at such a suggestion. "I wish we could manipulate the press," he jests. And he is jesting.

■ Varsity challenge

This is a letter that needs to be written, but I am not trying to upset anyone – just bring a few things to the attention of the people who write my-computer-is-better-than-yours letters.

The things which make a successful computer are: enough quality software which is useful and easy to use; a large user-base; and fast reliable hardware. A lot of very good PD shows that there are experienced, dedicated programmers using the machine.

For desktop publishing, I hope you have access to a laser printer or cheap laser printing services and also a lot of memory and a very large, fast, hard disk.

For music, I hope you have access to MIDI keyboards and MIDI equipment and lots of it, for serious music-making requires it.

For graphics, you need a very high resolution multi-sync monitor and a few transputers or graphics co-processors. I am not talking about the future, I am talking about ray-tracing and 32-bit colour, right now.

For serious computing, you must have 4Mb before you count the memory for graphics, digital sound and data, and enough expansion slots so you don't run out of room for the 'necessary' hardware.

This may sound funny to a lot of you. I am not knocking computing as a recreational pastime, but think about what kind of computer you need to do professional work. This is what I mean by serious.



Don't pretend you are a serious computer user until your computer needs to be faster just so that it won't inconvenience you. Don't pretend to be what you are not.

If you need to multi-task more than two big applications at one time you are a serious user. A serious working arrangement for one-man DTP in my books is multi-tasking a wordprocessor, an art package, a DTP system and a few other necessary utilities for macros and such.

This requires, by my reckoning, about 8Mb to be convenient, and that isn't including some good hardware. I am not implying that DTP is not a good application for computer users, just that everyone seems to think that it's the best thing since sliced bread.

All anyone 'needs' is a computer which does everything that he or she needs to be done by computer. But serious computing is in another realm from using an ST at home to do a lot of different little tasks (not multi-tasking), and some people don't seem to realise this.

Many people can't seem to separate what they want their computer to do (usually in some incredible fantasy), and what they need the computer to do for them in a way that is cheaper and more convenient than any other.

I think you have both added perspective to the debate and (to mix metaphors – I am sorry) muddied the waters at the same time.

Yes, the rivalry between owners of various models seems petty judged by the standards of people who have to carry out complex and memory-consuming tasks. And, indeed, it is petty.

I find it difficult to understand why people who are pleased with their computers need to validate their ownership by knocking someone else's machine – it smacks of insecurity and most probably immaturity.

You cloud the issue by attempting to differentiate between serious and

frivolous users on the basis of their computers, and as such you are falling into a very similar trap to people you criticize. You are in danger of replacing the 'my computer is better than yours' squabble with the 'my work is more serious than yours' debate.

There are plenty of musicians using the ST in the course of earning their living. There are plenty of good writers who work on the 'humble' PCW and

whose livelihoods depend on it. They are all 'serious' computer users.

You put your finger on the nub of the matter by stressing the word 'need'. The sort of people I refer to above have machines which will do all that their owners need them to, and setting arbitrary RAM sizes as a measure of 'seriousness' is no more than a distraction from the real question of matching the equipment to the demands of its user.▶

There are, however, a few things that puzzle me.

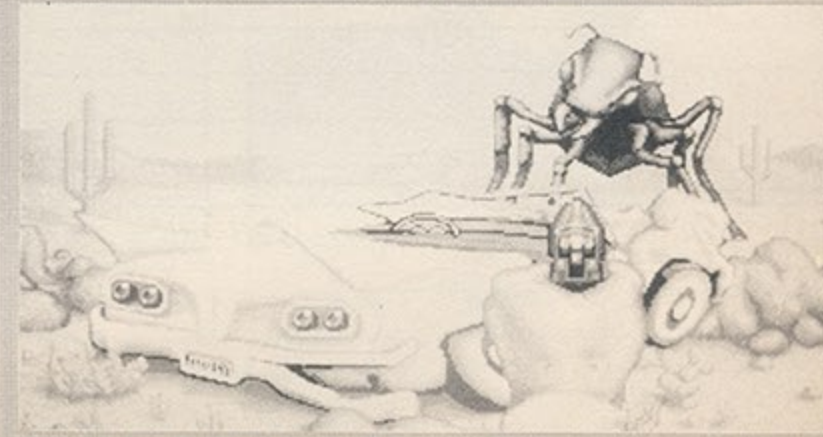

■ Budgie licences

Following the letter of Simon Daniels (*Express* 69) you asked someone to throw some light on licenceware. Well, I think I have some authority on the matter as I was one of the guys involved in setting up one of the first schemes on the Atari ST.

I help run Budgie UK, the cheapest provider of decent games for the ST. In fact, we now manage 37 varied titles, including shoot-'em-ups, simulations, adventures and strategy-based products.

The initial idea came from the ST Club and basically runs along the following lines:

- **Library:** A PD library obtains a written licence from Budgie UK to sell our games and agrees to pay 15p for each game disk that it sells; a serious disk costs the library 50p.

After three months the library counts up the total sales and sends a cheque for that sum.

A minimum fee of £15 per quarter is payable and, if necessary, the library must make up the difference.

- **The author's representative:** In this case Budgie UK. We check the new disks received from the authors to make sure that things work and are good enough to be enlisted and distributed.

We then send these disks to the library and, when fees are received, divide the money according to the number of titles each author has under the scheme.

In December, when this was last done, Gary Wheaton, who wrote four titles, got about £70 for the three-month period. It's not going to make anyone rich, but it would pay for a memory upgrade or some new books.

There are currently 21 libraries enlisted by Budgie and one of them is in Australia, while the now-famous Andrea Ramos handles the whole of Scandinavia.

We think licenceware will catch on once more people find out about it. By the way, it is up to the PD authors to write to us and see if we will handle the distribution for them.

Indeed, Budgie has just started to accept more serious titles, which include an electronic bank statement and sprite package. These more serious titles are sold for £3.95 while games are £2.95.

realistically accepts that some libraries are run on a professional or semi-professional basis.

As long as product is kept at budget prices, somewhere close to the levels already charged for PD, schemes such as this one may provide an extra rung on the ladder for aspiring software professionals. Product will be cheap enough to sell and get them noticed, while the modest remuneration involved is also an incentive to produce programs which are up to scratch.

Let's hope it catches on and provides an extra source of low-priced but reasonably-impressive products.

■ Work your way up

The debate that has started in *Express Mail* recently concerning jobs in the computer industry is very timely. With the falling numbers of school leavers and the importance of IT to the future of this country, it is essential that the issue is addressed straight away.

If the Government is as committed to furthering Britain's computer literacy as it would have us think, then it must put its money where its mouth (policy) is. It must encourage mature people, like Neil Foster (*Express* 69), who are genuinely enthusiastic about computing work, and implement a 'workable and realistic' scheme for training people with the prospect of decent jobs on completion of courses.

In schools, both equipment and staff need to be near state-of-the-art, which is very far from the case at present. In the

school where my wife teaches they are the proud (eh?) owners of three Nimbus and three BBC Bs and what little software they have is hardly exciting. This is not going to instil a sense of technical excellence in the little treasures is it?

For those older people seeking work in IT, I can only offer these words of encouragement: I am 38 years old and have been applying for jobs in computing, on and off, since 1982. All my experience was in an unrelated field but, through the introduction of computers in my place of work, I got the chance to get involved.

After a couple of years a job in support, within the same company, was circulated and I applied successfully.

I am now in the process of moving to another employer with whom I shall have what I consider to be an excellent job in applications support. I now think of myself as an IT professional which was my goal from the start.

The point is this, sometimes there has to be a compromise. Go for the nearest thing to what you want, and wait for the next opportunity.

A final thought, most of the employers I have encountered have been as interested in my commercial and business experience as in my computing skills - so no experience is wasted.

Just keep on keeping on, as they say in Motown.

The subject of astrology and predictions has generated more letters over the last few months than any other barring the 'my machine is better than yours' saga.

Ex-editor Rob Ainsley called it "old tosh", then it was ridiculed again in my name a couple of weeks ago. A number of readers disagree.

■ On prediction

I think I have the right to say that I can speak with some authority on the subject of predictions as this is something that I did for some years.

It is as if you were driving a train and

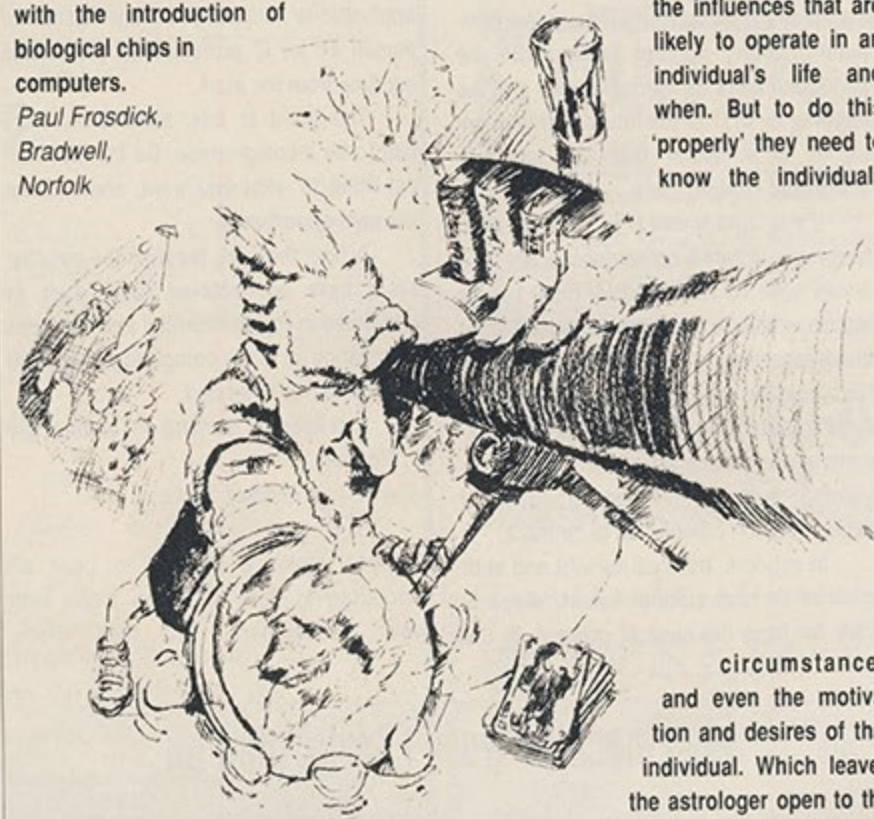

■ The real astrology

Our company, Astrocalc, has advertised fairly often in *Express*, as well as advertising regularly in *ST Format* and *8000 Plus*, and it has been selling and advertising in the computer press since 1982.

I point this out because you say that astrology is a load of bull and, as far as that which appears in most newspapers and magazines goes, I entirely agree with you. But then, that is not real astrology. What is real astrology?

To set the record a little straighter, the latest research would indicate that Newton probably didn't believe in astrology and the comment to Halley that reputedly had astrological overtones was probably never made.

Furthermore, the researches of Nelson into the influence of the planetary aspects on the radio reception have now been largely discredited, despite the high commendations that he received from many institutions, including the American weather bureau and NASA. What is more, both of these re-thinks are the result of work by real astrologers.

Indeed, the only astrological work which has stood up to scientific scrutiny

is that by the French psychologists, Michel and Françoise Gauquelin. Their work has withstood scrutiny by scientists of all 'denominations', including those belonging to CSICOPS (the Committee for the Scientific Investigation of Claims of the Paranormal).

The Gauquelin work shows that exceptional individuals are more likely to be born with certain planets near the four angles of the chart – ie, when they are rising, setting, culmination or at the IC. Different planets are prominent for different types of individuals and the results are not always in accordance with tradition. Mars is prominent for athletes, the Moon for writers, Mars and Jupiter for the military, Jupiter for politicians, etc.

In forecasting, astrologers should be able to give an idea of the influences that are likely to operate in an individual's life and when. But to do this 'properly' they need to know the individuals

circumstances and even the motivation and desires of that individual. Which leaves the astrologer open to the charge of merely feeding back

to the individual what he wants to hear. In addition to this psychological influence in astrology, there is also the issue of free will.

If you are told that you are likely to be in a quarrelsome mood and find that you are, and then you are careful not to quarrel with people, are you exercising free will or is it an illusion? Further, are you proving astrology or disproving it? After all you were told you would quarrel with everyone and you haven't.

There are computer programs which interpret charts. Yes, there are computer programs which will predict your future. How accurately? This can vary with the individual concerned and there should be no programs which claim absolute precision. Better still are those programs which allow the output to be modified before printing out, to take account of individual circumstances.

Would we let *Express* test them? No, we don't think that you have the time or expertise. What we would suggest is that you concentrate on computers and do more 'comparative' research between types of computers.

How about telling your readers how

long AmigaDOS takes to load a disk, or how many disk swaps you might make in doing that simple exercise?

We have written programs for many computers – we still have more than 25 different makes – and have grown to love them all. I even sort of love the Amiga. But to make it 'best buy' as you did at the end of last year! Come on now, tell it like it is.

■ Common sense

Your remark in the January 27 issue cracked my resolve.

You said: "I don't see how a bunch of stars billions of years away can affect my life." Well, of course you can't; because they don't. But let me ask you a question.

How does a thermometer affect the temperature in a room? The answer is, of course, that it doesn't. What happens is that certain events take place – a fire is lit, a door opens, etc – the physical manifestations of which seem to be closely linked.

Some of these manifestations can't even be seen, let alone measured – but some can. We can use those phenomena we can see in order to understand and measure those we can't. (When we look at a thermometer we say we are measuring temperature. We are not – we are measuring the changes in a column of mercury.)

On a more complex scale, 'things' are happening in the universe, the manifestations of which are inextricably linked. Some of these can't even be seen, let alone measured and understood – but some of them can. Is the penny beginning to drop? That's right, the shape of the universe is not the cause of what is happening within it but the reflection.

The fact is that something is happening in this universe and you don't have to be an Einstein or Mandelbrot to begin to see what it is. I'm not saying that this 'something' has meaning or significance. My view is that it means sod-all.

Nevertheless, the universe is unfolding around us and it behoves us with any scientific inclination to simply observe what is going on without prejudice.

ORLANDO, FLORIDA

Traffic around Walt Disney World is controlled by a synchronised system at 34 road intersections, all controlled by one central computer, costing \$3 million. At 12.30pm at the height of lunch-hour traffic, a maintenance engineer forgets to connect one jack plug. Immediately, all the lights turn red and stay that way, paralysing the entire downtown area within six minutes. The situation is remedied by a decidedly low-tech solution: traffic cops on horseback.

Twenty-two-year-old computer buff Philippe Gombert is arrested by the Sécurité, after gunning down Jose Pereira, an electronics expert.

The two men have devised a system whereby they can draw unlimited amounts from French cash dispensers, but start arguing when Gombert insists the system is not yet fool-proof. During a trial scam, they make six successful withdrawals before the target machine swallows their card. Officials report that with his gun still smoking, Gombert's first words are "I told you so!"

The city water authority installs a \$2.3 million computerised metering system, designed to eliminate foul-ups in 106 water pumps and 850 miles of piping. One of the automatic burglar alarms sends a scrambled signal back to the control computer, which shuts down the pumps. An automatic over-ride tries to turn them back on, resulting in a tidal wave of sewage surging through the city at 75 pounds per square inch. The city's older mains immediately explode, but one fail-safe device does manage to work: the one that automatically turns on the fire alarms!

LAKESWOOD, NEW JERSEY

90,000 orders are received for special UNICEF Christmas cards, and are fed into the telemarketing computer run by TMI Inbound Ltd. The orders are then collated and squirted down the line to BSA-Fulfillment Service Incorporated where they disappear into an electronic black hole. Mr Colin J Rainsbury, Vice President of UNICEF's greeting card division, explains that "we have a little bug in the system" but promises delivery of the Christmas cards before the spring.

BIOSPHERE, SWEDEN

After an 18-month delay, the first of Saab's JAS39 Gripen combat fighter takes to the skies. The computer flight control has a triplex digital fly-by-wire system with a triple analogue backup, but it experiences "problems with lateral oscillations", in other words it crashes. The reason for this multi-billion krona cock up is found to be that the software misreads the movement of the joystick (something that any bog-standard home micro has no trouble in achieving.) Saab then issues the following press release: "Delivery of the first production aircraft... is now expected in 1933".
