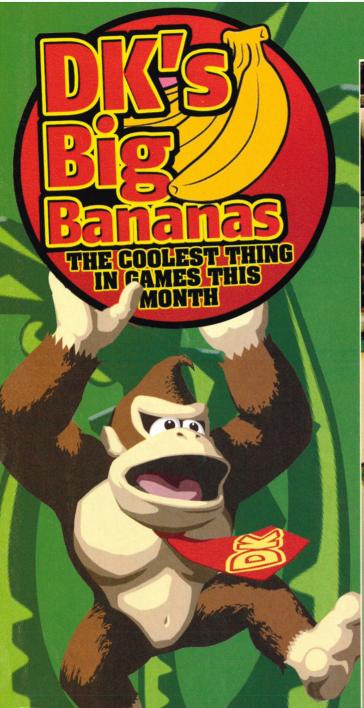

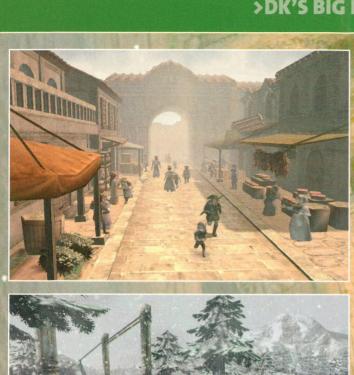

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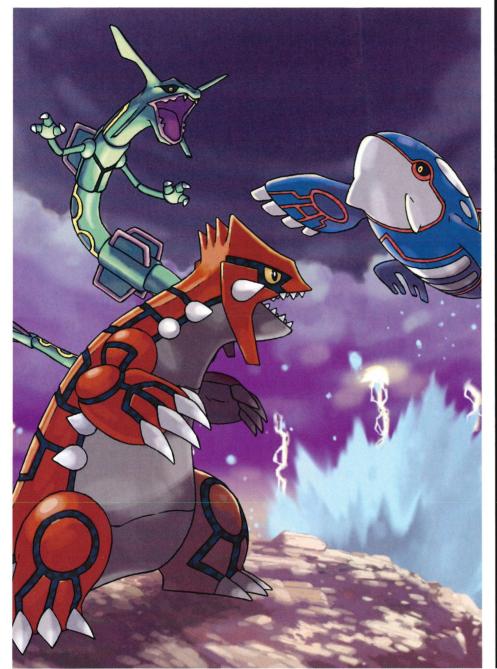

))) Town residents still stick to one predefined area, and will repeat their same lines of dialogue whenever addressed. Monsters still respect borders, and engage in their hideous activities in a very strict regimen outside the town walls. The game's hero, as always, starts off with nothing and, by the end of the game, becomes the most powerful force in the known universe. No-one locks their doors, or acts even remotely surprised when you barge into their homes and start strutting around like you own the place. And winning the game relies almost exclusively on what we call 'level-building'. This involves hunting and repeatedly defeating the same creatures, over and over again, until your 'level' increases to the point where you're strong enough to move to the next section. Then the process starts over again, against slightly more powerful enemies.

These sections, typically, are barricaded in some way, and are cleared through a story-related event or action. What makes

Pokémon unique, in a manner of speaking, is this subject of 'levelling-up'. For one thing, the main character (a silent type, male or female, chosen and named something like 'Diego' by the player) is a pacifist who would rather make friends than actually hit someone. Your main character will not take part in any battle and, subsequently, will never personally 'level-up'. All of the dirty work is forced onto the Pokémon themselves, which they'll do without a complaint. Not that complaining is possible, mind. These little

guys lack anything even remotely resembling personality or free will, instead opting to be at your absolute beck and call. Unfortunately, there isn't a "make me a pizza" button, but when it comes to fighting, these little guys will happily die for you. Well, they'll faint. Nobody ever dies in a *Pokémon* game, they just... run

out of breath and take a nap, or something, until you nurse them back to health.

Through some story convention or other, your character will typically start the game with only one Pokémon to call his or her own. Certainly, this will be enough to fend off your enemies in the first area of the game but, as we've already learned, your enemies get tougher the further you stray from home, and may even gang up on you with their friends. So not only will you

))) What this means is that if two Pokémon trainers happen to see you at the same time, they both attack you. Luckily, when this happens, you are able to control two Pokémon simultaneously, rather than one at a time.

Of course, these are just your average street trainers. In addition to them, many of the game's towns have elaborate buildings called Gyms, and hidden somewhere in the back, each has a Leader. These are what expert videogame terminologists refer to as 'boss enemies', in that they signify the final challenge of a certain section of the game, and are much tougher than your average enemy.

Often these Gym Leaders will be much too powerful to take on right away, so it's off to the grass fields again to hunt wild Pokémon and build experience up. Once you manage to take them down, you get something called a badge, which gives you a new (necessary) ability for the

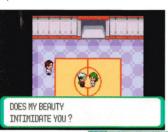

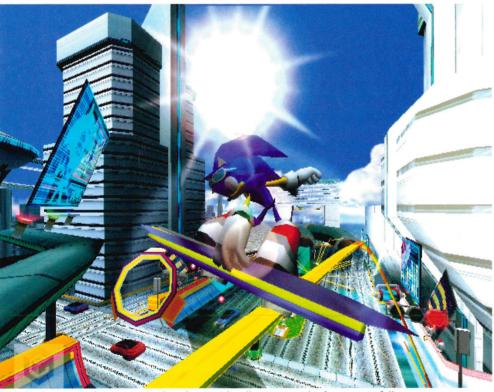

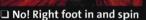

NOM: Did you always plan to have dogs? Or did you think about other animals, like cats?

HK: There were many other animals considered, including cats. But the reason why we decided to make it with dogs was because, for example, we wanted to teach them tricks with our own voices. Also we wanted to include as many other fun aspects as possible, like the agility contest and the flying disc contest. So if we had dogs we could do things like that. But, as long as I know, cats would not be able to take part in these types of events. So we discussed for a while and decided we must make the game with dogs.

NOM: A *Pokémon* version of *Nintendogs* would be awesome. Is that something Nintendo has ever considered?

HK: All I can say is that it might be an interesting plan.

NOM: Was it hard to choose the different dogs?

HK: Selecting the dogs that are loved by people around the world was not such a difficult job. In Japan we have the Kennel Association (a club for dog owner) and it has data showing how many people have which dog. But other countries also have similar clubs and organisations that gave us the same data. So it was not difficult to decide which dogs should appear in each version. The US and Europe have the same dogs because they are both very similar in their tastes of dogs.

NOM: Why do you think the game has been so popular back in Japan?

HK: From the outset, one of our goals was to make a game that would appeal to a wide range of different people, from children

to old age pensioners and both sexes. I think one of the reasons for its success has been word of mouth, as people compared their experiences to someone else. Many were reporting the joy they had with Nintendogs.

NOM: Do you hope there will be a similar reaction in Europe? HK: At least in Japan it has become very popular and I believe it's because people feel it's a unique and pleasant experience. It can't hurt to have unusual encounter with someone you don't know thanks to the Bark mode. I really hope people in the UK will feel the same way.

NOM: Which Nintendog do you have and what tricks can it do? HK: As the main developer I have all the versions but now I own the Chihuahua version and I'm teaching my dog special tricks, like break dancing and standing on its paws.

NOM: Do you wish real dogs were as easy to train? HK: I should not really comment on that or some people may try to train their real dogs to break dance. Which could be risky. < laughs>

NOM: There are so many different toys, was it fun to choose all the different ones? HK: It was necessary for us to think of many different toys to give a variety of gaming experiences. When you are playing with the remotecontrolled Mario Kart you are going to have some fun. Or when you use the helicopter, it's a toy that lets you see things from the sky. Also it's a nice and almost healing atmosphere when you watch two puppies playing with a football. We wanted to make sure you have some fun with the puppies.

NOM: Which is your favourite? HK: I came up with many great ideas for the toys but one of my favourites is the helicopter, especially the command helicopter. When you fly it around the room it plays the music from Apocalypse Now.

NOM: Although there are lots of

cool accessories in Nintendoas. your dog can only wear one at a time. Were there ever any plans to let them wear more? HK: Actually yes, during the course of development we were thinking about having different items at one time. But we were concerned that it may not be possible with the DS'specifications. Also, and more importantly, we wanted the game to be as simple as possible. If there are many different things the user is meant to do at one time, it could become confusing

NOM: Were you pleased you could have the Mario Kart as one of the toys?

HK: I am also responsible for the development of Mario Kart DS so I asked the development team to give me the model data for the actual Mario Karts in the DS game. There are three different Karts in Nintendogs, including Bowser, Mario and Peach. And they're all fun.

NOM: Do you think Nintendogs would work on GameCube or, in the future, on Revolution?

HK: Well of course but being portable is one of the most important elements for Nintendogs to be successful because you can carry it around all the time. On the other hand, it doesn't mean we can't make the console version of Nintendogs. It depends on whether or not we can make something really

unique for the home console. This could be the control style or it may be something more ambiguous. But if we could have something unique it may be possible. Although if it was just a graphical improvement we could pursue with the console, then I don't think people would be satisfied and we would not want to do that.

NOM: Moving away from Nintendogs, what games are you playing right now?

HK: In order to expand my own knowledge I try to play as much as possible buť only when I'm in my office. Once I'm at home I like to enjoy other hobbies and don't play video games at all.

NOM: Are you busy developing more games at the moment, apart from Mario Kart DS? HK: Yes, I am working on many other projects as well, including Revolution-related projects.

NOM: Can you tell us about any

HK: No but please wait for Mr. Iwata to break any news in the near future.

BUT THE **REAL FUN** COMES AS YOU SWAP BETWEEN CHARACTERS ON THE FLY DURING BOUTS. THE BOTTOM SCREEN RESEMBLES A MANGA STRIP, WHICH YOU TOUCH TO CHOOSE YOUR CHARACTER DURING FIGHTS. THE **BATTLE CHARACTERS'** SIZE RANGES FROM 2X2 SQUARES TO 3X2 RECTANGLES. THE BIGGER YOUR CHARACTER BLOCK, OR KOMA, THE MORE POWERFUL YOUR FIGHTER IS. BUT IT'S A BALANCING ACT BECAUSE THE BIGGER THE BATTLERS, THE LESS YOU CAN FIT INTO THE 5X4 GRID. YOU CAN SWAP BETWEEN CHARACTERS IF ONE HAS TAKEN TOO MUCH DAMAGE. SO IF YOU'RE **ROCK HARD**, GO FOR THE BIG CHARACTERS. IF YOU'RE TACTICAL, GO FOR LOTS OF SMALLER GUYS.

AS WELL AS BATTLE CHARACTERS, YOUR MANGA GRIP ALSO HAS TO HAVE SUPPORT CHARACTERS IN. THESE GUYS COME IN ALL SHAPES AND SIZES AND MUST BE PART OF YOUR TEAM. JUST LIKE THE BATTLE CHARACTERS, YOU NEED TO PRESS THESE BLOCKS ON THE BOTTOM SCREEN TO ACTIVATE THEM. ONCE TOUCHED, THEY QUICKLY ZIP









ONTO THE SCREEN, PERFORM A SPECIAL MOVE, THEN DISAPPEAR. THERE ARE DOZENS OF THEM AND THEY ALL HAVE NIFTY AND SLIGHTLY MORE TACTICAL MOVES - PRINCE OF TENNIS HITS OPPONENTS WITH A POISONOUS TENNIS BALL, SASUKE FROM NARUTO KICKS FIGHTERS IN THE HEAD AND A WEIRD ORANGE SUN-PUPE ELECTRIFIES ENEMIES

BUT TO UNLOCK ALL THESE BATTLE AND SUPPORT CHARACTERS, YOU MUST SLOG YOUR WAY THROUGH THE SINGLE PLAYER GAME. EACH LEVEL HAS DIFFERENT MISSIONS, LIKE SMASH THE WALLS, BEAT OPPONENTS OR KICK THE TREASURE CHESTS, WHICH CAN BE COMPLETED PRETTY EASILY. BUT TO UNLOCK MORE KOMAS, YOU NEED TO BEAT THESE MISSIONS WHILE ADHERING TO CERTAIN RULES, LIKE NOT GETTING KO'D, USING THE 10 ATTACK 10 TIMES OR STANDING ON YOUR HEAD AND PLEDGING ALLEGIANCE TO THE GOD OF SHONEN JUMP.

> ONCE YOU'VE GOT THE KOMA, THAT'S ONLY THE FIRST PART OF GETTING ALL THE NEW CHARACTERS. YOU THEN NEED TO COMBINE DIFFERENT KOMAS TOGETHER TO PRODUCE A NEW ONE YOU CAN USE IN THE MAIN GAME. FOR A WESTERN GAMER, THIS IS NEAR IMPOSSIBLE BECAUSE TO RECOGNISE WHICH KOMAS TO COMBINE, YOU NEED TO READ JAPANESE. SO IT'S A CASE OF TRIAL AND ERROR AS YOU TRY FITTING EVERY SINGLE KOMA TOGETHER. STRANGELY THOUGH, THIS IS A REALLY ADDICTIVE PART OF JSS AND THE BUZZ OF CREATING A NEW CHARACTER IS THRILLING. IN FACT, DURING A RECENT TRAIN JOURNEY, WE ALMOST MISSED OUR STOP BECAUSE WE WERE SO ENGROSSED IN COMBINING KOMAS-

> > BUT EVEN WITH THE LANGUAGE BARRIER, WE'RE ENTHRALLED BY JUMP! SUPERSTARS. THE FIGHTING'S TOP NOTCH, THE

20 GRAPHICS ARE SUPERB AND THE KOMA-COMBINING IS BECOMING AN OBSESSION FOR US. UNFORTUNATELY THOUGH, THIS AWESOME GAME IS UNLIKELY EVER TO MAKE IT TO THESE SHORES. THE DIFFERENT CHARACTERS ARE SO TIED-UP IN A VARIETY OF OTHER GAME DEALS THAT IT WOULD BE ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE FOR NINTENDO TO CLUNK A FEW HEADS TOGETHER AND LET EVERYONE PUT THEIR HARD-EARNED CHARACTERS IN ONE GAME. 50 ... IF NINTENDO CAN'T DO IT, LET'S TRY TONY BLAIR. "DEAR MR. BLAIR, YOU KNOW HOW MUCH YOU LIKE ANIME, WELL ... "

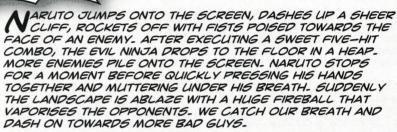












FROM READING NOM, YOU SHOULD KNOW ALL ABOUT NARUTO — PROBABLY THE **BEST ANIME** TO COME OUT OF JAPAN SINCE TIME BEGAN. BUT IF YOU HAVEN'T READ EVERY SINGLE ISSUE OF NOM, THEN YOU NEED TO KNOW THAT NARUTO IS ALL ABOUT THE ADVENTURES OF A GROUP OF TRAINEE NINJAS. IT HAS **FIGHTS THAT LAST FOR WEEKS** RATHER THAN MINUTES AND SPECIAL MOVES THAT THREATEN TO SMASH THROUGH YOUR TELEVISION. ALTHOUGH IT STARTED IN SHONEN JUMP, THE ANIME AND GAMES MAKE THIS LITTLE NINJA SHINE.

THE TWO MOST RECENT NARUTO GAMES TO BE RELEASED ARE BOTH FOR DS — NARUTO RPG2: CHIDORI VS RASENGAN AND NARUTO: SAIKYO NINJA DAIKESSHU 3. WE TRIED TO PLAY THE RPG ONE BUT IT WAS JUST TOO CONFUSING. BUT SAIKYO NINJA DAIKESSHU 3, A NIFTY LITTLE 2D BEAT—'EM—UP SIMILAR TO DRAGON BALL ADVANCE ADVENTURE, IS ABSOLUTELY AWESOME.

THERE ARE NEARLY 20 DIFFERENT CHARACTERS FROM THE NARUTO SERIES AND EACH ONE HAS ENOUGH PUNCHES, KICKS AND SPECIAL MOVES TO GIVE **RYU A RUN FOR HIS MONEY**. YOU PICK ONE MAIN CHARACTER AND TWO SUPPORT CHARACTERS WHO JUMP ON—SCREEN WHENEVER THERE'S TROUBLE — AND THERE'S ALWAYS TROUBLE.

JUST LIKE ANY DECENT BEAT-'EM-UP, THE ODDS ARE ALWAYS STACKED AGAINST YOU. IT'S JUST YOU AGAINST HORDES OF SEEMINGLY ENDLESS BAD GLYS. ADMITTEDLY, YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE CAPTAIN TACTICS TO PLAY. MOST THINGS CAN BE SORTED OUT WITH A BOOT OR A FIST IN THE FACE TO AN ENEMY NINJA. EACH CHARACTER CAN PULL OFF NICE LITTLE COMBOS WITH A FEW PRESSES OF THAT SEND THE ENEMY FLYING. BUT YOU CAN ALSO COLLECT THROWABLE OBJECTS TO HELP YOU OUT OF STICKY SITUATIONS. THERE ARE PLENTY OF LETHAL ITEMS TO COLLECT AS WELL, INCLUDING NINJA STARS, KNIVES AND A HUGE FOUR-BLADED FRISBEE-TYPE THING YOU PROBABLY SHOULDN'T THROW FOR THE NINTENDOGS TO CATCH.

WHEN THINGS GET TOO HAIRY, EACH CHARACTER HAS A SPECIAL MOVE THAT RELIES ON YOUR ABILITY TO QUICKLY TOUCH STUFF WITH THE















STYLUS. AFTER HOLDING TO CHARGE UP YOUR ATTACK, THE TOUCH SCREEN CHANGES DISPLAY. YOU QUICKLY CIRCLE THE STYLUS AROUND BEFORE TOUCHING THE CORRECT INCANTATIONS TO PERFORM THE MOVE. IF YOU DO IT RIGHT, THE SCREEN LIGHTS UP WITH AN ATTACK. NARUTO HAS A HUGE BLUE FIREBALL THAT ALMOST BURNS YOUR RETINAS, SLIGHTLY USELESS GIRL NINDA SAKURA HAS BLAZING FISTS OF FURY AND SASUKE (THE BEST CHARACTER) ELECTRIFIES HIS ENEMIES WITH A MASSIVE BALL OF PURE ENERGY. PULLING OFF THESE SPECTACULAR ATTACKS IS WICKED AND IT'S ALL ACCOMPANIED BY SOME OF THE MOODIEST ROCK MUSIC YOU'RE LIKELY TO HEAR.

AS WELL AS YOUR PLAYABLE CHARACTER LIGHTING UP THE DS SCREEN WITH **BLAZING MOVES**, YOU ALSO HAVE TWO OTHER TRAINEE—NINJAS THAT CAN POP ONTO THE SCREEN WITH A QUICK TOUCH OF THE BOTTOM SCREEN. THESE GLYS ALSO HAVE SOME PRETTY **SPECTACULAR** MOVES. THE BEST ONE IS CALLED GAARA, WHO HAS THE ABILITY TO CONTROL SAND. YOU WOULDN'T THINK IT'D BE THAT GOOD BUT AFTER WATCHING HIM IN ACTION, YOU HAVE PLENTY OF RESPECT. SASUKE'S SUPPORT MOVE IS ALSO PRETTY COOL. AFTER YOU'VE PRESSED HIM, YOU BLOW INTO THE MIC TO **FIRE FLAMES** TOWARDS YOUR ENEMIES. IT'S NOT ESSENTIAL BUT IT DOES FEEL WICKED THE FIRST TIME YOU PO IT.

ALL THESE FANCY MOVES ARE VITAL DURING THE BOSS FIGHTS. JUST LIKE CLASSIC BOSSES FROM METROID, EACH ONE HAS A PATTERN YOU

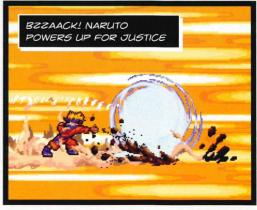
MUST LEARN, BEFORE EVEN THINKING ABOUT LAUNCHING YOUR OWN ATTACKS. THEY ALSO HAVE MULTIPLE FORMS THAT ARE A REAL PAIN IN THE ASS. ONE GUY TURNS INTO A MASSIVE SPIDER THAT FILLS THE SCREEN AND IS ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE TO EVEN HIT WITHOUT GETTING DAMAGED. A GOOD BEAT- 'EM-UP SHOULD ALWAYS HAVE A RANGE OF AWESOME BOSSES AND NARUTO IS DEFINITELY NO EXCEPTION IN THAT RESPECT.

SO, WHAT ARE THE CHANCES OF THIS COMING OVER HERE? WELL, NOT MUCH REALLY. UNLESS SOMEONE LIKE TOONAMI OR JETIX SNAP UP THE ANIME LICENCE, THERE'S REALLY LITTLE POINT IN RELEASING A GAME BASED ON SOMETHING THAT ONLY A HANDFUL OF PEOPLE KNOW ABOUT. BUT YOU NEVER

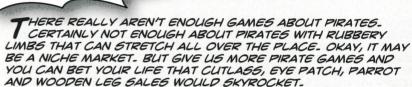

DESERT, WITH SINKING SAND THAT TRAPS YOU.

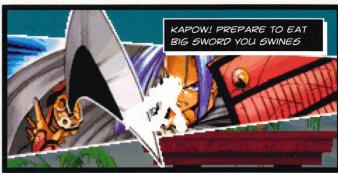

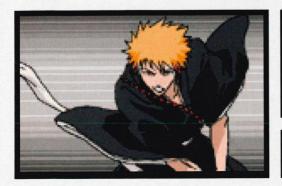

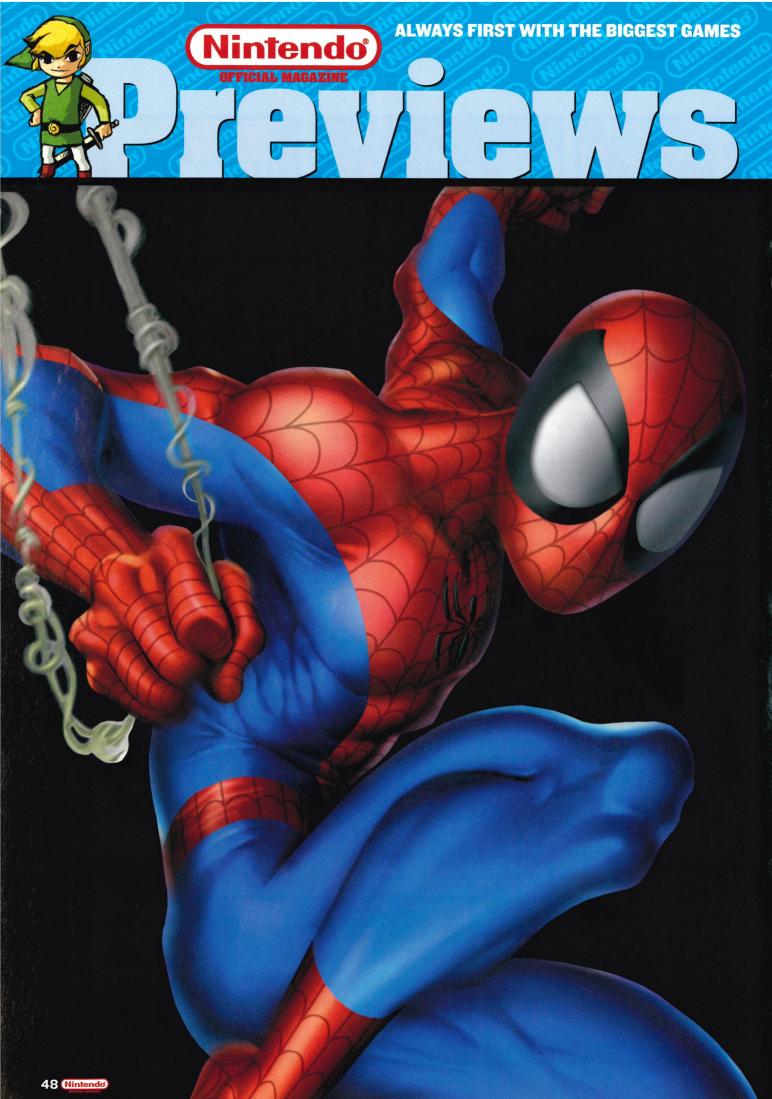

Superheroes engaged in competition, it's so brilliant. And New York has LOADS of heroes to call on, let's not forget.

'The same, but with LOADS MORE SUPERHEROES' might well be enough. We've heard Wolverine puts in an appearance too, so that's pretty good. But the core gameplay is extremely similar to *Spider-Man 2*. That means the glorious swinging system that feels like it was programmed by God is still providing most of the fun. So when you get to play as Venom, cool as he is, it's just not as much fun.

We spent ages chasing Electro as Venom. Ages. When you can't web up buildings and need to climb them, it's a proper pain in the pods. Venom jumps miles, but he's fairly nob at street level. So you have to suffer a barrage of unfunny quips, like "My grandmother moves faster than you" over and over again until you learn the route and can basically cheat. When something's not funny the first time, repeating it rarely powers-up the comedy. As a general rule.

When you're standing on top of a skyscraper looking out, the poor GameCube can't quite handle the pace. The beautiful cartoon towers in the distance are rendered in two-tone. It can actually look a bit bland, like a model of a city that hasn't been painted yet. And because it can look a bit bland, the incentive to see every square inch of it is diminished. So while there are tokens to unlock comic-book covers scattered everywhere, the compulsion to get them all isn't as strong. Speaking of tokens, certain new ones

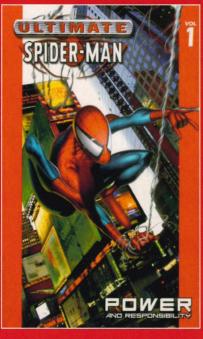

We spotted a few cheeky ad hoardings in the game too. Stuff that would look like any advert to a casual player, but would cause a Marvel freak to have a new kind of sexual awakening. Imagine how YOU'D feel if you saw an advert for 'Latveria Cruise Lines: come for the fun, stay forever'.

We're a bit worried there's not enough new beyond the flashy comic-book style. A few of the boss fights we played through were good fun. The first fight with Venom presents Spidey with an odd problem. If he gets too close to Venom for

too long, his brain starts hurting and his health gets crucified. Like his Spider-sense is going off so strong, it's giving him a brain hemorrhage. You can't run too far either or the same thing happens, meaning you have to fight instinct and stay in medium range of a slavering psychopath. Hit and run to take him out. It is the most confusing thing we've ever played on 'Cube. Not because it's got a twisting plot, strange gameplay mechanics or crazy characters. It's because there was just so much happening at

once. The game throws everything at you like a blender without the lid on.

We were thinking it would be a Viewtiful Joe version of Super Smash Bros. Melee and in some ways it is. After all, there are four characters on screen and they're all pounding the crap out of each other. But then, on top of trying to beat up your opponents, you've also got to perform certain missions. Like beating up a boss, entering an open door or collecting gems. This would be hard enough without everyone trying to punch you.

But then, as if all this wasn't enough,

the game throws another confusing element at you. Along with all the missions and face kicking, all the characters can perform the signature special moves from the normal Viewtiful Joe games. So all of a sudden, one character, normally not us, would slow things down or speed them up, to create even more panic. Madness. When you've got four players, this kind of thing is happening all the time, rendering tactics almost impossible.

Okay, so we only played a demo of the game but we were hoping for something a lot better than this. We expected a cool four-player fighting game but what we actually got was a confusing mess that made no sense. Perhaps the demo was just trying to show everything off at once, instead of just demonstrating the fighting. We hope things will improve drastically in the finished version. Rob Burman

The RPG segment of the game looks

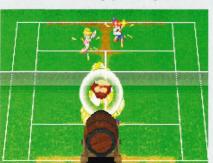

The only things that still rankle are the power moves. We just don't agree with games stopping and playing themselves at any point. 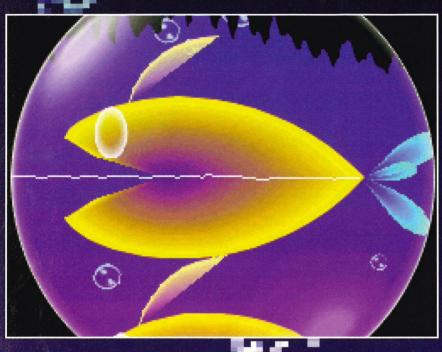

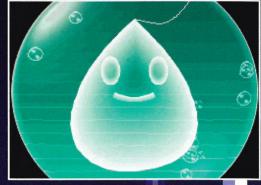

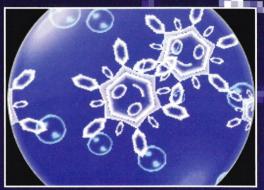

Meet the funkiest animals on Earth. They aren't monkeys.

The seabed isn't always the cute and cuddly world from Finding Nemo. Sure, there are seahorses and jellyfish but sharks aren't called Bruce. They are called Jaws, chew people in half and spit the rest out.

Strain your eyes a little harder though and you might see something bright in the murky depths. Bright lights and eerie sounds created by tiny plankton. Usually they are the food of some giant sea creature, scooped up in thousands and swallowed to join the human bodies, tyres and other fish that sit in the belly of blue whales.

Some plankton will be

wagging their spindly tails to the hyper-speed tune you'll recognise from *Mario World*. Others ping piano notes off plant leaves. They live for a good time, so put your hands in the

air and give them the respect they deserve, in the weirdest game you'll play this year.

Electroplankton's been created by Toshio Iwai, a media artist claimed as a genius over in Japan. It's not the first time he's worked for Nintendo. A few years ago, he worked on something called Sound Fantasy for the Super Nintendo, a game that eventually made it onto PC as Sim Tunes. Now the DS is here and he's the perfect man to make something genuinely sprinted and overland the superior of the perfect man to make something genuinely sprinted. original and extraordinary for the touch screen.

Electroplankton is an audiovisual game, not like the ones where arrows scroll up the screen and you scurry around the dance mat like a ferret. No, this is a music-maker with that typical Nintendo twist. It's hardly going to break more than half an hour's gaming at a

time but just busting loose with some haunting creations will tickle even those who have no idea of music.

Ten plankton kick back in the water waiting for you to summon them so they can create their music. They all have odd names, like Rec-Rec and Luminaria, except the first one we tried, Tracy. No, it's not the name of some Essex girl but what you actually do with the game. Draw lines with your stylus and your plankton will ring out a tune as they fuzz along the track, tracing your drawing. It feels more like a DS tech demo.

It does get better from there. Hanenbow is perhaps the nearest thing to a 'game' and sees you firing plankton at a musical plant on the other side of the screen. Angle the leaves to create different notes and

fire up to three to 500 have them pinging around and ricocheting off the sides of the screen. Keep them in the air to make your tune last longer; it's as simple as that

Deeper into the game, you'll be launching four plankton of different tempos around a screen filled with arrows. Rotate the arrows and they'll fire off in another direction, creating more weird and wonderful tunes. Then there's Nanocarp - a screen filled with plankton, high notes at the top, low notes at the bottom. Tap the screen and they'll play, more taps and you'll get more varied music.

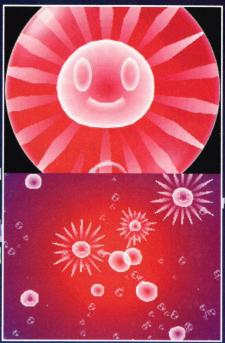
It wouldn't be a DS game though without the added use of the machine's functions - so you can blow, clap, hum and

sing into the mic to make plankton spin into a variety of different shapes from snowmen to houses.

The use of the mic goes further

though in Rec-Rec, where fish-like plankton swim across the screen. Touch one and record your voice, and this will be added to the drumbeat. Four fish are recordable and with the option of a faster beat, it has to be one of the best packages on the cart.

Nods to Nintendo are limited but they're easy to find and it offers one of the highlights on the cart. Beatnes hits you with the high-speed invincible star music from *Mario World*. As the track pounds along, five snake-like plankton sway their tails along to the track. Tapping the heads create the 1-Up chime, others trigger a voice that says 'Up' or another command. Further down are the tails of each creature - giving you a pitch range that alters, depending whether you hit higher or lower. Yet it will only stay for four notes and there's no save option.

Creating this kind of thing is certainly original and should be applauded for showing off the power of the DS in a fun way. Only some of the music-makers are great to come back to but if creating ambient tunes on your DS rocks your world, then track this down on import. The Japanese text won't stand in your way, just the fact that there are no endof-level bosses, cars to unlock or races to win to keep you coming back for more. Tim Street

It's the middle of August but it feels like winter. We're hacking down the DS slopes as a spiky-haired dude on a snowboard, while just two feet behind us are carol singers dressed up in Victorian clothes belting out Hark The Herald and Good King Wenceslas. It's Christmas come early for journalists at a Nintendo show and here's just one of the games we could play.

SBK is the third installment of this mountain-slope madness. Snowboard Kids first came out on the N64, or Snowbo Kids as it was called on import. It saw cartoon midgets with their parachutes and ice block weapons, teasing us with their Mario Kart rip-off. Except the race-track was on snow and Vanilla Lake was nowhere to be seen. It wasn't classic and the sequel never saw the light of day here. But that hasn't stopped it making a comeback with touch screen thrown in.

It's been eight years since the original but the ideas, even for this DS version, remain the same. Hammer

down the slopes, take the checkpoints, beat the rest and claim first place. Unless the dodgy collision detection we spotted screwed up your race and leaves you limping over the line last.

Touch screen itself is used from the off. Tap the screen to make your 'boarder kick off the blocks or after a weapon has smashed you up the ass and left you sprawled in the snow. Then there are the tricks you can perform, no longer a case of pulling a direction and pressing a button.

As you fuzz off a jump, one of two things will happen. On higher jumps you'll have to tap coloured squares in the split second they appear, while on smaller ones you'll have to tap the screen to make a countdown go faster. Either way, you've gotta do it to give your 'boarder enough time to trick out before crashing back to earth.

And that's it. That's the sum total of SBK's touch use. Not a lot really. Even the weapons - Shuriken to lightning bolts - are fired using the shoulder buttons. The modes fail to liven things up; even Boss Battle, where you let ammo rip at a giant skiing robot, bored us. Maybe the four players, one cart, wireless play might appeal, but we'll have to wait for the final version. Tim Street

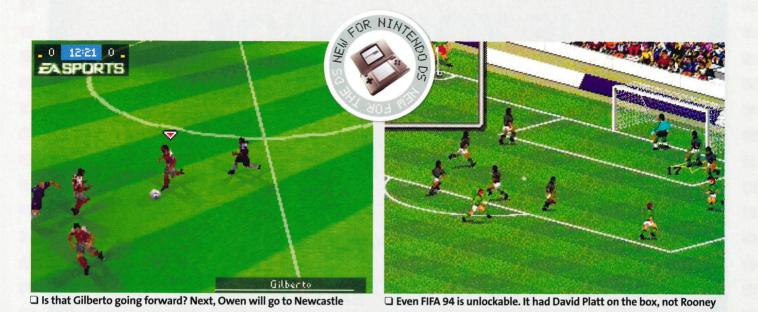

Touch reared his stupid face when it came to the goal replays, but that's a workable application. Poke the screen to pan around and make yourself vomit as a Lego Van Nistelrooy embarrasses Petr Cech from outside the area. Actually, that's a mistake now we think

Since E3, we've had a chance to get another look at PoP 3 and we're not too chuffed about what we've seen. We loved Sands of Time like a brother. But Warrior Within took the Prince down a dark alley, with play concentrated more on fighting,

rather than adventuring. Now in *PoP 3*, Ubisoft has added socalled 'Speed Kills' to take the excitement factor to unprecedented heights. Unfortunately, these are just a cheeky way of renaming what are actually stealth kills. Playing as the Prince, you sneak up on enemies and deliver a quick killer blow at the last minute. Admittedly this a quicker way to kill them than the faffing about of previous games but it just feels lazy. You'll enter a room and there'll be two guards stood right near a pole. And guess what - you can swing round the pole and

decapitate them. Hooray. The guards are waiting to be killed.

There also seems to be more enemies than ever before. We were excited about the prospect of scaling the roofs of Babylon, a bit like *Sands of Time*. But instead, you do a few cool moves then have to perform a Speed Kill before carrying on. Sands of Time was beautiful because you could go into a room which towered above you and know you could climb all the way to the top. So far, PoP 3 seems to be missing that.

Even worse was the inclusion of chariot racing sections, which according to Ubisoft, YOU wanted. What's wrong with you people? They looked incredibly cheesy with cinematics of your horses jumping over obstructions in slow motion, Dukes of Hazzard style. What's next - Police chariots?

Okay, maybe we're over-reacting but PoP 3 seems so far-removed from the game we loved that we no longer even recognise it. It'll still probably sell by the bucket-load because it's ticking all the right boxes for the casual gamer. But you know better than that. Go play Sands of Time and despair about the future. Rob Burman

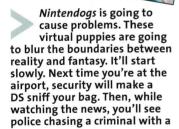

But now we've got our paws on the UK version and the lack of language barrier has revealed the intricacies of a game that's about to take the world by its heart strings. Nintendogs will jovially eat up your free time until you only ever want to spend time with digital dogs and probably refuse to interact with anyone, unless they've got fur and a tail. Apart from cats - they suck.

The game immediately throws you in at the deep end. Which dog do you want? The Husky, the Chihuahua, the Shih-tzu... it's a



decision you've got to live with FOR EVER. Even if you choose the wrong dog, you feel guilty about resetting the game and KILLING your pup. Even a psycho couldn't bear the thought of their poor puppy's digital atoms scattering into cyberspace just because they buckled at the wrong time and chose the evil-looking Pug.

Meet the new pups on the block.

Just like the Japanese game, the UK Nintendogs will come in three different versions. But unlike the original, we'll get six different dogs in each cart, rather than five. That's because our version will have three new puppies; the Boxer, Golden Retriever and Siberian Husky. Don't worry if you're panicking about which version of Nintendogs you should actually go out and buy though, because all the dogs are available in every version. You get to unlock new puppies by performing well as a trainer and also by linking up with other owners.

We knew the pups had different personalities but we didn't quite realise the wealth of them available. These different personalities will affect how quickly they learn, how they behave while walking

and whether or not you'll spend your time screaming commands at them. "Twix. Sit down. Twix. Twix. TWIX. SIT DOWN. TWIIIIX". Our dog Twix was bad, if you hadn't already guessed.

The range of personalities available drives you to play more. Although you may love your first dog like a furry brother, in the back of your mind you'll always wonder how things could have been different if you'd chosen the rebel dog. Would it have eventually tried to

introduce communism into your home? Would it have eaten the other pups? Previously, when we played Nintendogs, we were worried about its lasting appeal but these different personalities are reason to rejoice.

No matter which dog you choose, caring and training is easier than the first level of Super Mario Bros. Teaching them tricks is very rewarding. When they perform a new move, like rolling over, a light bulb appears in the top right corner. Once you've pressed it, you speak the name of the move performed. Repeat it a few times and they learn the moves. Unfortunately, they only learn three a day. This

makes sense, after all you could teach them everything in an hour or two. However, it can be frustrating when your dog first back flips but it's learnt too much that day

Just like real dogs, they need food, walks, water and of course, entertainment. One of the most fun parts of Nintendogs is the different toys. At first you've only got balls you can toss about with the stylus but you'll get some awesome toys that are actually fun for you to play with. For example, the fantastic little Mario Karts you control with the D-pad, will have you panting and salivating just like your excited puppy itself.



))) But there are also pull-toys you must hold with the stylus while your pup tugs them. There are even space ships that fly around the room. How cool?

You unlock items while out on walks and they appear in the street as '?' icons. This version does seem more stingy with decent items at the start though. At first, you only get rubbish like sticks and have to play for days before getting really cool toys and clothing. Strangely enough, dressing your puppy up is actually a cool feature of the game. Each time you unlock a fun accessory, like a top hat, spiky goth collar or Luigi hat, you're desperate to see what your pup will look like in it. Like the personalities, the accessories and toys are another incentive for extended play. Unfortunately, dogs can only wear one accessory at a time, which is a let-down. We would have preferred if your pet could wear at least two.

How cute? A pressie from a cat would normally be a dead, smelly thing in pieces. But your dog loves you too 08.60 much for that I'm gonna chill, looking dumb "You know, I can't shake this feeling that there's something more to life. Something bigger, something out there." 08 30

As well as getting items on walks, you'll also run into other dog owners. We already knew your pup could befriend or fight other mutts. But we didn't realise other owners give you advice about how to train your puppy. Also, the game does have a curious sense of humour and these little exchanges with fellow owners can be quite amusing, adding more charm - although some do repeat the same thing over and over again. These owners most likely work in libraries or local government.

But the dogs are definitely the most charming aspect of

the game. Nintendo has clearly spent a long time tweaking them to make sure they look like real puppies. The visuals are definitely the best on DS so far. It's not only the dogs that look great, though. While out on walks, there is loads of detail in the neighbourhood - there are trees, homes, lakes and even the ocean. It all adds to the cool feeling you've really got a puppy, a home and a neighbourhood. It sounds sad and it kind of is. But who cares when you're having fun. Like that time YOU pushed the kids off the bouncy castle and started doing somersaults.

Nintendogs is almost certainly the game that best uses the abilities of the DS. The touch screen interaction between you and your pup is the closest thing you'll get to a real dog and couldn't be done on anything else. It immediately ensures you're close to your pet. It's not like a Tamagotchi that always felt like a computer "game". At times, you'll have difficulty distinguishing between your Nintendog and a real dog. Everything is right, from the wag of their tail to their gallops of joy when they run towards you with a freshly-caught Frisbee.

The voice recognition software is also spot-on. Controlling your dog with actual voice commands adds to the realism of the entire package. But you've got to be careful to ensure voice commands don't sound alike. Although the mic normally works perfectly if you have two that do sound similar, it could get confusing.

Be warned though; you're always going to look an idiot playing this game in public. In fact, it should come with a warning; "Do not play in the company of members of the opposite sex. Unless they too have a copy of Nintendogs. Then you're well in. Give them the Mario Kart. Go on, do it. They'll love you." But if you can overcome the slight embarrassment then you're definitely in for an extremely satisfying game.

Although Nintendogs may not be as immediately rewarding as reaching a new area in Metroid or killing a boss in Zelda, the first time you actually win an Obedience Trial, you'll be beaming with joy. Admittedly, it's best played in small bursts, particularly because you can only walk your pup every half an hour and puppies can only learn three tricks a day. But, as long as you can overcome the slight niggle you might be playing a soft game, it's a charming experience that keeps on giving.

So is it finally time to say 'adios' to Advance Wars on GBA? Definitely. Dump the old hag and get down and dirty with this dual-screened hottie!

At its heart, *Dual Strike* is just like the first two *Advance Wars* games. The 2D background action will be instantly familiar to every Orange Star veteran, as will its cartoon style. Many of the COs also return, along with the troops, tanks, battleships and bombers called to arms in the original and *Black Hole Rising*. In fact, the first couple of campaign missions are so similar to some previous *Advance Wars* battles, you'd be forgiven for thinking you stuck in the wrong cartridge.

Blast through these simple training missions, however, and *Dual Strike* soon starts dishing out 24-carat gaming goodness. Apart from a couple of new faces, the first new unit you'll come across is the Black Bomb. It's a lethal cruise missile, capable of flying across the entire battle-

field in a single turn. When it explodes, any unit within a three-square radius is dealt a crippling blow. Ouch. And to make matters worse, you're not the one who's controlling the damn thing.

It's about now that anyone new to Advance Wars learns their first lesson in tactics - know when to make a sacrifice. There's no way of stopping the Black Bomb, but it's possible to limit the damage it causes. Send a decoy towards the missile - a soldier or scout car - and they'll soak up the explosion, leaving your other units untouched.

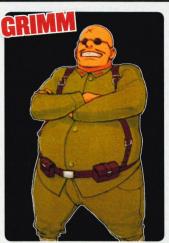

))) Of all the new vehicles, the aircraft carrier is probably our favourite. It's the most expensive unit in the game but it's worth every dollar of its \$30,000 price tag. Firstly, up to two aircraft can be sheltered inside, so it's great for refuelling bombers during long range runs. But its anti-air missiles can also take out fighters from a distance, allowing you to protect nearby allied aircraft while they're queuing up for fuel.

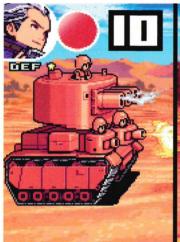

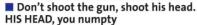

But in Geist, there's not a sheet in sight. The ghosts are really super-hard... although not actually hard, they're still

Look, let's start again. Geist takes the best parts of being a ghost - possession and scaring people - and uses them to create a sometimes fun but ocassionally flawed FPS.

have overlooked that basic rule of being a ghost. Ask someone in the street what a ghost does and they'll reply: "Hide under my bed and stalk my dreams like a predator." You'll slap them and ask them again and then they'll say "walk through walls". So although Raimi the ghost can slip through small cracks, his lack of wall-passing ability means that a lot of the time, you find your missions are "find a way to get past because you're a ghost that can't pass through walls."

So, that's where the whole possession element comes in.

Because weak meatbag humans can open doors and stuff. They also do your dirty work. In order to possess people, you must scare them to open their ghost hole, so you can slip in. Now, at first, the scaring element seems great fun and really interactive. For example, you need to blow up a computer so a nervous guard comes to investigate. Once the timid fool comes close, you possess a bin and make the paper inside catch fire. By this time, Mr. Guard is absolutely pooing himself.

These first few possessions are very special - they dazzle and delight your senses. You think the game's really interactive. After all, you possess anything from phones, to cookers and paint cans. But once you're several missions in, you realise scaring is just a case of going through the motions. Possess cooker, make meal burn, use fan to blow smell towards cook, he investigates, possess stack of plates, throw them at him and finally possess cook.

It would have been cooler

about how you go about scaring people. But instead, once you're halfway through it feels too scripted. When you need to possess someone, they're in a room full of things that you could possess easily. Why should you only get to possess one specific thing? Admittedly they're interesting puzzles but they reminded us of the Fear Factor in Batman Begins. That was also cool at first

to give you different options

but once you realised you HAD to do things in a certain way, it lost its appeal. It should be up to you to decide the best way to scare people, not the game.

Once you have possessed someone, everything changes from an

adventure theme to a slightly ropey FPS. In fact, if this game didn't have the ghost element, you probably wouldn't look twice at it as an FPS.

The AI is dodgy, most enemies are just cannon fodder and you can only have the gun your host was carrying as you possessed them.

))) This wouldn't be so bad if you could possess different people during levels to acquire different weapons. But most of the time you're stuck with one character and one gun for an entire level.

The shooting sections are also easy, thanks to the bad AI. unlimited ammo and frequent health pick-ups, both before and after any challenging sections. Things do get better later in the game though, when you have to challenge monsters as well as moronic guards. But the ghost shenanigans and interesting creatures can't hide the fact that you're doing quite boring missions that involve going here to switch this on, then go back to open a door, kill some people along the way, possess a penguin and complete the level.

Okay, so we made the penguin bit up to try to make it slightly more exciting. n-Space could learn a lot from us. Forget soldiers. If there's a sequel, it should be set in a zoo and you can possess rare geese - it'll be called Geest.

This music invariably kicks in during the boss fights. Now, a boss fight should be a stand-out point of any action gamé and, at first, there are some good ones. Like the fight where you need to possess your opponent's grenade or the huge monster that catches you off-guard right at the start. But then they lose steam and sadly, the first boss you see is repeated several times, with exactly the same attacks and the same weakness - its mouth. Other fights are overly drawn out and irritating. And the motorbike battle against other bikers and a

truck is bamboozling. You think you're meant to drive the bike, but you're not. However, the guy driving it is so bloody stupid you still need to possess the bike now and again to steer him in the right direction. Christ,

next time, possess some stabilisers.

Luckily, things are less irritating in multiplayer and although there are only three different game modes, it still does manage to be fairly decent. The possession element certainly stands out more in

multiplayer because you have to look for hosts with decent weapons that will ruin any enemies. That's an element sorely missing from the main game and it also makes you realise just how many different cool weapons you've used in Story Mode.

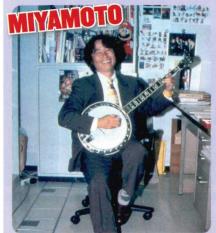

A fish could count on it's fingers the number of times Dean has played a GameCube FIFA game without it being demanded by his job description. In fact, we feel the exact same way about this as we did about last year's game. We expected more than ONE gem. Our mistake.

You could whip out a copy of Super Mario World right now, and we'd happily play it for hours. Our Super NES is still set up with Super Mario Kart sat firmly in the cart slot. These are just two of many Mario games that will never get old.

The only game that's aged as well as these in Sonic Gems Collection is Sonic CD. The chances are most of you Ninty dudes and dudettes wouldn't have played Sonic CD before. Either because you were hardcore Mario fans and wanted to stamp on Sonic's skull. Or because you made the wise choice not to get the dire Sega Mega-CD.

Sonic CD represents the pinnacle of Sonic platforming before Sega quit the hardware scene and sent their mascot to the Nintendo camp. They left it out of Sonic Mega Collection - a decision that left many Sonic fans disappointed with the first retro bundle. But it turns up to be the main attraction in SGC.

It's the sharpest and fastest of the

classic 2D Sonics, and the level design is mint, even when compared with the more recent sprint-hard episodes. And there's a wicked time travel mechanic, too. As you pelt through the stages, you will encounter portals that warp you to a past version of that stage. On a basic level, this will allow you to run around a bit, then warp back to the present in areas that are normally unreachable.

But if you dig a little deeper, you will find small objectives in the past realm, and your actions will affect the state of the present stage. So instead of simply seeing how fast you can sprint through a stage, you will be exploring the two realms for secrets, extras and brand spanking new routes.

It's a shame the rest of the games in this compilation haven't stood the test of time quite so well. The Sega Saturn did 3D about as effectively as hedgehogs cross motorways. Sonic the Fighter looks messier than an animal that's been slammed by a truck at 60mph. You won't have heard of half of the fighters, and this must comprise the LEAST number of moves in any beat-'em-up we've ever played.

Sonic runs well fast, so a Sonic-based racing game sounds like a wicked concept. But the handling in Sonic R is garbage. Sonic runs on foot, yet rather than control him in a typical way, you have to accelerate and STEER him like a car. That's bent. And the courses are just as rubbish.

Then there are the six Game Gear titles, thrown in for good measure. But strictly for good measure - surely not to actually be played. You'll think your GameCube is having an electronic stroke in its brain chip when you see a Game Gear game run on it. The colours are washed out and blurry, and the frame rates will make your head hurt. Sonic The Hedgehog 2 is the only one worth a quick look. The rest, Triple Trouble, Tails' Sky Patrol, Sonic Pinball, Sonic Drift 2, and Tails Adventures aren't even worth talking about. You need these like you need a fireball in the face.

On-rails sniper missions are interspersed between the running and gunning. These work pretty well, but you don't get health back for perving on chicks in bikinis, like in *Silent Scope* at the arcades.

We liked the feel of the game very much, and zoomed-in

aiming is done better than most games manage it. But with bullets as deadly as they are, the fact that your team are all a bit special-needs does kill the fun a bit. It's incredibly linear too, with classic clichés like 'rocks on staircase' and 'busted door' keeping you well and truly on the prescribed track.

There are some nice touches, like the ability to shotgun-blast doors open and slow down time in a hectic gunfight. Oh no, wait, that's just what the game does

anyway. Reality might have slowdown, too. We've never been in a position ready to kill six people with an assault rifle where we could check.

You have to be a bit of a masochist to be into *Rainbow Six* games. They just kick your balls for hours, and progress is often slow and painful. We'd take this over a *Medal of Honor* game any day of the week, though. If you're desperate for an FPS, that might be all the recommendation you need.

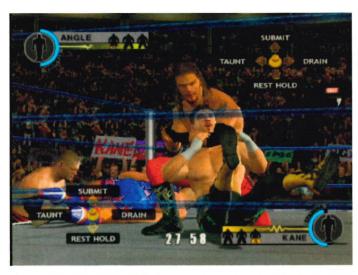

Who likes wrestling games? Wrestling fans do. No-one else. They're slow-paced fighting games with fat men all doing the SAME MOVES year in, year out. There's no fireballs, helicopter kicks or dragon punches. You can't fight in a flying Sea Harrier, in a jungle or on a giant magic carpet with dancing monkeys in the background.

Wrestling games just try as hard as they can to imitate the 'real' thing, getting slightly nearer with each sequel. And Day of Reckoning 2 gets closer than any GameCube wrestling game has done so far. But that's all. It gets slightly realer. There's nothing super-inventive, wacky or obviously unique about it. It's just like the man-grappling, face-slamming brawler of the past, with a few little tweaks to warrant calling it a sequel. So while wrestling fans will be moderately pleased with a new type of submission hold or the addition of a stamina bar, no-one else will really give a toss.

The submissions system is

the biggest addition to the DoR gameplay. When you grapple your opponent and trap them in a hold, you get four options. Submission makes them feel crazy amounts of pain and hopefully forces them to give up. Drain takes away their stamina. Taunt builds your momentum while Rest Hold keeps them down for a moment while you catch your breath. These four options sit conveniently on different ends of the C-Stick.

The twist is that your opponent gets these same options and if they choose the same one as you, they'll break free from your clutches. It's a guessing game, like papers, scissors, stone. You must

try not to be predictable. If your Stamina is really low, it's obvious you'll choose Rest Hold. If you're smart, you opt for something else. It's a neat system, although the lack of a Snap Nose Bone option is a little disappointing.

The other major new gameplay mechanic is the Stamina bar. Punching people in the face and kicking their limp body all round the ring is tough work. The more you pound away, the more tired your wrestler gets. There's a little bar to indicate his exhaustion. If you hammer your opponent constantly for ages, although you're doing well, your character will tire out

This leaves you extremely vulnerable to attack, as your blocking and counter moves are disabled. If the Stamina bar drains completely, he won't even move. He'll just stand there, trying to catch his breath. So while you scream "MOVE, KNOB 'ED", your opponent regains consciousness and slaps the crap out of you.

This makes fights more unpredictable. You have to consider tactics, like choosing the right moments to rest and picking the less than obvious submission options when you get into grapples. The Momentum Shift techniques are still in there too, mixing things up even more.

In case you missed the first game, Momentum measures your character's confidence. If you're all over your opponent like a rash, your fighter will be in high spirits, which activates his special moves. On the other hand, taking a pounding makes wrestlers lose the will to live, and their low spirit does you no favours. Momentum shift allows a wrestler in low spirits to perform a special counter move that switches your Momentum round in an instant.

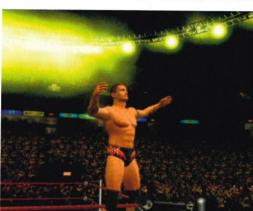
The days of watching your wrestler getting hammered while you bash buttons, powerless to do anything, are truly over. You can be ruining your opponent one minute. and the next, the whole fight can switch around and you'll have your head wrecked by a folding chair.

Does that make it exciting? Only if you like wrestling. That's the thing - this is the best wrestling game on GameCube to date, but there's still nothing in there to make it appealing to gamers in general. It's essentially the same plain wrestling action we've all seen before, with nicer graphics.

We're not sure how many polygons God designed our eyes to handle, but apparently there are loads more on the latest character models. The detail in the faces has improved - they've even got 3D teeth and tongues. All this detail is shown off to the max in the wrestler intros.

We spent more time gawping at the impressive intros than we did actually fighting. Take a few steps back and it has a very real look and feel about it. The animation is spot on. They've used more motion capture this time round, which definitely improves the effect. And the arenas look amazing when

If you haven't bought the DS version, then now's your chance to play. Don't bother with the usual EA fare (cough*Goldeneye Rogue Agent*cough). This is the game to spend your cash on. The cutesy animals are animated nicely and become strangely excited as you delete their friends from existence. But underneath the kiddie exterior is a monster

of a game, which will mercilessly suck you in and refuse to let go. Hours will go by without you even realising. It doesn't quite beat Advance Wars' ability to eat whole days of your life without even caring, but it comes close.

THE name in American footy takes another punt.

What was that, Mr Madden? We can't quite hear you above the din of some unknown American rock band. Did you say that we are 2nd and 10 or was there a flag on the play? We know what you're talking about, we've had over ten years of learning the playbook but that rock is making our brain hurt.

Like last year's effort, the look of the new Madden is as authentic as you're going to get. Teams, stadiums, rosters and the whole presentation of the game look like something ripped from a sports channel. The thousands of fans shout and boo, even drowning out the commentators. slightly worse to play.

Elsewhere, they've added a Superstar mode, where you get to work your way to the NFL Hall of Fame. Conducting interviews ("What do you eat before a

match? Pizza!") to scoring well in an A Level-standard IQ test ("Would you like to go hunting for wild game? God yeah!") broadens the appeal, even if you only just want to get out there and play a game for the hell of it.

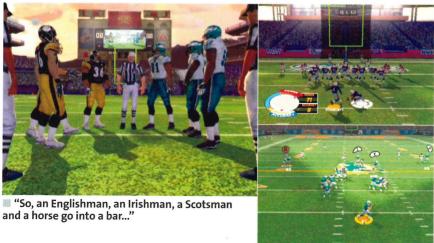

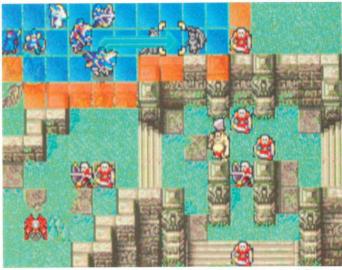

Is there a reason you didn't play the first Fire Emblem game on GBA? Maybe you picked it up in the games shop and the little pixelly dudes in the screenshots didn't turn you on? This time, don't be so shallow. You think it looks boring? This is high drama on a map. Why aren't they swearing? You're an idiot. American gamers fought in the streets, just to get these

strategy/RPG titles released in the West. We heard some fat yank even dropped his taco shouting at Iwata-san on a US tour. That's commitment. They helped us out in WWII... eventually. Now it's time to give something back.

Unlike the last Fire Emblem, this time the characters you control don't refer to you as their 'strategist'. They don't refer to you at all. You don't input your name. They don't thank you for your leadership. It's like you don't





exist. Except you must exist, because you bought the game and you're the one moving their blocky little asses around and dealing with their problems. It's demanding, but thankless. Maybe this is how God feels. Alone, but in total control. And responsible for everyone, from the strongest barbarian to the weakest cleric.

And pretty much all of your characters start out weak. They can barely take down a poxy grunt at the outset. You

rely on stronger chaperone figures to soften up the opposition while the weaker fighters feed on scraps and chip in where they can. But that's all good because it makes you start to think strategically. It makes you plan ou your moves and m

makes you plan out your moves and minimise the chances of defeat. And to help you out, *Fire Emblem* usefully lets you know how likely you are to slap (hit) the opponent and how much pain (hit points) you'll inflict if you do. This makes it easier to avoid death. But not so

easy you'll walk through the whole game unscathed.

But what happens if that guard's 20% chance of giving you a critical slap comes off? Well, it's death. As with all *Fire Emblem* games, once a character has been defeated, they're out of the game. They may still pop up in the narrative, but their moves will never be seen again on the battlefield. So what do you do? Take it on the chin or restart the

chapter? It depends on what kind of gamer you are.

If you're all about the top scores, you'll restart whenever a comrade dies. If you're a purist, you'll see the game for what it is - chess with wyverns, demons, bloody great axes and a compelling storyline that your feeble elitism

is only ever going to ruin. If you lost a Rook in chess, would that make you start over again?

Combat is based on weapon triangles and your ability to hit and defend. If the numbers don't add up, you're in trouble, but making sure you're using swords

In The Face!

New weapons, new noises, new ways to die.

One of Fire Emblem's most rewarding features is the ability to pick up brutal new implements of death. They can be bought from local vendors, but it's best to get them given to you by helpful locals, or as the spoils of combat - that way you get a cool little noise, too. Ba-ba-ba-ba-ba-ba-ba-ba-aaaaaa!

Weapons range in the quality of their construction, starting with iron and moving through steel, up to more painful-sounding objects, like a Killing Edge and Lancereaver - the former having more chance of connecting with a critical hit, the latter reversing the time-honoured weapon triangle.

You'll have to reach a certain level to use many of them in combat, but pressing \(\begin{align*} \text{ Mill have to reach a certain level to use many of them in combat, but pressing \(\begin{align*} \text{ While moving through your items will get info on any weapon. against axes, and axes against lances helps. Magic works just the same; Light beating Dark, beating Anima and round you go again. It seems easy enough, but sooner or later you'll go cold when the combat music suddenly stops and so does your character's heart. Some characters are really cool, like Joshua the coin-flipping swordmaster. Some you'll be glad to see the blood-drenched back of. The exception is when one of the central characters, like Eirika or Ephraim, is killed. Then you've got to start the chapter over.

The opposite of dying (a good thing) is gaining experience, which comes from victories in story chapters and skirmishes with wandering monsters. If all goes well, your band will mature as the story unfolds, levelling-up and using special items to switch classes. A Cavalier, for instance, can turn into a Great Knight (slow but powerful) or a Paladin (faster

but weaker). Your choice. As characters advance, so does the plot and it's worth leaving the ① button-skip alone and taking it in, even though there is a lot. It's a good tale, but one you'll probably feel you've heard before, until the juicy, dark elements turn up close to the end.

Games are about winning, but here each victory is tempered with regret. It's another step towards the end of the story; the last great battle on a dusty plain; one final frozen dungeon filled with monsters. For God's sake buy it, just don't play it all in one go. Go slow. Play it on Hard. Anything to prolong your stay in Magvel. Once you're done, you can play a different branch of the storyline or just wander the map, taking on more monsters just for fun. Or pick teams and take on a mate in Arena mode. Or sit back and just marvel at the power of those tiny little squares. The choice is yours.

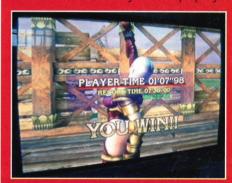
How to take a pic...
