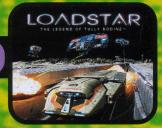

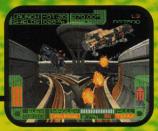

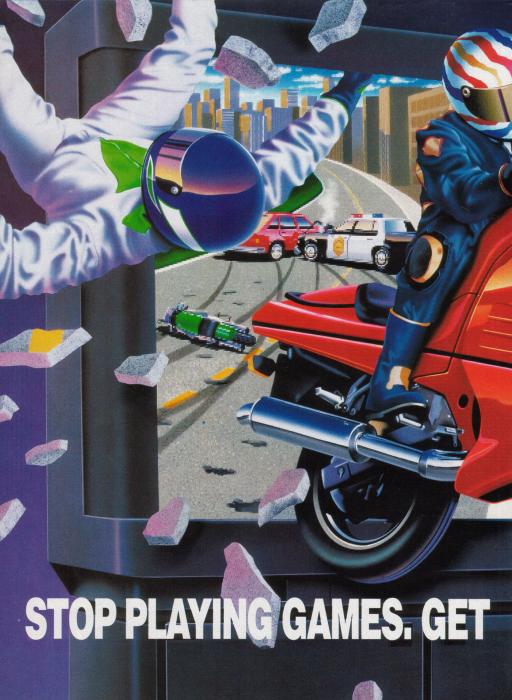

# Game Quality and Sequels: Good Buy or Goodbye?

yle Hansen has a good point (see his letter at right) – there are a lot of bad games out there trading on big names and rehashing old concepts. But on the flip side, you don't have to look very far to find refreshing, innovative games – even some with familiar faces.

For instance, look at this month's ProStrategy Guide (starting on page 97), which reveals hidden features in the fabulous action/adventure game Earthworm Jim. The game's developer, Shiny Entertainment, is already working on a sequel that will be entirely different from the original.

Then look at the latest Sonic. Although Kyle's sick of Sonic games, the innovative "lock-on" technology in Sonic & Knuck-les (see "The Cutting Edge," page 20) brings new game play to old software. By plugging older games like Sonic 3 into the Sonic & Knuckles cart, you can discover new arenas of play. That's pretty cool.

And let's not forget another fresh product starring a socalled "rehashed" character: Donkey Kong Country. With allrendered graphics, DKC marks an advance in game technology and earned a 5.0 in Graphics, Controls, and FunFactor (see "Nintendo Went Ape," *GamePro*, December 1994, p. 51).

How can you tell if a familiar name will be awesome or awful? Easy. First, scour *GamePro* for an in-depth review of the game. Then rent it or play a friend's copy. If you think a game stinks, there's a powerful way to show your disdain: Don't but. Speak with your wallet, and you will be heard! After all, business is business, and companies can't afford to put out products that don't sell.

Case in point: As of last June, 502,283 people were buying GamePro each month, making it the most popular video game magazine in the U.S. That, too, is speaking with your wallet. Thanks for the feedback!

fact, it's applying for a patent even as you read this article. Sega refers to the unique programming process simply as "backward compatibility."

Connecting two carts combines stored memory data within each cartridge. All the code in the Sonic programs is compatible; each Sonic game

builds upon a central core code that's modified but stays consistent from game to game. That makes it easy to import the new graphical and special game-play data stored in Sonic & Knuckles into older games.

The game environments in the older carts contain hidden areas that were previously inaccessible to players. In fact, no one besides Sonic's game designers (even within Sega itself) knew they were there. A proprietary software technology creates a link like a handshake between the game code in S&K and the older Sonic carts. The only information Sega will reveal about the technique is that it's standard assembly-language programming.

Hedgehog Hatchery

Lock-On is the brainchild of the Sega Technical Institute (STI), which created the entire Sonic series. STI is a special division of Sega, now located at Sega of America (SOA) headquarters in Redwood City, California. It's the premiere creative games-development group for Sega worldwide.

"When Sonic was originally created," recalls Roger Hector, STI vice-president and general manager, "we hadn't thought of Sonic & Knuckles yet, and backward compatibility was a dream. But the original programmer, Yuji Naka, is the lead programmer of the team that designed Sonic. Sonic 2.

Sonic 3, and Sonic & Knuckles. He, in his own right, automatically created a connection between all the carts by the consistency of his programming style and the consistency of the team's vision for Sonic."

According to Hector, the seeds of the backward-compatibility idea were planted two-and-a-half years ago – before Sonic 2. However, even during the creation of the first Sonic the Hedgehog, the Sonic team

had ideas for new areas that just couldn't be playable at that time. What did they do? They programmed them into the game anyway, with hopes of some day using them. That day has arrived.

#### Back to the Future

Sega has no announced plans to use Lock-On in other games, but keep an eye out. Sonic and Knuckles could appear just about anywhere!

# KILLER INSTINCT

Killer Instinct's set to pave the way for Nintendo's Ultra 64 technology. All the characters are built from rendered, texture-mapped graphics. The game will scale in and out of the action, revealing huge, gorgeous backgrounds. On some stages, you'll scroll around 360 degrees to fight.

#### Fighting on Instinct

The Killer crew consists of ten fighters with finesse and unusual special attacks who battle through ten stages. For example, Spinal, a skeleton warrior, swings a sword and blasts energy from his shield. He calls forth helping skeletal hands from the ground and morphs into other characters. Sabrewolf is a wicked werewolf with sharp claws and a bad bite; watch out for the three bloodsucking bats flying around his head. Meltdown turns into a human torch with flamethrower arms. If things get too hot, he becomes invisible.



The rest of the gang is equally mean. Glacius the iceman unleashes a bouncing energy-ball ground attack. Jago the ninja swings a quick blade, and Riptor, a reptilian warrior, spits fire. Orchid's a lethal woman warrior with quick martial arts moves, while Thunder fights with double tomahawks. Combo's an all-American boxer decked out in red, white, and blue, Fulgore's special move resembles an electrical fireball attack.

The six-button control will be very similar to Street Fighter. with sweeping directional motions and button presses for specials. The fascinating fighting system is geared for multihit combos: The show's test unit unleashed a 22-hit monster!

#### Kill or Be Killed

KI looks awesome. In November. arcade fighters will determine if the game's for show or go.





















wicked port of the original weapons fighter, Samurai Shodown II has a few notable improvements. The graphics look more or less the same, and the perspective still scales in and out, but graphical improvements like eight brandnew backgrounds and bigger character sprites heat up the action. The six-button control layout remains the same, but a new full-power meter juices a secret move. The old combos won't work, but the game is packed with spanking-new ones - and more of them.

#### New Samurai

This time, gamers can choose from 15 characters (rather than 12), and four of them are new. Say "sayonara" to Tam Tam and "konnichiwa" to Cham Cham, who's rumored to be Tam Tam's sister. Cham Cham's monkey sidekick pulls



three Tam Tam moves, and her boomerang murders air attacks. Also making his debut appearance, Genjuro is a swordsman who resembles Haohmaru. He tosses Japanese flower cards (called "hanafuro") at opponents, but he can also toss a foe into the air and slice him up.

Sieger's a big, buffed, bald guy with a huge iron arm guard. Like Street Fighter II's Zangief, he uses grab moves. Nicotine is a small guy who carries a big stick. His smoking



is hazardous to your health he exhales rampaging smoke & animals (a bird and a tiger). He can also temporarily scramble an adversary's controls.

#### On with the Shodowns

The coin-op version of Shodown II is reportedly due in November, and the home version's due in December. Search for a code aimed at better-red-than-dead home-cart players, too.

At the show, we managed to get a sneak peak at the long-awaited Virtua Fighter sequel, Virtua Fighter 2. It looked better, faster, and smoother than its predecessor.

#### A Technical Knockout

All your favorite combatants from Virtua Fighter are back for an encore, and they've brought along two new friends: Shun and Lion. Every character has hot new fighting moves and challenging counterattacks.

It gets better. Many players complained that 150,000 polygons per second wasn't

enough, that 30 frames per second was too slow. With a punch and a kick, Sega's come out fighting. According to Sega, VF 2 will feature 300,000 polygons per second for incredibly smooth animation and 60 frames per second for a championship level of speed.

If the prelim version was any indication, you're going to dig those texture-mapped graphics (similar to Daytona's) and the new, expanded 3D arenas. With Virtua Fighter 2, Sega seems ready to get deep into fighting games—three dimensions deep.



These days, any fighting game in the arcade circuit can expect to be put through heavy-duty paces, but Taito has just begun to fight. Global Champion is a side-view one-on-one fighting game where players use six-button control to guide nine fighters in a battle for glory and bragging rights. The combatants can power up to five attack levels, and they have a lethal special move that clobbers half the opponent's

health meter. The show version had gorgeous character graphics. Looks like Taito's ready to beat or be beaten.

Yes? Then you're prime zombie bait for Corpse Killer Sega CD, a B-grade, live-action shooter by Digital Pictures.

#### Killer's Bs

That "B" designation extends to more than the game's second-tier status among active shoot-em-ups. Try "B" for "bodies," "B" for "bullets," and "B" for "B-movie."

The "bodies" are zombies, whose sheer numbers and variety keep the action intense. The walking dead overrun hellish Cay Noir island and appear as six increasingly tough gangs. They're the result of a U.S. military experiment gone awry, and, yes, the Army was looking for a few good dead men.

The "bullets" are your ammo in this simple-to-play first-person blast-a-thon. You can use the standard controller, an American Laser Games Gamegun, or a Sega Menacer to guide on-screen cross hairs and send the ghouls back to their graves.

# How To Use the New Entertainment Software Rating System

What is the Entertainment Software Rating Board?

The ESRB is a newly created independent board that has, with the support of the industry, developed a standardized rating system for interactive entertainment products.

What the Ratings Do

The ESRB ratings are designed to give consumers information about what's in an interactive video or computer entertainment title and for which ages it's appropriate. They are <u>not</u> meant to tell you what to buy or rent or to serve as the only basis for choosing a product. In addition to the ratings, consumers should always consult product packaging for additional information about the product and should apply their own tastes and standards in making final purchase or rental decisions.

#### What to Look For

Ratings: Consumers should look on the front of the package for the ESRB rating symbol, which gives information about ages for which the product is appropriate.

Content Descriptors: In addition to the rating, consumers should check for important content information (also called "descriptors") in the black-and-white box on the back of the package. These content descriptors give more details about the product in terms of violence, sexual themes, language, and other areas that may be of interest to some consumers. If there is no content information on the back of the package, the Rating Board believes that the product does not include content that must be highlighted.

#### **The Five Rating Categories**

Look for these ratings on the front of the package and, for more information, look for content descriptors on the back of the package.



Titles rated "Early Childhood (EC)" are suitable for children ages three and older and do not contain any material that parents would find inappropriate.

#### Kids to Adult

Titles rated "Kids to Adult (K–A)" are suitable for persons ages six and older. These titles will appeal to people of many ages and tastes. They may contain minimal violence, some comic mischief (for example, slapstick comedy), or some crude language.

#### Mature

Titles rated "Mature (M)" are suitable for persons ages 17 and older. These products <u>may</u> include more intense violence or language than products in the Teen category. In addition, these titles <u>may</u> also include mature sexual themes.

#### Adults Only

Titles rated "Adults Only (AO)" are suitable only for adults. These products <u>may</u> include graphic depictions of sex and/or violence. Adults Only products are not intended to be sold or rented to persons under the age of 18.

# Doom with a View

If you haven't already played Doom on a PC, you're in for a treat. Doom is a gaming milestone. It's nothing like id's earlier Wolfenstein 3-D or the Wolfenstein-influenced (and pretty good) Zero Tolerance and Battle Frenzy on the Genesis. In Wolfenstein, the halls are straight, the lights are always on, and the playfield is always level. It's a great game, but it's still conspicuously a game.



PROTIP: The chainsaw is hard to find, but it's a great weapon when you run out of ammo and have to battle mano a mano.



PROTIP: Don't rush around cor ners. You're just begging to get blown away. You can draw enemies out by quickly stepping into a room, then immediately stepping back.

Doom is more like being there, with all the spookiness and variation that implies. The game-play aspects of the previous versions are present: You're still walking over items to pick them up, still searching for secret doors, still questing for an exit.

But now the walls curve, and the rooms take on all sorts of unpredictable shapes. Light often gives way to degrees of darkness. Chasms with nasty stuff (and occasionally pleasant surprises) block your path. Walls and platforms appear

and vanish. Stairways and elevators lead up and down (sometimes way up and down) into forbidding places populated with bizarre, angry creatures. These enemies range from wimpy soldiers and

yammering pink demons to great fireball-throwing red globes and worse...much worse. When you spot your







first CyberDemon, you'll think the devil himself is after you.

Naturally, you'll need serious ordinance to take these guys down. Wolfenstein's fabled chaingun is just a middle-rank weapon here. Doom's arsenal ranges from a chainsaw to a rocket launcher to the BFG 9000, which obliterates multiple enemies in a blaze of green light.

# Doom Lens

Devotees of the original will notice some trims – an effect or two missing here, a bit of level architecture excised there. That's nothing to complain about; the mere availability of Doom will probably be enough for game-hungry Jag owners.

But this Doom does suffer somewhat in comparison with the PC original. The resolution on the Jag is slightly lower, the images are grainier, and enemies in the middle distance tend to blur together. It'll be interesting to see how this game shapes up on the 32X.

The sound effects remain very Doomish. There's the labored breathing of the protagonist, the devilish shrieking of the demons, and the satisfying grunt of an enemy when he's slammed back by gunfire.

# **Doomed If You Do**

The directional pad doesn't permit the aiming accuracy of a keyboard. Although the speed is quite good (especially when

running), explosions and death animations do tend to give it up to the gods of slowdown.

The designers also heightened the game's puzzle element. You'll often need to push buttons and throw switches to progress through a level. And then there's the matter of sorting out what the switches do. It's not always obvious.

Parents sensitive to video game violence may want to have a look at Doom before

buying it. It's visceral stuff with quite a lot of blood and guts on display. A level near completion will be littered with corpses.

# **Net Play?**

Finally, many Doomers would argue that the game found its ultimate expression as a multiplayer "fragfest" played over a modem or network. While Doom by modem is planned for the Jaguar and Cooperative and Death Match modes are included on the cart, modem support won't be ready until January. Either way, you can't go wrong.

Doom is a memorable experience when played solo. With another player, it should be absolutely wicked.



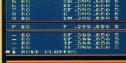

Swing from the low hook point to the higher hook point, then doubleswing to the left with enough momentum to reach the 1-up at E2.

SNES: This move is less complicated on the SNES, but it still requires tricky whip work. From the third basketball, jump up and to the right. While in midair, hook left to the hook above. Snag the hook, and it'll propel you to the platform to the left.



You'll end up at a swirl point that leads to super blasters at E3. Look for the 1-up off to the left.

The graphics are very similar to Sega's other NFL football games. All action scrolls vertically from a third-person, behind-the-quarterback perspective. The zoom-cam effect of zeroing in on the ball carrier in earlier versions has been toned down to allow much more effective passing. The entire field shifts to give the QB a wide-angle view of all his receivers within 40 vards, which does wonders for the passing game.

Unfortunately, this downfield view isn't used throughout the game. It would've been useful for the running game, which now only shows you 10-15 yards of field in front of the ball carrier. When comparing graphics, Madden '95 wins the round, because it keeps a constant wide-angle view and its players move faster and more smoothly.

NFL '95 has a slower pace than Madden, which makes for a different kind of game. However, once you adjust, you'll appreciate NFL's realism. Running backs must fight for every extra yard, and QBs must give receivers time to run their downfield routes. Unlike Madden, where you can sometimes run up a ridiculously high score, scoring's more controlled and realistic in NFL '95. The nod for controls goes to NFL '95.



PROTIP: On offense, you can flip the direction of plays to double your number of play options.

Call the sounds a draw. Both games have some sound effects. but they don't set the world ablaze. NFL has no Madden-style



commentator, but you do get trash talking. None of it really makes the game much better.

## **Final Score**

Both NFL '95 and Madden '95 are first-class games. The grittiness and intense details of NFL. '95 are intended for die-hard fans who have the time and enthusiasm to take advantage of all the stats and options. While Madden '95 isn't much less detailed, it has more of an arcade feel that makes it more appealing for a quick game. The graphics in the Madden series have continued to improve. The

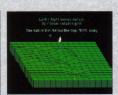

The controls remain almost the same (which means they're

#### Special Attacks

Each fighter has a series of special attacks, including Defensive Throws, Special Punches and Kicks, and Taunts (which aren't just funny!).

#### **Defensive Throws**



You can charge up for a Throw while Blocking. To do it, continuously press Button C as you Block. You'll throw our opponent on the next move.

#### **Taunts**



Any player can Taunt by simultaneously pressing Buttons A, B, and C. The Taunts are more than merely amusing - your power is increased when you hit an opponent after a Taunt. Although you're vulnerable when Taunting, it can be a useful tactic, especially against stronger fighters and bosses.



The Punch comes in four flavors. It's a great deterrent, and you can Punch your opponent out of an aerial attack.

#### **Basic Moves**

Each fighter also does a set of basic moves, including Punch, Kick, Block, and Throw. Most characters can perform these moves on the ground or in the air. During a match, mix up these basic moves with your character's special moves.

#### The Return of the X

Sega's 32-bit system has arrived, and we took a prototype for a test drive. This straight-from-the-box review covers 32X hookup, compatibility and all its pack-in items.

Sega claims that the 32X is compatible with all the current versions of the Genesis, including the original Genesis and the Genesis II (the unit that hooks side by side with the new Sega CD). The test unit had some compatibility trouble with the Genesis I, but the system performed well with the Genesis II.

Sega CDX? At the time of this writing, the 32X was awaiting FCC approval for capatibility with the CDX, Our beta version tested well with the CDX, but if FCC approval is not forthcoming Sega will not recommend using the 32X with the CDX.

A removable plastic adapter on the bottom of the 32X stabilizes the unit when it's used with the Genesis II. For the Genesis I you remove the panel to ensure a snug fit.

The package also includes a 32X power supply, AV in/out cords (you must run AV in from the 32X to the host Genesis), and an audio/video cord for TV hookup. That's right: lust like the CDX, you have to buy an RF/AV adapter to patch

This iumble of cords and wires is very confusing. Keep the manual - and Sega's telephone help line - handy. Another consideration: The 32X adds about 4 inches to the height of your system... and that's without the cartridge inserted.

Despite the complicated hook-up, the prototype system seemed to perform well. Some games froze occasionally, an anomaly that Sega assured us would not happen in production copies. The unit also had a tendency to heat

up, another correctable glitch.

The 32X is here, and though it's as complicated as setting up your VCR, it's ten times the fun.

#### The Jov of X

Catapult has the first modem for 16-bit gamers. Now you can beat someone across the country without leaving your living room. Available for the Genesis and SNES, the XBand is true interactive gaming.

At press time, the XBand Network covered New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco. Dallas, and Atlanta (any calls made outside these areas will incur longdistance phone charges). The Genesis version of the modem will ship first, with the SNES version to follow in the first quarter of 1995.

Not only can you play long-distance, but up to four players can access the modem in one household. Upon winning at the local level, the finalists were immediately transported to San Francisco in prison gear, where they were held in tight security at a hotel. The next morning, everyone showing on an MTV special, to be hosted by VJs Daisy Fuentes and Bill Bellamy.

# Williams Makes Jaguar, Ultra 64 Plans

Atari and Williams Entertainment announced plans to re-create some classic arcade hits on the Jaguar and various PC platforms, including Joust, Defender, and Robotron. The companies claim that these legendary games will be updated to include such things as "first-person perspectives in a realistic, three-dimensional environment." Atari will release the Jaguar versions, while Williams will market the games to high-performance PCs.

Williams Entertainment also revealed that it is developing

a "new, advanced" version of Doom that will be introduced when Nintendos Ultra 64 makes its home debut in fall 1995. The game is being done under the creative direction of id Software, the company that made Wolfenstein 3-D and Doom.

## **SF Movie Actor Dies**

On a sad note, actor and political activist **Raul Julia** died on Long Island, New York, in October. He was 54. During his career, Julia starred in many stage and screen productions, including his acclaimed role as Gomez Addams in the Addams Family movies. His final role was M. Bison in the film Street Fighter.

The video includes rap star Hammer and football/baseball great Deion Sanders, who collaborated on the soundtrack with such music celebs as Ice Cube, Public Enemy, and LL Cool J. Also making a cameo in the music video was Street Fighter star Jean-Claude Van Damme, who puffs a cigar and puts on some dancing moves.



# **Atari Plans Jaguar VR**

Atari Corp. and the U.K.-based Virtuality Group are combining efforts to develop virtual-reality games for the Atari Jaguar. Virtuality will devise a consumer-oriented headset that Atari will manufacture and market. The headsets expected to be ready for Christmas 1995 and will be under \$200. Virtuality Group is best known for its Virtuality VR stations for arcades and software like Dactyl Nightmare.

At Virtuality, confidence is high that the Jaguar is a good platform for the first affordable consumer VR games. "The Atari Jaguar platform is the only 64-bit system currently on the market." Virtuality's CEO Jon Waldern said, "and is ideally suited for immersive, virtual-reality games."

# Sony Imagesoft Bundles CDs

In a promotion that will last into the first quarter of 1995, Sony Imagesoft is bundling some of its Sega CD product into two-for-the-price-of-one packages. The bundles are Mary Shelley's Frankenstein and Bram Stoker's Dracula, No Escape and Cliffhanger, Three Ninjas Kick Back and Hook, Prime and Microcosm, and Firearm and Strangers. Additionally, Sony Imagesoft is offering a "buy two, get one free" Sega CD software campaign.

# **Night Trap Returns**

January 2, 1995, marks the return to the Sega CD of one of the industry's most talked-about games, Night Trap. Sega originally pulled Night Trap off store shelves last year following Congressional hearings on game violence. But Digital Pictures is re-releasing the game with an M (Mature) rating from the interactive-entertainment industry's **Entertainment Software Ratings** Board. It's one of the first games to be rated by the new group. Similarly, Night Trap will be rereleased in the United Kingdom. where it was previously banned. with a 15-17 (unsuitable for audiences under 15) rating by the European Leisure Software Publishers Association.

Even better news to players is word that the 32X version will offer 50 percent larger graphics and four times as many colors for more realistic playback. The 32X version will be released simultaneously with the Sega CD version and will be marketed through Acclaim Distribution.

# Nintendo Goes On-Line

To supplement its launch of **Donkey Kong Country** on November 21, **Nintendo** drove

on the information superhighway with CompuServe. In mid-October, CompuServe hosted a real-time conference with Nintendo execs Minoru Arakawa, president; Howard Lincoln, chairman; and Peter Main. vice president of marketing. The "Three Men and a Modem" chat was followed by an on-line trivia contest that ran through November, previews of DKC via digital movies, and another technical conference to discuss Nintendo's Advanced Computer Modeling (ACM) process, first used in Donkey Kong Country. Game tips and other inside information were also part of the conferences.

Transcripts of the conferences and the DKC movie clips (available in IBM and Macintosh formats) are available on-line. CompuServe members interested in checking them out should log in and type GO NINTENDO.

# E3 Replaces Summer CES

The Electronic Industries Association (EIA) has formally postponed the 1995 Summer CES in Philadelphia, renamed CES-Interactive (CES-I), with plans to reintroduce the show in Orlando, Florida, in May 1996. The main reason was increasing competition from the Electronic Entertainment Expo (E3), a new interactive-entertainment trade show co-produced by Infotainment World and Knowledge Industry Publications, Inc. E3 debuts in Los Angeles May 11-13, E3 has signed up well over 100 exhibitors, including Sega and Nintendo, Sega of America President Tom Kalinske will be E3's keynote speaker.

own. The story line for Fight for Life, scheduled for January 1995 release, involves a competition for the dead called the Annual Hell Fighting Tournament. The prize? The winner of the tournament gets to come back to life.

The game is being created with the help of BioVision, a company that has developed a state-of-the-art motion-capture games. The process involves filming a martial artist doing 250 moves with up to 25 mark-

ers attached to their body to record their movements. BioVision then converts the data into information that the Jaguar can use to display the action. The result will look very much like Sega's Virtua Fighter. Atari claims that the filming took place at 200 frames per second, far beyond the standard 30 or 60 frames per second of most video games.

### **More Ultra 64 Tools**

Nintendo recently signed a strategic alliance with Multi-Gen, Inc., to create exclusive 3D graphics tools for the Ultra 64. This is the second agreement Nintendo has made for Ultra 64 tools, the first being a deal with Alias Research ("ProNews," GamePro, October 1994). Nintendo intends to use MultiGen's technology to create games that allow player interaction in real-time 3D scenarios.

MultiGen has previously created high-end flight simulations and virtual reality environments on Silicon Graphics workstations. The Ultra 64 is a joint venture between Nintendo and Silicon Graphics.

# Acclaim Beats Movies

The release of Mortal Kombat II to the home systems last fall was a highly anticipated event. Acclaim said that MK II sales during the first week on the shelves - or flying off the shelves - were a cool \$50 million. That success made MK II "the largest introduction of a video game in history," according to Acclaim, and one that exceeded opening box-office receipts for such blockbuster films as The Lion King, The Mask, True Lies, and Forrest Gump. The shipping effort involved 65 trucks and 11

jumbo jets to transport the more than 2.5 million MK II games to some 15.000 stores.

# Capitol-istic Games For Sega's 32X

Sega announced that it has signed CapDisc/Capitol Multimedia as an official 32X developer. Previously, Capitol has been a developer for Sega CD and CD-i, as well as for PC and Mac CD-ROM. Capitol's first releases for the 32X are NFL Football Trivia Challenge and Kingdom - The Far Reaches. NFL Football Trivia Challenge is licensed from NFL Films, offers a 1500-question database, and is narrated by sports announcers Pat Summerall and Tom Brookshier. Kingdom is an animated fantasy RPG set in ancient times that features 33 minutes of animated adventure, 45 minutes of dialogue, and 40 minutes of sound and music.

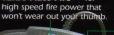
