THE POST-WAR PERIOD IS HERE

Regardless of what the average man in this industry wants to believe, the postwar period is actually here, as far as he is concerned. This does not mean that he will see new machines appearing on the market tomorrow. But, as far as his future business ventures are concerned, the post-war period is here, and he must guide himself accordingly.

Gradually, and very, very easily, this is being made known to the public. One order after another is carefully eased out of Washington these days, and so quietly that the average man doesn't note its import nor even, in some cases, its release.

For example, just a few weeks ago the country was notified that there was now in effect a \$200,000,000 cutback in Army munition and Navy ship manufacture. The news came unhurriedly and without much fanfare. The country being in the midst of watching the race for Berlin, simply glanced at this subheadline in its newspapers and continued reading the latest war news.

Just a few days ago WPB announced that the automobile manufacturers would now be allowed to make new tools. This was a very short and rather quiet release. Following this came news that possible release of manpower controls would probably soon follow. This was also very quiet and without fanfare.

The nation has now been told that as far as the European war is concerned, this can be considered to be finished. No active head of the Nazis is now powerful enough to put a stop to German fighting. It is now all dependent on a declaration from General Eisenhower which would force all armed Germans into the category of guerillas. Thereby these would be shot on sight without benefit of articles of war.


In fact, such a declaration may be announced while this article is rolling on the presses. This would then be considered V-E day. And this might suddenly release a torrent of cutback telegrams as well as eliminate many controls for which this nation is not as yet prepared. If the words of former War Mobilization Director James F. Byrnes are to be recalled - this would mean an instant return to at least 15% domestic production.

The Cash Box urges this industry to be prepared to greet this sudden announcement of V-E day. And the best method of preparation is to actually consider itself in the post-war period at this time. In this fashion the average man in this business will be protected from any sudden surprises.

As published last week, distributors want to know just where they stand with their former factories. They certainly cannot be blamed for this attitude. These men, in the majority of cases, are willing to spend more than they ever did before to beautify their showrooms, even build new quarters, hire salesmen, train mechanics, and do one and a dozen other things to get themselves set for the opening of that period when new machines will once again come off production lines, regardless of how long after V-E day this will occur.

Jobbers, too, want to know where they stand. These men are in exceptionally close contact with the operators. They are usually the men who give most of the credit in this field. They take in most of the trades. Their big business is used equipment. They usually find themselves making two sales to earn one profit. Therefore they, too, want to know where they stand so that they can arrange for the best possible progress for themselves during the post-war period.

The average operator is intent on solidifying his locations to make sure that they will remain his locations. But he also wants to know what machines to rid himself of first and thereby revamp his route so that it will be in a best profit position for whatever shall occur during the post-war era.

The operator is not worried about his equipment. In the first place he has learned that the location means more than the machine in it. In almost all cases his equipment is amortized and therefore whatever he will get for these old machines will actually prove to be profit.

To assure themselves of the future and to also protect themselves for whatever sudden business surprises that may occur, the members of this trade just make up their minds that right now - at this present moment - they are actually in the post-war period, and for their ewn future goed and welfare must so conduct themselves, regardless of when new machines will again be produced.

A NEW PLAN FOR THE RECORD MFRS. The average music machines operator is not of the belief that the record manufacturers, namely, the big three; Victor, Columbia and Decca, are doing very much to help remedy the inequitable distribution situation which exists thruout the country.

The average music operator has arrived at that stage wherein he feels that the members of this industry, themselves, sheuld create, or foster the creation, of a record manufacturing firm which will press for coinmen only.

By this method, he believes, will he then be able to obtain the quantities necessary for continued profitable operation today, and surely for tomorrow.

Many an operator of music machines has explained that unless he can get the records he needs to continue to operate efficiently, it just won't pay him to increase his present route, nor will he, in the future, want machines with more than 10 or 12 records in them. He claims that only 5 or 6 of the records in any machine actually bring in the play and that the rest are simply so much extra expense.

Of course, there are many whe will strongly centend that more records in a machine or music system, will gain greater attention from the public, and thereby gain more play action. This has been proved true in the case of wired music, which has been so successful during this war period, wherein a large number of records are featured.

But all this still does not cure the present record situation. It seems, instead of bettering itself, to grow worse. Both Victor and Columbia promised investigations of their present distribution set-up, and so far little change seems to have occurred. Tho in some territories praises for both of these, or at least one of these firms, is now being heard.

Decca has so far not answered any of the requests published here. This firm is continuing along on the basis that the trade knows of its intents and purposes. Some of Decca's branch managers have won the praise of certain leading music men, others anything but praise.

There is no doubt that as the coin operated music machines industry grows greater, during the post-war era, it will need the complete support and cooperation of these three leading record manufacturers. They will prove vital to the progress which the trade hopes to make during the post-war period.

The record situation should therefore be brought to some satisfactory conclusion. The members of this industry are eager to help arrange for this conclusion. They want to continue to work in harmony with the big three. They feel that whatever misunderstandings have occurred in the past that these can be cured. They want very much to have the big three advise them of their status for the future.

Some coinmen have become so hardened that they do not believe that whatever will be premised them will ever be fulfilled. They feel that there is only one answer to the entire record situation and that this answer is the creation of a record manufacturing corporation of their own which will administer to their needs exclusively.

Perhaps this is what will have to result eventually. Perhaps, tho, the three large manufacturers of records will see fit to create separate organizations to make certain that this coin operated music machines industry gets the records it needs. These three organizations to be completely separated and distinct from their present companies. These three to work exclusively with and for coinmen. In fact, to manufacture the kind of records that coinmen need - using the name bands and leading artists they now have under centract.

This, then, the creation of separate units within the parent companies may prove to be the answer to what this trade needs to assure itself obtaining the number and kind of records which will bring it success in the post-war period - and which will also allow it to grew greater and to more fully expand its operations throut the nation.

Will the record manufacturers agree to this proposal? What do you think?

WILL TAXATION BRING LEGALIZATION? There seems to be a growing belief among some coinmen that eventually high taxation will being about the legalization of much coin operated equipment.

This belief is based on the fact that, like the revenue received from horse racing, when the states also begin to receive big revenue from coin operated equipment, that the legislatures of such states will legalize coin operated equipment to insure receiving this revenue regularly.

These men explain that it is a more or less assured fact that all coin operated equipment will eventually bo forced to pay a sharo of its gross roceipts to the state, and this means to the counties, citios and villagos in the state as well.

A percentage of the gross receipts in any large state can run into a very important and sizeable sum. For example, if the tax makers in Texas eventually win their point and obtain \$50 per yearly license per phono, plus 15% of the gross collections from the phono; and \$100 per yearly license per pin game, plus 15% of the gross collections from pin games; Texas might find coin operated equipment one of its mainstays as a revenue producer.

Digging further into this Texas tax demand, it must also be remembered that the counties and cities of that state, by law, are allowed to charge up to 50% of the state's fee as their license fee. In short, the operator of music machines and pin games in Texas could be forced to pay an additional 50% of the amount he will be paying his state to the county and city where he operates.

There is no doubt that under such a severe tax burden the averago Texas operator would probably have to give up the ghost, and about the only ones who could then operate such equipment in Texas would be the location owners thomselves.

Yet tho state, as well as the counties and cities, would then receive such tremendously large income that they would, to insure this income, according to the beliefs of some coinmen, legalize pin games and music machines by law. And this, they think, might even lead to the logalization of other equipment, too.

The thought, then, on the part of these men seems to be that to eventually legalize all coin operated equipment the plan is to allow the states, counties, cities and villages to obtain exceptionally high revenue via taxation.

The fly in the eintment is that should the state and its communities tax coin machines at such a rate where the revenue would become of vital importance, the operator would then not be able to carry on his business on any sort of profitable basis.

In short, the state and its communities could, by such taxation, wipe this industry out of existence. The economic law which concerns itself with the point of diminishing returns would have to eventually assert itself, and by such assertion, the tax rovenue would be greater than the income, on a net basis.

Therefore, those coinmen who are of the belief that by higher taxation of the equipment of this industry the tax makers will eventually force legalization of this equipment, have to also figuro what income will be left for them to continue their businesses.

Possibly horse racing can stand up under such a heavy load. But this industry is not based on the same premise as horse racing. Past performances have already proved that this business is incapable of paying anything but the most equitable sort of taxes for its equipment.

In many communities the equipment of this industry is being unfairly overtaxed. In most such communities coinmen have been forced to remove their machines, for they found it unprofitable to continuo. For example, one community in New Jersey placed a \$500 yearly license foo on pin games. This means taxation at the rate of \$10. per week. Fow, if any, pin games can stand up under such a torrific tax burden.

Certainly, then, were such high taxation productive of such marvelous revenue, why didn't this community pass a law to legalize pin games? It not only did not legalizo pin games, but it does not to this day receive any revenue from pin games, for thore aren't any pin games operating in this community.

This industry must continue on the basis that it can best assure itself a profitable business by holding taxation down to the very lowest possible point. This is practical. This is what has been proposed for all business. This is what has also been urged for the continued freedom of competitive enterprise by the nation's leaders.

TALKING OUT LOUD" FORM UNITED STATES C.M.I. CORP. IRADE URGED TO FORM 'UNITED STATES COIN MACHINES INDUSTRY CORPORATION'. NOTED NATIONAL FIGURE FOR CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD. STOCK TO BE ISSUED TO MEMBERS FREE ON CONTRACT AGREEMENT. DIVIDENDS PAID TO SHARE HOLDERS. BUSINESS ON HIGH PLANE. PLAN MEETS APPROVAL OF MANY COINMEN.

NEW YORK — Once again The Cash Box presents a startling and revolutionary plan to this industry. This plan, in the past six months, has been explained to various noted leaders in this industry, ranging from operators to jobbers, distributors and manufacturers.

All are in agreement that the formation of such a corporation, as proposed, can be successful and that it will help place this industry on the highest possible business plane.

The plan itself, like those offered for creating a National Tax Council, a Credit Bureau, a Publie Relations Bureau, a National Board of Trade, a School for Coin Machine Mechanics, and the others urged upon this industry by The Cash Box, is of vital importance to the further expansion and growth of this industry, and helps to assure this trade its proper place in the American industrial scene.

First, the plan suggests the creation and formation of a corporation to be known as the "United States Coin Machines Industry Corporation". This corporation, it is hoped, will eventually be composed of all the members of this industry, regardless of their status in the trade.

No sale of stock in this corporation will be made now, or as long as it remains in existence. Instead, a share of stock will be issued free of charge to each coin machines man or woman who, by signing a legal contract, will agree to live up to a code of business ethics to be drawn up and voted on by all members.

This share of stock will be held in trust for each member. On his death and should his estate discontinue its association with his industry, this share will be voided, after all value has been paid to the estate for this share. This information will be contained in the contract agreement.

Further, should the member be definitely proved to have volated the statutes contained in the contract agreement, and have this so ruled as a violation by a trial board of the corporation, he will also lose his share of stock, after all value has been paid to him.

The corporation shall receive its revenue from the contents of his contract agreement which will he signed by each member. In this agreement the member will anthorize the corporation to collect from the source of supply a definite amount which will be added to the cost of each machine he purchases.

In short, the member will authorize (by legal form) the source of his purchase and supply to add onto each machine he purchases magreed to amount, possibly a dollar or two. This will be collected at regular intervals by the corporation.

This will probably bring more money into the corporation than will prove necessary for its maintenance. This additional money will be carefully handled so that dividends will be paid annually to all share holders and valuation of each share will rise proporfonately to the amount in the corporation's treasury.

This addition of a dollar or so to the cost of each machine at a source is, naturally, a hidden tax. But one to which the average minman agrees. At the same time the share of stock he was given be of charge will, as times goes on, become extremely valuable and will, annually or semi-annually, pay him unusually good avidends.

This will act as a stimulus for all this industry to expand and rosper. It will, at the same time, tend to place this trade on the highest possible business plane because no man will want to lose his thare (as the value grows) by untoward acts in violation of his threement with the corporation.

Urged upon the industry is the employment of an outstanding, wright nationally famous person to act as Chairman of the Board and head this corporation, or the industry, whichever expression is preferred.

Such a person should have won the respect of the entire nation. He should be a man who has already held a position of national importance. He should have judicial knowledge as well as executive ability, and the qualities of leadership.

Into such a corporation can be embodied a National Tax Council, a Credit Bureau, Public Relations Bureau, and all the other proposals already made by The Cash Box to help this industry rise the highest possible plane. Many have already agreed that this new suggestion by The Cash Box embodies all the good that this industry needs for the future. These men believe that this proposal, tho as yet in crude form, will answer all present and future needs of this trade.

MUSIC OP GIVES LIBERAL VIEW OF RECORD BIZ

BOSTON, MASS.—Cy Jacobs of Interstate Music Co., this eity, reports that in his estimation some of the music ops are expeeting and demanding entirely too much from the average record distributor. Since many have increased routes, he says, they now demand more records than they ever received before, even tho the record distrib may be giving them a very fair share of his quota as eompared to what they purchased pre-war.


Cy writes, "I have been following your articles about the record situation and perhaps you would be interested to know that from our experience with the distributors, they have been pretty fair and square with the operators. The average operator must bear in mind that, after all, it takes sometime after a number is released before it becomes a hit, and then when it is a hit, they all scramble for it. Therefore, the distributors are swamped with orders.

"One distributor in particular has been very cooperative with the operators, That is the Decca Distributing Corp., Jack Meyerson, manager. He installed a stauding order system when the shortage of records started, and I can say personally, and I can also speak for other operators, that he has maintained this standing order, and every release that Decca has made, the operators have received their share.

"However, there are many operators who have enlarged their rontes and feel that because they did this, they are entitled to more records. That is one of the many causes of ill feeling between the operator and the record distributor."

Jacobs goes on to state that Vietor and Columbia have also heen very fair in the Boston area and that Capitol, who have just opened a Boston office, have started out with a good system.

Y. TIMES SURVEY FINDS CURFEW SAVINGS NEGLIGIBLE

NEW YORK CITY - The New York Times has just completed a survey on the effect of the midnight curfew, after giving it a two month trial (began February 26) and finds that it has proven negligible as a coal saver and stimulant to public morale.

According to Consolidated Edison Co. of this city, fuel saving would amount to less than three-tenths of one percent annually. Restaurant and nite club men report service men and public generally drinking too fast. All reports indicate that service men are much angered by the curfew.

CANADA PREPARES RECONVERSION PLANS TORONTO, ONT., CAN. - The Qanadian Government is now granting construction permits for certain types of industrial projects of a post-war nature to enable its industry "to lay plans for the future, to place its orders now for equipment and materials involved for later delivery and, so far as supplies warrant, to get started in a modest way on its reconstruction program", J. Gerald Godsoe, Chairman of Canada's Wartime Industries Control Board, announced April 23 in an address before the Toronto Board of Trade.

It is believed in coin machine circles that manufacture may first start in Canada (as reported in the April 24 issue of The Cash Box) and parts shipped to this country for assembly.

DORSEY BROTHERS TO MANUFACTURE RECORDS NEV YORK CITY - Rumors here claim that Tommy and Jimmy Dorsey, noted band pilot brothers will go into the record manufacturing business the moment the war with Japan is over. However, it is reported, they intend to go in for the "longhair" music.

SEATTLE, WASH. - At the Boeing Aircraft plant here, several pins from nearby drug stores have been recruited and converted into testers for the intricate B-29 wiring mechanism. The flashing lights are reported to tell technicians that wiring connections are properly installed and because of this somewhere in the Pacific a B-29 crew will have a better chance of hitting the jackpot.

NEW BOOK RECALLS NEW YORK'S MAYOR LA GUARDIA AS SLOT PLAYER NEW YORK CITY - "The Best Is Yet", the new book by the noted attorney, Morris L. Ernst (just published by Harper & Brothers) recalls one night when Mr. Ernst went to a saloon opposite a theatre with Mayor LaGuardia and the Mayor ran to a slot machine where he "gleefully triod for the jackpot, with no apparent sense of guilt. Was he the same man who, less than a decade later, had slot machines dumped into the East Eiver?" asks Mr. Ernst.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Coinmen who have always made a few extra dollars working arcades and concessions at state and county fairs may find this extra income cut off, according to Col. J. Monroe Johnson, national director of the Office of Defense Transportation. He stated "Those making proparation for such fairs this Summer and Fall are The nation's locomotives and rail cars are being taxed proceeding at their own risk. to the utmost to maintain military and essential civilian needs.
