# JUKES, PINS, SLOTS, PARK'G METERS CAN BE MANUFACTURED AGAIN BUT NO STEEL, ALUMINUM, COPPER, TIN, ZINC OR RUBBER CAN BE USED!

WASHINGTON - Late Tuesday night (May 15) some members of this industry were made aware of the fact that WPB had revoked Limitation Order L-21. This means that automatic phonographs, pin-ball games, slots, arcade equipment, parking meters, etc., could once again be manufactured.

Wednesday morning (May 16) this news was spread (and in some cases headlined) by the press and radio thruout the nation. The trade became tremendously elated. Jubilation reigned uncontrolled. Many immediately dashed for Chicago's coin machine manufacturing center. It seems that few read the restriction notice that was attached to this revoke order by the War Production Board.

Yes, automatic phonographs, pin games, slot machines, arcade equipment, parking meters, and almost all other types of coin operated devices can once again be manufactured now that the War Production Board has revoked L-21 under the mammoth M-126. But, in revoking this order WPB stated that no steel, aluminum, copper, tin, zinc or rubber can as yet be used by the manufacturers. These vital metals are still on the critical list. (And everyone also knows how critical lumber is.)

Of course, if the manufacturers can dig up scrap metal here and there, and replace and substitute with materials that are not on the critical list, then they can go ahead and manufacture machines once again, provided, that they are not in any way hurting the war production effort now engaged in producing enough to beat Japan.

Perhaps the trade will soon see juke boxes, pin games, slot machines, arcade equipment, etc., made with plastic cabinets (if enough plastic can be obtained and the manufacturers want to spend the monies necessary to make such expensive moulds) or perhaps cabinets made of the newest type of flexible glass, and instead of copper perhaps some sort of string can be used (not steel wire, for steel is prohibited in the manufacturing process.) In fact, while writing this, WPB has even added to the metals and materials that can not be used the following: nickle, lead, plastic and chromic acid.

In short, wheatever products will ensue within the next 90 days or so, will have to be completely on the ingenuity of the manufacturers to develop substitutes for the materials they can't use and from such substitutes put together the fine products they formerly presented to the trade.

The trade does not yet have to become unduly excited over the fact that WPB has revoked Limitation Order L-21. It had as yet best remain calm, cool and collected (as recommended in the editorial pages of this issue) until the restrictions are lifted on the materials needed by the manufacturers to manufacture. And that may be a long way off.

# "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round" by Bill Gersh

#### LAST CHANCE FOR A BETTER COMMISSION BASIS

Ever since its inception The Cash Box has urged coinmen to arrange for a better commission basis between operator and location owner. This was especially urged during this wartime period. It can be so much more easily arranged while the war is on.

This is a last chance for those coinmen who can foresee the future of this business to arrange for a better commission basis. The Cash Box originally urged the trade to set up a 75%-25% commission basis. It is still of the belief that the operator should receive 75% of the proceeds of every coin machine against 25% to the location owner, at least on the average location.

The reasons for this have been presented time and time again. There is no leader in this industry who will not agree with the contention that a better commission basis is necessary. Costs of materials, supplies and labor have risen to a point where a 60%-40% commission basis is absolutely imperative right now.

With the possibility that these same materials and labor costs will also require that manufacturers obtain more for the new equipment they will introduce - the urgency of a better commission basis grows more important daily.

The average operator will admit that he is today paying much more than 20% above what he paid pre-war for supplies, parts, labor, etc. Then surely he is entitled to a share of this increase from the location owners. If he adopts a 60%-40% commission basis he is at least getting part of the differential that he needs. At the same time, he is insuring himself for tomorrow.

Now, before the post-war manufacturing era gets under way for this industry, is the time to adopt a new commission basis and place it into immediate effect. Only by such effort will the operator protect himself from again becoming classified as - "machine poor". This phrase was the one that hurt a great many coinmen very deeply during the pre-war era. It should therefore be eliminated, if at all possible, before the new machines period.

Many will remember that certain operators thruout the nation, right before the war started, had large routes of machines - but no cash. These were the men who were termed "machine poor". The salesmen who traveled the nation would dodge these men as much as possible and seek to install new men in their territories.


Nor were the salesmen to blame. They, too, were forced to eern a living. And the only way they could do so was to sell the machines they represented. Therefore there was much friction during that period. One operator after another was forced to give up the ghost because competition was moved in against him which he could not financially overcome.

This did not necessarily mean that the new man who was placed in competition to the older operator made a better financial go of it. Usually he did not. The reason? Because before very long he, too, became "machine poor". And because of his lack of experience, and especially his lack of capital, was soon forced to quit. It was a vicious cycle in many territories. Only this wartime period saved many of these men.

Therefore, this is the time for those now engaged in operating, at least for those men who want to continue operating, and there are a great many who do, to get a better commission basis arranged with their locations so that they will be assured a safer and better operating business for the future.

Not only does this differential between 50%-50% and 75%-25% mean an escape from becoming "machine poor", but it also means that the operator will be in a position to meet any and all competition in his territory in the future, as well as protect himself from that competition which will be moved in against him, because of a more solid and liquid financial condition.

It also means that he will be able to purchase the machines which are now getting readied for manufacture, regardless of what price will be charged for them, within

reason, and more rapidly amortize their cost. It also means that because of this he will become the favorite of the manufacturers and will be given first preference on every new machine introduced.

This is the time for the operator to so set himself up that he will never again fear the term "machine poor". And, furthermore, this is so easily arranged that it is irritating to hear one man in a certain territory blame another (who, in turn, blames him) for not being able to get together on a better commission basis. The most irritating part of it all is the fact that both agree that this is what is absolutely needed in their area to assure themselves for the future, and yet they won't get together to make it possible.

That being the case, the members of this industry must remember that unless they protect themselves today, unless they arrange for that ounce of prevention now, they will be faced, in the future, with the sort of competition, and the sort of business man who will push them out of the picture, just as many in this trade at present pushed their predecessors out of this industry.

The arrangements for a new and better commission basis, because of the great and logical need for such a new basis, is therefore a last chance necessity for this trade. The 60%-40% basis which has already been set up by some in this industry has so surprised these individuals with the greater profits it has produced, that they now wonder how they ever former by did without it.

There is no need, it is agreed, for anything but a 50%-50% commission basis on the exceptionally good locations. These equal about 1% or 2% of all locations on any route. The take on such locations warrants continuance of the 50%-50% commission basis. But, on the average location, the location which pulls down the income of all the route, on such locations there is a tremendous and immediate need for a new and better commission basis. From such locations, based on their income, the operator must arrange for either a 60%-40% or 75%-25% commission basis to assure himself financial liquidity for the future.

Most of all, the operator must remember that his overhead has risen far above 20% during this wartime period. (Many claim that it is far over 35%.) This alone requires that he cover this overhead rise with larger income. He, in most cases, has reached the limit of what income he can obtain from the locations he now controls. Therefore he must arrange to get this addition by changing his 50%-50% commission basis to a better and more practical as well as more profitable basis for his own future welfare.

This is the last chance. Right now - before the post-war manufacturing period gets well under way and all forget to remember that they cannot exist on the same income when competition becomes keener and new machines roll off production lines in such volume and with such speed as never before imagined by the members of this industry even in their wildest dreams.

START TO CHANGE YOUR COMMISSION BASIS IMMEDIATELY IF YOU WANT TO CONTINUE ON IN THIS BUSINESS SUCCESSFULLY.

#### SCHOOLS FOR COIN MACHINE MECHANICS

Probably the most popular suggestion ever made to this trade was when The Cash Box proposed that this industry create schools for coin machine mechanics thruout the nation.

Now, as the post-war manufacturing period is practically upon this industry, more and more does this become a great necessity, to assure this industry rapid and efficient expansion.

As is well known, there are many in this industry at present who wish to greatly expand their operations when the new machines become available.

There are others who foresee that selling the new machines to even present coinmen will require that these coinmen have mechanics capable of handling these new machines they will purchase.

All this means that schools for coin machine mechanics become an ever increasing and, in fact, an immediate necessity. These mechanics are today available from a wide variety of sources.

The average returned soldier and sailor (and there are reported to be over 28,000 of these who want work, unemployed at present) who has had some technical training in the services is sure to make a grand mechanic with the proper sort of schooling from experienced men in this field.

The average technical highschool student, who will be seeking an apprenticeship with some machine shop or factory would, too, be a very worthwhile prospect for this industry.

Furthermore, these men would be assured of earning more, and of advancing into better positions in life in this infant industry, than they would in almost any other industry they could enter.

There is also a demand from trade schools now training men to become auto mechanics, etc., for teachers from among the mechanics and engineers of this industry.

Coinmen who have approached trade schools, in various parts of the country, have been amazed at the interest shown by the faculty of such schools for this field.

These faculty members realize that here is a field requiring highly skilled specialists in not only electrical but mechanical and even electronic knowledge.

They can furnish such men by adding a course to their present curriculum which would prove both profitable to them and to the men engaged in this business.

The U. S. Government would be more than happy to pay the cost of training returned servicemen for mechanical pursuits. They could place these men in the recognized trade schools featuring such a course and be assured that they would have positions awaiting them on their graduation.

Everywhere in the industry there is a demand from coinmen for more and better mechanics. This need is so great that it can retard the progress of many now in the field if they do not obtain sufficient mechanical help.

Of what use is it for the average operator, or wholesaler, to plan for immediate large expansion and sales if he doesn't have the manpower to go along to keep those sales intact and those routes operating correctly?

In short, the average operator is not going to buy more machines than what his present force of mechanics can service for him. The average wholesaler is then held up on sales to such operators, regardless of how eager the operator may be to buy more equipment.

The manufacturer, too, is hurt. His sales are retarded. Surely the new man who will want to enter into this industry must instantly be supplied with good mechanical help - or he is lost.

Therefore, from every standpoint, this trade definitely and immediately requires that schools for coin machine mechanics be put into operation so that this industry can more rapidly expand and be better assured of its future growth.

Rumors are flying thick and fast thruout the trade. All these amount to very little when captured and tied down to any factual resultant. But, in the meantime, they disturb and distract.

This is one time, while WPB, WMC, WLB, OPA, and the various other Government agencies are in ferment, for the members of this trade to remain calm, cool and collected.

Whatever rumor is spread, simply upsets plans which have already been made, causes unnecessary expense by rushing man to visit manufacturers, who are themselves very busy getting interpretations and watching their war work, and also creates a suspicious atmosphere as if the entire market is crashing overnight.

When the right time comes the manufacturers will make official announcements. But until such official announcements are forthcoming, it is best for all to keep cool. Don't get excited because someone whispers that any certain manufacturer is already in production.

Should such be the case, whoever the manufacturer is, he will certainly announce this fact to all the trade so that all will know that he is now ready to discuss postwar with all coinmen.

Too many are phoning foolishly here and there to friends who can tell them no more than what they themselves learn from their daily newspapers. Not even the officials of the leading Government agencies are as yet in a position to make any truly definite statements regarding this business.

#### MARKET PRICES HOLD REGARDLESS OF RECONVERSION

Possibility That New Machines May Be Seen In Six Months Does Not Avalanche Used Market

The average coinman is of the belief, according to all reports, that the new machines will not be produced in sufficient quantity to affect present used machines prices to any great extent.

Furthermore, these men claim, the very fact that new machines will come rushing off the production lines should not interfere with the used machines business which will still be the biggest business in this

Others are also of the belief that the first new machines will not even so much as get trade-ins, and will therefore be used to further expand present operations while other machines will be moved down the line from the better locations.

There was a general belief some months back that the very first glimmerings of the possibility of new machines production would avalanche prices right down to rock-hottom.

This seems to have gone with the wind and the result now is that the trade is more of the belief that the used machines, as at present on the market, will remain for sometime to come without any great price changes becoming apparent.

This fact has met with much elation on the part of a great many who purchased routes and machines at present market prices. They now foresee a long run prior to any great depreciation having to be placed against this equipment.

As one leading coinman stated, "It proves all the more that today it isn't the machine as much as the location which gets the big price. Coinmen have come to realize this fact. They know that regardless of how many machines the manufacturers can produce this first year of production this will not greatly fill the tremendous backlog demand for new machines.

"Therefore we can rest assured that the used machines market will continue on just as important as it has always been for the past years since Pearl Harbor."

Others are of the belief that there is a possibility of the used machines market crashing down in prices when machines are out on the streets and production is well under way.

"But," one of these men admits, that won't be for at least another six to twelve months from now."

Special Committee in State Legislature Studying Constitutional Amendment to Permit Bingo and Other Forms of Gambling to Benefit Charities Only

Senator Summerill of Salem, N. chairman of the committee, said that the amendment will be permissive and that while it will not, of itself, permit gambling, it will empower the legislature to pass laws permitting it under the proviso that all profits go to charity or churches.

The amendment has not yet been drafted and Summerill indicated every effort will be made to close up any loopholes that might give it a broader construction than in-tended. Doubt has been expressed by other committee members as to how restrictions can be drawn around the definitions of "games of chance" and "gambling".

Actual wording of the amend-ment will be left to John B. Mc-Geehan of the Statutes Revision

(It will be interesting to all this industry, and will probably be able to set a precedent to note how the New Jersey legisla-ture defines "games of chance" as compared to "gambling" which has always been one of the sorest bones of contention for the members of this industry in all courts of the nation.)

OPA GIVES RECONVERSION PRICING FORMULA

WASHINGTON - The Office of Price Administration has just announced its reconversion pricing program as follows: Industry will have a choice of the higher of two alternatives in establishing its prices: 1) the 1942 level or 2) the 1941 costs adjusted upward for increase in the cost of materials and the rise in wages since that date, plus the 1936 to 1939 profit margin. If any firm in any industry finds that these prices are not adequate it may apply for relief.

For small manufacturers, and in connection with new models, prior approval of price ceilings will not be required. Such producers will merely have to file their

prices with OPA, which can, of course, reject them if they are too high.

FLORIDA SENATE VOTES PINBALL PAYOFF BAN

TALLAHASSIE, FLA. - Pushed thru by Senator Ausley of this city the bill to outlaw payoffs on pinball machines, including awarding of free games, went thru the Senate here by unanimous vote this past week (Thursday, May 11) and is now in the Assembly. The bill will affect operation of all machines where the outcome is unpredictable and

where the players may receive a payoff in any form from any source.

Ausley said the bill revises the 1937 law defining slot machines and that another bill will be offered shortly revising the 1941 pinball licensing law. He said that a "joker" in the 1941 law had, by implication, repealed the 1937 definition and allow-

ed the pinball machines to operate legally.

NEW JERSEY COMMUNITY WANTS \$100. PIN GAME LICENSE FEE ORANGE, N.J. - On the motion of Public Safety Director McHugh an ordinance was introduced to the Orange City Commission here calling for an annual license fee of \$100. for pin games, prohibiting them being placed within 500 feet of a school and barring use of them by children under 16.

HIDDEN TAXES ACCOUNT FOR 19% OF EVERY DOLLAR

NEWARK, N.J. - Coinmen here who are trying for a better commission basis bring to the fore the report of the New Jersey Taxpayer's Assn. that hidden taxes amount to 19% of every dollar spent. The association cited such tax sleepers as 2¢ on every loaf of bread, 4¢ on a pound of hamburger, 1¢ for every pound of sugar, one-third the price for a bottle of cough medicine, among with many other items. Coinmen all claim there are also many tax "sleepers" in the supplies and parts they buy and are urging agreement to get to a 60%-40% or 75%-25% commission basis.

WRITER OF FORTUNE SCALE TICKETS


NEW YORK - According to an item in the July issue of Pageant magazine, Charles W. Sutherland, newspaperman of the old New York World, was responsible for the legends


which emerge from the fortune telling ticket scales.

MIAMI PHONO ORDINANCE TO BE HELD INVALID

FLA. - The Miami city ordinance here limiting 1 phono to every 265 population will be held invalid by Circuit Judge Ross Williams who sent notification of this fact to city attorney J. M. Watson, Jr. The judge informed Watson that he is going to issue a writ of mandamus requiring the city to issue a vending machine license to the Miami Vending Co., Inc. This firm charged that the ordinance is discriminatory and unconstitutional. There are now about 700 machines operating in this city under this ordinance and the quota is still to be filled.

Judge Williams said he would hold the city has the power to regulate the machines as to tone, hours of operation and otherwise, or to prohibit them altogether, but may not grant the privilege of operation to a few persons. During the trial of the case Judge Williams required that types of machines be brought into the courtroom and played, so that he could determine if they could be regulated to tone.

H. Z. VENDING BUYS ADDITIONAL BUILDING OMAHA, NEBR. - Hymie Zorinsky of H. Z.
