NATIONAL PHONO NETWORK

The automatic phono is today the only completely national unit in the coin machines business. Some years back pinball also claimed this distinction and could be found in every village, town and city from coast to coast. But with the drives against pinball in certain states - this division lost its national unity. Neither are any other coin machines, with the exception of merchandise vendors, so nationally identified as a network. The automatic phono is the one machine which has won national acclaim and recognition. This network of about 400,000 machines in all the 48 states and in practically every hamlet in the country is today one of the most important musical stimulators in American history. It has created stars. It has also proven itself of more national importance during the first bond drives. It is a patriotic morale builder. It is everything that the phono operator ever hoped it would become. By not being a single guided unit it is a loose muscled giant, which if properly trained and controlled with the right sort of men at the head would prove one of the most powerful influences in American music. The music field is extremely important for it opens a great many possibilities to the trade in the post-war era. The locations it dominates are all-important. Plans are already being prepared by many to invade this field after the war for it will probably be the most lucrative of all. Complete care should be exercised by every member of the automatic music industry to protect the prestige it has won.

PHONO SERVICE TIP

If you are losing a lot of volume on a remote installation - the cause may be sub-standard shielded wire. Since new wire is hard to obtain, try this short cut: connect shielded wire across voice coil instead of at the amplifier. Use 75 ohm volume control at remote box if you make this change.

PARTS & SUPPLIES

There are still large stocks of parts and supplies in the warehouses of a great many firms in this industry. These have never been catalogued. A great many of these parts are therefore doomed to oblivion. It is our hope that former appeals we have made in this regard have been heeded by many and that these men have listed these parts and supplies if just for the benefit of their own inventory control systems. Such lists should be featured in The Cash Box as was done by The Vending Machine Company of Fayetteville, N. C. Transformers, power packs, motors, tubes, bulbs, locks, wire, cable, in fact all types of parts and supplies grow more valuable with each passing day. You may help a fellow coinman in distress who may have machines idle because of lack of certain parts which he is seeking if you list your parts now.

ARCADE DROP

Arcade take dropped this past holiday season and continues low as we enter into the New Year. This is mainly attributed to the expenditures made by the public for holiday shopping as well as adverse weather conditions prevailing thruout the East, where this drop is most apparent. But, as reported here once before, old timers in the arcade field consider this more or less a "seasonal" drop and claim that the take will come back stronger than ever once the holiday season is forgotten and the weather rights itself somewhat.

C.P.L. MONTHLY

Suggestion from noted coinmen have come to us recommending that The Confidential Price Lists be published but once during the month and in more elaborate and permanent form. This sounds good to us. 7 TO AVERAGE LOCATION

Some years ago the writer made it a point to report how the number of machines continued to grow on the average location, as the years went by. To be found in the average location today are: phonograph (or other music system; telephone or remote), a scale, cig machine, game or two (sometimes more), postage stamp vendor, peanut, gum and possibly another bulk merchandise vendor, counter game or two, and sometimes a foot vibrator and other service machine. The average today is 7 machines which shows a closer concentration given to each location by operators.

EQUIPMENT SCARCITY

As predicted some issues ago, equipment scarcity now beginning to make itself felt in all divisions of the industry. And, as equipment grows more scarce, The Cash Box becomes more proud of its far-visioned policy of allowing free ads with each subscription. With salesmen practically out for the duration and the few who are traveling not reaching into the hinterlands anymore (because of gas and tire rationing) the average coinman needs an economical outlet wherein he can advise the rest of the trade of what he wants to buy or has for sale or trade. We also know that the greater majority of coinmen cannot afford the more expensive advertising methods. The Cash Box by allowing free ads is bringing much equipment to light and doing so with the greatest speed known to this industry because of its first class mailing as well as its brief and digested form of reporting.

DISTRIB'S LETTER

We received a letter this past week from one of our leading distrib which we feel is worth reporting. This gentleman explains that in his belief we shall find sound-on-film machines gradually become predominant after the war. He also believes that unless much eastern territory opens that the pins are more or less in the background of this industry's achievements. And that with the \$100. license it pays rather to run 4 and 3 and dubbells than single bells. He also made a few other observations which definitely prove that leaders like himself are doing a lot of post-war thinking and planning - a very healthy sign for this industry. We could tell him that one distrib explained to us there was a sound-on-film machine with complete selectivity, larger screens, and using Television patents more than one screen could be featured on a location off the same mechanism which would also be able to play records and that wall and bar boxes would also be used and also that the larger film companies would become interested because such a development would bring them in and that would mean much lower priced films. Yet, as this distrib stated, "The cost will probably be very high and therefore I can't see how such equipment can be operated for a nickel play." Anyway, it's something to think about.

TUBES CUT

Radio tube production has been cut once again. This time from 327 types to 120. An old tube will be required to be turned in for every new tube purchased beginning sometime in February.

55 MILLION JOBS

Frightened at post-war prospects? Are you worried about a big drop in employment right after the war and very great, tho temporary, depression to follow? This is already being planned for by America's leading business men who figure on 55,000,000 post war jobs. The plan is backed by all U. S. agencies. This peace planning group is known as "Committee for Economic Development". If you employ people you will probably be approached by one of the thousands of district offices being planned. To achieve this employment object the nation will have to produce an annual output of between 130 to 150 Billion dollars or about 35% more than in 1940, our last peace year, when the national income was about 100 billion dollars. All these plans for continued better business should be carefully studied and backed by coinmen.

RAISE PAY

1300 employers in New York and New Jersey appealed to the WLB (War Labor Board) to raise pay of employees in the \$16. to \$30. category - since all salaries have been frozen. 650 such applications have already been approved by WLB in the past two months. Main purpose of raising pay is to help eliminate labor pirating. But, in the meantime, it does mean more money in player's pockets and that is most important to all coinmen.

THE C.R.R.

The Confidential Record Report is already being acclaimed by the trade. It is the most complete, chronological report of the new recordings ever attempted. Already it has stirred much interest in the smaller record manufacturer. Tho the "big 3" have more or less a monopoly on the "big games" the smaller manufacturer has been known to bring out hits. These should be made known to the trade, as well as all records they produce. Note that in some of the hit numbers listed in the C.R.R. there are as many as 7 and 8 records listed by various manufacturers and graded according to coinphono tests whereas no other publication even recognizes their existence.

NEW RECORD FIRM

Robbins Publishing Company, music publishers, are readying to go into the record business using the label "Lion Records" from Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's famous Lion trademark. MGM is understood to own 51% of Robbins' stock but are not backing the record venture. Principals involved are Jack Robbins and Abe Olman.
