Super Famicom Software

By The Unknown Gamer

Unless you've been living in a cave these past few months, you're probably aware of the impending arrival of Nintendo's Super Famicom 16-bit game system in the U.S. This system was released November of last year in Japan: the first 300,000 units selling out im-

The U.S. release is still slated for September 1991. Expect this rollout to parallel the introduction of the Game Boy - a big preview to the retailers at the upcoming June Consumer Electronic Show, followed by lots of fun media hype and marketing rap.

One advantage the new Nintendo system will have over its direct competition, the Genesis and the TurboGrafx-16, is massive support by third-party licensees. All the major NES game producers will be joining this party, and, of course, a library of titles will already exist in Japan ready for conversion to the American version of the Super Famicom. Here's the lowdown on what we've played so far.

Super Mario World (Nintendo) -

This was one of the first two releases for the system and undoubtedly will be the biggest seller. This Mario possesses larger characters (just check out the size of the Bullet Bob in the screen shot below!), multiple-scrolling backgrounds. and incredible sound and music. Mario also has a dragon pal, named Yossie (at least in the Japanese version) that he can ride or use as a springboard. We were blown away by the echoing sound effects when Mario is in a cavern and the transparent graphics at the

ghost house (notice how you can see the house through the clouds in the screen above).

F-Zero (Nintendo) - Call this "Rad Racer '91" - and then forget the comparison. This outtasight futuristic hovercraft race features four different vehicles, three skill levels, and a multitude of tracks to choose from. You've got to win each race to continue to the next. This cart has some great background scrolling, and the explosions when a car crashes are spectacular.



On your mark, get set...

Final Fight (Capcom) - This hot arcade title has been perfectly reproduced for the Super Famicom. Your girlfriend has been kidnapped by some Bad Dudes (oops, wrong game), and you have to use all your martial arts expertise to get her back alive. Every level and move from the coin-op is in the home version. We expect this one to be a hot seller.



More to Come

Look for extended coverage of the Super Famicom in future issues of Game-Pro, including news, reviews, and previews of what is sure to be the hottest game system of 1991.

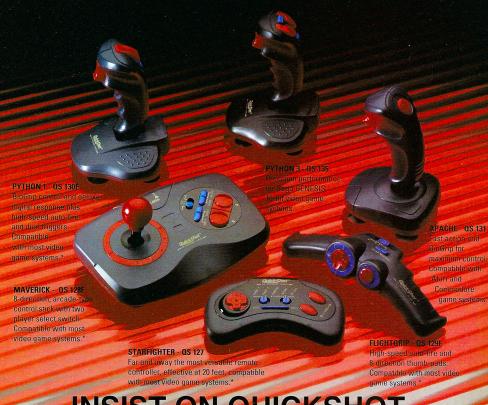

R360 revolving jet simulator, and Atari's hot on the wheels with Race Drivin.

R360 (Sega)

Alright jet jockies it's time to join the ultimate arcade air force. The R360 is more like an amusement park ride than a coin cruncher. 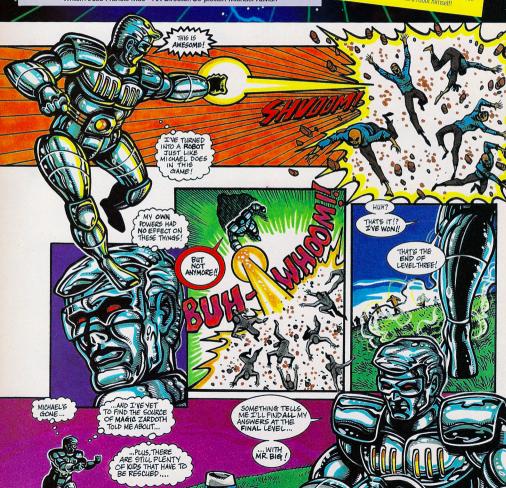

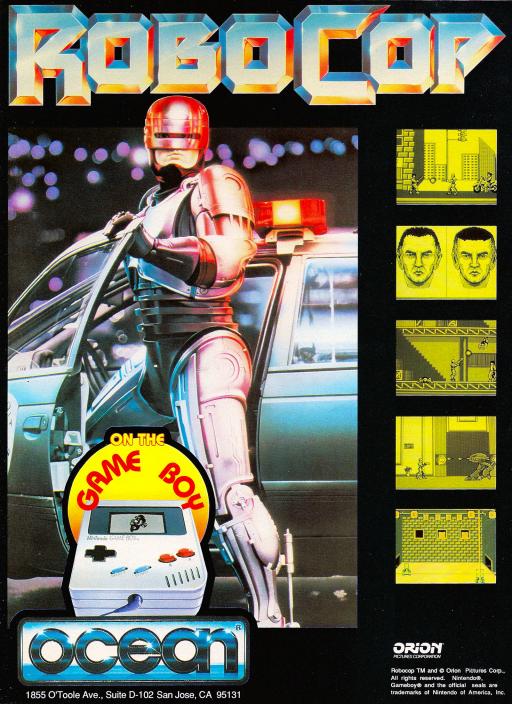

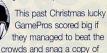

Shelling Out the Action

Shredder has abducted news reporter April O'Neil and every die-hard TMNT fan knows she's the only person who can bring Raphael, Leonardo, Michaelangelo, and Donatello out of their shells. The Turtles are determined to save April, put an end to ole' Shred-head's worthless existence, and in the process restore their radical rodent martial arts master. Splinter, to his normal human self with the Metal One's Life Transformer Gun.



Shredder's waiting!

The heroes in a half shell track Shredder across five incredibly tough levels of turtle-stompin' action through the

streets and sewers of New York City and into Shredder's horrific headquarters, the Technodrome. You have to play each of the four Turtles one at a time, but you can switch among them any time. Each Turtle has his own life line, and if it runs out vou're captured!



The action's in the sewers.

Most of the action in this one-player adventure is displayed in a side view perspective inside sewers and buildings, but in order to find these you stroll the streets via an overhead, bird's eve view.

PROTIP: Explore the buildings in any order. The only dead ends are buildings 10. 11. and 16.

PROTIP: The large building in the center of the man is a terrific snot to power-up with pizza between excursions into the caves. You can also rescue a fallen comrade in the passageway under the destructible blocks.

Turtle Power

Naturally, they use the weapons they're famous for, but you can add to their arsenal by grabbing a limited supply of special throwing weapons such as boomerangs and shurikens. Other helpful items that pop up occasionally include energyrestoring pizza, rope for crossing the gaps between buildings, and an item called "Mr. Invincibility," which makes you temporarily indestructible.

PROTIP: To destroy the Big Mouser stand directly under his steel jaws, use Don's Bo, and hold down Up and push B continuously.

Those Dam Bombs

If the world's most fearsome floating fighters successfully rescue April in the first level, they find out that Shredder has set eight bombs to blow the Hudson

River Dam sky-high. In Level Two that makes swimming not sword-fighting skills a must.



Find the bombs or it's turtle soup.

PROTIP: At the start of the underwater section, proceed right and disarm Bomb



One. Swim up through the first passage to get Bomb Two. Go back down and right to Bomb Three. Then head up and Bomb Four is to the left. Next, go right to Bomb Five. Up and then right leads to Bomb Six. Go down, then down on the right side, and you find Bomb Seven. Finally, swim down on the left side, then head right to Bomb Eight.

PROTIP: If your oxygen timer is about to run out, which automatically drowns vour entire team, select the weakest Turtle and commit Turtle-cide. That way vou only lose one Turtle and the bombs you've disarmed remain inactive.

Keen on Truckin'

The good times really roll in Level Three when the fab four burn some rubber in their Party Wagon. Armed with Anti-Foot

Clan Missiles and a rapid-fire Vulcan Cannon, the boys must search through the Big Apple to find Splinter, who was kidnapped while they were off saving the dam.

Four you can cruise after Shredder in the Turtle Blimp - if you can find it. It's somewhere in JFK International Airport, but you'll have to fight through the Clan again to reach it.

Techno Tough

In Level Five, Shredder's getting scared you're close to the Technodrome, which is hidden deep within one of four caves. But if you fail the first time around, its location changes every time you play.

Enter the Shredder

The final big brawl broils inside the Technodrome with laster totin' rocket

TMNT is a good blend of side view fighting and overhead map tracking that ought to keep your fingers busy. However, it's got a few dents in its shell.

men and miniature mechanical dinosaurs with whip-lash tails lurking around every corner. All paths lead to the Turtles' archnemesis, that "Edward Scissorhands" reiect. Shredder.

PROTIP: To beat the Technodrome tank wait until the laser switches off, then iump on the treads and disable the two mini-guns. Now, concentrate on the eyeclops radar, but look out for Foot Soldiers.

PROTIP: When Shredder attacks, jump onto the right ledge, duck, and use your weapon to knock him away every time he tries to leap onto the left platform. A special weapons such as the Triple Shurikens works great!

The absence of a multi-player option detracts from the whole concept of Turtle togetherness, the overall action is just average, and it's nearly impossible to finish with only two continues. Also, although the Turtles look cool, the Foot Clanners' graphics are a little weak.

Despite these drawbacks, however, Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles will rank as one of the top-selling NES carts of all time. What gives? Turtle power, dudes. When you're hot, you're hot. Cowabunga!

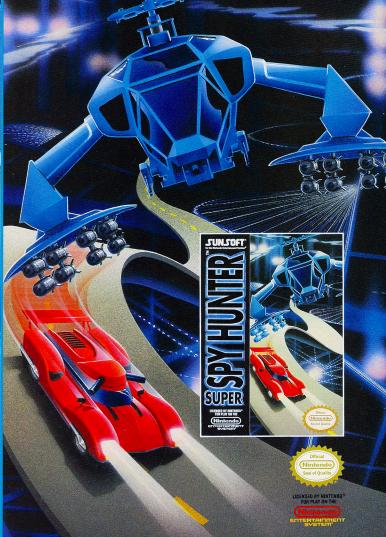

Dick Tracy made his debut on newspaper funny pages way back in the 1930's when "Pretty Boy" re-

ferred to a gangster named Floyd not Warren Beatty. Although this good-looking, sinale-player Genesis copper cart from Sega is closer to the 1990 movie than the comic, it still pits Tracy against his classic criminal counterparts including The Brow, Itchy, and the infamous Big Boy.

You get six stages, three scenes each, of take-no-prisoners shoot-em-up action. However, if you're gonna walk around in a yellow coat with matching hat, you'd better be tough, and although Tracy's definitely no pushover he isn't going to knock you outta your socks either.

Scene of the Crime

Tracy features a unique gameplaying perspective that makes you shoot long distance as well as up close. The action scrolls horizontally as Tracy marches along the sidewalk or drives through the streets. Mobsters sneak in from the left and the right of the screen, but some open fire from "across the street," that is, towards the top of the screen.



PROTIP: During the car chase, shoot mobsters as they peer out car windows before they fire back.

To fend off the mobsters you've got standard issue weapons, a knockout punch and a pistol. But to hit the goons across the street, you whip out an awesome tommy gun with unlimited ammo. Hold down the fire button and you see bullet holes rake across the buildings, shatter windows, and pop fire hydrants. The high degree of interactivity makes you want to blast everything in sight just to see what happens.



The tommy gun's a blast!

PROTIP: When you run into a crowd, know who to shoot first. Mobsters dressed in yellow are more accurate than those in blue. Snipers in elevated positions pull the trigger before gunmen on the ground.

The gunfighting gets heavy but just short of intense. The downside is Tracv's poky-paced walking; it'll drive the impatient crazy.

PROTIP: Listen carefully during Stage 3 and you'll hear the Brow set his bombs before he appears.



Target practice: Think fast!

Survive the shootout and you get a fun Bonus Stage shooting gallery where you try to hit the hoods and not the civilians.

An Open and Shut Case

Dick Tracy seems simplistic at first, but give it time and it grows on you. However, hardcore fans of lone lawman shootem-ups might prefer to step into the future with ESWAT. It's more challenging with snazzier graphics, rougher bad guys, and tougher boss stages.

less, god-like Galactus to wander the universe alone on his super surfboard. Arcadia Systems' Silver Surfer may doom NES shoot-em-up lovers to a similarly bleak fate.

In this outrageously intense shooter, the Surfer must seek out six pieces of an interdimensional "Device" that will open the universe to the vile hordes from the Magik Domain. His quest takes him through six murderous levels, five of which are guarded by his most fearsome enemies - Reptyl, Mephisto, the Possessor, the Emperor, and Firelord, Each level has three stages - either two horizontally scrolling sideview and one verticallyscrolling overhead view, or vice versa.



The beast can be overpowering.

Silver Surfer is a NES marksman's nightmare! The Surfer cruises on his cosmic board and kind of bowls power blasts at his enemies. You'll battle seeminally endless waves of tanks, monsters, mutants, ghosts, bats, and robots. Opponents always attack in groups, most take several hits to destroy, and none of them are slow. Robo-guns and traps are everywhere. And be careful not to crash into the scenery.

PROTIP: In addition to creatures and the mobile machines, you can destroy ANY stationary weapon that shoots at you.

This cart is easily one of the toughest shooters around, but at least the graphics are great and the sounds really cook. Use slow mo, turbo fire, prayer, or anything else you've got! It's all recommended. Oh yeah, set aside a few weeks to play. There are passwords, but not all the stages give you one.

PROTIP: If your blasts can't penetrate an obstacle, you can't fly through it.

Earth's defense computer has been invaded by a wildly prolific virus. Mutating like wildfire, the

virus is now heading straight for the program which controls all nuclear weapons. If it isn't stopped, well, in a nutshell it's bye-bye Mother Earth!

To Err Is Computer

There are two sources of hope - Colonel Scott O'Conner (a computer expert) and a newly developed device, the Image Transfer System, which can turn a human mind into raw binary data and input it into a computer. Risking his life. Scott volunteers to act as a human guinea pig and test the Transfer System. Oddly enough, once he's fed into the computer Scott takes on the form of his great grandfather, Danjuro, the famous Kabuki actor.



Lost in computer-land

Monkey-Man

You may wrinkle a brow at Kabuki's storyline (it earns a ten for bizarre originality), but once you dig your heels into the game-play of this single player adventure, it won't matter. With the speed and agility of a monkey you can jump, swing, kick, punch, turn somersaults, and climb your way through the six rounds of dual-scrolling madness. And, you won't have to break your back trying to master the moves.

Graphically Kabuki is standard fare. The colors are dull and dark but, then again, so is the inside of a computer. The enemies on the other hand, such as the flame-spitting Squawking Heads, the Boomerangers, and the firebomb Pit Hounds, are anything but dull. Mean and

relentless, these enemies, and many others, crop up when you least expect it.



PROTIP: If there's a choice between running or climbing, climb. Though it isn't always safer, it is faster, and it enables you to avoid the many conveyor belt platforms found throughout Kabuki.

High Tech Tresses

Your main weapon, a long, wild mane of hair, is one of Kabuki's coolest features. More than just a lovely set of locks this hair is the next best thing to a sub-machine gun. With a quick flip of the head it swoops forward with the force of a bullwhip and, with the exception of the level bosses, eradicates any creature in just a few lashes



PROTIP: You don't have to run after Round Boss number one. He bounces around a lot, but eventually he moves to the center. Also, he kneels down just before he throws flames at you, so be prepared to jump over the flames. Then move in and attack aggressively before he bounces away.

Bombs Away

Not all of your fire power is in your head. In fact there are five explosive-type weapons available, and you earn one each time you successfully complete a level. Destroy certain enemies and you get computer chips which power up these



weapons. For head-to-head combat a swift whack of the locks packs more punch than any other weapon, however, there are situations where the Chip-powered weapons come in quite handy.





PROTIP: As you the climb the blue platforms at the end of Round Two, you'll come across lireball-shooting wall fixtures. You can easily eliminate them with one or two blasts from your Fusion Gun.



Gettin' nowhere fast on a conveyor belt.

Va-Va-Ka-Boom

Be glad that your guns don't totally obliterate everything, it forces you to save them for those unforeseen situations when you really need 'em! For instance when an enemy is positioned above you it's almost always safer to jump up from a short distance away and fire a blast than it is to jump up to the enemy and use your hair. Of course there is a small catch: many times the closest place for you to stand is on a conveyor belt, then you've gotta' be swift.

Battlin' with the big wig level bosses is a prime time to have spare ammo, too, although Kabuki's nifty trade feature enables you to change Chips into Energy at any time during the fight. However, this is the only time you can use this feature, so plan ahead and keep your ammo supply up to par.



PROTIP: You need lots of Energy to make it to the top of the "circuit board" in Round Two. To build up your Energy and Chips run up the first two platforms and eliminate the three Squawking Heads, taking care to duck under their fireballs so you don't lose your existing Energy and Chips. You can easily repeat this process four or five times and still have enough time to make it through the remainder of the stage.



PROTIP: Eliminate Boomerangers to earn 1-Ups in Round Four.



PROTIP: Use a couple of sticks of Dynamite to blow up the two flying eyeball creatures that protect Stage Four's Boss before you attack him. Then, use the remainder of your Dynamite on the Boss while he's on the ceiling. Once you're out of dynamite you can't reach him, so lure him off the ceiling. To do this, stand beneath the white spot on the top of his head, wait for him to shoot his ray, then jump out of the way before it hits you. After three ray shots the Boss jumps down off the ceiling — here's your chance to run in and slash him with your hair.

It's a long and complicated journey to the top of the silicon heap they're calling a defense computer, but it's well worth it. The action in Kabuki Quantum Fighter is consistently hot, with frantic, invigorating music to match. The hair-weapon feature is not only imaginative, it's much more fun to use than an ordinary gun. The only thing that drags this adventure down is the painfully long and slowly scrolling storyline. Other than that, Kabuki Quantum Fighter will wig you out!

From somewhere beyond the stars came a race of half-alien, halfmechanical creatures now

known as the Metal Mechs. At first, they seemed to have peaceful intentions. Guess what? Now they're planning to wipe out the human race! Only one man stands between the Metal Mechs and Earth: Tony Martin. To save mankind, Tony must pilot a captured alien vehicle called a "Mech" and use it to destroy the invaders.

Familiar Territory

The first thing you'll notice about this cart is its similarity to Blaster Master (by Sunsoft for the NES). Both games pit man and machine in an alien-blasting shootout against all odds. Metal Mech, however, outshines its predecessor with more features and much larger areas to explore!



PROTIP: Make maps of Atlantis and Alien City (Levels 4 and 5). It's very easy to get lost in there!

Metal Mech's graphics are detailed though not very colorful. What makes

Metal Mech a treat for the eyes is the high-quality animation throughout the game. For example, in the Level 2 Towers, even the slime on the wall moves. The Mech itself is smoothly animated as it walks, and the "death" sequence it goes through is simply unbelieveable!

The sound, on the other hand, isn't quite so perfect. The background music isn't bad, but it practically disappears beneath the noisy sound effects.

Mechanical Moves

Metal Mech's one outstanding plus is its high degree of interactivity. As either Tony or the Mech, you can "play" with almost anything you see. T.V. screens, fire hydrants, and beat-up cars are all at the mercy of your blaster. Trees, chain-link fences, and vine-covered walls are all tests of Tony's climbing skills. Sometimes it's fun just to go around trying different stunts!



PROTIP: To travel quickly and easily through the City (Level 1), jump on the backs of the Catapults. You can't be hurt as long as you stay there.

The Mech itself is easy to handle, although mastering the art of accurate jump-

ing can take some time. The only real problem occurs when you eject Tony from the Mech. Every time you eject, you select the next weapon (if you have more than one) in your arsenal. This becomes annoying very quickly, especially when you're in the middle of intense combat.

First Time's the Charm

Metal Mech can seem extremely tough at first. You may find yourself spending hours annihilating alien 'bots as you search for the Level Keys that get you to the next level. Once you know the keys' locations, however, most levels are a cinch the second time around.



PROTIP: The Level Key for the City is to cated in the sewers. Watch out for the deadly rats! They drain Tony's health rapidly.

After you've played the cart for a while, the only extremely difficult part of Metal Mech is the Alien Queen's Mothership (Level 6). On this level, you control a large-scale Tony, using his jetpack and his sonic boomer to make your way through the Alien Queen's maze. Once you find her, you'll have to bust some pretty slick moves to destroy her and finish the game.

PROTIP: In the Alien Queen's Mothership, avoid enemies at all costs. They can kill Tony with just one hit!

Mech Tests Your Mettle

Metal Mech is an excellent game. If you like Blaster Master you'll certainly love this cart.

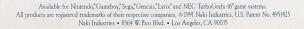

North and South is the first American history simulation to come to the NES. It isn't as com-

plex as other games in this genre, but there's plenty of strategy and detail to keep military history buffs happy and challenge most video gamers.

Now you can refight the Civil War to either preserve the Union or help the South rise again. Challenge the computer or fight a partner. The overall objective is to wipe out the other side's army by mastering four different game play sections: the Strategy Map, the Train, the Fort, and the Battlefield.

History in the Making

You begin play by selecting one of four Civil War years (1861-64), choosing each side's skill level, and activating random options such as weather and Indian attacks. Then you move on to the Strategy Map, the most important part of North and South, where you make the big military decisions that separate the generals from the corporals: should you attack a fort or take over a territory to cut off the other side's cash flow?

On the map states appear as territories controlled by the Confederates or the Union; some are neutral. At the beginning of each turn you position soldier icons (1 icon = 1 cannon, 3 cavalry, and 6 infantry units) to capture enemy holdings or occupy unclaimed territories.



Use the strategy map to maneuver your armies through the territories.

Then you invade the territory and the fun begins.

Train in Vain, Support the Forts

To buy troops, you need cash. Trains bring you cash, but they need tracks. One track runs throughout the map, so you try to control it by taking over states it runs through.

PROTIP: Intercept the train bringing cash to the enemy by taking over a territory in the middle of your opponent's portion of track.

If an enemy train rolls through your territory, rob it. Jump onto the moving train and fight your way to the engine before time runs out. Your opponent has 10 men who try to stop you (one at a time) by throwing knives or punching you out.



Head for the engineer...that's where you'll find the loot.

Find an enemy fort in a territory and you play "Capture the Flag," which is similar to robbing the train. Here you fight past 10 soldiers to nab the flag and control the fort.

You Gotta Fight for Your Right...

The Train and the Fort sequences are fun, but the best parts of North and South are the head-to-head battles. You face the enemy on a horizontal battlefield where you command the cannon, the infantry, or the cavalry.



PROTIP: Use the terrain; protect infantry behind rocks, hide cavalry behind trees,

PROTIP: When the Cavalry rides off one side of the screen, it returns to the onposite side, but for a few seconds they're paralyzed. Position Infantry or your own Cavairy a few paces from where the enemy reappears, then charge forward and easily defeat them.

Victory!

North and South is a hard game to categorize, as the best games often are. It's an arcade-style action game during the Fort and the Train sequences and a military strategy contest during the Battlefield and the Strategy Map parts. It's even educational! Mount your horse, grab your sabre, and...charge!

New York City's been taking a lot of hits in the think the Big Apple's bad

news now, it's positively rotten to the core in 1997!

That's the year Shadow Dancer, the long-awaited sequel to Sega's Revenge of Shinobi, forces Joe Musashi (a.k.a. Shinobi) out of retirement to once again wipe out Genesis-generated bad guys and save the world. But Joe hasn't spent his off-time lost in meditation; he's been busy training a crafty co-star - a big. white German shepard.



If you can make it here, you'll make it anywhere.

If you're a bonafide student of Shinobi start loosening up your "throwing" thumb; this sequel's a good one, featuring shuriken-tossing up the kimono. However, although its graphics and overall challenge are above average, it's definitely a notch below Revenge of Shinobi. And if you got off on the arcade version of Shadow Dancer, be forewarned: this cart only has a bare bones resemblance to the coin cruncher.

Dancing in the Shadows

Still popping brain cells trying to figure out what "Neo Zeed" means. Shinobi vets? Here's another headache for you: this time you battle the evil minions of "Union Lizard." These fanatics have taken a load of blondes hostage and utterly devastated New York City in the process. As Shinobi, you and your canine sidekick must rescue fair-haired slaves in every stage.

You get five rounds of basically horizontally scrolling action, although there's an outrageous elevator battle up the side of the Statue of Liberty in Round 3.



No sightseeing allowed on the Statue of Liberty.

Each round consists of either two or three good-looking stages - on streets of fire, across a bridge, up Lady Liberty, across a dark and deadly cavern, and through five murderous rooms - and a boss stage.



PROTIP: Round 2's Wall Monster boss has a big mouth.

PROTIP: Round 3's boss lady has one weak spot. Wait for her to roll the saw blade at you.

PROTIP: Round 4's flying Fire Wheel boss has a weak hub.

After you beat a stage boss, you get a rad bonus round - a dizzyingly-paced, vertically-scrolling dive off the edge of a building, where you plummet through space, tossing throwing stars down at a horde of ninias flying up at you.

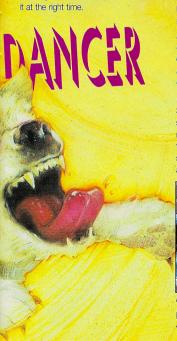
Points add up to extra lives, but you'll find a few 1-Ups and 2-Ups, too. There are three levels of difficulty, each of which increases the number of evil-doers you face.

PROTE: There's a 2-Up in Round 3 Stage 2. You must power up and then zap the lone Spinning Warrior on the extreme right side of the ground floor.

Fighting Tooth and Shuriken

Shinobi's got all his regular moves including the gravity-defying somersault, but his weapons are slightly different. Unlike Revenge of Shinobi shurikens are unlimited, but they still automatically turn into a devastating katana (sword) during close sha'ves. If infinite throwing stars is too sissified for you, check out the "no-shurikens" mode.

During every stage you can also cast a unique ninjitsu magic, but this time around, you only have one magic ability per stage which means you'd better use it at the right time.

PROTIP: The Red Ninjas are a big league pain, but remember they land, where you stand.

PROTIP: From Round 2 on, try saving your magic till you face the bosses. It cuts down two of their lives.

As far as video animal talent goes, Joe's dog is totally blue-ribbon. He barks when enemies are near, and he always "heels" after he attacks. He's easy to control, too. Simply hold down B till an onscreen dog icon flashes then release it, your woofer puts the bite on your enemies till you waste them or they beat him up. When that happens your pooch becomes a helpless pup, literally shrinking onscreen.

PROTIP: The dog barks at off-screen enemies. You can't get them until they apnear, but he can attack.

PROTIP: The dog is best against gunmen. Enemies with sharp edges make dog meat.

Shadow of Revenge

Shadow Dancer's a good sequel, but it suffers in comparison to Revenge of Shinobi. The regular enemies are deadly but they don't have the wicked moves of some of Revenge's bad guys. Also there are hardly any obstacles or traps to chal-

lenge your jumping skills. And unlike Revenge with its tricky maze at the end,

Shadow's conclusion features five rooms that are strictly linear.

PROTIP: In Round 5's Room 2, when you lace three or more Spinning Warriors, stay back and let them spin together. Three become one.

PROTIP: In Round 5's Room 5, a 1-Up sometimes appears just above the exit.

PROTIP: In Round 5's Rooms 4 and 5, try not to use Ninja Magic until the nasty crowd of ninjas shows up just before you reach the exit.

The graphics, too, don't quite have the overall pizzazz of the original. Most of the backgrounds don't jump out at you like Revenge's did. And taken as a whole the U.L. soldiers don't look nearly as slick as Revenge's band of assassins.

On the plus side, this tough cart puts up a good fight. The dog is a great ally. Some of the bosses look sharp and they'll make you work, too. The sounds are right on. The bonus stages are fast-paced, fun games within a game.

Conclusion. If, hack-n-slash ninja action jacks you up, go for either Reverige of Shinobi or Strider (see *GamePro*, February '91) first and then put the moves on Dancer. Shinobi masters, however, must try this cart. Even though the sequel doesn't rise above the original, Joe knows ninias.

to the Sega Master System. In this version of the arcade and Genesis title, Michael is once again out to rescue all the children in the world from the clutches of Mr. Big, the psycho mastermind of crime. The diabolical Mr. Big plans to brainwash the little tykes and use them as his slaves. But not if Michael has anything to say about it.

Michael's Moves

The J-Man's got some fancy moves in this one player version of the game. Although he's more limited than in the Genesis cart, Michael can still kneel, punch, kick, jump and hit, Moonwalk, spin on his toes, toss his hat, and strut his stuff during a Dance Attack.

PROTIP: It's hard to get Michael to do exactly what you want him to with the Master System controller, particularly when he goes down stairs. Try using a Genesis controller for better control – just remember you won't need one of the buttons at all.

PROTIP: The Dance Attack looks nice but doesn't do a whole lot for you. Stick with the basic moves for the best results.

Twist and Shout

To make it to the final confrontation with the nasty one you'll have to slip into Michael's dancing shoes and "Beat It" on down to Club 30, a Parking Garage, a Graveyard, an underground Cavern, and the technoid towers of Mr. Big's hideout. It's five levels, each with three different stages, of vertically and horizontally scrolling arcade-style action, plus a final confrontation with the dreaded Mr. Big.

To clear each stage you and Michael must find all of the kidnapped children that Mr. Big has stashed in some pretty tricky hiding places: behind doors, near windows, in back of gravestones, and even inside the trunks of cars. The faster you find the children the more points you

PROTIP: In some hiding places you'll find little Michaels. When you snag one of these you get extra Star Magic on your power bar. A good strategy is to learn where these are located and avoid grabbing them until you really need them.

Mr. Big's cronies are a mixed lot. Club 30 is packed with gun-toting con men in blue suits.

PROTIP: Watch for the blue suits that jump out of the windows from above. These are usually the ones toting guns. Bad guys leaning against the wall and trying to look casual often have guns also.



PROTIP: Beat the blue suits at the end of each stage by kneeling, pivoting left and right, and punching them when they come to you.

A gang of tough guys, some packing bats, roam around in the Parking Garage, as well as a nasty pack of Dobies whose bite is worse than their bark. PROTIP: The Dobies come in low and nip at your heels. Try to kneel and toss your hat at them.



PROTIP: To beat the Dobies at the end of 2-3 kneel just to the left of the red car, and keep tossing your hat.

Ghastly Zombies leap from tombstone to tombstone in the Graveyard and creep around in the underground Cavern with Spiders and laser-toting bad guys.



PROTIP: The best way to put Zombies six feet under is to hit Buttons 1 and 2 simultaneously to do a jump and punch move. If you punch them in mid-air they're done for.

A timer keeps you moving along, and you can redo your last move if you make a mistake. At later levels, there are rebound bumpers, secret passageways, and arrows that after the direction of objects you punt.

Kicky Tricks

Tricky Kick is an extensive and challenging game that's great to take on with an audience. It's one of those carts that's bound to stir up a lot of group participation - everyone has their own strategy. My only knock on this cart is that the text is poorly translated from Japanese. After driving for what seems like hours (there's no map and the scenery is incredibly boring), the first city appears on the horizon.

Hudson Soft Announces Super Famicom Products

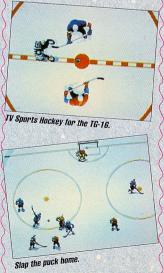

Data East and Taito Become Genesis Licensees

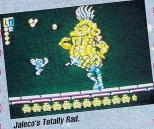
Longtime Nintendo developers, Data East and Taito announced plans to develop titles for the Sega Genesis. Crystal Palace, Midnight Resistance and Vapor Trail are the first planned 16-bit releases from Data Fast Taito has announced three releases for the Genesis so far: Snace Invaders 91 Rastan Saga II, and Sagaia. All three products are slated for the first half of '91.

Hal America is releasing Lolo 3 sometime this Spring. They promise this new Lolo is more complex than the two previous Lolos, British developer Gremlin Graphics is working on a TG-16 version of their U.K. hit, ImpossiMole. NEC thinks 'Mole' could be their next Bonk, Look for plenty of ImpossiMole marketing this Summer and Fall. Accolate is working on a baseball cart for the Sega Genesis. The game will probably have their well known Hardball title. Whether the game will be a recreation of the PC hit, or something entirely different, remains to be seen. Accolade is also working on a version of their PC hit, Star Control, for the Genesis. Star Control is the story of two warring nations, the Alliance of Free Stars and the UrQuahn Empire. The game is an action/adventure title with some strategy thrown in for good measure. Nintendo licensee T.H.O. continues its licensing ways with titles based on the Fox-TV cartoon. Attack of the Killer Tomatoes, and a game based on the popular Where's Waldo children's books. T.H.Q. also has a golf title for the Game Boy featuring Curtis Strange. Taxan is releasing Burai Fighter Deluxe for the Game Boy in April. It's a game designed "for the serious gamer," according to Celine Cebedo, Marketing Coordinator, Burai has plenty of fast action, multi-directional firing capabilities, and a password feature like most Taxan games. Sunsoft is coming out with a sequel to their hit, Spy Hunter, called (appropriately enough) Super Spy Hunter. They also

have an unusual NES cart entitled Euphoria, slated for a Spring '91 release, Texasbased Tradewest is releasing the longawaited Battle Toads, a cart designed by those British game masters at Rare Ltd This game has been three years in development so you can bet it will be pretty spectacular! Look for Ikari III: The Rescue, a follow up to the SNK 1986 hit, Ikari Warriors. A secret organization known as "Crime Ghost" has infiltrated every country in the world. They've kidnapped the President's daughter and are threatening to execute her in a couple of days if the President doesn't resign. Looks like a job for those incredible Ikari Warriors, Paul and Vince, SNK also has a version of the arcade hit. Touchdown Fever, coming to the NES in April. Hi Tech **Expressions** has licensing fever! Joining their 1991 NES product line are: Tom & Jerry, a multi-level adventure featuring that cartoon cat and mouse duo: The Count's Counting Game, starring Sesame Street's bloodsucking numbers expert: The Hunt for Red October, based on the Paramount Pictures '90 hit flick; plus Barbie (as in the doll) and Twin Peaks (as reported here first in December '90 ProNews). Hi Tech also has Dungeons & Ducks, a Game Boy cart featuring Daffy Duck. FCI continues their roleplaying ways with the announced release of Pool of Radiance, the second NES cart in the Advanced Dungeon and Dragons series, and Ultima: Runes of Virtue, a Game Boy title. Ultima is expected to be released in May, while Pool of Radiance is due Summer '91. Activision has announced three new games for the NES, Sword Master, Die Hard, and Ultimate Air Combat. Sword Master is a seven-level swords and sorcery action game featuring multi-lavered scrolling, Ultimate Air Combat features some great air-to-air and air-to-ground combat and 30 missions for junior combat pilots to complete. Die Hard lets vou play police officer John McClane, who must take on a gang of international terrorists who have taken his wife and others hostage in the Nakatomi Plaza building. Yep, it's based on the 1988 Bruce Willis action flick - one of our personal favorites, Yippee Caveh M - uh, vou know the rest. Jaleco sends gamers on a gnarly trip through the California under-

ground in **Totally Rad**, a multi-level adventure featuring incredible screenscapes (and some heavy duty spellcasting. The hero, Jake, has 12 spells at his disposal, including magic that turns him into a lizard, a lion, or an eagle.



Whomp 'em is the first NES title to feature a Native American as its central character. Soaring Eagle is a young Indian brave seeking totems for his magical pouch. He must travel through eight worlds collecting the magic totems that, in turn, provide Soaring Fagle with powers to fend off his enemies. Mysterium is the title of Asmik's first Game Boy title. This cart was designed by Maxis, creators of Sim City. Mysterium features 10 levels of darkened mazes. You're an apprentice alchemist who must mix precious minerals to make gold. The game has a 3-D view and a great combo of action and role-playing. You can look for it in May 1991. Ocean is working on an NES version of last summer's hit flick, Darkman. Parker Brothers has a version of their classic board game, Monopoly for the Nintendo Entertainment System. Acclaim/LJN have some blockbusters for the NES and Game Boy this year. The long awaited Double Dragon 3: The Sacred Stones is coming for your Nintendo this month, Also coming this summer from Acclaim are Terminator 2: Judgment Day, Smash TV (based on the smash coin-op from Williams), and Wolverine (the short-tempered, extremely dangerous Marvel superhero) for the NES, as well as The Simpsons and The Punisher for the Game Boy.

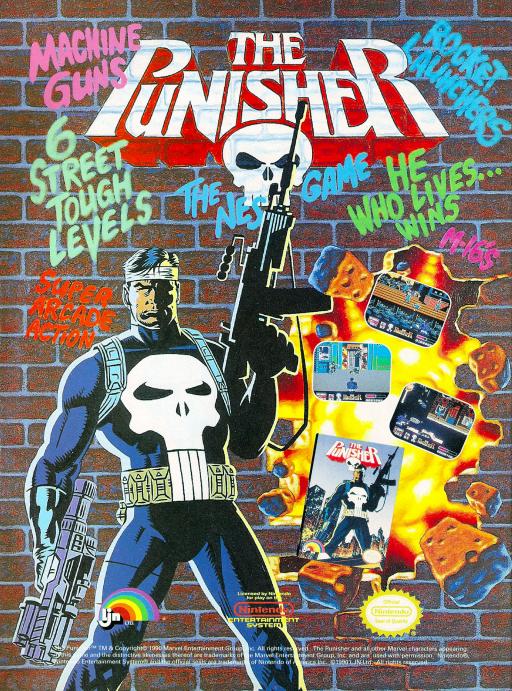
