FOREWORD

Perhaps the most outstanding subject among the nation's music coinmen at this time - is the music machine of tomorrow. Everyone seems to be most interested in what music will be like in the post-war period. The following is a concensus of the opinions, predictions and statements of music machine leaders thruout the country. NEW PHONOS MONTHS AWAY

All are more or less agreed that the first machines which will appear on the market will, in all probability, be the same units as last seen, prior to the stoppage of manufacture, with the only possible difference being - new cabinets. It also seems that all are agreed at this time that it will be some many months yet before even this sort of music instrument will appear on the market. All believe that with WPB ready to relinquish many controls (except for two priority provisions 1) that raw materials will first go to those manufacturers still engaged in war work and 2) that extremely necessary consumers goods will receive second call on materials the moment the war in Europe is over) that the actual production of coin operated equipment is as yet very far from realization.

POLL FOR SPRING 45

Sometime ago The Cash Box poll of leaders in this field revealed that these men did not expect to see new machines until sometime in the Spring of 1945. The meeting just held by the post-war planning committee of the auto industry seems to confirm this prediction. These leading industrialists do not believe that they will be able to produce new cars for at least six months after V-E day. Prime Minister Winston Churchill's statement that the European war may go into 1945 also seems to bear out this prediction.

ENTHUSIASM CONTINUES HIGH

But this has not withheld enthusiasm for new coin operated music equipment in the least. All are of the belief that the manufacturers already have experimental models of their post-war units pretty much completed, even the they will not be able to produce them for sometime after they receive the word that they can go ahead. None of the past known music manufacturers want to be left in the lurch and will rush machines to market, probably greatly similar to the last models they built, while completing tools and dies for their new models.

WIDER RECORD SELECTION

As far as the new units are concerned the general belief is that they may range from 20 to 40 record machines. The 40 record units will probably be 20 record machines playing both sides of each record. Should these come into being they are bound to create some new problems for the music coinman. He will have to get records (and probably pay more for these) where both sides have currently popular tunes, not just one side currently popular and the other any old recording as at present used for fill-in. Yet many do not believe that more than 20 to 24 records are necessary. Some even claim that wall and bar boxes should be cut down to the 10 most popular songs of the week.

PRICES

.

The general concensus seems to be that music machines will not be too much above pre-war prices. A possible increase from 25% to 35% is indicated at present. With such increase they will remain well below the present market price situation. Some even believe that the first phonos presented will be priced very reasonably so as to discourage too many others from entering into the manufacturing field. This will also allow the present known manufacturers to more speedily capture the market and also insure wider distribution. Combination deals, whereby coinmen will be able to buy a new phono plus remote control units, is also reported in the making. In this fashion the music operator will be obtaining a complete music system at a single unit combination price,

NEW MANUFACTURERS

There are also many reports of new manufacturers entering into the music picture. Some believe that these new firms may cause some hesitation on the part of buyers who will want to wait and see these new machines prior to committing themselves. Yet the majority believe that the old line manufacturer will rapidly forge to the front and that his knowledge and experience will prove too tough for most of the new manufacturers to overcome.

DISTRIB-OPERATING COMBINES

Also disturbing to many today are the distributing-operating combines being created thruout the nation. Large music ops are tieing in together and thereby creating chain operations. Some of these are not only impressive in size but may possibly prove sufficiently powerful and important enough to warrant and actually swing the distribution of the first new machines to their banner.

SEEK PROTECTION

To combat this many are working hard in their territories to arrange for location agreements and organizations to protect them in all possible fashion. They fear being left out in the cold when the first new machines arrive. These men want new machines to insure their locations remaining their locations. They want these new units as fast as they can possibly obtain them, and also at rockbottom prices. They believe that the time for a new deal for the music operator has arrived. They also realize that if their competitors get the new equipment into the territory first that they are going to suffer loss of locations. All this has caused a great deal of comment pro and con and is still continuing on a very heated basis.

ACCESSORIES MANUFACTURE

Many are also reported to be planning to enter into the music accessories manufacturing field. Some have already made quiet announcement to former distribs that they will be manufacturing wall boxes and other accessories for the music trade. These manufacturers are sure they will enjoy a lucrative business, especially in the early stages of the post-war period. Past successes in this field have encouraged many manufacturers, who were formerly disinterested in music, to enter into the accessories division of the music field.

SLOW PRODUCTION TO HELP USED MARKET

The belief is that new machines, when they do again begin to enter into the field, and this is not considering those first few thousand or so units that will be built up from inventory stock parts, will come in at a very slow pace, and that they will therefore not seriously affect general conditions. This belief causes the opinion that the used music machines market will continue importantly forward for many, many months to come. It is also believed that even after new music production is well under way that the used machines, the prices are expected to fall, will still bring many sales from this, as well as foreign countries.

EXPORT MARKET

The concensus is that the importance of the export field will grow greater each month after new production starts. This is born out by the fact that the first machines asked for by Canadian coinmen, who came back into the buying market the moment their government cut the rope withholding imports of coin operated machines, was for music equipment. The same is expected to prove true of the big British market. England has found juke boxes extremely profitable and coinmen there are expected to start a barrage of cables to this country when once again allowed to import, calling for music equipment.

ROUTE SALES

Also interesting at this time is the fact that tho the music trade is eager to get into post-war action and looks to the large music distribs to work closely with it, there seems to be a growing resentment regarding the fact that many distribs have begun to purchase routes. Sales of routes have increased tremendously these past few months. Prices being paid are considered fabulous by many. Many an operator has sold a route simply because he could not resist the tempting offer made to him. Others have actually gone out of their way to divide their routes and sell part to such buyers because of the high prices being offered. Whatever the effect will be in this matter, only the future will decide. But in the meantime many are wondering whether this will have an offect on the distribution plans for the future of the music machines industry. All the trade is carefully watching events in this direction and looking to the first concrete moves.

LOOK FOR ACTIVE ERA

Whatever the general result, the conclusion seems to be agreed to by all in the music machines field at present, that this division of the coin operated machines industry will prove the most hectic, the richest, and certainly the most outstanding in the post-war era. Music men are already girding themselves for the hectic and tumultuous post-war period. Many feel that they will have to be on their toes every second to make certain that they are not going to get caught short. Others claim that action has already started and that the first new units manufactured from inventory parts piles, possibly featuring new cabinets, will start the ball to rolling.

TAXATION

Many continue to be worried about taxation on music equipment in the future. They feel that since many cities are already obtaining large license fees that the possibility is, providing that new equipment is placed about in bigger volume than ever before, that this may have the effect of increasing taxes. Still others are of the opinion that with the war over many communities will cut down on taxes so that business men can proceed with greater freedom and make more risk investments to continue great employment. Some point to the fact that at present this nation needs more to continue the war, but once the war in Europe and the Pacific are finished, that the Federal government will not need as much money to continue on a healthy basis, and that a great many taxes will be removed. city and local community governments will then follow the lead of the Federal government in this case. Whatever the licenses fees may prove to be, music men generally are not too much worried about these. They are more worried about arranging for better commission basis with locations. They feel that the tax situation will be taken care of in the regular process of doing business and that at least a good share of such license fee will be passed on to the location owner.

RECORDS

The lack of records during this wartime period has angered a great many. There will be more record manufacturers than ever before, is the general belief. Also, music coinmen explain, many new stars are going to arise in the recording field when servicemen come home. These are not going to be completely gobbled up by the present record making firms and therefore new recording companies, with possibly the Bing Crosby and Harry James of tomorrow, can be expected to arise. Some deal should be made, the average music man believes, whereby this trade will be given greater consideration on all new recordings. Quotas for the industry as well as priority arrangements are suggested to be worked out with the large record manufacturers so that the music man will be fully protected regardless of the demand from the retail music stores. In the meantime some are of the belief that some of the bigger firms in the coin operated music field will be starting record making companies of their

"DREAM EQUIPMENT"

Of course, everyone continues to talk about 'dream equipment'. And everyone seems to have the 'lowdown' or the 'inside info' on what will appear on the marketyears after the war is over. Some say that music on wire tape will be a surety. The answer given most of these men is the lack of a library of such music and also the fact that should such machines become popular some arrangement for the music of such stars as Bing Crosby, Harry James, etc., will have to be made so that the operator can get the music of these popular stars on this wire tape. The general opinion is that the big record producers aren't going to release their stars to make music on wire tape or on anything else and create great loss for their own record Sales.

Many are discussing the possible importance of television. The average music man is intelligent enough to understand that television on a coast-to-coast hookup isn't going to become effective for perhaps ten to twenty years after peace is here to stay. Most of the men realize all the technical difficulties which have yet to be overcome. But, these men believe, that the manufacturers should begin to think about television and work closely with these firms so that such units can be incorporated into the automatic phonos at the right time, and thereby prevent any possible loss of popularity and revenue which might result with television going national.

FILM MUSIC

Many still continue to discuss music-on-film machines and believe that after the war is well over that this, too, should be better worked out by the manufacturors. Some believe that with selectivity and by combining with present record phonos, that music-on-film machines have every opportunity of succeeding in the post-war era. These men claim that the fascination of seeing the star in action is still very great and is comparable to the motion picture musical shorts which have been growing ever more popular. They also feel that these music-on-film producers should choose the leading stars and make better shorts than they are now producing.

APARIMENT MUSIC

Also up for discussion is the possibility of locating a hidden unit in the basement of large apartment houses (and even hotels) whereby wall boxes with individual speakers and volume control can be installed in the apartments (or rooms) on a regular monthly fee basis, payable in advance. Some also state that these individual volume control speaker boxes can be enclosed in beautiful cabinets to blend with the furniture of the apartments or the hotel rooms. Many are of the definite belief that this is a very great field for post-war.

REMOTE SET-UPS

Some suggest that much smaller and simpler mechanisms be used, which will be very reasonably priced, and that cabinet shells as well as wall and bar boxes be placed about over a large area, with the mechanism located at one central point.Some are of the belief that music-on-film machines can also be remoted showing individual pictures over a wide area by distributing screens from a central unit. Others claim that reduced in proportionate size,wall boxes can show the individual picture remoted off the central mechanism, and that this will step up music-on-film machine popularity and possibly create a new field for the trade. Such remoted action on the regular music mechanism is sure to save many dollars for the average music man, is the claim of the trade.

CONCLUSION

It is still best for the trade, in summing up all these opinions of leaders thruout the nation, to remember that the used machines market is as yet the one and only market.Furthermore, it will probably remain the only market for many months to come. Therefore, continuing to do business on this market seems most logical to everyone of the leaders in the music machines field. In addition, the words of Admiral Chester A. Nimitz from Honolulu, Oct. 1, 1944 should also be taken into deep consideration by all in this industry. The Admiral stated, "As we push the Pacific front forward an accelerated effort on the part of every person, man and woman, now on the job or who can take a job will be needed."

(Perhaps this will give many pause in thinking that new equipment will be released the instant the European war is over.)

NEW JERSEY ELATED OVER FAVORABLE DECISION GH COURT'S BROAD RULING ON BASEBALL GAME OPENS PATH **RETURN OF PINBALL. PRESS FAVORABLE, CLAIM THIS PART OF NATIONAL** TENDENCY TO MORE LIBERAL VIEW ON GAMBLING. PLACING PINS IN SOME SECTIONS. OTHERS AWAIT LOCAL INTERPRETATION.

NEWARK, N. J.-Attorney Charles Handler's victory in the case of Sterling Distributors vs. John B. Keenan, Director of Public Safety for this city, before this state's highest court, the Court of Errors and Appeals, has brought great elation to all coinmen thruout New Jersey.

The decision of Justice Bodine in this matter is considered one of the broadest ever yet handed down by the Court of Errors and Appeals. It opens the way to the placement of not only baseball, hockey and bowling games but also pinball machines.

The Paterson Sunday Eagle (September 23) headlined their entire front page as follows: "HIGHEST COURT RULES PIN BALL GAMES NOT GAMBLING". On page 3 of the inner section of this edition the paper headlined the page, "PIN BALLS LEGALIZED IN NEW JERSEY". Their sub-headline read, "Mechanically Operated Devices To Reappear In Stores, Taverns, Restaurants Under Latest Ruling".

The rest of this page was entirely devoted to the story regarding this favorable and broad decision by the Court of Errors and Appeals. It read in part, "Mechanically operated devices such as baseball, hockey, bowling, races, pinball, football and other sporting games may now be played in New Jersey by inserting a coin, according to the latest decision of the Court of Errors and Appeals — the final court of judgment in the state. This means that hereafter these machines cannot be classified as 'slot machines', the level-nandle pulling type.

"The law enforcement authorities are now prevented from further making arrests for having the machines in one's possession nor are the police and other officials permitted hereafter to confiscate machines and raid establishments. All this is a matter of the past.

"Owners of pinball games and other mechanically operated devices will be allowed to place these games in any and every location in the state, including taverns, hotels, eating emporiums, confectionery stores, stationery stores, as well as in clubs and amusement places.

With this latest ruling of the Court of Errors and Appeals, the pinball games and other mechanically operated devices become a legitimate business for owners to engage in and there will be no further prosecution from police heads and others.

The Paterson Sunday Eagle goes on for the rest of its tabloid size page to give more details regarding this decision. It also calls attention to the \$1,000 fines that were imposed in some cases and asks County officials what they are now going to do in this matter since these games were pronounced legal. It believes that one of the many coinmen is bound to make a test case of these fines.

The Paterson News, three days later, in its September 26 issue, composed its opening editorial in regard to this decision with a headline reading, "LIKE IT OR NOT TENDENCY TOWARDS A MORE LIBERAL VIEW OF GAMBLING GROWS THRUOUT THE COUNTRY".

In this editorial the Paterson News states, "The retired April Grand Jury which proposed off-the-track betting on horse races and won the approval of the county's chief law enforcement officer, isn't alone in its advocacy of recognition of existing tendencies towards gambling. The Court of Errors and Appeals, in its recent decision taking the illegal stamp off pinball games, recognizes the fact that while the machines themselves are not gambling devices, they may lead to some on-the-side wagering. The court's view is that some people will bet on anything."

This editorial then goes on to tell of Cleveland's plan to obtain some of the lucrative "take" from Bingo playing. It reports that Cleveland expects about \$40,000 annually from licensing Bingo.

As yet many communities thruout the state are without pins. Most of these are awaiting interpretaions from their local legal departments. In most cases the coinmen in these communities believe that decisions of their legal departments will be favorable toward the placement of all types of arcade pieces and pinball games. All of these communities are thinking of local license fees and in some cases are expected to be much larger than ever before proposed.

As yet coinmen in this city, largest in the state, haven't started to place pin games. Coinmen here are waiting for the coming elections this November. Others are eager to get going immediately. Many believe that regardless of the elections that they will be placing pin games in Newark, tho these will be the novelty type machines. Officials are stated to be favorable.

This decision is considered one of the most favorable to have been obtained by any of the Eastern states and compares to the Pennsylvania decision in many ways. Tho the Pennsylvania decision recognizes free play games and the New Jersey decision does not, the similarity of the decisions in other points is quite interesting. Demand for pins is already apparent thruout the state with many coinmen phoning distant parts of the nation to get the novelty type machines for resale purposes to those who are already placing these in their communities. Collections are not expected to be very great in the beginning, according to leading ops, but are expected to go up.



New Jersey Court of Errors and Appeals No. 223 May Term, 1944 STIRLING DISTRIBUTORS, INC. Complainant-Appellee

JOHN B. KEENAN, Director of Public Safety of the City of Newark, N. J., et als.,

Defendants-Appellants. Submitted May 1944 Decided Sept. 14, 1944 On Appeal from Court of Chancery For Defendants-Appellants, Philip J. Schotland, Charles S. Gansler.

For Complainant-Appellee, Charles Handler. The opinion of the court was

delivered by BODINE, J. The appeal in this

case is from a decree in the Court of Chancery restraining the Director of Public Safety of the City of Newark from confiscating certain so-called baseball games owned and leased by complainant.

The question for determination

was whether the device in question was a gambling device within the meaning of R. S. 2:136-2. State v. Brandt, 122 N.J.L. 488. The issue was tried in the Court of Special bessions and the determination was favorable to the complainant who then proceeded to final hearing in the court of Chancery and secured a permanent injunction as men-

tioned. The learned Vice Chancellor said "A fair of the device in question: "A fair example of all the machines in question is the 'baseball machine', which presents on a table a minia-ture baseball field. The player drops a five cent piece in a slot; the mechanism pitches a ball; the player presses a button which releases the bat and he may make a base hit, or better, or he may not. The dominant element that determines the result is chance, not skill. For five cents, the machine pitches 15 balls at four-second intervals and the game is over. If the player has average luck, he has made four runs.'

The coin which starts the mechanism is eventually spent. There is no free play nor prizes or a return of any money. The device is a game which those who want to play may do by purchasing the right. That players may bet on the outcome is not determinative, since bets may be placed by those who would on almost any occurrence. Since the game is not in the nature of a gambling device it does not fall within the ban of the statute, and because complainant's financial loss would be great had a court of equity not intervened that court had jurisdiction. Ruty v Huelsen-beck, 109 N.J.E. 273. The decree is affirmed with costs.

Displays of juke boxes have also been made in windows of leading stores in this city featuring youthful garments. From many parts of the nation similar reports have already been received.


THIS WEEK

The continued upward swing in collections was again very noticeable this past week. All equipment thruout the nation was reported going up in most cases. Here and there were scattered reports of collections remaining the same as the previous week and also a few very low percentage drops. But these had very little effect on the general upward trend. The increase as a whole, on all types of equipment, thruout the country, averaged better than 14%. This is the largest increase as yet reported. It is believed that from now on increase will continue.

Largest increases this past week were reported in amusement machines of all kinds with slots and consoles leading the parade. Pins came a close third and then arcade equipment. The amusement field therefore outdistanced the increase reported last week in the music machines. These latter were first to recover from the Summer slump. With amusement getting good play again action in this field, as far as sales and purchases are concerned, is expected to show rapid increase, too.

Also interesting were the good increases reported in the service and merchandising machine fields. Here new enthusiasm and optimism was noticeable. Many of the largest service and merchandise machine coinmen reported that the increases were truly surprising. This is an indication that in many sections more merchandise is becoming available. Also indicates that after the summer such units as scales are beginning to get better action.

Music increases were also apparent, tho not as great as this past few weeks, when the music field took the lead. Still music continues on ahead and from all present indications is bound to continue to lead the field to new records in collections for the coming Fall-Winter season of '44-'45.
