In addition to this special engineering building, Jack Keeney also will erect a separate office building for the general business of the firm. With these new buildings the firm will have more than three times the space and manufacturing facilities they now have at their present address.

JIMMY WALKER HEADS NEW MAJESTIC DISKS NEW YORK - From Majestic Radio & Television Company of Chicago comes news that the new subsidiary of the Majestic firm, Majestic Records, will be headed by New York's former Mayor James J. Walker.

Jimmy Walker will have complete charge of the firm which will sell popular recordings, according to Eugene A. Tracy of Chicago, president of Majestic Radio. This subsidiary was formed thru purchase of the Classic Record Company and other concerns operated by Eli Oberstein. Oberstein will join the new company in an executive capacity.

Rumor in the music machines field here is to the effect that Majestic will handle their new records thru their present distributors and dealers. The cointrade is therefore wondering whether this means they will not be given dealer's prices and will have to purchase these records from Majestic retailers.

Since the music machines men thruout the nation are boiling at the present record manufacturers over the fact that they are forced to buy more than 75% of their record needs from retail stores at top consumers' prices, they hope that Majestic will announce a real policy for the cointrade and play ball with them.

NEW YORK - Bill Rabkin, president of International Mutoscope Corp., this city, who handled the local coin machines drive for The National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, annual fund raising appeal, reported today, "The results were very gratifying". "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

NEED FOR NAT'L TAX COUNCIL GROWS DESPERATE

For more than two years now The Cash Box has been urging the members of this coin operated machines industry to get together into a National Tax Council. The need was great when The Cash Box first made this suggestion. It has grown greater right along. Today it surpasses every other need because there is now in action the greatest tax grab in all the history of the coin machines industry.

State after state, county after county, city after city, and village after village have been following in the footsteps of former tax grabbers. These tax bugs are biting deeper and deeper into the income of the average coin machines man. The coinman would like to protect himself from these biting tax bugs. But, as an individual, he has very little chance to prevent the bite. Furthermore, he hasn't the legal and other data required to minimize or at least offset the revenue amount desired by these tax biting legislators.

Just this past week the head of one of the largest eastern phonograph operators associations phoned The Cash Box long distance asking for information with which to prevent a great increase in their phono license. As much information as was available was given to him.

As managing director of this large organization he has been urging his members to follow the lead of The Cash Box and help create a National Tax Council. Now, more than ever, he sees the need for such a council. He is backing The Cash Box with everything he has to help get such a council started. "Because", he says, "the need is now desperate."

Here are some facts for every coinman in the nation to consider as to why the need for a National Tax Council has grown really desperate.

A bill is now in the state legislature at Indianapolis, Ind., to license almost every type of coin operated equipment. Some of the license taxes asked are beyond what the machines can pay when normal times once again return. (Coinmen should remember that what seems picayune to them now in these tax grabs will look many, many times bigger when normal conditions again prevail after the war.)

In Columbia, S.C., where the Governor of this state reported sometime ago that he was ready to organize a state constabulary to clean out slots, there is now a bill pending to raise the license tax on automatic phonos from \$10 to \$50 per year. A 500% increase over the present license fee. It means that the first dollar that is earned by every phono in this state must first go to pay for this yearly license fee. How many locations can stand for that sort of grab when normal times return to South Carolina?

In Charleston, W. Va., where coinmen have been going along rather good, a new occupational tax is now being placed into effect for vender operators as well as a yearly license fee on each of the units they operate. Here is great need for a National Tax Council to step in and help with this situation. The legislators in this state are taxing the very smallest earning equipment in this industry.

Weeks ago The Cash Box rushed a plea to the trade to please send all information of all types of taxes in effect in every village, city, county and state and in the nation for the benefit of Tennessee coinmen. The men in Nashville had heard thru the grapevine system that the legislators in this state were getting ready to tax them to a fare-thee-wejl.

The result is that there is now a bill pending in the legislature of this state that is asking for 12 1/2 PER CENT OF ALL GROSS RECEIPTS FROM EVERY TYPE OF COIN OPER-ATED MACHINE.

That means that 12 1/2 cents of every dollar that every machine in this state takes in must first go to pay this state tax. This leaves the operator with only 87

and 1/2 cents from every dollar he takes in, gross. And that means a tremendous cut NET INTAKE.

It means that hundreds of machines will disappear from locations in this state when normal times return. THEY CAN'T OPERATE UNDER SUCH AN EXORBITANT AND CONFISCA-TORY TAX LOAD.

And that's only a beginning. Other state legislatures are watching just what will happen in Tennessee. The tax magazines which are circulated among these men will blazon the news out to them should this tax bill succeed in getting thru the legislature.

There is no doubt in the wide world that Tennessee's coin machine men would give up a lot of money right now for the services of an expert and experienced staff of coin machines tax counsellors who could appear before the committees in their legislature and show them where they are entirely wrong. Only a National Tax Council could do this sort of job.

All the foregoing is only a beginning. Illinois, Montana, Arkansas, Utah, Idaho, Pennsylvania, and many, many other states are preparing to grab as much as they possibly can from this industry. And this does not include the huge list of villages, cities and counties everywhere in the nation following in the footsteps of these state legislatures.

This industry must get together into a hurry meeting of its leaders and discuss ways and means to create a National Tax Council for its self preservation right now.

What does it require to do so? Simply, the sincere expression of leading coin machines men in every state in the nation to get together into a body and hire the proper people to handle a National Tax Council.

Where will the money come from? The jobbers, distributors and manufacturers don't want to see territory closed because of exorbitant and confiscatory taxation. They can't sell in closed territory. They need open territory. Open territory means bigger and better markets.

Surely they will cooperate to the extent of placing a self imposed tax of \$1. or whatever is required, on each and every machine they sell and have that money earmarked to go into a National Tax Council for the preservation and protection of this industry - so that this business can proceed into the post-war period with a clean bill of health.

This self imposed tax will eventually reach the operator anyway. The operator is WILLING TO PAY IT. He has said so time and time again in surveys conducted by The Cash Box as well as by individuals in this industry.

Therefore, if the men who will have to actually PAY this tax, because it will be added on to the sales price of the machines they will buy, whether new or used, ARE WILLING TO PAY IT - why can't the leaders of this industry - those noted operators, jobbers, distributors and manufacturers get together - NOW - so that a National Tax Council will come into being to HELP THIS INDUSTRY BEFORE IT IS TAXED OUT OF BUSINESS ENTIRELY?

(Just before going to press with this issue we received word from Arkansas that regardless of the fact a bill is now pending in the House, a new bill was just introduced into the Senate (Bill No. 192) that is asking for 30% OF THE GROSS REVENUE OF ALL COIN OPERATED MACHINES, with the exception of slots. This is as yet the greatest tax bite The Cash Box, or anyone else in all this industry, has ever yet heard of. This is the sort of tax legislation that is beginfing to sweep the nation. This is the sort of thing that every state in the country will have to watch out for, and unless a National Tax Council is created to step into the breach and prevent this sort of confiscatory tax legislation - this industry is going to be cleaned out of good territory.)

RECORDS SOLD ONLY AT CONSUMERS' PRICES From everywhere in the nation, in answer to the questionnaire included in the February 13 issue of The Cash Box, come reports that to obtain any quantity of records, so that music machines may be able to continue to operate, it is necessary to purchase the records from retail stores.

What is most startling to the men in an industry, which raised the record business out of the dumps of despair and helped place it on top onceagain, is the fact that these records must be purchased at the same prices that consumers are paying. (Read just a few of the letters received in "Talking Out Loud" this issue.)

This has brought about the belief that is the plan of the record manufacturers to eventually force the members of this industry to pay the same price that consumers who purchase one or two records a month, are paying. In short, the record manufacturers will no longer recognize the music machines operator in the light of a "retailer". They have placed him in the same category as the "consumer".

This thought would probably never have entered into the minds of the men in this business weren't it for the fact that a great many of these record manufacturers are advising operators (and all of a sudden) that they are not accepting anymore "dealers". Yet in every city the music machines operator can go into the downtown, and even into outlying sections, and purchase the records he needs, and which he cannot obtain from the branch office, agent or distributor. But he MUST PURCHASE THEM AT CONSUMER'S PRICES. He buys these records from department stores, small radio and music shops, local sandwich-drug stores, electrical appliance outlets, etc., etc.

Everyone who has ever taken time to read the wording on a record label knows that the record manufacturers have protected themselves from any possible lawsuits regarding "commerical" music. Because of this there has been a long standing suspicion in this coin operated music machines industry that the record makers never did consider this a "real" business and were only in it for what they could grab, while the grabbing was good. (And how they grabbed.)

For example: Decca, Columbia, Victor, et al, on their records state: "Restricted Used Notice. This record is manufactured and sold under Patent Nos. (three or four appear on each record but all have 1637544) and is licensed by the manufacturer only for non-commercial use on phonographs in homes. The original purchaser has expressly agreed with the manufacturer of this record that it will not be resold or used for any purpose other than for non-commercial use on phonographs in homes. All subsequent purchasers and users are notified that this record may be used only for non-commercial purposes on phonographs in homes."

Perhaps this is because of the fact that there is still inset in the minds of the men in the record manufacturing business that this is an industry that is besmirched by the word "racket". And furthermore because they do not like the tough and horny hands of the hardworking men engaged in this field. They still continue the wording about "commercial" music on their labels and are gradually weaning the members of this industry away from them as "dealers".

Why is it that from town after town come reports that the records cannot be purchased from the branch office, or agent, or distributor, they can be purchased, at top consumers' prices, from local department, drug, music, electrical appliance and other stores in the very same town?

How can distribution suddenly halt to customers who have been buying for so many years from one source? How can any intelligent merchandiser claim that his entire distribution set-up has suddenly fallen apart and become so full of holes that it can now be termed "viciously inequitable"?

Perhaps, then, the belief of many leading coinmen that the manufacturer is eventually ridding himself of the music operator, under the classification of "dealer", and will instead place him in the category of "consumer", may have a great deal of truth in it.

It is up to the record manufacturers (especially the "big three") to answer the industry. It is up to them to explain why coinmen suddenly cannot purchase records from them BUT CAN BUY THESE SAME RECORDS AT RETAIL STORES AT CONSUMERS' PRICES. It is up to the record manufacturers to tell this industry, honestly, openly and frankly, whether they want the coin machines man to continue to obtain records at "retail price" or at the present "consumers' prices".

"Talking Out Loud" LET'S LOOK AT THE RECORDS Nation's Music Coinmen Tell About Their Headaches With **Record Manufacturers. Claim No Equitable Distribution Of** Present Quotas. Forced To Buy From Retail Stores At Top Price.

NEW YORK --- Many months ago, when the nation's music machine operators first called on The Cash Box to bring into the open the unfair, biased and coercive methods being used by record manufacturers, their agents and distributors, investigation was immediately started to ascertain whether this situation was national in scope.

The Cash Box learned that the record problem has been growing worse right along. Most of the answers to questions asked brought in more and still more complaints. Complaints continue to pour in advising this medium that operators, who had purchased large quantities of records for many years, were not getting records. They are not getting even a fraction of what they were asking for. Yet new retail outlets are daily being created by the record manufacturers. The Cash Box decided to come into the open with this problem a few weeks ago. It started the ball rolling with

its first article. This was an effort to get the record manufacturers to give this industry, the business that started them up the ladder again and that put them back on their feet, equitable distribution of the quotas now being manufactured.

The result of the first article which appeared was a flood of letters of commendation. Stories of more complaints also arrived. Phone calls were received urging the industry get together with the record manufacturers, or devise some new course for itself.

Here are only a few of the letters received from noted music coinmen and their associations, telling about the record situation.

THE VERMONT COIN OPERATED AMUSEMENT MACHINE ASSN., BRATTLEBORO, VT., WRITES:

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"If fellows like Joe Davis can manufacture records, and other small manufacturers it would seem to me as tho the operators in this country could form a company and make their own. I for one will put in some money.

"I haven't the slightest idea how much it will cost to get started -I do know it can be done. Why not take the matter up with Homer Capehart, a go getter and see if we can start something.

"We have got to do something and I believe as a whole, we are enough so that we can do it. I certainly am sick of the way records are coming to me. So far only one concern - Decca - has given me any kind of service — Columbia and Victor have been lousy. I have not received one record of Victor production during the past six weeks.

"I say-let's look into this record proposition and unless we can get definite assurance from the people whom we put back on their feet, that we are going to get records, then let's get busy and try to make some.

"Capehart has a factory that after the war is going into the music machine game, one way or another and it is just possible that record manufacturing might appeal to him.'

JULES OLSHEIN & CO., ALBANY, N. Y. JOBBERS WRITE:

"Glad you're getting after the record manufacturers. All my customers have been in an uproar for some time now with regard to the record situation. How about some sort of a boycott until they realize that the phono operator is the fellow that put them in business? Let the operators use their used records for weeks as they can, and this will turn the tide!"

RADIO & ELECTRIC SERVICE, DOUGLAS, WYO., WRITES:

"For the past three years we have had to buy most of our records at retail. The ones shipped by the record companies have been very few, but there is some increase lately. About 80% is what we have been buying at retail and they come from the same branch offices of the record companies as those shipped us. We have been shipped records we didn't order to the extent of about one-third of all records being shipped us, but have not complained for fear of being shut off altogether."

MARTIN & LYNWOOD SHIREY, LEWISTON, PA. OPERATORS AND JOBBERS OF MUSIC WRITE:

"My two headaches are: (1 - I get records 30 days after they are out and (2 - I do not receive any Decca records at all. I can't get to the District office to hand the manager a few \$10 bills as a tip to sell me records."

NORTHWESTERN AUTOMATIC MUSIC CO., FORT DODGE, IA., WRITES:

"For the past several months, all of the retail stores in Fort Dodge, Iowa, have been receiving the current popular records weeks ahead of our receiving them, as operators. We have purchased the leading brands of records for the past 18 years in quantities ranging up to \$700.00 per month at the peak. These retail accounts are not over 2 years old, and yet they get more records than we, and get them at a much earlier date. The records we have received for the past several months are not of good quality. They fail to stand up. No dates are available for the above statement, but we have written to the record distributors, giving them such information."

T. & T. NOVELTY CO., WILLIAM-SON, W. VA., WRITES:

"We have not been asked or told that we would have to purchase other items of accessories in order to get shipments of records from any of our distributors, but just haven't been able by any means, good or bad, to obtain more than about 15% of our needs. Bluebird, Victor, Columbia and OK distributors ship us a few records each month; but Decca has gone for as much as ten months without a single shipment. Orders go out weekly to each distributor. We are forced to buy 85% our record needs from retail outlets. To us, this silent fact is conclusive evidence of wrong allocation of records by distributors. How-ever, we doubt if we could point a finger at anybody."

MATHENY VENDING CO., WICHITA, KANS., WRITES:

"We have operated music for the past ten years, having purchased thousands of dollars worth of records from the manufacturers. Today we find that we have to purchase 75% of our records from retail outlets at retail prices. Records that we are unable to purchase from the manufacturer are available in the retail stores. We are getting damned tired,

NOVELTY AMUSE-U CO., SAVANNAH, GA., WRITES:

"I have just finished reading the February 13, 1945 issue of "The Cash Box" pertaining to neglect the music operators have received from the record manufacturers and distributors.

"Since our company was one of the many in this city on whom the Decca Distributing Corporation tried to force five cases of lamps in order to obtain records, we feel that we are entitled to offer some comment on this subject.

"Through concerted action among the various operators in Savannah, I am very happy to state that the situation so far as our receiving "SOME" new releases from this company has been alleviated. However, a letter that I wrote to Mr. R. N. McCormick, Southern Division manager of the Decca Distributing Corporation in New Orleans, on November 9, 1944, explains our position and our future relations in the post-war era.

"'While it is quite true that the situation can be made difficult as far as our receiving Decca records during the present emergency, we are of the opinion and we feel that you are too, that our business with your company before the war was appreciated and I am sure that your Mr. Hess or whoever is in charge of your Atlanta branch will once more be out in the territory endeavoring to sell us

again.' "In all fairness, Mr. Gersh, we had been treated quite fairly by Decca until November 1944, when managers changed in the Atlanta office. This fact, I think has a great deal to do with the record situation. As long as the manufacturers or their distributing agencies had the same personel who serviced the music operators before the war, we received equitable distribution on records released. This was due to their understanding of the situation and the realization on their part of the volume of business given them by music operators. Where changes have been made in the distribution set up of the various manufacturers, and people with no conception of the part we played in building their pre-war volume where given control, our situation steadily de-teriorated and the amout of new records received became smaller and smaller.

'We have a situation in this territory that bears out my contentions. The Yancey Company in Atlanta, Georgia, distributors of Bluebird and Victor records, have treated, I believe, all of the music operators in Savannah quite fairly. They have the same key personel employed now as they did before the war.

What we would like to see in this industry, Mr. Gersh, and we are one of the oldest organizations of our kind in this section, is an organization set up to manufacture records exclusively for the music operators. We believe that every operator would unquestionably pat-ronize a company of this kind."

C. E. ARMSTRONG, INDIANAPOLIS, IND., WRITES:

"Records do not stand up. Operators in Indianapolis are paying and have been, some 10c more than wholesale for their records They advise they have to pay extra from the local wholesale source. to get the records from their source, which I believe enables them to get them for re-sale. Under the cir-cumstances, the writer hardly wishes to divulge the name — if so, there would be no more records to be had from this source, and at times you can get none at the other wholesale sources. In fact it would be cutting off your own source of supply. However, this is the condition here at Indianapolis, Ind. and all operators have paid to be able to even get records. It looks like the price raise goes clear back to some one in the factory or some place who is shoving them out, if he or they get an extra hand out for so doing."

COLUMBIA NOVELTY CO. AMSTERDAM, N. Y., WRITES: "We have received very very few

of the latest recordings by name bands in the past months; some of the new releases we never got while the down-town music stores were selling these same records. In order to keep our phonographs in proper condition we have been forced to buy new records at the music stores at consumers price. We have made several trips to the distributors in this section in order to purchase records and these trips have met with little success. Although we did get some records, they were not the popular type but we took them anyway in order to have something to put on our machines. We have written numerous letters and called the main distributors, and this too has met with little success."
