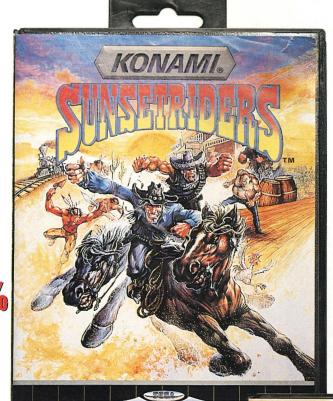

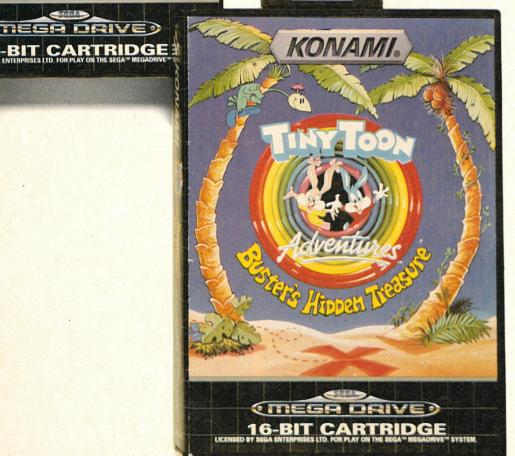

Set for Autumn is Smaartvark! This is a new character developed by the Codeys who hopefully will continue on and become as successful as some of their other big names. Smaartvark is actually a TV repairaardvark (obviously!) who actually gets inside your TV and sorts the job out from in there even though there are countless gremlins out to spoil your merry fun.

Code of Honour

A general Code of Practice is to be introduced by members of the European Leisure Software Publishers. This will involve software houses imposing voluntary software classification and guidelines on game content that should, if all goes well be introduced by May 1st.

Games across every format will recieve a rating based around four separate age brackets - Up to 10, 10-14, 15-17 and 18 and over which will be displayed on each package. Under this new system, publishers in Europe are requested to fill in a questionnaire providing facts about their product and which age category they think it should go into. Once all this formality is out of the way the Video Standards Council will then make the final decision on the rating.

ELSPA chairman Mark Strachan was quoted as saying "It's great that the industry, as a body, decided that self-regulation was the right the thing. We need to show - not only in the UK but in Europe as well - that we are a responsible industry."

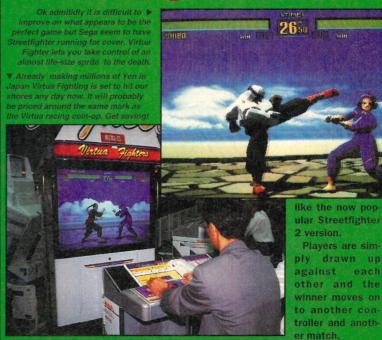
Adventures Sonic the Hedgehog. Already a monster smash all across the USA it may seem a little harsh that he's been relegated to such a low-key spot.

Seen in the Japanese arcades and already attracting much interest over here in Europe is the latest fighting game to hit the big screen.

Designed by the same team that brought you Virtua Racing the game named Virtua Fighters is polygon based and will also feature a unique link up system allowing multi player input. How this works is as yet unclear (for more info see Over The Edge) but I would hazard a guess at it using a tournament style of play

Graphics, just like the Virtua Racing engine are stunning and the speed is fantastic. The large screen really brings the characters to life with film quality screen updates.

It looks like the game will appear over here in our arcades in a few months and no doubt will see the Mega Drive conversion treatment pretty soon after. Rumours that the game is being developed on Sega's Saturn console are as yet unconfirmed by sources. It would be nice.

Game tor

The UK's largest game store has just been opened in Liverpool by Alan Hanson. The Liverpool hero played winners of a Liverpool Echo competition at FIFA Soccer, while Nintendo champion Metro took on all challengers at Street Fighter II. Alan had been practising his FIFA skills all week, and his 12-year-old son could still beat him, he said. But he was more concerned about his PGA Tour Golf record, golf being his latest passion. Super Mario was there too, while over in Nottingham, Mister Blobby was opening another record breaking Game store.

These specialist game stores have been wantonly vandalised by a graffiti artist depicting Sonics and Marios and feature an amazing number of monitors - 62 in Liverpool - many with games for their customers to play. The store was actually too big for the range of games around at the moment said Neil Taylor, Game Managing Director, so a large back room remains available for special launches and six more floors for future expansion.

The second biggest games retailer in the country is opening 11 stores before Christmas, three of which will

be (equally) the largest in the UK, with plans for a further 50 stores in the New Year aiming to reach 200 in the next two years. "With the games departments of music stores, the staff are there primarily because they like music," said David Wilson, buyer for Game, "whereas our staff are gamesplayers."

Game pride themselves on their value for money products, with a special budget section including a £19.99 range and a full selection of accessories. "Kids come here to spend their pocket money," said David Wilson, "and if they can't afford a game then they want to go away with a joystick or a magazine." The Liverpool store also have a wide range of board games for Christmas.

oming from the same team that brought you Aladdin, this film licence has been developed on PC and is currently being converted for the Mega CD. The game begins in good old LA and uses shooting gallery style action with you simply pointing the weapon in the desired direction to eliminate onscreen menaces.

Extra footage was shot on set during the filming of the movie specially for the game. Accuracy to the film plot is second to none. Hand to hand combat has been suggested for the game and it seems to be favouring a side-on *Streetfighter* view of the action.

The player is taken through various scenes of the plot, carefully rendered in 3-D static sections, where conflicts take place. Of course all the while the action is hotting up there's constant background music, again true to the flavour of the film, presented in glorious stereo.

Sound effects have been used from the movie soundtrack. So have certain dialogue sequences, keeping the quick fire flavour of Stallone and Snipes featuring predominately in the film. This game is in its very early stages and it may be some time before you see some definite screen shots so rather than take some other dubious format we've dug out some nice movie shots foryou to drool over. Rest assured though, Mega Action will be there to cover any further developments in this massive film license!

ut on PC and by all accounts selling very well indeed, this game is based upon the American fifties cartoon classic *Speed Racer*. For those of you who are not aware, this classic is currently having a cult revival on MTV and airs twice a day.

The game sees you in the Mach 5, a revolutionary design of racing car pitting your wits 'wacky racer' style against other race contestants. At your disposal are such devices as oil slicks, powerful springs that project the car skyward and the odd chopper blade to cut through the traffic.

You can choose two types of car, the Mach 5 or the Shooting Star, as Ranger X, the deadly opponent. Both have special devices fitted to the race car. Race 16 deadly opponents, all based on the cartoon characters or go head to head split screen.

As you race, the money you win allows for various updates to the car. These can increase grip, making the car more resilient or you can just go for increased speed.

The whole game is presented in cartoon style and you constantly interact with key characters via the communication screen on the dashboard. This gives valuable info on your rivals. The game is currently being transformed into a Mega Drive cartridge so we look forward to seeing a bit more very soon, watch this space!

VIRTUA RACING

SEGA

t's been a long time coming and has been the topic of conversation ever since Mega Action was the very first magazine to show it to you outside Japan. We were privvy to a good look at the game thanks mainly to our Japanese contacts and since then the game has undergone some serious marketing changes.

Firstly the cost of the special processor which powers the game has been cause for some concern. Sega are toying with the idea of selling you the DSP or, as it will be known, SVP (Sega Virtua Processor?) as a separate plug through unit allowing cost reductions. Buy once and use with all the planned Virtua releases

Other areas of contention were the memory size. We first suspected the total Meg to be something around 32 MBits but recent sources have confirmed a capacity of the standard 16meg. This must mean the power of the SVP is something to be reckoned with as game speed is well up to the coinop standards. There are three courses to race and they get progressively harder as you get better.

It would be nice to say that Sega are planning on releasing a proper steer-

ing column for the game but ah well one can dream. No link up facility has been added and this is a real let down for multi racers. The arcade success can be pinned down to the graphics admittedly, but a great selling point has to have been the fact that up to eight could race on a course at one time.

Retained in the game, though, is the cockpit viewing facility which allows the road car to be seen from right inside the cockpit, just behind or way above from a imaginary following helicopter. Of course the pit scenes still remain with care and attention lavished on your car by the albeit simplified (graphic wise) crew. Fairgrounds, bridges and other cars move as swiftly as the coin-op and it looks pretty good in all.

A nother from Virgin that is causing quite a stir at the moment is their basketball game, Jammit. Now there's nothing new in another game of basketball being translated onto the Mega Drive but what makes this so different is the fact that no official rules exist for this console game. It seems street basketball is very different from the glossy image we see on Sky or Cable TV.

The roots of the game provide a rougher edge with spitting, kneeing and even punching all part of prising open a way to the basket. Famous stars of today have all played on the scene and the classic movie 'White Men Can't Jump' just about sums up the whole thang.

Jammit is not quite so ruthless but still lets you see the other side of the coin with some more street-wise characters to play with. When that all important hoop has been committed to, the action zooms in to show the outcome. Trick shots and special hoops are all possible and mastering the techniques makes for a very satisfying experience indeed.

Control methods are a little sketchy at the moment and rumour has it that the game does not take advantage of the Sega or EA four player tap which is a shame as it looks like other games, including Charles Barkley from Accolade, will. We'll keep you informed of course.

ANOTHER WORLD CD

This is without doubt one of the all time classic games. It has since been translated onto every format from Apple Mac to Amiga and still provides a challenge even now.

Programmed by the French team Delphine the game combines strategy, arcade action and simulation to produce a strange and bizarre environment for you to explore. The game has now received the CD treatment and boasts new puzzles and better graphics but that's not all!

There are, in fact, two games on one CD. Another World 2 provides a new experience with the story carrying on while you take control of Buddy. He appeared in the first adventure as an alien who'd chosen to help you through the ordeal and eventually help you get free.

New creatures are more freakish and threatening than before and each have individual characteristics. The game's been cleverly designed to provide two separate adventures which can be completed either individually or as one long quest.

If you have played *Another World*, and know it inside out, then never fear! The game allows instant access to the second part. New soundtracks create an atmosphere similar to that found in *Flashback* so this should be good!

TERMINATOR CD

he Terminator, on cartridge, was a great success and Virgin, ever keen to keep the ball rolling, are developing a CD version. Kyle Reese, the warrior of the future, has returned to the past to ensure the survival of mankind.

You must face the streets of Los Angeles in a post apocalyptic nightmare, working your way through various cyborg generations (T-500's) before coming face to face with the terrifying might of the Terminator T-800. (Later to be replaced by the T-1000, a more down to earth kinda guy).

The enhancements to the game lie in greater weapon selection, superbly rendered backdrops and many many more levels for you to complete. Improvements don't just stop at the visuals though, as the game boasts a full stereo soundtrack that truly creates an atmosphere of doom.

Sequences from the film have been digitised and implemented into the game with the now famous 'holocaust' playground sequence included in all it's foreboding glory.

The Terminator movie was one of the most successful science fiction movies in its time and was surprisingly shot on a very low budget. The sequel was of course another matter completely and definitely wasn't as good.

DRAGON

Virgin

We mentioned this in the news the month before last and since then things have really been moving on the development side at Virgin. Based on the film (which is playing in most cinemas at the moment) the game sees you playing the young Bruce Lee as he battles through level upon level of martial madness.

Up to three players can fight on screen at once with player one taking on two opponents or both player one and player two fighting against each other or even together against the third assailant.

So you think you've seen film footage on CD before in games like Night Trap and the intro sequences of Puggsy and Microcosm? You've heard how the programmers of Jurassic Park had access to original dinosaur drawings and how Sylvester Stallone spent two days filming special scenes for his Demolition Man game tie-in.

Well that was nothing. In the States now the first interactive movie games are being filmed. And on the set of *Ground Zero Texas*, next to the director, Dwight H. Little

of *Halloween 4* fame, sits a game designer, there to ensure the movie works on the Mega CD.

The set of Ground Zero Texas looks just like a Hollywood set, with more than 100 actors, technicians and cameramen spread around a fake Mexican town in Los Angeles. Links with the film business are strong and the stunt coordinator on Texas was responsible for Rambo 3 and Star Trek 2.

"Ultimately I believe the business will be more like traditional Hollywood stuff," says Tom Zito of Digital Pictures, the film's producers. "We'll be doing interactive game shows, talk shows, dramas, sit coms."

But these are games, not films and there cannot be just one plot. Each scene has to be filmed several times and actors often have to talk to the camera, as you, the gamesplayer.

Sony Imagesoft, the publish-

ers of 'Texas, have produced a number of movie tie-ins with digitised sequences from films and had varying degrees of success. Night Trap and Sewer Shark are best selling titles whilst Cliffhanger and Last Action Hero were eventually shelved, the latter due to Arnie's insistence that the game should be a non-violent beat'em-up. 'Sher right.

In Sewer Shark, the actor playing 'ghost' is a familiar character from

He's the violent nutter, yelling at you even when he's standing right next to you. "Pretend it's a game and maybe it'll even be fun," he says. But the digitised sequences in these games are not fully interactive, they only appear as between level fillers and backgrounds. In Sony's Dracula CD, the movie set background quite stunning, but is still only a great backdrop to what is, after all, a pretty mediocre game.

There are problems with the new technology. CDs can't store enough data for the movie pictures, so they end up grainy. Programmers are, though, working out new ways of storing the information.

Then there are the psychological effects. This summer Digital Pictures hired Ron Stein, the man who choreographed Raging Bull and Rocky 3, to direct Prize Fighter, a black and white interactive boxing game filmed from the point of view of the boxer. Focus groups found this was traumatizing for kids under the age of puberty, but the older kids loved it. Hence the age restrictions.

With designers constantly trying to find new ways of involving the games players, interactive movies are looking to be the way forward. And oldies are always suspicious of new products. Soon the day will come when Clint Eastwood will be pointing a Magnum 45 at your head, saying "Go ahead punk, make my day."

The history of boxing holds many spectacular moments, most of which come from the heavyweight circuit. The heavyweight championship has run for over 100 years, with new challengers attempting to take the title two or three times a year.

It wasn't until the fight between John L. Sullivan and Jake Kilrain back in 1889 that the judges decided that leather gloves should be worn. So before that, boxers fought with bare fists, (very primitive indeed).

The boxing authorities also decided to limit the number of rounds in one fight, because Sullivan and Kilrain boxed for two hours, 16 minutes before the fight was won by Sullivan. The fight lasted an amazing 75 rounds in total!

The introduction of the Queensbury

rules helped to bring some kind of order to the fights, so they didn't look like bar room brawls! They also introduced a marking system, where judges would award points to each boxer, depending on how well they both fought. If both players were still standing after the last bell, then the judges would decide on who fought the best during each round.

It takes years of training, sparring and competing against lesser fighters before a fighter can even consider taking on the heavyweight champ. Once a challenger steps into the ring, there's no backing out, they either win or lose.

When the fights last for 12, or more, rounds fighters often don't really know what their are doing. They've taken so many punches they start to function on automatic pilot, just wandering round the ring and relying on the instinct hammered into them during training

to survive.

Everyone's favourite finish to a fight is a good KO. The KO can come after a barrage of punches when the opponent is just totally worn out or through a real power blaster of a hit.

Once a boxer hits the canvas the ref steps in and starts the count. If the fighter gets up the round will probably continue, otherwise he's out for the count, game over.

The only champion who never lost a professional fight in all his boxing career was the one and only Rocky Marciano. He fought 49 contests before retiring in 1956. Joe Louis held the championship title for the longest period, from 1935 to 1949.

During those fourteen years as Champ he fought opponents of a mixed quality. Many were top class but Joe also travelled the world fighting the local national contender for the title, often winning easily. These wer known as the 'Bum of the month' tours.

Boxing has never really made much of an impression on the

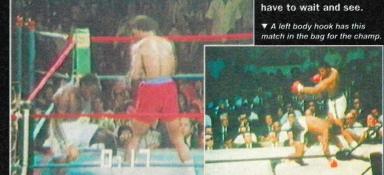
console market, with previous games seeling a few thousand copies thenfading away. The games didn't capture the feel of the sport, they were slow and the graphics were poor.

As technology has progressed, however, game programmers have developed the ability to generate a simulation fight, but still make the game playable for the consoles.

For a game to be realistic the programmers has to include as many features from the sport as possible. Greatest Heavyweights and Boxing Legends Of The Ring look to have broken through that barrier.

We reckon these games make welcome change from the recent invasion of beat'em-ups. So, is this the new way forward? Will the nation of gamers be asking for boxing gloves

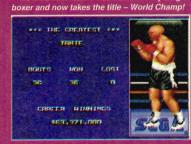

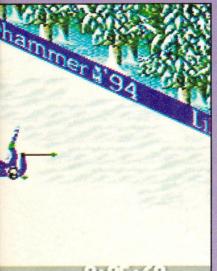

A JOY TO CONTROL

The standard joystick that you are given with the Mega Drive fun packs is more than adequate but let's face it, it certainly ain't the most ergonomic, sexy, slinky design you'd like to hold. If it were a car it would be a Fiesta Popular diesel. Small, purposeful, good for learning but lacking that certain sex appeal.

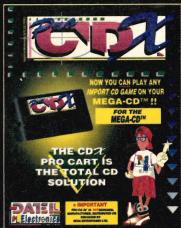

Joking aside though, they do give the avid gamesplayer a headstart on British players tied to official releases. In some cases imports can be obtained some six months in advance, though the Japanese text can prove a slight problem.

Since Sega have a general policy of pick-up-the-joystick-and-get-into-the-game-instantly, this language problem never really matters. There are three types of import games, American, Japanese and of course British or European. The differences, until recently, were physical with the cartridges unable to slot into foreign machines. To combat this you need a

simple converter which raises the socket out of the Mega Drive and presto! You can play!

As idyllic as all this sounds there's now a down side in the form of a coded lock-out that stops you playing all together. To get around this there are devices called Code Breakers that will allow the PAL and NTSC (American) versions to work in European consoles.

CD owners can use a device called the CDX from Datel, the makers of the Action Replay cheating device, to achieve the same thing. ■ You've saved up for, you've been given, you gave your right arm for... a Mega Drive. Now where

There are two types of unit on the market at the moment, the Codemasters Game Genie and the Datel Action Replay. Although they both do the same job their approach to the problem is very different.

The Datel Action Replay is the more popular device. It looks much like a cartridge and simply plugs into the cartridge slot of your Mega Drive. A slot is provided on the top of the device to plug in your game for a piggyback effect.

On the side of the Replay is a three position switch. To obtain the cheat you require, let's say infinite lives, you simply throw the switch into the down position. This puts the device into a discovery mode of sorts and allow access to the raw code of the programming. Now all you do is tell the device how many lives the game starts you with and off it goes analysing the raw code for that number of lives, let's say three. Now reset the Mega Drive, lose a life and

tell the device to start hunting for the number two. Off it goes again, checking for any number change from three to two. Keep this up, constantly changing the value and eventually you will narrow down the possibilities to two or even one. Now the values you have been given should be entered into the parameter screen and the cheat activitated by putting the switch to up. Enter the game and you have infinite lives! There are several methods of discovery to use and they all provide varying results allowing anything from total power up. invincibility, selected weapons all the

time or anything you might require. The unit acts as a converter too, though not for codebreaking.

The Codemasters Game Genie looks quite similar to the Action Replay unit and also has a switch on the side. It uses the same system of hacking into the game but not by you. Put simply, you join the user club by buying the device and receive constant updates of codes.

To get going you enter the code on the parameter screen then engage the switch. The Game Genie gives more startling results, like Sonic in a dress, but being tied to a given list may prove a bit of of a problem.

that can be used for the ultimate shoot 'em-up. And though the thing looks good, feels good and is quite easy to use, there's little or no software to compliment it.

Pity, as the Nintendo unit has good back-up and some quite interesting games. Early days yet though and maybe this device will see some commitment in future. Till then I would resist the urge to buy.

Just out is the Activator, a spaceage interactive joystick that allows fighting games to break through new barriers. You have two contacts which you attach to your arms and legs. When you move around or mimic fighting actions, these are picked up by a flat sensor plate on the floor and translated to your onscreen character.

Eternal Champions, reviewed in this issue, is the first game to use it and sees you fighting for your life against Streetfighter-style foes.

There's more. Under much scrutiny at the moment is the Virtual Reality headset that Sega have been developing. Initially slated, The unit has been redesigned. It's now lightweight and features the Game Gear display shown in each eye. Control is by head motion sensors and a fire button from a standard joystick.

Now, although the hydraulic eject has been taken out and replaced with a manual system much like the Walkman CDs you see around at the moment, nothing much has changed except for looks. Styling is very much like things should be with a very ergonomic trendy device that can handle both Mega Drive versions slotted into its side.

The games that were first available came in for a hell of a lot of criticism due to great expectations from press and public alike. At first all you got were compilations of older games or maybe a slightly revamped version of it.

But things are looking up now with all the software houses firmly committed to producing some quality stuff. I mean look at Thunderhawk or Silpheed or even Sonic CD. Breathtaking stuff. Psygnosis have even taken things as far as producing original

soundtracks by some very famous artists. The two phono jacks situated on the back allow you to plug into the home Hi-Fi and obtain a louder stereo experience. The new Q-Sound system currently being utilised on games such as Ecco The Dolphin means a three dimensional effect to the music can be achieved. Of course the CD units can be used as

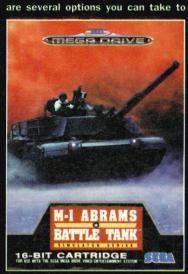

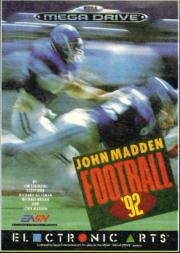

Ever wanted to play the piano? Well now you can with the Miracle Piano Teaching System from Mindscape. You have a half size Midi Compatible keyboard that connects to the Mega Drive via the joystick port. Through an on-screen tutorial you canlearn the basics and more. On-screen games using the keys can be played and the keyboard has built-in sounds and can also play the Mega Drive internal sounds.

Keep fit fanatics amongst you will also enjoy the Heartbeat Personal Trainer from Heartbeat Corp. of America. This device monitors the heartrate during and after exercise, providing graphical information on how things are goings. Great for the heart disease enthusiast.

Also available from America is the Edge 16 Modem Card system which as the name suggests lets you play games with or against opponents over the phone. This device is very expensive and as far as I am aware

is only available in the States. It's also perhaps a bit dated now as Sega have announced the acquisition of a Cable channel with the opportunity of downloading games from the station via this cable. What equipment you will need is as yet unclear but I would imagine in keeping with Sega's 'domination of the world' policy it will be reasonably priced.

If you are an avid reader of our magazine then you will have noticed back in issue 3 a review of the import game Switch which was, as far as I am aware, one of the first games to use the Sega mouse. This little black device fits firmly into the palm of the hand and allows a little arrow to be moved around the screen. Selections are made by clicking the button after placing the cursor over the desired file or object.

A quick word about monitors, TVs and how to get a clearer picture. Many of you no doubt are more than impressed about the arcade-quality graphics that the Mega Drive can produce. When it comes down to looking at it on the TV, however, things are just a tad fuzzy.

To get around this there are a few options available. First, if your TV has a SCART or RGB connection on the back (these will be clearly marked and are for video or auxiliary sources), then all you need do is pop into your games shop and buy an appropriate cable. Plug this into the AV OUT socket on the back of the Mega Drive and into the RGB or SCART socket in the TV. Make the appropriate channel selection and you will immediately notice the difference in quality.

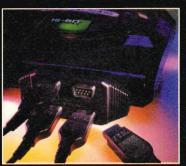

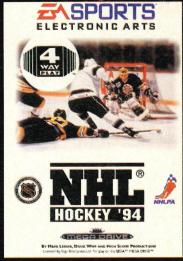

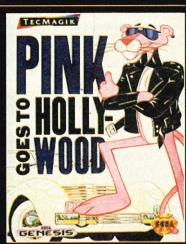

Soon it becomes apparent that all is not right with the President. For someone who's supposed to be recovering from a routine operation he's missing some vital signs.

oe Montana has built up his career and gained Superbowl supremacy by quarterbacking for the San Francisco 49ers. So after joining the Kansas City Chiefs, the next logical move was to become the latest American football star to grace a game with his name.

A full selection of plays have been made available for you to employ. You're given 45 seconds to run though all the options and decide on the best manoeuvre. If you exceed the time limit you incur a five yard penalty. So there's no time to sit around twiddling your thumbs!

You have the choice of playing any of the 28 teams that make up the NFL, from all six conferences. Note the team statistics shown before play is started and select your team. Then decide who to play against. You can choose any team from any con-

ference, you can even play against the team you have selected!

The 10 greatest teams ever, according to Sega anyway, are also here as the Superbowl Greats. The manual gives you the run down on the years each team won, and how.

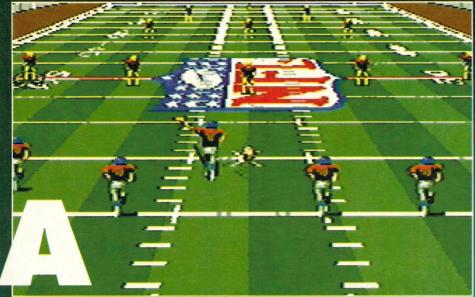

When passing you can control the trajectory of the ball. Increase the angle of the arc for a deep pass, or decrease the arc of the pass for a bullet throw. The bullet pass is generally more effective, as it's a lot quicker and gives you a higher chance of completing shorter passes. When your team either lose possession or score, the Defensive team move in. These guys have to prevent the other team gaining the necessary 10 yards.

For Coppola's version is true to Stoker's novel, following Gary Oldman from his spooky castle to 19th Century London in search of his long lost love, Winona Ryder. "It's not really a vampire movie," she says. "To me it's more about the man Dracula, the warrior, the prince. 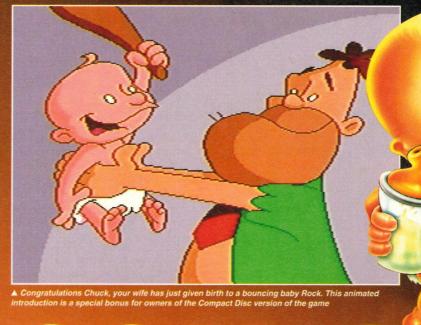

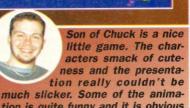

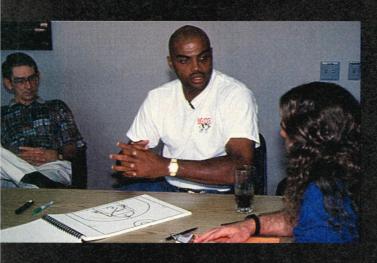

ccolade achieved a sporting "Double Whammy" by signing up Charles Barkley earlier this year to endorse a basketball game, just as Michael Jordan announced his retirement and Big Bad Barkley became a challenger for the uinofficial 'golden boy' title of basketball.

As Accolade made the announcement of a "worldwide licensing agreement", the entire United States went Barkley bonkers, as Barkley was awarded NBA's most coveted award and Nike signed the man up for the most lucrative licensing deal in sporting history.

In 1994, it is estimated that Barkley will earn \$100,000,000. Barkley's meteoric rise to national fame peaked earlier this year as the media hounded Michael Jordan about his alleged gambling habits and grew bored with wonderkid Shaq'O Neal. Barkley jumped to Jordan's defence telling the press to: "Butt out and let us get on with our job!". This won him the respect of the nation.

Accolade's logo "Games with Personality" could not be more aptly applied than to a game featuring this tough, unconventional basketball star. Barkley is big, 6'5" and 250 pounds, this Phoenix Suns forward is the most exciting player the sport has ever seen.

He's also gained a powerful reputation for his 'exuberance' on, and off the court. Media people have



become understandably cagey in their dealings with the man. Placing a dinner plate-sized hand over a camera lens he recently growled: "I'm a tough guy, I go out and compete every night. If you want to test my limits, go ahead!" Not surprisingly, nobody has yet taken him up on his kind offer.

"With Michael Jordan his only real peer in the game, Barkley has taken basketball to a new and disorderly level." Said Project Team-leader Danny Pisano. "We're endeavouring to integrate his fast-breaking intimidating whatever-it-takes-to-win playing style into the game." Barkley added: "I love to play, I love to have fun and I love to win. I'm sure my enthusiasm for basketball will reflect in this game."

One thing's for certain, the world loves a guy that's good at being bad. Hailed by his fans and critics as "Sir Charles", Barkley has earned this distinction by becoming the all-time NBA leader in fines assessed. Pisano added: "This man takes no prisoners and this game will

reflect this awesome power and controlled aggression."

Barkley is working closely with the design team and is keen that the game not only simulates his style of play but also tells a bit about the man himself, his personality and his upbringing. Already a multi-millionaire and likely to become the richest sportsman ever in '94, Barkley has not had an easy ride to the top.

Barkley grew up in the ghettos of Chicago where he discovered gift for basketball. Play was rough and he learnt to be streetwise, tough and singleminded, because for every one Charles Barkley there are thousands of kids that grow up as 'could've beens', jailbirds or corpses. Fortunately for Barkley, his extraordinary skill and power meant that success was a foregone conclusion.

Design team leader Pisano described the design meetings with Barkley as: "A real thrill! Charles was very keen to portray the Street element of basketball, and so we designed the game around street scenes. Makes a welcome change from the court arenas featuring in other games.

The graphic designers are building a background of street scenes,

Charles is very keen that this street element be included as he claims that even today his best and most enjoyable games are those played on the street with his friends. Imagine the crowds now as Barkley goes back to his old neighbourhood to play some ball with his old friends.

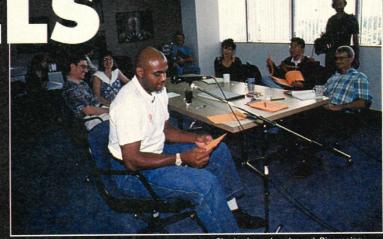
The design team is employing the latest 3D technology and animation techniques to make sure that the player can really relive Barkley's unique, and allegedly unethical, style of play. The graphic artists digitizing Barkley boast they'll get closer to

the way the man moves and plays than any sports game before.

"The game will be portrayed in his style!" Says Pisano "Rough and tough on court, completely uncompromising, hitting, knobbling and pushing". This sort of play is done right out in the open in full view of the referee. It's not malicious, just a burning desire to get possession and dunk the ball. The more he does it, the more he scores, the richer he gets and the more the fans love him.

The game is in mid-development at the moment and Barkley regularly liaises with the design team, approving and making useful suggestions, which I'm sure they are only too keen to implement.

Pisano describes the basic structure of the game as an "...intense 2 on 2 jamfest starring Sir Charles and sixteen of his neighbourhood buddies. The intention at the moment is for the game to be fully compatible with Sega's 4-way adaptor, with each of the sixteen players hav-



ing his own special moves, patented shot, and, above all, completely unique personality."

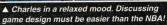
Barkley's motto is: "Play or get out!" which reflects his attitude of "Get out of the way or get beaten up!" This ethic inspired the great title for the game, 'BARKLEY - Shut up and Jam!".

To really get Barkley's message fully over, the team is digitizing Sir Charles voice to include some of his famous abrasive on and offcourt comments. We can't tell you exactly what they are because this is a family mag.

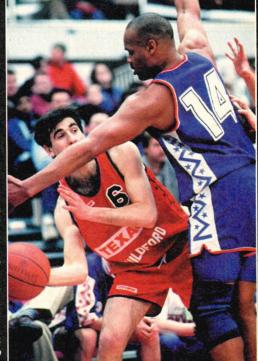
"Shut up and Jam" isn't a game of polished wood and shiny paint. It's a game of tough street ball, played on broke-up asphalt courts.

Will Shut up and Jam prove part of a renaisance in English basketball? What with this, Jammit and NBA Jam being released next year we wouldn't be surprised if basketball took off in this country in a masiive way.

I'm sure that's what the makers of *Shut up* and *Jam* will be hoping.

CASHING IN ON 1

he greatest participant sport, the most popular spectator sport, soccer transcends race, creed and class. With the World Cup in Los Angeles just a few months away an epidemic of footy fever is about to course through the planet. It's no surprise that soccer is arguably the premier videogame theme, boasting some of the top-selling titles of all time: a good footy game can be a hit, a great one can make history!

Above all games, the dimension and speed of soccer is a perfect medium for videogame simulation. In the arcade soccer coin-op machines set a fashion which is still considered by many to be the most fun and playable style.

These overhead view coin-op machines featured squat little players charging around the pitch at a frenetic pace. The introduction of a control ball on arcade favourite Hotball turned the whole thing into a brow-moistening experience.

These games were, by design, unpredictable to control which only served to add to the frenzied pace. Game designers became determined, eventually, to present a more accurate simulation of the game. The result of this is a whole new style of game. A whole new ball game even!

The new squad of games feature a lower angle of perspective and a rotoscoping scroll technique inspired by American Football favourite John Madden. This new stage of soccer

sim evolution saw designers looking at television coverage of soccer. The idea was to ceate a perspective which vigeogames players could identify as 'real' footy.

If you hadn't already guessed the imminent World Cup has inspired a new batch of soccer releases. Here we look at the soccer games already available on Mega Drive and put the latest and forthcoming releases through their paces.

CODEMASTERS

By avoiding the words 'Cup' and 'L.A. 'clever-clogs games publisher Codemasters can safely release a soccer game in time for L.A. 94, without having to raid the piggy bank to buy the licence. They've spent a year in development, and a further six months fine tuning. This is a serious bid for a piece of the action.

Look deeper and this isn't just a straight soccer sim. The game combines a kind of in-game TV show, with a soccer simulation.

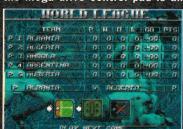

ULTIMATE SOCCER

Like Oldham Athletic, Sega's own Ultimate Soccer is a contradiction in terms. The boast of 'ultimate' in a title sets the game up for even clos-

er scrutiny than normal.
It has to be good.

This comes very much in the Striker style of game, which with its lowered perspective and scrolling method was a revelation.

A bonus feature here is the indoor six-a-side option which steps up what is already a pacey game and requires razorsharp passing and shoot-

ing control. Player control is surprisingly accurate and comprehensive. One criticism though is close control, the shortest pass achievable is too powerful, which makes dribbling the ball impossible.

Ultimate Soccer does run Sega's four-player adaptors, which presents an hilarious: "Hey who's ball is it... which player am I controlling?" Scenario. You can quite easily score and launmch into lavish, extravagant celebations before realising you've just put the ball in your own net.

controlled equivalent of the 1970 World Cup winning Brazil team.

The lack of an option to adjust the ferocity and skill of the computercontrolled team makes this a tough test of humility as the opposition clocks up a phone number score while the player resorts to hopeless and indiscriminate button pushing.

Thanks to a confusing array of controls, the two-player option is a far more balanced affair which could

be likened to the King's Arms second team against the Royal Oak women's darts squad. Nevertheless, perseverance in mastering controls of this Kick-off inspired game reveals some subtle kicks and moves not achievable in the majority of footy games. Pro-Striker is one for those willing to put in the training.

Verdict: A real tenacity tester! Second raters are unlikely to see the match through to extra time.

TECMO WORLD CUP

A Tecmo coin-op conversion which shows how much the Japanese know about arcade entertainment and how little they know about soccer simulation. This is a pure arcade kickabout with no options or simulation features added to the conversion to lend some credibility.

The action is decidedly dated, simply nudging the ball in the direction of the goal is not a fullfilling experience, and kick strength is very unpredictable. Sprite animation is unrefined which results in woolly player-control. This was a popular arcade game in its time, but there are many superior soccer games available for the Mega Drive.

Verdict: About as vacuous as John Motson's tireless pursuit of trivia.

WORLD CUP

A true celebration of the game. Italia 90 World Cup was inspirational, even if England walked away with little more than the fair play award. This

World Cup 90 licence game was a big disappointment four years ago and is comparable to the most mediocre soccer game. Its credibility unravels quicker than that two-foot long piece of hair soccer supremo Bobby Charlton used to wrap around his head.

Graphically, the game is a mess and the players scurrying around makes getting a grasp of play very unlikely. A wasted opportunity. By rights it should have been the biggest soccer simulation ever.

The only consolation is that it now resides in the bargain bucket price range and as Pele used to practice with lead weights on his ankles this game could be good training for playing a decent football game.

Verdict: Deflating! If England not making it to LA 94 is your idea of fun, then this is the game for you.

EUROPEAN CLUB SOCCER

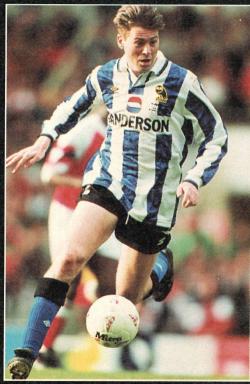

Verdict: Exotic and full of flair, but definitely not an orginal master.

FIFA

EA Sports has made US sports simulations its own. But what do Americans know about our national game? Well rather more than Mr Taylor and his squad it seems. Sure enough, EA Sports shows it means business by producing not

means business by producing not only the best soccer game, but arguably the best Mega Drive game ever. The team has employed many of the techniques perfected in its superb US sports games. Control is smooth and precise, kick power is

easily controllable and the worry of which player is in control never presents itself.

FIFA adopts the TV camera perspective and the scrolling is superlube slick. The option to play a oneoff friendly or compete in the World Cup from any stage is just one of a hatful of options. FIFA boasts a comprehensive, and enjoyable, team managment and training feature to go with the red hot action.

FIFA Works in conjunction with Electronic Arts 4-Way Play adaptor. The fact that this game has won the approval of soccer's governing body says it all.

Verdict: Winner of the golden boot and man of the match. I hate to rain on everybody else's parade, but at the end of the day it's goals what count Brian, and FIFA's already got it's hands on the cup.

SENSIBLE SOCCER

Sensible Soccer took the Kick-Off style of game, analysed what made it good, identified its weak areas and came up with a game which is immeasurably more controllable and, as a result, more fun than Kick-Off.

At first, the small-scale player

A fulfilling player manager aspect is a worthwhile pre-occupation and the league tables are an extra treat for all you budding statisticians.

Verdict: The sensible choice for fans of the overhead perspective. Fast and fun!

MARKO'S MAGIC FOOTBALL

inhead is a new style of robotic hero for the Mega Drive, care of MicroProse. But it's been over a year now since this Sonic challenger was first conceived and little did he then know that he would end up on a mission to save all the stars in the entire Universe.

Nick Thompson and Jim Gardner are the programming brains behind this little metallic marvel. They wanted to give the game

from any other platformer, so Tinhead will be able to use special robotic powers in his quest against one villian by the name of Grim Squidge.

This grim guy is an evil goblin who has flown around the Universe, sucking all the stars into his spaceship. So to return the night sky to it's usual twinkly scene, it's Tinhead's task to rescue all the stars. He can do this by freeing them from the bubbles that Grim has encased them in.

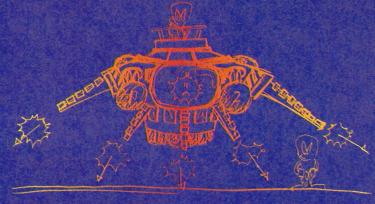
Tinhead doesn't have to worry about carrying any weapons around with him on his search as he uses a multi-shot, head mounted bounce blaster. Sounds pretty cool. There are several simple tasks for Tinhead to perform before a level is completed, like locating buttons that open doors elsewhere on that level before you can proceed.

The play can scroll in any direction and several routes from the start to finally locating stars have been programmed in on the large maps.

The purpose behind all this was the programmers desire to include "non-linear gameplay for enhanced re-playability". That's all right then.

Passwords are available after completing each level, so you can go straight into the game and not spend hours each time you play going through the first levels.

By using a droid with a cool, yet dynamic, image for the star character in the game, the programmers are

planning that Tinhead will appeal to a wide range of game players.

The arty guys at MicroProse who've been working on Tinhead have made the graphics really bright. There are some great effects used on the explosions. All the sprites and all the action here has been created with cartoon-style animation, which they hope will make the gameplay

look a lot faster. Tinhead's character has been well thought out and has loads of cute little features. On collecting certain power-ups, of which there are loads, Tinhead will transform or 'morph' himself so he has use of some form of transport, other than running about. He can also use a rocket pack or space hopper as well as a few other objects.

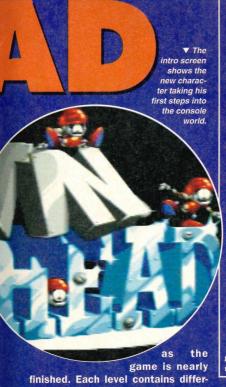

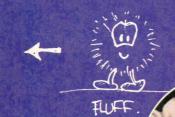

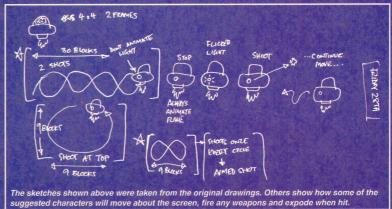

NNY, CHAMPIC

Do you consider yourself to be the best games player in the UK? No. In the world. There are probably a few Japanese lads who can beat me, but I'm the best in Europe, definitely.

Even though you are no longer the European champion?

The only reason I am not the European champion is that Sega cocked it up. When they found out I was working within the industry, they made sure that I wasn't allowed to enter again. I saw the 1992 Sega European finals and I could have whipped any of them.

Were you nervous in the champi-

In each of the competitions there were very different reasons to win. The 1991 UK Championship was to get some form of recognition for myself. Back then I was just a kid playing games. In the European championships there were loads of magazine journalists and TV crews

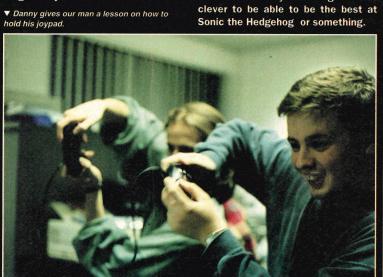
from the UK there, all piling loads of pressure on me to win. I felt I had to win or I was letting the country down. But the two lads I was playing against were absolutely useless, so I walked that one. I had to win the 1992 UK championship for my job, because the reason I got the job in the first place was for being champion. So the UK one was for me and Manchester, but the European one was definitely for the country.

Did people start coming up to you in the street and recognising you?

Two years ago the games industry wasn't as massive as it is now. But People from around my neighbourhood were coming up to me and saying well done and some asking me for tips. I was a very local hero, I mean not Greater Manchester or anything.

Are you arrogant?

I have been known to be big-headed, but it's not something to be specifically proud of, playing games. I mean It's not exactly that big or that clever to be able to be the best at

Are you the best at all games? No. There are a lot of people that are

better than me at certain games. I can get whipped on Streetfighter II or on Tennis. But you judge someone's gameplaying skill on several games,

then you get a better idea. I have played hundreds of console games.

What type are you best at then? I'm very good at racing games and

shoot 'em-ups. RPGs are my favourite kind of game, but I wouldn't say I was particularly good at them because they don't require gamesplaying skills, it's just a matter of intelligence really, working out puzzles and stuff.

Plug your video.

Power Play doesn't tell you how to skip levels on Bubsy Bobcat or Mickey Mouse but it will teach you how to figure out for yourself what to do next. For example all end of level guardians have difficulty curves. You play the first time and probably get killed. You learn something about it. you learn attack patterns or stuff like that. This will help you get through the difficulty curve faster. All the other games videos just give you tips on how to play specific games.

POWER PLAY - THE VIDEO

Domink Diamond says watching this video will make you a better gamesplayer and a better person. But then he would. It certainly looks at all aspects of your games playing life, from sports games to shoot 'em-ups, beat 'em-ups and platformers.

Looking at specific titles from each genre, Danny Curley gives us the benefit of his genius with tips which are supposed to apply across the board. Most are worthwhile, but some are too obvious and others just plain silly. His four joypad grips fall into the latter category. It's by no means comprehensive - the only beat 'em-up tip is to try flying kicks.

Still, it's nicely presented, set in a London Docklands lock-up, complete with gold fish bowl and screens a plenty and there's some witty repartie between Dominik and Danny.

"You're not going to get near my goal again," says the Games Master sarcastically, as Danny makes him a better person again. Games include Bubsy, Cool Spot, Flashback, Teenage Mutant Hero Turtles, Speedball 2, NHL PA, Sensi, Olympic Gold, Xenon 2, Project X and Gauntlet 2, with a Bubsy challenge.

Wouldn't people pick up these skills anyway?

If they had 12 years to spare. What I've learnt and what I've used in the championships I have put in that video. It's for new gamesplayers and veterans alike.

Does it take a certain sort of intelligence to play?

You have to adopt a different sort of common sense to know what's going to happen next, so after playing it for so long you get an idea what's going to happen with a game. It's a different sort of reality to the outside world. I have average common sense in the outside world, but when it comes to gamesplaying I know what's going on. I've heard these reports about three year old geniuses who have completed level one of Mario, and they have been playing it for six months. But they are only geniuses for their own age.

How did you get started doing the video?

A movie production company got in touch with me and said they were interested in doing a games playing video, so I started coming up with ideas. I decided it should be about games skills and techniques rather than tips and cheats and then I started writing the script. They got Dominik Diamond in to present and

we started filming. I wrote the original script, dead scruffy and all, but absolutely loads of it. Then they hired someone to tart it up, cut it down, and structure it more cleanly in the order it should be on the video. So we used that to work off, but me and Dominik actually did the video off the cuff. We looked at the first question and then played it by ear, without the actual words to work on. That's why there's a lot of "errrs" in the video.

What is Dominik Diamond like? He's a top bloke. He's not a Prima donna – he's down to earth.

How did you start games testing? It was actually because I support Man United. Sega sponsored Man United versus Leeds in August 1991, and as I'm 20 minutes from the ground on a bus, I got invited along. In the executive lounge, I sat next to one of the bosses from US Gold and he told me about Teartex and I thought that sounds alright. So he got in touch with them and told them all about me and really it just went on from there.

Did you find the job boring, playing games all day?

It was good at the start obviously, because I wanted to play video games but after about six months it started getting boring. But I only quit because of certain circumstances

that came up.

How much can you earn as a tester?

How much do you earn? It's comfortable but you couldn't set yourself up for life. You've got to work your way up and become a programmer.

When you were a kid did you dream of doing that particular sort of job?

I always wanted to be a spaceman, to go to space. I didn't ever think I'd play games for a living when I was sitting there playing my Spectrum and that. I've never thought of playing games as a carreer move, but it just happened, so I took it. I've been playing now for 12 years, since I was six when my dad got me an Atari for my birthday.

Do you prefer Nintendo to Sega?

The SNES has a lot of fancy chips, so it has loads more colours and colour overlay, but it has a really crap main processor, with no beef to it, whereas the Mega Drive has a dead powerful processor. So it depends what kind of games you're talking about. Games like Mario Kart and Pirate Wings are going to look a lot better on the SNES because of the hardware, but with football games and

platform games, that don't necessarily require Mode Seven or loads of fancy touches but just need a decent processor to get a bit of speed going, you're best off with the Mega Drive.

What's it like being interviewed by national papers?

The thing with the Video Games industry, apart from characters like Sonic and Mario, any other human figures within the industry don't get household name status. Dominik Diamond was the first to change this and, with the video and all, I should be the next.

What's your favourite game?

MD - Fantasy Star 3. But I am absolutely brilliant at Super Mario Kart. I once won £20 gambling on it with a programmer at Teartex.

Manga artists are demi gods in Japan, the equivalent of Take That, the people who appear on talk shows

and sign autographs, kick start new fashions and invent novel catchphrases that spread throughout the entire nation.

The great exaggeration of action and emotion is brought about by a basic love of fantasy, while the extensive use of purely visual effects allow a picture alone to carry a story.

Manga experiments with cinematic techniques, making use of closeups and different angles. Lavish sound FX help the longish films run.

The Japanese regard Manga comics as another medium in which to present a story with just as much to say about life as a novel or a film. Real life is woven into fantasy and heroes DO die, making the whole concept so much more sophisticated and realistic.

The brutality is tied up with Japan's experiences in the Second World War. One Manga artist, Keiji Nakazawa, was six years old and living in Hiroshima when the atom bomb was dropped.

In Akira, hailed as the most unique and original animation film ever, a whole city explodes. Akira is a stark,

tion lies waiting to knock your eyes out if you get your hands on this little beauty.

If you've ever seen the oriental nutter out of Deee-lite then you'll empathise with my stifled chuckles while I watched, open mouthed, Tetsuo II. A mild mannered Tokyo businessman, Taniguchi Tomoo, with a pair of thick black plastic rimmed specs wreaks revenge upon a gang of mutant skinheads.

Why? Because the shiny headed scum bags have abducted the previously balanced bloke's son. He has a series of video's best ever 'mares (his body mutates into a gun in a scene reminiscent of John Hurt's

Alien encounter) and proceeds to cause havoc wherever he roams.

To add to the bizarreness, the skins capture the businessman to experiment on him and inadvertently quicken the body/gun m u t a t i o n process. The special effects are astounding – incidentally, this is no cartoon –

and the bleak, oppressive industrial ambience provides the perfect feel for a crazy, mixed up vid.

It's hard for a vid (or anything for that matter) to be simultaneously suicidally depressing and intensely exciting. Tetsuo is both throughout.

Bit part actors with half their bodies blown away keep coming back for more ultra violent fun whilst Body Hammer (Tomoo) goes through the agonies of arsenals breaking through his flesh without warning.

It's a beauty. The special effects are so frighteningly convincing, it would be hard not to award Tetsuo an adult rating, so it's an 18 I'm afraid. In the shops now from Manga video for £12.99.

It seems this is a problem faced by many of you at the moment. The Menacer gun has been available now for about a year and the games on it have been either a) rubbish or b) unavailable in this country.

I would definitely advise people not to buy one of these things. The gun is stylish enough, breaking down into rifle or pistol configurations but it isn't as accurate as the SNES device and the thing also costs far too much at about £40-£50.

So far the list of games have been far from impressive with Terminator 2 being the only one worth shouting about. Should Sega or any other software house make a sudden commitment we'll let you know.

Dear Steve

I read in last month's issue of Mega Action (Xmas Issue 08) that Eternal Champions could be used with the standard joypad or a thing you called the Activator. From what I gather about the unit this must surely be a mistake on Sega's part or at the very least it must be in very poor taste.

A unit that you attach to your feet and hands which mimic your movements in the game? With all the bad press that violent games are getting at the moment regarding children trying to copy what they see on screen, are Sega mad encouraging players to physically copy the punches and kicks that can obviously hurt so much? Karate and other martial arts people are instructed under strict conditions with serious consequences for improper use.

These games coupled with the Activator seem to me a free-for-all as regards learning such arts. in my opinion it could be potentially lethal. Rachel Lewis, Bournemouth

It looks like you have misunderstood the role of the Activator in the game Eternal Champions. The unit does not mimic your movements exactly, like doing a somersault, but makes your character do one on screen.

The Activator is exactly as the name suggests, a way of switching on and off pre-set moves by making your hands or feet cross a sensor plate at certain points. So it will be more a case of the player hooked up to the unit moving like a Morris dancer than a direct descendant of Bruce Lee.

As for your fears and concerns, well I must agree with you partly. Although this particular unit does not realise a nightmare, further developments might well do. I think that then public outcry would be merited.

Dear Steve,

I have been reading your magazine every month since the third issue and it has gone from strength to strength culminating in a fantastic Xmas issue. You seem to review or preview games well in advance of the other magazines and you also go into much greater detail than the other console offerings.

How far in advance do you get these games and why do you sometimes say that you will be reviewing it next month and then you don't, sometimes not coming back to it for a few issues?

Well Dave, let me introduce you to a little word called slippage. Slippage is a term often bandled about by software companies and can leave magazines very red faced.

You see a software company can schedule the release of a game some six months to a year ahead of time. If all goes well, the first EPROMs arrive and they start to show it off to the respective trade and our humble little mags. We duly include it in a news section or, if things are looking very promising, we might stick it in a Work in Progress. Here we look at not only the game but the programmers and also uncover what the software house expect from the game.

When further developments and tweaks and such like have been made, the finished game is put onto development EPROMs (chips) for us to play properly – we have a development board which allows us to stick the chips in and play the game.

It's at this stage that we will preview the game, give you an outline of what it is all about and comment on how WE think the game will go.

It's now that the word slippage comes into effect. Should magazines. focus groups or other such game testing bodies bring up any relevant points then the game can be sent back for a touch of re-development. This can take weeks or in some extremes months. So you see the problem. We expect the game to be released on such a date, we get excited and tell you all, it slips, we can't review it and end up looking very silly. Such is the life of an upfront games magazine. Although we do try to get everything right, sometimes it is just beyond our control.

Dear Steve,

I read in another magazine some time ago that the Sega Mega Drive and CD 2 would be quite a bit cheaper than their predecessors when they finally came out in this country. This doesn't seem to be true. If anything the price has gone up! Why is this the case and why are some highstreet shops still selling the older Mega Drive and CD at the same price even when it is out of date?

Put quite simply the unit has maintained or increased its price because this country is in an awful state and the pound has not been faring well against other forlegn currencies. The original intention, from what we gather, was to perform certain cost cutting exercises on the machines as well as a major re-design and sell the unit to seriously undercut the competition. The headphone socket has been removed, there has been some internal tidying up and also the CD 2 has had the hydraulic eject removed.

All very nice and no doubt a positive step, except the dire exchange rate has swallowed up the benefits. As for the older machines appearing on the high street, well you are perfectly within your right to ask for the newer unit if it's advertised as such. It probably isn't open policy but you may get a discount for the older units and to be honest there isn't much difference between them. Apart from the newer unit looking just a tad nicer.

Also you mentioned in last months On The Other Hand that Robocop 3 had obtained a 91% vote of approval and was one of the first games to receive the 16 certificate in line with new guidelines just introduced. If you turn to the news section a more in-depth explanation is given but, in a nutshell, it appears the whole classification system has not entirely been confirmed as yet.

Software houses themselves have been the main force behind the move towards regulation. The governing body ELSPA have drawn up some guidelines creating four different age brackets. These will be: up to 10 years old, 10-14 years old, 15-17 years and 18 plus.

These classifications will apply both for console and floppy formats. It is all expected to be put into effect by May 1994.

As for Robocop 3 recieving a 16 certificate, well erm... we made a small mistake it was actually Robocop v. Terminator from Virgin that has been given this rating. Sorry about that, these things happen when you are under-payed. Ho ho.

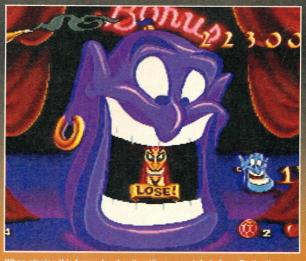

Back to the Future III

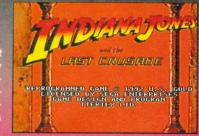

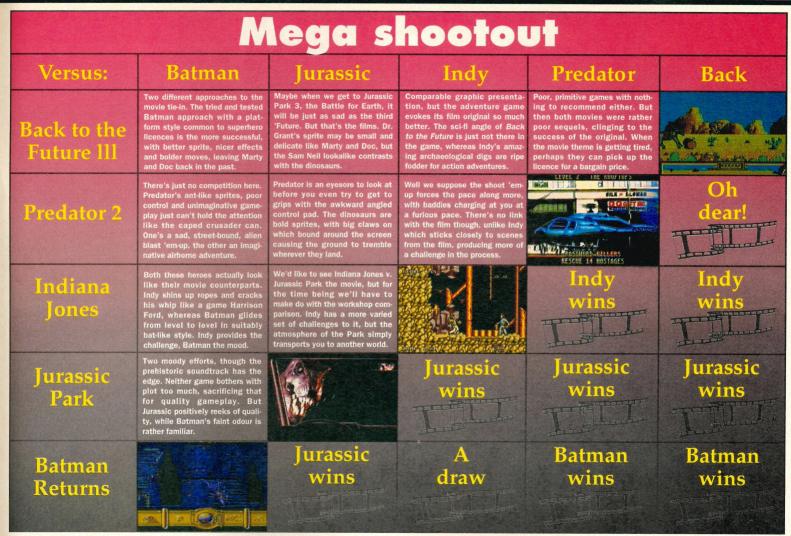


With loads of scenes from the movie, superb dinosaur animation and great dinonovelty value, this is one game that will never become prehistoric.
