"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

PHONO WAR COUNCIL *By Bill Gersh*



In our past (Spring Special) issue we recommended the creation of a phono "war council" to meet in regard to the Petrillo record ban. This has already won the approval of many phono men who feel such a meet is a necessity. The ban on recordings is now in its 8th month and from all indications will continue on indefinitely unless something is done by the phono men themselves to bring the situation to a head.

The events since the ban are worth reviewing. The record manufacturers met with Petrillo and then wrote advising him they could not accept his new "social philosophies" and, in that same letter, also advised him that as far as the "juke box" was concerned, this was his (Petrillo's) problem. No nationally representative group of coinphono operators, jobbers, distributors or manufacturers have as yet met with Petrillo.

After the AFM board meeting in Chicago, Petrillo turned down the records mfrs. and advised them that any further negotiations would have to come from them. The record mfrs. called a meeting at the offices of Columbia Records this past week. (Remember, that during all these negotiations there hasn't as yet been direct mention of the coinphonos and their problems). One of the progressive, smaller record mfrs. (Musicraft Corp.) attempted thru their president, Paul Punor, to settle with Petrillo and they, too, have just been turned down. Petrillo wants a complete settlement with all the recorders.

Regardless of what you personally think of Petrillo, his principles and his methods, the fact remains that no new records are being manufactured and that he has proven himself sufficiently powerful to maintain the ban he imposed, regardless of the statements of many national leaders (such as Elmer Davis of OWI), regardless of the many editorials which have been printed in the nation's press and regardless of Thurman Arnold and even the Senatorial Investigating Committee.

The music operators must have new records to retain the high averages they have attained. New recordings are also necessary to help build and maintain the morale of the armed forces thruout the nation who look to coinphono music for relaxation and stimulation, as Elmer Davis of OWI stated. A "war council" of phono men is most necessary to get together the leaders of the nation's automatic music industry and have them meet with Petrillo and discuss just what he wants from this industry so that some workable basis can be reached. This will be, if it comes into being, the first and only meeting of coin operated music men with Petrillo. There hasn't been any such meet to this date. It is also well to recall here that the war busy phono mfrs. themselves seem unable to get together in a meet with Petrillo at this time. At least so far they haven't met with him nor is there any indication that they will.

Therefore, the distributors, jobbers and operators of automatic music should arrange for a "war council" to make the necessary plans, choose a committee to meet with Petrillo and then decide what is best for all concerned. Many leading coinmen are in favor of such a meet. They believe that this is the one and only way they will ever learn where they stand. It may even be possible for coinmen to arrange for the records they need to be made exclusively for coinphonos. Let the radio transcription and other recorders solve their own problems with Petrillo. It is also understood that Petrillo favors the coinphonos for he realizes they play to larger audiences and his plans are so arranged that records will be manufactured separately for the coinphonos and entirely different recordings made for the home market. These latter will not be mechanically suitable for the coinphonos, it is reported.

But, this time the "new blood" will not only mean coin machine operators being created overnight, it will mean bankers and manufacturers and distributors who have been closely watching this field and who now have many plans under way as to just where they will fit most profitably into the picture in the post war era.

Kahm, in this article in Forbes, brings out many reasons and facts why and how the average business man can profit in the coin machines industry. He does not advise his readers that the fatality rate in the coin machines industry is just as great as in all other industries in the amusement field. Each new man who enters into this field and fails still leaves something of definite value behind him. Regardless of how many may have become interested in investigating this industry because of this article the majority will be out of this business in short order. That goes for potential financiers, distributors, jobbers, mfrs. and operators. Only about 1 out of every 20 ever make the grade.

To any of you who may have become alarmed over this Forbes' article we suggest you rest easy as far as the domestic market is concerned. These new men who will enter into the picture after the war will all be helping to build this industry to greater power and will, therefore, help make this a better business. As far as the international markets are concerned, this will take men of greater knowledge of world conditions than is now contained in this industry. The foreign market will prove extremely profitable, as we have stated many times in the past. This is the one field that has the greatest potentialities. The coin machines market that has already accrued in Great Britain alone could easily take all the production of the present known mfrs. in this industry for many, many months. And this is but one of the world's great markets for coin machines.

Forbes' Magazine has actually helped with this feature article about the coin machines industry as an investment paradise for business men. For if powerful financiers do become interested and make substantial investments they will most certainly not allow their investments to be jeopardized by local police chiefs, sheriffs or any other politicians.

LAND ARMY OPENS FARM SPOTS

The creation of a "land army" this summer, by presidential decree, means the opening of a tremendous number of profitable farm town locations everywhere in the country. With swollen populations, which such a land army will create, the need for relaxation in the farm towns will prove extremely profitable to coinmen.

A few issues ago we advised that some coinmen were already surveying many of the smaller farm town spots in their territories. Now, more than ever, it is a surety that these will prove profitable and therefore if you haven't already done so it is decidedly to your advantage to tie up the locations where these farm workers will gather.

Farm town play action is at low ebb during the week, tho with city people being engaged by the farmers this may not prove the case this year, for there is no doubt that this city labor will probably seek the town each evening. The real play is over the week-end. Beginning with Saturday afternoon it continues on into the wee hours of Sunday morning. Usually the taverns, lunch wagons and drug stores are the hot spots. Some of the best locations in the farm country will be found at out-of-the-way road intersections.

PARKING PROFITS

It's too bad that operators can't handle parking meters on the same basis as they handle pins, slots, consoles and all other equipment. Report just published by the City of Newark, N.J. to the effect that after one year of operation the parking meters installed by the city not only paid off the \$49,400.00 original cost, but, showed a net profit of \$21,968. in addition. That's really sweet operating for Public Safety Director Keenan (who is in charge of the parking meters) and who is also the man who decided that pins and other equipment were "illegal". (Wonder how Keenan feels about coin operated equipment now? Perhaps some enterprising coin machine salesman should now sell him a route or two just in case he isn't appointed "Public Safety Director" after next elections.)

THE OUTDOORS SEASON

One of the most contrasting pictures is that of the coming outdoors season. Some believe that regardless of food and other rationing there will be a big exodus to the country resort spots this summer. Others are of the opinion that because of the national demand for a 48 hour work week, because of food shortages, victory gardens, and other factors, resort spots will actually prove to be only week-end places and that the real outdoors season will be closer to home than ever before. Regardless of what side of the fence you jump to, there is no doubt that there will be a greater demand for relaxation this summer than there has been for many years. Workers demand more relaxation and take it wherever and whenever they can. Therefore there will be no let down in play action this summer for most locations. This will be one outdoors season that will find the majority of the people enjoying themselves as best they can closer to their homes than ever before.

OKLAHOMA PASSES BILL TO TAKE 10% OF GROSS FROM PHONOS

For weeks and weeks, for months, The Cash Box has been advising that all cities, counties, and states are hungrily seeking revenue, especially since the drop in auto license and other incomes and that the coin machines industry is the easiest of all for pickin's - for these politicians.

This past week the State of Oklahoma passed a bill which makes it mandatory for the phono operator to pay 10% of his gross collections. That's about the highest tax we've yet heard. The average coinman doesn't mind taxes. He likes Licenses. But, there is such a thing as being taxed out of business entirely. And, when one state does it, past experience has proven, other states follow.

The very fact that there is no National Board of Trade in existence in this industry to have been present at the meeting of the Oklahoma legislature to fight this bill, again demonstrates one of the glaring weaknesses of this industry. There is a greater need for a National Board of Trade for the coin machines industry today than ever before. This was originally proposed by The Cash Box and the Cash Box again appeals to all of its readers to make it possible as rapidly as they can.

Naturally the Oklahoma phono operator will simply first deduct the 10% at collection time (which means the cost to him will be 5%) and then split the balance on his regular percentage arrangement. But, do you have any idea what 10% of the gross will amount to? And, do you also now realize what other states will do when they see these figures made public by Oklahoma?

"BUSINESS WEEK" TELLS ALL

One of the most successful reasons for the continued great growth of The Cash Box is the fact that it is a CONFIDENTIAL medium for the members of the coin machines industry exclusively - and for no outsiders. Take this one item as an example, "Although there are some big operators, such as Automatic Canteen Co. of America, 70% of the U.S. operators are one-man outfits. A year ago there were 30,000 part-timers and 25,000 full timers; now there are probably 75% as many." We KNOW that even in the flushest of all the flush days in this industry there were never at any one time 30,000 operators or anywhere near that figure and anyone who knows this industry will completely agree with us.

Other items are just as exaggerated. About one man taking care of from 80 to 100 phonos all by himself. Handling 100 cigarotto machines all by his lonesome, etc., etc. (Read the article yourself). But, this one is really a pip. "The country's 7,000 operators (supposedly 7000 music operators) bought 45,000,000 records in '41." That means about 150 records per phono for 400,000 phonos as reported in Business Week, per year.

And while you're trying to digest these figures, just remember that any politico, state senator, city councilman or what have you, are going to clip this story and read it OUT LOUD to tax coin machines in their communities. (We wouldn't be surprised if those figures were quoted at the Oklahoma state legislature to help bring about that 10% gross tax).

We sincerely believe that after you read this item in Business Week that you, too, will become one of the staunchest boosters for The Cash Box and its policy of being a discreet and CONFIDENTIAL WEEKLY FOR THE COIN MACHINES INDUSTRY.

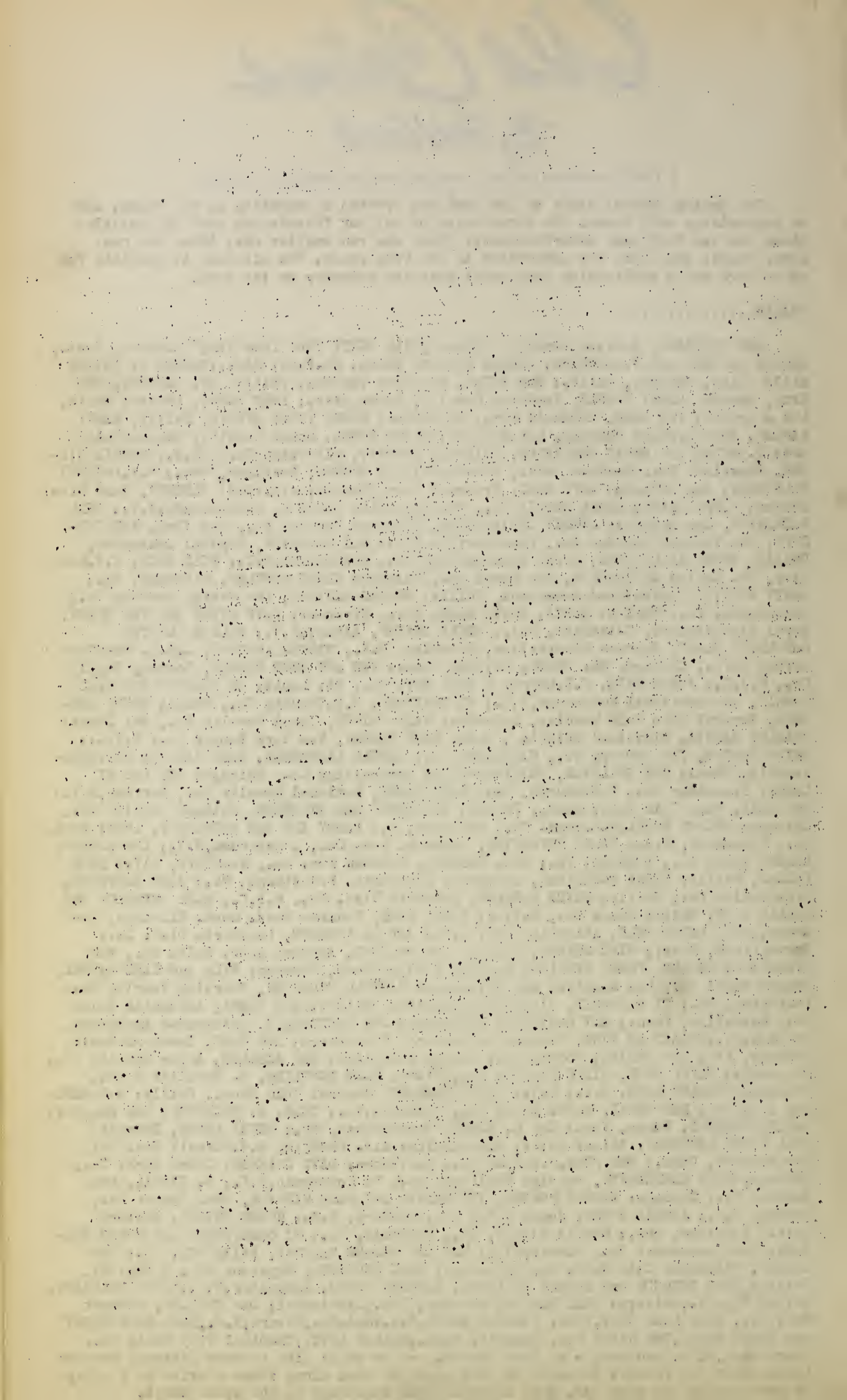

1. THE SCHRÖDINGER EQUATION

The Schrödinger equation is the fundamental equation of quantum mechanics. It describes the time evolution of the wave function ψ of a system. For a particle of mass m moving in a potential $V(\mathbf{r})$, the time-dependent Schrödinger equation is given by
$$i\hbar \frac{\partial \psi}{\partial t} = \hat{H} \psi$$
 where $\hat{H} = -\frac{\hbar^2}{2m} \nabla^2 + V(\mathbf{r})$ is the Hamiltonian operator.

2. THE TIME-INDEPENDENT SCHRÖDINGER EQUATION

For stationary states, the wave function can be separated into a spatial part and a time-dependent phase factor. The time-independent Schrödinger equation is then
$$\hat{H} \psi = E \psi$$
 where E is the energy eigenvalue.

The Heisenberg uncertainty principle states that the position and momentum of a particle cannot both be known to arbitrary precision. Mathematically, for position x and momentum p_x ,
$$\Delta x \Delta p_x \geq \frac{\hbar}{2}$$

- Divergence of a vector field $\mathbf{F} = F_x \hat{i} + F_y \hat{j} + F_z \hat{k}$ is $\nabla \cdot \mathbf{F} = \frac{\partial F_x}{\partial x} + \frac{\partial F_y}{\partial y} + \frac{\partial F_z}{\partial z}$
- Curl of a vector field \mathbf{F} is $\nabla \times \mathbf{F} = \hat{i} (\frac{\partial F_z}{\partial y} - \frac{\partial F_y}{\partial z}) + \hat{j} (\frac{\partial F_x}{\partial z} - \frac{\partial F_z}{\partial x}) + \hat{k} (\frac{\partial F_y}{\partial x} - \frac{\partial F_x}{\partial y})$

The divergence theorem relates the volume integral of the divergence of a vector field to the surface integral of the vector field over the boundary of the volume.

The Stokes theorem relates the surface integral of the curl of a vector field to the line integral of the vector field over the boundary of the surface.

These mathematical tools are essential for solving problems in quantum mechanics and electromagnetism.

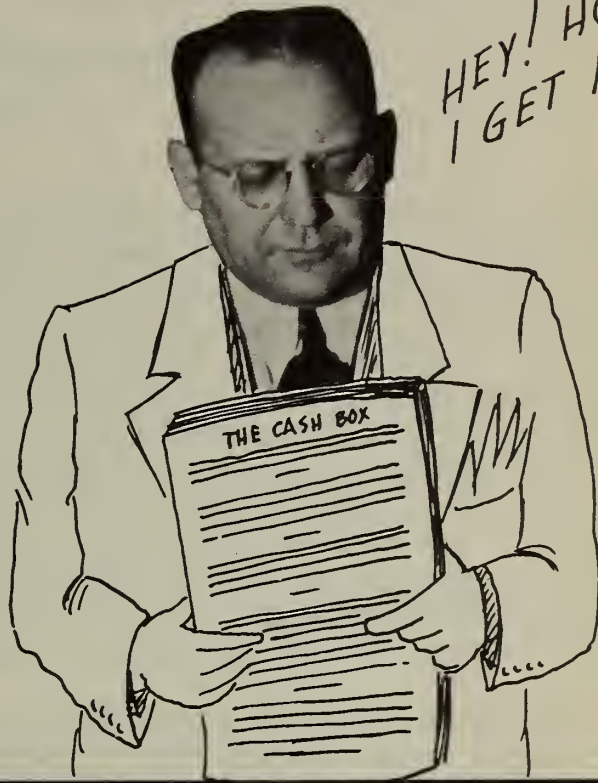

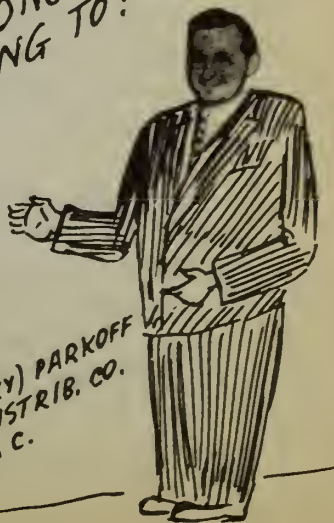
