NO MANUFACTURE ON AUGUST 15TH

In view of the fact that The Cash Box has been in almost daily receipt of large numbers of phone calls, telegrams and letters regarding the publication of an unusual and somewhat surprising story headlined in the July 22 issue of The Billboard as: "MFRS. GET WPB GREEN LIGHT" and with a sub-headline reading: "Ban Removal Will Fermit Production To Start Aug. 15", it believes that this is the time to absolutely bring complete understanding to all this trade.

THERE WILL NOT BE ANY MANUFACTURE OF COIN OPERATED MACHINES ON, OR EVEN ANY-WHERE NEAR, AUGUST 15.

While this total war is on, it is the duty of every American to give everything he possibly can to finish this war FIRST. And to further help with all means to MAKE THAT FINISH STICK SO THAT WAR WILL NEVER AGAIN COME TO PLAGUE THIS NATION.

WFB did not give the "green light" to the coin machines manufacturers, nor to any other manufacturers, for that matter. Donald M. Nelson, Chairman of WFB, just placed into effect his "spot authorization plan" which is his fourth step in PREPARA-TION for the POSSIBILITY of earlier peacetime production.

This does not mean that any manufacturer can apply to WPB to manufacture what he would like to build. This does not mean that on August 15th anyone will even see anything related to peacetime production. It simply means that WPB has opened the door to the POSSIBILITY of peacetime production just a tiny crack so that the smaller manufacturers thruout the nation, and the larger industrialists, too, will be heartened in the fact that this government is concerned with and considerate of them, even while the war is as yet in full blast.

THERE ARE TOO MANY FINE AMERICAN BOYS DYING ALL OVER THE WORLD AT THIS TIME FOR ANY FEDERAL AGENCY TO EVEN THINK OF ALLOWING THE MANUFACTURE OF ANYTHING BUT WAR MA-TERIALS AT THIS TIME.

Any coinman understands that the world's finest machine isn't worth a plugged nickel to him if he hasn't the location for it. He also realizes that a great many former members of this industry, who have been out of this business since the war, will be returning to this trade at the very first opportunity. Some of these men are now in the armed services and others in war work.


It is also a fact that, in addition to these former members returning to this industry, much new blood is also bound to enter into this business the moment the war appears finished. THERE WILL NOT BE ANY NEW MACHINES TO GREET THESE MEN. THEY WILL HAVE TO BUY USED EQUIPMENT NOW ON THE MARKET.

There is no doubt that the men who will be coming back to this business realize that the location is MOST IMPORTANT. Therefore obtaining and holding a location even with a used machine, regardless of what that used machine costs, is ALL IMPORTANT. These men can always promise the location owner the first new machine they receive if and when they receive it.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN TO USED MACHINE PRICES? They have taken a tumble at this time. But these prices are bound to go higher when these men return and grab for locations in the territories they left behind. A visitor from a far away Texas city, in the offices of The Cash Box this week, told about a crippled returned soldier who has already taken a number of locations away from him, and who naturally purchased used machines to hold these spots. This is starting all over the country. It is bound to increase daily.

The Cash Box does not appear on news stands, nor on cigar, drug and candy store counters where such headlines can be read and irritate, not only officials, but service men now giving up their lives, and all the general public. The thought that is back of the minds of everyone in this industry is to GET THIS WAR WON FIRST.

Furthermore, when the time does arrive for WPB to allow a return to peacetime production to the manufacturers in this industry, the WPB Industry Advisory Committee of coin machine manufacturers will most certainly be happy to announce this fact, officially, to this trade.

TAX PLAGUE PUTS THE FINGER ON THIS INDUSTRY

From everywhere in the nation The Cash Box has received letters of commendation regarding its articles on the "tax plague", which seems to once again have started tax seekers digging deeply into the vitals of this industry.

From Atlanta, Gao, comes word that a phono license fee of \$50. per year per machine was attempted but that by hard work phono coinmen were able to bring this down to \$25° per year. Yet, what

is most important, is the fact that there is now a yearly license fee in effect for each and every music machine that will be operated in Atlanta, and which also means there is a great possibility that this yearly license fee can and may be increased in the future on the whim of one or more of the legislators in that city council.

Chicago, center of the industry, is paying \$50. per year license fee for each coin phono operated there. At the present time Chicago's coimmen are bitterly fighting this excessive fee. The state of Oregon arcade men seem to be puzzled and tremendously upset by a sudden demand that they pay a yearly license fee ranging from \$1. to \$50, on each individual machine in their spots and this tax is being rolled back to June, 1943.

Terre Haute, Ind. is now also faced with a \$50, per year license for every phono. From Birmingham, Ala., comes word that this coming year may see even more and higher taxation in effect. Texas coinmen report the possibility of new and greatly increased license fees for coin operated equipment of all kinds.

In fact, from everywhere in the nation comes a general demand that a "National Tax Council" as proposed by The Cash Box for so many, many months, be created now to help the members of this industry out of this tax jungle which can stifle the future growth of this business.

There is no doubt that each and every man engaged in this business realizes that this industry is highly vulnerable to much new and increased taxation. It seems, many times, that the first thoughts of legislators seeking ever greater revenue is to turn to coin operated equipment and simply plaster this business with the highest possible yearly license fee that can be made to stand up.


A "National Tax Council" is necessary. There is no doubt that such a council, in time, would prove invaluable to all in this industry. It would have a most complete file of all present taxes on coin operated equipment. It would know how to combat confiscatory and inequitable taxation. It would be prepared to rush experienced tax men to any threatened section of the country. Men who would know and understand the many peculiarities of this business.

It would have invaluable data at its finger tips which would prove of tremendous help to the average coinmen when tax problems arose. It would even be able to set taxation precendents to benefit all in this industry. It would probably become the most important organization that this industry could ever have working for its benefit.

It seems to be extremely difficult to convince some coinmen, especially those men in territories where the "tax plague" hasn't yet hit, that there is the very certain possibility of taxation suddenly arising. Because such coinmen are backward about getting together into a strong single group to strengthen their individual efforts, if tax problems do arise to molest and seriously hurt them, all the nation's coinmen are affected.

The fact that a few believe they can handle any tax situation which may arise with competent dispatch, does not help the other men in another territory in that very same state. And many times, as has been proven in the past, even these first find themselves suddenly heavily taxed regardless of their competency.

Only by coming together now into a "National Tax Council" can all coinmen assure themselves the proper cure for whatever taxation problems may arise in the future.

Inequitable taxes that have already become law will take many, many years to change. This, as all common who have had legal experience know, is negative legislation and the most difficult sort of legislative action to put thru. But, prior to new taxation proposals being voted into law, there is the definite possibility that a strong "National Tax Council" can prove of great value to all in this business.

Many leading coinmen have asked that The Cash Box be first to help arrange for such a council by quietly calling together the leaders of each state into an immediate meet and putting the problem before them.

But, it should be remembered that ODT has asked that no meetings whatever take place at this time. Regardless of this fact this meet can be regarded as of an extremely essential nature, even an emergency measure, for with taxation continuing to crawl up to ever greater heights, especially where this industry is concerned, the need for such a meet can be placed before ODT and permission requested to hold it.

This industry can definitely point out to ODT that this meeting is to help protect its future as an industry. Surely no one in this business wants to see coinmen strapped with excessive inequitable taxation as the post-war era approaches. This will not only cut sales, it will also have the effect of discouraging the great expansion which is promised this business.

The Cash Box therefore believes, since it must openly answer these great many requests which have come to it to arrange for such a meeting, that this be placed before all this industry and allow the members of this trade themselves to decide if and when they want such a meet called to create a "National Tax Council".

THE CABARETS DID IT !!

In keeping with the thought that this industry, now undergoing extenuating suffering which a sudden eruption of the tax plague has put upon it, should go all out to bring better understanding and thereby more equitable taxation for itself, the nation's cabarets are presented as an example, because of their success in eliminating the 30 per cent excise tax which was imposed upon them by none other than the Federal government, of what can be accomplished by a strong and collective front; so sorely needed in this industry at this time.

Surely cabarets are not "essential" industry. There has, from time to time, been much mud slinging in their direction, regardless of the columnists who attempt to glorify this business. Parents thruout the nation are certainly not amenable to having their children visit these places.

Yet, the cabarets, by quick and completely collective action clear across the nation, and with the addition of good and strong publicity, were able to force the Federal Government to revise the 30 per cent excise tax that was placed on them, after it had become law, and during wartime, too, to the present 20 per cent level under which even the most daring and outspoken government officials couldn't go, because of the fact that so outstanding and impressive an industry as the movies is paying a 20 per cent excise tax at this time. And certainly the movies are of greater importance to America's millions, poor and rich alike, than are the cabarets.

The very fact, tho, that the nation's cabarets were able to reduce this 30 per cent levy, after it had become a national law and especially during a time when the invasion was ready to burst upon Europe's shores, is something for coinmen to study and carefully and thoughtfully consider, for their own good.

The nation's coinmen are faced with growing taxation at every turn. Not only is the Federal Government obtaining inequitable tax, as proven in the case of counter games, pin games, arcades, etc., but states, counties and cities are now also imposing tax, in yearly license form, upon coin operated equipment of all types without due consideration and without any too careful and industrious study of the true facts.

This is because there is no strong, collective front at present to carefully explain and offset these tax makers, prior to tax legislation being passed and becoming law. (Such a front was urged, in collaboration with the allied industries, in the August 1, 1944 issue of The Cash Box. Such a front would help tremendously to bring about greater consideration for the members of this industry.)

Unless the members of this industry create an organization, or some sort of body to protect their interests nationally, as well as in local communities all over the country, this "tax plague" will continue to spread far and dig deep, and will eventually have the effect of stifling this trade's greater post-war growth.

The average coinman today, in many states, pays from \$2. to \$5. tax per week per machine, disguised as a yearly license fee. After the war with much less money in circulation and with wages returning to some sort of normality, such heavy taxation will tend to greatly curtail operations.

This means loss of sales to manufacturers, distributors and jobbers. It means loss of a tremendous amount of revenue to operators. It means that the extra necessary monies which would go to assure a stronger operator backbone for this industry, will be flowing into channels which, because of lack of understanding of this industry, doesn't give one tinker's damn whether this business does or does not survive.

The cabaret tax victory should act as a lesson to coimmen all over the nation. It proves once again the force that a strong, collective body can exert. It also proves that by coming together to intelligently and capably work for tax reduction and for understanding and equitable taxation where and when necessary, even so non-essential an industry as the cabaret field, can succeed.

Surely, then, an infant industry, which many of the nation's leading industrialists believe holds great promise for a glorious future, should certainly be able to help itself to overcome and forever squelch this growing "tax plague" by the creation of a "National Tax Council".
