THE NATION TALKS AMUSEMENT

LOOK TO NEW GAMES

The amusement coinmen of the nation have faith and confidence that this is one division of the field that will present many new innovations. As explained by leaders, this is one division that just cannot go back to the machines that were formerly popular. This is made impossible by the very fact that these machines have been played time and time again and that the public expects something radically new and different which will once again attract their interest, in much the same manner as did the pin game when it first appeared in the industry. The amusement game coinmen believe that the first really new and different units will appear in their field. This, they believe, will also make possible the opening of much territory.

RE-OPENING OF TERRITORY

There is no doubt that there was general enthusiasm occasioned by the re-opening of much of New Jersey's profitable territory. The re-opening of New York, Detroit, Chicago, Cleveland, Milwaukee and many other metropolitan centers is looked forward to so that once again amusement devices will be more popular, and naturally, more profitable to operate. In addition many coinmen are of the belief that the post-war era will bring with it greater liberality, as far as gaming generally is concerned, and that the coin machines industry, too, will benefit from this more greatly liberalized attitude forced upon officials by the public.

RADICALLY DIFFERENT GAMES

Great innovations are expected in all types of amusement machines. Changes of styles, play action and of design are foreseen by the average coinman. He is not only convinced that the manufacturers already have these changes under way but he astually expects to see these in the first games that will come off the post-war production lines. Whether or not these men will be disappointed is up to the manufacturers.

LOCATIONS WANT NEW GAMES

A survey by the manufacturers, such as just made by The Cash Box to compose this concensus, may change a great many ideas as regards the men in this industry and the equipment they expect for post-war. These men would much rather roll along with the machines they now have on location than pay for new equipment if the new equipment is not different and better than what they now have. They also state that amusement games is one field in which the player definitely seeks the newest and latest ideas to challenge his skill. Therefore, they claim, the manufacturers must live up to the promise which is expected by their locations from these amusement coimmen.

NO WORRY ABOUT PRICE

The price of the new equipment, whatever it may prove to be, does not seem to worry the men in the amusement games field. They feel that the machines in their division of the industry are priced according to what they will earn. Therefore, they state, they are willing to pay higher prices for machines if those machines will, in turn, earn enough to warrant this payment. They are not too concerned over what the price will be, but they are absolutely adamant in that the machines which they do buy be the sort of equipment where returns will be comparable to the investment made.

TAXATION

Taxation was and still is a problem in the amusement games field. The average man in this field would rather see slot machines legalized thruout the nation and pay an extraordinarily high license fee for such legalization than have to worry about the decision of each community as to the proper and sufficient tax to place on his business. The average pin game operator, for example, does not worry so much about the license fee as he does about the machines that will be produced for post-war. He is firm in his belief that if the manufacturers will produce machines for him that will earn sufficient revenue he will not have to worry about the size of the license required, for then the better take will provide for this part of his overhead. In short, the average amusement machines operator is extremely optimistic regarding the post-war era and even foresees it as a period of great prosperity, regardless of what sort of taxation may be in force.

UNEMPLOYMENT NO SCARE

Amusement game leaders point to the statements of many of the nation's leading economists in which these men have said that perhaps as many as five millions of people will be out of work during the transition from war to peacetime production, and possibly for as long a period as six months. The amusement coinman believes that even if this should come about he will profit during such a period for he feels that the average laborer will probably be ready to play at whatever economical amusement offered him. In short, he compares this possible unemployment period with the past depression when pin games jumped into the limelight of national popularity.

MORALE HIGH

No one has been able to dampen the spirits of the men engaged in the amusement machinos field, and from all present indications, it is a certainty that no one will ever be able to do so. These men have found that not only could they carry forward during this wartime period but that the public approved of their equipment - and therefore they look forward to even greater approval and a finer future in the postwar era.

PIN GAMES

Those who favor pin games believe that finer machines of this type will appear on the market. The free ball return feature was found to be very profitable during the war period. The revampers have proved this. The jackpot feature on these games has also proved itself. It was also learned that the public liked the longer play they got on these machines and also that greater liberality was the general rule of many officials who have more or less become accustomed to pin games being in their official area.

HIGHER PRICES

It is also believed by the average coinman that pin games will be anywhere from 25% to 100% higher in price than they were ever before. Theypoint to the many revamps now commanding over 100% more in price than do former machines in the field. Yet, they explain, this was only made possible because these games earned more and therefore were worth the additional investment.

BETTER BUSINESS MEN

It is safe to state that the average pin game operator has become a much more astute business man and that he is today among the best of the "percentage figurers" in this industry. The pin game field, as long as it continues to contain men with confidence and fortitude, is sure to go ahead and prove itself even more popular than ever before.

CONSOLES

In the consoles field a great many new thoughts and ideas are sure to be born, all believe. Many lessons were learned during this wartime period, leaders claim. These lessons will not be hastily forgotten by those men who were out on the firing line. Already one manufacturer is reported to have a four-way console featuring $5\not/$ $10\not/25\not/50\not/$ play chutes. This opens the path to many other ideas of a similar nature. Many are most certain that this is one field wherein some really new ideas will be born. They are especially certain of this fact for they feel that because of the prices they are willing to pay for equipment, the average manufacturer in this field will offer them only the finest product he can produce.

ONE-BALLS

One-balls have won a tremendous following all over the nation. Tho it seemed, at the start of the war, that this field had dwindled down to a very low ebb, it proved that it could come back stronger than ever. It has proved itself one of the most profitable fields, in this industry.

ONE-BALL REVAMPS

The fact that many revampers made a try at the one-ball field is significant of the popularity of the machines in this division. The one-ball men are looking forward to the last great games produced with some changes and better designs and are willing to pay even more for these than they did before. All they want is speedy delivery to meet their needs.

SLOTS

Slots have come a long way during this war period. Practically out of the picture, from a national standpoint, at the beginning of the war, they are now among the most outstanding phenomena of this industry. Slots are so popular today that the general belief is that the average factory in this industry producing them, and regardless of its production facilities, will not be able to meet the needs of the trade for many months to come.

NEW SLOT TERRITORY

Slots have re-opened much territory for themselves. The belief is now general that greater liberality and better understanding of gaming is bound to ensue with the ending of this war and that even more territory is then expected to open for these machines. The slot operator, therefore, optimistically looks forward to a good run for many, many months to come with new territory being made available, and with many new angles and ideas being born in this field.

COUNTER GAMES

Possibly the most sorrowful disappointment in the amusement games field was the heavy Federal excise tax placed on the counter games which pushed these popular little moneymakers out of the national picture as a factor. The many of these still continue to be seen thruout the country there is no doubt that many thousands more of these games would have appeared on locations were this Federal tax removed, or at least lowered to a point where such operation would be profitable.

LOWER COUNTER GAMES TAX

The average counter games operator is of the belief that "hundreds of thousands" of these machines will come back into the field if someone or some organization will get this Federal excise tax removed or reduced. There are some in this division of the field who are of the opinion that the Federal government itself, perhaps a year or two after the war, will remove this heavy excise tax of its own accord while doing away with much other surplus taxation.

ARCADE EQUIPMENT

Most interesting is the fact that the average arcade owner feels that his business is bound to continue the most outstanding of all in this industry. He also believes that the arcade has only just started to assert itself. Former arcades, he explains, were just feeling their way blindly. The modern arcade opened the eyes of a great many in this field, and tho its popularity was never expected to grow so great, it is today accepted as an integral part of the amusement machines field and, he believes, will prove even more important and popular in the post-war era.

"THEATRES OF AMUSEMENT"

For many years the average man was of the belief that his division of this business was destined for more attractive and scintillating heights. He feels that the arcade hasn't yet reached the right path. But the day will come, he is certain, when arcades will open a new path to greater progresssiveness and popularity for all amusement games. The average arcade man looks to his place becoming a "theatre of amusements". The same sort of idea that led to the modern motion picture theatre.

CONFIDENCE

Most interesting, of course, is the fact that the entire amusement games division of this industry breathes such great confidence. In fact it can be said to be cockily sure of itself. It believes that just as it led this industry into many great innovations in the past, it will do so again in the future. This confidence is more apparent in this division of the industry than in any other.

PROGRESSIVENESS

Its manufacturers, the members of this amusement games field believe, are the most progressive. It explains that the men who have always been most fond of the amusement machines division of this business have also been the men who proved themselves the most progressivle. These men are most certain in their belief that this is the division of the field that will open the way to a great many new ideas which will prove themselves sound in the post-war years to come.

FIRST NEW PRODUCTS

And this isn't all. Leaders in this field also believe that this will be the very first division of this industry which will really present more and different post-war products - not just improvisations of what was last produced prior to the war. They sincerely believe this for they claim that this is one field which simply cannot afford to even attempt to fool the public. They state they are entirely dependent on the whims and fancies of each player of their machines. Therefore, they are closer to the public than any other division of this industry, they claim.

FAITH

From this concensus there is no doubt that the average man who has been engaged in the amusement games division of this coin operated machines industry is gratified by the fact that he and all the rest of his field rode thru a trying time with flying colors. The his business may not be as stable, he admits, as other divisions of the field, there is no doubt that his faith in his field is very great. He eagerly looks forward to new innovations, the great and revolutionary changes coming into his field first, in fact, far before they appear in any other. He is proud of the fact that his division of the industry can go ahead, even on a small scale, to earn more than other divisions on a comparable investment basis.

COMPLAINTS POUR IN ON POOR EQUIPMENT BEING SHIPPED. TRADE ANGRY. BETTER

BUSINESS BUREAU NEEDED TO HELP CURE THIS PROBLEM. TRANSPORTATION FIRMS HOT ABOUT BEING PLACED ON SPOT.

NEW YORK — Complaints continue to increase from thruout the nation regarding the fact that more and more shipments of broken, mechanically imperfect, uncleaned, unchecked, misrepresented and improper merchandise are being received by many buyers. Many of these men claim that some of the machines now being shipped aren't even worth the crates that contain them.

The Cash Box' efforts to rid the trade of "deposit grabbers" has been successful. For sometime now there have not been any serious complaints in this regard. For the past six or seven months complaints regarding poor equipment shipments also fell to a minimum. But with the opening of the Fall season, and with business stepping up daily, complaints have suddenly started to come in once again that equipment being received, and purchased in good faith, is not only the worst yet, but that the excuses given by some of these sellers are the lamest ever heard.

The Cash Box prides itself on the fact that all of its subscribers know it has fought this evil with every ounce of its energy and power. It has come forth openly (as it is doing now) and boldly stated the facts in an effort to bring an end to such practise.

This industry can terribly harm itself for long duration with every leading transportation company in the nation by continuing to blame these firms as "damagers", instead of truthfully declaring, in advance, the condition of the machines being shipped. These irresponsible individuals and firms in this industry whose intentions are to ship defective merchandise, and who misrepresent this merchandise, have taken to placing the blame entirely on the transportation firms.

Every such complaint run down to the ground by the transportation companies and proved false is a black mark against all this industry. And too many such black marks can halt any shipping guarantees for this trade.

Naturally, not all complaints from buyers can be accepted verbatim. Many times the buyer, in an effort to chisel down to the lowest possible price, must realize that he is then taking chances on what will be shipped to him. But where the buyer is willing to pay the price quoted, he expects equipment to be at least representative of that price.

It is in such latter instances where a certain few, an outer fringe who have developed in this industry during this wartime period, have taken advantage of the buyers, have blamed the transportation firms instead of telling the truth. They have thereby done great harm to all the trade. And this has also resulted in a loss of faith in sellers, even tho the great majority of the selling firms are extremely honorable and practise only the finest business methods.

It is therefore up to the better firms in this trade to help weed out these few who have hurt all — and bring them to the attention of everyone in this business so that this industry will not find itself suddenly in a turmoil of poor business practises.

Furthermore, with conditions what they are today, the average man must, many times, go a great many miles to obtain the equipment he wants. This requires that he place complete trust in the seller. It is therefor imperative that the seller treat him as he, himself, would want to be treated. And rather than allow the buyer to become suspicious of him — the seller who has aways practised the finest of business methods must expose the sort of firm that can not only harm him but everyone else in his industry.

In this same matter The Cash Box many, many months ago published a "pledge" and asked all in the trade to sign it. Many hundreds were signed and have been receipted and certified. This was but one of the attempts to get every single firm, and every individual in this business, to set himself up as a better business bureau in his own right.

Let it be recorded here and now that the greater majority of the complaints which have reached The Cash Box have not been for merchandise purchased thru the many advertisements which appear in The Cash Box each week. To help bring this about The Cash Box startled this industry (as well as the entire publishing world) and is still the only medium in this trade that offers "FREE DEPOSIT INSURANCE' up to \$100.00. It took this daring chance in an effort to help cure the "deposit grabber" situation. It now seeks a

similar plan in an effort to help cure the practise of those few who are damaging the reputation of this entire industry with the transportation companies by blaming them for the poor equipment shipped.

For a great many months The Cash Box has urged that a Coin Machines Better Business Bureau be created, to cure this evil, to help make this a greater and finer industry, and to help place all in this trade on the highest possible business plane.

The Cash Box again appeals to all in the field to help create this Coin Machines Better Business Bureau, not only on a national, but also on a sectional and local basis. Thereby those who have been forced to undergo loss from shipments of poor merchandise will have a means and method to bring those few unscrupulous people to judgment. These few who disregard even the primary tenets of good business practise. And to bring to those few, who can harm all in this industry, the punishment they deserve.

FALL SEASON GETS OFF TO FLYING START

NEW YORK — As predicted the Fall season of 1944 has started with a resounding bang. Buying has upped. Demand for machines of every type is noticeably greater. Leading coinmen are of the belief that this upswing will continue into the Winter months, and that by January '45 there may be an entirely new trend noticeable thruout the trade.

It also seems that the average coinman has forsaken the belief that he will see new, post-war equipment within a month or so.

He has therefore settled down to assuring himself that his present business will continue on at the best possible pace until announcements are officially forthcoming from the manufacturers or from Federal agencies as to just when production can be really expected.

WPB LISTS SCARCE MATERIALS AFTER V-E DAY

WASHINGTON — The War Production Board in its final report on the supply of important industrial raw materials included tin, lumber, paper, kraft-type container board, and some many other items. These will all continue to be scarce after V-E day.

WPB also listed 17 other materials whose supply will be insufficient to take care of war and essential industrial demands. In this group are medium and small steel castings. (The items listed here are used by coin machines manufacturers.) Explaining this selection of ma-

Explaining this selection of materials that will continue scarce even after the defeat of Germany and the 40% cutback that is expected on war materials manufacture about 30 days after V-E day, WPB stated, "A German collapse may or may not come quickly. When it arrives, large cutbacks should change favorably the materials situation."




LAST WEEK

THIS WEEK

Once again this past week showed a definite rise in the average national collections of all types of equipment thruout the country. Coinmen were enthusiastic in their reports that machines are rapidly recovering from the Summer slump and that, in some cases, collections are better than they have ever been before. Of course, here and there, in a few isolated cases thruout the nation, collections are still down and some are very slow at recovery. But, for a general national average for this past week, collections have risen better than 16%.

Once again the amusement games field has taken the lead. In New Jersey there is much enthusiasm over the re-opening of pinball territory. Tho the largest and leading city of the state, Newark, hasn't as yet opened, and all of Union County, including Elizabeth, are still meditating and waiting for local interpretation of this highest court decision the general belief is that pinballs will appear in Essex and Union Counties after the November elections.

Music continues its upward averages, as far as collections are concerned. Many music operators report that this Fall season of 1944 looks like it will prove to be a record breaker as far as collection recovery is concerned. These men also report that there has been a great swing to the new, popular records and that President Roosevelt's appeal to James C. Petrillo and the AFM has instilled great optimism in many that new records will be forthcoming from all firms in controversy with AFM at this time. This enthusiasm is reflected in the better play now being enjoyed by music coinmen.
