Code Masters cuts cost of disc games

CODE Masters has announced the cheapest disc games software which will retail for \$2.99.

In the past, the cheapest disc software was produced by Mastertronic which released \$4.99 games. Bruce Everiss, marketing manager of Code Masters, is confident about the new price point. "These will be the best-selling disc products in Britain," he says.

The initial games released consist of four titles, BMX Simulator, Grand Prix Simulator, ATV Simulator and Fruit Machine Simulator. Everiss would not say how many titles will be released each

The packaging is claimed to be

exceptional. "It is similar to a Album sleeve with a flap at the top," Everiss says.

Despite the low cost of the games, Everiss says they are not cheap quality, "They are highquality existing products"

The \$2.99 price point is part of a long-term Code Masters plan to release further titles, "We may eventually release the disc titles and cassette titles at the same time," Everiss says.

Mastertronic, one of Code Masters rivals for the position of number one budget software house was surprised to hear of Code Masters plans and a spokesperson said "Watch this space".







HIS week's news that Code Masters is to release C64 disc software for only \$2.99 begins another battle in the budget war. Particularly when you realise that this new price undercuts the previous price of budget discs by more than 40 percent, a price set by Code Master's rival for the budget top spot, Mastertronic.

Mastertronic and Code Masters have been fighting for the honour of being king of budget software ever since Code Masters was launched at the 1986 Personal Computer Show. Between them they have swapped more claims and counter-claims than they have released games - all to

prove that they are number one.

As the battle continues the other budget players, such as The Power House and Alternative Software, steadily

gain ground with a string of hits.

Budget software is still a growth market with new companies joining every week but this week's re-launch of the Grandslam Bug Byte label will find a very different market from that which supported its previous \$2.99 games.

Now it is a forum for releasing former full-priced games at a fraction of their original price and, by the recent chart successes of Ghostbusters, Way of the Exploding Fist and Steve Davis Snooker, it seems this is what people want.

This all adds to the pressure on full-priced titles which must achieve higher levels of gameplay and quality to survive. The day is dawning when 8-bit software will be available only at a budget price as full-price software houses write only for 16-bit machines.

U.S. software house Word Perfect has announced that it will not be releasing an Atari ST version of its word processor because of piracy being rife in the market. Similarly, Epyx refused to release an Atari 8-bit version of its classic Winter Games for the same reason. Others are set to follow suit.

The message is abundantly clear. Think carefully before you "borrow" a copy of the latest game. If you do, you might just persuade a software house that it is not worth supporting your machine.





Sexist software

am writing with reference to John McCarthy's letter in the issue dated May 19-25. I do not mind people voicing their opinions on sexism, but considering that most programmers are male, and I believe most home computer users are male, there is bound to be a certain amount of sexism which cannot really be excused.

I found it difficult not to laugh at McCarthy's letter, as he describes capitalism as if it were a disease. It is as much as a disease as communism or socialism; vote with your wallet is a good rule for buying your software, because if a company sees demand fall it will stop making such programs. The ordinary software house is out to give you what you want. If not, it goes out of business from lack of sales.

There has not been one law which has accounted for individuals and there never will be. No amount of laws and demonstrations can prevent prejudice – they just breed it and suppress it. The only people who can stop prejudice are the parents of children, the people who have the most impact on them.

None of this, however, has anything to do with computing, so while I am writing I might as well warn Amstrad users wanting to buy printers. I bought a 9-pin printer and found that pin 8 and 9 would not work. Any number using the Most Significant Bit, bit 8, had the MSB knocked off when entering the printer. This is because the Amstrad printer port has pin 9 which the printer uses for receiving numbers with the MSB - as a GND pin, meaning if I sent 10000000 (Binary) to the printer, it would see it as 0 and if I sent 10110101 to the printer, it would see it as 00110101. I hope this is helpful. Richard Shepard,






Live by the sword

Legend of the Sword -Atari ST

Six brave compatriots stand on the deck of a ship as the captain decides where to land. The captain was faced with three possible landing sites, each offering new opportunities and dangers to the men who would have to disembark. The captain calls to the leader of the men. "Where to?" he shouts. So begins a most peculiar adventure, as the company of six sets out in search of the fabled shield and sword of Anar, the only weapons capable of defeating the evil wizard Suzar.

Suzar is a wizard of great power and cunning and being so makes him a threat to the king who wants him dead. The task would be impossible without the







shield and sword, so it is essential to collect them before an encounter with Suzar.

As the leader of the group of questors you have your own personal reasons for finding and killing the wizard. Many years ago your character was the lone survivor from a battle in which Suzar decimated your compatriots with his foul magiks.

Legend of the Sword is an adventure game which utilises GEM to speed the interaction between the player and the problems. All movement can be achieved by clicking the mouse pointer on one of the three movement icons – one icon for up and down, another for compass movement, and one controlling in and out movement.

The second of the three main display areas shows the menu selected from the top of the screen. Some of the menus contain frequently-used words and are used to speed normal text input. The structure of the menu is such that it is possible to play the game almost entirely with the mouse.

That area of the screen is also used to display the map which the computer makes as you explore the adventure. By clicking on the map with the mouse pointer a full screen display of the map can be obtained.

The third section of the screen

displays two graphics, one for the current location and one for the current activity of the player.

Despite this seeming lack of interest in your welfare the men seem like a good bunch. They will help you occasionally if it is not too inconvenient. Your fellow travellers may follow you as you explore the land but they tend to keep to themselves as much as possible, often standing back and watching as you leap.

This is an adventure with a feel of a role-playing game as you and your five fellow adventurers run round bashing heads.

As the story unfolds it becomes apparent that it is aimed at older adventurers. As seen by the sometimes bloodthirsty graphics, a parser knows some of the phrases an adventurer will use when a little stuck.

As an unusual style adventure with good graphics and fast gameplay, this could be the start of something big.

Brother set to sew up PC market?

After establishing a reputation for producing high-quality sewing machines, typewriters and microwave ovens, Brother looks set to establish a niche in the PC market. Leslie Bunder reports.

Prother is well-known for producing printers, microwaves and even sewing machines. At this year's Hanover Fair, Brother announced that it will be entering a new market. After much research, it has decided to make in-roads in the IBM PC-compatible market. "We have a large base of Brother dealers who started asking about a Brother PC. They wanted to sell a machine which offered good profit margins to make it worth their while, so we decided to offer a machine with full support," says John Carter, national sales and marketing manager.

The initial Brother range will consist of the BC-10 and BC-20. The BC-10 offers

640K of RAM and one 380K 5.25in. floppy disc drive as standard with the option of additional floppy or hard disc drives. The

BC-20 is a much more advanced machine; it offers 1MB of RAM and a 1.25MB 5.25in. floppy disc drive. Both machines have options of hard disc and a choice of monitors.

Despite the fact Brother is from Japan, the machines are not manufactured there. "We have close contacts with a company in Korea called Goldstar. It manufactures a number of our knitting machines and other goods. We provide a specification for the way we want the product to be built. The cost of designing and constructing your own PC is enormous. Our intention is to offer it as an addition to our product line," Carter says.

It is a possibility that Brother may consider production in the U.K. Last year





the company transferred production of its printers from Japan to Wrexham. "There is always a possibility as the U.K. side manufactures typewriters, microwave ovens and printers. It is not planned at the moment to make a PC in the U.K.," Carter says.

Until now Brother has manufactured computers for other manufacturers. "We make a lap-top for Wang. So it was only a matter of time until we produced a machine with our name."


Brother has still not finalised a price for the machines. "We will expect them to be 10-15 percent higher than the Amstrad price," Carter says.

Does Carter see the machines competing against Amstrad or other PC manufac-

turers? "We do not see ourselves really competing against anyone in that market. It is obvious Amstrad has the mass market area but not everybody wants to buy an



4018 printer - the fastest dot matrix on the market.

Amstrad. Our whole effort behind it is the support and the training we offer. If you do not buy an Amstrad from Dixons, what support do you get? We have a number of accounts which will buy Brother because of the support we offer."

As well as the PCs, there are plans for


other computers to be released. "We are looking very much at the lap-top market and very much at the 386 market. We crawl before we run – that is why we do not have a whole range of products. If we are successful in this market we will extend the range."

With Brother producing computers and printers, is there any possibility that it will consider a portable word processor like the one from Smith Corona? "Our typewriting division will be bringing out products like that – I think there is definitely a need for it. Our machine will be similar to the form of the Smith Corona, which has a typewriter with a printer and a screen," says Carter.

In the last two months Brother has launched the HL-8 as its first laser printer and is claiming a 10 percent share of the laser printer market. "The market for laser printers is enormous; it is growing very, very rapidly. In the future many applications will go towards laser. We have not ordered enough," Carter says.

Despite the emergence of laser printers, Carter still thinks there is a market for dot matrix. "There will always be the dot matrix printer because people need it for printing carbon sets. There will always be a need for an impact printer."

How will the EEC plan to impose a levy

on Japanese dot matrix printers affect Brother? "At the moment the effect on Brother is not enormous as we do not have a huge market share like Epson."

With the PC computers to go on sale at the end of June, it will be interesting to see how well-received they are by the enduser. According to Carter: "We are putting a good deal of support into the machines."



PUZZLE SOLUTION

Solution to Animal Magic of May 26-June 1.

The correct substitution was 176 times 523 equals 92048. From the letters given we are looking for two three-digit numbers which, when multiplied, produce a five-digit result having the second digit the same as the middle digit of the second of the multipliers. All the other digits are different.

Each of the values for 'CAT' and 'DOG' are permutated in turn. Two preliminary tests – carried-out by the subroutine – determine if all digits are different. To perform this test the digits for inspection are transferred to variable Z\$ before going to the subroutine which sets a flag to 1 if any match is found.

The product of the two values is then calculated and checked, first to see that it has only five digits and, second, that its second digit matches the middle digit of 'DOG'. The final test is to check that all remaining digits are different, again using the subroutine. In this case the string Z\$ contains 'cat', 'dog', and 'horse' minus the 'O'.

Any values which pass this final test are printed-out. This results in six possible sets of figures but the professor informed his students of the value of the letter 'D'. From the list printed-out it can be seen that in

three of them 'D' has a value of '1' and in two of them it has a value of '2'. Therefore only if 'D' equals '5' is a single solution possible, so it must have been this value which appeared on the blackboard.

One for the road

An intelligent mapping program from Next Base could be the answer to your navigational problems. Barbara Gaskell is your guide.

uyers of early home computers were often misled into believing that the humble machine would revolutionise every aspect of their lives. Everything from walking the dog to monitoring the Stock Exchange was considered possible in an attempt to make a sale. In fact, the only program useful to almost everyone was the word processor.

Autoroute from Next Base is an exception; everyone who owns a car will almost certainly find it useful. Next Base hopes that it will replace the road atlas in almost every office and home which owns an IBM PC or compatible. Autoroute needs a PC or compatible with at least 512K of memory and two 360K floppy disc drives. In practice, either two 720K 3.5in. drives, two 1.2MB or a hard disc are needed.

Autoroute uses a system called MetaWindows which allows you to write PC programs without worrying about the different graphics standards used on the PC. Fortunately, MetaWindows can also determine the configuration of most machines, so installation is a matter of running the install program and confirming that MetaWindows has guessed correctly.



details such as the times of ferry routes. By intelligent I mean that it knows motorways are faster than B-roads, London traffic grinds to a halt during the rush hour, driving at a constant speed is more economical. Next Base says there will be regular updates as the road system changes.

Given two points, a start and a destination place, Autoroute will calculate the fastest, shortest and most economical

route between the two. Unlike people, who tend to look for the nearest thing to a straight line, Autoroute will work off its database of knowledge. The results are surprising; I cut 20 minutes from a 250-mile journey I make every two weeks.

Not everybody drives in the same manner and other factors such as the type of car you drive may well influence your average road speed. Consequently you can specify your average speed on different types of road and your preferences for one road type over another. If you hate motorways and adore B-roads, do not expect lightning times from London to Manchester, for example.

The main screen consists of nothing more than a menu-bar with options selected by cursor keys or by first letter. The Journey option lets you enter details of your journey. When entering it you can specify places to visit on the way, places to avoid and your departure or arrival time. It does not matter if your spelling of place names is not too good – Autoroute will offer a list of near spelling if it does not recognise what you have typed.

Having entered your journey details, moving to the Calculate option will start Autoroute looking for the best routes. A shrinking bar shows how it is progressing. Up to six routes may be found with the quickest, cheapest and shortest suitably marked. Pressing the spacebar takes you to a graphic screen map.

For most of this review I used an Amstrad PC1640 with an EGA screen; on this the maps are stunning. Different road types are shown in different colours, place names and road names are marked and yet everything is readable even in densely-packed London. Using a mouse or the cursor keys, it is possible to scroll the map in any direction and obtain the name of any unlabelled road or town. Function keys allow you to zoom in or out and increase or decrease the detail shown. Unfortunately the lack of resolution when using a CGA screen makes it more difficult to use.


Alternatively, you can display the journey information as a table of road names, distances, directions and headings. The table can be printed and taken on your journey or saved to a file for use within a word processor. It is also, in theory, possible to print the maps but I found the output very disappointing.

Cheaper version

Autoroute costs £135 plus VAT. Next Base hopes to produce a cheaper version and a far more comprehensive version aimed at transport firms. There will also be an Atari ST version but do not hold your breath.

As soon as I received Autoroute I was glued to my machine for the best part of half a day. Everyone who wandered by has spent at least an hour entering routes and then another half-hour justifying the way they travelled. I have learned a good deal from the package and now always consult it before going on a new journey.

cends into the mine and retrieves the gems. With the help of a jetpac they can fly, enabling them to travel all over the screen.






The game reasonably good if extremely limited as you move Charlie round the film set thumping other characters in an attempt to make a block-busting film.

Monopoly – Commodore 64

Go to Jail! Go directly to Jail. Do not pass go. Do not collect \$200. Words which either have you breaking into a cold sweat or rubbing your hands with glee. Monopoly is the kind of game you either love or hate.

The computer version of Waddington's classic board game contains all the features of the original. Properties can all be traded, mortgaged and auctioned as you become involved with the unacceptable face of capitalism.

Up to six players can play, each being either human or computer-controlled. The computer players all play a fairly mean game, mortgaging themselves to the hilt as they try to build as many properties as possible.


Game control is via keyboard or joystick and involves selecting an option from a menu bar at the top of the screen. They are arranged in an unusual order, the ones used most frequently being in the middle rather than at the beginning of the list. There were a few problems with control; keeping a finger on a key for a fraction of a second too long

resulted in unwanted choices being made.

Most of the controls work well but a few, such as building houses and, especially, offering a trade, prove cumbersone. With human opponents it is easy to haggle before agreeing a final settlement. Against the computer each offer has to be entered separately. All you get back is whether or not your offer has been accepted.

In practice, the conversion works very well, not least because no-one has the arduous job of being the banker. What the game lacks, though, and what ruins it totally is that there is no atmosphere generated. Half the fun of Monopoly is that you can gloat over impending bandruptcies and cheat as much as the other players will allow you to do. It just does not work on a micro.

van Ellovanitch was a Russian revolutionary – True or False? This is a typical example of the kind of questions asked in Paul Daniels' popular television quiz programme Every Second Counts.

For anyone who has not seen the programme, the format is very simple. Three couples compete not for points but for seconds. Each correct answer adds to their clock. At the end of the game the couple with the biggest total goes forward to compete for prizes. The more time they have earned the longer they have to answer the questions.

The computer version is an accurate simulation of its source. The couples must first select their faces from a graphic screen before selecting one of six sets of questions which are loaded separately.


The first two rounds consist of the kind of true/false questions and correct answers are worth two seconds on the clock. Then follows a bonus round. Competitors select from three categories and must type-in the answer – 10 seconds if you are correct on the

first attempt, nine on the second and so on.

Minor spelling mistakes are tolerated for those with a less than perfect command of English. If the correct answer is Carl Lewis, Lewis on its own was not allowed but Carl Lois was.

The winners go to a final round where they have to compete against the clock as they attempt to amass points. Selecting from two categories, the couple have to answer four, five, six and finally seven questions on their chosen subjects. Every Second Counts is great fun to play but initial interest is likely to wane quickly and I found no desire to return to it.

Bob Winner - Atari ST

Bob Winner came to life in the docks of New York and vague memories flooded his mind. He knew that they were waiting for him. His only chance was to fight his way across the world to the temple, where all will be revealed.

Bob Winner is an android with the ability to copy the form of his enemies. Once he has taken the

form of one of his enemies Bob will be able to enter into combat with them. If he manages to kill two of the enemy players he will be rewarded with a key. Once Bob has collected three keys he will be able to unlock the temple door and end the game.

Bob can change only into the form of his opponent if he is carrying the relevant object – a shoe for the French boxer; a glove for the boxer; and a gun for

the gun fighter. Combat with the two boxers is relatively easy but combat with the gun-slinger is nearly always fatal. If you combine this with the natural hazards such as swamps and minivolcanos and the wasps and knives which appear a few inches in front of your face you will find that the game is almost impossible to play.

Bob Winner is a brave attempt at a new style of game play, featuring digitised characters and backdrops from three countries, combined with a wide range of character movements. It is perhaps unfortunate that the game is too difficult to play, mainly because of the poor character response time and the speed of some of the obstacles.

As the software industry matures, more and more programmers are experimenting with new techniques in an attempt to produce the long-sought-after masterpiece which will be known as a classic of its time.

One such game is Whirlygig from Rainbird. The company has been developing three-dimensional techniques for games such as Carrier Command and the long-awaited sequel Star Glider II; using these techniques Rainbird is producing a shoot-'em-up game which looks set to revolutionise the computer industry.

Whirlygig follows the escapades of a rebel human in a bid for freedom from the self-reproducing spaceships which use humans as slaves.

The human in question has

kidnapped a baby space fighter and is on the rampage in an attempt to locate and travel through the star gates to freedom.

The graphics are truly amazing; the universe in which the game is set is two-dimensional but all of the objects found within it are represented in true 3D format. Areas of light and dark shade the objects as they move around the galaxy light sources producing exceptionally realistic graphics and, they hope, an all time smash hit.

Whirlygig is still in the early pre-production stages on the Atari ST but when it is finished it will surely take its place at the top of the Gallup polls.

Staying with the 3D aspect I would like to introduce you to Laser Squad a tactical warfare system.

Laser Squad is an expandable strategy game on the Commodore and Spectrum. The game features wargaming with more emphasis on the individual characters, each with their own characteristics which affect their effect within the game.

Three scenarios are planned for inclusion with the game, with further scenarios with which to expand the game to follow.

Each scenario has a different objective and available equipment giving the game long lasting appeal. The 3D aspect of the game is the game map which is displayed in a pseudo 3D style.

Laser Squad will be released in August for the Spectrum and in October for the CBM 64 version.

On the preview page you will be able to read about *Oops* and *Virus*, while looking at Virus at the Rainbird HQ I was treated to a viewing of *Star Glider II* on the Amiga and Atari ST. The main point of interest apart from the graphics and scope of the game is the fact that the game is currently on a dual format disc.


Both ST and Amiga versions of the game are contained on the same disc, which is surprising considering the amount of code needed for the game.

The main other point of interest about Star Glider II is the view enemy option, which allows you to view the three-dimensional objects contained the game. It will be possible to use the objects as brushes and draw on the screen in between playing the game.



The foul stench of Corruption

Ken Matthews looks at the latest adventure releases and offers more advice for those still trying to master the Dungeon.

Bill Benson, won't you please come home? That is exactly what he must do to complete Bermuda Project, the latest Mirrorsoft release for the ST and Amiga which is due in mid-June. Bill, the erstwhile journalist, has sought to escape the rigours of sub-editing and talked his editor into allowing him to chase the disappearance of a charter flight in the notorious Bermuda Triangle. His flight suffers a similar fate and our hero must brave the dangers of cannibals, voodoo and the local fauna to discover the wherewithal to return home and file his story.

Uninvited


Playing the game is reminiscent of the Faery Tale adventure from Micro-Illusions/Activision which won such critical acclaim on the Amiga. In Bermuda Project, too, you move the main character with the mouse and click to bring up various game options. The action takes place in real-time and you must move quickly in the early stages to allow progress later.

The island on which you have crashed is represented in good quality graphics with plenty of detail, although the change of background colour as you move from beach to forest and so on can seem a little sudden. The puzzles are plentiful and logical, though, and since all the commands you can use are shown in menus which appear beside the character when you click, are reasonably simple to solve. Most of the game will be spent searching for the items you need to make progress.

After playing *Dungeon Master* it is difficult to enthuse about any other real-time graphics adventure but Bermuda Project is definitely a cut above average and good fun to play but the price of \$24.99 may discourage many.

Also sent to me by Cathy Campos of Mirrorsoft was *Uninvited* from Mindscape. Developed by ICOM Simulations, the game is another icon-driven adventure in the style of *Deja Vu* and *Shadowgate*.

Scripted as a Gothic horror, the game has you surviving a car wreck to find your brother missing and the only help in sight is a spooky mansion on the horizon. You leave your wrecked car and wander in and

so the nightmare begins. I am told the game has been available for some time on the Amiga but now ST owners can join in the action.

Mandarin Software has announced a new triple format version of *Time and Magik* and *Gnome Ranger* as programmed by Level 9, which has found only a small piece of machine-specific code is necessary to handle the differences between the formats. "Producing a multi-format disc in this way is technically difficult but takes very little space and gives players the best possible game," claims Peter Austin. The new format will cover the Spectrum +3 and Amstrad CPC and PCW machines.

Hottest news on the traditional adventure front is about *Corruption*, the latest title from Rainbird/Magnetic Scrolls. Clare Edgeley says that the wry humour of previous releases will be absent in this hard-hitting look at the deceitful world of high finance.

Framed by your partner, you are caught between the police and a drugs baron who wants to send you on a trip to the bottom of the Thames. To survive you must prove more ruthless and cunning than the opposition.

Corruption claims to be a no-nonsense,

complex, graphics adventure which relies on manipulation of characters and the careful extraction of information, just like the world it attempts to portray. The graphics are of the highest standard.

The plot and puzzles should, if they match expectations, help to silence the critics of previous releases who seem to have found the problems either facile or too obscure and lacking in logic.

QL help

The bad news is that players will have to wait until July before they can put the disc into the Amiga, ST or IBM PC. Still, it is good to have something to which to look forward.

A letter from Richard Alexander mentions the lack of coverage for QL machines. CGH Services offers a title called QL Adventurers' Forum which covers adventure, strategy and wargame titles and is available either on Microdrive cassette or as hard copy at \$1 per issue. CGH also plans to release user-written software for the machine, so QL owners can contact CGH at Cwm Owen Hall, Pencader, Dyfed, Wales SA39 9HA.

The postbag this week was enormous

and consisted almost entirely of requests for help on Dungeon Master. Everyone enclosed SSAEs and will receive personal replies since some requests cover the last stages of the game. I apologise for any delay in replying but the number of requests is almost overwhelming. Several have difficulty with the same area – the treasure rooms of level three. Since this is sufficiently early in the game I print the answer to help anyone who may be stuck.

Mapping problems

To progress with Time is of the Essence you must first ensure that no characters are wounded or over-burdened. You have only a short time after pressing the button to reach the end of the corridor and pass through the secret wall before it closes.

Once inside that area you will encounter an open pit. The button by the pit does not close it but activates a teleport beam for a short time. If you throw an object into the field it will drop on a pressure pad which closes the pit. To pass the next pit you must face the button by it and, as you press, move backward two steps quickly as the pit remains closed for only a short time.

These tips should help you solve this area and stress that Dungeon Master is very much a real-time game. There are many more puzzles later which require split-second timing and have none of the leeway shown here.

The remaining puzzle in the treasure rooms is in The Vault, where you are invited to "cast your influence, cast your might". The clue is in the scroll found in the chest in the open area. You must cast the zo spell across the pit to open the door. You should then see a pressure pad to close the pit which can activate by throwing an object.

Several general enquiries have been on the subject of mapping the game. Dave Barker of Peckham has mapped it in large scale, using a programming template providing a detailed large-scale solution but it is very difficult to hold alongside you as you play. Henry Mueller is using the map supplied by Express Software which I have yet to see.

I did not map the game much at all but relied on the old standard of following the left-hand wall to take a person through a real maze. The disadvantage is that some hidden buttons open areas behind the party which will be discovered only on a second circuit of that level but, by running two saves, I could use one for scouting and a second to cover the ground economically to conserve food and water.

I still have mixed feelings about a map being available commercially. A map *per se* would not be too bad as you would still have to solve the puzzles and destroy the monsters but if the solutions are shown it turns the best role-playing game ever on a machine into a pedestrian hack-'n-slay which is a pity both for the programmers and the players who lose so much of the fun and atmosphere of the game.

Finally, on strategy, a few have asked my opinion on the Rainbird *Universal Military Simulator* which was released earlier in the year on the ST and is due to appear on the Amiga soon.

Until last week I had not seen UMS but I now have a copy and have spent the last few days getting to grips with it. So far I am impressed as it seems to provide anything the player can imagine in terms of the various types of unit for battle simulations.

Scenarios are included from Arbella to Gettysburg to allow the player to get the feel of UMS before tackling the intricacies of the game design functions.


UMS includes a topographical program to allow the simulation of hills and depressions and for the placement of woodland. It is surprising that there appears to be no facility for the placement of rivers, important features to be expected in a wargame were missing. Wargames in general are not generally visually impressive and UMS shares that in its monochrome presentation. The grids and hexes which feature in most simulations could be replaced, since both mouse and joystick can allow for eight directions of movement.

One of my favourite simulations was

Operation Whirlwind, which involved little historical detail or realism in terms of morale/casualties but the game map and the movement were attractive. Limited

marshes and similar terrain which would be impassable to some types of unit. It is possible to view the terrain and battle from any angle, which is exceptional in my experience.


The unit design function allows full scope for creating units of your choice and the option of wildcards can let the user include units like bombers for air support or wizards and other special characters for fantasy-type scenarios. I found this part of UMS the most useful and comprehenesive, as it gives the package its true flexibility.

I was impressed by the concept and design of UMS but I felt that some

military intelligence was shown by enemy units appearing only as your scouts came within range.

Surely 16-bit machines with excellent graphics and huge memory would allow excellent simulations and the ease with which windows are manipulated could cover every detail one could expect.

Having said that, I do not intend that as a criticism of UMS, which for the most part delivers what it promises and delivers it more stylishly than many other packages I have seen. I am hoping to see some 16-bit releases in the future which use the full potential of the hardware they support. □



Amiga graphics

Julian Hunt, of Norwich, Norfolk, writes:

I have an Amiga 500 and am interested in producing some spectacular graphics, specifically those produced by the *Mandelbrot* set. I wonder if you could recommend a book on the subject? I have a reasonable grounding in maths but would probably not be able to understand anything too complex.

The best book on the subject I have seen is *The Beauty Of Fractals* by H O Peitgen and P H Richter published by Springer-Verlag. It has many examples of the fractals possible from both the Mandelbrot and Julia sets.

Upgrading

Paul White, of Worlington, Cumbria, writes:

I own a BBC Model B and was thinking of upgrading either to an Atari ST or Amiga 500. I want to know if I could use my printer, disc drive and monitor with the ST or Amiga. I have a Microvitec Cub monitor, a Cumana 5.25in. disc drive and an Epson FX printer. If I can use these devices, will they connect directly to the ST or Amiga or will I have to buy leads? If so, where can I get them?

The monitor and the printer should work with both machines, although you will need leads, since the BBC/ST/Amiga connectors are generally non-standard. Getting leads should not be too difficult, as most dealers should stock them. The disc drive is another matter and I am not sure whether the BBC disc drives will work with the Amiga and ST.

If any readers know how it is

done I would appreciate some ideas, since I have had a number of letters on the subject. It would also be a good idea to put all those extra 5.25in. drives to some use.

Virus infection

P Kenton, of Liverpool 19, writes: I have encountered the same problem of blank Amiga. I think that it is caused by a software protection device - a virus. Not long ago I bought some software from a reputable supplier and made a back-up copy for my own use. The copy was, however, useless and sent the Amiga into a coma. I forgot all about this until a few weeks later when the problems encountered by Andrew Craig appeared on my machine. Every write-protected disc failed to verify in the internal drive but verified in the external or internal drive if write-enabled. This problem extended to all my discs. Initially I concluded as you did. When I tried to initialise the faulty discs I found that they could not be formatted even after disc doctoring.

I became suspicious when after using the format command from the CLI, the command could not be found even though all the other commands could. I concluded that I had caught a virus which allowed only write-enabled and therefore infectable discs to be inserted into the internal drive but which was clearly ignorant of the external drive's existence. Installing all discs which could possibly have been infected cured the problem.

To finish, a spooky little mystery of my own. Some time ago I corrupted a disc accidentally.

Seeing the DF1:BAD report under the icon I got into the CLI and proceeded to use the disc doctor in the usual way and when I had finished I got rid of the window. Imagine my surprise to see that the disc had been renamed 'Lazarus'. Needless to say, I have never used that name for any disc directory, program or file and Lazarus has never popped up since then. Exhaustive searches of both the Amiga manual and the Amiga DOS manual failed to provide an answer. Do you have one?

I am still not convinced that the problem I had was a virus, since it has now disappeared. That does not mean that the virus does not exist; the reason for it is beyond me – perhaps some people are natural vandals.

The Lazarus name seems fitting for a retrieved disc, especially if the original name could not be found. Any machine which produces the message 'GURU MEDITATION' must have been programmed by someone with a fairly unusual mind.

Atari boot

Jason Boydell, of Bolton, Lancs, writes:

I have an Atari STFM with an external 1MB disc drive and I would like to be able to boot the machine from it. Could you tell me the modifications I would have to make to allow this? Ideally, I would like to switch between drives for booting but to be able to boot from drive B would be sufficient. I know a little about electronics and I know how to take the ST apart.

There are probably a number of ways of doing this but the most obvious is to swap over the drive select lines so that drive 0 (internal) becomes drive 1 and vice versa. The drive select lines are from the sound chips I/O port A bits 1 and 2 and a changeover switch placed on them should do the job. The diagram shows which lines need to be altered; you will have to find the most convenient place to insert the switch.

A DPDT - double pole double throw - switch is used and its operation swaps over the drive select lines.

Cured


K A Welsman, of Barton Hill, Bristol, writes:

With reference to a letter in the April 28-May 4 edition on the subject of a blank Amiga. I, too, have suffered from all the symptoms described. Being a member of Bristol Amiga User Group, we have almost all experienced the symptoms of a blank screen and drive validating error. The cause is not a fault with the hardware but is, dare I swear – a virus. This one locks up the machine and leaves you with the only alternative of powering down.

That is why after you have booted a disc which is infected and then inserted a disc which is write-protected, the virus has not settled in and it does not recognise the disc as being write-protected and tries to write to the disc anyway.

Provided you do not have this virus on protected software, which could present a few problems, all that is necessary is to kill it by installing a boot block with INSTALL from the CLI, i.e., INSTALL DFO:.

If this solution does not work and the fault remains there is probably something wrong with the hardware.



Connections

Keith Reynolds, of Stockport, Cheshire, writes:

In the May 5-11 issue you discussed a problem from M B Nailor regarding his Atari ST and the Brother HR5 printer. I also have this combination and the connections are strobe, data 1-8, busy, the associated grounds, and the printer 0V lines. Pins 16 and 17 on the printer are connected to ground and this works well with 1st Word with a slightly modified printer routine.

I wrote to Atari for advice when I discovered that the print screen gave strange problems and encountered a "not invented here" attitude because I was not using its printer. Although its letter was very polite, it was obviously not interested in helping me with my problem.

I decided to scan the advertisements in various magazines and saw one for the Cygnus Trading Co in London. It was claiming it had "all the answers for simple dumps," so I telephoned. A very polite and informative conversation took place where I was promised success.

Within days of sending a cheque for a program, I received the all-important disc. It contained variations for horizontal and vertical formats, two being

in high density. In a nutshell, they worked perfectly, albeit very slowly – a problem with the HR5, not the program. I hope the information is of some use to Nailor and others.

Number-crunching

N S Savill, of Ascot, Berkshire, writes:

I have been running number-crunching programs in Basic on a UK101 (6502) computer which I built from a kit in 1979. I have not replaced the 101, which is marginally faster than the BBC, as computers have only recently become appreciably faster. I have added a Triumph Adler Alphatronic CP/M computer for word processing but its Basic is slower.

Your test in issue 38 showed that the Atari ST with a HiSoft compiler is faster by a factor of nearly 30. That would indicate a four-hour program would run in about eight minutes, give or take a factor of two, but I would not be willing to type-in the programs so they will have to be transferred via the RS232 ports in ASCII. Will the combination of an ST with a HiSoft compiler cope with this? Also, after the

programs have been transferred I would not be willing to edit out the line numbers and change multi-statement lines to single-statement lines, so will the compiler cope with both of those features?

I was stunned by the revelation in the Stacks of Basic review that none of the Basics would wrap around Basic lines which are longer than the screen width. I can only suppose that while home computers are used mainly for games, the manufacturers ignore the requirements of the few serious users. Possibly you can suggest a better combination of computer and compiler?

A year ago I fitted a maths coprocessor - an 8087 - to an Olivetti M24 - not mine - and this reduced the run time of a Fortran program by a factor of 14. Probably the Motorola coprocessor (68881) would give a similar improvement when added to a 68000. Do any of the home computers with 68000 have provision for adding a co-processor or have expansion boards to take one? It would be essential that either a high-level language compiler or an assembler which is capable of using the co-processor should be available.

The eight 32-bit registers and the multiply and divide instructions of the 68000 might make writing programs involving integers only in assembly language a practical proposition. Which is the best assembler for the ST or for any other computer which you recommend?

I can see no problems in transferring the Basic programs as text files from the 101 to the ST. It is so long since I heard about the UK101 that I cannot remember its capabilities but I am surprised that it is faster than a BBC B, which is one of the fastest 8-bit home micros. HiSoft Basic will take any straight text file and attempt to compile it. It takes line numbers and uses them as labels but there is the oddity that you can have the same line number twice, e.g.:

30 PRINT "Hi there" 30 PRINT "Ho there"

Any jump to line 30 always takes the last as the label to goto but this should not cause you difficulty since normal numbered Basic programs always use consecutive line numbers. Multiple statements on a line are no difficulty either, so you should have no trouble with this aspect of the 'port'. I do not know what kind of

Basic you have on the 101 but unless it is fairly standard Microsoft you may have to do a number of modifications to get it to work. Obviously, any PEEKs and POKEs will not work.

There are two points of view I can see concerning the ability of the text editor to wrap lines around the screen. The first is that on the ST – indeed any machine with a reasonably fast processor like the 68000 – the screen can be moved sideways fast enough to allow reasonable editing of long lines without the need to wrap them around on to the next line. Slower machines cannot do this and remain usable.

On the other hand, having used so many machines which wrap their lines, it is rather disconcerting to have the whole screen shift sideways every time a long line crops up. I would prefer the ability to wrap as an option, since sideways scrolling screens are annoying when writing Basic programs; you cannot see the whole line at once. A solution is to get the highres monitor on which 80 columns is usually adequate.

Another solution is to use an editor or word processor which will wrap the lines and then compile using the stand-alone compiler – takes a straight text file – which is part of HiSoft Basic to test the program.

So far as I know none of the current 68000 home machines has Motorola maths chips. I susspect that both Commodore and Atari are planning machines which either have the option or have them fitted as standard – some of the larger ST and Amiga machines may already offer this – since they give a large increase in speed. If and when the co-processors become available, I am sure the assemblers and compilers will cope with them.

If you want to go for machine code on the ST the HiSoft new version of GenST is an excellent assembler. It is fast and provides a number of options the older assemblers lacked.

If you really want to have access to fast processing you might consider the Acorn Archimedes. It is the fastest home micro I have used and it also has superb graphics and a fast disc filing system. Its only disadvantage is that there is nowhere near so much software available for it as there is for the ST. It is also more expensive and it seems that Acorn has done its usual trick of producing a great machine which is unsupported because of its high price and lack of marketing.

Mouse trained

F. Glossop, of Chesterfield, writes:


I have had my Amiga for two months and have just started having problems with the mouse. When I move it, the pointer moves in small jerks and is not very accurate. I have tried cleaning the internal rubber ball but this does not seem to make any difference. What should I do, send it back or is there some other way of getting it to work again?

The chances are that the mouse is still dirty, the dirt being on the rollers which sense the movement of the ball. There are two ways of cleaning them. The first and easiest is to remove the sliding cover on the bottom and use a screwdriver to scrape the dirt from the metal rollers. This is fiddly and usually produces some of the dirt inside the mouse. Too much of this and it will get indigestion and begin to play up again.

The other way is to remove the bottom cover, then the two screws

and then take off the top cover. You will then be able to see the internal workings of the mouse and be able to gain better access to the rollers.

Clean them as before and make sure that they are bright and shiny. Make sure no more dirt gets in the workings; that is fairly easy since you have full access to the innards of the rodent. Once cleaned, put it back together and try to make sure that you always use it on a clean surface. If necessary get a mouse pad on which to use your mouse.

Copy Protection

Listing two should be incorporated in your own Power Basic program. This will read the disc at track 80 and determine whether the number matches what is expected.

If all is well, the program will run, if not, it will exit back to the desk-top. \Box

You can have any colour you want so long as it's black

ave you ever wondered why today's and all previous personal computers have looked so incredibly boring? All have been in either white or black, have had a QWERTY keyboard and a few holes into which their owners can insert various cables. All have also had roughly the same shape, variations on a theme of rectangular. Only very rarely was there change and when it happened it was not particularly daring - grey Atari XLs, a buff Dragon and the occasional red function keys would not change the world. The only real departure was with the Elan/Flan - or, for more recent computer converts, the Enterprise with its low, curved shape, built-in joystick and unusual blue-black colour with some green keys.

The trend, like many others in the micro industry, appears to have been started by Sir Clive Sinclair, who first sold the white ZX-80. Then, when the rest of the world – comprising at that time the Vic 20 – copied him, he launched designer black on the world with the ZX-81, Spectrum – although that had a designer rainbow in one corner – QL, Z-88 and so on. Before he arrived on the scene the principal colour was grey – in TRS-80s – a colour which, as some MSX machines have since proved, does not go

down well with punters. If you are prepared to take a few risks, unfold your imagination and let loose, all this can change. A few cans of paint and your machine can look completely different. Anyone who has seen a Llamasoft stand at a computer show can attest the impression left by Jeff Minter's psychedelic Atari ST – demonstrating *Colourspace*, of course – and will be aware of the possibilities. Anything is possible, from space invaders and monsters to a pinstripe business machine – to anything you like. Just be careful the paint does not get at the innards.

For hard-pressed or non-artistic directors an American company, Aesthetics Technology, offers a computer-customising service, one of the most popular designs apparently being a granite Macintosh. Marble and wood Macs are also available at about \$895. Ironically a black Mac is also available.

After paint, why not go further? Cases could be reconstructed into more interesting shapes, or incorporated into other things – building a PC into a desk, for example, or a mouse-shaped mouse. Many such ideas are trivial, ridiculous or pointless but, if carried far enough, re-designs of

casing could lead to other improvements, perhaps with the replacement of the QWERTY keyboard with something not designed to slow typewriters as much as possible. We are now, as we are frequently informed, in the computer age and computers do not have little hammers which jam.

What I am talking about is the avoidance of risks by designers. Rather than risk something new and possibly better, they stay with an accepted standard or design. The problem is not confined to the computer industry; the hi-fi industry continues to make rectangular box loudspeakers because that is what it thinks the public wants, despite problems with that particular shape.

What is needed are a few risk-takers, without which the world would have got nowhere. If such people no longer exist, we may well be stuck where we are permanently with only our boring white or black computers to amuse us.

Professional designers or manufacturers clearly are unwilling to produce something even slightly daring or unusual. Thus it will have to be left to imaginative, artistic users who are bored with their machines.




