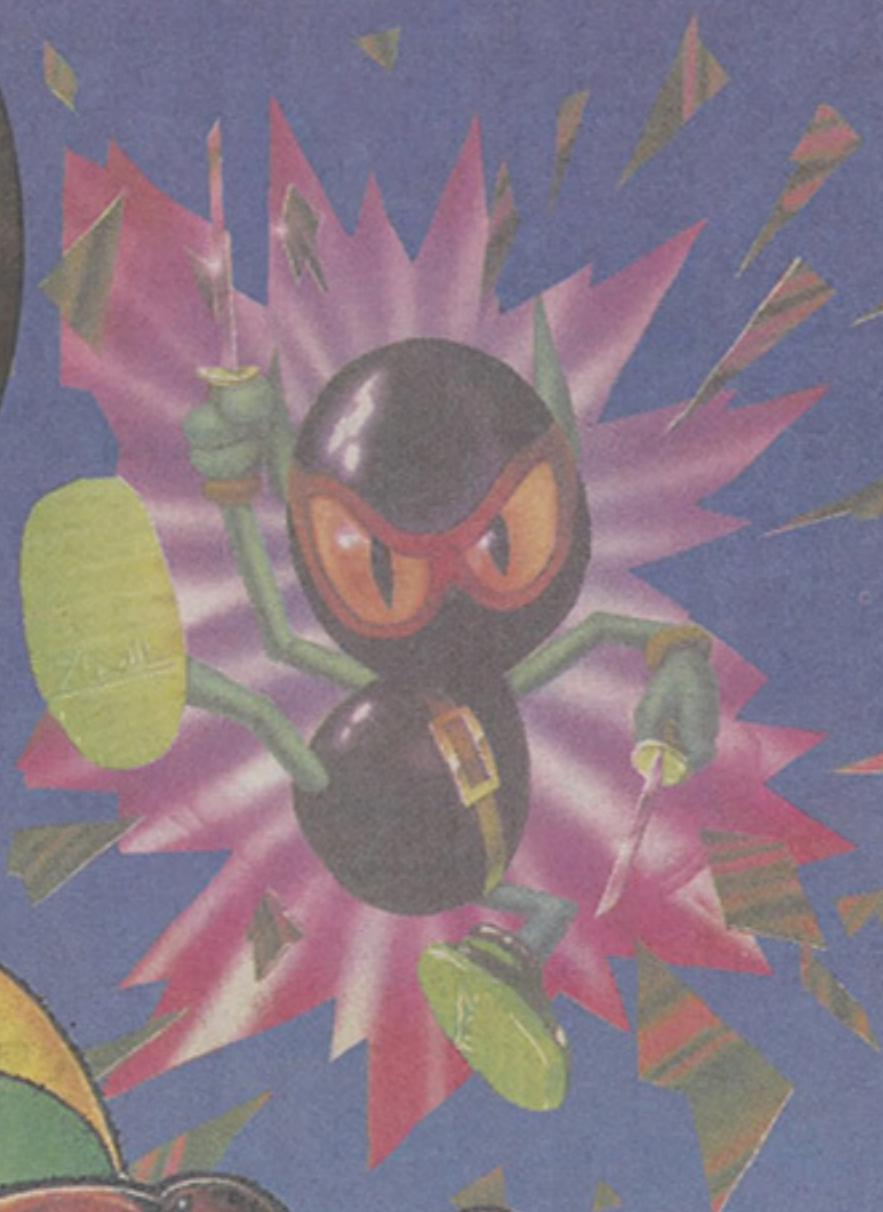
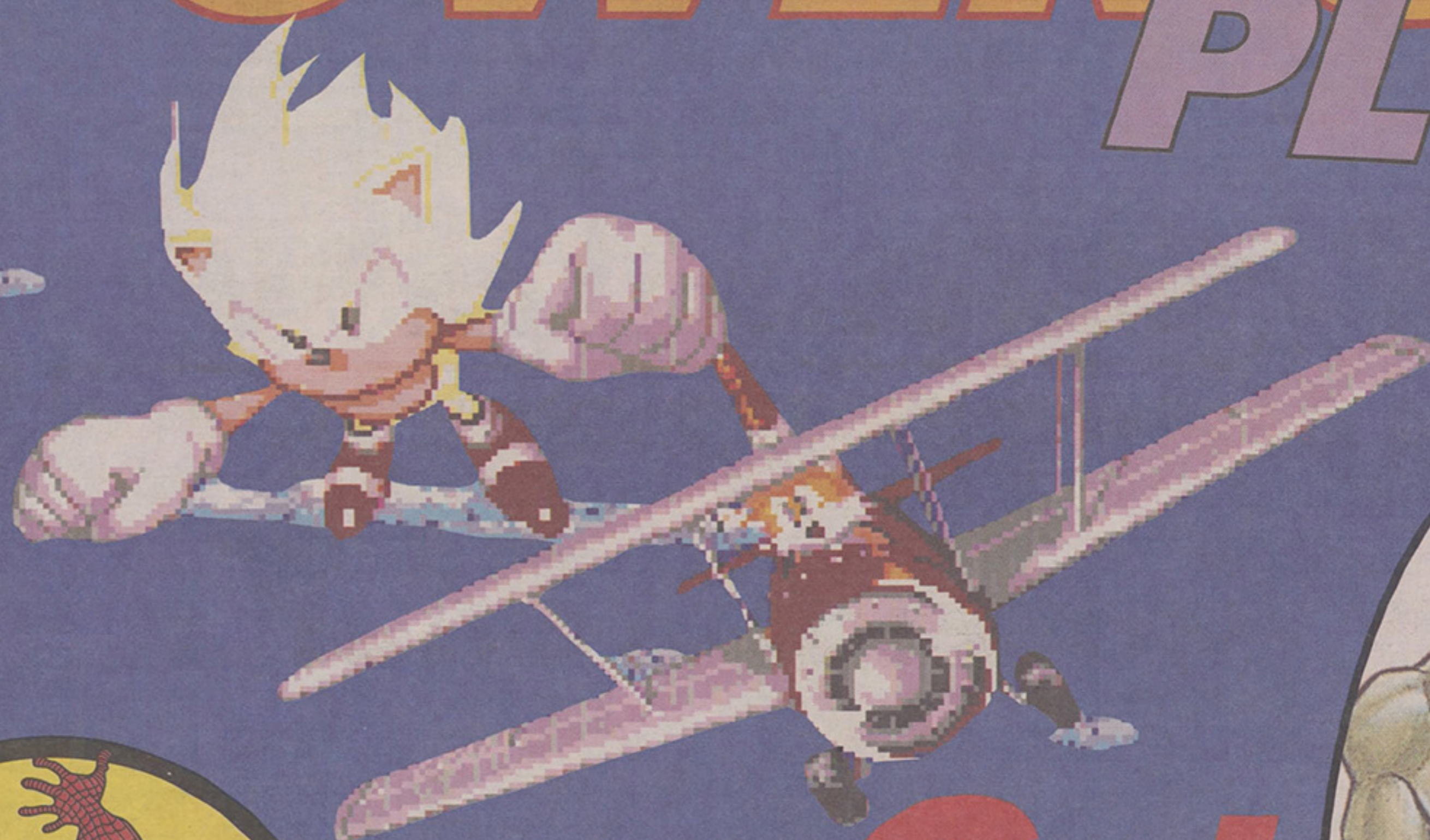

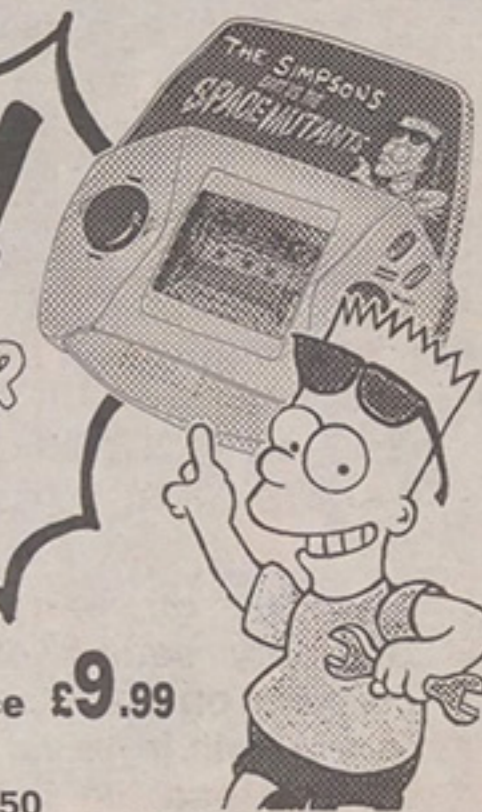

The Future Entertainment Show is a glimpse of the thrills the future has to offer - available today.

All the latest computer games technology is gathering under one roof at London's Earls Court Arena on Thursday.

The four-day event is already being hailed the greatest show on earth - and no wonder...

The world masters in games technology from Japan and America have been queueing up to show off their latest computers and consoles, carts and disks.

More than 100,000 people are expected to stream through the turnstiles. Computer and video games amount to the fastest growing form of entertainment in the world. Even in slump-hit Britain sales of home computers and consoles are staggering.

It's one area of the economy enjoying a massive boom.

BUT the show is more than just a dream for "techies" - it's fun for all the family, which is why the nation's leading pop station Radio One will be there too.

For games fans who can't get to Earls Court, Radio One DJ Steve Wright will be carrying reports of the event and running daily competitions in his top-rated afternoon show.

But there'll be nothing as old-fashioned as sending in your answer on a postcard.

THE Radio One Roadshow pulls into Earls Court on Thursday with lots of surprises for visitors over the four days of The Future Entertainment Show.

Making a guest appearance will be MC Mario and The Ambassadors of Funk, whose hit *Supermarioland* is No 9 in the charts.

The Roadshow is led by DJ Neale James, who presents the Rock Line show on Sundays. Neale and the gang will be giving away lots of prizes at the show.

Neale says: "I'm a Game Boy addict myself and spend all the time travelling between Roadshows playing *Tetris* or *World Cup*."

"Video games are great. They are the perfect way to pass the time and keep you

mentally alert." Neale will also be taking a look at the more serious computing stands at the show.

He adds: "I've got a Panasonic laptop which I use to write all the scripts for my Sunday shows."

his comedy and pop show live from the Arena between 1pm and 2pm.

Visitors can also see the 70ft Roadshow vehicle with its state-of-the-art studio.

Two vehicles stand back-to-back to support a fold-down stage and the studio can even work as a satellite ground station.

Earls Court Arena in London has seen nothing like the four-day explosion that starts on Thursday. But if you don't know a bit from a byte, or wouldn't recognise Mario if he came to mend a leaking pipe, don't worry. DAVID HANCOCK guides you round the greatest show on Earth.

SEGA

(Stand 900):

THE people who brought you the Mega Drive have built a mind-boggling Games Arcade so you can try out their latest blockbusting titles.

And they might even unveil their Mega CD.

You'll simply have to come along and find out. (For a whole feature on Sega see Pages 8 & 9).

DOMARK

(Stand 800):

DIAMONDS are forever and James Bond's not far behind. Here his 30th anniversary in films is being celebrated with the Mega Drive game James Bond - The Duel.

Versions for the Master System and Game Gear are to follow soon and visitors to this stand can see Bond's original Aston Martin as well as having their picture taken with a bevy of Bond girls.

Other games you can test your skill at include Dragon's Fury, Pitfighter and Prince of Persia.

Psygnosis

(Stand 1000):

THE worldwide hit Lemmings, in which you have to stop the lovable creatures marching to their death, was hailed the best puzzle game of the year.

Now the publisher unveils Lemmings 2. And to celebrate they will paint your face and spray your hair green!

£10,000 jackpot
for UK's hotshot

ONE lucky games player will walk away from the big show with £10,000 and stardom.

That's what awaits the winner of the first National Games Championships.

Regional heats for the competition, organised in association with ITV's new *Bad Influence!* computer show, have been taking place up and down the country.

Masters SEGA

IT WAS only a decade ago that bat-and-ball games on a screen with fat, blocky graphics and no sound seemed a technological wonder.

Now, if it's not full colour and in stereo, forget it!

Two Japanese companies, Nintendo and Sega, have made billions around the world by developing games entertainment to an incredible

new peak. In Britain this year alone they expect to sell more than £500 million of machines and games.

Next year that figure will double and games will

threaten the pop industry as the biggest form of youth entertainment.

In a world-wide mega industry they are Titans.

And like all Titans they clash.

THE video games world was dominated by Nintendo – and then along came Sega, which now claims to have a bigger share of the market.

Sega's success throughout Europe was based on getting in first with the latest advancements in gaming.

While Nintendo was still selling its eight-bit NES, Sega launched the mighty Mega Drive and moved ahead.

There is talk that Sega will do it again next year by being first with a CD-ROM drive. Here's the company's current line-up of machines:

GAME GEAR

(£99.99, with the game *Columns*)

A full-colour handheld that has become the machine for people on the move.

There are lots of games, including *Sonic the Hedgehog*. There are screen-magnifier attachments and even a tuner to turn it into a TV.

It will also play Master System II games with a converter. But the short battery life – less than three hours – makes continuous portable play expensive.

MASTER SYSTEM II

(£49.99, with *Alex Kidd in Miracle World*)

A good value-for-money eight-bit console you plug into the telly.

It's a good buy for younger children and there are plenty of excellent games, like the *Alex Kidd* series, for around £25.

But don't expect state-of-the-art.

MEGA DRIVE

(£129.99, with *Sonic the Hedgehog*)

The biggest-selling 16-bit in the country with stereo sound and great graphics.

It boasts the most top-notch video games for any console, and was the machine that launched *Sonic*, which has sold four million in a year.

Sonic 2 is released on November 24 and is expected to be Sega's No 1 Christmas seller.

NINTENDO ENTERTAINMENT SYSTEM

(£54.99)

The older version of the Nintendo console plugs into the mains and can be used with a TV set.

Game cartridges sell for £25 to £40, and the best feature arcade-quality action.

SUPER NES

(£129.99 with Super Mario World)

The NES had only an eight-bit chip, which limited games quality.

The Super NES has a 16-bit chip which means games can handle much more sophisticated graphics and sound.

Add the Scope Light Gun and you can shoot at the screen from anywhere in the room.

It comes with six shoot-'em-up games and costs £59.99. Or get the Action Pack - the Scope Gun and a Super NES for £159.99.

Street Fighter II is currently being twinned with the SNES in a £160 package timed for Christmas.

If you own the NES and want to upgrade to the SNES but still play all your NES games, there's an adaptor to be released soon.

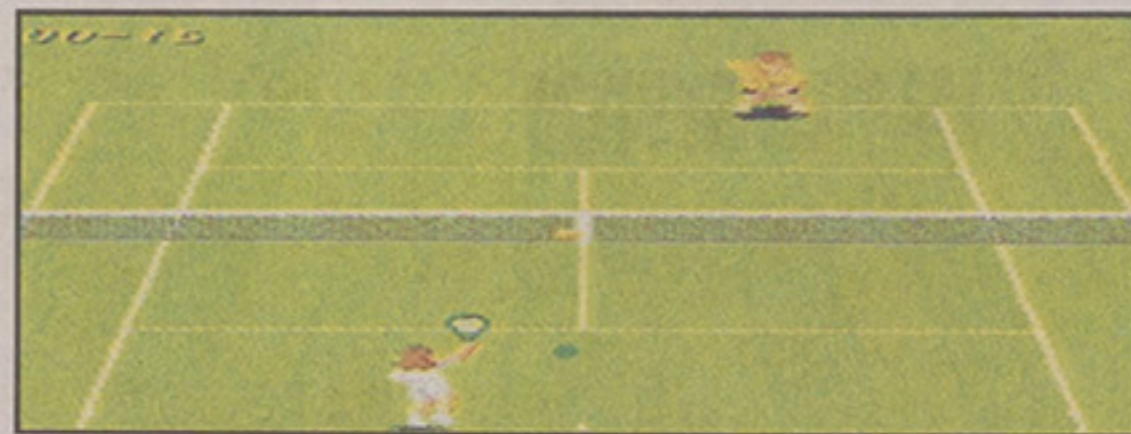

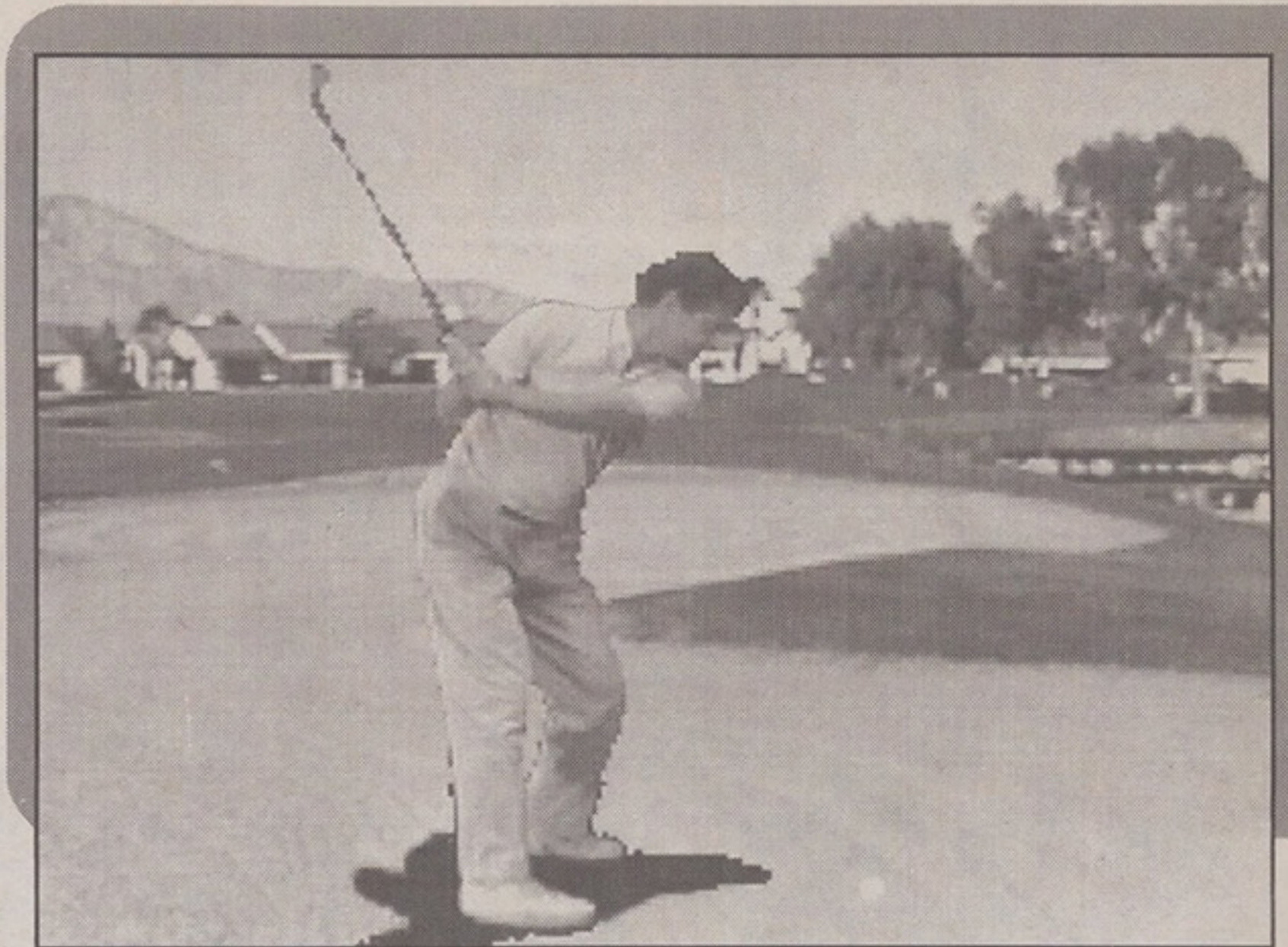

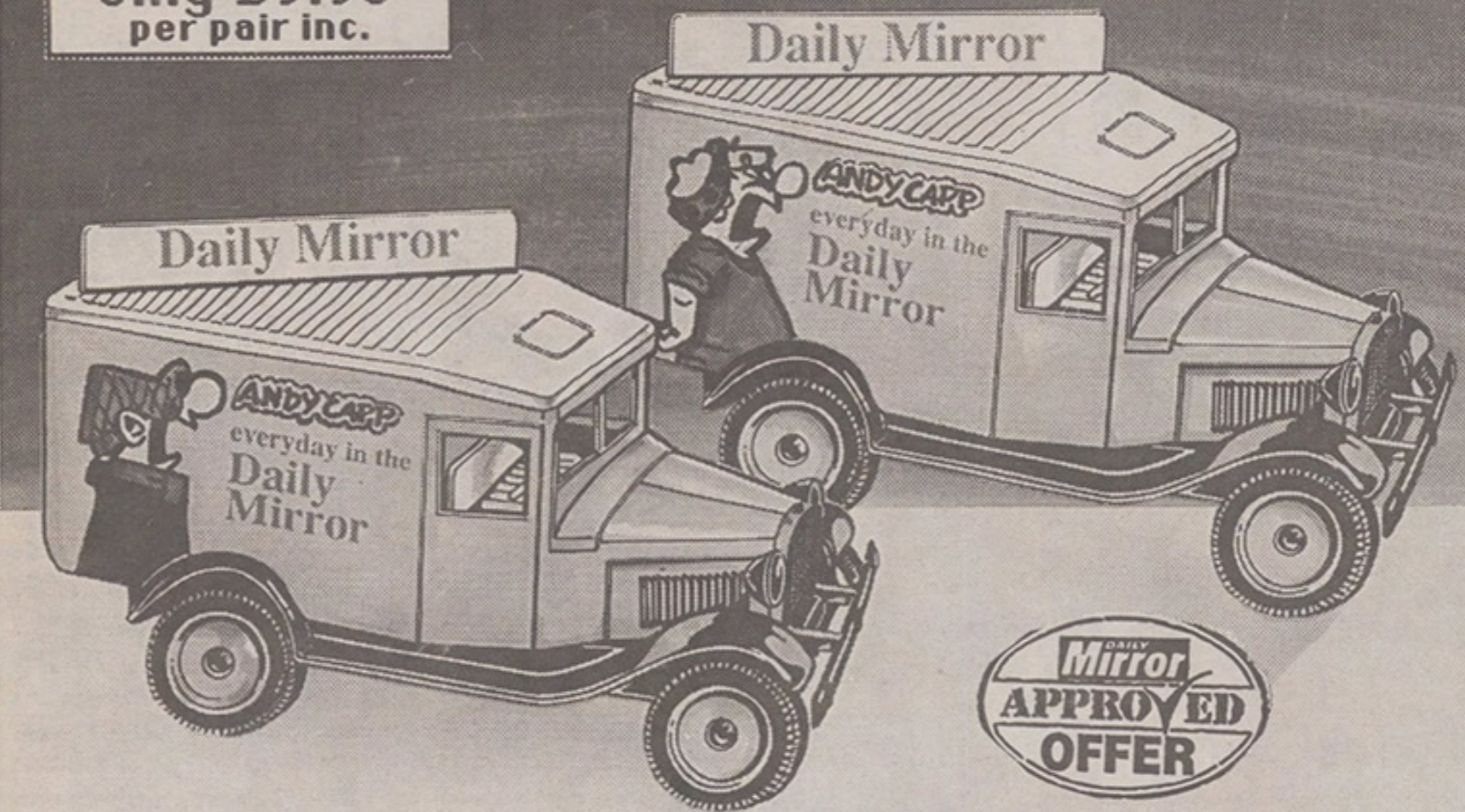

CDs spin out a revolution in pictures

THE latest hi-tec breakthrough to hit the high street means it's just a matter of time before you can play *Terminator 3* with clips from the movie.

Interactive Compact Discs are like ordinary music CDs with an added dimension - pictures.

Already in the shops using the new technology are home entertainment systems such as Commodore's £399 CDTV and Philips's £499 CD-i player. Boffins can now put up to 72 minutes of film footage on to a single CD.

And next year CDTV and CD-i systems will offer upgrades to allow owners to run new games with MOVING pictures.

Just connect your CDTV or CD-i player to your hi-fi and TV and use a remote control to play any of the new interactive CDs.

The range of disks out now is enormous - with more than 100 titles available for each machine (priced from £20).

CDTV's catalogue includes many of Commodore's Amiga computers' top games with new stereo soundtracks, plus educational titles to help with spelling, maths and languages.

Disks such as *NASA... the 25th Year* bring archive film footage of the race to the moon.

And top titles like *Trivial Pursuit* and *Sports Football* are great fun.

What's more - add a keyboard and disk drive to CDTV and you can run the

thousands of software titles designed for the top-selling Amiga computer.

The rival CD-i system is less flexible. You can't use it as a computer and there aren't any well-known games for it.

But it does have a better

range of higher-quality special-interest software.

Top CD-i disks in the shops include *Palm Springs*, designed to improve your golfing skills, and *Time-Life Photography*, in which you take pictures with a simulated camera and see the re-

sults on screen. There's also a good choice for youngsters with the *Sesame Street* and *Hanna Barbera Cartoon Jukebox* disks.

A single CD can store huge amounts of information - up to 500 Megabytes or the equivalent of 750

floppy disks. It can hold sound effects, text, photographs and video.

And encyclopaedias like *Treasures of the Smithsonian* can bring whole museums and art galleries into your living room.

So what's the competition like? Last year's No 1 was Ocean's dire *WWF*.

Wrestling fever doesn't seem to have cooled so the sequel, *WWF European Rampage*, looks certain to make a good showing.

The main difference in the new game is the addition of tag-

teams, but it's going to have to improve a lot.

Lemmings 2, sequel to arguably the biggest computer game of all time, is due for December release.

And with several significant advancements on the original you have to fancy its chances.

Star programmers The Bitmap Brothers will be launching the super-looking *Chaos Engine*. Also in the frame a re *Cool*

World and *Lethal Weapon*... but the dark horse of the race might well be *Sensible Soccer: 1992/93 Season*.

The original game headed the Amiga charts for a record-busting four months.

Now with loads of new features in the latest version - also available as an upgrade for just £4 - sales are potentially enormous.

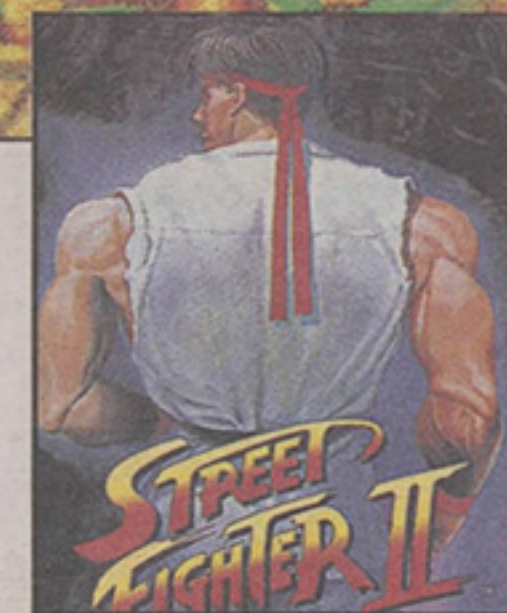
