Welcome to Issue #10 of Game Fan. As we wrapped up this issue, the talk around the production room was of the upcoming 3DO, the Atari Jaguar and Sega's new 32 bit Saturn project.

It seems strange, the 8 bit market flourished for five years before 16 bit came in and slowly took the reigns but now, after just three years of Genesis and two years of SNES, here we are again. The question is; is 32 bit going to be an alternative while the 16 bit market continues to flourish, or will Nintendo join the fray (along with Hudson) with their own 32 bit machine, thus ending the 16 bit era? On one hand, it doesn't seem right. The SNES is still very young and just now finding its legs. There has only been one Zelda, one Mario, no Kid Icarus, no Metroid and no Mega Man, normally sequel friendly, banner games for Nintendo. At the same time, Sega has just released its CD, which will be less than two years old when their 32 bit is introduced and is far from reaching its potential. Also, programmers are still finding ways to make the Genesis perform better. On the other hand, if the technology is available for improvement, why not use it. The thing is (at least in our industry) that when one company does something new, everyone then follows in fear of being left behind ... maybe the 8 bit era was misleading and the reason it reigned for so long was because no one else

Now that the NES has paved the way to an 8 billion dollar per year industry, it seems everyone is jumping in, including: AT&T, MCA, Universal, Matsushita (Panasonic), Time Warner and many, many more. In other electronics markets, products are updated and improved almost yearly, look at a two year old VCR ... yuk. Could we be headed in the same direction? Video game consumers have a lot of choices to make over the next year. Do you buy and stick with one system, constantly sell off the old and bring in the new, or just buy 'em all? Then there's the mater of software. Currently, it takes at least 6 months and up to two years to make a good game. So, who is going to make all these games for all of these formatic? (202) Nis list: SNES, Genesis, 3DO, Jaguar, Sega CD, Hudson 32, Sega 32, Sony Play Station (???), Neo Geo, Game Gear and Game Boy, that's 11 formats! With 70-80 titles per year, per system, that's 8-900 games! Will companies grow in numbers to meet the new demand, or will companies simply rush out product that is low quality in search of the quick buck (as many still do now)? These are all questions we have to ask ourselves over the next year. One thing is for sure, our industry is growing at an incredible pace...we've been found. All of a sudden, everyone is realizing what all of us gamers have been so excited about for the last few years and now they want to cash in.

Well, my message to them is; if you can find a way to bring me fifty quality games a year on a system that you will continue to support, even in the wake of other new consoles, then I'll buy it. But, if you introduce superior hardware and then allow countless bad games to be rushed out, then I'm gonna git ya. Hey man, I've got a magazine and one dedicated bunch of gamers, we can do it. So, be warned. If the industry crashes again, we're out of a job and we'll be bored to tears. Bottom line, the game industry is quickly going from ages 8-15 to 8-50 and beyond (I know I'll be hammerin' away 'til I drop) and its up to us to make sure this is all handled properly. I can tell you one thing, if you use Game Fan as a buyer's guide, you can't go wrong. Our official 3DO section starts next month ... here we go.

This is, for a 16 meg cartridge, a great arcade translation, the Sega version delivers as promised with a nifty code for all the blood. The graphics, music and control (with the six button) are perfect. As an MK fan I couldn't have asked for

Mortal Kombat gets high marks for being an excellent translation of the arcade game. The digitized graphics, sound and game play are all high quality. The game does not have the lasting play value of SF2 and that is ultimately the game that MK will be compared to. Even so, it's a fun, quick ride through an excellent arcade translation.

Excellent! Acclaim has a winner on their hands with Mortal Kombat. Fans of the arcade should be happy with the Genesis version; all of the fatalities are here and there is some blood. This is one of the better arcade to home translations so far and the special moves are very easy to pull off, perhaps easier than the arcade...buy it.

"Give me the code, I need the code". Yes, the Genesis version of Mortal Kombat does have the blood and full-on death moves (code accessible). With the exception of the lost voice samples, the Genesis version is a better game than SNES MK. If you were a fan of the arcade, you won't be disappointed.

BUBSY - ACCOLADE - 16 MEG - 1 PLAYER - SEE REVIEW PG.



Not exactly the cutting edge, Bubsy is your basic Sonic/Mario action/platform with added personality and difficulty. But hey, there's nothing wrong with that. Large levels and diverse play help Bubsy come across as a solid and worthwhile challenge for the Sonic set.

The music kicks, play control is impeccable and the attention to detail is amazing, all of this in only 8 meg...awe-some!

RX is one incredible cartridge shooter. Like Gunstar and Aladdin, RX pulls out every graphics FX you can imagine to take this side scroller to the top of any shooter fan's wish list (after Silpheed of course). Although not as good as the import (the explosions just aren't the same), the U.S. version still ranks as one of the best games of the year.

JRASSIC PARK - SEGA - 16 MEG - 1 PLAYER - SEE REVIEW PG. 60-61



While Jurassic Park delivers on good, digitized graphics, it falls short on control and collision detection. It plays like a game that's not finished. This is what happens when you rush out a game to meet a movie's schedule. The Raptor game was mildly amusing but, overall, JP is destined for the tar pits.

Great Moviel Gr...uh, not too good of a game. Jurassic Park has some great digitized graphics and animation but the game play is seriously lacking. The marketing people at Sega seem to think that this is their big game for the fall. Too bad, Gunstar and Silpheed are games, this is a license.

Now here's a game that mimics the movie in that the actual experience did not live up to the hype. Although not a bad game by any means, Sega missed a golden opportunity with JP. The difficulty setting is about perfect and playing as Raptor is a blast for awhile, but this game lacks diversity and the ability to keep you interested...nice try, though.

If Steven Spielberg had seen the game first, it probably wouldn't have become a movie. The game has some flashes of brilliance with its digitized graphics and well animated characters but the quality of the game play never really comes close to the look of the game.

BARI ARM - HUMAN - CD - 1 PLAYER - SEE REVIEW PG. 66-67



If you really like side scroll shooters and CD music, you just might like Bari Arm. It has nice scrolls, big, bad bosses and plenty of pebbles to dodge. There's even a warping floor in one level. I played it once and that was enough. This genre of games is dead, wake me up when it's over.

import! Silpheed aside, this is one of the most entertaining shooters I have played in some time. You can't go wrong when you combine Thunderforce IV with R-Type. if you're a Sega/Mega CD owner and like a good blaster, look no further than Bari Arm.

I have played this game to death. Expect it to take you about 60 + hours to get through this jewel the first time you play it. I am now on my fifth journey through the world of Landstalker and I still love it. Sega's answer to Zelda is welcome and well done.

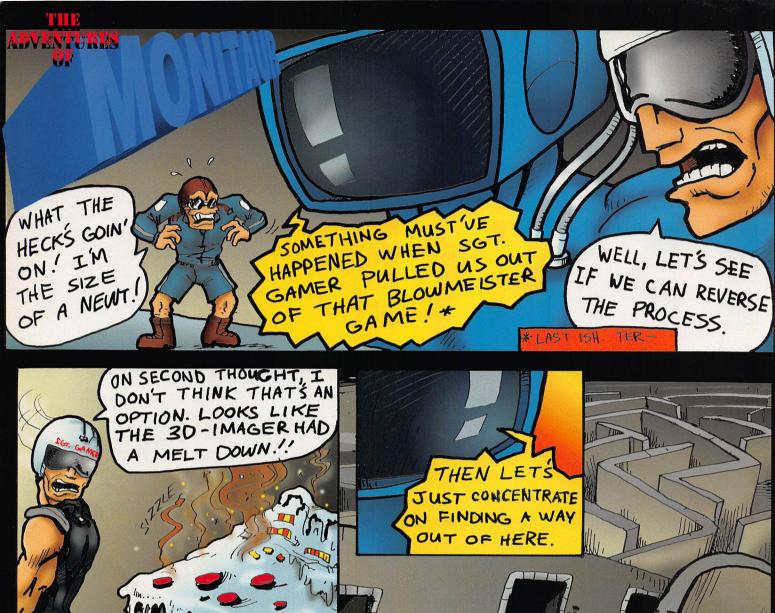

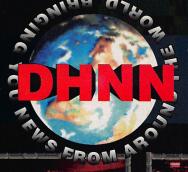












### **AN INTERVIEW WITH**













At the recently concluded Summer CES, Game Fan's Editor-In-Chief, David Halverson and Sports Editor, David Winding, sat down with Mr. Olaf Olafsson, President of Sony Imagesoft, Inc. to get his thoughts and feelings on the state of the video game industry and the role that Sony Imagesoft is playing in the emergence of the new technologies that are shaping the way we play today and tomorrow. As a recognized leader in CD-ROM technology, Sony is marching toward their ultimate goal of providing the player with a gaming environment that is unparalleled in its realism and the quality of its interactive story.

GF: Can you bring us up to date on Sony Imagesoft's plans for '93 and '94?

O As you know, we recently acquired sygnosis, the English development house esponsible for such titles as Bram Stoker's racula and Ghadow of The Beast. We are englished on pursuing development on the Sega CD over the course of the next ear and our product release schedule effects that. We currently have 8 Sega CD des in development for '93, including racula CD, Cliffhanger, Last Action Hero, SPN Baseball, ESPN Football and the copardy and Wheel of Fortune titles.

GF: The ESPN license would seem to position you in the thick of the sports marketing battle with Sega and Electronic Arts. Do you see sports titles as a major focus of your development efforts?

OO: Absolutely, in addition to the console and CD versions of baseball and football, we plan to be very aggressive in 1994.

Our current plans are to introduce 4 new sports titles across all platforms. Our relationships with our licensees are central to our future success. We plan to involve them early on in the design process and take advantage of their expertise to produce the best product that the platform is capable of

GF: Technologically, you and Psygnosis broke new ground with Dracula CD. Do you plan on taking advantage of the SGI graphics system in any future titles?

OO: Last Action Hero CD will make use of the SGI system. We are very pleased with the look we are able to achieve in using the Silicon workstation and we will, most certainly, take advantage of this technology as it is warranted in addition, our development team has found a way to include music in those games that take advantage of the SGI system.

GF: What direction do you see the industry taking over the next year to two years?

OO: I definitely believe that the market is graying. Look at all of the interest from the financial community in 3DO. Although don't believe that it is the technologica water shed that it seems to be perceived as, the sheer strength of the media push and consumer interest has convinced me that the industry is ready to accept an older consumer. Essentially, with the introduction of Sega CD, it already has. The technological sophistication of the home machines will continue to evolve and then level off with the introduction of the 32 bit machines. '95 will probably be the year of 32 bit systems.

GR Speaking of a graying market, what do you think of Sega instituting their rating system for all products produced by Sega and its third party licensees?

OO: Games are becoming more realistic It really is a natural progression that some sort of ratings system would be implemented. It happened in the movie industry and now the recording industry. It really is inevitable, with the increased visual realism, that it become common place in the gaming industry. Although, it is not really a rating system that is going to determine the amount of graphic violence, language, etc. in a video game. That will ultimately be determined by demographics more than any institutional mandate.

GF: We can't let you go without asking you about the Play Station. Your position seems to be that 3DO is evolutionary, not revolutionary. Do you see room for Sony in the 32 bit hardware world?

OO: All I can really tell you at this time is that there is very strong development being pursued by Sony with an eye toward marketing advanced entertainment hardware.

GF: Thank you for your insight and candid answers, we at Game Fan wish you and Sony Imagesoft the best for the remainder of '93 and beyond.

The four players can choose to band together to take on the Genesis or they can go 2-on-2 or 3-on-1. In each case, one player is the play caller/quarter-back and the others can toggle through and choose an offensive/defensive player to control, whoever presses the "B" button first takes control of the player closest to the ball. The end result of including the four player option is that Walsh becomes the ultimate weekend party game and the long term play value goes over the top.

Graphically, BWCF features very large, well-animated characters in a field perspective that is a little "higher" than the Madden viewpoint. The game makes extensive use of digitized images of

Walsh, the fans, coaches, etc. as you make your way through the College Playoff Championship. Ron Barr, of "Sports By-Line USA" fame, calls the action and guides you through tournament play. The sound is decent with some strong, "college sounding" tunes and some good voice samples.

Additionally, BWCF features reverse angle instant replay, a fairly extensive playbook, user definable weather conditions, a team match-up analysis, decent statistical analysis and user-definable play and pass catch modes. Bill Walsh College Football is an excellent simulation with great presentation and a worthy challenge. Even if you own every football game on the planet, this game is definitely a "blue-chip" recruit and should be near the top of your fall '93 video game wish list. Talko













Atlus is set to release their World Soccer game for the SNES and this game is a speed merchant! 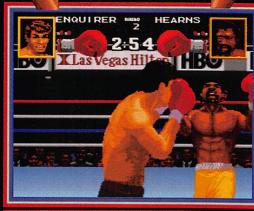
Legends of The Ring, from Electrobrain for the SNES and Genesis pits you against some of the greatest boxers of all time; Sugar Ray Leonard, Thomas "Hit Man" Hearns, Roberto Duran, et. al. are present in their silicon incarnations to challenge you for the crown.

The SNES and Genesis versions of this title are essentially the same, so we will review them both together and point out the differences. LOR benefits from large sprites and good animation (courtesy of Sculptured Software, the NCAA design team) and the game play, especially in the SNES version, does a good job of establishing that rhythm that boxers can get into. The basic theme and control of the game does not stray too far from the "punch until your thumbs bleed" type of game but there is more strategy involved in terms of how you read the other boxer.

In addition, the game offers you a career mode that lets you progress through a 6 fight schedule leading to the Middleweight Championship that can be saved via a password feature. You can also customize the strengths of your boxer and even what he will look like. The SNES version boasts a little better color and animation than its Genesis cousin, but the Genesis game shows more sweat and blood. It is also easier to get in that rhythm on the SNES version. For those of you that own both systems, I prefer the SNES version. It is more realistic and the control is better. Also, the stat tracking on the Genesis version is a little suspect (i.e. punching a guy 98 times in a round when he punches you 23 and you lose the round).

Along with Ali Boxing from Virgin, Legends of The Ring is the cream of the boxing crop. It's not perfect, but it is among the best we've got. Talko.



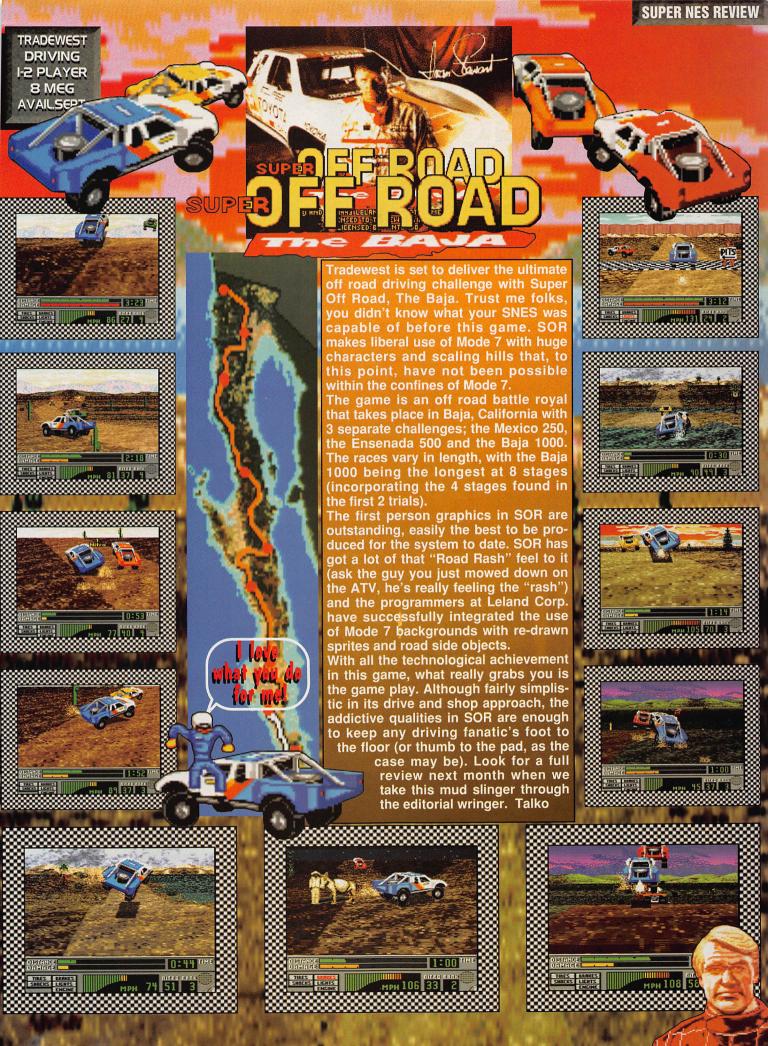


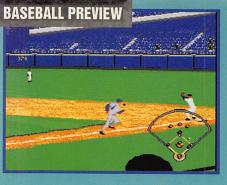


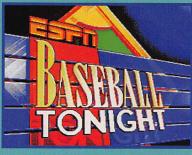




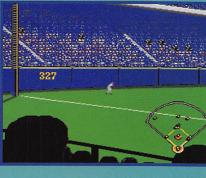

Incredible! The ultimate sports arcade translation has arrived for the Genesis; Super Baseball 2020 from Electronic Arts. I thought the SNES version was good, this is absolutely brilliant! With the exception of the close-up scaling and some crowd animation, everything from the Neo Geo version is here. In fact, the game play and control is better than the Geo version. For example, in the Geo game trying to leap and snag a long drive was next to impossible, in the Genesis version it can be accomplished semi-regularly. The pitching is also much better, with starting pitchers that can make it into the 6th and 7th innings. The crackers (bombs for those of you who are not familiar with the game) are also here (they were noticeably absent from the SNES version).

Graphically, this is the best 16 bit version of 2020. Most of the color, resolution and animation made it through the transla-

tion process and the game really gives you the feeling of having that \$600 Neo Geo sitting on your living room floor instead of the \$89.99 Genesis (available at a retailer near you!). The music and voice are well done as well, with clean digitized samples that capture the spirit and feeling of the arcade title. The only negative that I can see in the game is that, when you hit a screaming liner to either right or left field, you get some flicker as the ball pushes the screen a little faster than it wants to go. But, this is extremely minor and does not effect game play in the least.

As you probably know, Banpresto has become famous for their SD (Super Deformer) games, just about anywhere these 25 gallon trash can size robots show up, you can pretty much guarantee it's got Banpresto's name slapped on it. This is the third of their strategy series. It earned a perfect "10" in a recent issue of Famitsu (a score not easily obtainable by the people who most harshly judge strategy titles). When Special K (the only guy at Game Fan who actually likes strategy games) played this one, he got all nostalgic because Gundam. Getter Robo, Mazinger Z and Rydeen were popular TV shows when he was growing up in Japan.

Each character transforms and uses special moves, just like the old TV shows. So, Japanimation buffs may find this game interesting. SRW3 uses a multi-scenario system, meaning you can choose where to go. You can fly to the moon and attack there or go back to the Earth for help and additional supplies; you're the director. What, of course, makes or breaks a strategy title, are the battle scenes, since they are the only excitement offered in these titles. The battles in SRW3 are excellent scrolling graphic affairs that more than break the monotony.

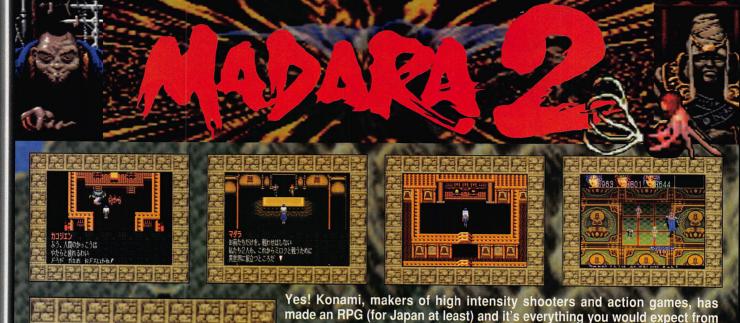
So, if you're in the market for a high quality strategy quest, this should be the channel you turn to next.

Madara is one of the most popular comics in Japan. In fact, an 8 bit version was introduced on the Famicom a few years ago. In this story "Hans" (your 17 year old lead character) sets out to rescue his girlfriend, who has been kidnapped and brought to Madara. When you begin your game, although the graphics are incredible, you will inevitably be blown away by the music which is, to say the least, spectacular for cartridge.

The game itself is not standard RPG either, as the overhead "walking around" portions are the most detailed I have ever seen. The characters are heavily animated, as are the landmarks and backgrounds, but perhaps the best thing about Madara is the fighting mode where, although you simply assign commands as in Final Fantasy, your characters animate fluidly and











use the entire screen as they actually run up to the enemy to unleash their fighting or magic attack. There's even an option where you can decide where to place your characters on the screen when the fighting begins. My only complaint with Madara was the unevenness between your characters and the enemies early in the game. Since they are so strong, a lot of time goes to simply raising your HP and MP. something that should become necessary toward an RPG's end. Other than that, this is a first class quest all the way. It has everything a good RPG should and it's all programmed to perfection by Konami. It's a shame this game may never see the light of day in the US, where we are still trying to convince 3rd party companies that RPGs are a viable means of income...the struggle continues.

In part one, the main character was the Prince of the kingdom. This time, the lead is taken by an everyday kid who over hears that the Prince has embarked on a journey to seek out and destroy the monster "Zool" and decides to follow. There are several unique systems in this game. You can buy (hire) up to four mercenaries to aid you or you can find and combine magical statues to give you up to 12 characters in your party. The fight scenes in SS2 are standard issue RPG fare (1st person with status boxes low on screen and no sight of your characters) but are extremely well drawn and colored. The enemies are scarcely animated and you see your thrust, magic, etc.. The music in SS2 is of the classical nature and is among the best in the SF RPG category.

Gamewise, however, SS2 is fairly linear and will most likely be beaten quickly by advanced RPG players, but because of its quality fight scenes and quality orchestral soundtrack, it should not be overlooked.

You are a descendant of the legendary hero, Maxim and it's your fight now to defeat the Sinistrals; the evil ones. Your girlfriend, Lufia, is by your side helping you through the whole game. The interaction between these two characters is both comic and romantic.

Graphically, the game ranks high. In the field screen, there are clouds floating across the sky and variations of colors are available to make the game look spectacular. The music in Lufia is also excellent. I especially like the title track.

The only drawbacks in Lufia are the fighting scenes, which just don't put me into the fray like other RPGs. The version I played was in English and is translated from the original (Estopolis) very well.

I recommend this RPG to all US players since it is one of the few ready for US release and it's a good RPG for both beginners and masters alike.

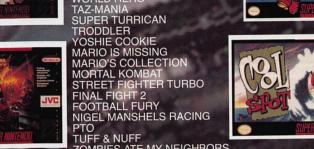

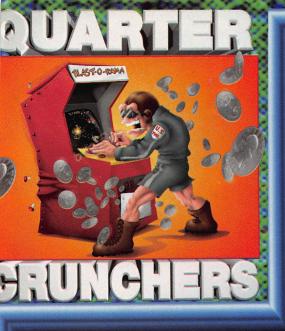

There are a ton of Street Fighter 2 clones out there, most of them are worth tossing a few bits into then it's back to Capcom's massive money making, quarter crunching monster. Namco's Knuckle Heads is a little different.

The key to Knuckle Heads is its simple play mechanics and ease of control. Up to four players can compete at a time and there are 6 bad ass characters each of whom has four different special attacks. With great background graphics, solid animation and unique game play, Namco looks to have another winner on its hands.

All of the characters have different abilities; for example, Gundam can shoot the beam and Vulcan gun and Zugoc has a dashing heat attack similar to Blanka's. This game has tested extremely well in Japanese arcades and may find its way to American shores...we'll keep you posted!









Every Japanese kid knows all about the famous animated series Macross. Now, Banpresto and Gamest Magazine have released Macross 2, their new shooter based on the series, in Japanese arcades.

Macross 2 is a solid, side scrolling shooter with great graphics and control. The attack is fairly straight forward with the requisite shooting and bombing capabilities and power-up system and the game play is very similar to the R-Type series except with a unique twist; if you score more than 10,000 points on any level, you will get unlimited lives for that level.. If you want to play Macross 2, however, it's a one way ticket to Osaka pal.

So, here's what's new in the gaming world this month, or at least the most important stuff.

### In Sega News ...

There's been a lot of talk about Sega's upcoming 32 bit system, here's the scoop. The project name is Saturn, whether or not the system will be called the same is unknown...probably not. The release (for Japan at least) is September November '94. Sega could let it rip earlier (it's rumored to be complete) but won't because of price. Sega isn't interested in marketing any system over \$500 and can't get the unit out at that price just yet. The developers will also need a year or so with the new hardware, so for once we'll have a good library of games at the system's launch. In the meantime we'll have to be content with our Sega CDs, which is fine by me. I just got finished playing a little Silpheed and it's freaking awesome. Also just around the corner (hopefully) are Rebel Assault, Lethal Enforcers, Microcosm, the revamped Dracula, Journey to The Center of The Earth (a working title), which looks awesome, Aliens, Last Action Hero (which uses Silicon graphics in a 3/4 perspective), Cliffhanger, World Series Baseball, Walsh Football, Montana CD, Dragon's Lair, Stellar Fire, AX-101, Dream House, Sengoku, Heimdall, F1 Grand Prix, Ground Zero Texas, Racing Aces, Mad Dog McCree, Spiderman, AH-3 Firehawk, Terminator, Lunar (US release), Jurassic Park, Video Boxing, Mortal Kombat, Super Battletank 2, Battletech and, of course, this year's crowning jewel; Sonic CD and that's just what we know about, many projects for '94 have already been started, so the Sega CD is in for a good year. Did you notice the word revamped for Dracula CD? I am happy to report that Sony/Psygnosis has had the good sense to delay the game for another month or so in order to make some much needed improvements (like everything but the background). So, look for Dracula to be an excellent game, good call. We've also heard that Core, makers of such splendor as Wonderdog, Son of Chuck, AH-3 Firehawk and Heimdall, has a new CD title under development that is really going to knock your socks off, so keep your feet clean. Over in Japan, word is that Enix may become a Sega 3rd party, Act Raiser CD? I wish, but it does make sense. Also going into development is Lunar 2 by Gamearts. After pushing the CD to its limits with Silpheed, can you imagine what they'll do with this already great RPG? We're still waiting for screen shots of Sega's recent (and most spectacular) coin-op driver, Out Runners and, as of August 9, no format has been announced. CD? DSP? Either would be fine. I've noticed a lot of mail over at the Postmeister's office (what a mess) about a supposed Street Fighter CD. Don't hold your breath though, if it is to be, it's gonna be a while. We heard it may be at the January CES...maybe. For now, you'll have to be content with Mortal on CD and believe me, if you're into MK, you will be! While we're on the subject of Sega, has anyone seen those cool Sonic RC cars at Toys 'R Us? They're pretty cool, Sonic can drive your dog crazy. Finally, check this out. Psygnosis has found a way to display 4096 colors on screen with the Genesis! It's called HAM (hold and modify). No word yet on on the first game to use this new technique, but I'm pretty sure you'll know when you see it. European developers sure have been on a roll lately; Core, Probe, Software Creations, Psygnosis and Rare, the new frontier!

## And In Nintendo News ...

And what about the sleeping giant...Nintendo? The latest word on a CD drive is 1995 but, with the upcoming upgrade we talked about last month, does it matter? Wait until you hear the music and singing in Clay Fighter. It had me lookin' for a CD drive. Meanwhile, FX Trax is undergoing major surgery, it's up to 16 meg and has new graphics but will most likely be an early '94 release. In the meantime though, there are a few new projects in the works. Konami is readying Lethal Enforcers and a new Twin Bee action game. Taito has announced an all new version of Ninja Warriors with 3 characters to choose from and 2 player simultaneous play and, of course, Nintendo has another SFX game in development, but they're not talking...yet. Meanwhile, Nosferatu, Super Metroid, Mega-Man X, Ninja Gaiden and Act Raiser 2 are big titles lurking in the near future, but near enough? Will Mario Collection carry Nintendo through the holiday season? How's this for a rumor (and so far this is just a rumor)? We have heard from more than one source that Nintendo may acquire Atari! Think about it. The Lynx becomes the Color Game Boy and Jaguar would become Nintendo's long awaited new cart./CD-ROM console. Even the suggested retail is right where Nintendo wants it at \$199. Could you imagine Capcom or Konami programming on the Lynx, or better yet a 64 bit power monger like the Jaguar. You know, some rumors are true and some are not. My guess is this one is not, but you never know.

## And What About Atari?

In actual Jaguar news, game development is well under way. Although no official announcement has been made as to

w many third parties will develop software, there have been sightings of Cisco Heat, Tempest, an F1 Racing game and first person flying/combat sim.. With the low price point and the high level of technology, I would expect to see excelnt support for Atari's new hardware. By the way, Cisco Heat is exact. We will be attending an Atari press conference in a gust, so we will give you all the details next issue.

While we're on the subject of super systems, the 3DO is on schedule and the rumors of a lower price continue to cirlate. By next issue, our 3DO section should be actual in-house layouts, so look for mega pages on what is shaping up be the hot system for '94 and beyond. Let's not forget about the Neo Geo though. Samurai Showdown is amazing and st around the corner are Top Hunter (yeah! an action game) Fatal Fury Special, Art of Fighting 2, Magician Lord 2 and lk of a Geo version of Chrystalis continues to linger. SNK is also rumored to be working on a Sonic/Mario type game alled Reactor. Top Hunter is an over 100 meg (well over) action game similar to Bionic Commando and Contra and is aid to be the best action game to date on the Geo. Fatal Fury Special features 15 characters to choose from; from both and FF2, and is also over 100 meg. Fatal Fury Special is set for October release while the other games mentioned the simply coming before the close of '93. No actual dates are set, bottom line, if you're into fighting games, this should be your system of choice.

Now, for those of you that have held on to your Turbo CDs and Duos, there is some good news for you. The 16 meg ograde card (arcade card) is scheduled for a December release in Japan, along with Fatal Fury 2 CD. Also scheduled or early '94 are World Heroes 2 and Art of Fighting. Other games in the works include Knuckle Heads, SF2 Turbo, farriors of Fate and Fighter's History. Konami's new fighter, Martial Champions, is also scheduled for a December elease (for Super CD) and Castlevania (also Super CD) is set for October 29. And don't forget Y's IV, The Dawn of Y's is so coming in December. Although the US market continue to sputter like so many Mario carts, the PC Engine remains popular and competitive system in Japan (ahhh, compatibility). Meanwhile, project Tatsujin, Hudson's 32 bit machine,

set to appear in Japan in March of '94 and could come out here around the same time.

The big news in the arcades these days is of course Street Fighter 2 and Mortal Kombat 2. MK2 will feature 14 characters (including the original 7) and you will now get to control reptile Goro and Shang Tsung. According to our source, ne new character has knives coming out of his body, pin head style and Lu Kang can now turn into a dragon and bite ou in half. I bet the censors will have fun with that one. Button configuration will remain the same. Finally, there is yet nother new system ( we mentioned it in Issue #7 ), Commodore's Amiga CD 32. Although no US release date has been lanned, the system stands ready and has European gamers all excited. For a look at the spec's., see pictures below. 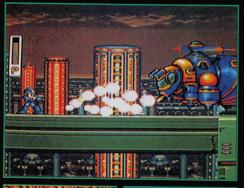

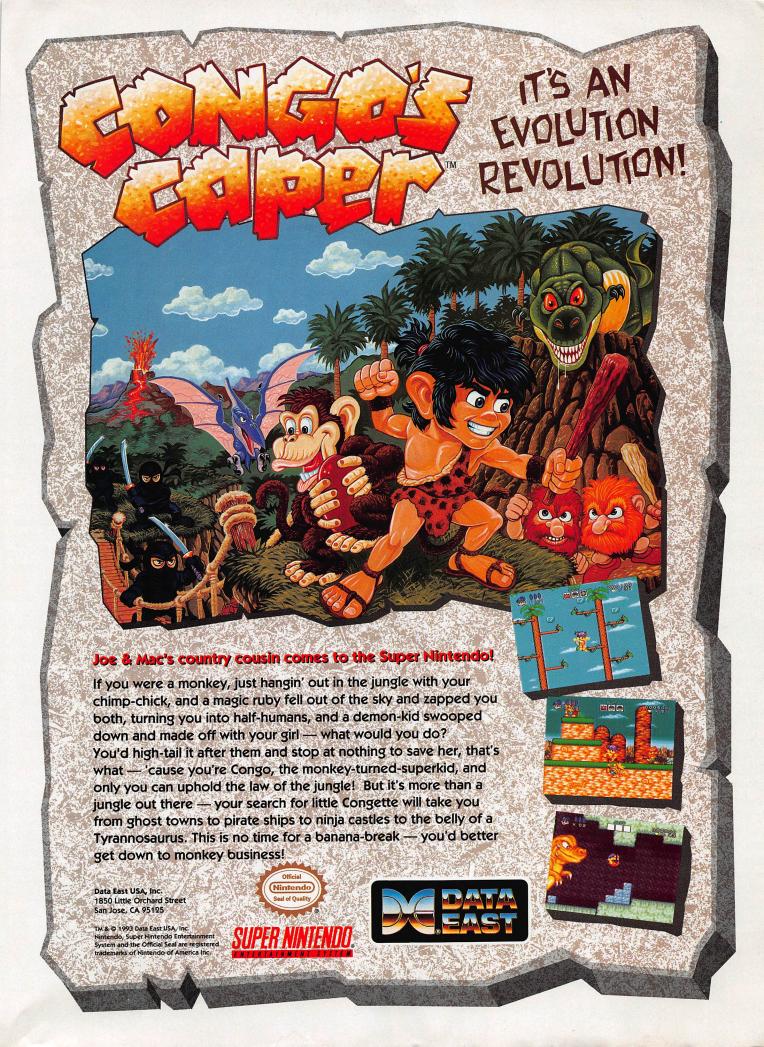

Hey Willy,

It is odd, isn't it? Think about it, you're a licensee and you're about to hire a development team to make a game, so you get some hard core gamers together to look at your idea. They grovel and tweak and give it back... "Make this." If you don't develop in house, you go hire a team. First question; "What have you done previously?" Look at that, give it to some gamers. They say "these guys are ok", so you invest a ton of money in development, advertising, etc.. Then, every week during development, you send in your prosto ok the progress. Finish it, submit it, weak it, send it to the mags for some hype, run some ads then sit back and wait for the profits...no worries! I'm the Postmeister and I can figure that one out.

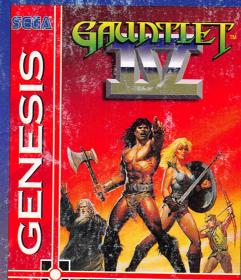
