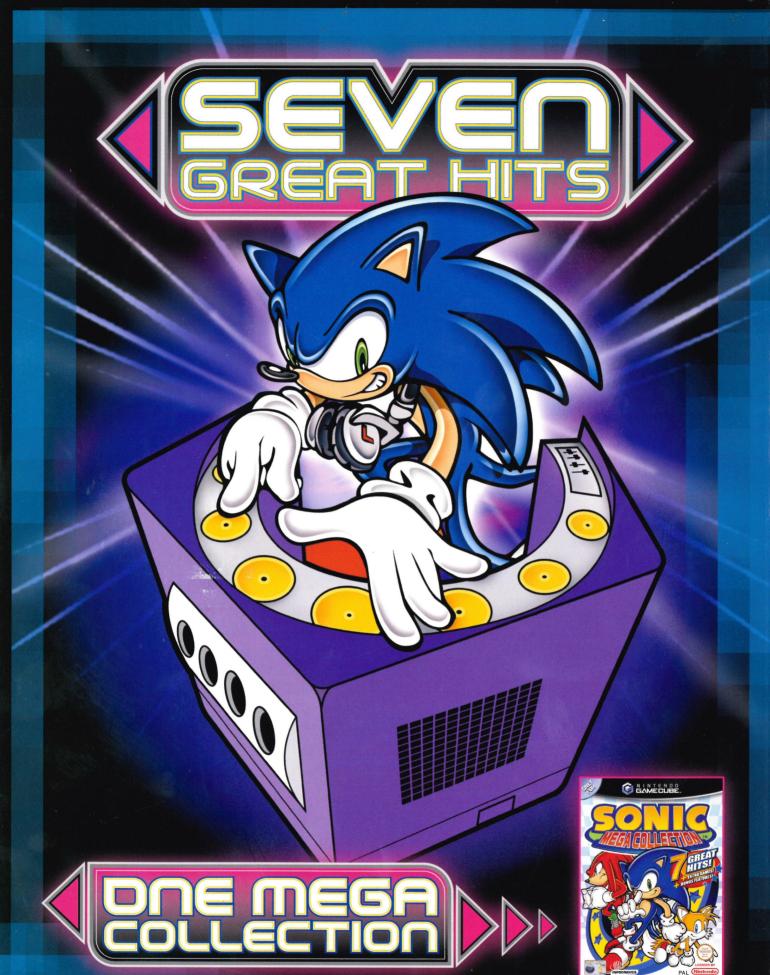

here are two very important qualities you need to be a stealth operative. Firstly, you need to sneak around in an almost invisible fashion. Secondly, should you ever be captured, never tell them what you know. Well, while on a European tour to promote The Wind Waker, Shigeru Miyamoto managed to spill beans all over the shop by blurting out that Metal Gear was coming to GameCube in an interview with Italian journalists. Bag open, cats everywhere...

This wasn't an announcement Nintendo were ready to make and all we could get through official channels as we went to press was: 'Mr Miyamoto is working with Konami to bring Metal Gear Solid to GameCube."

Konami weren't much in the mood to talk either, simply stating that: 'As Mr Miyamoto says, the game is currently in development. We will make an official announcement regarding this project when the time comes."

The very fact that a Metal Gear game is on its way is fantastic news for the Nintendo faithful - it's lead character, Solid Snake, ranks with Mario and Sonic as one of the most famous faces in the world of video games. Rumours are rife as to what the game will be like, but we've boiled it down to two options. Konami has already stated that Metal Gear Solid 3 is in development for PS2, so this would be relatively easy to switch to GameCube.

The second theory is that the new game will be a remake of the PlayStation classic Metal Gear Solid, still regarded by many as the finest Metal Gear game yet. This way Nintendo gamers are guaranteed an amazing game that looks brilliant and it's a winning formula as Capcom proved with its Resident Evil remake. Anyway, the moment Shigsy lets any more information slip out, you'll be the first to know.

### METAL GEAR COMES HOME!

### METAL GEAR, **NES, 1988**

The year is 1995 and Snake is sent to an enemy fortress called Outer Heaven to rescue trapped operative, Gray Fox, and take down a nuclear tank called Metal Gear. Weapons and ammo are scarce, necessitating the stealth approach that became the series' trademark.

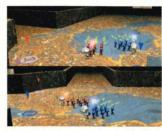

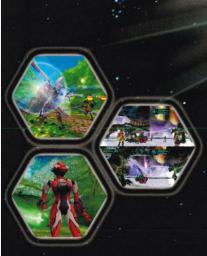

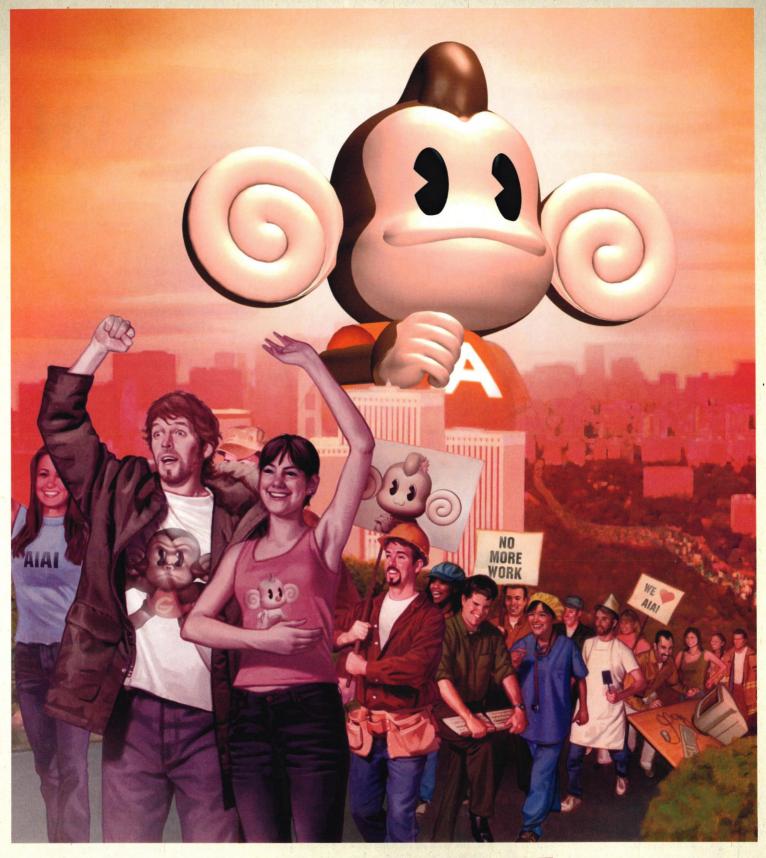

The GameCube version will linkup to the GBA and the most likely application is a reproduction of the Chao mini-games of the Dreamcast version. This would mean training up the little Chao creatures on your GBA screen, Tamagotchi style.

The main game sees Sonic and friends battling to retrieve the seven Chaos Emeralds that the evil Dr Robotnik (Eggman) plans to use to destroy the world. You can see Big the Cat in these shots, swinging his fishing rod around - he uses this to hit enemies in the face extremely hard (and also to catch fish). Maybe he'll appear in Soul Calibur 2 for a vicious fish-off with Link! Actually, maybe he won't.

The game also features a menacing robot - the E-102. It has big machine guns, rolls around and can also hover. That'd sound like bad news if it wasn't on your team. Eat that Robotnik! Sonic Adventure DX will be out in the Summer.

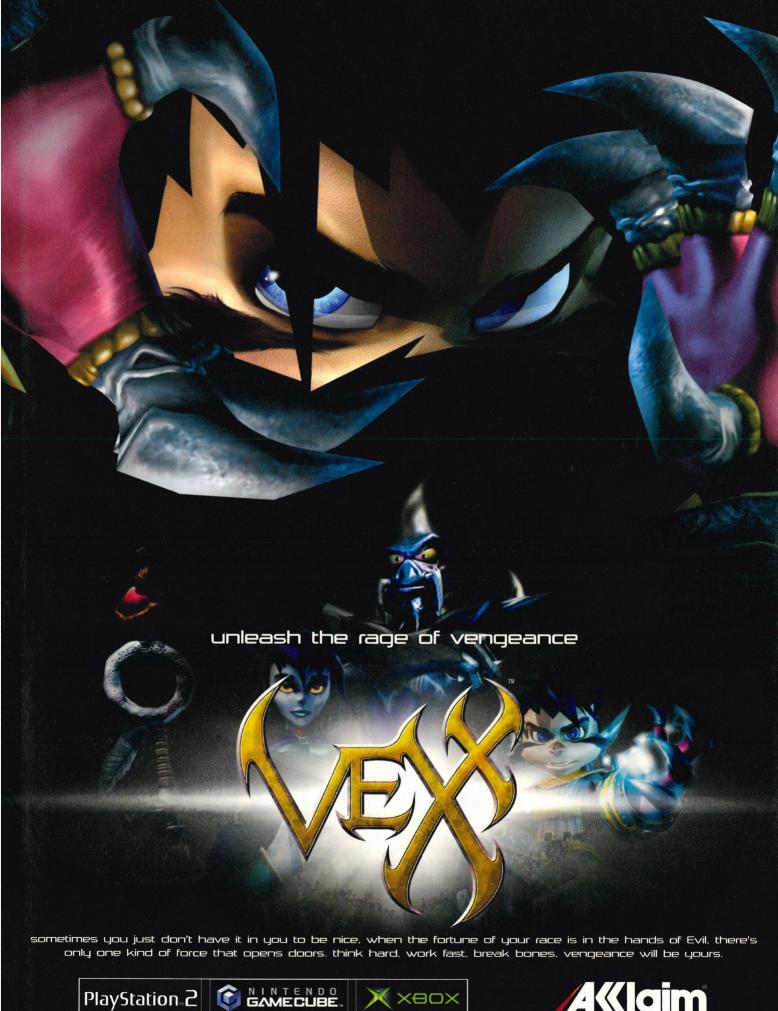

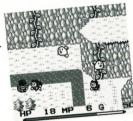

Metroid Fusion and Final Fantasy Tactics Advance were the top-selling games.

■ The inventor of the Game Boy, Gunpei Yokoi has received a posthumous International Game Developer's Association Lifetime Achievement Award



at the Game Developer's Conference in San Jose. The award will be presented by last year's winner, Sega's Yuji Naka. As well as the handheld

console, Yokoi-san also collaborated with Shigeru Miyamoto on classics such as Donkey Kong, Mario Bros. and Metroid.

- Square recently revealed details of its exciting precursor to the Secret of Mana series, Shin Yaku Seiken Densetsu. The game's title translates as New Testament: Leaend of the Sacred Sword. The original Game Boy title was Legend of the Sacred Sword, released as Final Fantasy Adventure in America, According to the game's Japanese website, it will be based on the Game Boy version where the legend began.
- New screenshots have emerged from Hideo Kojima's new GBA title, Boktai (My Sun), showing pictures of the game at various stages through the day. No information has yet been released on how

it'll actually work or what players will have to do.

■ The Soul Calibur 2 Arcade Stick will be released in Japan on the same day as the game. Featuring six face buttons and an old-skool joystick, the unit is also decorated with SC2 characters. Japanese Calibur fans will be able to pick up a copy of the game and the stick in a bundle for around ¥10,780 (about £58).

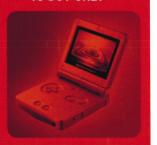

SHIGERU MIYAMOTO'S LONDON VISIT

### SHIGSY REVEALS MORE SECRETS

STAR FOX GBA AND MARIO KART ANYONE? MIYAMOTO REVEALS CLASSIFIED NINTENDO SECRETS

f you were anywhere near London's Virgin Megastore at 1pm on 21 February it wasn't an earthquake you felt, it was the stamping, cheering and hollering of over 1,000 Nintendo fans going mental as Shigeru Miyamoto stepped out on stage for his first-ever signing session.

The man who created Mario, Donkey Kong and tons of your most cherished Nintendo characters sat signing memorabilia for over two hours and, according to Virgin, more people turned up than at a recent Westlife signing session. Too bloody right!

It was after the London event though that Miyamoto started to divulge a number of development secrets. Work on a new Donkey Kong is well underway and the Space World 2000 GameCube Zelda demo may well form the foundations of a future GameCube title, though not necessarily a new Zelda game. Miyamoto also let slip that there is a Ruby and Sapphire Pokémon Stadium in the works and that the cancelled Super NES game, Star Fox 2, may finally see the light of day on Game Boy Advance.

However, rumours that the next Mario Kart will be online now appear to be false with Miyamoto stating: 'We've been conducting online experiments with Mario Kart for quite some time. We've looked at it and I still feel that it would be very difficult to pull off online."







☐: Where did you get inspiration for using wind? Were you going to use fire or water instead?

A: First of all we came up with the idea of the ocean and how Link would move. We decided to use a ship and make use of a sailing boat so

players could have control over the wind and that's how we came up with the idea. We also wanted to take advantage of areas that no-one else was using and that was controlling the wind by taking advantage of GameCube's performance.

☐: What were the main elements of Zelda that you didn't have the time to put in?

A: We had to delete two stages, which included some dungeons. Most of the ideas we were originally thinking about were incorporated.

☐: The new style of Zelda was a radical change when it was first shown. Can we expect a similar type of shock with Mario 128 this time around?

Actually we never intended to create a shock it's just that we were trying to make something new. Talking about Mario 128, we have not come up with the specific stages of reformation for the Mario character. Once again, I try not to make any shock waves in the industry - I'm just always thinking of perfect gameplay and control.

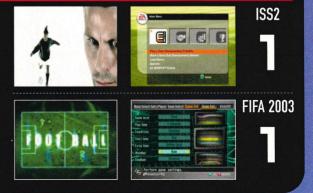
ith one domestic trophy already decided and the football season screaming towards a thunderous head, NOM set out to find which footy game rules the roost with a head-to-head contest between the two main contenders; ISS2 and FIFA 2003.

It was a hard fought, tense battle between the two protagonists, but of course there So kick back and read on to find out who qualified for Europe and who's left fighting for survival at the very foot of the table.

### **PRESENTATION**

It's clear from the start that FIFA is the big-budget game with Giggs, Davids and Carlos showing their skills while Timo Mass' To Get Down bangs away in the background. But FIFA's menus can be confusing, and there are some hefty loading times.

ISS2's intro is quite mundane as CG players move in slow-motion across the screen. The music is generic big beat that grates after a while. But the menus are much better organised and it's easy to see what to do.





### **GAMEPLAY**

The most important factor by far and the two sides are pretty evenly matched. ISS2 has a good variety of moves and it's easy to get into. Player selection is usually pretty spot-on and with a bit of practice you can knock the ball about quite comfortably. ISS2 is let down by players who can't turn and goalkeepers who often have no appreciation of what's going on around them leading to some absolute defensive catastrophes.

The improvements that have been made to FIFA since the dismal

2002 World Cup edition are staggering. EA's game takes a little longer to master but the through-ball running and close control is almost like the real thing. The old problem of being able to run through the defence like it isn't there still happens. but it's not quite as easy as in past incarnations. It's tight, but FIFA just shades it in injury-time.



### **GRAPHICS**

Both games look great with lush pitches and realistic weather. ISS2 has good player detail and the replays are nice, but FIFA is the clear winner with excellent likenesses in the players. And FIFA's greater variety of camera angles means you can enjoy the action from a number of

We may know our games, but we certainly don't claim to be experts on the beautiful game. Therefore we asked some people who quite clearly are: Mark Bailey and Darren Cross from NOM's lunchtime football opponents Match magazine.

The guys spent an afternoon in NOM's seedy games room comparing the two telly-based titles to the real thing. Here's what they had to say.

### **FIFA 2003**

FIFA has genuine football playability that lets you ping passes about, string moves together and pull off silky skills to provide a fun, high tempo game just like the real thing. Sadly shooting, which is the most important thing to a footy fan, is a bit tricky and occasionally there's some slow reactions that ruin the normally sharp movement of players. But unlike the usual cardboard cut-outs you see as fans, the crowd bounces about in impressively accurate stadiums, singing proper songs, which shows an eye for detail that any footy fan will appreciate.

### ISS<sub>2</sub>

ISS2 actually works better as a football game if you're a spectator, rather than a player. This is largely because the gameplay is halted by replay after endless replay, which is visually impressive, but incredibly annoying if you're playing as they constantly interrupt the flow. The players plod very slowly around the pitch and go down like they've been shot when they're tackled, but when you get used to this (and the chirpy co-commentary of Mark Lawrenson) ISS2 can be a lot of fun.

Behind every Nintendo classic, there's usually a legacy of excellence – *Metroid Prime* stands as a magnificent example of video game craft, but that only came as a surprise to people who hadn't played the previous games in the brilliant series.



### THAT TRADEMARK ATMOSPHERE, *METROID*, NES. 1986

Metroid on the NES gave you the feeling of being in an organic, threatening alien world. Quite an achievement given that today's calculators have as much graphical grunt as the crusty old NES. The fantastic music also helped build up the moody atmosphere.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

The Metroid series was the brainchild of Nintendo genius Gunpei Yokoi, inventor of the Game Boy. Yokoi left Nintendo in 1996 after his Virtual Boy console flopped and was killed in a car crash in October 1997.





### IT'S A GIRL! METROID, NES, 1986

Thanks to today's powerful polygons, Samus' ladybumps give her away as a girl straight away, but on the humble NES it really wasn't obvious at all. Nintendo played to this by only revealing her sex at the conclusion of the first game. It caused shock and despair in equal measures.

#### DID AON KUOMS

Samus' Power Suit is 190cm tall (6'2") and weighs 90kg. Seeing her step out of it at the end of *Super Metroid*, we'd say she's about 5'10". Our Dom can also supply a breast-size guess if asked. Filthy beggar!





## THE REVOLTING MOTHERBRAIN, METROID, NES, 1986

Metroid's menacing über-boss Motherbrain established another Metroid trademark: disgusting and innovative boss characters. Motherbrain crops up throughout the series and it's brown trousers time on every occasion.



#### DID AON KUOMS

Samus features in the mighty Super Smash Bros. games on N64 and GameCube, but she's also had a smaller cameo in level 5-2 of Kirby's Dreamland on the Super NES.



### *METROID* GOES PORTABLE, *METROID II*, GAME BOY, 1992



It was a long time coming and then it arrived in black and white! The handheld conversion didn't harm the series at all and it was here we first saw the invaluable, secret-uncovering X-Ray Scope.

#### DID AON KUOMS

The original *Metroid* was one of the first games ever to feature a password-save system. By the time of the sequel, Nintendo had introduced battery back-up.



### NASTY OLD KRAID. SUPER METROID. SUPER NES. 1994



We could sing the praises of almost any *Metroid* boss, but Kraid is particularly cool. He's huge, filling the screen, spitting fire, throwing spikes and getting bigger as you shoot him.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

Metroid is the one big Nintendo franchise that never made it onto the N64. All poor old Samus got was a brief outing in Super Smash Bros.



### MOTHERBRAIN. SUPER METROID. SUPER NES. 1994



Few game endings bring a tear to your eye, but this is one of them. The giant Metroid sacrifices itself to give you the power to defeat Motherbrain in an epic final confrontation. Now you know where a certain handheld Metroid ending came from.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

Early on, it seemed that the development of Metroid Prime in the US was going badly. Rumours were rife that Nintendo were going to remove Retro Studios from the project and take it back in-house for some tender loving care. What a mistake that would've been!



### THE TERRIFYING SA-X. METROID *FUSION*. GBA. 2002



The scariest thing a severely depleted Samus could be hunted by is a fully powered-up version of herself – each laser bolt creaming off whole energy tanks and a survival chance of approximately zero. When the two cross paths in Fusion, it's absolutely terrifying.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

At the time of its release in 1994, Super Metroid came on the biggest Super NES cart ever issued – 24Mbits. It didn't hold the title for long though -Namco's Tales of Phantasia weighed in at 48Mbits.







### MORPH BALL GOES 3D. METROID PRIME. GAMECUBE, 2003

Everybody thought the Morph Ball would be dropped for the 3D Metroid. No chance. Monkey Ball met Tony Hawk's and the animation is one of GameCube's coolest graphical touches so far.

#### DID AON KUOMS

Metroid games are far more popular in the West than Japan. Super Metroid sold twice as many copies in the US, explaining why an American developer was used for Prime.





### SAMUS GETS HER OWN BACK, SSB. **N64. 1999**

"So Nintendo still loves you, huh Mario? Have a laser in the face". Okay, Samus never actually said that, but we did on her behalf. It was great to have her back, fighting fit.

#### DID AON KUOMS

There's a monster in Super Metroid called Ridley - a nod to film director Ridley Scott. Scott's seminal sci-fi movie Alien inspired many of the creatures in the game and also the twisted landscapes of Zebes.







### METROID TROPHY. SSBM. GAMECUBE. 5005

There were some huge Metroid larvae in Super Metroid, but this trophy let you get a great view - the translucent body looked disgusting. To Metroid fans, it was some prize.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

The numbers at the start of each game reveal that Super Metroid and Fusion are the third and fourth episodes in the Metroid saga. Prime is the start of a new series, but we hope a 2D Metroid 5 turns up soon.

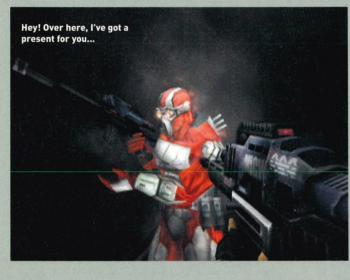

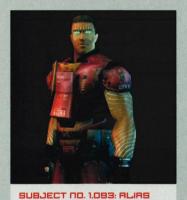

### NO REST FOR THE WICKED

Right from the start of the first mission it's clear that Red Faction II is a nononsense shooter. There's no real stealth involved, it's a simple case of kill or be killed.

What we weren't prepared for was the relentless pace of the game that leaves you absolutely breathless. There are hardly any cut-scenes to speak of and the missions are updated on the fly, so there aren't any mission objective screens to sit and pore over.

As you progress through the levels. an alert will appear on screen to advise you that your objectives have been updated. A quick tap on A reveals the new missions and then it's back to the action. It's a very clever system that makes you feel like you're really in a desperate battle between good and evil, and the fact that the enemies don't stop while you check your mission status only adds to the urgency.

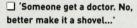

### BRING THE HOUSE DOWN

Red Faction II's most unique feature is the Geo-Mod system. This allows you to destroy almost any part of the scenery that you desire, often creating new or alternative routes.

The original Red Faction game was criticised for the failure to fully implement the Geo-Mod system - there just wasn't enough destruction - but Volition has fixed that by making almost everything you can see collapsible. Chances are if you

can see it, you can destroy it. And it's not a gimmick - it's an integral part of the game. You won't even be able to get past the first level if you aren't prepared to enter into the destructive spirit.

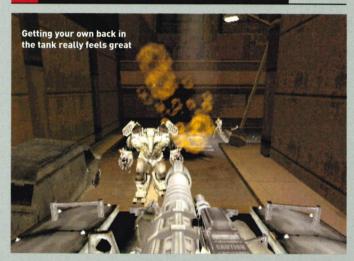

The Nano-cell is being stored in the centre of the building, but there's no clear way through. A frightened worker is hunched down next to an air vent off to our left. We head towards him, shoot out the vent and head through the tunnels, flicking on our night-vision goggles as we go.

A few more guards out of the way and we reach the containment facility and grab the Nano-cell. The screen fades to black and we jump forward two years to the opening sequence where we discover that we are now renegades, marked for death.

The passageway leads to a subway station filled with spider bots that are viciously quick and intent on our destruction.

- How long has Red Faction II been in development then?
- The original Red Faction II for PS2 started in May 2001. Work began on the GameCube version in June 2002.
- : What changes were made to the GameCube version?
- We tweaked the GameCube RFII to render at a higher resolution than the PS2 version, making the graphics much smoother, polished the artwork and animations and optimised many areas of the game including physics processing, animation and the Geo-Mod system.
- How has the Geo-Mod system been improved?
- Geo-Mod has been updated to have much more of a gameplay role in Red Faction II. In addition to being a really fun feature, now the player must destroy the environment to advance. Also, A.I.-controlled enemies can take advantage of their dynamic surroundings to further challenge the player.
- What new weapons have been invented for the Multiplayer mode?
- The weapon selection features a wide variety of tools to get the job done. Ranging from the precision and one-shot-kill of the Sniper Rifle to the massive destruction caused by the W.A.S.P. Rocket Launcher. Personally I prefer the special targeting mode of the Rail Gun that allows targeting and disposal of opponents through walls! It's the best bit in the game.

#### ... AND YER MATES



With its strong sense of wanton destruction and high-octane action it would almost be a crime for Red Faction II not to contain a multiplayer mode. Thankfully the team game is as well developed as the singleplayer adventure meaning that you can blast the arse out of your mates into the wee

The standard Deathmatch contains all of the usual modes and options. You can set a time limit and a frag limit, turn on one-shot kills, have unlimited ammo and tailor the weapons to suit your needs.

There are also bots that can be added to the arenas to make the Deathmatch an absolute bloodbath. The level design is very

good, a mix of GoldenEye 007 corridors and Quake 3 halls. There's also a team option where you can take sides and destroy the enemy together.

As well as the standard Deathmatch there's Capture the Flag, where you have to find the enemies' flag and return it to your base for a score, and Bagman where the winner is the player who can hold on to the bag for the longest amount of time.

Then there are the more unusual modes like Arena; a best-of series of Deathmatches in which the winner must triumph over a number of rounds, but once killed you can't respawn until another round begins. And there's a hidden multiplayer game called Regime that must be unlocked in the oneplayer game.

Red Faction II's non-stop action is a welcome change to all the stealth games we've been seeing. There seems to be very few changes to make on this preview code, aside from small graphical glitches and lip-synching. We reckon this will be another unmissable slice of GameCube action.

The surprise hit of last year finally gets a GameCube sequel. Buckle up, race fans – this looks like it could be the craziest ride of your life.

hen rumours started circulating that the maniac racing game, *Burnout 2*, wouldn't be coming to GameCube, the whole *NOM* office broke down.

The first game had steered its way into our hearts with a great mix of high-speed thrills and heartstopping spills. Sure there were problems but it was, and still is, one of the best racers available on GameCube.

But with no official word from the game's publisher, Acclaim, we kept our fingers and toes crossed, hoping that we'd soon be experiencing more hardcore racing. This month our prayers were answered when we received an invite to a rather seedy lock up in Hammersmith to see *Burnout 2* running on GameCube. Bring it on!

Although it shares the same basic premise as the original, *Burnout 2* has everything turned up to 11. With more cars, more tracks, more traffic and more explosive crashes, this really is adrenaline-central.

The most striking thing that you'll

notice from these screenshots is the new-look cars. The basic models are all here but there are now some juicy extras to unlock.

By winning championships and driving like a nutter you'll eventually get your hands on the Custom Series mode which will take you to *Max Power* heaven. The Custom cars are based on the standard motors, but they've been tuned-up, dropped down and covered in decals to make them look like true rockhard street racers.

# □: I found the whole *Burnout* meter a bit confusing, what does it actually do?

**A:** Criterion got a lot of customer feedback about this aspect of the game. Some people didn't even realise what the Burnout meter was for. The idea was that as you made daring overtaking manoeuvres and drove on the wrong side of the road you'd build up power in the Burnout meter. When full you could use the Burnout to get a speed boost.

#### ☐: And that's all been changed in Burnout 2 has it?

**A:** The concept is the same but the whole system is pretty unrecognisable when compared to the first game. Burnout is now earned for virtually anything, powerslides, jumps, overtaking and driving on the wrong side of the road.

Once full, the meter sets on fire making it pretty impossible to miss. When you activate the Burnout meter you'll hear an almighty crack, like in the classic Turbo Outrun, and the volume of the music increases. Oh, and your car goes like it's possessed.

**\Pi**: Burnout had realistic crashes but they weren't all that exciting, what are they like in Burnout 2?

**F**: Mad. Whereas before your car would hit

an oncoming bus, do a couple of spins and get a dent in the bonnet, now the car will fly into the air, pirouetting as it rises above the streets, whilst pieces of bodywork fly off it and spin wildly across the road, before finally coming to a battered rest.



# THE FIRST HOUR

Right from the off it's amazing to see how far the game has come. The sense of speed is absolutely incredible and the amount of traffic plus background and foreground detail shows that this is pushing the GameCube pretty hard.

It's great to see that the boys at Criterion have taken on board all the comments that came in about the first title and they've really tried to improve every aspect of the game with a huge

amount of success. Burnout 2 more in your face, much louder. obvious as soon as you get into the car that this game is unashamedly about driving like a crazed loon and not having an ounce of respect for whatever else is on the roads.

> What the developers have attempted is to allow players to link boosts more effectively – it's even possible to Burnout around a whole circuit. This definitely adds to the sense of speed that you get from the game. We managed to link six boosts, but some of the guys at Criterion had done 29! The cars handle very well and it's easy to pull off crazy drifts and wild overtaking manoeuvres. And a bonus for players who like the front-of-car

camera is that this viewpoint has been made a bit more forgiving meaning you can get much closer to other vehicles without

the fear of crashing.

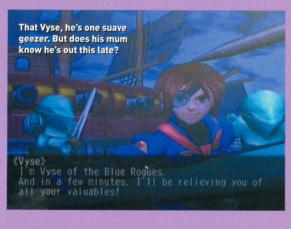

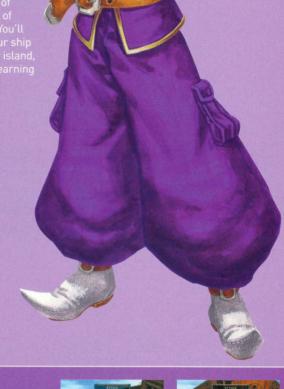

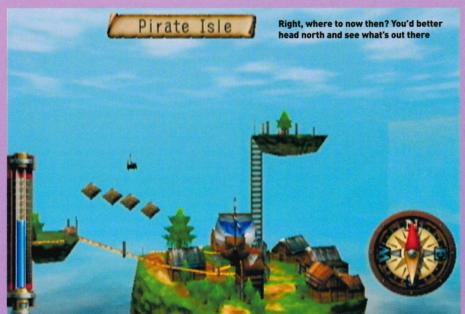

But mostly *Crush Hour* is a case of cat-and-mouse chases, searching for power-ups, making unholy alliances to deal with runaway leaders and circle-strafing opponents like it's going out of fashion. All this makes it feel a bit like an FPS deathmatch on wheels.

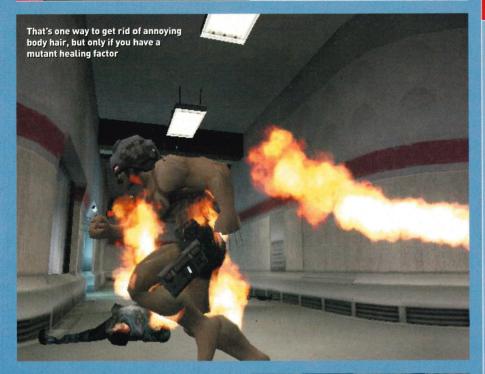

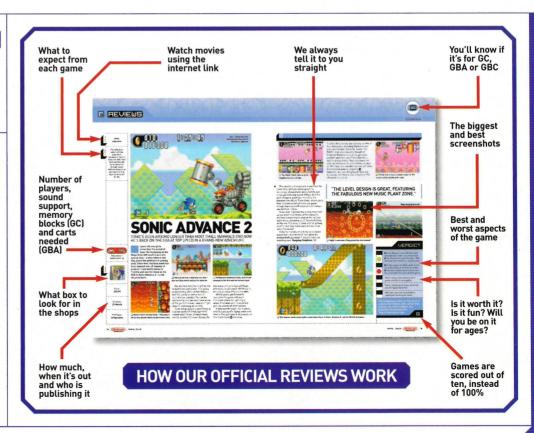

Everything that's scanned is logged in Samus' computer and by accessing these files you'll discover an enemy's weaknesses and what's happened to the planet - and just as importantly, what's happened to its inhabitants. It's a truly brilliant and original way of telling the story and serves to reinforce the relentlessly immersive gameplay.

Only by progressing will you lay your hands on the remaining two visors, both of which are utterly awesome and just rewards for the battles that lay before them. The first you'll uncover is the Thermal Visor, which displays heat signatures, allowing Samus to operate in low lighting. The other, and definitely the most impressive, is the X-Ray Visor. This permits you to peer though walls and lets you see Space Pirates using optical camouflage as well as platforms hidden from the naked eye.

All this visual and technological flair would count for nothing if the gameplay was poor, but it most definitely isn't. Control is resolutely tight and our worries about a firstperson game involving so much jumping have been shot to pieces. The contro's are very different to games like TimeSplitters 2 and Turok Evolution, but they work in every situation, giving you total control over a game that serves up a heady cocktail of exploration and all-out action.

The game world is a web of claustrophobic tunnels, dilapidated ruins, towering

Equally beguiling is the combat. Enemy intelligence is always varied and you'll have to do so much more than park your finger on

This search leads them to Ragoll, but in time honoured fashion something goes seriously wrong, meaning you have to descend to the planet's surface and find out what's occurring.

There's the choice to play online, which will cost you £5.99 per month once you've used the first free month that comes with the game. You'll also have to buy either

#### WHAT IT'LL COST YOU

Let's talk money, if we can be so crude. To get this game online and to keep it there you'll need to consider the following costs. First there's the game, which will cost you £39.99. This cost includes the first month online free, after which you'll have to pay £5.99 per month by Direct Debit or via a credit or debit card. Then you'll need a modem, which will cost around £34.99 for 56k, and the

same for broadband.

Next you'll need to decide whether to get a keyboard at about £30. Our advice is to buy one if you can afford it as it'll make it much easier to communicate with your fellow online gamers.

All this comes to over £100 by the time you're up and running, which is a lot of money for a game, but bear in mind that if Phantasy Star Online is your kind of game you could quite easily be playing it in six months time.

a 56k or broadband modem for your GameCube if you want to play online. And on that note we're assured by Sega that there is no difference in performance between the two types of modem - for this game at least. Getting online is surprisingly straightforward and there's much help and advice available if you do run into trouble.

There's also the ability to play the game offline on your own and then there's the option for you and three mates to play a four-player, split-screen game, again offline. What we will say is that the offline gaming isn't half as much fun as the online experience, and we recommend you think long and hard if you're thinking of buying this title as a purely offline adventure.

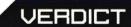
If you do decide that you can afford the modem, then you're in for one hell of a ride. with enough game here to keep the most fervent gamer happy and content for many a month. As well as the very chunky challenges of the two adventures there's also the option to download all kinds of new quests and challenges, many of which will

be linked to what time of year they're posted on Sega's Phantasy Star website.

Our experience of the game points to a dangerously addictive experience, where building alliances and chatting to fellow Phantasy Star gamers becomes almost compulsive. It's a credit to the developers that you really do feel as if you're living in an alternate universe completely removed from your usual life.

There's so much stuff in the game that we just don't have space to go into it here, suffice to say that if you're an RPG fan who likes the idea of working alongside fellow gamers, rather than trying to beat them, then this is manna from heaven.

Building a perfect four-person squad with people from all over the world is extremely rewarding, especially if you also invest in the GameCube keyboard. This odd-looking gizmo allows you to communicate at speed with people, but even if you can't or won't get one, Sega has worked hard to give gamers with just a standard GameCube controller a fair degree of interactivity with fellow players. 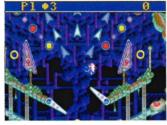

irst released on the PC back in 2001 and with its then-impressive graphics and awesome online compatibility allowing for massive skirmishes over the Net, Ghost Recon was a big hit. Now it's finally found its way to GameCube, but sadly doesn't deliver quite the same impact.

As we detailed in our Preplay last month, Ghost Recon's gameplay emphasises stealth and strategy. You command two squads of elite Special Forces soldiers (typically named the Alpha and Bravo squads). You can either place your orders on a terrain map for the A.I.-controlled

soldiers to follow, or you can control them yourself, getting them into position in first-person style. However, although this may sound amazing, the system is let down by the horrendous A.I., with soldiers standing around like scarecrows in a field rather than stealthily engaging enemy soldiers. And the enemies are the same too, as they duck in response to your attack and then stand up again, leaving you clear for a head-shot. All wrong!

The quality of the graphics in Ghost Recon leaves a lot to be desired. These may have been topnotch visuals two years ago, but now it's quite frankly well below the standards of more recent games. The soldier animations are particularly poor, shaking and jerking every few seconds. The landscapes are huge and look decent over a distance, but go up close to the trees and bushes, and you'll see that they feature very little detail. And the water in rivers looks more like blue cardboard.

Ghost Recon is a good game, but now a little dated and seems to have been ported shoddily. Stealth freaks may enjoy this if they can see past its faults, but it'll surely disappoint everyone else. Mike J

t first, Super Bubble Pop may seem like a 3D variation of the awesome puzzle game, Bust-A-Move. Well, appearances can be deceptive because this fails to reach the superior standards of design and fun of the classic series.

Choose to play as one of five groovy characters, select a difficulty and the game begins. There are no cool options or game modes, so don't bother looking for them.

Your character stands at the bottom of a grid shooting coloured orbs up the table. Similar to Bust-A-Move, you must clear all the orbs before the grid fills and your game ends. Line up three orbs of the same colour to make them disappear. Seems reasonable, but it has a few flaws.

Your character doesn't move left and right fast enough, delaying your ability to shoot orbs quickly, and his slow response will occasionally cause you to shoot down the wrong row. The game is also let down by poor presentation, and apart from a psychedelic-style title screen, the grids are all the same and the 3D character models are N64 quality. Puzzle fans should look to Eggo Mania for a puzzling fix. Mike J

t may be over ten years old, but when thoughts turn to A Link To The Past the list of fond memories is just too much to take. With its gold box, tiny Top Secrets booklet (sealed until the end of course!), fake Master Swords in The Lost Woods and the loner in the desert, the legendary 16-bit RPG can still hold its head up high. Thank God Nintendo has decided to release this, and with the short-but-sweet Four Swords thrown in for good measure, it makes a very inviting package for retro fans and newcomers alike.

Link may have turned 3D since A Link To The Past but his 16-bit quest is a classic and it still retains all its charm on the GBA. From Death Mountain in the north to Lake Hylia in the south, every pixel looks exactly as

it did on the bulky Super NES.

In the sound department though there have been some tiny tweaks. Link will now shout and yelp with every slash of his sword, just as he did in Ocarina of Time and should he fall through any holes or come to a sticky end you'll hear a satisfying scream. All these effects go some way to giving the remake a new lease of life, but ultimately it's still the same game and if you've finished it before you may not want to try again.

Thankfully, however, this is just part of the GBA Zelda deal, because there's the multiplayer Four Swords as well. For the first time in a Zelda game Nintendo has thrown a fast and furious four-player link-up mode into the fray. This new concept could rightly be regarded as a Gauntlet

▶ clone, but with multicoloured Links starring in the game it's far from a cheap rip-off.

In Four Swords, your mission is to rescue Zelda from the sinister clutches of the wind sorcerer, Vaati, who has a penchant for the young ladies of Hyrule. Teaming up is essential for success in order to move boulders and pull apart Hyrulian creatures, but at certain moments you'll be saying to hell with friendship as you charge around grabbing scattered Rupees before your mates have enough time to react.

With Four Swords added to the mix, this turns into a must-have package. And with one of the greatest RPGs ever made headlining the show, the GBA has got another classic to add to its collection. But dear Nintendo, can we have a brand-new Link game? Please? Tim Street

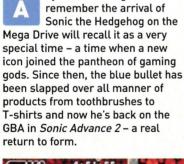

This is because not only can she hover for a short time in midair like Tails, she can also use her pet Chao to attack bad guys by pressing B. Naturally, you can also play as Tails and Knuckles, and there's also a mystery fifth character to unlock.

The visuals and sound are a real treat for Sonic fans, with pin-sharp graphics, stunningly atmospheric backgrounds and nostalgia-inducing sound effects. And the level design is great too, including the fabulous new Music Plant Zone, where you'll have to traverse xylophones and guitar strings that react with musical notes when you hit them. Class.

Boss-wise, Eggman has a tasty new trick up his enormous sleeve, which basically involves scarpering as soon as he catches sight of you, meaning you'll have to hit him on the run this time. It takes a bit of getting used to, but then Sonic boss battles never were the easiest.

Make no mistake, this is top-draw Sonic action from start to finish, but while it's undisputedly polished, it doesn't really do anything new. Kingsley Singleton

# MADNESS TO SQUASH THE GAMECUBE VERSION, OR WILL IT BE A REAL CHIMP OFF THE OLD BLOCK? IS IT MONKEY MONKEY BALL.

he smash-hit Super Monkey Ball has got to be one of the most ingenious concepts in the history of video games. And now it's made the transition to the GBA and it's almost as good as the GameCube version. How could that be possible, you ask? Here's how...

Super Monkey Ball Jr. contains 60 floors based on the GameCube originals in simplifiedbut-smooth 3D graphics. The same concept remains intact - roll the ball round the course and through the Goal before the time runs out.

Our main concern was how well the D-Pad would work for a game like SMB that relies on pinpoint accuracy, but SMB Jr. has it sorted.

Holding the (A) or (B) buttons will vary the tilt gradient when you hit a direction on the D-Pad. It's obviously not as precise as the 3D Stick on GameCube, but handles surprisingly well under the circumstances - once you've managed to tame it. Some of the mini-games have

also made it to the GBA. including Monkey Fight – an arena battle game - Monkey Bowling and Monkey Golf, and all play almost as well as on GameCube. And with four-player options and a Duel

mode to boot, this small cartridge is crammed with fun features.

To sum it all up, SMB Jr. is awesome fun, and once you've mastered the D-Pad controls, you won't put this down. Mike Jackson

game, destroying the various bosses as you go, your character will be upgraded, eventually packing more powerful guns and brand-new abilities.

The bosses come in many weird and wonderful forms, from a fat green slime ball with a sweat spot in the centre, to a lethal gun-packing robot with the agility of a monkey that's high on Red Bull. Defeating them is tough, but you'll need to waste every one before you can get to the final showdown.
