"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

One of the points being raised at this time by many coinmen, since introduction of the survey to arrive at a standard for recognition of jobbers and distributors, is about the present operating-jobbing combinations. This combination has become extremely popular during this war period. It is sure to continue after the war. The average coinman believes that, especially in view of the fact that a 25% increase in the price of machines can be expected, the most logical method for post-war operation would be the op-jobber combination. (This 25% price increase is

based on the reports of the automobile manufacturers just made public who stated that they would present the last known 1942 models when once again allowed to manufacture and that these would cost at least 25% more than they did in '42 due to the increases in labor and materials costs.)

This operating-jobbing comination was proven profitable even before this present war period. Many leading jobbers of used equipment were known to be large operators. Many of the largest operators in the nation were also leading jobbers. This combination was able to overcome the higher prices charged to the operators directly, as operators. They purchased at jobbers' prices. They were able to amortize the cost of the machines they purchased by operating them. And sold these, after this amortization period, at practically what they had paid for them, as jobbers. This selling price was, in some cases, their profit on the machine. Likewise, in many cases, they had already enjoyed a profit on the operation of the equipment and the selling price was therefore additional profit. In this fashion they were able to do a large business, gain the good will of the men whom they sold for they were able to juggle prices, as well as win the commendation of the factories and distributors they represented because of the large quanties of equipment they purchased.

Many leaders are therefore of the belief that this combination will leave its mark after this war and will prove the most profitable post-war combination. Operating is believed to be by the vast majority of coinmen at this time, the most profitable. They feel that a great many men, such as certain jobbers and the majority of the distributors, who never operated prior to the war, are now agreed that operating is the most profitable division of this industry.

These men do not take into consideration the keen competition that is certain to arise after the war with the creation of much new blood. They also fail to take into consideration the constant changes of models of all types of machines when normality returns. They also fail to consider the fact that amortization of equipment under such conditions isn't as rapid nor as easy as it is at this time. With competition expected to be keener than ever before in the history of this industry, this operating-jobbing combination may run up against a great many problems. At least, this is the other side of the picture.

It is a well known fact thruout the trade that specializing in operating, as most of the men are doing during this war period, made possible many large gains in location revenue, along with the fact that the public could afford to spend more for relaxing entertainment of every sort. Specializing in jobbing has also proved profitable in a great many cases. The combining of both these division is not as easy as it seems, unless the combiner seeks to work harder than he ever before has in his life.

As one leader explains, "Sure it sounds good to combine jobbing with operating and sell off equipment after it has shown a quick profit and buy cheaper than the average operator can buy. But this means that the operator-jobber must constantly switch his equipment. He must be in a position to take whatever new models the distributor will shoot at him, and take his full quota each time or lose his jobber status. He must therefore not figure on being able to completely amortize all the equipment he purchases by operating. He should also figure on losses. He may also strike some of his locations with machines which prove perfect for these spots, and the location owner won't want them removed at any cost for new machines. In such cases he finds himself handicapped as to meeting his quota and must then get the smaller operators in his territory to buy more. At the same time, in most sales to these smaller ops, he must arrange to give credit. It's a very tough problem and one on which the average man cannot give an instant or definite answer."

Yet, the majority feel that the operator-jobber commination will prove the best for after the war. This will be one mark which this war era will have left on the post-war world. To classify such firms under a recognition standard their operating businesses must be brought into the open. As one of these men also stated, "I'm sure that the average manufacturer or distributor would rather have a jobber who is already in control of a certain number of locations in his territory. At least he then has a fore-knowledge of how many machines he can sell this jobber. Where the firms are strictly jobbers and do not operate at all, they are absolutely dependent on what the operators will order. They simply cannot state in advance just how many machines they will use. The firm that knows just what its locations want and how many locations it has can tell just about how many of any number of machines it will require."

Some are of the belief that such firms should be classified as operators. Yet this would be unfair as far as the jobbing business of the firm is concerned. The firm might prove to be among the best jobbers in the country, possibly because of the large number of locations it controls. In any recognition standard it seems that such a firm should receive classification as an operator-jobber, but that the trade should know this fact. Just the same as any distributor who operates, should also allow this fact to become known. (The belief is that distributors should not operate. The fact that jobbers do operate is more or less accepted.)

It is up to the trade itself, in its answers and in its additional remarks to the survey now being conducted by The Cash Box to decide on the jobber-operator and the distributor-operator combinations status.

WHAT ABOUT THE MANUFACTURERS?


From everywhere in the country, at regular intervals, letters are received asking whether the manufacturers have as yet announced or prepared plans for the postwar era. Such plans are of extreme interest to the trade. It is well to realize that the average manufacturer, being now engaged in war work, doesn't have much time to concern himself with any now or startlingly different plans for the future. There is no doubt, tho, that the average manufacturer has many ideas placed away for the time when he will again be able to enter into the production of coin machines. Whether he has any tentative or definite plans as to distribution and general merchandising have not as yet been made known, and the trade continues to remain in the dark concerning future action, if any.

There have been a great many rumors and much guessing on the part of many now engaged in this industry regarding the manufacturers' plans for tomorrow. Some believe that certain manufacturers will eliminate distributors and jobbers and will instead establish factory selling agencies at strategic centers thruout the country. These men point to the success enjoyed by these "factory agencies" just prior to the war. They claim that the manufacturers would then enjoy a double profit. Their manufacturing as well as the merchandising profit.

But most of all, they claim, the manufacturer would be in much better control of the sale of his machines. He would be sure that his factory branch would not be handling any other merchandise but his own, therefore giving complete attention to his merchandise only. At the same time the manufacturer, being in a better financial position than the average jobber or distributor, these men explain, would also be better able to more carefully and completely follow thru on the merchandising of his products thruout each territory. He would also be able to control sales. This control of sales, they claim, would certainly meet with the operators' approval for the manufacturer, by being in complete control of all sales, would not allow his products to be sold direct to location owners nor to outsiders who might hurt the bonafide operator.

Others believe that the manufacturers intend to create entirely new distributing and jobbing outlets. They state that some manufacturers have already been questioning and surveying the trade and believe therefore that they seek to use many of the new firms that have developed during this war period. One reason they advance for this is that the average better known distributing and jobbing firm of the pre-war era have turned to operating during this war period. Another reason for this, that these men advance, is that the manufacturers believe that this post-war era will be an entirely different type of business world and therefore seek the younger, newer men who will come in with radically different sales plans and ideas to merchandise their products.

In general, these letters which The Cash Box has been receiving over a long period of time, give one reason or another why these men are of the belief that this forthcoming post-war era will note many changes in the coin machines merchandising picture. The Cash Box itself is of the belief that there will have to be, of necessity, a great many changes in merchandising theory and plans as well as in practise after the war. But this is only the natural development that arrives with each new era.

The Cash Box is also of the belief that the manufacturers will return, whether because of force of habit, or loyalty, or generally good merchandising theory, to their former distribution outlets, and for sometime after the war will continue with these outlets. Unless, of course, these outlets should fall by the wayside or prove themselves incapable of continuing to correctly merchandise quantity in the post-war era. There is no reason for any immediate change of distributor or jobber outlets at this time. The Cash Box does most sincerely hope that the manufacturers will give complete consideration to those firms that continued on so gallantly during this war period.

THE MUSIC BUSINESS

With the music machines division of this industry so definitely established as leading field of this coin operated machines business, much discussion arises when music leaders come together. Most of this is naturally devoted to what the future holds in store for this leading division.

All are agreed that immediately after the war is over the same machines last manufactured will probably be placed back into production. The demand will be so great for new machines that the manufacturers will not need to, nor will they have time to, create any new and surprisingly revolutionary innovations. All are agreed that the futuristic, "dream" machines, will not be seen for some years after the war. The majority are not only agreed but are completely satisfied to abide by this fact and are anxious instead to get into sales action with new equipment.

Intermixed in such conversations are always the following problems. What will happen as far as the record manufacturers are concerned? Will Petrillo demand part of the coin operated music revenue? Will Ascap start more legal suits when the war is over? These, and many other anxious queries, always come into such discussions to cast a shadow over the rosy picture of the music machine's future possibilities.

Music machines leaders believe that a great many problems should be solved in advance of the post-war era so that this division of the industry can roll smoothly ahead. They are all of the belief, that as reported in The Cash Box sometime ago, they have the possibility of becoming one of the most outstanding industries in the nation. But, they claim, if they are to be pestered at each new move by one or another outside agency wanting to cut into their revenue, they will simply find the road too rocky and too difficult, and the future of the business itself endangered. Naturally, they explain, new blood will not want to enter into a business where legal suits constantly continue to pop up.

The majority seem to be satisfied that the record manufacturers will come thru with flying colors when the war is over and that they will once again be supplied with as many records as they will need. They do not expect former, pre-war prices. They realize that labor and material costs have risen so steeply that prices of records will because of this be much higher. They are also of the belief that many new record manufacturers will enter into the picture. They claim that new bands, new vocalists and instrumentalists will develop into stardom after the war so that these new firms will also be able to produce records that will be in big demand. They believe that new amplification systems, lighter weight tone arms, as well as many electronic improvisations, which have been discovered during this war materials production era, will come along to cause phonographs to sound and play better and also last longer. All these factors, they claim, will work in to help them with suppliers of tubes, needles, etc. They are also of the belief that better remote systems will be presented so that much wiring work will be eliminated. And a great many other mechanical improvements will be featured, they believe, which will, as far as the phonos themselves are concerned, make operating a lot easier than ever before.

But what troubles them most, is the possibility of legal suits here and there thruout the nation. Including possible heavy taxation, both local and Federal, as greater expansion is noted. This, they claim, will hamper all rosy development of their field. They point to the fact that Petrillo is not at all finished with the coin operated music machines picture. Rather that he has declared a truce for the duration, and is just awaiting the post-war production era. They also state that Ascap is persistent in getting some part of the revenue from phonos. They also feel that many other such problems will arise. All these, they claim, should be settled now, for they feel that their division of this business has a long and grand future ahead of it and that these problems may definitely endanger that future.

The town of Newark, N. J., was closed down to pin games and much other machines many months ago by Public Safety Director Keenan of that city. This past week Mr. Keenan, the same person who so ferociously frowns down upon coin operated devices, went before this city's commissioners and requested an additional \$40,000.00 for coin operated parking meters. (Sometime ago The Cash Box reported the huge profits which this city had enjoyed from its parking meters.)

According to the Newark Evening News of March 8th: "Public Safety Director Keenan today said about \$40,000 of the \$48,500 parking meter appropriation in his 1944 budget will be spent for purchase of new parking meters under present plans. The rest of the appropriation will be for salaries and repairs.

"Keenan said there is a demand for parking meters by property owners in Springfield avenue and Ferry street, but he doubts the meters can be bought until after the war.

"The meters now in use are paid for, Keenan said. He believes meters can be bought for little more than \$50 apiece after the war. This would mean the city would get nearly 800 for \$40,000." Commendation

We received copies of two letters sent to "Curley" Robinson of A.O.L.A.C., Los Angeles, Calif. One came from the Headquarters of the Army Air Forces Pilot School at Minter Field, Bakersfield, Calif., and the other from Jack G. Gotch, publisher of the Hollywood Clipper and other papers in Hollywood, Calif.

The letter from Major Frankovich of the Army Air Forces Pilot School reads: "Pleace accept the thanks of the men of Minter Field to you and the members of your association for the contribution of six marble games for our use.

"Also for your help in aiding us to obtain some slot machines. Your desire to be of service to the men in uniform is outstanding and I know your organization has contributed much to the various camps in Southern California."

The letter from Jack Gotch reads: "Last year members of your organization responded to the appeal of the Y.M.C.A. in contributing, thru the medium of subscribing for community memberships, in order that paid leadership might be secured for the boys of West Hollywood.

"Because of this campaign, to which you contributed approximately \$300 it may please you to learn that juvenile delinquency is practically nonexistent in this district, according to the Sheriff's department and local juvenile authorities.

"This is a grand piece of constructive work and your contribution helped make it possible of achievement."

Hershfield

One of our readers, who forgot to mention his name, sends us a clipping of Harry Hershfield, the noted cartoonist and humorist's column, "My Week," wherein appears the "Week's Best Gag" as follows: "Moron in Automat for first time. Petrillo

In fact, he stated that if he would have had any idea of this rebuff he would never have put the case before WLB hut would have waited intil the war was over when WLB would have been non-existent.

part III, reads: "During the period of the growth of mechanized music, the number of bands and symphony orchestras has increased, but the opportunity for small job musical employment has probably diminished.

"Though juke boxes, playing phonograph records, have displaced live musicians, the overall use of phonograph records has probably not, on balance, decreased the employment of musicians."

Part V of the text reads: "Recordings played in juke boxes and over wires have displaced live musicians to an unknown extent. The fact that the displaced musician and the musicians employed in making the displacing recordings are members of the same union practically distinguishes such displacements from the usual type of technological unemployment. The grievance is more poignant and the remedy more ready.

"Approximately 20 percent of all phonograph records are used for unintended commercial purposes, mainly in juke boxes." Plan

The Cash Box and I am sure each subscriber feels as I do—The old saying, you only get what you pay for and The Cash Box is one of those articles.

"I think your articles in The Cash Box and the Second Wartime Conference we had and the Third Wartime Conference coming up, as you have outlined in this issue, is welding together the men in the coin machine fields of the United States in a way that will give the selected ones of the Third Wartime Conference the support and financial backing to set up the national association that every other industry of our size or less already has.

"I have the following plan I believe would get the members and get their membership dues paid on time which the association will have to have to be a success:

"First, he or she will have to be a member of his state or district coin machine association before they are eligible to be a member.

"Second, national membership dues will be \$100.00 per year. If paid quarterly will be \$27.50 and if paid monthly will be \$10.00.


"Third, each member is to be kept posted on all national matters of importance to the industry and also be mailed a financial statement of the industry quarterly.

"Fourth, the goal of the National Association to be twenty-five hundred members or a gross collection of one-quarter million dollars a year. Sixty per cent of this to be kept by the association and forty per cent goes back to the members in War Bonds. Work this into four quarterly drawings and have twenty-five winners each quarter. No member will be eligible to the drawing unless his dues are paid up. On twenty-five hundred members the 40% back to them would equal \$100,000.00 in bonds and this would give a lot of good will to the industry.

"Fifth, and last, the National Association is going to save the operator several times his dues in taxes. This saving will be divided between the operator, jobber, the distributor and last the manufacturer. So each individual of this industry ask yourself this question, are you doing your part or are you leaving it up to the other fellow? Let's all pull together and write Bill Gersh that he can count on you 100% in this third war conference!
