"The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

FEAR OF FEAR

By Bill Gersh

Possibly the most trite, illogical and pessimistic remark heard these days is fear for the future welfare of those engaged in the juke box industry.

There are those in this field who have stated that they can see very little future progress for this most outstanding division of the industry in view of the great and overwhelming competition which, they believe, is bound to come this year.

These men feel that because there may be ten or more manufacturers of coin operated phonographs, competition will become so keen to hold and maintain their locations that earning power will diminish to a point where operating juke boxes will become unprofitable.

All this points to "the fear of fear" that seems to be creeping over a certain portion of this trade as '46 gets under way.

There is no logical reason for such fear. The backlog of orders for new equipment is so great that whatever the phono manufacturers will produce in the next two years is bound to be gobbled up if just for necessary replacement purposes alone.

Many new types of locations have opened and will continue to open as venture capital again goes into action. These locations have been created by the war. And to cover these alone will require a tremendous number of juke boxes.

This isn't all. Large numbers of machines and mechanisms were consumed during the war by the armed services. These were purchased from the trade and shipped to outposts all over the world. This has left many locations without any equipment.

The Cash Box suggestion (originally presented to the trade over three years ago) that the present commission basis of 50%-50% be changed to 70%-30% is most logical. It is certain to end the fear that juke box operating, because so many new phonos will be presented during 1946, may prove unprofitable.

In addition to the suggestion that a 70%-30% commission basis immediately be placed into effect, especially with average locations, *The Cash Box* also urged operators to protect their location with location agreements, contracts, leases, or any other legal method which would best apply in their territories.

Many will recall the convention held at the Hotel Winton in Cleveland in 1929. Almost from the minute this convention opened it was called, "the scale convention". And that's just what it proved to be. There wasn't a single booth in the crowded hall that didn't feature one or more scales. Yet, the scale business has flourished.

In 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934 and for each year after that, conventions have been dominated by the pin games. Yet, these games are here to stay! The pinball trade is still a leader in this field. And the demand for new games is just as great as ever.

Beginning with 1935 and into '36, '37, '38 and for the years leading to the last meeting at the Sherman Hotel in Chicago, juke boxes have been extremely prominent. Regardless of all the types presented, this business has still remained in its infancy. This year of 1946 its leaders hope to bring it out of that stage and into a new and greater and better era.

This is a mighty field. It is only now beginning to find itself. It is only now beginning to realize its power and importance. This juke box industry has all the world before it. Its future is assured.

More important to it is the fact that it must clear all obstacles from its path to insure its rapid progress. It must, once and for all time, create a "National Tax Council" to help drive off the many revenue seeking wolves who will attack it, especially as it continues to grow more and more prominent.

It must help to create a "Public Relations Bureau" to help it to gain the good will of the public as it expands and grows greater.

It should also be first to arrange for the creation of a "National Credit Bureau". As time goes on it will need such an organization to assure each and everyone of its members completely accepted and fully recognized credit facilities.

It should also have a "School for Mechanics". It will most definitely require more and better trained mechanical minds to insure its going ahead as rapidly as possible. Uncle Sam would today cooperate in such a school as to assure returning G.I.'s better jobs.

It should come to some settlement with the leading record manufacturers so as to assure it more and better records and at wholesale prices. This is extremely important to its future welfare.

The juke box industry, in fact, should be most elated that so many new machines will be presented. It will now, for the first time since 1934, have a wide and varied choice.

The juke box industry has a few problems. But, they are not "the fear of fear". The greatest problem to the average juke box coinman is, instead, to get new equipment. And get this new equipment as quickly as he can so that he will be among the first to lead the way to the greatest era in coin operated music history.

MEASURED MUSIC HITS EAST

New York and New Jersey Music Ops Preparing to Launch Measured Music Installations. Predict Opening of Many Locations Not Featuring Coin Music at Present.

NEW YORK — Leading music machine ops thruout the New York and New Jersey areas seem to have been bitten by the "measured music" bug, which swept California sometime ago, and are now planning studios and installations of this system thruout this area.

According to one leading New Jersey music op who is already in the process of completing a studio to serve measured music in his territory, "There is no doubt, after seeing how this system works in California, that it will take on thruout the east. I also believe that this is going to open a great many locations that do not have any type of coin operated music at this time.

"For example, in my territory there are lunchrooms and also some very good restaurants, drug stores and other places where we can install measured music boxes. At the same time we intend to work out a system whereby we can equal the Muzak type of music service since we will be offering continuous music over a single channel wire anyway.

"The fact remains that measured music is extremely successful on the West Coast and there is no reason in my mind why it can't be just as successful here. I have already contacted locations and find that they are very much interested in this music system. Formerly, these locations had no juke boxes. This makes measured music even more interesting to my firm."

The same is taking place in New York City where some noted ops are already arranging to broadcast measured music over a single channel studio wire and serve as many locations as possible.

One op has already arranged for some of the smaller lunchrooms along Broadway in the Times Square area where there are no juke boxes due to the fact that these places are too small to accommodate a juke box.

Other ops here are contacting chain drug stores and some of these men are also hoping to have arrangements with leading chain restaurants.

One op has stated that he, too, along with the plans of some Jersey music ops will service beauty shops, doctors offices, dentists, and various other commercial enterprises over this single channel wire system.

GETS DEPOSIT CHECKS FROM COINMEN WHILE IN JAIL

CHICAGO — One noted distrib here received an answer to one of his "wanted-to-buy" advertisements appearing in a newsstand publication from a Gordon Scheurers, 1003 Zeisler St., La Crosse, Wis., offering him the equipment he wanted to buy and advising him that a deposit would be necessary.

Since the letter carried no heading whatsoever, this distrib phoned one of the La Crosse coinmen and learned that the 1003 Zeisler St. address was also the address of the County Jail.

Since then information has been forthcoming from La Crosse, Wis., that Gordon Scheurers was in jail for entering and breaking into a place of business. His trial will be held sometime in April. He is now under \$1,500 bond.

A New York distrib has also just advised receiving letter from La Crosse on equipment he wanted and the latter asked for "one-half certified deposit."

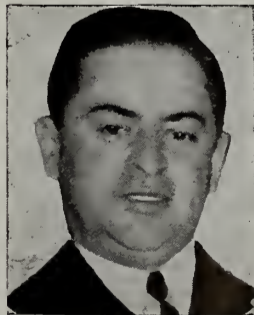
This is the union which is now working with the Phonograph Operators Association of New Jersey.

The purpose of the meeting, according to those who were present, was to bring forth the idea that in unity there would be a strong organization.

Sol Kesselman, attorney and manager of the association, is reported to have made a very stirring speech to the gathering.

Others, among the more than 28 operators from as far away as Asbury Park, also spoke and gave their viewpoints on how the organization could be strengthened.

It is also reported that "Shugy" Sugerman gave a very good talk regarding the fact that, "the operators must stick together to assure themselves a better future in this business."

CAL. UPS PINBALL LICENSE FEE

LOS ANGELES, CAL. — The annual pin game license fees on the 1800 machines in operation in unincorporated county territory have been increased by the Board of Supervisors from \$12 to \$36.

The supervisors also ordered other ordinances to increase the license fees for second hand dealers, junk yards and auto wrecking firms to \$100 per year.

It is reported here that this increase has been expected for sometime and that it was one of those revenue seeking measures which is proving more and more necessary as communities get into stride.

Other territory thruout the state is wondering whether this increase in license fees will also affect them. Many coinmen are planning to keep careful watch over the licensing authorities so as to have plenty of advance notice if any increases are contemplated.

BROADWAY ARCADES BUST ALL RECORDS

NEW YORK — Times Square arcade owners wound up 1945 in a blaze of business which broke all time collection records.

"Never before, in the history of Broadway's arcades," these men report, "has there been such a hectic and busy holiday week."

One arcade owner stated, "The kids hundreds of soldiers and sailors on their way back home. The crowds were tre-were home from school. There were mendous every day. There were thousands of people from out of town wandering up and down Broadway for the holiday season. Collections of every arcade owner in the Times Square area exceeded anything ever before enjoyed in the many, many years arcades have been prominent along Broadway."

There are at present reported to be about a dozen arcades in the Times Square area, ranging from 42nd Street to 52nd Street, including the Sixth Avenue and Seventh Avenue spots.

In addition there are about a dozen or so photo shops, some of which also feature guns and other equipment.

Since right before Christmas the arcades became jammed and remained that way until New Year's eve when the crowds were so great that the police department stopped all traffic.

Machines of every kind, and especially the photo studios, were given a tremendous workout.

Arcade owners report, "This past holiday week gave us the grandest "send-off into the New Year. And 1946 also looks," they state, "like one of the best years the arcades will ever have."

CONSOLIDATED IS DISTRIB FOR ROCKOLA AND WILLIAMS

KANSAS CITY, MO. — Irvin W. Weiler of Consolidated Distributing Co., this city, reports that his firm have been appointed as distributors for Rock-Ola Manufacturing Corp. of Chicago for Western Missouri and the state of Kansas.

The firm are also distributors for Williams Manufacturing Co. of Chicago for the states of Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska.

Weiler reports that the firm have moved their offices to 1910 Grand Street, this city, from their former location in the Walheim Building.

He also states that Consolidated will now completely concentrate on distributing the products of these firms and that they intend to have a large sales organization in the field to cover the entire territory.

"We believe", Weiler reports, "that all the operators in our territory will agree that in Rock-Ola and Williams we have two lines which will prove real money-makers for them. We are now preparing to make complete showings of the new machines of these firms the moment they arrive."

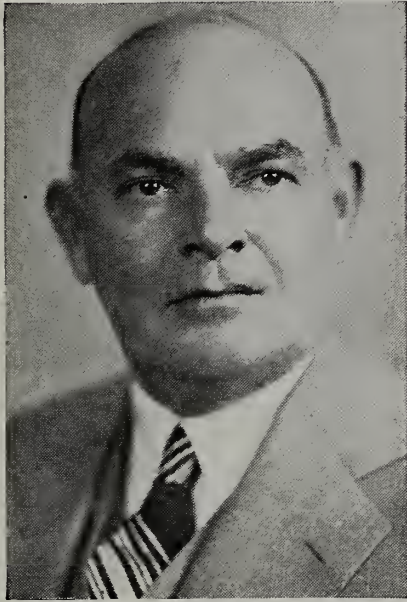

SENATE AGAIN ALLOWS NICKEL IN 5c COINS

WASHINGTON, D.C. — In making changes in several parts of the second war powers act, the Senate included a section directing the Treasury to resume use of nickel in making five cent pieces.

MORE SALTED PEANUTS

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Over 26,000,000 cans of salted peanuts, each weighing 8 ounces, have just been released to civilian trade channels by the Production and Marketing Administration of the Department of Agriculture.

These peanuts were originally intended for the military but they never did get over there. They are packed in hermetically sealed cans.

It is believed that they will help to relieve the shortage which exists at this time for salted peanuts on the home front.

The department points out that in spite of a large crop, peanuts of the size preferred for salting are scarce, as is the oil which is involved in the salting process.

It is also reported by the department that civilians will eat their way thru these 26,000,000 cans within six months.

SAILOR TO ENTER MUSIC BIZ WITH OWN WALL BOX

NEW YORK — As a result of reading Michael Gore's new book, "101 Ways To Be Your Own Boss" (which was reported in the Dec. 31, 1945 issue of *The Cash Box*) and which devotes an entire chapter to the coin machine industry as one of the businesses the author suggests prospective business-seekers to enter, Murray Malament, of 66 Avenue A, this city, Chief Petty Officer in the U. S. Maritime Service has decided that the coinbiz is for him.

Chief Malament developed a personal music, selective wall box before the war came along to stop him from further development and from obtaining materials with which to manufacture the boxes.

He reports that the box is approximately seven inches high by nine inches wide and about two and one-half inches deep. It features ten selections but, he claims, it can be made to feature twenty or twenty-four, or whatever number will be required. The box has a built-in speaker and the player hears the music personally right in his own booth.

He feels that this wall box, which is completely designed and of which wood models have already been made, is much better than measured music because it gives the patron the advantage of hearing other tunes, selected by other customers in the place, in addition to his own tune when it comes up.

Most interesting to the cointrade, of course, is the fact that not only this young sailor, but many others like him in the armed services, are anxious to get into the coin machine business and are planning ways and means to break into the field.

Malament is interested in having the wall box manufactured for him and wants to place these himself in this city. He will, he reports, sell whatever number after what he uses to other operators around the country.

SANDLER AND MATHENY ARE AIREON DISTRIBS

KANSAS CITY, MO. — Announcement was made recently here by R. R. Greenbaum, Vice-President of Aireon Mfg. Corp. that Irv Sandler of Des Moines and Harold Matheny of Wichita would be the exclusive Aireon distributors in their surrounding territories.

In making the announcement, Mr. Greenbaum said, "I'm more than pleased to see Irv and Harold climb aboard the Aireon bandwagon. They've both been good friends of mine for a long time and I couldn't ask for better representatives for our new automatic phonograph."

Present at the Radio and Phonograph Division offices with Sandler and Matheny were Ralph Rigdon, Regional Sales Manager for the Aireon organization and Myrl Park, District Sales Manager. The men all agreed that country-wide interest in Aireon's new electronic automatic phonograph is becoming greater every day and were greatly enthused by their trip through the company's factories and plants.

BYRAM REPORTS ON BUCKLEY BILL

WASHINGTON, D. C. — The following was just received from Major Ira T. Byram, Jr. of Silent Sales System, this city: "This is in regard to the Buckley Bill, HR-3190, which is now in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives here in Washington and about which those in our industry who are interested in music are rightfully disturbed.

"As you probably know, we here at Silent Sales are located in the heart of Washington, only a few blocks from the nation's Capitol itself, and although we have no vote here in Washington and therefore no Congressmen or Senators who are elected by us, we are pretty close to things and always try to help our many customers and friends throughout the industry in every way possible.

"With the thought of helping members of our industry familiarize themselves with the Buckley Bill in order that they may bring all the pressure possible upon their representatives in Congress, as has been proposed by your publication, we suggest that you publicize the following.

"Major 'Ira' T. Byram, who has just returned from overseas and again taken over active management of Silent Sales System, has advised that his firm will keep a supply of copies of Rep. Chas. A. Buckley's Bill (HR-3190) on hand to furnish to all members of the coin machine industry upon request. Just write Silent Sales System, 635 D Street, N.W., Washington 4, D. C. requesting a copy of the Bill and it will be forwarded via return mail without charge or obligation.

"As a matter of information, an executive of Silent Sales System contacted a very reliable source who is very close to the House Patents Committee in the Capitol on December 28, 1945 and was advised that the Bill in its present form (having been previously recalled and rewritten to exclude provisions relating to the motion picture industry) has received no action or reading as yet by the Patent Committee and that in view of other important legislation which is before the committee it is not believed that the Bill

will receive action until approximately thirty days after Congress reconvenes.

"As we see it, the Bill in its present form is now in the same position as the original Bill was when the motion picture lobby presumably brought the pressure which resulted in the Bill being recalled and rewritten to exclude the provisions which would have worked undue hardship upon the motion picture industry.

"That is, if the coin machine industry is going to do anything about this Bill they had better do it now while the Bill is subject to revision prior to action by the Committee, or it may be too late."

100,000 NEW SMALL BUSINESSES IN N. Y.

ALBANY, N. Y. — Governor Dewey's new program to cut income and business taxes in this state, it is believed, will greatly encourage the establishment of small business enterprises needed thruout the state.

It is estimated that the state now needs 100,000 new small businesses and the Governor's program is designed to stimulate their creation.

Coinmen have already made reference to this report in the jubilant belief that a great percentage of these new small businesses will mean more locations for coin machines of every type.

UNITED AIR CUTS FREIGHT RATES TO 20c TON-MILE

NEW YORK — United Air Lines announced this past week air freight rates for large shipments which figure less than 20 cents a ton mile on lots of more than 3,000 pounds between New York and the Pacific Coast.

While the extremely low rates are applicable to shipments of 3,000 pounds or more, reductions have also been put into effect for shipments of 100 pounds, which go to the coast for as little as 24c a ton-mile.

This brings the cointrade to the point, predicted sometime ago, where shipments of samples by manufacturers can go air cargo and be in the hands of distributors on the West Coast just as fast as they will reach New York and other East Coast cities.

HOBOKEN, N. J. — The Symphonola Music Co. this city, operators of wired music as well as juke boxes, are probably opening a new path to the music machine men with the fact that they are now charging 10c for every wired music tune and three tunes for 25c.

It is reported that the owners of this firm decided that they had best increase their charge to overcome the present double channel charges as well as increased overhead costs. They feel that they can only operate wired music profitably on a 10c per song basis.

As soon as the new juke boxes are presented here this firm, it is reported, will go into a 70%-30% working agreement with its locations. They feel that even this is very low today to help overcome the tremendously increased overhead expense with which they are confronted.

They may, they claim, instead of giving 30% commission continue their charge of 10c per record even on the juke boxes. They feel that in this fashion they will be better able to amortize the new equipment more rapidly and thereby overcome any possible loss in depreciation of equipment.

The idea of 10c per record and three records played for 25c is reported to be spreading thruout the New Jersey area and, it is believed, may become common practise.

Tho the 10c per record charge is common in California for wired music this is the first time that it has been charged in the eastern area.

PHONO OPS ASSN. OF N. J. FIGHTS BUCKLEY BILL

Asks Other Assns. to Join in United Effort to Help Shelve Bill in Present Committee

NEW YORK — The following letter was received by The Cash Box just as it was going to press this past week from Bernie Goodman, president of the Phonograph Operators Association of New Jersey:

"At a meeting of the Phonograph Operators Association of New Jersey held this past week at the Essex House, Newark, New Jersey, we took up a discussion of the Buckley Bill.

"Thanks to the enlightenment given by your article in 'The Cash Box', it didn't take very much talking on anyone's part to open the eyes of every member present.

"I am happy to say that we agreed unanimously to write at once, each member under separate cover, to our Congressmen who are members of the House of Representatives' Patents Committee in protest to the passage or even another reading of this terrible Buckley Bill.

"Our association hopes and prays that every other organization will follow suit and do likewise in preventing this devastating bill from becoming law.

"Facts and figures do not lie. On the basis of a \$100 assessment per machine ASCAP or BMI or for that matter, any licensing agency will be able to bleed

our industry to the tune of at least \$40,000,000.00 per year.

"Why we are asleep at a time like this, when we know our industry cannot tolerate such a burden, is beyond me. The old adage, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure," should certainly apply here of all places.

"We ask you this time for our sake and for the preservation of the entire music machine industry to please continue your wonderful work in publishing your articles in 'The Cash Box,' bringing to the front this horrible and visible picture that was so well covered as to escape the eyes and even the thoughts of the majority of the members of the other associations and independent operators.

"Servicemen and collectors do not realize that they, too, would be affected, else you could bet your last dollar that they too would enter a protest.

"Again, please continue your good work, for it seems that 'The Cash Box' is our only chance. It is the only publication that has the guts to bring a matter of such grave importance into the open. Certainly the other publications are asleep or cowed by the fear that they may lose advertising business from other sources."

CANADA TO COOPERATE WITH ITS INDUSTRIES TO LOWER TARIFFS

OTTAWA, CANADA — Close cooperation between business and industry and the Government departments that will handle future trade and trade-barrier negotiations for Canada has been assured by the coalition of department officials to which business men and industrialists are invited to submit their views and desires.

The committee is, in fact, an extension of the existing tariff board and will be headed by Hector McKinnon, head of the Commodity Prices Stabilization Corp.

Discussions with Britain and the United States will begin late this month or in February and in this connection it is notable that increased attention is being given to the proper regulations of Canadian imports.

An import board has been set up by the Trade and Commerce Department to promote thru the country's trade commissions the purchase of commodities from other countries as well as sales to them.

It is generally hoped thruout the coin machine industry that this new trade move on the part of the Canadian government will allow for all types of coin

MINNEAPOLIS

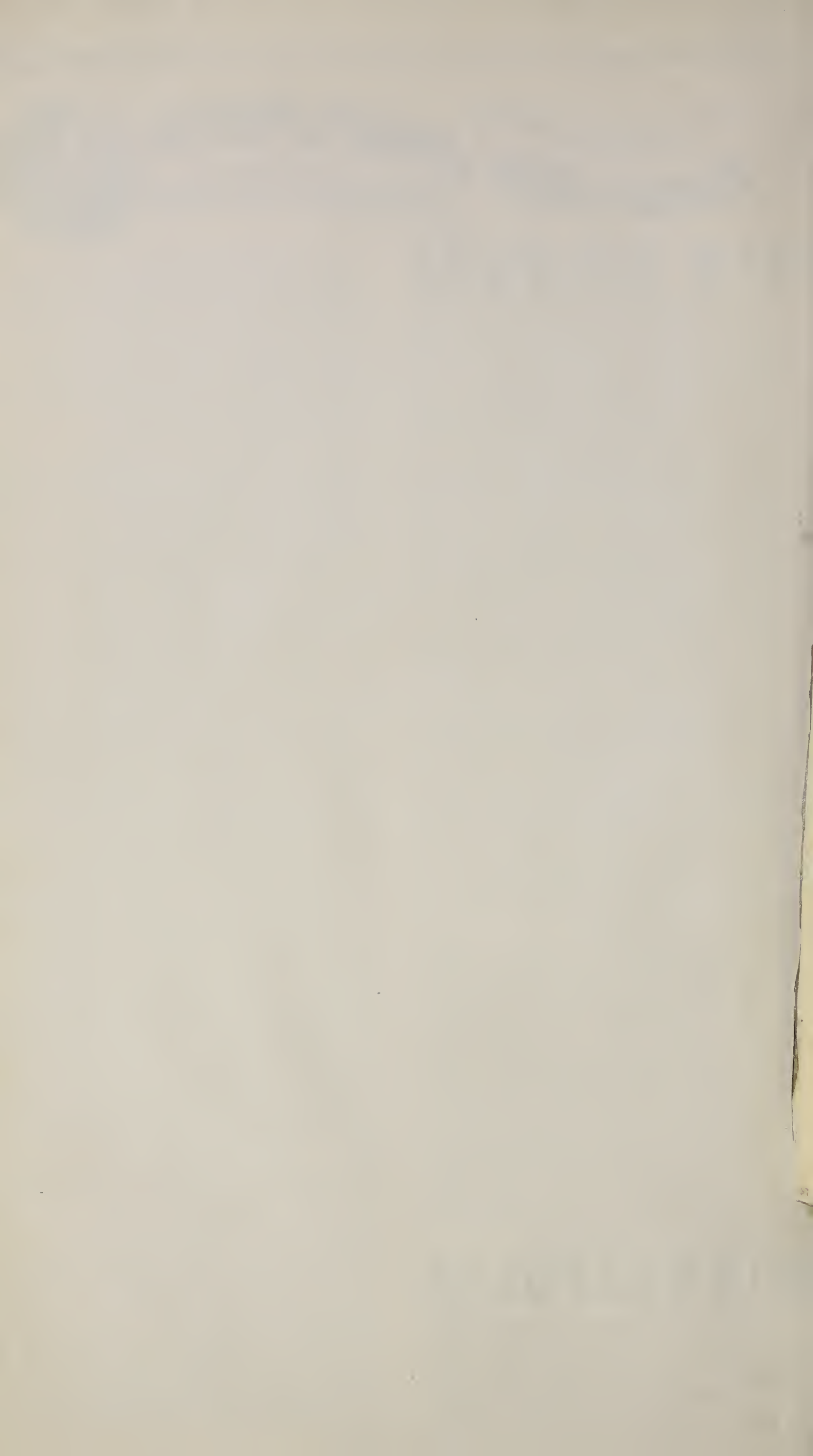
