ATARI ANGER AS STE CRITICISMS MOUNT

"We're furious, and you can print that" - Atari

Top ST software developers have prompted the wrath of Atari by criticising the new STE as 'too little, too late'.

They say the company has failed to come up with a computer which can challenge the Amiga.

Atari is furious at the criticisms being levelled at its new upgrade. A handful of programmers received a machine and were obliged to sign a non-disclosure agreement prohibiting them talking to the press - Atari says it will be taking machines from those who have broken that agreement. "They can have opinions but they should keep them to themselves," offered a furious spokesman.

Express asked 10 leading software developers for their opinions on the improvements to the long awaited machine, specifically the much awaited blitter, stereo sound and the hardware scrolling.

Details of the machine were first outlined in Express (issue 33) last June and

it was first shown in Dusseldorf at the end of August. The machine was, however, absent from the PC Show in October. The firm says it will be available in this country around Christmas time.

The STE is a direct upgrade to the 1040 and will be sold for the same price (£499). It is thought that, in time, it will replace the £399 520ST.■

Why Atari is furious

It is standard practice for companies to insist that other parties involved in projects sign non-disclosure agreements. This is supposed to prohibit them talking to competitors (or to the press) about new products.

Atari clearly feels cheated that some of its close allies in the software world have no qualms about making their opinions on the STE known.

The firm is taking an unprecedented hard line and recalling machines from programmers who have talked to the press.

Such is the level of secrecy within Atari that those programmers deemed to be favourable toward bitter rival Commodore were not given machines in the first place.■

The programmers' verdict

WAYNE SMITHSON (*Blood Money*):

"Atari have done too little too late. Having extra colours is a waste of time since you can still only get 16 on screen at once. No-one will notice. Having even 32 colours would have been nice.

"The blitter is pretty useless as well because there's no barrel shift of any kind. You still have to shift the graphics. And apart from the odd shoot-'em-up the hardware scrolling will hardly be used. As for the stereo sound, that's an absolute nonsense. I think most users will be pretty disappointed."

JEFF LAWSON (*Flair Paint*):

"It's a missed opportunity. I can see people using the extra colours just because they're there, but I can't see them bothering with the dedicated hardware such as the blitter and hardware scrolling. If they'd used the 68030 chip it could have beaten the Amiga. It doesn't come close. I won't be doing anything for it."

GLEN CORPES (*Populous*):

"I'm still finding my way around the machine but it looks good for serious programmers. However,

as a new release it's not too exciting. Games will have better sound and the graphics will have more subtle shading. But 256 colours on screen would have been really nice. The blitter's not as good as it could be."

JEFF MINTER (*Trip-a-Tron*):

"A lot of people won't bother taking advantage of it which is a shame. But if I get one I'll try and get the best out of it. I wouldn't mind using the hardware scrolling just because it's there but that's not really commercially viable."

JEZ SAN (*Starglider*):

"The Amiga is still better than the ST but it's a step in the right direction. Still, at the same price as the 1040 you can't complain. The colour palette bits are in a strange order which makes it difficult to access different shades and, as I understand it, the blitter is virtually unusable. You can't use interrupts to create the illusion of extra colours on screen. Mind you, I am looking forward to the Atari TT."

LES PLAYER (Ex Atari now at GFA):

"Atari hyped it long before it arrived and that was always going to be a problem. Even

insiders at Atari weren't sure what the machine would be like and people started to read between the lines. As a software developer now I can see Atari having real problems getting people to write for it. But, to be fair, it's not really Atari's fault. It's just a problem of evolution."

JOHN BRANDWOOD (various Ocean games):

"It's an improvement but it's a bit late in the day. This is what the machine should have been in the first place. I think the blitter and hardware scrolling are the best parts and the machine was desperate for those. The stereo sound is a waste of time. End users won't notice the difference, maybe the odd art package will be a bit better. I don't like to be negative but I fear it's still not as good as the Amiga."

IAN HETHERINGTON (Psychosis joint boss):

"Atari has managed to fill the gap between the ST and the Amiga by no more than seven to ten per cent. I haven't seen one but I know what it's going to be capable of. This is what the ST should have been originally."

ANDY PENNELL (various HiSoft products):

"It really should have been a bigger step forward but at least it's a step. For serious programmers it's good because it's easier to expand the RAM. And the blitter is nice. But after four years you would have expected a bit more. I think they've concentrated on the TT which is a good machine and not so much on the STE. It doesn't have the advantages of the Amiga but so few programmers use those that it doesn't really matter anyway."

STEVE BAK (*Goldrunner*):

"The prospect of the STE doesn't excite me. I won't even look at the machine until Atari have sold several hundred thousand units."

• Atari's spokesman refused to be drawn on any of the criticisms saying they are "contrary to a legal agreement". "Atari are going to come down heavily on those programmers who have broken the agreement. We're furious. And you can print that."

In the past Atari has taken a poor view of criticism in the press and has often successfully acted upon that. Although criticisms have been publicly rejected in the past this is one of those rare occasions when the company is genuinely enraged.

It's show business

Montbuild has finally announced its plans for an autumn computer show to rival the troubled PC Show next year.

The firm which once helped organise the PC Show will be staging the first Business Computing Show at Earls Court from September 25th to 28th.

Show goers will now find that instead of the traditional PC Show which encompasses all aspects of home and business computing they have two show - Montbuild's business affair and EMAP's European Computer Entertainment Show (September 13th to 16th).

The future of the PC Show is in serious doubt. Patron VNU used to organise it in conjunction with Montbuild but that firm split last spring. VNU has slapped a £5 million lawsuit on its former partner but Montbuild says that will be fought off.

Montbuild is hoping to attract top end manufacturers to its new show such as IBM, Wang and DEC. But expect to see the likes of Amstrad, Commodore and Atari present as well.

Meanwhile Commodore has split with Database over the organisation of the forthcoming Commodore Christmas Show (November 17th to 19th).

In the past Database had completely organised the event. This year it was to simply take care of the peripheral details such as cleaners and security. However, differences of opinion and Database's commitment to the Computer Shopper Show have forced a split.

Commodore has managed to woo bug names to its show such as Ocean and Electronic Arts. The firm is known to have been tired of seeing "grey importers" and box shifters virtually dominating the last few shows.

KONIX CASH BOOST BUT CONSOLE LATE

The Konix Multisystem will not appear until after Christmas - but at least the machine's future has been secured following a substantial cash injection.

Konix was to launch the machine this week but various problems have meant a delay. The firm's management has been involved in lengthy discussions over the past few months in a bid to attract a buyer for a large share of the company.

Last week it emerged that a Southampton based hardware distributor called Addons had stepped in to buy a large share of the company from its boss and founder Wyn Holloway.

Holloway has been in negotiations with Addons since the PC Show when staff from the distributor were constantly present on the Konix stand. Despite the bad publicity about Konix's PC Show presence Addons appears to have been impressed by public interest in the console.

It is not yet known how much Addons will have paid for the shareholding or how much of the company it owns but it is understood that Holloway no longer has sole control of the firm.

He had hoped to push his creation through singlehandedly but failed to raise the money needed through traditional

sources such as banks. As a result he had to turn to a buyer.

It is still hoped that the Multisystem will be launched before Christmas although that is highly unlikely. Konix has still not booked any ads for the machine.

Addons has risen to prominence in the trade over the past few years as a top shifter of Commodore's products to deal-

ers. It has a close relationship with the hardware manufacturer and this year sold more than £20 million worth of computers.

The Konix machine will stay the same and will still be priced at £229. However, Holloway will no longer have complete control over the product and its peripherals.

Virus launched against NASA

Anti-nuclear protesters have inserted a special virus into NASA's computer network opposing its work on the nuclear powered Space Shuttle.

The Fu Manchu virus failed to worm its way into the computers monitoring

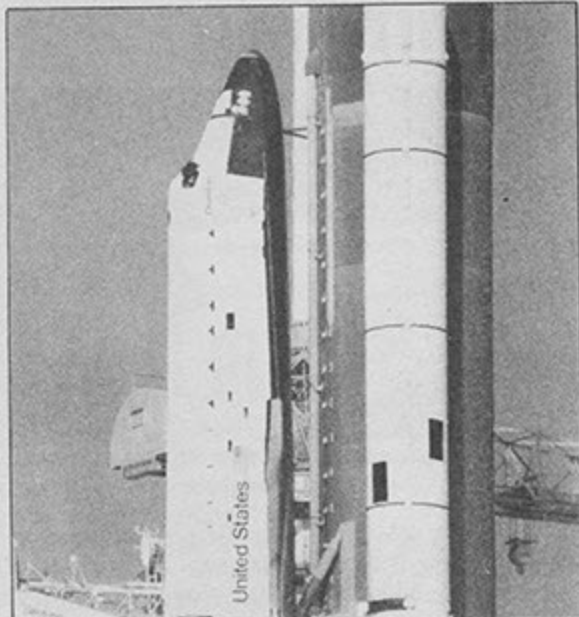
the Shuttle's launch late last month but did get through to the computers which will be used to carry data from the mission.

Computer operators at NASA found their DEC mainframe computer terminals infected with mes-

sages such as: "You talk of times of peace for all, and then prepare for war" appearing alongside others including "George Orwell was an optimist" and "WORMs against nuclear killers".

Some 6,000 computers are claimed to have been infected. NASA officials took the precaution of disconnecting especially sensitive computers from the network. Whilst NASA says no real damage has been done there are fears that the "garbage" data could be used by mistake. It is thought that the virus crept through a French network which is attached to NASA's computer system.

The launch of the Space Shuttle was surrounded in controversy because it uses nuclear fuels. Lift off was delayed for a few days while protesters tried to stop it through the law courts.

Firebird faces the axe in MicroProse shake up

Games software house MicroProse is considering dropping the Firebird label which it bought from British Telecom only seven months ago (Express 23).

The firm is planning a major reshuffling of its labels at the end of the year with Firebird being closed down along with Microstyle which was launched only weeks before the Telecom deal.

At present MicroProse games come under five labels - MicroProse, Rainbird, Microstatus, Microstyle and Firebird. MicroProse feels this is all too confusing.

Microstyle and Firebird games are all "lightweight" affairs with the emphasis on fun. However, MicroProse dislikes the Firebird image and wants the games to be slightly more in depth and lasting. So Microstyle will stay whilst Firebird goes. Where to is not

known.

Rainbird has been a leading name in cerebral gaming for the past five years. Although Microstatus was launched with similar goals it can't hope to compete.

This will bring the MicroProse label down to three games with clear identities. MicroProse said it preferred not to comment on future plans.

Meantime, MicroProse is looking for top class programmers to join a new development team. Most MicroProse games are put together in the US but now the UK offshoot is looking to make an impact. "We've got most of the team together now but if someone can come and stun us then that would be great," offered a spokesman. MicroProse can be contacted on 0666 54326.

ALTERNATIVE MOUSE STYLE

A revolutionary new alternative to the mouse is being developed by a Dorking based company.

Culton Services has licensed a finger position sensor which could easily be designed into a com-

puter's keyboard. The sensor works according to finger pressure and is claimed to be just as accurate as a mouse.

Manufacturers of portable computers have been stumped for an alter-

native with Apple and Atari having to plump for uncomfortable roller balls.

A special pad for desktop computers is also being developed by the firm. Culton is on 0306 885138.

There are two possible approaches to take over the Konix affair. One says what a shame it is that yet another British (i.e. not English but Welsh) entrepreneur has had their visionary scheme hindered by lack of money, how it could have provided hundreds of jobs and given the British computer industry a genuine lead over the Nintendos and NECs of this world, etc. etc.

The other is less generous. Konix - a hitherto obscure Welsh (i.e. not British or English) joystick manufacturer - never could take on the world, pundits said when the company announced its console. It simply can't compete against the big boys because it can't provide the sheer up-front cash and marketing muscle.

So far the console has survived on the oxygen of publicity only. At the recent PC Show punters were given the embarrassing sight of a stand with all the promo tapes and videos working but no console. SOFTWARE BUYING REVOLUTION LOOMS

A revolutionary new way of buying computer games is being tested by high street retailer WH Smiths.

The firm has installed a special computer in its Princes Street branch in Glasgow which will copy games while you wait. The experiment has been set up with software houses Code Masters and Elite as well as trade distributor TBD.

The trade feels that this is a good way of making the most of valuable shelf and stock space. Hundreds of computer games can be stored in the machine instead of on the shelves.

Buyers simply go in, buy a blank tape, and have the game of their choice copied. All Code Masters' and Elite's back catalogue of 8-bit budget games are being kept on the computer. In other cir-



cumstances WH Smiths would not bother to carry all these old games - only current big sellers. This gives games buyers more choice.

The computer being used is American in origin and is called the Avedas. TBD's Norman Smith told Express: "It looks just like a PC but can copy games over very quickly and without disturbing any of the normal copy protection. It's capable of copying games onto disk or tape"

"In the trade we have to be aware of the restricted space on shelves, this is a good way of offering people older games and saving space. We're able to give consumers access to three times as many titles as before.

The software houses say they are delighted to be able to get golden oldies into the shops instead of having them collect dust in the back of a warehouse. If the experiment is a success then Smiths plans to install more computers in branches throughout the country.

TBD and WH Smiths are even considering using the process to sell old audio tapes although that is at an early stage of development. TBD can be contacted on 0782 566566.

Earl quits CBM

Jeff Earl, Commodore's newly found public face, has left the company saying that he disagrees with the firm's "culture".

Earl was taken on as marketing manager only three months ago and in that time had established a good relationship with the press and much of the trade. However, he left the company abruptly two weeks ago.

Earl has quickly denied rumours that he was fired and says he left because he disagreed with the firm's management style.

He also denied that there had been a clash of personalities between himself and UK boss Steve Franklin. "I just realised that Commodore isn't the company that I thought it was. For all its years (it was set up in 1957) the British wing is very young. All the people there have been taken on since Steve became boss

two years ago. But the parting was amicable." He said though that he disliked the firm's "culture" and its internal structure.

Commodore is refusing to comment on the matter saying only that Earl left "to follow up opportunities elsewhere".

Chinese fear computer crisis

Computer criminals in China are defrauding the country of hundreds of thousands of pounds as its technology fails to keep up with the skilled thieves.

According to *The People's Daily*, dishonest computer literates are taking advantage of the country's poor computer security. It is estimated that there are some 50,000 computers in use in the country but most are basic and not built to withstand attacks from today's generation of high tech fraudster.

The first fraud was discovered in July 1986 at an office of the People's Bank of China in Shenzhen. Since then 15 cases have been discovered the largest of which involved more than £150,000.

New model Citizens

Citizen has launched new printers into its "elite" range of Professional models - the ProDot 24, ProDot 9 and ProDot 9X printers.

The ProDot 24 offers 24 pin dot matrix printing at a speed of 240 cps in draft quality and 79 cps in letter quality and comes with a driver disk, which allows the printer to be driven by pull down menus. 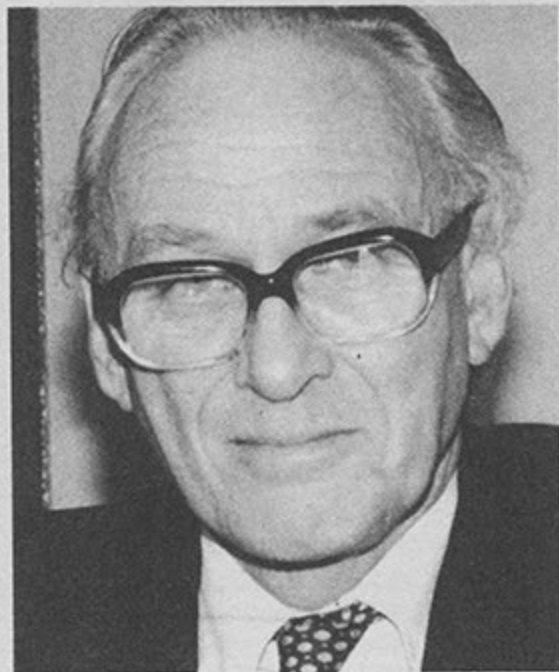

The ProDot 24 costs £599 whilst the ProDot 9 and 9X cost £439 and £559 respectively. As always, additional extras for the printers are available such as tractor feeders, sheet feeders and colour kits at various prices.

HACKING BILL FACES DELAY

One hundred leading industrialists and anti-hacking campaigners gathered at the House of Commons last week to demand early legislation

which will outlaw hacking. They fear the forthcoming bill will be postponed in order to make way for other legislation.

The companies descended on the Commons following the Law Commission's recent recommendations to make hacking illegal with a maximum five year prison sentence (*Express* 50).

They are particularly concerned that Nicholas Ridley, the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry, will give in to pressure from junior ministers who feel that other politically sensitive bills should be pushed through before the next election, leaving the hacking legislation aside. If so hacking would still be legal for at least two years.

Some have suggested that the Bill has already been dropped from the Government's 1990 programme although that has not been

confirmed. The final decision will be revealed in the Queen's Speech at the official opening of Parliament next week.

The industrialists are asking three thousand firms to sign a petition urging Ridley to include the Bill. And John Banham, the boss of the Confederation of British Industries, has demanded a meeting with Ridley.

The CBI has long taken a tough line on hacking reflecting Britain's bosses fears

about the menace. But reports have suggested that the bill will not be included in the Queen's Speech this month which will outline the Government's plans for the next twelve months.

Anti hacking MP Emma Nicholson commented: "He [Nicholas Ridley] is taking the issue far too calmly for my liking. But he's not computer literate so he can't be expected to understand." ■

Voice PC for handicapped

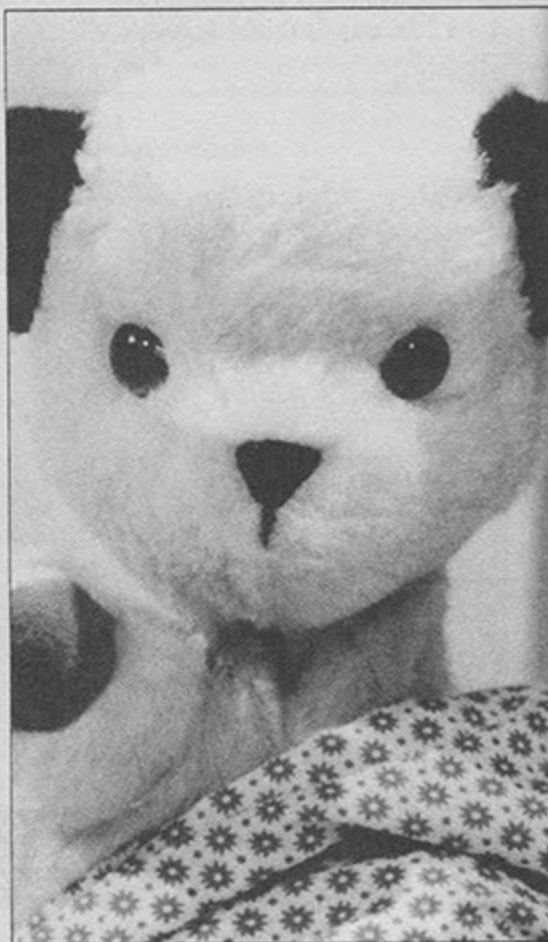
Zenith has come up with an extraordinary new PC which will help severely handicapped people get the most out of computing.

The voice controlled PC will come with specially configured software so that everything can be operated by the voice. The project has been undertaken in conjunction with PRAM Command.

Zenith says the PC's special circuit board will "train" the PC to understand commands regardless of slang, dialect or even speech impediments. An optional robotic arm which can retrieve documents from a printer is even in the offing.

"This system opens the world to the severely handicapped. They need no longer be cut off from the outside world or, indeed, even the working world," said Zenith's Clive Taylor. "These innovations will have repercussions, eventually, for everyone who uses a computer."

Not surprisingly the system is expensive. The basic kit costs more than \$20,000.

It seems that the strangest individuals are catching the computing bug. The latest convert is none other than Sooty.

In a recent episode (*The Good, the Bear and the Fluffy*) Sooty received a brand new computer and started playing games. However, his friend Matthew Corbett didn't approve of Sooty's new hobby especially as it began to look like an obsession.

Still, Sooty managed to persuade Matthew to start playing games and he had to admit that they really jolly good fun after all.

But there's no danger of Sooty becoming a computer addict. The two pals ended the episode by going outside to find other games to play. ■

Armed robbers turn to chips

Computer chips are emerging as California's newest attraction for armed robbers.

Gangs of thieves are reported to be raiding scores of warehouses and manufacturing plants in the technology intensive state. Such is the extent of the crime wave that the FBI and US Customs have begun investigations.

Many of the robberies are being undertaken by Vietnamese gangs who have switched their attention from gold to silicon. The gangs are called "gold people" because of their habit of storing personal wealth in portable gold. But now they're making a killing from chips.

One of America's largest computer manufacturers, Western Digital, says it has already lost £3.5 million worth of chips to thieves. And one recent raid on Express Manufacturing cost that firm £250,000 in chips.

The gangs are attracted to chips because they are not guarded as heavily as they might be and don't carry serial numbers. They are also extremely small and valuable. A fistful of chips can fetch thousands of pounds on the black market.

The gangs usually strike at night and are highly efficient. They are always armed and usually violent.

Chauk Chin, the owner of Express Manufacturing said he was attacked by two men who walked onto the factory floor and threatened him with handguns. They then tied up and gagged employees while they stuffed their bags with chips. Chin said the members of the gang operated with military precision.

Sergeant Peter Pearson of Santa Clara police said: "It's totally out of control. The Vietnamese gangs come in at four or five at a time and completely turn over a company."

Western Digital's vice president Robert Erickson commented: "There's not a company in this area that hasn't been hit." ■

Micro tips

Computer owners still unsure about the rudiments of their machines are being offered a free tips brochure by Price Waterhouse.

The guide outlines all the best housekeeping rules such as backing up disks, keeping food and drink away from the machine and keeping your computer cool. It also offers ten security tips which should keep your machine free from corrupted disks, viruses and unauthorised access.

"Many users are not carrying out basic procedures such as regular back up of vital data, and there is often little or no control over access to systems," explained Price Waterhouse's data security chief David Frost. The leaflet can be obtained by calling 01 378 7200. ■

We'll quit 16-bit says Psygnosis

Leading 16-bit software house Psygnosis is "seriously considering" dropping out of the ST and Amiga markets because of rampant piracy.

The firm says it is "sick and tired" of writing computer games just so they can be ripped off by parasitical crackers and pirates. Psygnosis says it will move into consoles, an area which the firm has been courting for some time.

"We released *Shadow of the Beast* on the Friday, it hit the

shops on Saturday and I could buy a pirated version on Saturday night," said the firm's Ian Hetherington. "We invest a lot of money, time and talent into these games. What's the point if we're not being rewarded? Anyone who says piracy is alright because the price of games is too high is talking rubbish."

Psygnosis has based its success over the past couple of years through graphically excellent games such as *Beast* and *Blood Money*. ■

Sex and CD

An Italian firm is planning to launch a CD-ROM set of disks containing explicit sex pictures.

The *Unabashed History of Pornography* is being sold by Milan based In-Cat systems. The five disk set contains 300 graphic images of sexual acts from a variety of historical periods. According to trade paper Datalink the static pictures are "of photographic quality" and are rated XXX.

It would appear that Italian regulations on such matters are not as strict as ours and In-Cat "is not aware" of differences in other countries.

HiSoft: not PD

This month's issue of *ST Format*, sister publication to *New Computer Express*, contains an unfortunate error: HiSoft's MonST program is described as public domain. It is not.

All versions of MonST and the other programs that make up Dev-Pac ST (versions 1 and 2) are the copyright of HiSoft and therefore should not be copied or otherwise treated as public domain.

DEEP THOUGHT THRASHED

Top chess computer can't beat human

Deep Thought, the world's most advanced chess playing computer, was last week beaten by world champion Gary Kasparov in 52 moves.

Typically, Kasparov used the victory as a vindication of human supremacy over any computer. "I had to challenge Deep Thought for this match to protect the human race," he told assembled chess fans and computer enthusiasts.

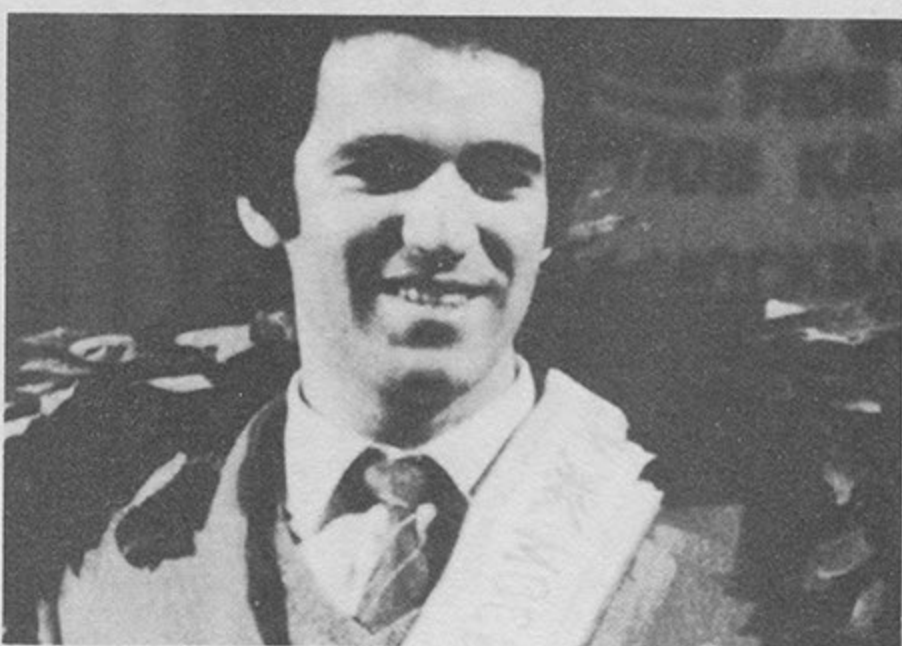
Deep Thought is a dedicated chess playing computer and can think through 720,000 possible moves every second.

However, in this match it was soon clear who was going to emerge victorious. The Grandmaster used a classic Sicilian Defence and then bewildered the machine by implementing a violent King's side attack cleverly disguising a sneaky passed pawn on the opposite wing.

The computer was still claiming to be level half way through the game when one piece down and under heavy attack.

Kasparov was jubilant after the exhibition at the New York Academy of Art. But he has a smarter rival waiting in the wings.

The development team behind Deep Thought are currently working on a machine which can think through a billion

moves per second. That should be ready to take on the champion within two years.

He doesn't appear to be overly concerned. "I cannot visualise living with the knowledge that a computer is stronger than the human mind," he said. "Computers have their psychology too. If

you know a computer well, you can anticipate its moves."

However, he gave Deep Thought some credit. "If a human player was beaten as decisively as I just beat Deep Thought he would be so intimidated he would be an easy target in the next game. But not a machine. It cannot be intimidated."

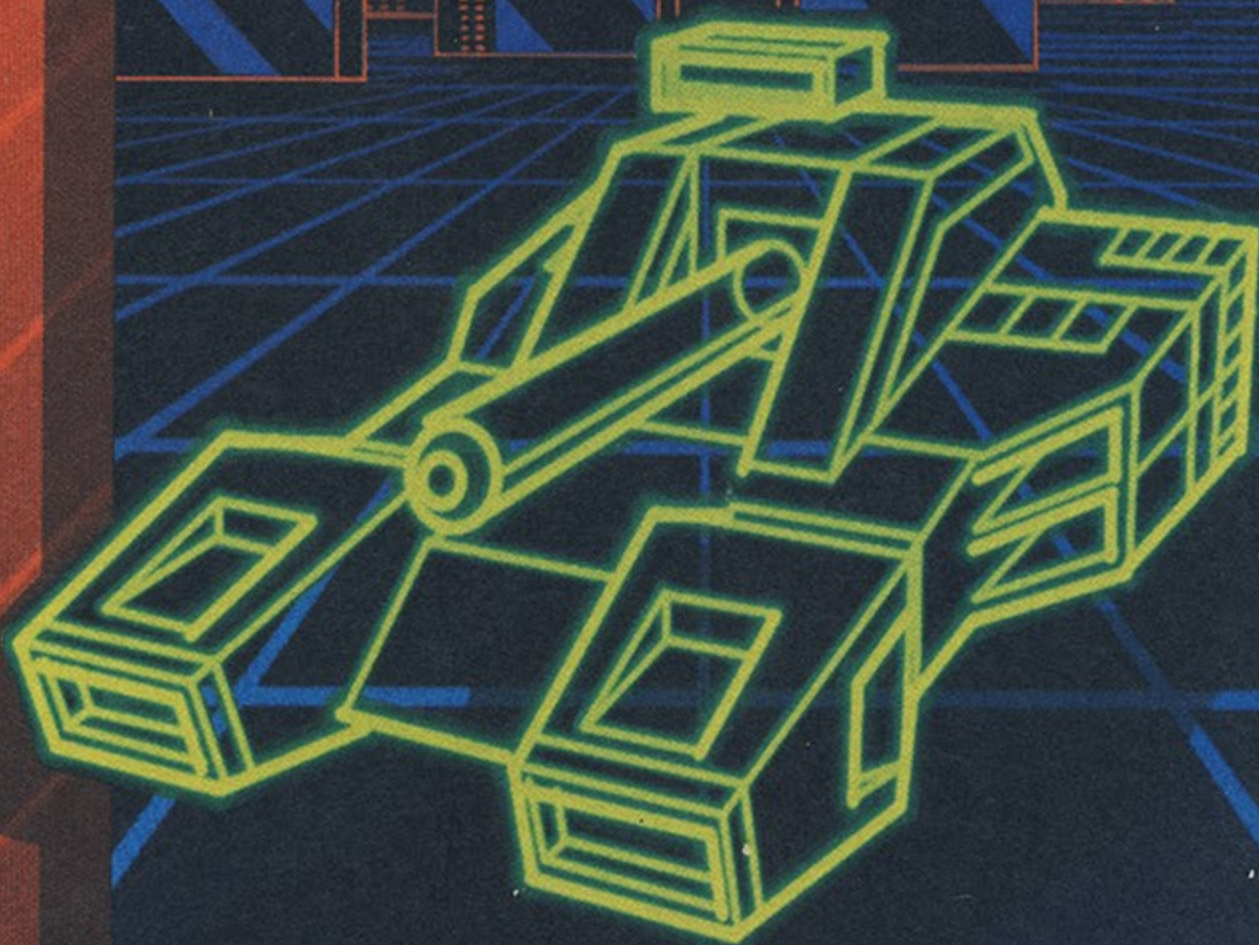

For instance, the Amiga has four-voice stereo sound, but the ST has only three-channel mono sound. The Amiga also has many extra features plus 512K operating system.

I'm not trying to slag off the ST, but it is an indisputable fact that the Amiga has a better technical specification.

I should think there are probably many Amiga owners who are hopping mad at Colin Westwood's suggestion that the Atari ST can emulate their beloved machine, which is an impossible task for even a Mega ST.

I am writing in support of Colin Westwood (Amiga

Emulators, Express 50). AMY68 does exist - I have a version of it (1.40+). This version runs on my Mega ST with 2Mb of RAM. Version 1.40+ includes an addition, Graphic-X, which is the 'Amiga graphics co-processor emulator.'

My manual (release 2A) describes, in detail, how AMY68 works. Basically, it cross compiles code from the Amiga to the ST using a special 68000 cross compiler/ assembler. The author says that he is currently working on sound emulation.

I have run Amiga versions of Della WP, Craze Stop, Chuckie Egg, Ferrari Formula One, Interceptor, Jet, International Soccer, Captain Blood, B.A.T., Afterburner and Streetfighter.

I have been able to run all my Amiga friends' BASIC programs (I bet you thought ST and Amiga owners couldn't be friends) with no

problems. The whole system is beautifully documented and is extremely easy to use. AMY68 comes on three disks, and the last disk contains a weird copy of AmigaDOS - version 1.3A.

It doesn't feel quite like the original in use and so if you have access to an original copy of AmigaDOS v1.3 you would be well advised to use that instead for best results.

I got my copy of AMY68 version 1.40+ from American shareware organisation DatLogik for \$79.95 + VAT. S.C.Hampson, Banstead, Surrey

EASY FOR YOU TO SAY

Your magazine gives over a lot of column space offering moral judgement to readers who write advocating software piracy. I imagine that it's easy when working for a magazine industry to imagine that all computer users have "legal" access to as vast a range of software as you do.

This is plainly untrue. For new users the sense of alienation at the lack of software, and frustration at its price, can be overwhelming. Most users are offered copies very early on as they almost always know somebody else with the same machine. It would be foolish and naive to brand these people "thieves."

The industry need to take a far more realistic and less moralistic viewpoint. Ask yourself this - how much so you think the average user spends on software? I know some users who spend a colossal amount, many hundreds of pounds a year. Some schoolchildren spend almost all of their money on software.

The truth is this, something that FAST have totally failed to realise; if copying was impossible, these people would not spend a single penny more on software. They simply would not buy the machine in the first place. For all except the very rich and highly enthusiastic it would simply not be worth it.

The "legal" user - which, I assure you, is extremely rare outside the world of free review copies and gifts to the press; would have access to a miniscule proportion of the vast range of software available to their machine. Even then this would involve a massive outlay. FAST's figures of x-billion-pounds-lost-each-year are quite frankly laughable if they're working on the assumption that every program shared between private users would normally have been bought by each one!

The piracy of business and education software is bad news. These are institutions who can afford to pay and on the whole get good value. Also organized piracy "bootlegging" outfits are hardly

more acceptable. But private copies of games between friends is hardly more an act of theft than reading someone else's paperback.

- Whatever the circumstances, it's still illegal, and any sort of attempt to justify it, and therefore legitimise and glamorise theft is, I'm afraid, quite reprehensible. Your views are:

- Inconsistent (why is piracy of games good but business and education software bad? Because you want to play games)
- Hackneyed (the same arguments have been made before many times) and
- Plain wrong (FAST don't base their figures on the lines you suggest, and the comparison with reading the paperback is pointless. This is like letting someone else play your legitimate copy of the game, which is quite fair enough. Giving them a pirate copy of it is like photocopying the paperback, which is illegal).

HACK ATTACK

I feel that much of the authorities' (ie the state and its allies in business) paranoia about hacking is in fact a smokescreen: the "evil hacker" is put forward, with the connivance of much of the media, as a bogeyman so that more important issues of how computers can affect our lives (viz. the number of powerful bodies who have 'legitimate' access to mounds of personal information about us) can be conveniently forgotten - compare and contrast the draconian nature of the anti-hacking proposals to the loophole-ridden Data Protection Act and see what I mean.

In fact, the proposed new laws to imprison hackers have one particularly frightening implication from this point of view. Consider the following scenario: a hacker, caught by the authorities after the passing of the new law, is given the following choice; "Either we prosecute and nail you right up to the wall, or... you do some little jobs for us."

Hackers end up being forced by those in power to assist them in their information gathering - M15 could have the files of CND and other anti-government organisations hacked, the Inland Revenue and Poll Tax authorities could hack every little bit of information about your financial affairs... The result would be far worse than any of the horror stories seen in the media about hacking.

I wonder if this is not in fact the whole idea - I understand that hackers tend to be very individualistic and anti-authoritarian, and would not under normal circum-

PILOT LIGHTS

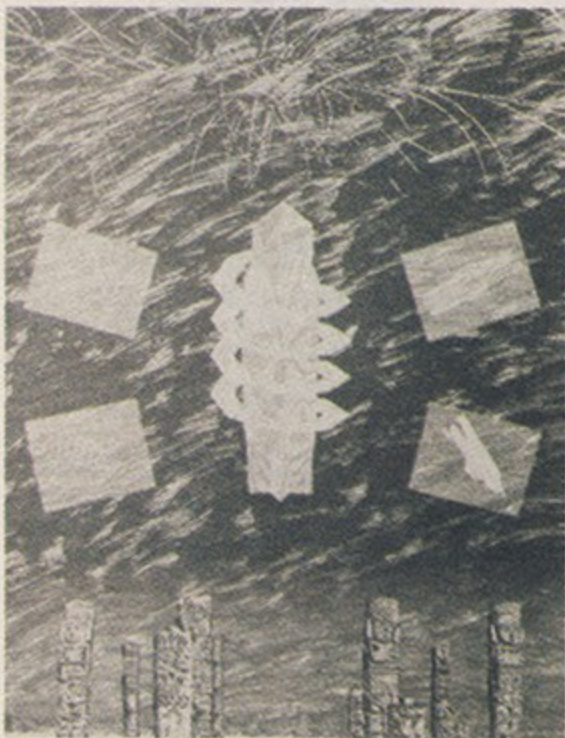

ART FOR ALL

Computer art has progressed beyond simple cartoons and heavy metal imagery, as Angela Neale discovers at an exhibition in the West Country

Is it really art? The question long ago asked when photography first emerged is now reverberating around the galleries at the Arnolfini, Bristol's contemporary art centre, but for a new reason - electronic art. At one time it was enough to wow everyone with gadgetry, but now artists are using the medium to produce technological 'art' - for art's sake.

The exhibition of electronic print was part of the Bristol Print festival and included the work of over 30 international artists. All of the pictures were produced using computer technology and brought together various fields of electronic printmaking.

The exhibition was exciting not only for the work on display, but also for the attitudes and foresight of the exhibiting artists. It was refreshing to see computer art hanging on the walls of a major gallery and treated with as much respect as art of

a more traditional kind.

The many unexplored areas in electronic art and design give an impetus to the artists to continually look to the next stage as both the technology and the artists themselves develop. The overriding feeling from the show was that the work on display was transient, ready to be updated and replaced by the next advance.

Computer art is challenging traditional painters by looking at art from a new viewpoint - anyone with a modicum of artistic skill can use their imagination to produce something for themselves. Most of the artists began working on fairly cheap home computers, though many of them have progressed towards more complex set ups, but the dominating idea is that the snobbery surrounding art can be broken down by anyone with a computer and the inclination to use it. ●

IN THE ART OF THE CITY

Mike King and Richard Wright are both computer artists and lecture at City Poly in London. They run courses for professional designers and artists who wish to learn programming and use paintboxes to further their creative work.

Richard Wright was training as a painter and became interested in alternative ways of making pictures. He explored mathematical and geometric ideas, first designing on paper and then realising that what he was trying to produce could be executed more efficiently on a computer. He started with a Commodore 64 in 1980 and did his own programming from day one, as this gave him space to produce rather than a package could allow. As he progressed the need to improve print out quality became apparent, so Richard moved over to an IBM PC at the IBM scientific centre in Winchester.

Mike King first used computers in his art quite by coincidence after watching a Horizon TV programme. He saw similarities between the chaotic stage his work was going through and the things the computers were being shown to do. He set out with a BBC micro and programmed his own software.

Mike and Richard have a vision of a generation that is growing up computer literate with a common language, and can enter the art world through a computer connection. They believe that this will help to break down the barriers that make art inaccessible to young people.

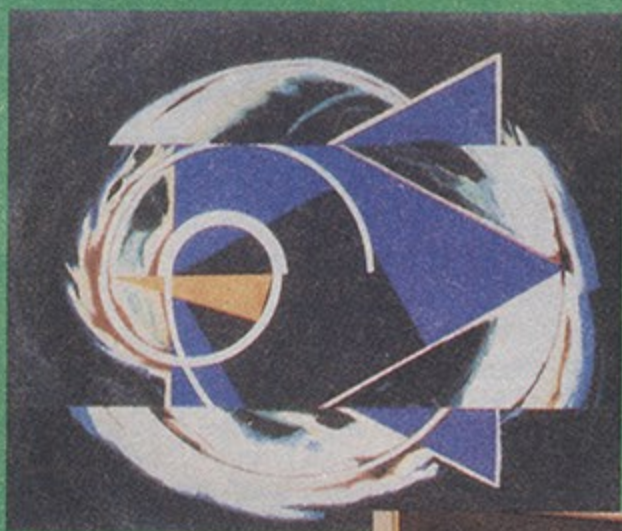
MARK WILSON

Mark Wilson trained as an abstract painter at Yale and initially became attracted to computers for slightly off beat reasons - the beauty and intricacy of circuit boards rather than what they could do.

After realising the powerful opportunities that machines could offer and with home computers becoming affordable he bought a Texas TI/994 A and began to construct a program for himself. It took several years of frustration and tinkering before a generally unsophisticated piece of software evolved.

Later he moved on to an IBM PS/2 and a colour plotter. Mark stressed that writing his own program gives him greater flexibility and fewer restrictions than a package could ever provide. He says a lot of his work comes from experimentation with this basic piece of software and often gives totally unexpected results. He finds computers "all consuming" and now uses no other media.

"Many powerful artists are among the leaders in exploiting machines but have to become aware of the limitations of computers as well as the advantages."

FAB 4 STUDIOS

Jeremy Norton and Danny Jenkins are both postgraduate students at Bristol Polytechnic and work primarily with computers. Unusually, they specialise in illustration and their work appears regularly in the pages of *Express* and other magazines brochures and advertising literature.

They were both attracted to computer painting systems out of curiosity and novelty and, having college equipment close to hand, quickly became involved in the medium.

"I found there was none of the restrictions that conventional media had imposed on me and ideas could be developed further and faster on a computer," said Jeremy. He uses a Pluto eight-bit paintbox and RGB "Pandora" 24-bit paintbox both running on Tandon PCs and also *Free-hand* on a Mac 2. "I like the ability to output to hardcopy or paste directly in to DTP software. The disadvantages are expensive software and square eyes!"

Danny uses other media and has done video work with Yazz, TV work and customisation of cars with spray cans but also uses the paintbox systems at the poly. "Most computer art I've seen I thought was fairly horrible - technically clever but lacking noticeably on the creative side. Computer art made to look like oil paintings. I find the great thing about using computers is the speed at which drawings can be developed. You can take a drawing in any direction and take any risks you want, completely mutilate and

experiment the work to death without the worry of losing it forever by just saving the crucial stages."

Little illustration work is done on computers, probably because access to hardware is difficult and the fact that computers are expensive, but Danny and Jeremy have a vision of young artists taking out bank loans, getting a computer and making extremely large amounts of cash! "Still, we'll see!" said Danny.

They both feel strongly that computer art should be practiced by creative people rather than programmers, then perhaps it could really have the presence to capture people's imagination.

ALTERED IMAGES

Mark Bennet explored the very expensive world of image processing at a recent London show

The Wembley Exhibition Centre was host last week to Image Processing '89, Europe's first major exhibition in the rapidly expanding field of image processing (IP). The show's 90 exhibitors covered a broad range of technology from flatbed scanners for use in digital archiving to complex colour medical 3D imaging systems, and were all keen to get their share of a market estimated to be worth \$468,000,000 by 1992.

While we lowly home micro users may have felt lost at the show it was good place to see what image processing was all about. Defined simply, it's the appropriation and manipulation of images, whether they be taken from satellites, a video or a video camera placed in a high powered microscope.

Go digital

Once you decided what you want to digitise and

get into the computer, you have to figure out which way to do it.

Traditional flat bed scanners were at the show being used for OCR (optical character recognition) for text recognition, but they were eclipsed in number and variety by CCD cameras (charge couple device - the chip used in most hand held video cameras) that featured high resolutions, high shutter speeds and the ability to handle depth.

Having decided on which camera or scanner you're going to use, you need to find a digitising board that will convert the analogue signal into something the computer can use. A wide variety were on show, for various computers ranging from the Archimedes to Sun workstations. Most however were prohibitively expensive, if state of the art in terms of processing power.

For the most part, image processing remains in the hands of the very rich and bureaucrats. The latter are speeding up and replacing the traditional filing systems with products like Callhaven's MD Mars. This is a system for archiving and retrieving of documents which runs on a Mac II. The system, costing thousands of pounds, is designed to archive any type of electronic or hardcopy documents on high capacity optical disks. It can store an entire filing cabinet's worth of information and retrieve it in a few seconds. It can, for example find any word on any page of text in a 1,000 volume set of 500 page books in less than five seconds. Storage is in a 'jukebox' WORM optical disk - an autochanging drive holding several disks. The drive stores 160 gigabytes, equivalent to 2,000 80Mb hard drives. If your filing cabinet is bulging call Callhaven on 01-549 5612.

ON THE ARC

Acorn made a big showing with their Archimedes, the top level machines - the 400 series - being ideal for image processing work.

One exhibitor was demonstrating using an Arc to help patients with retinal problems. The Digit image analysis

software is currently being used in one hospital to measure visual pigments. The computer generates 3D stereo images of the optic nerve. Also at the show were:

• Timestep Weather Systems,

suppliers to MOD and the US Air Force, now offers a range of low cost remote image processing systems based on the Archimedes which makes use of the Landsat satellite, sending pictures to the computer owner for under £600.

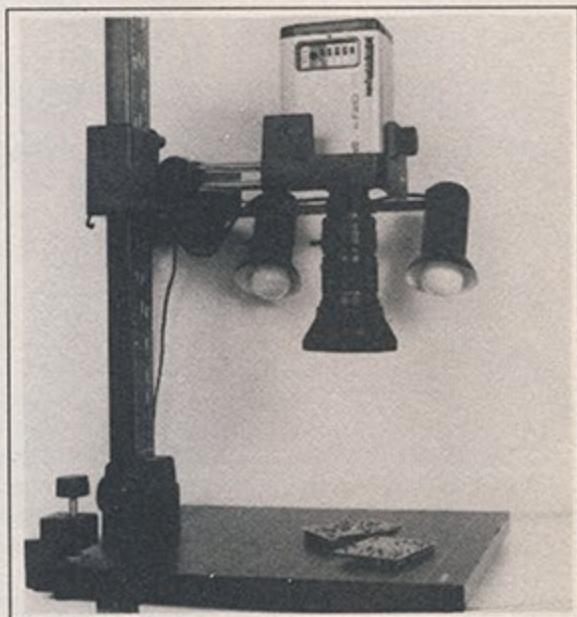
• Cambridge based company GEMS was showing the latest version of Gemsoft36 - the portable UNIX based image processing package written in C.
• Watford Electronic was displaying its video digitiser which can manipulate images in vari-

ous ways; squashing, rotation, stretching as well as straight input for desk top publishing, graphics, animation, image analysis and recognition. The company also showed the Arc hand scanner and graphic tablet.

IN THE MOVIES

Lundy UK were showing the Pixar II system, which it distributes in the UK. The high end image processing system was originally developed at the computer division of Lucasfilm Ltd in 1979 to help create computer graphics for use in the Star Wars series of movies. Films which use of the Pixar include Star Trek II: The Wrath of Khan, The Return of the Jedi and Young Sherlock Homes. The computer division spun off from Lucasfilm in 1986 and was bought by Steve Jobs, co-founder of Apple and owner of NeXT. The system is now being used for satellite image analysis, non-destructive testing, and high quality animations which have won an Oscar. You may have seen animations created on Pixar systems on Channel 4 last week.

The same firm produces the Render Accelerator an add in board for PCs. The board gives 286 and 386 PCs the power of five 25Mhz 386 computers, allowing the creation of photo realistic images on the desktop.

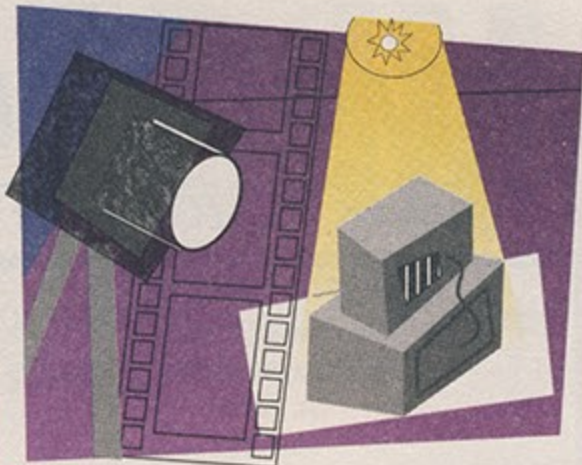

The publishing process. Above from left to right:

- **Planning:** The articles for the next issue are discussed. Already the editor has a pretty good idea of what the finished article will look like, in terms of text content and illustrations. A rough is sketched out showing the writer and artist what is required in terms of content, number of words, type of illustration etc.

- **Illustrations:** The photographs and illustrations are taken. In desktop publishing, the slowest part is the taking and developing of photographs, so this has to be done first.

- **Writing:** The article is written directly onto disk (or typed up onto disk if it's a freelance contribution from outside). The editor may, if the article looks as though it's heading in the wrong direction, get the writer to rejig the article. In theory, once it's typed onto disk, only typing errors and spelling mistakes can be corrected. In practice major re-writes are often done. (Continued opposite)

- **Final proofing:** The corrections to the first proof made, a second proof is printed out. (Because the whole page is stored on disk, these corrections can take just a few seconds.) In theory there should be nothing to change at all, but in practice...

- **Phototypesetter:** The high-definition version of the now perfect page is printed out. The machine uses a photographic technique to print on light-sensitive paper.

- **Artwork:** Any artwork - probably just the odd processed photo - is literally cut to size and pasted onto the page. Space is left for colour pictures which must be processed by a specialist firm. If there are any serious typing errors spotted now, a 'patch' - a bit of paper with the correct spelling - is pasted over the offending part. (Continued opposite)

THE DESKTOP EXPLOSION

Desktop publishing technology is revolutionising the magazine world - and now you can get in on the act. The New Computer Express team explains how...

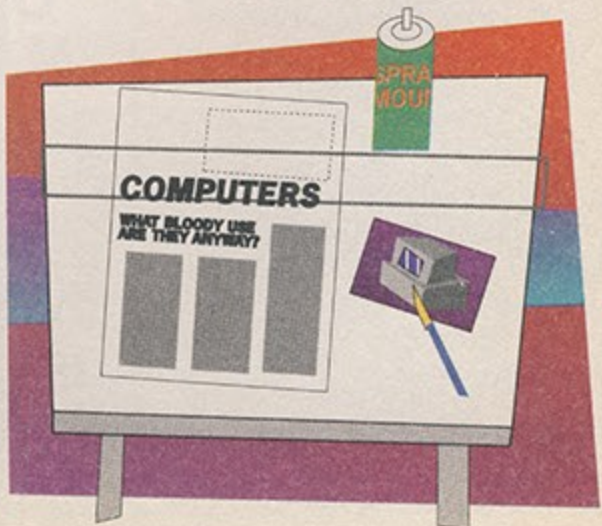
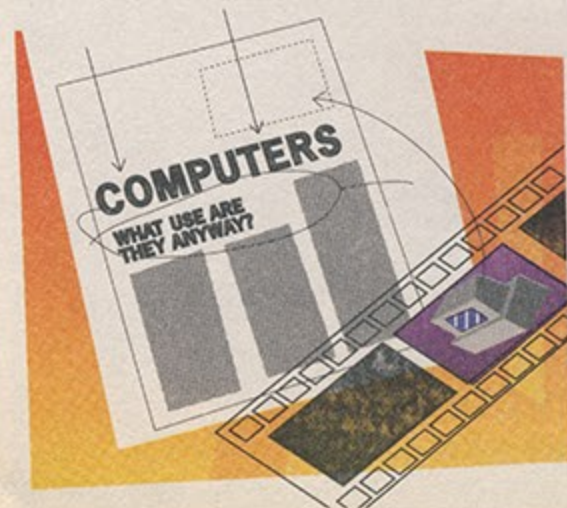
DTP has utterly changed the way magazines are put together. Computers can handle all the text, hold all the pictures, check the spelling, lay the pages out, and do colour separations. It means magazines can be produced far faster, cheaper and more easily than with traditional methods. Most importantly, it means anyone with a micro, software and printer can produce their own publications - company or club newsletters, parish magazines, even booklets - by themselves. All you supply is the time and the talent.

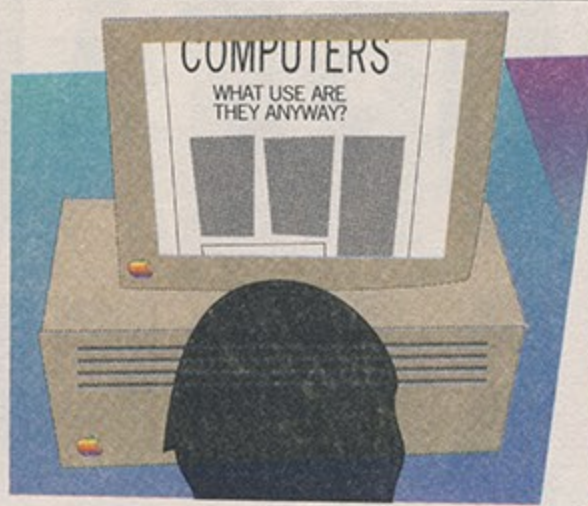
Professional setups - like that used to put *New Computer Express* together - can cost vast amounts of money: half-a-dozen Apple Macintoshes at three grand each, a laser printer for two grand, a phototypesetter for ten grand, software on top of that.... But you don't need to spend a fortune. You can produce desktop publications on a Spectrum or an Archimedes. All you need is a printer, some software and plenty of patience - the steps involved in producing a publication are the same whatever you're making.

What you need to produce is separate pages that will look just as you want the printed result

to look. This is called 'camera ready artwork'. Printers - such as your high street Kall-Kwiks and Prontaprints - have special cameras that take pictures of the artwork and then print it by a process called offset lithography.

Traditional magazine production goes something like this. The journalist writes the copy on a typewriter. This gets passed to the sub who makes corrections with a pen on the manuscript. The new text is keyed into a typesetting machine which produces a long column of text. This is passed to the artists who literally cut the text into little chunks and fit it around the various artwork and pictures, which are also stuck on in the right place. The result is a page of 'camera ready' artwork, looking just as the final page will look, with lots of different bits of paper stuck on. The headlines, for example, are printed out separately to the main text as they're in a different size, and will be stuck on as a separate bit of paper in the right position on the page. (The joins don't show on the printed result). This goes to the printers who take high-definition picture of each page, print, collate and bind them. The distributors then take the magazines to the shops.





But as for new technology... well, the printing and distribution steps are pretty much the same, but the process of actually producing the camera ready artwork is rather different. The whole page – headlines, line drawings, columns, centred text, even some illustrations – is prepared on a computer screen. The journalist's original copy is used all the way, taken straight off disk, meaning no re-keying. Fiddly little changes can be made right up until the last minute, making it easier to get the content and the look of the article just right. Perhaps most important for the home user, you can put a page together without paste up and artwork skills (though professional magazines still use trained artists).

Professional setups use laser printers to produce proofs of pages. These only give definition of about 300 dots per inch, which is not quite smooth enough for a national magazine, so a phototypesetter is used to output the artwork for use by the printers. This gives much better definition.

You can do the lot on your own printer, of course. The steps outlined on these pages are still valid for a parish magazine, say, but your

own dot matrix printer will produce the proofs and final version.

Picture this

There are two ways of putting pictures into the appropriately sized gap you've left on a page. The first is the more traditional way. You start with a normal black and white print and have it rephotographed through a dotted sheet of plastic. This turns it into a pattern of black dots, like on a newspaper photo. (Colour photos and transparencies can be scanned with a special machine to produce either black and white or colour results). The processed photo is then pasted into the correct place on the camera-ready page. Printing shops will process photos for you for about £5.

The other way is to incorporate the processed version of the picture on the computer, storing the graphics file on disc as a part of the page. The photo then appears when the phototypesetter prints out the page, instead of having to be added by hand afterwards.

You can buy hand scanners that will capture a photo on disc for you for about £120 upwards. ●

- **Styling:** The subs put the headings, body text etc. into the correct sizes and styles, and puts in the necessary bold and italic styles. They check the text fits in with the style of the magazine, is legal, and any facts are correct. The subs will also write the headlines and introductions for the text, and will go back to the author to get them to write to the exact length required. At this stage spelling and grammatical errors are corrected.

- **Layout:** The artist now takes over and puts the correctly sized and styled text onto a pre-designed 'grid'. The text goes into columns and spaces are made for where the pictures will eventually go.

- **Proofing:** The sub looks at a laser-printed version of the page. They look for any spelling mistakes, typing errors and so on which have eluded the system, and perhaps cut or add a little text or move a picture to make things sit on the page better. Though in theory that is all, in practice the writer will make stylistic changes and even rewrite passages make the article that little bit better, to the annoyance of everyone else! (Continued below left)

YOU AT HOME CAN JOIN IN

The essentials for a desktop publication are a micro, some software and a printer. If you want to do things semi-professionally, you'll go for an Apple Macintosh Plus with hard disk – about £1500 – and page makeup software such as Aldus PageMaker or Quark XPress (another £800 or so). You'd then get your made-up pages printed out by a specialist bureau for you on their phototypesetter.

More realistically, you can set yourself up with a DTP system for under £100 by buying the right software...

• Printer

Any dot matrix model will do, with a 24 pin giving better quality than a 9 pin, obviously! If you're on the lookout for a printer, the NEC P2200 (24 pin, £460, 01 993 8111) or the Star LC-10 (9 pin, £229, 01 840 1800) are good buys. Check the mail order ads in Express.

• Software

There are hundreds of DTP programs out there, but here's a quick glimpse of some of the cheaper ones for your machine:

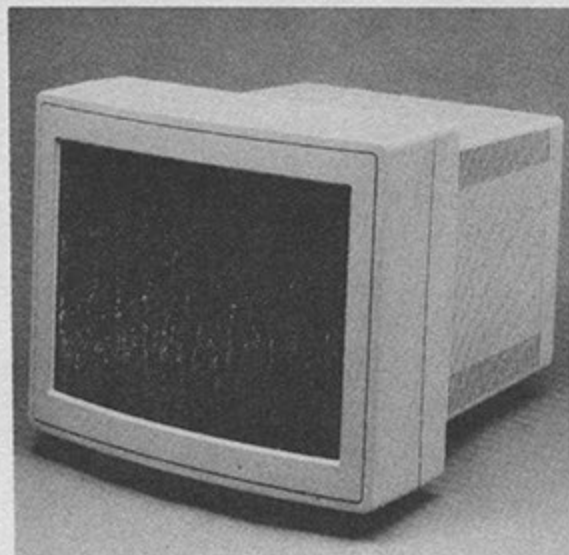

- **Separation:** Any colour pages are separated out into four versions, one each to hold cyan, magenta, yellow and black. These four elements combine on top of each other when printed to give the final, full colour, page. This can be done directly from the phototypesetter for simple pages, but articles with many colour pictures must be done by a specialist.

- **Printing:** The page goes off with all the others in the magazine to the printers, where it is printed, collated, stapled, trimmed and put in huge piles on pallets

- **At last:** The magazine hits the streets – and only now do you notice that typing mistake in the article you wrote!

Two floors of Wembley's Exhibition Centre were given over to ED '89 this year; a market place for display and monitor manufacturers. The exhibition also featured vast amounts of radiation. To view some of the all-singing, all-dancing displays intended for retail stores you really needed sunglasses. But it was the new monitors on show that attracted most attention and pride of place went to the Sony Trinitron range.

Trinitron technology has now been with us for 20 years and in that time over 40 million units have sold worldwide. Although its latest incarnations feature black and flat screens, the crucial design elements - the aperture grille and electron beam gun - remain the same. Producing a colour picture requires separate red, green and blue electron beams to be fired at a screen. Traditional systems had used three separate guns until Sony introduced the single gun, three beam system. Only one lens is needed to be used to maintain beam focus and so it could be three times the size of those in tubes requiring three separate lenses. As such, focus-precision was greatly

increased, creating clearer, sharper definition.

The other innovation was in the grille design. On their way to any screen, electrons need to pass through a grille for accurate placement. Sony overhauled the competing Shadow Mask system by designing a grille of long unbroken slits. The Shadow Mask consists of a lattice - the electrons having to distort through a multitude of tiny holes before lighting up the display. Sony's solution meant that beams hit the screen exactly where they're aimed - maintaining colour purity.

To date, Trinitron screen sizes have started out as small as five-inch and peaked at 19-inch, but ED '89 featured the brand new DDM-2801 - a 28-inch monitor able to display 2048 x 2048 pixels! Intended for image processing and CAD/CAM applications, the DDM delivers the world's highest resolution displays.

LCD launches

Meanwhile, ED '89 also served as the launch platform for the world's highest resolution black and white LCD screen. Hitachi announced its catchily-named LMG9001ZZZ LCM. Combining 'advanced double layer, supertwisted nematic LCD technology with cold fluorescent lamp back-lighting', the LCM is capable of handling 1120 x 780 dots on screen and is claimed to match the visual performance of CRT monitors.

WORLD'S SMALLEST 386 PC

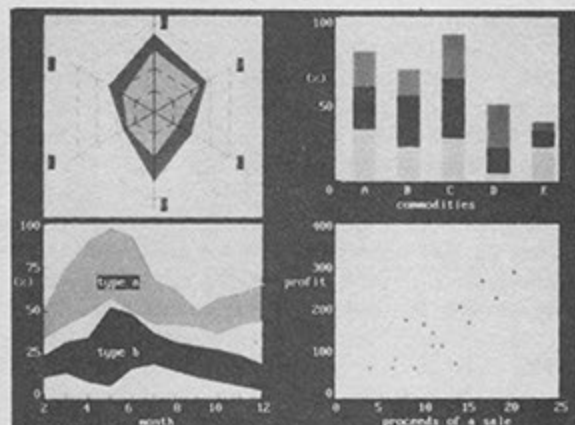
Perdix (0959 71011) drew visitors to a stand showcasing the Quark PCIII - the world's first 80386 single board PC - the size of a 3.5 disk drive. If you were to hook this up to a Private Eye monitor you would have the ideal pocket PC. Private Eye is a computer screen less than two-inches square that you wear! It comes as headset attachment positioned close enough to the eye so as the display appears to be the size of a 12-inch monitor as seen from a distance of two feet. Developed in the States, but still not on sale, the revolutionary screen weighs less than two ounces and delivers a resolution of 720 x 280 pixels.

SUPER SCREENS

• Contraves showed off the ultimate in large scale electro-mechanical displays. Characters 1 metre high can be viewed from as far away as 500 metres - what's more you can hook them up to your PC. Ideal if you just happen to own an airport.

• Surely the most dynamic display manufacturers on show were EEV who supply a range of monitors from its one-inch miniscan units all the way through to giant stadium Starvision screens.
• Thomas Electronics claimed the prize for the exhibition's

smallest cathode ray tube - the size of a thumb nail!
• Another approach to large scale displays is that adopted by Litron who manufacture luminescent film. Characters can be laser-cut to any size or shape up to 500 feet in length and lit in four different colours.



• Hi-res colour - but this is an LCD screen from Hitachi

Hitachi was also previewing its 10-inch colour LCD - an extension of the screen used in the six-inch colour CGA portable launched at the PC Show - though this one is VGA compatible and delivers eight colours at 640x480 resolution. Don't expect a colour VGA portable until mid-1991 though.

The neatest LCD on display was the new one from Epson - another highly memorable name here - the EG7500B-LS graphic LCD. Designed to replace the more bulky CRTs used for graphic displays, the EG75 is very small indeed - its viewing area a mere five inches high by four inches wide - but it can handle 320 x 200 dots and is as readable as any cathode ray based monitor. ●

Anti-red herrings

Shoals of herring are being used as neural networks to help track down the whereabouts of Soviet submarines. At the Lochaline naval base in north west Scotland, scientists have discovered the herring's brain to be an almost perfectly natural neural net.

Herrings, many of whom congregate in shoals of up to 10,000, emit ultra-sound reflections of their brains' electrical impulses. In a shoal, the collective brain is the equivalent to that of over 70 humans. Hi-tech scanning equipment is able to monitor the sounds and thereby detect the minute long-range directional changes herrings make in order to swim around unknown sub-aquatic masses. ■

PC200: Here comes the crunch

In a remarkable new deal the Amstrad PC200 is to be bundled with packets of Kellogg's Corn-flakes.

As of Monday buyers of the prestigious breakfast cereal will be given a free PC200. It is understood Kellogg's wants to get away from its plastic dinosaur image. "The little brontosaurus have had their day," offered a spokeswoman. "Today's corn-flakes eater wants a new breed

of prehistoric monster. So we approached Amstrad."

An Amstrad spokesman commented: "This is a very positive move. It's the best way to get rid of the damned things, er, I mean raise the company profile."

Kellogg's sells nearly a million packets of its crunchy cereal every week but don't worry. Stocks of the Amstrad computers are not likely to run out until May 2123. ■



Top virus watcher warns of:

ALIEN VIRUS TERROR

A deadly new virus from outer space is set to destroy Britain's computers if it isn't stopped soon, according to virus watcher "Dr" Algernon Braithwaite.

The virus is being beamed down from space by evil aliens intent on weakening our high tech defences and spoiling our computing fun. Home satellite dishes pick up the digital signals and the virus then transfers itself into the mains electrical system.

It then finds its way through the national grid and plants itself into every computer it finds.

The Cray has dominated the world of supercomputers for the last few years. Now, however, the NCube is here, claiming more power and more expandability. It boasts 500 million Mb of RAM, runs at 60,000 MIPS and can run 8,192 processors simultaneously. We put the two machines through their paces...

Word Processing

The NCube won hands down, easily coping with any major word processor. *WordPerfect*, for example, can be installed on the 100,000,000 megabyte hard disk leaving 99,999,997 megabytes free. This enables you to use the large version of the thesaurus.

WordPerfect Corp says it has no plans to bring out a spell check dictionary with all 950,000 words of the Oxford English Dictionary – surely a ridiculous omission. When will the software houses catch up with technology!

The NCube spell checked the Bible in 0.5 seconds as opposed to 2.3 seconds for the Cray – sorry, Cray, but this just isn't up to scratch. The NCube produced a concordance – a listing of all the words that appear in the Bible with their page numbers – in 2.1 seconds, with the Cray taking a sluggish 9.5 seconds.

Benchmarks

The NCube took 2 mins 6 seconds to count all the atomic particles in the universe, compensating for red shift and relativity effects. The Cray took 9 mins 24 seconds and missed out several dozen neutrons in Alpha Centauri.

Games

Not much software written specifically for either machine, so you'll have to make do with emulators. Again the NCube scores. The 'AmyCube' emulator lets you run Amiga software at 12,000 times the speed of the original. This can have problems though; to play *Sentinel*, for example, you have to go through 10,000 levels in 12 minutes, at a rate of 14 levels every second.

BATTLE OF THE GIANTS

The new NCube has come on the scene to challenge Cray's supremacy at the top of the supercomputer league. Which comes out tops?

There's also a joystick available for £9.95, though the NCube version with a joystick port in the configuration costs an extra £585,000. In contrast, the Cray has no expansion slots for joysticks, no mouse socket, no RS232 port and no serial printer port. Come on, Cray, when you pay this price for a computer you expect some sort of expandability!

Monitors

The Cray can run EGA and Hercules graphics.

On the other hand the NCube can handle as many as 256 monitors independently all running VGA off a palette of 16 trillion colours, with real-time genlocked video titles running independently as well, drive up to 626,000 sprites and can scroll in 65,536 directions.

Sound

The NCube can produce 128 channel 256 track sound and sample well enough to beat most

voice pattern recognition systems.

The Cray can only beep a G above middle C but it can do this at 140 decibels, enough to cause permanent deafness.

Verdict

The NCube has it over the Cray. Better graphics, more expandability and bigger memory. The £19 million price tag may look expensive, but as ever you get what you pay for. ●

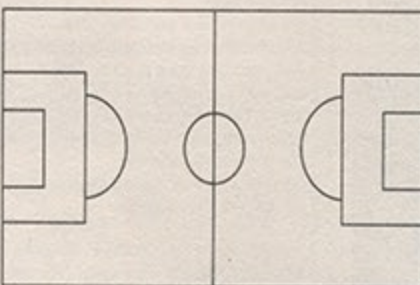

■HELP! SORDed episode

I have a Sord M-5 and I am rather bored with playing games on it as I am having an awful lot of trouble finding any. Anyway, I have recently become interested in machine code and I was wondering if you could answer a few questions for me.

1. Where is the stack positioned in memory?
 2. Is there a good assembler/disassembler package?
 3. Is there a version of WordStar available for the Sord?
 4. Can I upgrade the RAM to say 512K?
 5. Can I upgrade the processor to an 80386?
 6. What is the address of the Sord user group?
 7. I am interested in using my Sord M-5 as a fileserver on a ZX81 network. Is there a 10Mb hard drive available for it?
 8. Do you know anywhere that I can get any non-violent games from?
- I hope you can tell me the answers to the above questions because if you can't I will probably want to buy myself a PC instead and I don't think my pension will stand up to it.

I don't want to give my address because I will probably get a crowd of people around to my house trying to break in and steal my Sord.
No name supplied, Bath.

1. The start address of the stack is hex E456 (decimal 58454) for both issue 1 and 2 Sord M-5s. The stack enjoys considerable use by the Sord operating system for operations such as I/O, screen updating, register addressing etc. Addressing the stack directly is considerably faster when attempting I/O than by using BASIC and also requires less RAM (BASIC uses contiguous two-byte 'blocks' for every byte output). Here's an example machine language program which puts the first output byte into the accumulator and the return address of the operation on the stack:

(remembering of course that addresses are presented in low-high byte format and the program will only work with expanded Sords).

2. One of the best assembler/disassemblers available for the Sord was DevMon 4.6 from Six Byte Software based in

Cardiff. Unfortunately, Six Byte Software disappeared at the beginning of 1987, so there's no chance of obtaining a new copy of the program. Probably the best course of action would be to scour the Express classified section for past owners of the Sord selling their hard and software.

3. No. Incredible though it may seem, WordStar Inc (or is it Ltd?) never bothered to convert a version of the program for use on the Sord. Absolutely amazing, huh?

4. Yes, although you'll have to construct a motherboard to bear the RAM. This is not as difficult as sounds because the Sord is based around the Z80 central processor with an 8255 PIO incorporating eight-bit I/O ports accessible to the talented tinkerer. Use dynamic RAM rated at around 150 nanoseconds and a 10µF tantalum bead capacitor between the 0V and 12V rails in order to suppress spikes and other noise on the data bus.

5. NO. Intel's '8' range of microprocessors simply isn't compatible with the architecture necessary for Zilog's baby the Z80. A change of processor would also entail several amendments to the internal architecture of the motherboard.

6. I don't know the address of the Sord user group, if indeed there is one. If there is, please write in!

7. Again I must answer in the negative. To my knowledge there has never been a fixed disk available for the Sord. However, you don't need a hard drive to set up a network.

8. Express classifieds.

■HELP! Joyce: a star!

I own a Commodore 64 and the Star LC10-c Commodore version printer. I have just bought an Amstrad 9512 PCW and would like to know if there is a suitable interface available with which I can use the Star printer as a second printer on the Amstrad. All the dealers approached say it is not possible, with suggestions ranging from an £80 conversion (one way) to selling the LC10-C and buying an ordinary Star LC10.

Unfortunately, many of the eight-bit computer manufacturers provided non-standard interfaces for printers etc., thereby locking you into buying their products usually at inflated prices over standard items, and leading to fat profits for the companies concerned. I can find no-one who supplies an interface of the type you require to connect the Star to your Joyce.

Nowadays, as computer users have become more sophisticated, the manufacturers have had to give up this practise, but there are still a lot of eight-bit users around who have upgraded yet still have dedicated equipment that they would like to use. Sounds rather bleak, but in fact the situation can also be used to work for you. Just think how many devoted Commodore 64 users there are

still tapping away at their machines. One of their number somewhere is going to want a good quality, second hand Star printer for a reasonable sum. Express has a large, free classified section aimed specifically at people like you RC. Bung in an ad, offload the printer, and buy something with a standard serial or parallel interface suitable for use with the Joyce.

■HELP! Mastering the PC

At the moment I have a BBC Master 128 and I am considering upgrading to a Master 512. If I do this will I be able to run games which are designed to run on IBM-PC compatibles? Would I be vulnerable to IBM viruses from sources such as public domain software or shareware disks?

The answer, as always with questions of emulation, is yes and no. Some games will indeed run via an emulator on a Master 512, others need to have silicon slightly more 'compatible' before firing up. Why not adopt an opposite course of action by buying one of the many cheap PC compatibles and using a version of BBC BASIC on it. In that way you will be able to make use of all PC software both games and serious applications and run well behaved Beeb programs (not machine code games unfortunately).

If you do decide to plump for the Master 512 then you may be at risk from PD/shareware transmitted viruses but as there's such a tiny risk anyway even for users of genuine PCs I wouldn't worry too much about it. You can always use a virus checking program if you must.

■TIP Taking a PEEK

For many years now I have been computing on the Sinclair ZX81 computer and although I now own several other machines (Commodore 64, Atari ST and a PC compatible) I still find a lot of enjoyment can be obtained from the little Sinclair (So does Mrs Sinclair - Uncle TT). I spend many hours finding new ways to cram code into a 16K RAM pack. It was on one of these many marathon sessions that I started to have a bit of a problem with the RAM pack. No, not the usual wobble - I soldered my RAM pack directly to the edge connector to stop the dreaded wobble - but bytes being changed for no reason.

At first I thought it was the mains supply and so bought a smoothing device, but still the problem continued. So I wrote a little program to check the memory. This was very effective and using it I managed to locate two faulty RAM

chips. I thought that other computer users might like to see the program so have sent it in for publication. Although written for the ZX81, it could easily be adapted for use with other machines.

The program pokes random num-

bers into a range of memory locations then peeks the same locations to test the integrity of the poked data. Using the program you can easily determine the faulty locations.

I know that this sort of thing can be done because I've got a program somewhere that loads Spectrum screens into the Atari. I just don't know how to do it.

What I need to know is all about kerning and leading and the best way to use different fonts etc. Do you think you could recommend a suitable book which I can use in conjunction with my DTP program to produce really professional looking documents?

A good introduction to the terminology surrounding desktop publishing is the *Handbook of Desktop Publishing* by John C. Sans and published by Wordware Publishing Inc (ISBN 0-915381-95-8). Priced £18.45 it should be available from most high street book stores. Clear, concise and with chapters on word processing tools, page layout tools and necessary hard and software. Recommended reading for DTP beginners.

If you really want to get your teeth into principles of layout and the rudiments of design locate a copy of *The Complete Desktop Publisher* by Daniel J. Makuta and William F. Lawrence, published by Compute! (ISBN 0-87455-065-3). Again available from any good high street book store and priced around £20. This book has it all, necessary equipment, page layout, typography and a very useful glossary containing useful explanations of the jargon. Unfortunately the book is American and consequently some of the terminology is different in the UK. However, the book easy to

assimilate and a very good buy for those new to DTP.

HELP! Talk Talk

I've recently upgraded from my trusty old Atari eight-bit 130XE to a brand new 520STFM of which I'm justly proud. However, I used to use my 130XE for word processing and keeping a database. I now find that I have hundreds of disks full of eight-bit files that I would like to be able to access. Is there some way of getting the 1050 disk drive I use with my 130XE to connect to the drive port of the ST? If not, how can I get the files on to the ST?

The Atari 1050 disk drive is not a standard drive in the same way that the PC and ST drives are. The 1050 is full of extra control electronics to make up for the lack of drive controller in the 8-bit machines. You cannot just run up a cable and connect the drive to your ST. Even if you did manage to connect the drive, the file formats on 8-bit disks are such that you'd have to write some hefty machine language routines in order to read the disks. But take heart, because help is at hand in the form of *TariTalk* from Page 6 Publishing. *TariTalk* consists of public domain software and a cable which connect the Atari eight and 16-bit machines together to facilitate file transfers between the two computers. The software is easy to use and the con-

nection simple to set up. *TariTalk* costs around £20 and is available from Page 6 Accessory Shop, PO Box 54, Stafford ST16 1DR. Tel: 0785 213928.

HELP! ST Teletext?

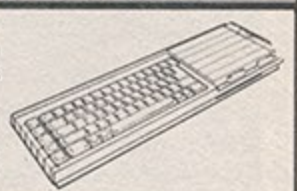

Quite an inviting prospect isn't it? Whizzing off around the world to play volleyball. Such an inviting prospect in fact that Ocean has decided to produce a game about it.

The intro shows your team members being signed up by a big sports promoter to travel to exotic locations and play your favourite sport. The game itself can be played either against the computer or a human opponent, each player controlling both members of the team. A hand is displayed over the head of the player under your control and a blue crosshair on the floor shows where the ball will land.

A variety of moves are at your disposal, including digs, overhead shots, lobs and an almighty powerful smash, which gives a huge amount of gratification when it slams into the ground on the other side of the net.

The smash is used rather a lot by the computer opponent and is successful nine times out of ten. That's my only real quibble with the game - it's much too hard to beat the computer. This means that you have a real job getting to see any of the other locations which is a shame, since the presentation and graph-

ics of *Beach Volley* are excellent and you feel a bit cheated off that you can't see more of the stuff. Having said that, it's extremely good

fun as a two player game and I recommend all beach bums, volleyball fans and computer fans alike to check it out.

Surprise, surprise! Three licensed games inside a month and they're actually all good. Including this fun racing game from Chris Butler.



Activision's last really major product was *Afterburner*, which didn't impress many people. Chris Butler's last major game was *Space Harrier*. This too didn't impress very many people. Put these two together and the result should be disappointing, but what we have instead is a 3D racing game which is remarkably good fun to play.

The game begins as you select your preferred circuit from a choice of five, ranging from elevated circuits to sunsoaked deserts. Next you pick your choice of driver from the line up of 12 and you're away off to the track.

The objective of the game is to finish the race at least in the top three to continue to the next stage - there being five stages in total - since finishing outside the first three results in you being retired from the competition. Simple eh?

The display at the top of the screen shows the usual information, such as speed, time and score, along with the current level and your progress through the stages in the form of gold, silver and bronze trophies. The very top of the screen shows all the racers and their relevant positions in the race.

AMIGA BLIT

GFA upgrades

GFA BASIC has been with us for over nine months now, but due to a number of different factors, the language has very much failed to catch on among Amiga owners - firstly, due to the lack of any compiler and secondly, the presence of a few bugs.

When Les Player (he of ex-Atari technical support) set up GFA UK, shortly after the release of GFA BASIC Amiga, Les was appalled by the state of the Amiga version. GFA UK instantly stopped selling and advertising the product until GFA Germany produced a product that was up to the same standard as the Atari version. Thankfully, the work is finally complete and GFA BASIC Amiga version 3.041 is now available.

After running those same test programs through this latest version, I am pleased to say the GFA BASIC didn't crash once, a welcome improvement on previous versions!

Existing owners of GFA BASIC will be happy to learn that they can upgrade to the new bug free version free of charge by sending their original disks, plus a stamped address envelope, back to GFA UK. Like the Atari version, GFA 3.041 is available for only £49.95.

That's the bugs problem out of the way, but what about the lack of a compiler? Thankfully, that problem too is due to be solved with the release of both the GFA BASIC compiler and GFA Assembler in early December. Details are still thin on the ground concerning these two products, but GFA UK hope to sell the compiler for £29.95 and the Assembler for £49.95.

Several books specifically for the Amiga are in various stages of translation. The books are aimed at programmers of all ability levels, from the greenest beginner to the most hardened professional. GFA Hope that the combination of a bug free interpreter, compiler and books will make GFA BASIC a more attractive proposition to Amiga programmers. Fat Agnus returns

It seems that Music-X has finally been toppled from its throne as the most talked about subject within AmigaBLIT; the tale of Fat Agnus returns with another instalment.

After having to just speculate on the finer points of the new Agnus chip, I'm relieved to be able to inform you that I've finally got my hands on a nice new revision 6 Amiga B2000 complete with obese Agnus. After running

several tests, it appears that several games and serious products will not work with these new machines (including Kick Off - shock, horror, is my life worth living without my regular dose of Kick Off?).

Quite a few of you have asked me whether it is possible to fit the new Agnus chip yourself. Well, according to a software developer friend of mine, fitting the new Agnus isn't just a case of removing the old chip and bunging the new one in - several jumpers on the main board have to be cut to allow the machine to recognise to extra 512k of chip RAM. However, when the chip is officially available 'off-the-shelf', owners will be able to upgrade by taking their machines to a Commodore-approved service centre (expect to be paying around about £50 for the chip + fitting charges).

As a side note, it is interesting to note that Commodore seem to have changed the keyboard used by revision 6 B2000s. Anyone who has used an A1000 will recognise it immediately as it appears to be exactly the same keyboard mechanism (and keys) used by that ill-fated machine, but in the new PC-like layout. Now we all know what happened to the A1000 stock Commodore had left lying about!

Holy Cheat, Batman!

Well, it certainly didn't take long for this one to reveal its inner most secrets. Yes folks, that illusive cheat mode for *Batman* has finally been discovered!

To gain infinite lives, load the game and once the title screen appears (the screen with the high score table), type 'JAM' and keep continuously pressing the 'M' key until the screen flips (literally!). You will now have infinite lives. Also, during the game, <F9> advances you forward a screen and <F8> takes you back a screen. Thanks to Bernadette for that one.

TOS to DOS in one

Condor Computer (01 828 9755) has announced *Supercharger*, a full MS-DOS processor system that doesn't require you to open up your ST: instead, it plugs into your DMA port. And it can be set to boot directly from your hard disk, should you be lucky enough to possess such an item. It also has a hot key to let you switch between DOS and TOS without rebooting.

At £299, *Supercharger* should prove interesting competition for Gasteiner's £379 *PC Speed*, which sits on top of your 68000 chip and therefore requires you to be a dab hand with a screwdriver.

To B or not to B

"I know it's possible to make my ST boot from an external Megabyte drive," writes John Kelly of Oxford, "because it's been mentioned in ST Club (issue 34, to be precise). But I still don't know how to do it."

John, you know I'd do anything for you short of buying you a drink, so here goes. Before we go any further, however, I must utter the standard warning: if you think a soldering iron is for ironing solders, for heaven's sake don't attempt this modification. Get an expert in. And in any case it invalidates your guarantee. So if you break your legs don't come crawling to me...

What you're about to do is to make some links in your ST that fools it into thinking your external drive is A. Remove the motherboard's casing and, from the circuit board, desolder pins 19 and 20 of the Yamaha YM2149 sound chip. Connect the pins to a double pole, double throw switch as shown in the diagram below. It's as simple (and as nerve wracking!) as that.

Boy, look at us now!

Further evidence, if it were needed, that one of the ST's real strengths is as the musician's

friend comes in the arrival of not one, not two, but three new programs.

First out of the starting blocks is *Chameleon*, the launch product of a brand new and self-styled "major" music software company called Keynote. It's claimed by boss Ian Paterson to be the "first true programmable universal patch librarian" for the ST. Complete libraries can be stored in memory and accessed instantly with the help of database-style librarian functions.

Chameleon (from the Greek, incidentally, meaning "ground-lion." Not a lot of people know that) costs £89.95: a demo version with saving functions disabled costs £3. Keynote is on 0761 32610.

Musical notes: 2

The second announcement of arrival on the booming ST music scene this week comes from Voxel Software, based in London's quaintly named Shoot-Up-Hill. Boss Al Straker explains: "launch product *MusicBase* is a database application for the music industry: a very comprehensive electronic storage and retrieval database/directory of essential names, addresses and contacts within the UK music industry."

Straker is cannily aiming *MusicBase* to tie in with the arrival of the Stacy, Atari's portable ST, which is undoubtedly going to be popular in the music industry.

I've yet to see a finished version of the database, so I can't comment on its range and accuracy.

MusicBase - "Enter the age of the paperless pop star" (ouch) - is available soon from Voxel on 01 452 1916.

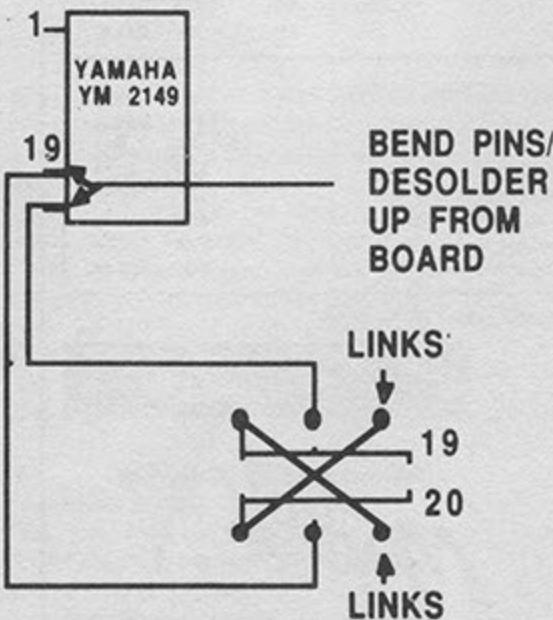

Finally, an already established US company is beginning to make its mark felt in this country. Musicode produce a range of voice development programs to operate with Kawai and Yamaha instruments.

With them you can edit, randomise and mix patches using eight edit buffers, and select, edit and audition patches on one screen. The programs include chord, delay/pan, micro tune, program change and utility editors. The librarian can store up to 300 patches in each library which you can copy, sort, filter, swap and delete; create new banks from libraries and vice versa; print all patch data and bank contents; autoloading voice banks, effects, micro tunes and sequences with selected performances.

Musicode is based at 5575 Baltimore Drive, Suite 105-127, La Mesa, CA 92042, and the Voice Development Systems cost between \$69 and \$99.

SPEX

Dubious gun

The pretty dubious benefits of owning a Sinclair Magnum lightgun have so far only been available to punters investing in the +2/+3 Action Pack bundle but now, Virgin/Mastertronic are flogging it as a stand-alone add on for 128k +2 and +3 owners to slot in the back of their Speccys. The price they're asking is £29.95 for the gun plus six accompanying games that are also included in the action pack. That might seem quite good value for money but the standard of the bundled games is low, with even *Op Wolf* failing to offer anything like as good a game as it with traditional joystick or keyboard play, and you'd be mad to walk out of the shop with this one before having a go on Cheetah's technically superior and cheaper Defender weapon. The prospects for both shooters look quite bad, in fact. They're pretty much incompatible with each other and unless we see the likes of Ocean including a lightgun option in their Chrimbo line up of suitable games, purchase of either can't be strongly recommended.

Sounding off again

Acres of paper have been devoted to the dreaded +3 sound fault in recent columns. Ted Kirk from Mersyside, just one of the

many afflicted, wrote to get this off his chest.

"I was glad to have your latest information about the +3 sound (every user I know has the distortion, like me, although I purchased well after Nov '88 or the launch of the +2A.) It's usually spoken of as if it were a rather trivial fault, but it totally wrecks any musical effect and as a writer of musical programs I deeply resent the havoc that has been wrought on what was a nice little sound system, and the lack of concern shown by those responsible. How could they possibly send out 40,000 computers with such a fundamental, obvious and destructive error? And what happened to the Sale of Goods Act... All in all it's hard to imagine a better example of bungled and misdirected product "development" than the successive stages of the Amstrad "Spectrum". It must be driving programmers off their heads all over - or am I the last idiot left?"

Well said Ted! I couldn't have put it better myself. As J.R.Cleveland pointed out several Expresses ago, distorted +3's are now being flogged as part of the Sinclair Action Pack bundle so Amstrad are knowingly inflicting the untold misery of distorted sound on the thousands who will buy a +3 this Christmas. That can't be legal, or if it is legal it certainly isn't very nice.

I know I've asked before but has anybody come up with a foolproof and cheap(ish) fix for the +3's sound fault? If you know how to get the +3 making beautiful music again send full details to Robin Alway, SPEX, *New Computer Express*, 4 Queen Street, Bath BA1 1EJ. You'll gain the freindship and respect of millions of distorted +3 users and there's also lots of Speccy software on offer for the first easy to administer cure.

Let's get serious

I know lots of you want to use your Speccy for things other than inflicting genocide on alien races so it's good to see a few companies are still producing serious(ish) software. Garner Designs is a fairly new label that has quite a few serious progs on offer and also runs a PD library and the +3 User's group, both of which have received their fair share of plugs in past Spexes.

Their latest piece of software is *Desktop* (£12), which gives +3 users a hip and fashionable WIMP environment in which you can carry out all the chores of disk management. Everything you usually do in +3DOS (loading, erasing and the like) are apparently possible with *Desktop*. There's also a special extended version, called *Desktop Executive* (£16.45) for +3 users with a Genius or Kempston mouse. This is the same as the original but also includes a day to day diary, calculator, icons etc and obviously, lets you jiggle your much under used rodent around in order to control disk files and all the other fun things ST and Amiga owners get up to.

Finally, a similar program for cassette-based Spectrums is available, it's called *WIMPY*, costs £8 and is pretty good although you will need to know a bit about BASIC to get it working to your advantage in home made routines and proglers.

All three programs are available, along with a few others mentioned before, from Garner Designs (57 Lovers Walk, Dunstable, Beds LU5 4BG). That's also the address of the +3 Users group which is still going strong with three issues of the club newsletter already published and the selection of PD software expanding even as we speak. S.A.E. for details.

Amstrad figures

Oh dear. Oh dear, oh dear. Oh dear oh...

You've probably got the idea that Amstrad's figures aren't too healthy - and you'd be right. Preliminary results for the year ending 30th June 1989 show a dramatic downturn in profits before tax. Last year the Brentwood Boys made £160 million, this year it's a paltry £77 million. Turnover, however, is much the same - the reduction in profits has been due to "margin erosion". In particular, last year's rise in DRAM prices caused problems, and the recall of all those PC2000s can't have helped much...

Now clearly, what Amstrad needs to set it back on the right tracks is a relaunch of the CPC...

Compulsory purchase

Powerdrift is here, and it's brilliant! You had to pay 50p to plonk your posterior in the hydraulic arcade machine, but it gave you a ride to remember. It was hard to imagine getting the same adrenaline rush out of a home micro version, but Activision has done a really excellent job.

OK, so you don't get the gut-churning (and pocket-emptying) immediacy of the coin-op, but Activision have captured the spirit of the game perfectly. Basically, it's wellie-to-the-floorboards all the way, and the devil take the hindmost.

Which sums it up exactly, as a matter of fact, because the idea of the game is to continually finish your races in the top three in order to qualify for the next round.

There are five courses to race on, all featuring the same blend of fast straights, tight hairpins, and surreal, twisting mid-air sections. Each course is divided into five progressively harder stages - each one a four-lap sprint.

You always start from fourth on the grid, so whatever happens you've got to make up at least one place to make it to the next round. An easy enough task at first, with Stage 1 featuring nothing more challenging than a few old grannies.

After you've ground them into the dirt things get tougher, however, as you start mixing it with the big boys. One tip - settle for second if you want to keep racing. Numero uno on the track is an absolute b****r to get past, and will think nothing of taking you off if you as much as try.

Powerdrift is fun not just because of the fast, colourful graphics, but because every corner is an oversteering, wheel twirling, slippery-sliding seventh heaven for frustrated dirt track racers.

Like I said, it's brilliant.

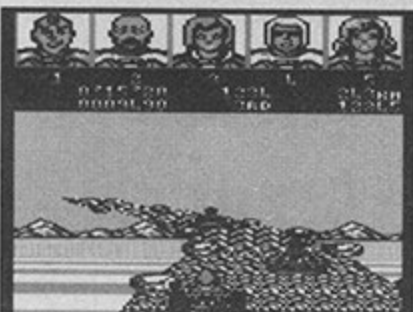
It's actually a rather good little game, featuring that tireless formula of a little character trotting around underground collecting diamonds and avoiding falling rocks.

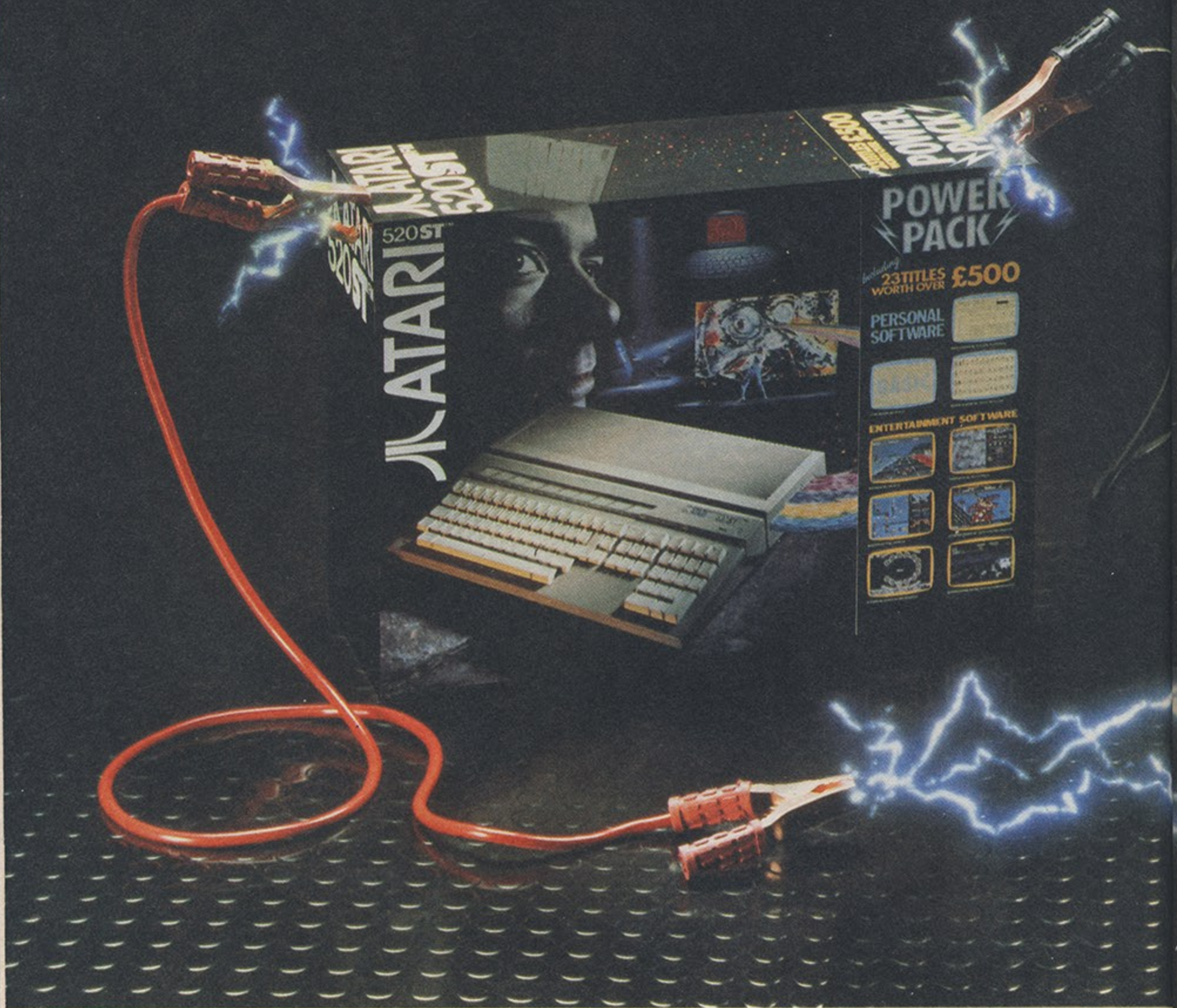

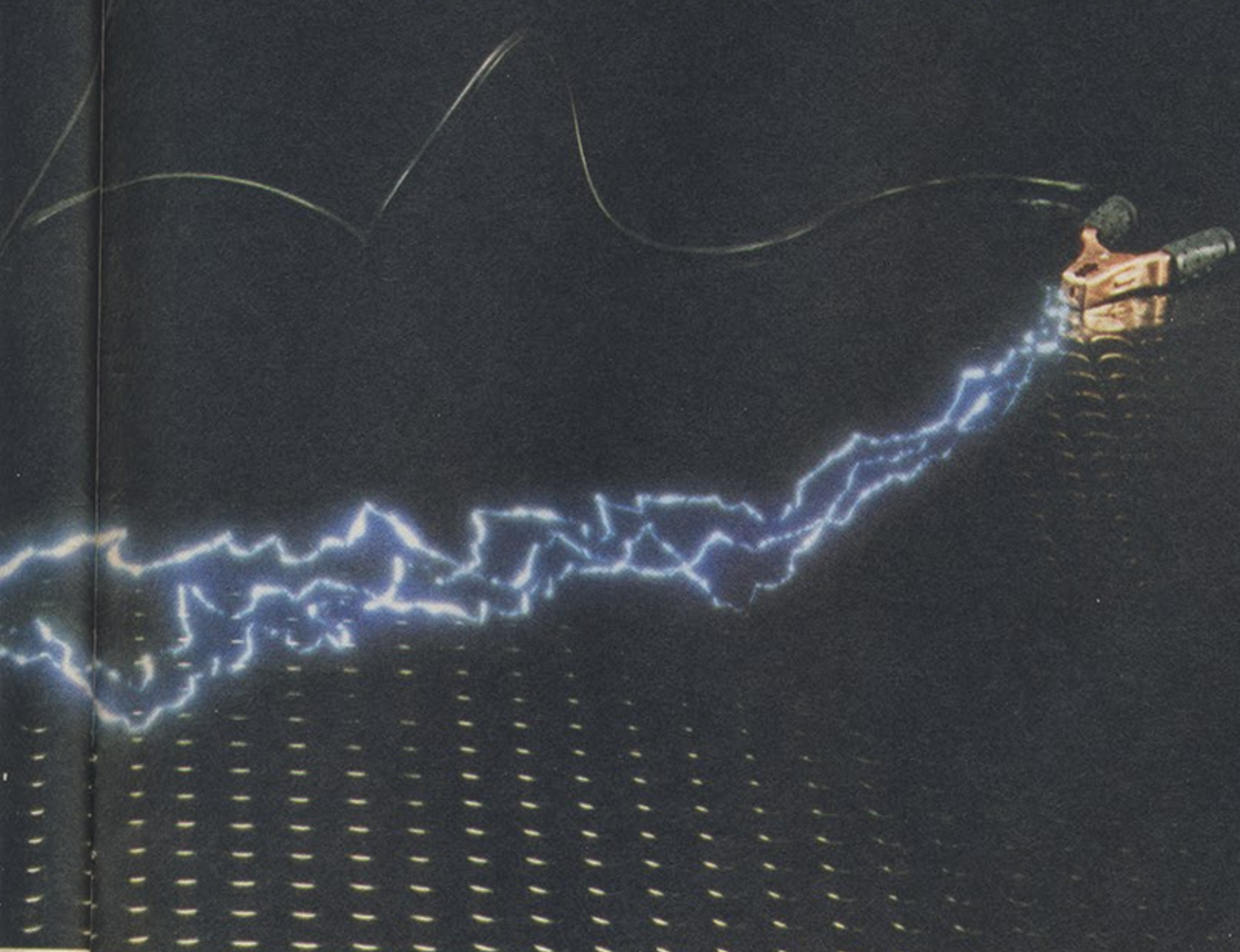

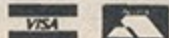

QUANTA doings

QUANTA member Jim Gilmour has successfully ported the Inmos Transputer Development System ITDS0 to the QL.

Although the TDS actually runs on a transputer system, such as one of the Concurrent Techniques transputer modules which Neville Smith has interfaced to the QL, a "server" program has to be written for the host machine.

Jim translated the C source code for the IDS server into QL SuperBASIC, and then compiled it with the Digital Precision Turbo compiler.

I wouldn't get too excited about this, unless you have deep pockets, as the TDS will cost you £1,500 plus VAT!

The group's reprint of Jan Jones's excellent SuperBASIC book was a great success; the entire print run was sold in a few weeks.

A math is a Catholic thervithe

A sophisticated maths package for the QL has been developed by Chalmers University in the States. QUANTA has acquired the distribution rights for this package, which will be available for £14 to UK members and £15 to overseas members.

The package includes routines for the solution of equations, curve-fitting, definite and

indefinite integration, Fast Fourier Transforms, and lots of other goodies.

John Attwood has replaced the 68008 in his QL by its grown-up older brother, the full 16-bit 68000, as used in the ST and Amiga. The brain transplant proved quite tricky, requiring 27 additional chips!

He's also converted the ROM and keyboard interfaces to 16-bits, which required another nine chips. John reports that SuperBASIC programs run about 25% faster, but machine code is a bit slower than normal, because the RAM is still 8-bit.

He will shortly be converting the RAM for 16-bit operation. I thought that hardware hackers like John were an extinct species - it's nice to hear that some of them are still alive and kicking!

QL repairs

I recently had a word with Tony Firshman of TF Services, about the various faults found on QLs sent in for repair.

The most common fault (about 50%) is found on QLs sent in for repair. Next comes the 8301 ULA chip. TF has large stocks of spares, including the ULAs.

It even supplies these to British Telecom, for repairing the Tonto, the BT "badge-engineered" ICL One-Per-Desk.

In a very small number of cases, faults have proved to be so incredibly obscure, that TF simply replaced the entire QL printed circuit board.

However, stocks of working PCBs are drying up, which might cause problems in the future. Contact TF on 01-724-9053, if your QL needs attention.

A game of two halves, Brian

As you may be aware there is no love lost between Superior and 4th Dimension/Impact games.

Recently this antipathy has been fuelled by both software houses releasing their own football simulation. 4th Dimension kicked Superior into touch by being first to the line with *Arcade Soccer*. This was a pretty decent strike at goal although the strategy options were limited.

Here comes Superior however with a surging run from the back. Can it score against mighty 4th Dimension, or is it going to be an own goal? (Don't you just love these footballing metaphors) Read on...

This is a full feature management simulation and arcade soccer game rolled into one. The two elements can be played separately or together, which should spread the appeal of the game to a larger audience.

Programmed by Peter Scott in his own unique style there are numerous options to choose from, which are selected from an easy to use menu.

In the arcade game the screen shows a small view of the pitch which scrolls to keep the ball centred, and at the top left there is a map which helps locate nearby team mates or opponents.

There are several key press combinations

required to dribble, pass, tackle and shoot. This complexity spoils what could have been an excellent game. In other games of this type when you gain possession of the ball you retain it until you are tackled. In *Superior Soccer* if you try to run with the ball and turn around to go in the opposite direction the ball is left behind.

The management simulation part allows you to play at being Brian Clough by navigating your team from the 3rd to the 1st divisions, buying and selling players along the way.

My thanks to Matthew Fifield for the above comments. His overall verdict? "Try before you buy, or you might be disappointed"

Higher level adventures

My second game this week is from Level 9 and takes a slightly more cerebral approach.

Scapghost is a text and graphics adventure from the old masters themselves.

Although it has all the paraphernalia of modern adventures, including some rather odd looking pictures, you know from the start this is a Level 9 and definitely not an imitation.

The language used for example is distinctly adult, so this one is definitely not for the pre-teen market. I for one am glad these days everything from pop music to clothes to TV is pitched at nine year olds.

I am also pleased that Level 9 are keeping their commitment to the BEEB market, although you now need a Master 128 to absorb that unique atmosphere only they can provide. My conclusion; I'm actually going to play this game!

Many a flip

Ever seen *Flipper* at work? It must be the world's most expensive PCW program in terms of K per £ - it costs £30 for just 10K of program - but has the remarkable effect of splitting your PCW's memory in two, letting you run *LocoScript* in one half, and a CP/M program in another. Pressing SHIFT-EXTRA-EXIT moves you between the two, getting you back where you left off last time.

Well, now that Isenstein has brought out a memory add-on that can beef up your PCW memory to 1024K (with a 2048K version in the pipeline!) *Flipper* has been rewritten to make best use of the extra memory. You can now run *Loco* as normal in 512K (spell checkers, printer drivers, *LocoFile* and all) with 496K to run your CP/M program in the other half.

Correction time

Last time I told you about the forthcoming alternative micro show but didn't tell you was the correct date for the event! The alternative micro show is being held at the **Show Centre, Bingley Hall, Staffordshire on the 11th November.**

DOS SOS

I've had several letters from frustrated SpartaDOS users who don't know how to boot Atari DOS and have the SpartaDOS cartridge connected at the same time. Mr Arthur Morris of Tregaron, Dyfed said "I can't understand how you manage to run [Atari] DOS on the computer and have the cartridge plugged in. When I plug in the cartridge, I lose DOS".

Simply boot the computer with the SpartaDOS cartridge plugged in (so you are booted into SpartaDOS) then issue the COLD command using the /N switch. This will allow your machine to boot up Atari DOS whilst the SpartaDOS cartridge is still connected!

How does it do this? The Cold command is

used to reset the Atari by running the reboot routine positioned at location \$E477. The effect is similar to switching the computer off and back on again. However, unlike performing this drastic action, the Cold command allows the computer to retain any data stored in the extended memory banks.

If you have an extended memory 800XL or a 130XE and you have one or more ram disks set up, then rebooting using the cold command will allow you to keep all of the information stored in the ram disks.

The Cold command can be used with two 'clauses', /C and /N. Performing the command thus: Cold /C, reboots the machine, switches off the SpartaDOS cartridge and allows the computer to boot any cartridge piggy-backed on to SpartaDOS. For example, if you have SpartaDOS plugged in and the Tennis cartridge plugged into SpartaDOS, you can boot tennis using this formula.

If you issue the Cold /N, SpartaDOS is switched off and the computer reboots as if there were no cartridges present.

Have an Atari DOS disk at hand, boot the computer with SpartaDOS, insert an Atari DOS disk in your drive and issue the Cold /N command. The Atari will reboot using Atari DOS. Go into the menu, then follow the sequence of instructions given last fortnight.

Time spent DOSing

Do you use SpartaDOS? Write and tell me all about your DOS adventures. I plan to introduce a mini tutorial detailing the use of the incredible SpartaDOS, and it will be very useful to know which version is more prominent and indeed how many are still using Atari's dinosaur DOS.
