



NO NEW MACHINES UNTIL 1946

The Cash Box many times reported that the average manufacturer does not believe he will be able to produce new equipment, in any quantity whatsoever, until sometime in 1946, some coinmen are still of the belief that they will see new machines rolling off production lines this year.

A survey conducted by The Cash Box among Chicago manufacturers revealed the fact that this medium was correct in its assumption that there would NOT be any new equipment coming off production lines until sometime in 1946.

In fact, the most optimistic statement made to The Cash Box by one Chicago manufacturer, was that June, 1946, would be about the earliest date for any sort of volume production.

The Cash Box likes to believe that the Spring of '46 will see new machines beginning to come off the production lines of some of the larger factories.

It believes this for it reasons that the War Production Board, and various other government agencies, must start preparing the nation for the return of domestic production as early as possible. Of course, without interfering with the progress of the Jap war.

But should the Federal government continue to withhold production from the average manufacturer by waiting for V-J day, then there is sure to ensue a serious period of unemployment and perhaps even a deflationary or inflationary era.

This would not only hurt all business, but would make it extremely difficult for the nation to get back to normal. It would probably mean a rush to start the ball rolling, instead of a gradual building up period to the point of normal, peacetime production.

Therefore The Cash Box is of the opinion that the Federal government will most definitely continue to arrange for gradual cutbacks of war production which will allow many of the smaller, and even some of the larger, manufacturers to get back to their former domestic products production on an eased in basis.

Perhaps this may be arranged as in the auto industry, where a quota basis was first set up. But regardless of the methods adopted, production lines will have been started and will be allowed to grow apace as the months roll by.

What is most important is for this trade to realize that because of all these surrounding factors there is no possibility for the manufacturers in this industry to start shipping machines into the field this year. The average manufacturer is still engaged in war work even tho he is spending almost as much of his time and effort these days in his experimental department in preparation for tomorrow.

This does not mean that by preparing his dies, jigs and tools for his new products, that he will instantly be able to get new machines popping off his production lines like he could in the pre-war era. A complete and almost revolutionary production methods change will be necessary before the average manufacturer in this industry can turn from war work to peacetime production.

His present employees, at least the far greater majority, are not acquainted with coin machine production methods. Not only do they have to be trained to this type of work, but machinery changes and component needs will all work to halt any speedy return to coin machine production.

Manufacturers in other industries have already issued statements that it will take them anywhere from three to six months and even longer to reconvert. Coinmen must take this into consideration as far as this industry is concerned, and plan that it will take the average coin machine manufacturer an equal period of time to reconvert from war to peacetime production.

The industry must, therefore, because of the statements of the manufacturers themselves, realize that there will be no volume of new machines until sometime in 1946. With this fact in mind, the average coinman can now plan accordingly.

He can prepare his path for post-war. If he is an operator, he knows that he can still purchase used equipment, and can still amortize such equipment in plenty of time before volume production reaches that stage where he will have to sell it or trade it in.

RECONVERSION UNEMPLOYMENT

There is today much talk thruout the nation regarding the possibility of a severe unemployment period while reconversion from wartime to peacetime production gets under way.

This has brought about many plans by politicos to create bigger employment projects, both locally and nationally. It has also started some manufacturers to fearing the possibility of either an inflationary or deflationary period.

The fact that unemployment is bound to ensue, while the large manufactories reconvert from war to peacetime products, is an accepted fact. Some of these manufacturers have stated that it will take them well over six months to again get under way with any real volume of domestic products products.

Regardless of the efforts of WPB and many other government agencies, there seems to be little hope that the average working man will be guaranteed any working hours at all while reconversion is under way.

Some in this industry are of the belief that while this unemployment period is in force it will hurt collections. This is completely erroneous. Those workers, who will be out of employment for from three to six months, will prove among the best customers that this industry will ever have.

The average working man, as the result of surveys already conducted, reports that he is going to consider this unemployment period in the light of a vacation. That being the case, then surely the coin operated machines industry will continue to enjoy profits.

In the first place, with the average worker released from the 48 down to the 40 hour week, and with overtime periods also cut off, he will have more time on his hands. And usually such time is spent in the naborhood taverns, drug stores and other meeting places—the locations for the equipment of this industry.

The worker will, because of this unemployment, be more careful with what coin he has saved. At the same time he will continue to enjoy economical amusements, such as coin machines. There is no doubt that this period, where the working man will be waiting for the factories to re-employ him once again, will have a very sobering influence upon him.

He isn't going to spend big money. Nor will he be too anxious to buy merchandise of any kind in a hurry. He believes that the average factory can get into peacetime production and produce merchandise faster than ever before, just as these same factories entered into war production and broke all records for output.

He thinks, from surveys already made, that there will be plenty of merchandise of all kinds on hand the moment the factories get going, and therefore he will hold onto his cash as long as possible to first assure himself employment, prior to letting go any big chunk of his savings.

This again means that coin machines will have customers who can, and will, spend to be entertained. Then, as the production boom gets going, and workers return to their benches, the new machines of this industry, too, will be coming off production lines. This will help to re-stimulate the play.

Therefore, from all viewpoints, coinmen are assured continued big action, regardless of the reconversion unemployment period which the nation's economists are expecting.

It is wise for the average coinman to prepare himself for this period. One of his best moves is to once again survey the locations in his territory, and to make use of whatever idle locations he may find. Used equipment will bring as big returns as will any other type of machine while the crowds are back at their old corner stores once again.

The coinman must remember, and must drill this fact into himself, that the location always counts more than the machine. He should therefore, in preparation for the post-war period, be covering every possible location he can, with whatever machines he can purchase, so that these locations will be his and will be ready for the new equipment when it does at last come to market.

BUCKLEY BILL STIRS JUKE TRADE

The juke box trade thruout the country has been tremendously stirred up by the report that there is at present in the Patents Committee of the House of Representatives in Washington a bill proposed by Rep. Charles A. Buckley of New York to amend the Copyright Act of 1909.

The amendment, if passed thru the Patents Committee after a third reading, and then thru the House of Representatives, into the Senate Patents Committee and thru the Senate, will become LAW.

And, as a law, it means that every juke box man in the nation will be endangered to the extent where he will never again be in control of his own overhead.

Such a law will give ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Artists and Publishers) the right to demand a license fee each year from the juke box playing the copyrighted music controlled by this organization. This music would now be considered a public performance for profit.

It would also give MPPA (Music Publishers Protective Assn.) the opportunity to yell for greater royalties from the record manufacturers. And there is no doubt that an increase in the royalties which they are now getting would result.

This would mean that records would cost more. And that, in addition to this increased records cost, which the average juke box operator is more than willing to pay so that the labels on the records he buys will bear the phrase, "for use in coin operated musical instruments", he would be assessed a yearly license fee by ASCAP up to the amount which this organization would believe to be fair and appropriate for the right to make use of the copyrighted music which they control.

The ASCAP has lost twice in this country in law suits which it brought against juke box operators, and also lost once in Canada on the same charge, it will now have the Federal government behind it, and will simply set a price on its yearly license for the juke box trade. (And who is to say that this amount cannot be \$100.00 or more per year?)

It is therefore little wonder that the juke box trade is plenty stirred up and anxious to get this bill out of the way. The movies were able to get themselves exempted from this bill. Perhaps because of the powerful lobby which they maintain in Washington to watch all bills which may prove detrimental to them.

But this industry has no representative in Washington to watch over and protect it. No one even notified this trade when this bill was introduced over a month ago. Now that it is in the Patents Committee of the House it is up to the trade to kill it right there.

This is the time for this great juke box industry to get together into a single and solid unit for the sole purpose of protecting itself from such proposed taxation. The Cash Box long, long ago recommended that a National Tax Council be created. It is now of the hope that this bill will get the trade into action and that such a necessary Council will at last become fact.

The trade must act fast. It cannot lull itself into a false sense of security just because someone states that this bill has been introduced time and again into the House. Nor can it wait because someone may state that it will be next October before any action is taken for the Patents Committee "may have thousands of other bills to consider first".

This is exactly the sort of false security attitude which has brought about extremely severe taxation upon this industry. Who knows, and who can state, that this bill may not be up for a reading right this moment, and all the members of this House Patents Committee may feel favorably inclined towards it — and pass it on?

As long as someone is pointing so dangerous an instrument at the heads of the members of this juke box industry—it is up to this industry to eliminate that instrument—and do so as rapidly as is possible.

\$1,000 Each in New Organization. Agree on 70%-30% Comish Basis. Trade Carefully Watching Results, Attorney Writes.

SAVANNAH, GA.—What is probably the most progressive as well as the most interesting move yet made by any coinmen thruout the nation has been made by coinmen in this city. Coinmen here have come together into an organization which they call the "Chatham Music Operators Association" taking in all coin machine men of Chatham County, in which the city of Savannah is located.

The very first move on the part of these coinmen was to appoint one of this city's most prominent attorneys as their "Commissioner". His duties are similar to the commissioner of baseball. He will not only rule on any infractions of the agreement signed by the coinmen, but will also help guide the future of the cointrade in this city.

The members immediately agreed on a new commission arrangement with locations here. As reported sometime ago in The Cash Box, this commission basis will now be 70% to the operator and 30% to the location owner.

In addition to this, coinmen here have agreed to respect each other's rights and locations, conduct their business ethically, eliminate sales direct to locations, etc. This and many other fine features are in the contract which these coinmen signed during the formation of this organization.

To make the agreement binding and to show faith in their new organization, Savannah's coin machine men each put up \$1,000.00. In this way, they believe, all will hold to the rules and regulations which they, themselves, had a hand in formulating.

This action has won much attention from the trade. Operators in other parts of the nation are closely watching results. Many believe that the success of this organization idea in this city will help spread it to other parts of the country, and that "commissioners" from among prominent men in each city in the nation may be appointed to guide the destinies of other coinmen, as is being done here.

President of this new organization is O. J. Mullininx, Jr. of Mullininx Amusement Company; Vice-President is Sam Goldberg of the Novelty Amuse-U Company and Secretary-Treasurer is Frank J. Hahne of the Savannah Amusement Company.

The entire organization is as yet in a formulative stage but has already won the acclaim and respect of many leading coinmen. Most are of the belief that Savannah has found the answer to what this trade needed.

Some have even gone on to state that not only should coinmen in other communities thruout the nation follow what is now being called the "Savannah plan", but that the trade as a whole would find it extremely advantageous to arrange for the appointment of a "commissioner" for this industry from among the many prominent men who will be seeking other positions when their war efforts are finished in Washington.

The attorney who was appointed "commissioner", Mr. Edward A. Dutton writes the following to The Cash Box.

"The principal function of the office (of commissioner) is to see that all of the rules and regulations of the organization are complied with by all of its members. In the event there is a violation of the rules, then it is the Commissioner's duty to hold a hearing and to decide the issue and determine what penalty, if any, the violator should receive."

The following was received from Mr. O. J. Mullininx, president of the organization, "This organization, even in its present temporary state, desires to make the public announcement that we are anxious to lend our full support to the correction and elimination of any problem arising which would affect the general welfare of the coin machine industry in the entire United States."

Mayor LaGuardia Says Jukes Play Too Loud

NEW YORK—Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia of this city, in his regular Sunday broadcast, July 15, claimed that the juke boxes located thruout this city were playing entirely too loud for the sleeping comfort of this city's citizens.

The Mayor requested that taverns and other locations tune down their machines and that this be done immediately.

Returned Marine To Start 1,500 Juke Box Operation In Convalescent Homes

NEW YORK—Milton E. Haas, who served in both World Wars as a Marine, is planning on starting an operation of no less than 1,500 juke boxes to cover convalescent homes for soldiers.

Milton smelled his first profits in the juke field by handling machines in Post Exchanges in this war. After seeing how soldiers went for the jukes and noting with what avidity they played them, also noting what fine profits Uncle Sam was earning from the machines located in the PX's, Milton decided that this was the field for him.

He reports that the juke boxes operated in the PX's on the regular Army contract of 60% for Uncle Sam and 40% to the operator.

He plans to set up juke boxes in all the convalescent homes thruout the nation. Haas figures that this will take an initial outlay of at least 1,500 machines. His plan is a national operation with service centers set up in various parts of the country. He will have trained men servicing and collecting from the machines. He also plans to arrange for a single record and parts exchange which will make it easier for his servicemen and collectors.

He tells a story of one soldier with such unbounded energy that he would purchase 10 or 12 glasses of beer each evening, a package or two of pretzels, obtain a handful of nickels, and stand in front of the PX's juke box, putting in coin after coin, drinking his beer, nibbling on his pretzels and jigging away until he collapsed and was put to bed.

OPA TO RELEASE CONTROLS C D-60 NON-ESSENTIAL TRA ALSO SET RULES FOR RECONVERSION PRICES

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The Office of Price Administration announced this past week that approximately 40 to 60 industries would find price controls eliminated in a statement

that this agency will announce very soon. (This is in keeping, almost to the minute, with the special flash bulletin which appeared in The Cash Box, May 15,1945 issue, wherein this publication advised the trade at the time that within 30 to 90 days there would be "further relief for non-essential industries".)

So far the only trades mentioned were jewelry and furs, and the fact was also noted that there was no control on furs costing over \$8,000. The announcement revealed that industries not definitely affecting the public's pocketbook, such as the food and clothing trades, would probably be released from price control as supplies became greater. It is generally hoped (and believed) thruout the trade that this industry is on this list.

Also of great interest to the trade were the rules for reconversion price adjustments issued by OPA. This arranges a method for pricing of new equipment which will come to market. The method is believed to be generous. It is reported that the pricing adjustments will allow manufacturers to earn a good profit on the new products they will manufacture.

In view of the fact that there has been much speculation thruout the trade as to how high prices for the new machines will run, this announcement by OPA more or less confirms the fact that the post-war machines will be much higher in price than ever before.

INKS CANT BUY PARKING METER TIME POCATELLO, IDA. - Judge Charles A. Brown of this city fined one of the local citizenry \$15. after an arresting officer's testimony that he had found the defendant sitting on

240% CIGAR-277% CIG RISE FOR POST-WAR NEW YORK - Joseph Cullman, Jr., president of Cullman Brothers and Allied Tobacco Stocks, Inc., in an address before the New York Tobacco Table, stated that there would

be a 240% rise in cigar smokers and a 277% rise in cigarette smokers after the war. He said that American smokers would consume approximately 12 billion cigars and over 500 billion cigarettes. Present deterrent factors, such as the Office of Price


Administration regulations and crop restrictions, did not change the over-all optimistic picture, Cullman declared.


JESCHER TO BUILD BLOCK LONG BUILDING

FOREWORD
